In a hurry to check out a book? Just a Reminder...



Many of you are using the SWAN library card catalog to place holds and see what titles are available at other libraries. If you decide to go to the owning library to pick up a title, instead of placing a hold, call ahead to be sure that the item is available to check out. An item may be showing "on shelf" in the catalog but may not have been re-shelved yet, misfiled, or in the case of a new title-may get checked out before you arrive at the library. Also when you call, ask if the owning library has any borrowing restrictions for non-residents that may prevent you from checking out the item. (e.g. item too new to be checked out by nonresidents)
