By employing the discovery method of teaching, the faculty encourages the students to take part in classroom work and to more fully understand the theories and hypothesis of mathematics. The student then feels a greater sense of satisfaction knowing that through his own ingenuity and key prompting by the instructor, he has developed the basic mathematic properties from their origin to their highest degree of complexity.




cafeteria staff prepares for noon rush with savory fare







student leaders aid faculty in supervision of activities












Adjusting the school telescope, two Astronomy Club members prepare to focus on the North Star.



A Science Club member completes his project for a science display.














camera club aids school in recording year's activities










Maintaining a scholarship rating of at least 2.0, the members realized their honored position and upheld the high standards of the National Honor Society.












maine east nudges morton west to win initial proviso west holiday tournament








silhan paces state finalists by capturing all-around crown








