Why get a Hillside Public Library card?

Your card lets you....

- Download digital media from **Zinio** (magazines), **Media on Demand** (eBooks, audiobooks, and video), and **Freegal** (music)
- Be the first in line for brand new books from popular authors
- Check out DVDs, CDs, and video games
- Request books, movies, and more from other libraries in our system
- Keep a record of your reading history on your library account

How can I obtain a library card?

Hillside residents can register for a library card at the circulation desk by presenting two forms of identification with your current Hillside address. One must be a photo I.D. such as a driver's license, a state I.D., or a school I.D. for students.

Proof of residence will be accepted with the following:

Bank or check book	Voter's registration card
Utility bill	Property tax bill
Hospital bill	Computerized bill from charge card

For children under the age of 18, parents are required to sign the application and show an I.D. with their current address.

How old do you have to be to have a library card?

A child of any age who resides in the Village of Hillside may receive a library card in his/her own name.

A parent's signature is required for children under the age of 18. Parents and guardians are responsible for materials checked out on their children's cards.

Can I use the Hillside Library if I do not live in Hillside, but I have a card from the town that I live in?

Yes. Cardholders from Illinois libraries may bring their library card and photo identification to be entered into our computer system.

I don't live in Hillside. May I still get a Hillside Public Library card?

The library may serve nonresidents from nearby unincorporated areas (in the Hillside school district) for one annual fee of \$369 for an entire family. This fee is established annually by the Hillside Public Library Board of Trustees.

I lost my library card. What should I do?

Library cards that are lost or stolen should be reported missing immediately so that use of the card can be stopped. The patron is responsible for all materials borrowed on his/her card until the card is reported missing. Replacement cards may be purchased for a fee of \$3.00.

My card has expired. What should I do?

You will need to renew your card by bringing your library card and showing one piece of identification with your address. In order to renew your card, your account must be clear of any overdue materials and unpaid fees. Library cards are renewed every three years.
