




### DEDICATION




Buildings A, B, C, D, E—







The comfort of parental shoulders, and the feel of a well-earned diploma, fill the void left by graduation day.





# Experience Provides New Answers to Old Questions






# ACT, PSAT, and Betty Crocker —the Strange Code of Mr. Bos

#### Odd Hours or Off Season, Education Continues at West

Long after the 3:25 bell sent students and teachers streaming from the building, Dr. Widergren remained to ponder the problems of his office. As Director of Continuing Education for Proviso Township, his primary duty was the organization and direction of night school classes. Although his main tasks remain essentially the same, each year brings a change in emphasis. Since the drop-out problem became increasingly important recently, Dr. Widergren's office moved to meet the need. To his satisfaction the number of high school drop-outs returning to school increased. A second program initiated this year involved the training of some 45 welfare recipients. Through correct placing and aid, these people learned to help themselves.

Dr. Widergren brings to this demanding job a B.A. degree from Beloit College, an M.A. from the University of Iowa, and his Ed. D. from Wyoming.



# Data Processing Techniques Taught in Business Course

The forty Senior girls who were members of West's first office machines course this year learned that being handy with a pencil and shorthand pad and reasonably adept at the typewriter is not all that is required of modern business students. Equipment which is constantly being developed to increase the speed and efficiency of most office procedures is forcing stenographers to become engineers as well. Two IBM card punch machines and eight IBM typewriters with simulated key punch keyboards made it possible for the new class to receive practical instruction as card punch operators. Also included was instruction in the operation of key-driven and rotary calculators. The more familiar beginning courses in typing, shorthand, and bookkeeping were not neglected, however, as a substantial enrollment of some 1700 students indicated. In addition, Distributive Education under the direction of Mr. Gable provided eighteen students with on-the-job experience in selling.





#### New Courses, Fresh Approach Enliven English in 1965

"Mr. Chairman, I rise to a point of order!" Facility in parliamentary procedure will be second nature for West students hereafter, since a first for the English Department this year was the redesigning of the course of study to give all Sophomores an entire semester of training in oral communication. Also for the first time this year, a course in Humanities was opened to Seniors which provided an integrated historical approach to art, music, and literature. Another "new look," which excited the interest of a steady succession of visitors, was given to West's entire approach to English instruction by the expansion of team teaching. This year eight Freshman, six Senior, four Junior, and two Sophomore classes worked under teams of two or three instructors who varied the learning situation to include not only large lecture groups of eighty or more but also large teacher-led discussion groups and very small discussion sections in which the teacher listened but did not take part.

An increasingly vital part of English instruction at West this year was the much wider use of classroom sets of paperback books as the basis for depth study of a few novels rather than the unsupervised reading of a wide variety of

books for book reports.







Throughout the year, more orientation tapes made by the teachers completed a departmental series which covered the 15 courses offered in the industrial arts program. A tape and slide study of a day's activity showed this year's 946 students busily engaged in projects ranging from making simple crystal radio sets to overhauling cars in the auto shop, while in the drafting rooms, boys practiced basic designing and drafting techniques by making tables and cabinets.

The Diversified Occupations Program expanded to 26 students this year under the direction of Mr. Darrell Biggs, Coordinator. He selected and counseled upperclassmen for this apprentice program. Learning and earning on the job, students worked in the afternoons after related classes in the mornings. Among trainees this year were a model, baker, beautician, draftsman, and the only apprentice taxidermist in the United States.

#### Choruses, Orchestra Flourish Under Three New Directors










# Physical Education Program Improved by New Field House





#### Biology Turns Green, Yellow





## Audio-Visual and Library Facilities Enrich Curriculum

The Proviso West Library provided the local headquarters for last-minute cramming and finishing term papers. Students received help from the librarians on everything from deciphering Mr. Dewey's system to the philosophies of Immanuel Kant. Besides fiction and non-fiction, reserve books, pamphlets, magazines, and microfilms were available to assist inquiring minds. Foreign language tapes and records also became increasingly popular as learning supplements. A professional library was open to the faculty for more comprehensive study. Over 10,000 materials circulated among the teachers and students last year.

West's Audio-Visual Department, headed by Mr. Bills, extended into nearly every facet of school life. Over 13,000 audio-visual materials including movies, slides, and overhead projectors were issued this year. The expanding department required and received a new copy room. Included in this addition were color-transparency machines, color lift machines, copy machines, and a new Thermo-fax copier. All of these devices were open for use by any faculty members.






#### Special Clinics Perfect the Techniques of Perception

More students became better acquainted with Proviso West's special education departments this year, since our school had three blind and two deaf students. These five students attended regular classes and were subject to the same exams as all other students. The only variation in their schedule was private help provided by their specialized teachers instead of study hall. With the help of braille and talking books for the blind and lip reading and sign language for the deaf, the students advanced in all activities.

The Reading Improvement Center and the Speech Clinic aided students desiring additional help in reading comprehension and proper enunciation. The Reading Center was operated on a non-credit basis for any student wishing to improve his reading skills. The Speech Clinic worked to overcome hindering physical defects and helped students speak clearly. Over 150 students per semester took advantage of this department.

To start the year off right, the nurses assisted physicians with physical examinations during gym periods. Freshmen received dental and hearing examinations, while all other students took the yearly vision tests. Flu injections, mobile chest x-rays, and blood tests were offered to the faculty and other school personnel. Individual counseling was also given to parents and students.












Defensively, Jim Conway turned in an excellent year at end, while Juniors Kelly Caloia and Steve Zupsich did commendable jobs in the line.




yard line with two minutes left to play.

#### Hardy Harriers Bring First State Championship to West

This year's cross-country season was the best in the history of distance running at Proviso West. 
#### Outstanding Record Brings Frosh-Soph Conference Title



There is some indication that this year's Freshman team is likely to be a strong contender for the 1968 State Gym-






## Varsity and JV Grapplers Surpass Previous Records





# Varsity Takes Third Place in Des Plaines Valley League






## Frosh-Soph Tennis Team Has New Coach in 1965

Put together with Mr. Larry Wells of Associates Engraving Company, and Mr. Norman Semmelroth of Record Printing and Advertising Company . . . add a group of eager editors . . . season well with an equally anxious sponsor these are the essential ingredients that produced the '65 Mural. Staff members kept on their toes while dealing with problems that demanded immediate action layouts to change . . . 50 "unknown" students to identify . . . 800 polka-dotted underclassmen pictures to handle . . . copy to write and rewrite . . . galleys and proofs to check . . . and revisions to make. Without the aid of Mrs. Wilma Dombrowski, our devoted business manager, and our enthusiastic and energetic advisor, Mrs. Jessie Veach, whose guidance and suggestions deserve an "All-American" rating, many of our worries would have been filed under "Mysteries."
