










East and West Share a Passport South






IBM PENCILS in hand, English students await Mrs. Momeyer's final instructions.



TOTAL COLLAPSE follows four and a half hours of trig, Latin, and chemistry exams.







Mr. Stubbs Says Goodbye to West And Teaching

For eight years they have moved through West's hallshesitant new faces in September replacing the triumphant ones June saw smiling beneath their mortar boards. Yet a school is more than its students. In many ways it is the lengthened shadow of the administration which gives it direction. And West is fortunate that during its entire eight years of existence it has had the informed and generous leadership of a single man-Edward W. Stubbsto give consistency and shape to its development. But his years at West are not Mr. Stubbs' sole contribution to Proviso Schools. For forty-one years, as teacher, department head, principal, and assistant superintendent he has made the problems of District 209 his own. Retiring this year, he leaves to all who knew him, briefly or at length, a legacy of intelligent, concerned service which is acknowledged with gratitude and upon which he can reflect with honest pride.

New Fieldhouse Marks Progress Of Board Plans

Faced with the almost unprecedented task of choosing two new superintendents in a single year as the result of the untimely death of Dr. Frederick Gottfried in October, the Board of Education for District 209 was also confronted by the routine, month-tomonth problems of administration of two large high schools.

Professional and business people in their own rights, they also handled the school's routine business with brisk efficiency.

The dedication of the new fieldhouse in November was a high point in the year, marking the completion of still another step in the Board's master plan for the development and expansion of Proviso High Schools.

Dr. F. J. Gottfried assumed his duties on July 1, 1965. He started his career in education as a teacher with a B.S. in education from Bowling Green State University. He later received his Ph.D. at Ohio State University. In a lifetime devoted to education Dr. Gottfried accomplished much, particularly for the schools of Elyria, Ohio where he had served as Superinter dent of Schools for twelve years be fore coming to Proviso Township. Aft er serving Proviso for only three months, Dr. Gottfried died suddenly Saturday, October 2, in Cleveland Ohio, of a coronary thrombosis.

He was part of West for such a little while. The red flowers edging the mall outside his office window were not even touched by frost the morning of October 6 when the school paused, observing the ritual moment of silence because he would not come back again to his big desk in the main office. He came in July, so he never saw the snow sift across the mall bleachers, or the magnolia bloom in April outside E Building. He had not even had time to learn the names of many of the men and women with whom he had come to work, but he had already made his presence felt. Alert, attentive, the force of his intention, of his planning for the school was already evident. West and the entire community is poorer without him.



Dr. Hoover Faces Challenge With Quiet Efficiency

"If you want a job well-done, ask a busy man to do it," would certainly apply to Dr. Hoover. This year he served not only in his regular capacity as Assistant Superintendent in Charge of Instruction, but as Interim Superintendent of District 209 as well. Dr. Gottfried's death made it mandatory that someone familiar with the District step into the gap until a new superintendent could be found. Dr. Hoover's versatility and unusually wide experience in both teaching and administration fitted him well for the difficult task of filling two positions.

Night School Has New Courses, New Director

As the new Director of Continuing Education, Mr. Stanley was in charge of 1600 enrollees in a separate school within the school. He ran Proviso's evening school during the year and later, when summer vacation sent most students scurrying from homework, he operated the summer school. This year classes in photography, IBM, key punch, Italian, and second-year Greek were added to the curriculum of the night school. Another of his duties was to discover federal and state money available to Proviso schools. His diligence in this task materialized in the form of federally supported courses in practical nursing, business machines, as well as in data-processing.

Gusloff Guides Students As West's New Dean

West's Dean of Students and Assistant Dean were new to their titles this year but not to the responsibilities and problems of their positions. As a former counselor, assistant and associate dean, and dean-counselor of West's students in summer school, Mr. Gusloff was particularly well-equipped to assume his new duties. Mr. Wede, who has been a member of the coaching staff and concerned with the supervision of extra-curricular activities since the opening of West in 1954, also found himself on familiar ground in dealing with the frequent crises in D-112. But when the last student left the halls the deans' work was not always over since fun-nights, ball games and all other extra-curricular activities were also their concern.






DE Progam Adds Vitality to Business Ed





Versatile, Varied English Program Challenges All

Seniors swapped grammar for Aristotle in College Preparatory English classes this year. Students who had scored in the upper percentiles on the required Purdue High School English test were eligible to join the independent study program which permitted them to work in the library researching extra literature while their classmates drilled on grammar.

Team teaching became the rule, rather than the exception in West's English department this year under its new chairman, Mr. Glenn Rittmueller. Large Freshman and Sophomore team-teaching classes for the first time were broken into small discussion groups similar to those used in Junior and Senior classes. These seminar sessions were introduced to allow underclassmen in large lecture sessions an opportunity to express their own opinions and interpretations of literature.





The old general science routine of note-taking and watching an occasional teacher-demonstration was smashed this year by the new course developed last summer by Mr. Diedrich and Mr. Spires. The subject matter ranged from water softening to atomic structure. The new methods employed include student experiments like those in chemistry classes which intrigue pupils by allowing them to solve problems themselves. The students paired off into lab partners who worked together in probing the natural world with their simple equipment and lab kits.




Library Caters To Both Readers And Listeners

This year about fifty new books took their places every week on the shelves of West's library where some 24,000 volumes were already available for use of students and faculty. A glance at the titles on a typical acquisition list which might include a book on printing, a new biography, and other books dealing with anything from child care to Chaucer was evidence that the long, bright, booklined room was very genuinely the academic heart of the school.

But the supplying of books was not the only function of the library. This year saw a greatly expanded use of the school's collection of more than 400 tapes. Some of these recordings were played more than 1000 times by students attempting to familiarize themselves with the sounds of a new language as well as the appearance of the words on the printed page.

New Director Satisfies Need for Teaching Aids



Special Clinics– Braille, Vowels, Speed Reading

A quiet clatter accompanied many teachers' lectures this year as West's three blind students punched class notes on their braille typewriters. With special tutoring from Mrs. Buhrow, these pupils took the same exams that stumped some of their classmates and learned to knit during gym periods.

While Mrs. Stuit employed pantomime to explain the meanings of difficult words, ten deaf students practiced speech therapy exercises in their amplifier-studded work room.

Students from all four classes who were determined to improve their reading comprehension rate spent an hour each day in the reading clinic where they raced a stop watch or struggled to keep pace with words and phrases flashing across a screen.











Future Nurses' Service Project: Clothe Orphans











This year's Junior Varsity wrestling squad completed the season with a 3-6 win-loss record.





Larry Hallaert received the Most Valuable Senior award in 1965.






















