- *The **morning class** will be on **Tuesday** -and- **Thursday** from **9:00 to 11:30 am**

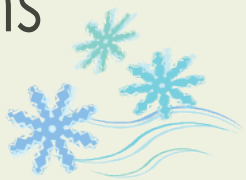
