






















GALLOPING TO VICTORY IN OCTOBER SUNLIGHT, West began its third










SPORTS SPARK STUDENT INTEREST with spectacular antics and athletic




"I'LL TELL YOU A STORY" PROMISED THE TITLE, and in December, the








### SPRING CAME WITH A "WHOOSH" DANGLING FROM THE CEILING of the


Mr. Edward W. Stubbs




The collecting, checking, and processing of some 340,000 cards during each nine-week grading period is only one of Mr. Vallicelli's responsibilities as Administrative Assistant. Together with his staff he schedules classes, prepares the yearly calendar, and sets up and maintains the elaborate system of records without which no school can function. In addition he meets, with humor and understanding, innumerable daily problems of students and faculty. A graduate of Eastern Illinois University, Mr. Vallicelli completed his graduate work at Northwestern University. Though he has served in his present position since 1960, he has been part of Proviso for much longer, having been both a science teacher and a counselor.



Drop-outs and students lacking sufficient credits for graduation are still able to earn diplomas at Proviso West through the evening and summer school programs which are directed by Dr. Widergren. "True ease in writing comes from art, not chance," is a quotation the Proviso West English department takes literally, for its multi-level curriculum is designed to give every student an opportunity to develop his ability to write effectively to the fullest. Regular weekly or bi-weekly themes are required and theme folders are kept for every student. Though composition and grammar are stressed, wide reading is also encouraged, particularly through the use of classroom sets of paper-back classics in addition to the required texts. Honors classes provide opportunities for challenging exploratory reading and enriched literary appreciations especially valuable to the college bound. Occasional excursions take advantage of nearby Chicago's plays and concerts. The College Preparatory Honors class this year enjoyed an afternoon dressrehearsal of the Chicago Lyric Opera's production of The Barber of Seville. The department makes frequent use of audiovisual materials, maintaining its own collection of records and drawing, in addition, on records and films from other sources. Team teaching, which permits specially qualified teachers to work with more students during a given class period, was expanded this year. Nearly 400 students in thirteen classes under eight teachers working in teams of two or three are now involved in the program. Another innovation was the introduction of a class in practical stagecraft whose members designed and constructed sets for both all-school plays. Special talents and interests are further recognized by the public speaking, debate, creative writing, dramatics, and newswriting courses.





### Doors to Careers Open for Industrial Arts Graduates



Education, which upon graduation, can be translated immediately into terms of dollars and cents is the boast of Proviso West's industrial arts department. Theory and actual shop experience in local garages is available in auto-mechanics. Finely-equipped print shops at both East and West gave students employable skills in graphic arts. Machine and architectural drawing turn out draftsmen capable of moving directly into industrial drafting rooms, while vocational machine shop graduates are also in demand by employers. Two new electronics courses this year offer instruction in both telegraphic and radio communication and in TV circuitry. An orientation course, which gave experiences in four different vocational fields, provided background for the beginning industrial arts student, and wood shop gave additional training in prevocational skills. A recent addition to the department was the diversified occupations program which permitted selected students to work during part of each school day in offices or laboratories.





#### Sight and Sound Concepts Improve Lingual Studies

To enable its 1400 language students to further their comprehension of a foreign language, Proviso offers the latest films, records, and tapes. Latin, French, German, Russian, and Spanish are taught by instructors who have either been born or have studied abroad. The sight and sound concepts are stressed through films, periodicals, foreign flash cards, and records. The library also aids the language students with its eight hundred tapes and twenty listening post stations. This year three new pilot courses used the Audio-Lingual Method for learning languages for functional use through films, records, and intensive practice in speaking in everyday situations. Already many honors have been received through the Latin and Modern Language students. Each year contestants participate in state or national examinations. Besides examinations and preparing dialogues, Latin students organized R.O.M.E. under the sponsorship of Miss Farrell and Miss Nissim which enjoyed classical films and plays and trips to places of interest.







#### New South Library Proves Welcome Aid to Research

Students finishing term papers, choosing books for reports or for leisure reading, daily fill the library and put its facilities to use. Besides aiding the students in their research, the library has increased its collection by adding audio visual materials, microfilm, books, pamphlets, and magazines. The aims of the library service are to assist the expanding research needs of the student and to have a current collection of valuable materials. Ear phones also are an extra aid to West's students. Tapes and recordings are not only a help to the foreign language student, but also to all of the students who are in an English class. Short stories, poems, and English literature are available on the ten ear phone channels. The south library room, being used for its first full school year, provides extra shelf space for Proviso's 20,000 books. This room houses the fiction, short story, and reserve book collection. Every morning the library extends twenty minutes of study or research to the students before homeroom. This extra time and effort put in by the library staff results in the students' greater understanding and appreciation of West's literary facilities.



More than a thousand films are included in the Proviso audio-visual library. Every year the Audio-visual Department purchases an additional fifty new films and numerous film strips, records and tapes. The department projected about sixteen thousand films this year, more than during any previous year. Use of audio-visual materials was improved by the addition of a 35 mm automatic film-strip projector, a 16 mm film viewer, and a Proto-Printer for making color transparencies, to make many of the newest techniques for teaching available to the entire faculty. Next year the department anticipates a room where all teachers will have convenient facilities for the preparation of their own overhead projection transparencies.

## Individual Capabilities Develop Through Sports

Far from being considered supplementary in Proviso's curriculum, physical education is an important and integral part of the total education program. Each student received four years of instruction in varied activities designed to develop his individual capabilities. Ten interscholastic sports drew hundreds of boys as active participants, but the PE classes gave every student the opportunity to take part in such team sports as touch football, volley ball and basketball, as well as swimming, golf, wrestling, gymnastics, and tennis. Classes in dance were a popular and valuable part of the girls' physical education program. Both boys and girls attended classes in first aid and hygiene and restricted gym classes, designed to make it possible for even the handicapped student to participate to the limits of his abilities. All available activities were supported by trained and interested teachers. Special courses were scheduled for sports during the seventh hour to allow extra time for practice and work in fundamentals to those taking part in interscholastic competition.







From the basic background courses in general science to the complexities of physics' slide rules and formulas, the science department at Proviso West sought to prepare students to better understand the problems which increasing scientific knowledge has presented and continues to present. Though a few freshmen were permitted to go directly into biology, most acquired in general science a basis from which to choose their later science courses. Biology I this year included the traditional insect collections, laboratory dissections, and lectures supplemented by the liberal use of teaching films. Biology II, an elective course, provided opportunity for college-level work in the life sciences. Plans are in preparation, however, for the introduction next year of some of the new approaches to biological science developed by the Biological Curriculum Study. Chemistry and physics, which are open to juniors and seniors, are of particular interest to the college-bound students. Experimental use of new approaches is also being contemplated in these areas for next year. In connection with improved science instruction, West's science department, along with eight other suburban high schools, participated this year in a study conducted by the University of Florida. Members of the physics classes took the Holzinger-Crowder Unifactor Test in September and in May to assist in assessing the effectiveness of the traditional as compared with the newer presentations of physical concepts developed by the Physical Science Study Committee.





Using the theme "The Faces of Proviso West" the staff and photographers raced around the buildings to find the different moods and expressions of the school. Near the end of the year the moods of Mural changed with the turmoil of getting ready for publication and competition. The '64 Mural caught the faces of Proviso and printed a record of its ever-changing atmosphere.










# Mixed Chorus Provides New Vocal Opportunities


























