Selling on Craigslist

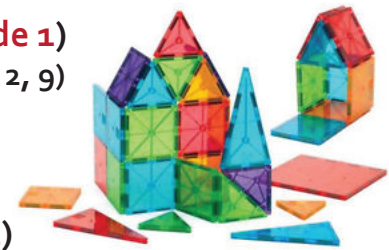
Tuesday, February 16 at 7:15 pm

Tuesdays from 4:30-5:30 pm (January 5, 12, 19, 26 & February 2, 9)

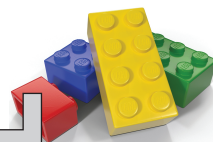
Listen to a story about building or architecture. Play with foam blocks, LEGO® DUPLO® bricks, or Magna-Tiles®.
