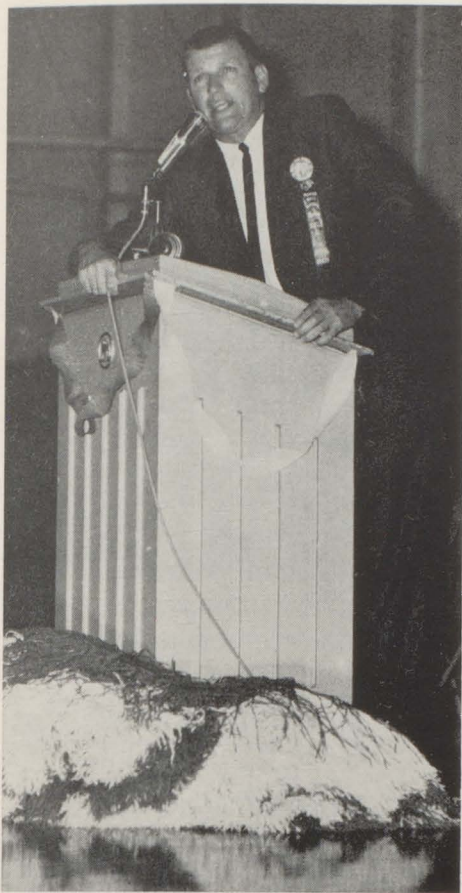

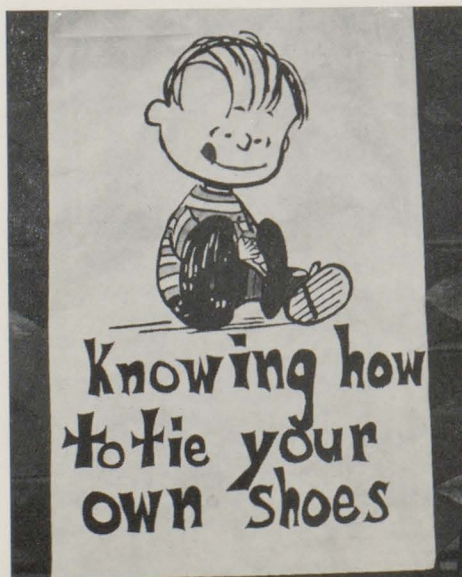

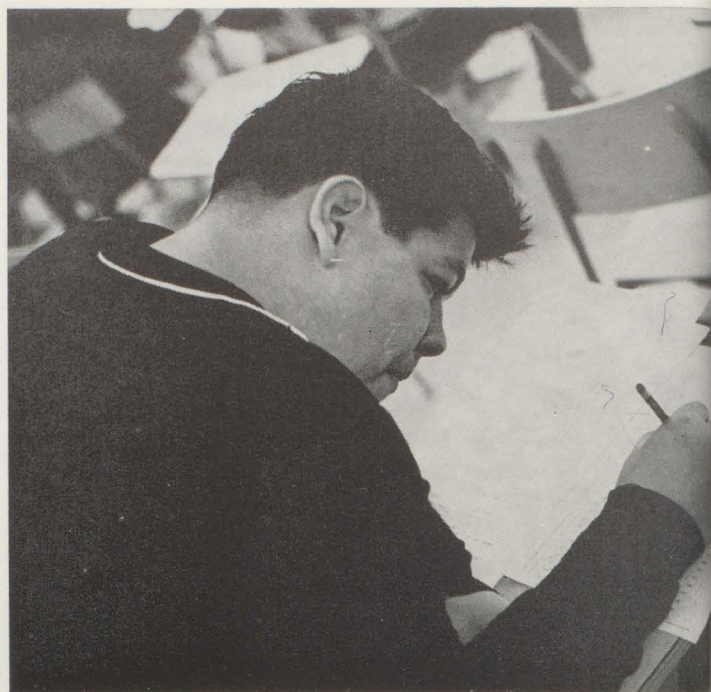

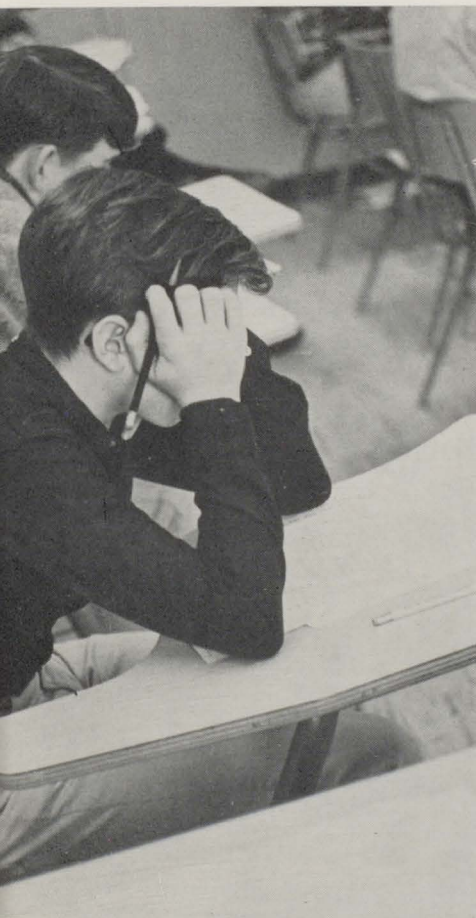

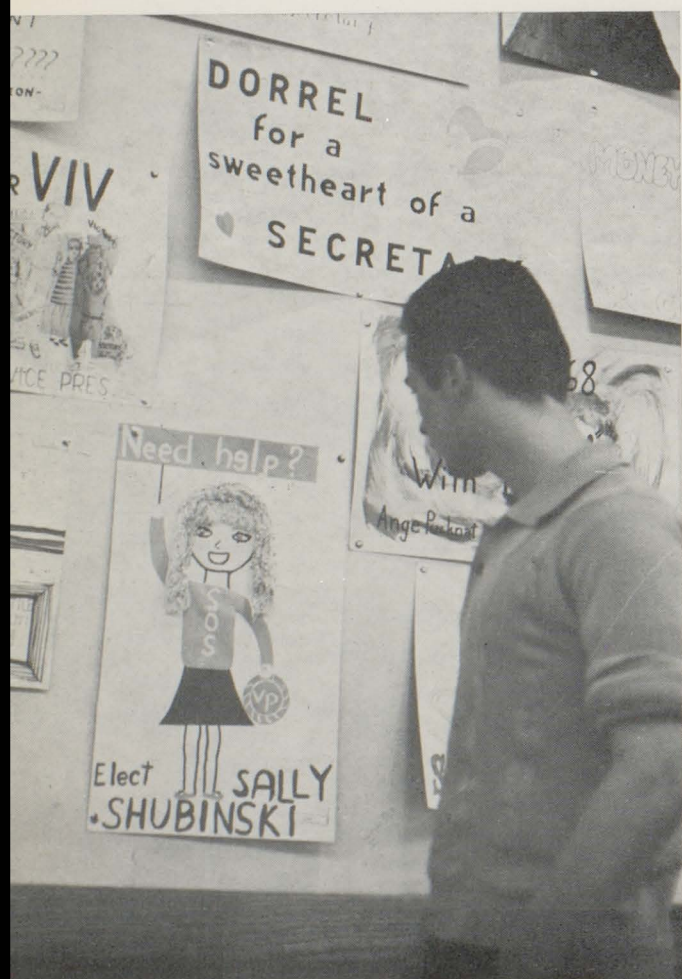

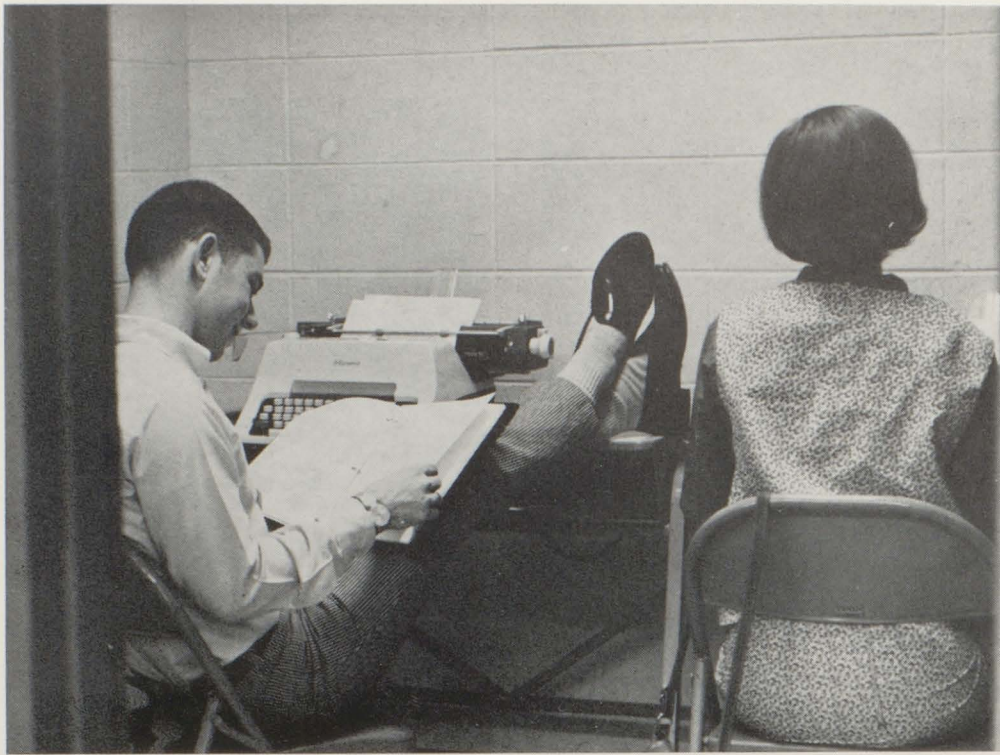

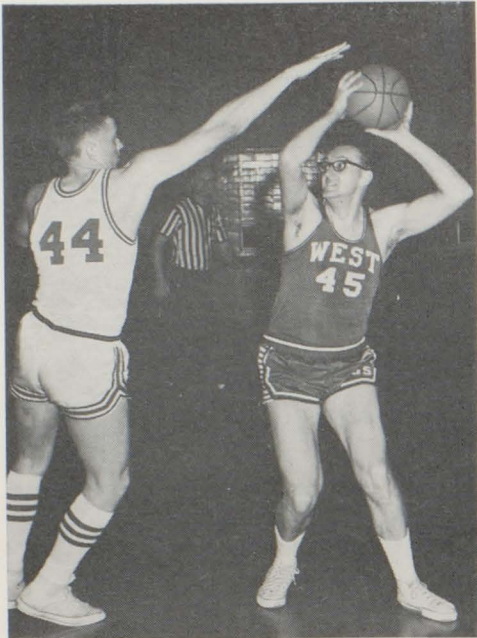

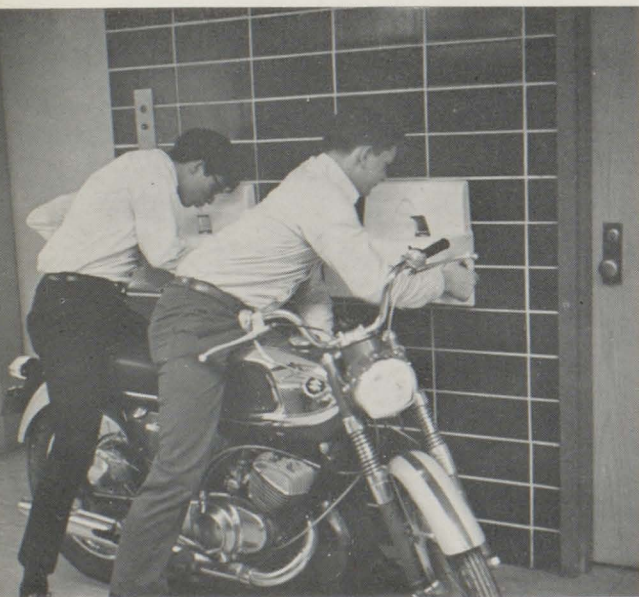

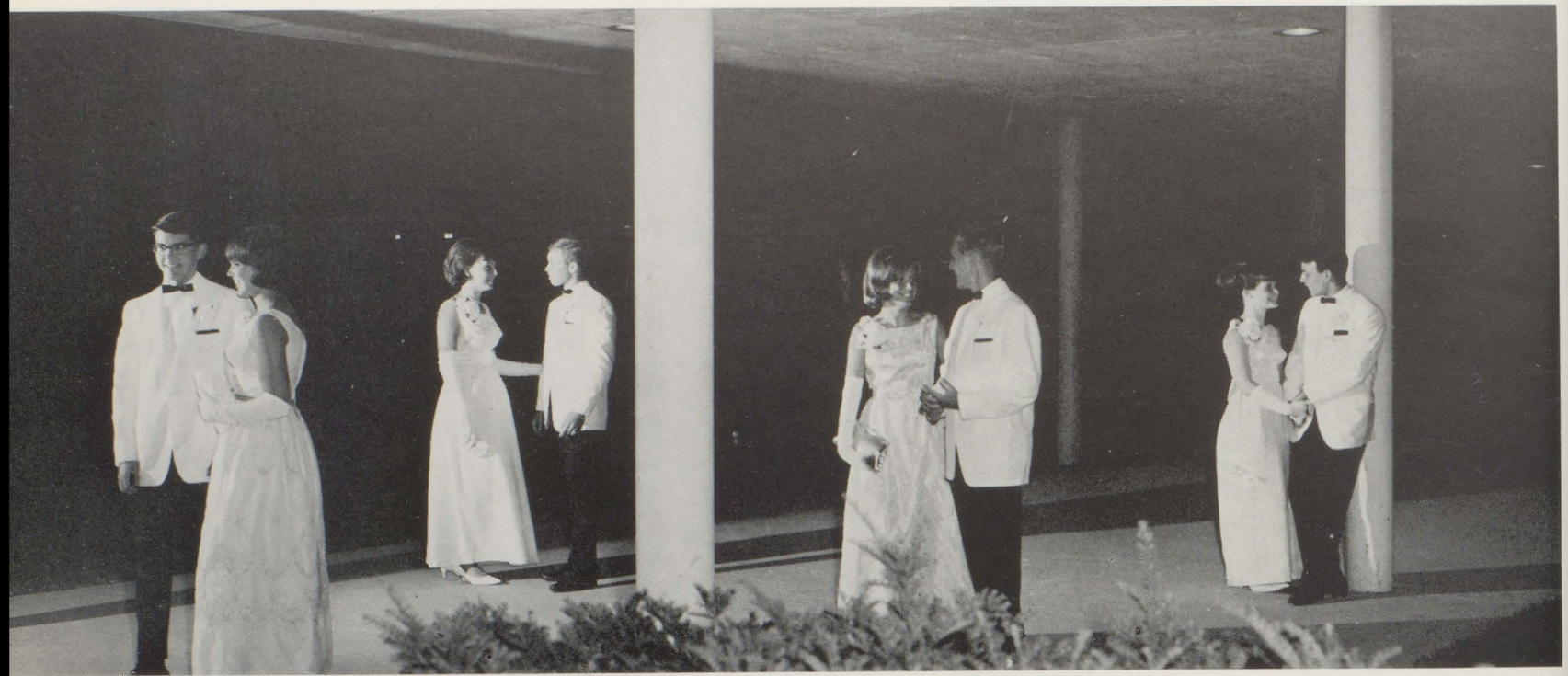

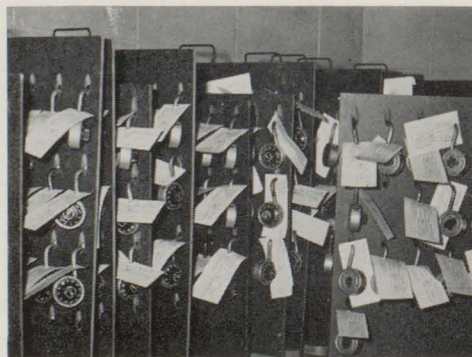

Dr. Norman Green, District Superintendent

Proviso High Schools Meet Their New Superintendent

When Dr. Norman Green assumed his duties as Superintendent of District 209 at the beginning of the school year, he brought an impressive background of experience and training to the position. Originally from Massachusetts, Dr. Green came to East Aurora as Superintendent in 1959. For some seven years previous to his East Aurora assignment, he had served in a variety of administrative posts in Iowa. His work in Aurora, however, provided extensive opportunities to become thoroughly cognizant of the problems and responsibilities peculiar to the direction of a suburban high school in the Chicago area.

Dr. Green's practical experience is fortified by a formal

preparation no less impressive. Having received his bachelor's degree from the New England Conservatory of Music, he obtained his master's in educational administration and supervision at Boston University. The State University of Iowa at Iowa City granted him the doctor of philosophy degree in educational administration. He has also done graduate work at Drake University and Northern Illinois University. Dr. Green lives in Aurora, is married and has five children. Though most of his working days are spent at his official base of operations—the Office of the Superintendent at Proviso East—West's faculty and students were aware throughout the year of Dr. Green's concern and interest in the district as a whole.

West's Fieldhouse Complete Board Plans East Addition

What is a Board of Education? First of all it is seven men and women elected at two-year intervals and entrusted with the responsibility for using that portion of the community resources set aside for education with reasonable acumen and effectiveness. Board members are not paid salaries; they meet for long hours on evenings they might be more pleasantly engaged; they are frequently the objects of criticism and dissatisfaction; yet they have their rewards. Few other activities allow a citizen to place his finger so directly on the pulse of the world that is in the making, or to concern himself with problems of greater importance.

Though the majority of the Board have served for an average of six years, the dean of District 209's Board of Education is Mr. Fred Meyer who has served for twenty-five years, the longest term of duty in the district's history. During his tenure he has seen the doubling of the school's enrollment, the construction of Proviso West's campus and the steady expansion of East's facilities including last year's field house at West and the current addition of ten new rooms at East.

Decisions involving building, curriculum and staff are not the only matters that come within the Board's province. The Big Snow of January 1967 necessitated the Board's action in closing the schools. It was the first time West had been so closed in its nine year existence.

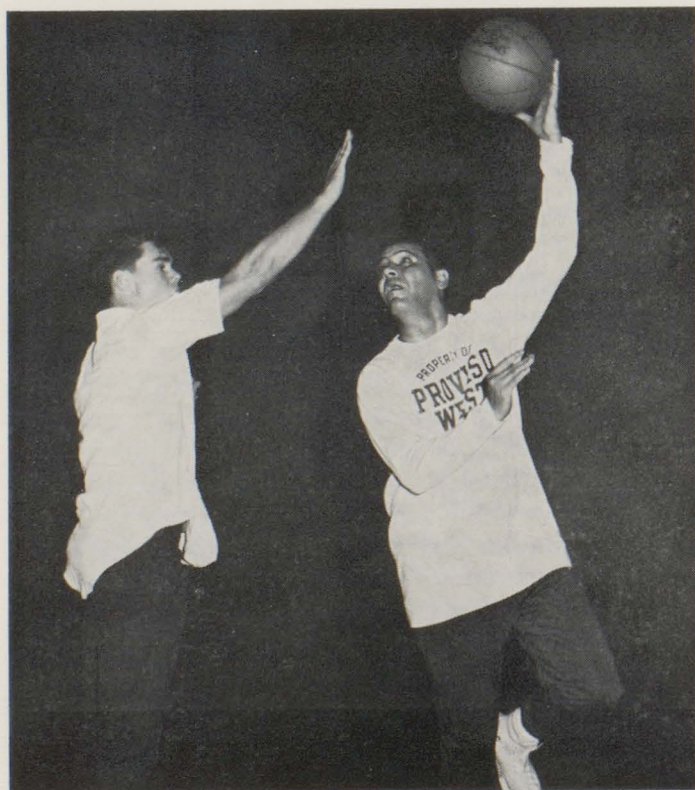

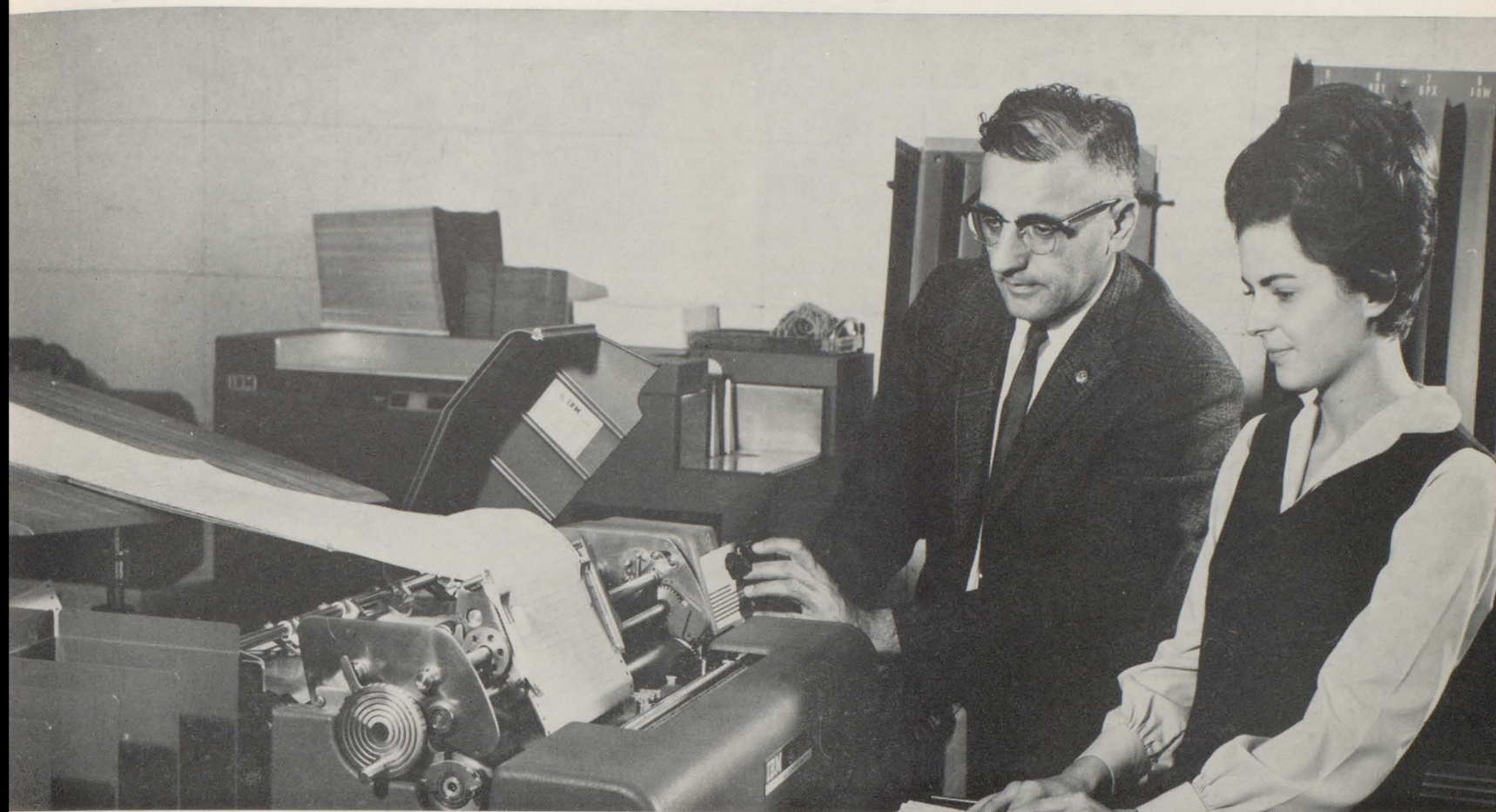

Mr. Gerald DeWitt Assumes Direction of Proviso West

In September he was only a name, pronounced with some trepidation by both faculty and students, but by June the vigor and warmth of West's new principal permeated the school, and his tall figure had become as familiar to students as faculty. Shooting baskets in the gym before school, speaking informally to a counseling class, stopping for a moment of friendly talk in the Commons—he managed to merge his more demanding official duties with participation in the daily give-and-take of school life.

Mr. DeWitt is not a stranger to Northern Illinois, having served from 1963 to 1966 as principal of East Aurora High School. Previously he was both high school basketball coach and biology teacher in Crawfordsville, Indiana and a high school principal in Indianapolis. He received his BS from Butler University in Indianapolis and his MS from Indiana University in Bloomington. Mr. DeWitt lives in Westchester and has two young sons.

Imagination Plus Computer Increase Office Efficiency

Two innovations this year have literally cut weeks of work from the schedule of the office staff. Both are the result of the teaming of West's new 1440 computer and the imagination and enterprise of Mr. Vallicelli, the man directly responsible for the activities of "the office" and "the machines room." A computer form, tailored to West's needs by Mr. Val now makes it possible to print and file permanent records for the entire school in a few hours—a task that formerly took weeks of painstaking hand labor. In addition, the making of student identification cards has also been redesigned as a computer operation. Since the printing of report cards and class scheduling were computer tasks even before West owned a 1440, an enormous volume of work is done with amazing efficiency by an office staff that has increased very little during the past nine years.

Busy Administrators Mesh Gears of Two Great Schools

Students of Proviso West sometimes fail to realize that West is only half of the functioning educational unit which is District 209. Problems which concern both Proviso West and her sister school, Proviso East, are the province of Dr. Hoover as well as, to a lesser degree, Mr. Stanley and Mr. Vandevender.

As Assistant Superintendent in Charge of Instruction, Dr. Hoover is responsible for hiring and supervision of the faculties of both schools. As a result he divides his time between West and East, maintaining offices at both places.

Mr. Stanley, as Director of Continuing Education, is in charge of the extensive program of evening classes held at both West and East as well as the summer school. In addition he is concerned with applications for federal and state monies for which District 209 may be eligible.

Mr. Vandevender, serving his second year as Director of Testing and Guidance, as his title suggests, supervises the extensive all-school testing program conducted at both East and West. In addition he serves as co-ordinator of District 209's entire counselling program.

But the Deans' concern with individual student problems and discipline, with extra-curricular activities and general school morale was as keen as ever.

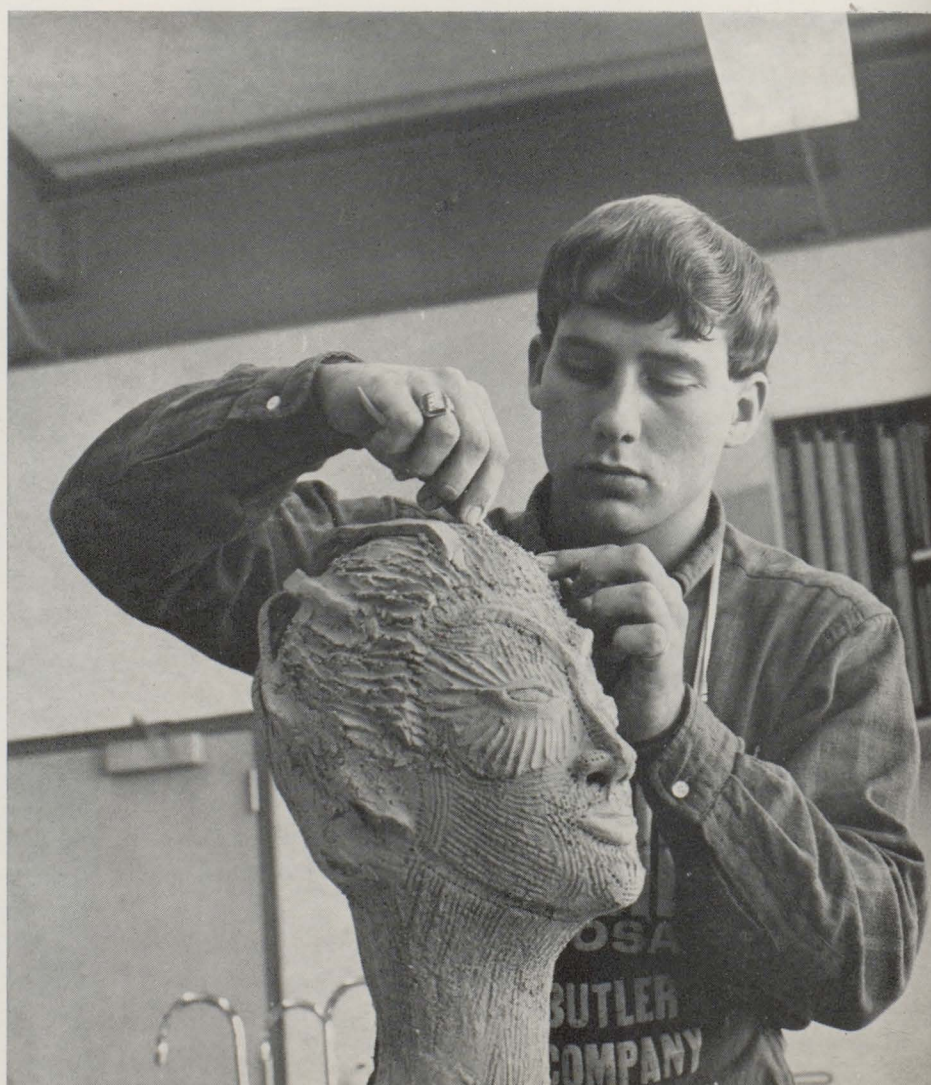
Art Students Shape Objects Both Useful and Beautiful

Nothing could be less attractive than a lump of damp, grayish clay, yet every year a ton of the stuff is rolled, pinched, patted and scraped by members of Mrs. Rickert's crafts classes into objects of great variety and undeniable beauty. Students respond to the challenge of the unlimited possibilities which raw clay presents by fashioning useful bowls and vases, but they also produce purely ornamental terra cotta sculpture of startling originality and charm. Sculpture projects this year included life-size heads, a torso and a whole family of dinosaurs. Ceramic bowls and pots can be thrown on the potter's wheel or built up by the same slab and coil techniques used by ancient potters. Once the raw clay is shaped, it is glazed to add color and make it water proof. The glaze is fused to the clay during an eight-hour firing at 900 degrees fahrenheit in the large twenty-six inch kiln conveniently located in the crafts studio.

Other art classes work in other mediums, however, from tempera and chalk to oils. Acknowledgement of West's artists' versatility is the 1966 Citation for National Achievement in Art from the National High School Art Exhibition sponsored by Scholastic Publications, the third such citation in three successive years.

Audio-lingual Approach Makes Latin Come Alive

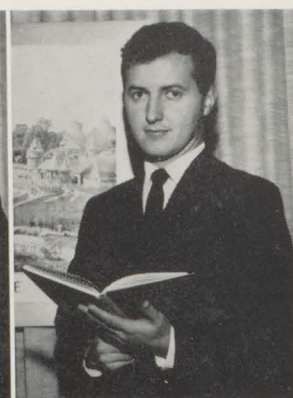

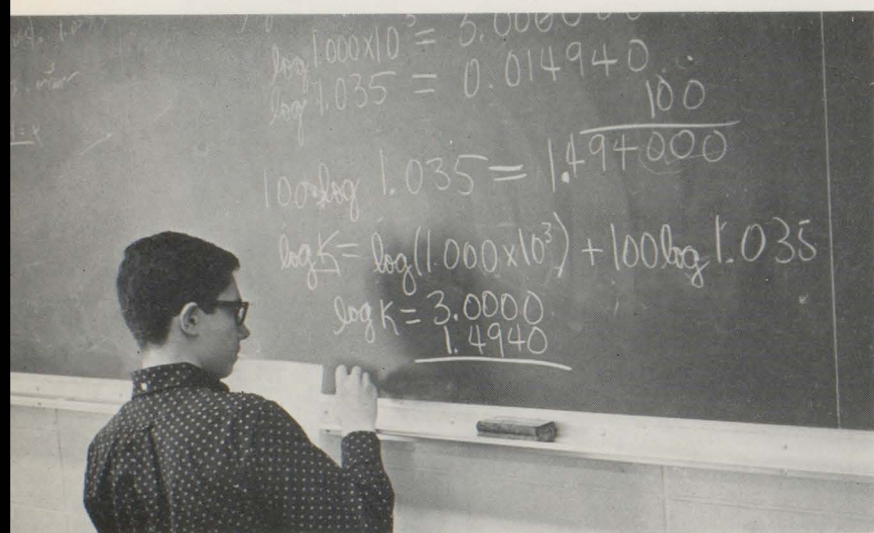

The philosophy of the "new math" which attempts to instill in students understanding of the "why" of mathematics as well as the "how" underlies West's entire mathematics curriculum from math fundamentals to calculus.

In math fundamentals some students are enjoying the benefits of Project Head Start which was initiated last summer for a select group of Proviso freshmen. Imaginative and concerned teaching at this level has produced impressive results as registered on standardized achievement tests.

In addition to traditional courses in algebra and geometry, students seriously interested in math filled two classes of calculus and one of college algebra and trigonometry. Also, breaking ground in a new field of high school math instruction were some ninety students in computer programming. Introduced last year this course utilized the school's 1440 and 1401 computers.

P. E. Creates Competitive Spirit Within a New Format

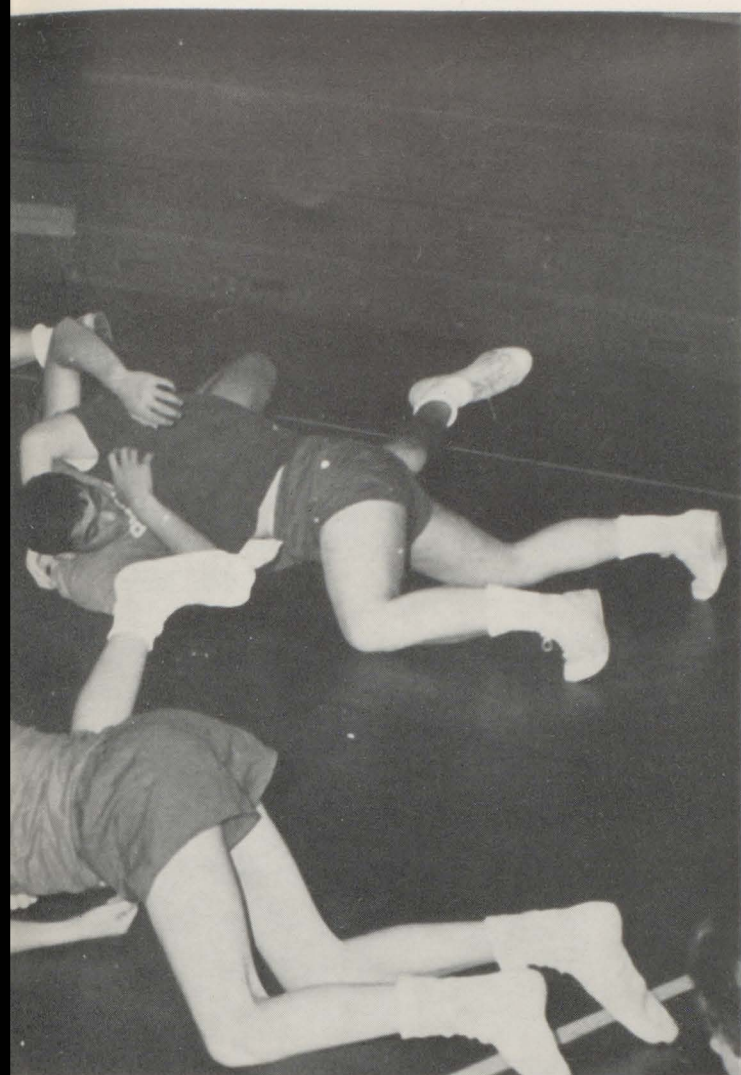

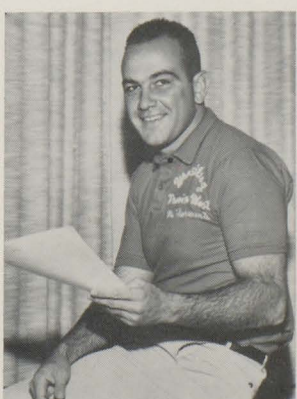

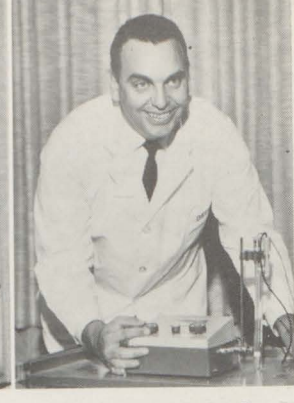

Biology II Students Feed White Rats Experimental Diets

To a Biology II student, the rows of baby rats in Mr. Slimmer's biology room were more than just fluffy white balls of fur. The rats were used in vitamin deficiency experiments which ran three months. The experiments were conducted in two parts. In the first part the rats were deprived of a vitamin and the effects noted. In the second phase of the experiments the rats were fed the withheld vitamin to see if normal health was restored. A few students tested the effects of massive doses of vitamin as well.

While Biology students investigated the intricacies of physiology, Senior Science students did college-level work in both physics and chemistry. Chosen from seniors who had already taken both chemistry and physics, the Senior Science class permitted much greater freedom for individual investigation and preparation for late specialization in science.

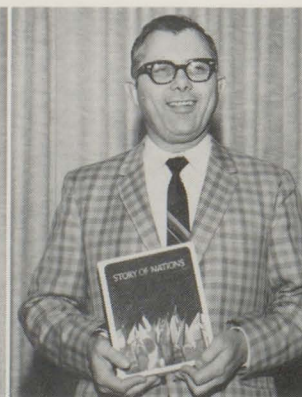

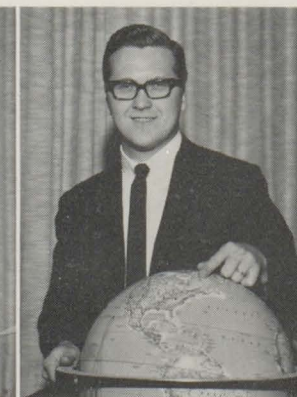

In addition to history courses of the traditional variety, classes in sociology introduced the background causes of social change, and psychology classes explored the basic patterns of learning as demonstrated at their most primitive level in experiments with rats in a maze. Geography films further broadened students' horizons.

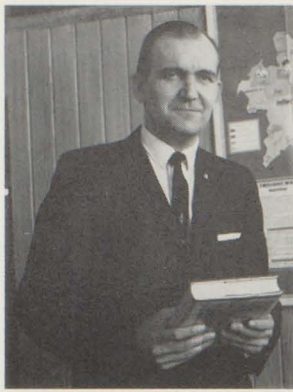

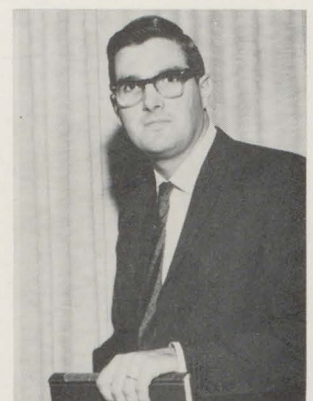

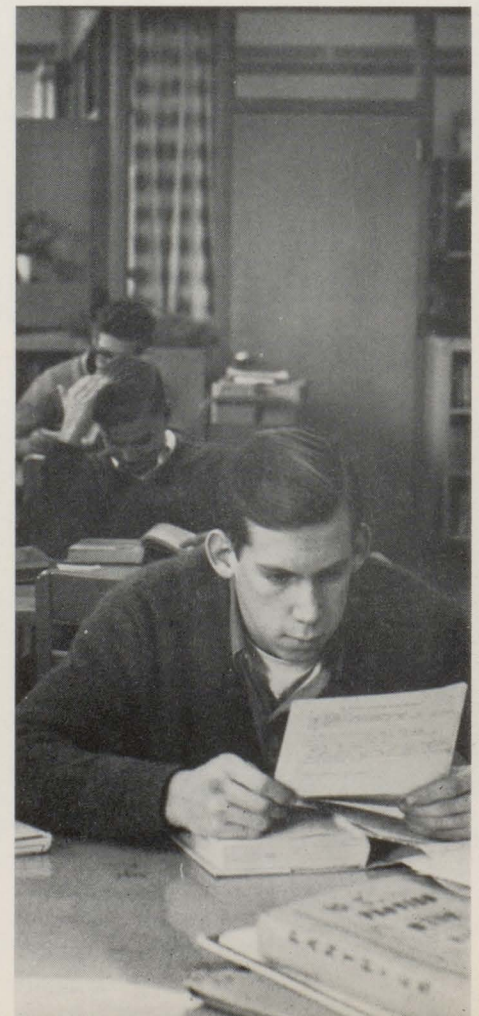

Audio-Visual Aids Learning With Movies, Duplicators

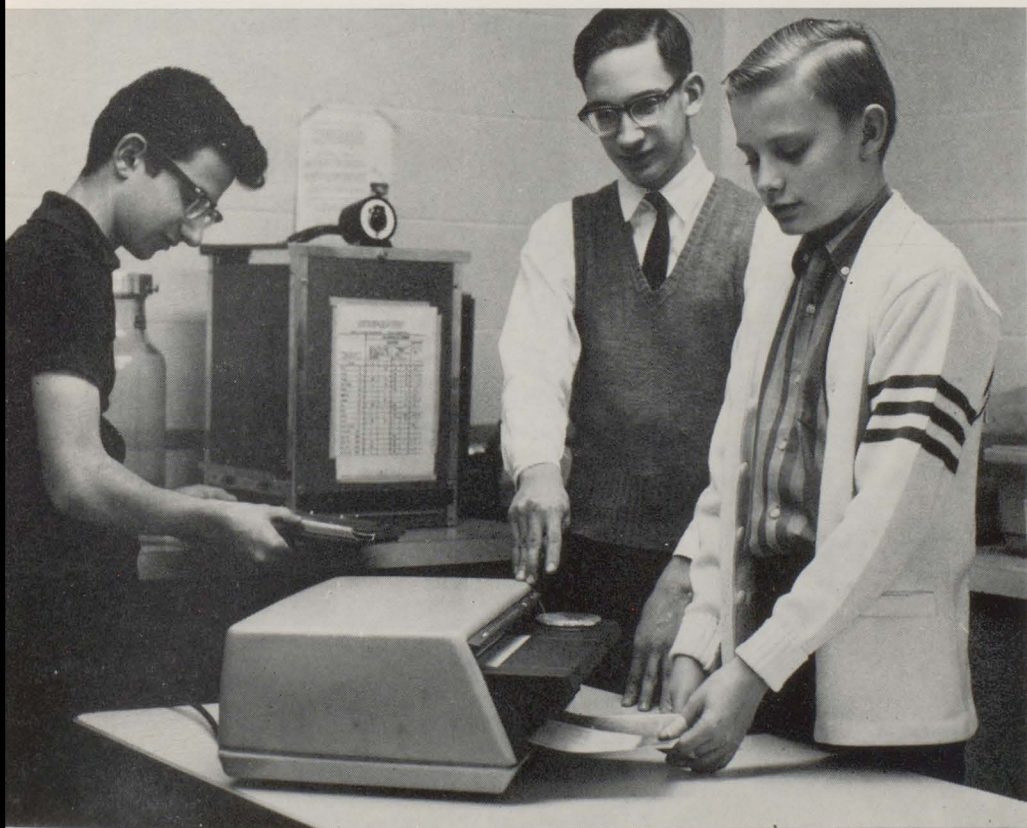
Visual Education is important to the educational program of Proviso West. A new copy room was the main feature of the Audio-Visual Department this year. It is equipped with the latest Thermo-Fax Duplicators, dry photocopiers, a Copy Ease book copier, translifts for laminating, a Diazachrome for colored transparencies, ditto machine and an executive-type electric typewriter. Equipment is available for faculty use and Cine Club members also assist.

Copying, however, is only one facet of Visual Education. In addition, classroom teachers have access to record players, tape recorders, overhead opaque projectors, 16 m.m. sound and silent films, filmstrip and 35 m.m. slide projectors.

Instruction is given in the use of all equipment because the equipment is not useful unless it is used. Proviso's visual aids do not gather dust. They are used extensively to help students grasp important principles in all areas of instruction.

Special Services Strengthen Regular Curriculum at West.

The standard curriculum offerings at West are supplemented by special services which included this year, two teachers of the blind, an expanded and very busy reading center, and a social counsellor.

In the headquarters in C Building Mrs. Buhrow and Mrs. Hastalis prepared brailled reading materials and gave additional advice and assistance to West's fourteen blind students who moved unassisted to classes, took part in student government, studied Spanish and German, struggled with obtuse angles in geometry and even swam in the pool and worked out on trampolines in physical education.

The reading center bulged with students working on their own study time to improve reading speed and comprehension under the direction of English teachers, Mrs. Dvergsdahl, Miss Dettmer, and Mrs. Wood. At the center each student, after diagnostic tests, worked to develop his individual weaknesses.

As director of the speech and hearing clinic, Mr. Moore made West his headquarters for diagnostic work, though no deaf students attended Proviso West this year. Mrs. Newbrough was available for a great variety of problems which busy class counselors were not always in a position to deal.

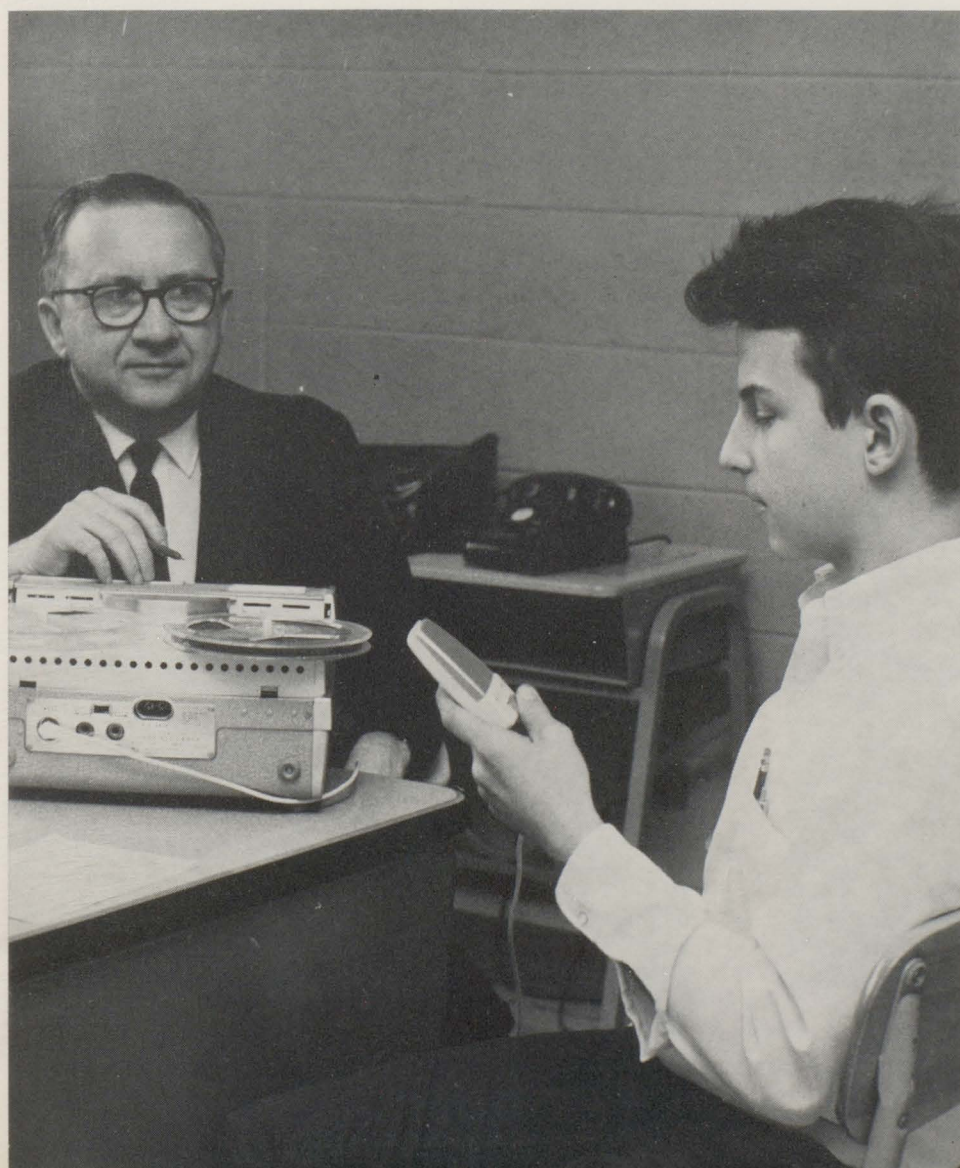

Between administering eye tests to every class, one at a time, handling any medical emergencies that might arise, giving the Physical Education Department an assist in making yearly physical examinations for students to take preventative measures to protect their health, the nurses, in the course of one school year, aid 8,200 students, more than twice the number of students and faculty at West. 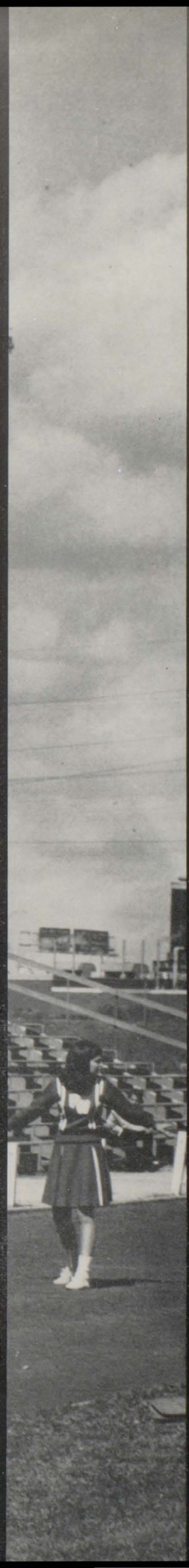

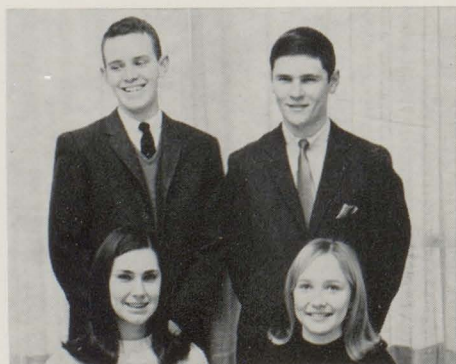

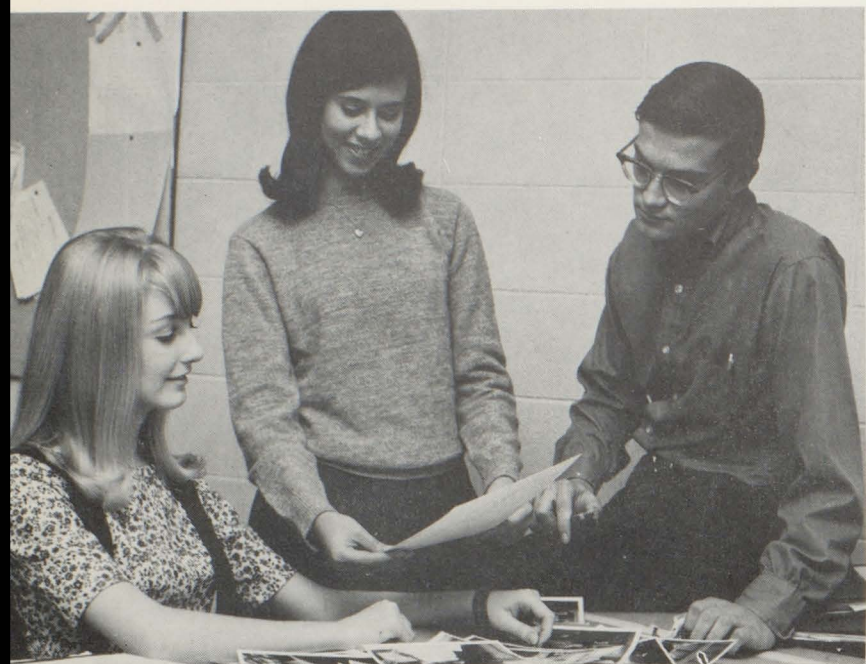

Yet, one fine day in April, the editors, staff and advisor gave a united sigh of relief as the book went to the press at last.

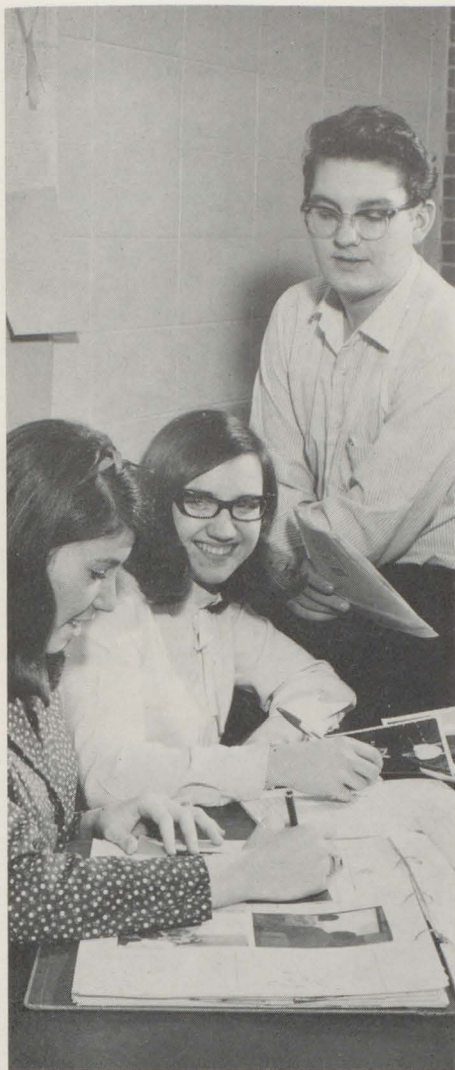
Despite the seemingly un-coordinated actions of the Mural editors they got things done. To prove it, the book has received the Medalist award three times and the All-American rating twice.

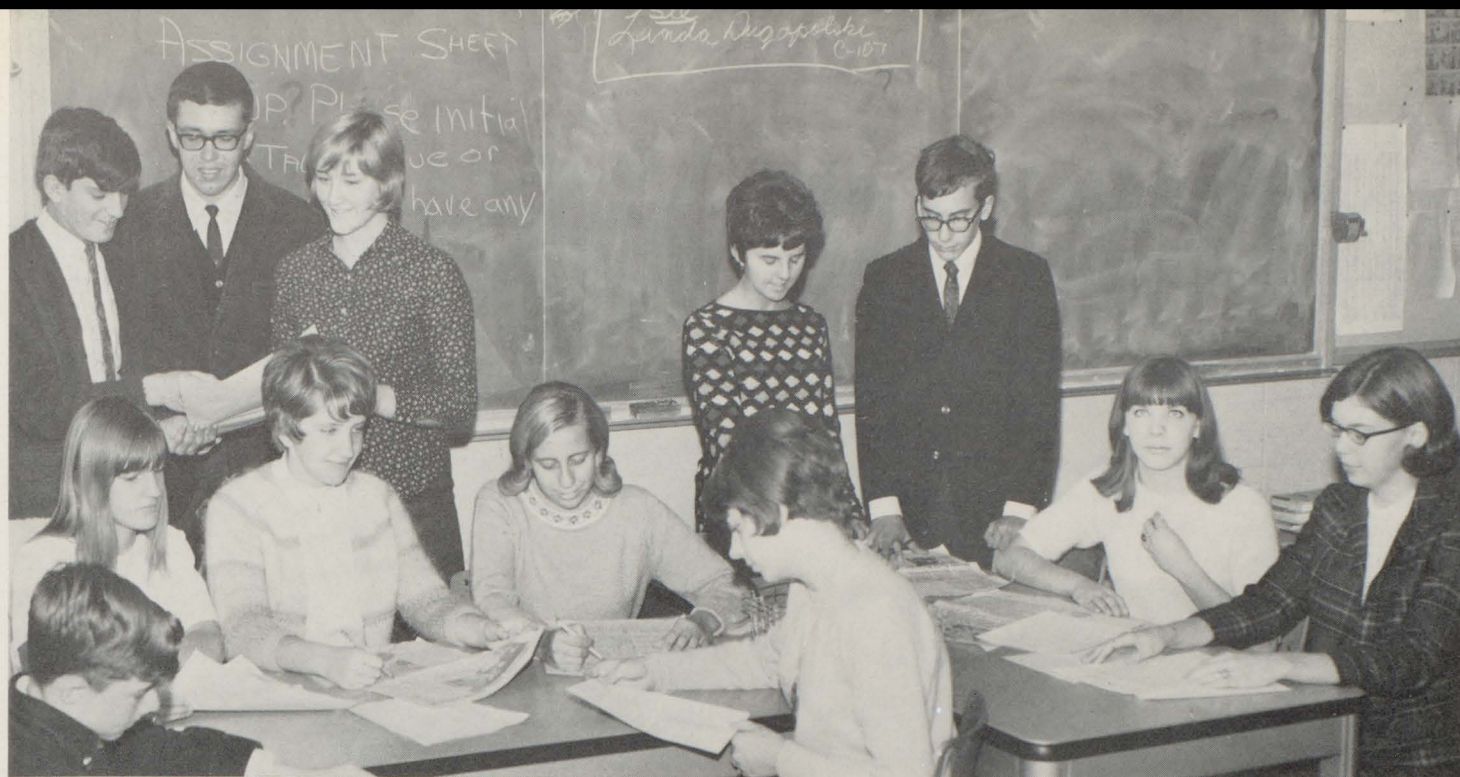

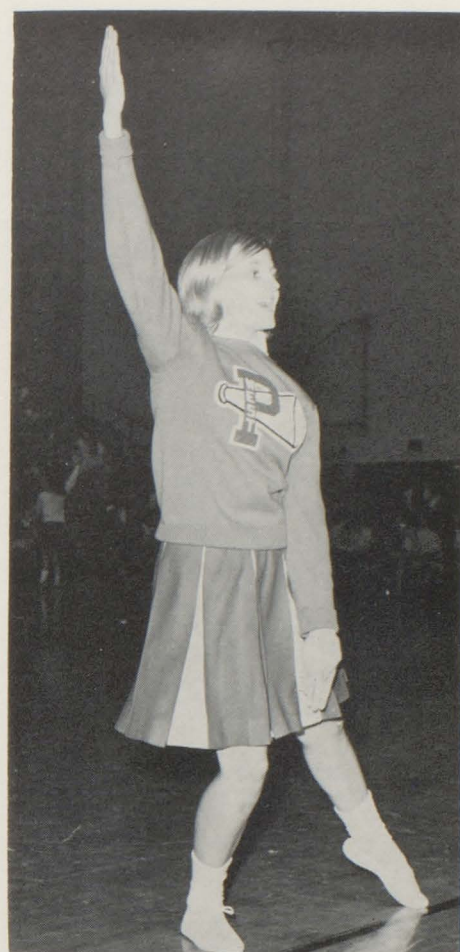

Force of 171 Monitors Patrols West's Maze of Long Halls

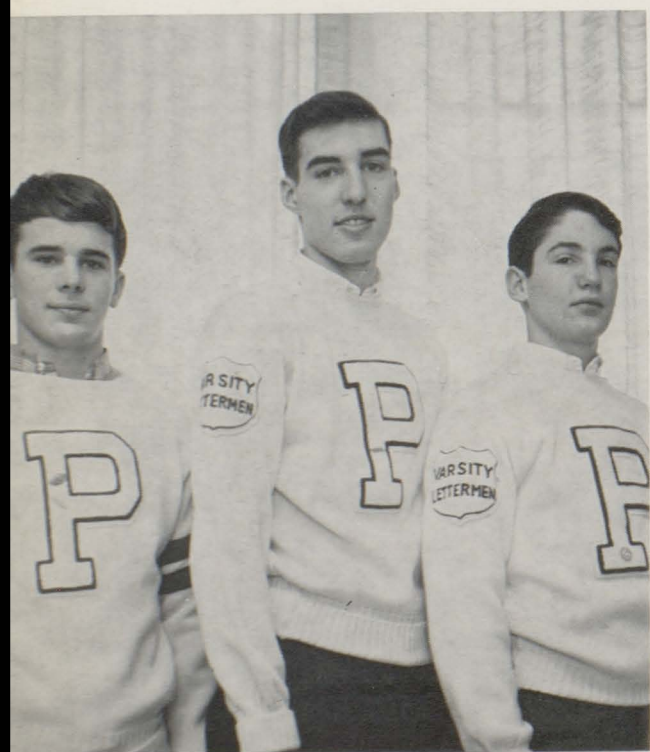

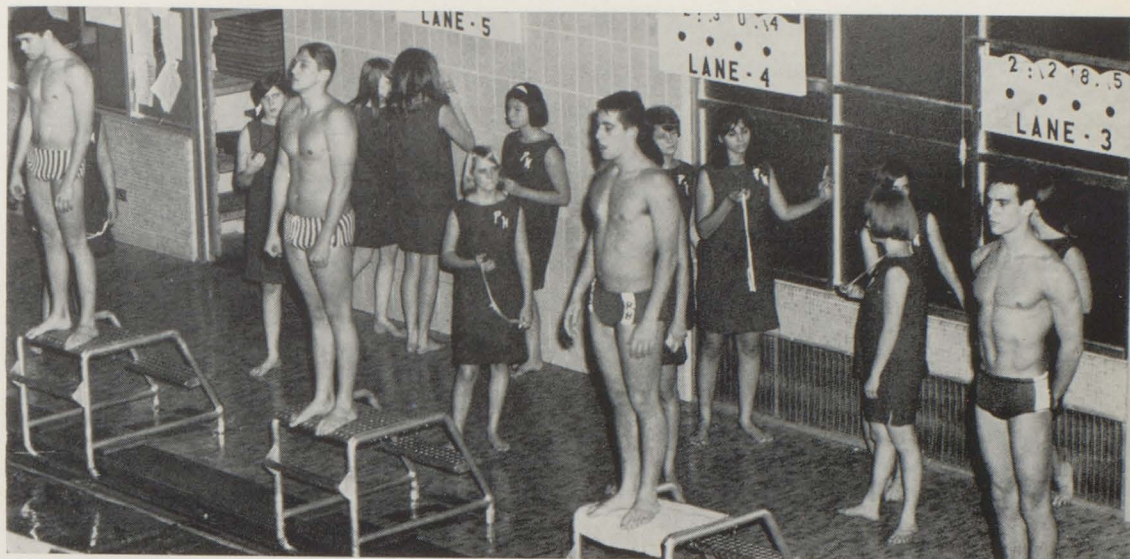

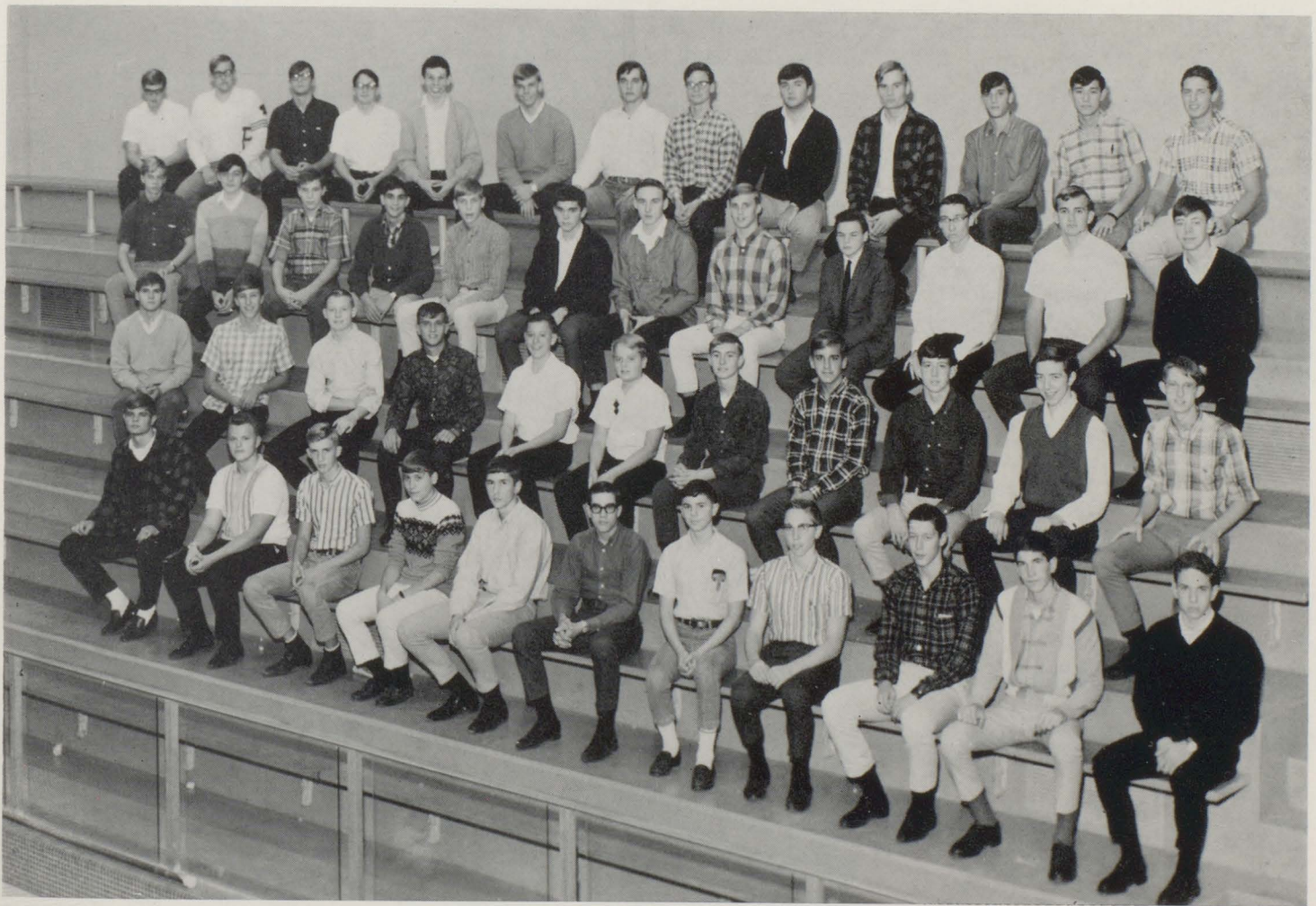

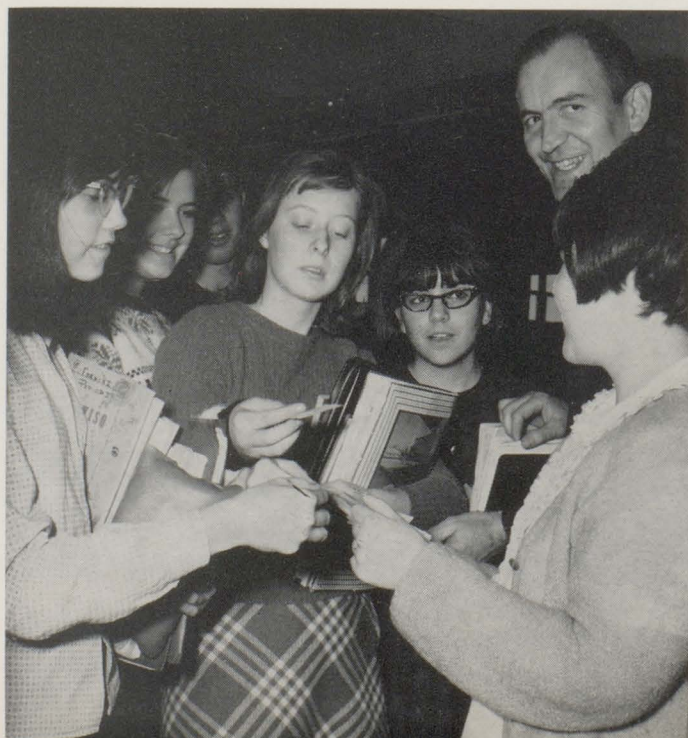

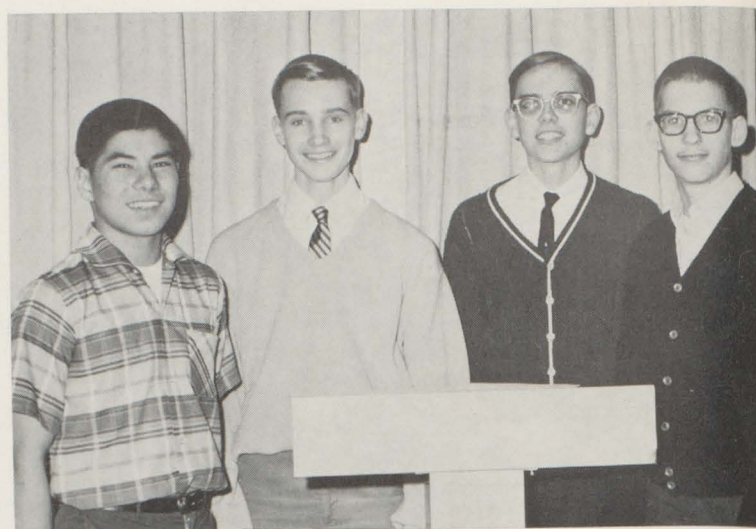

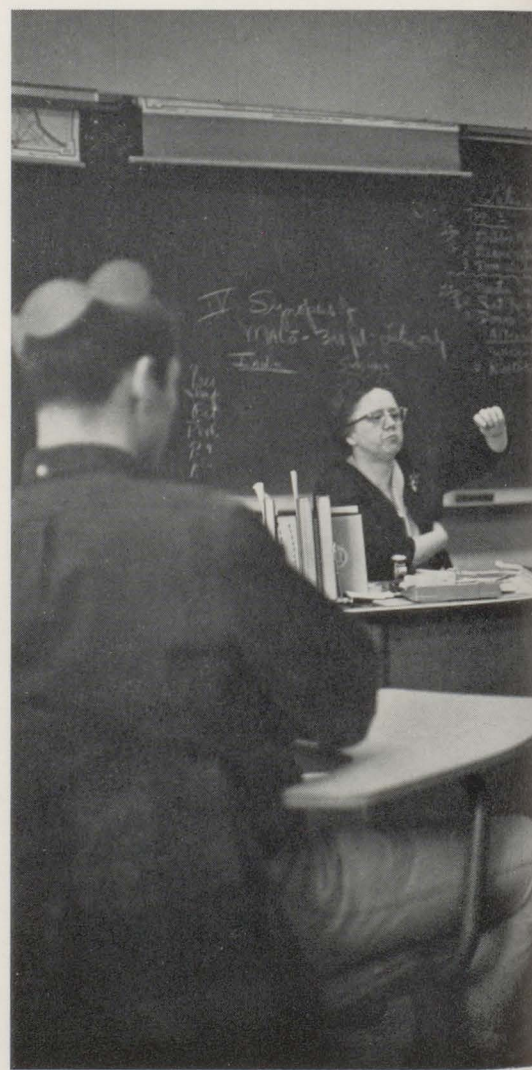

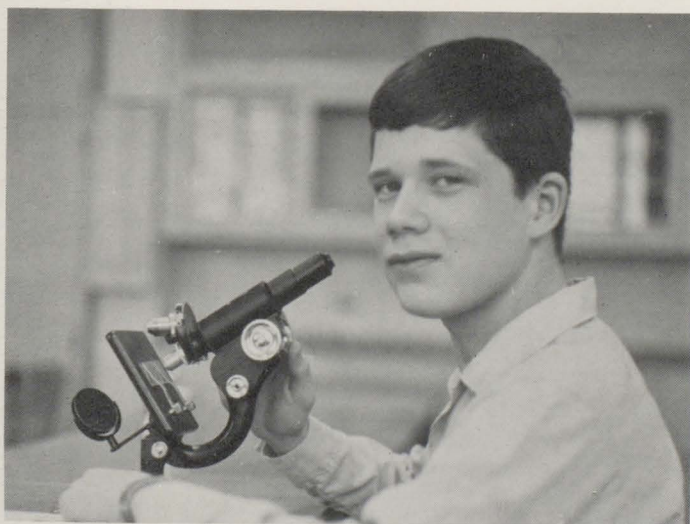

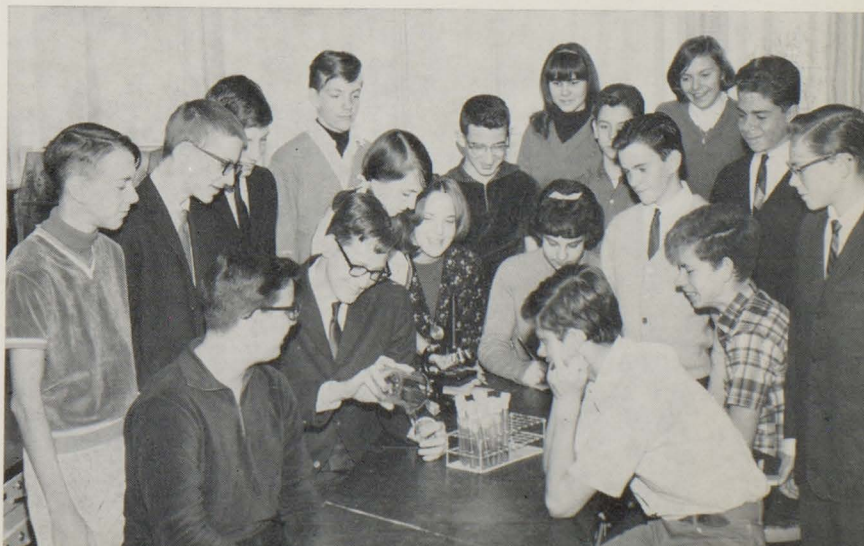
Curious Students Search for Wonders in Science Club

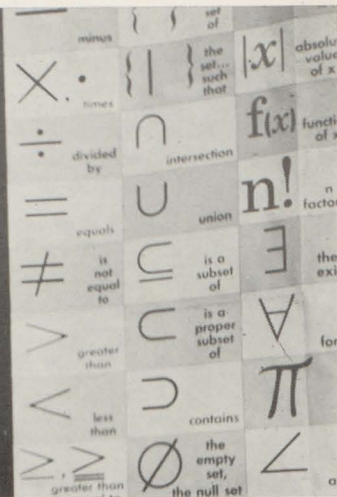
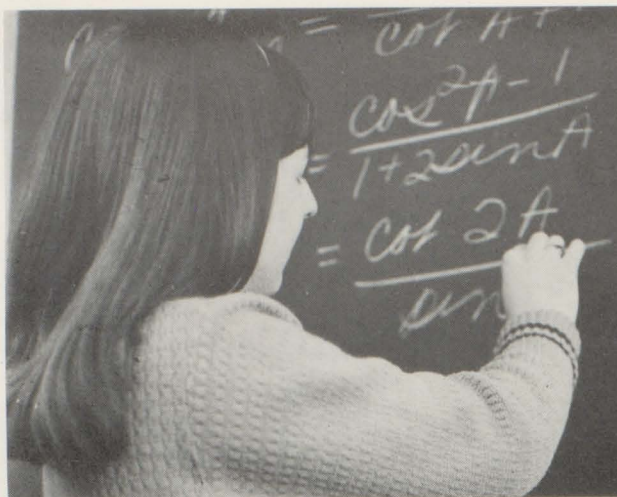

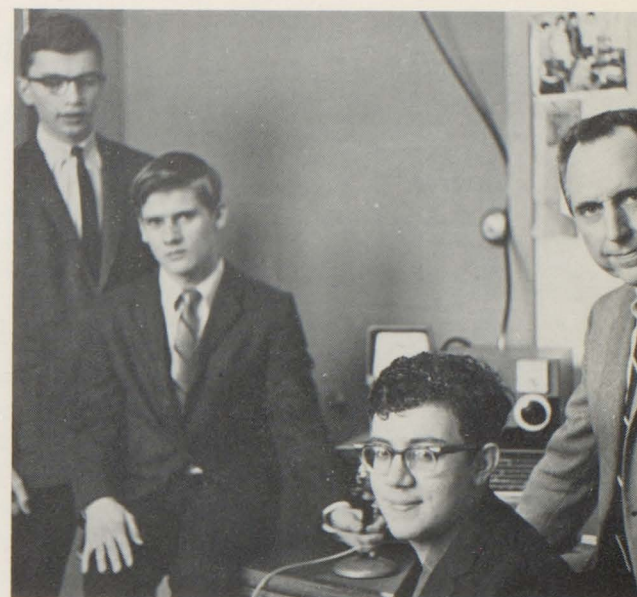

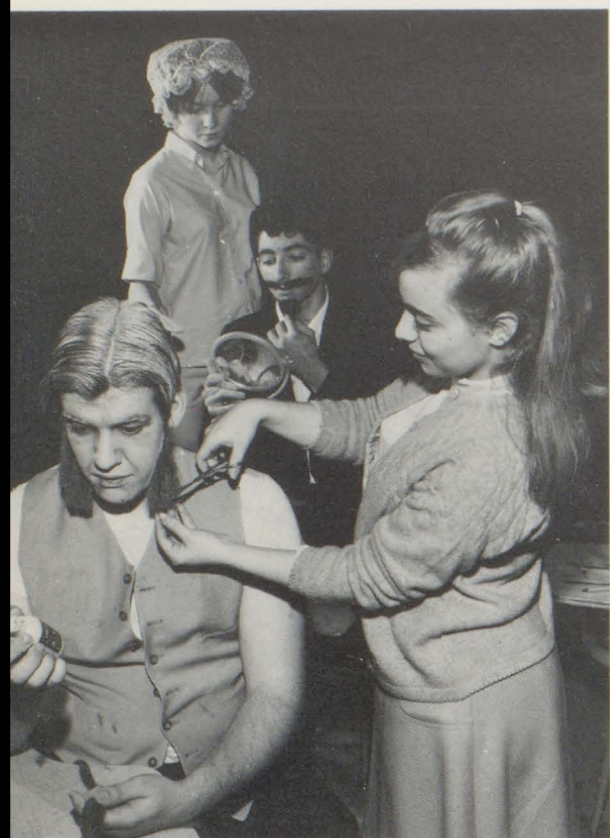

This new heading was found on playbills for all-school plays this year because members of Thespians added so much to the quality of these fine presentations.

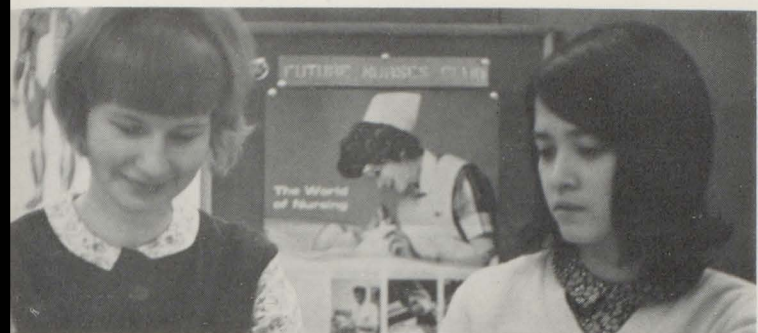

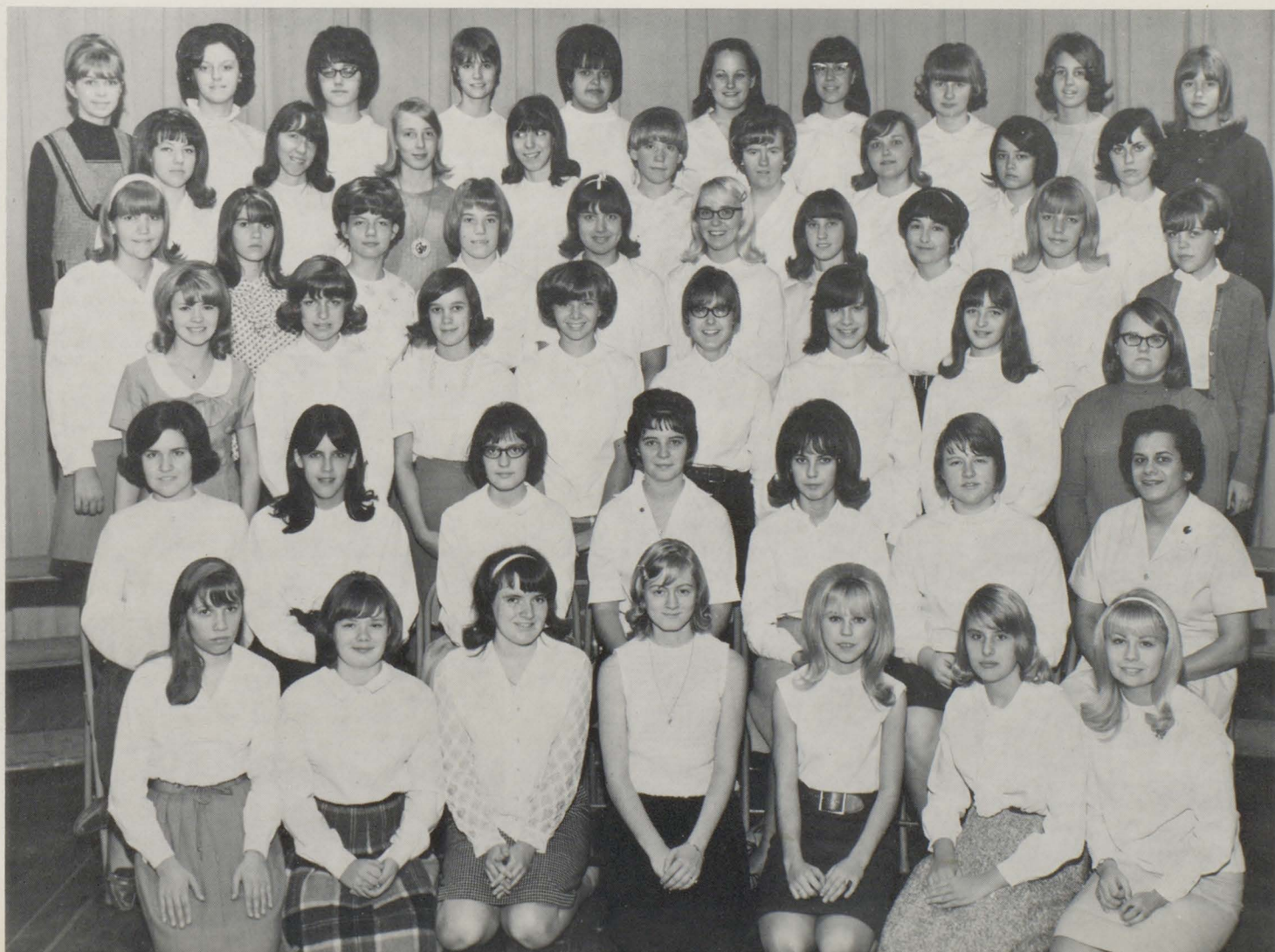

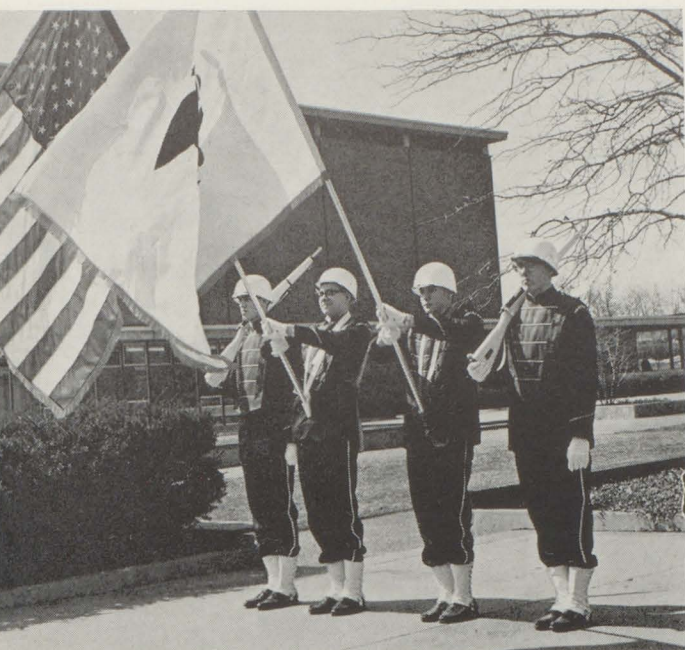

Representative at State Is West Orchestra First

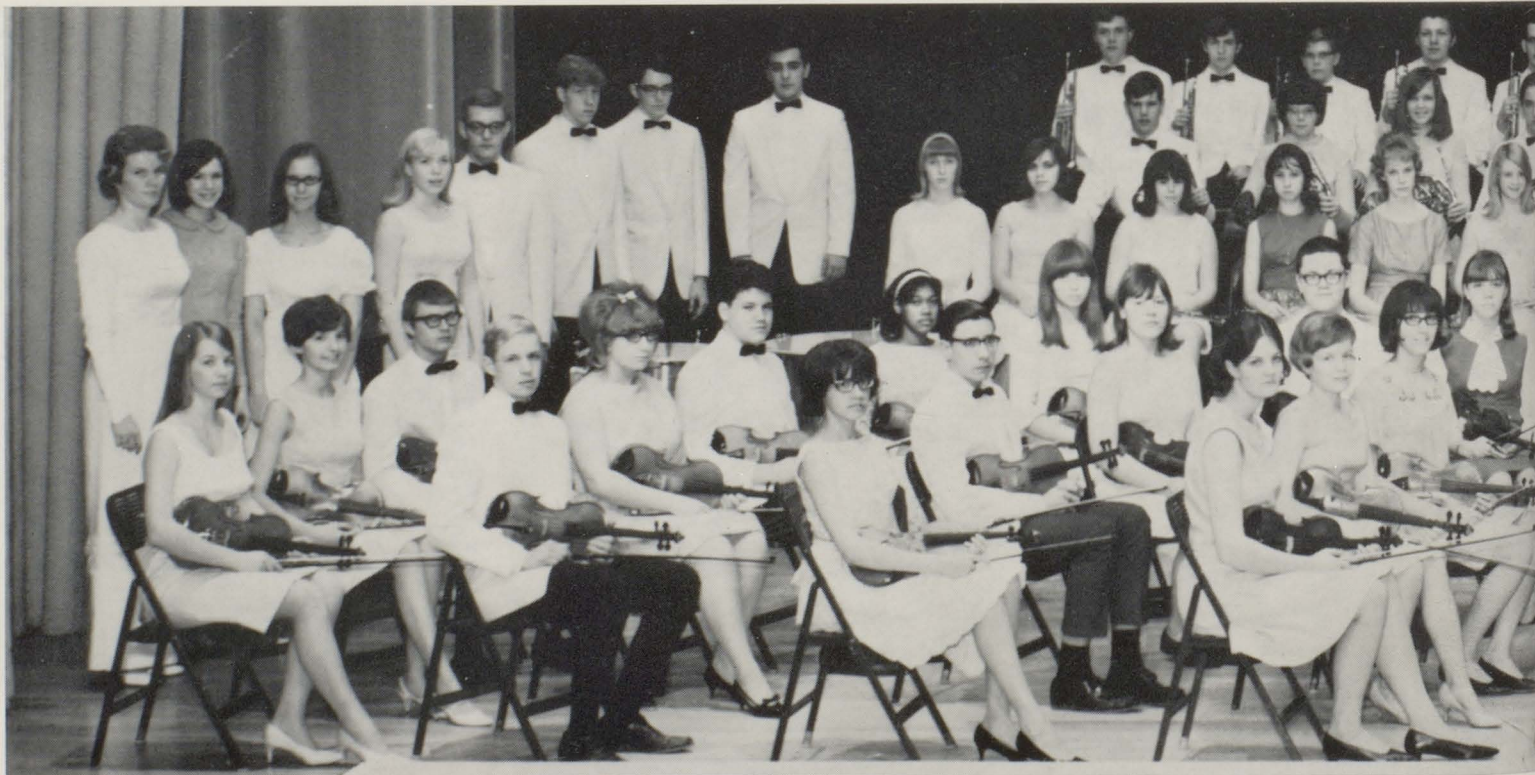

Cats Experience First Season in West Suburban Conference

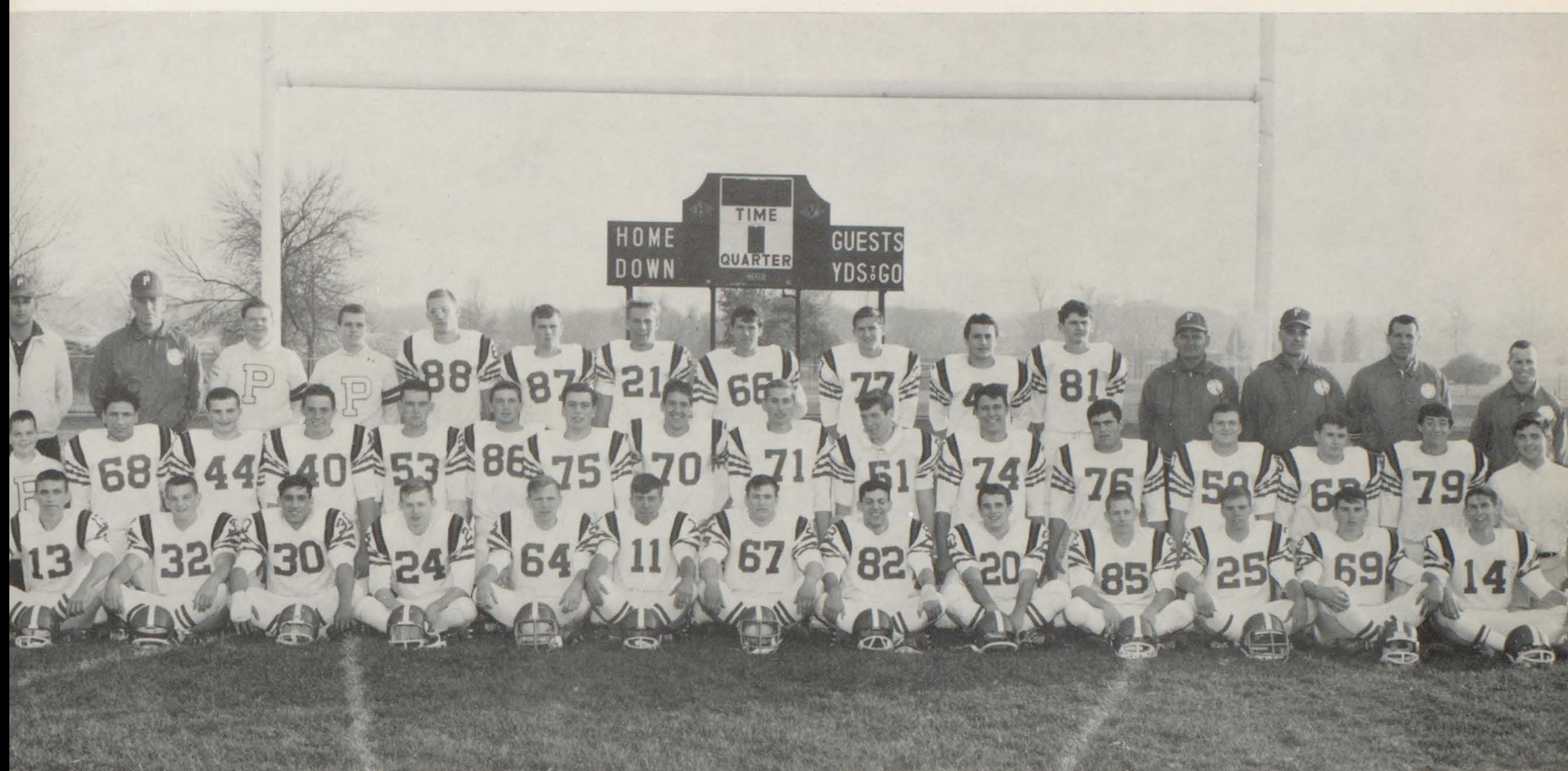

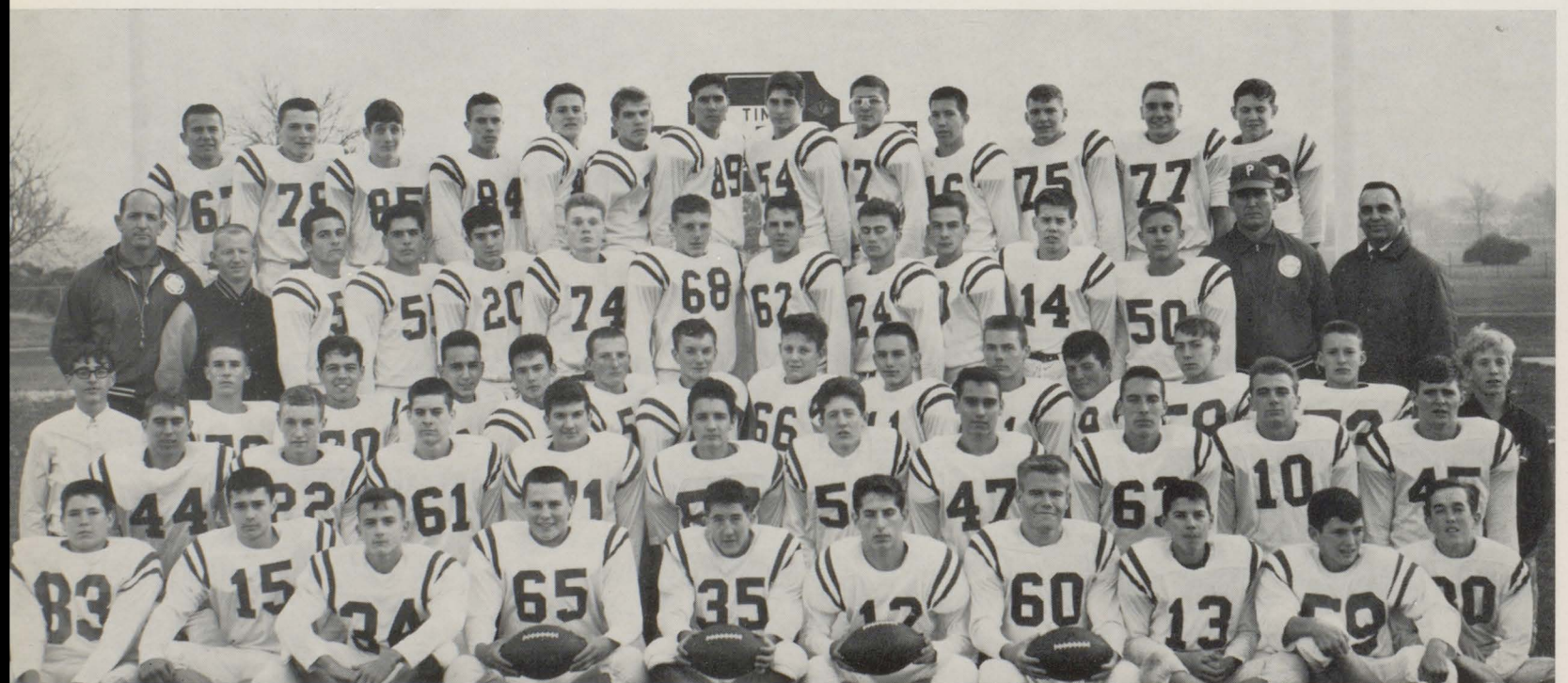

Harriers Under New Coach Chase Home 8-2 Record

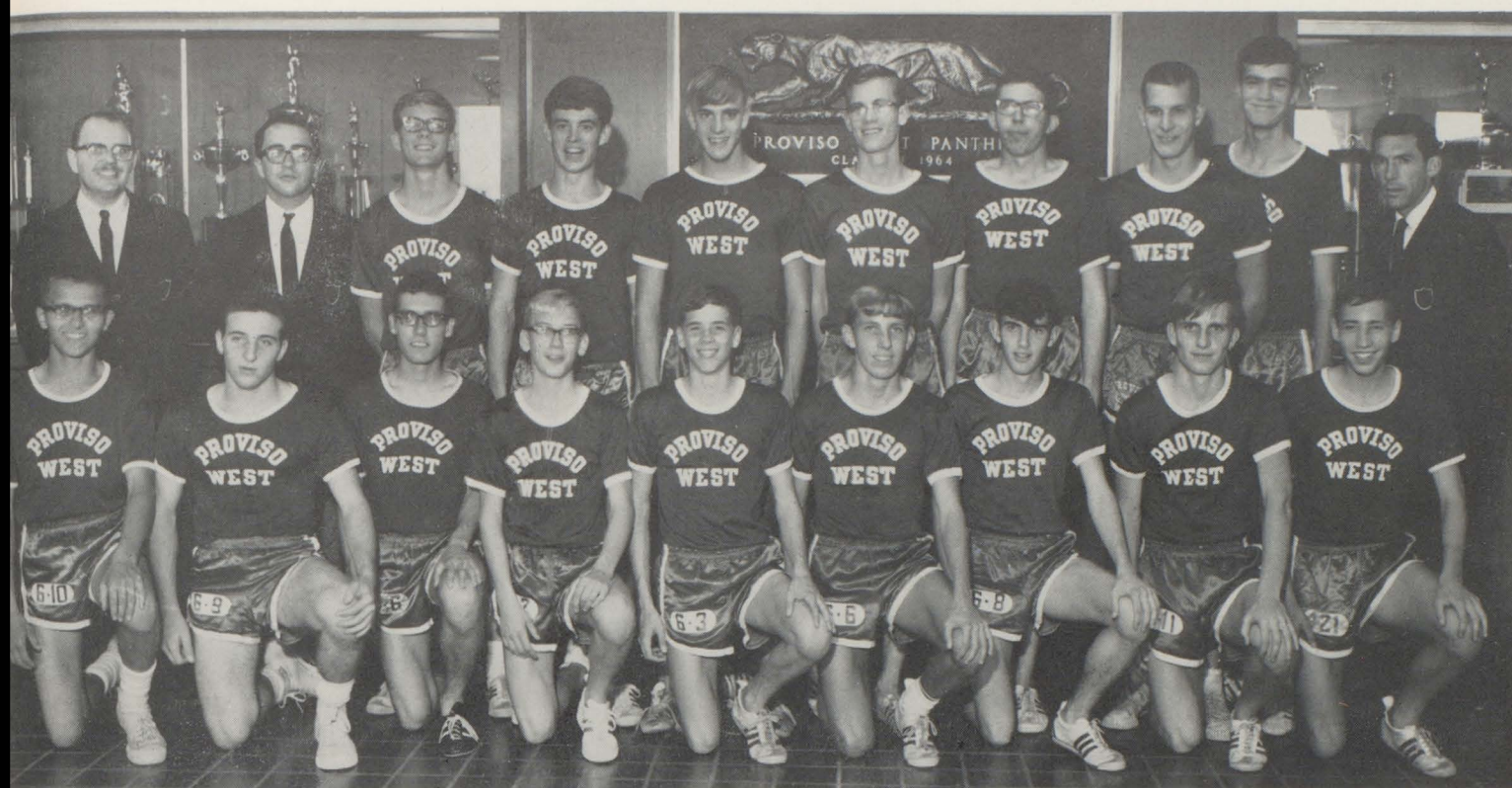

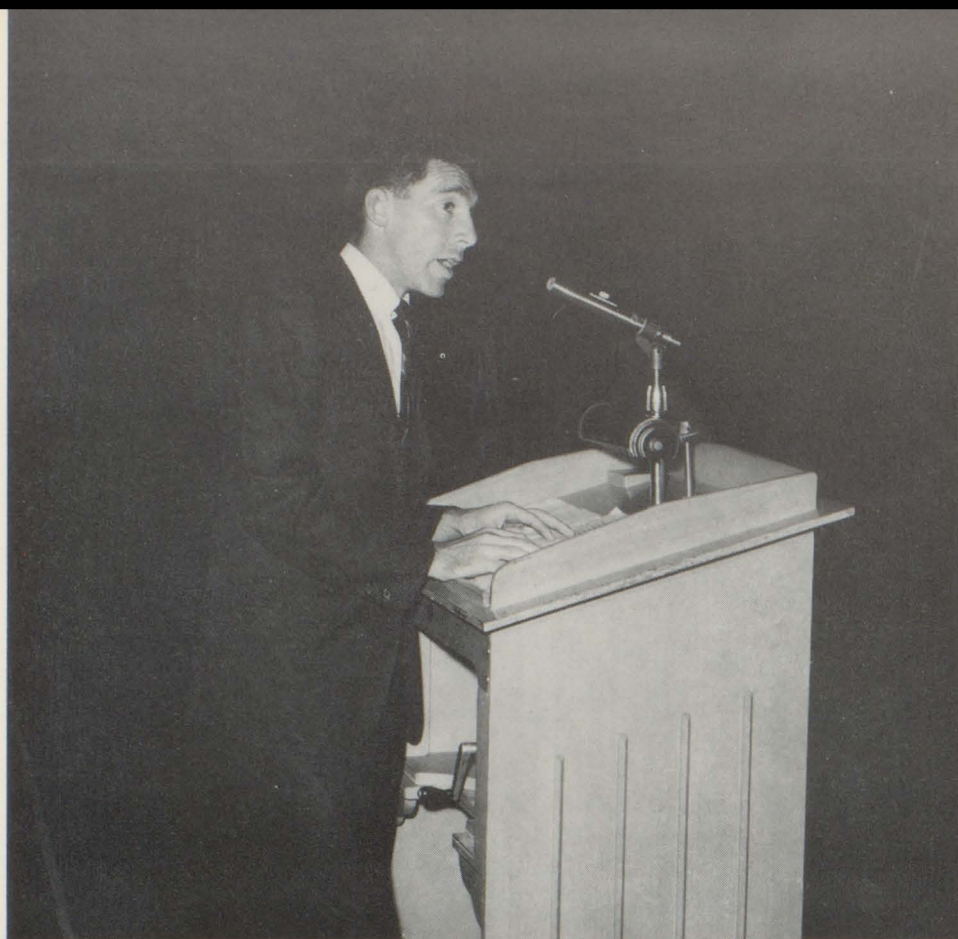

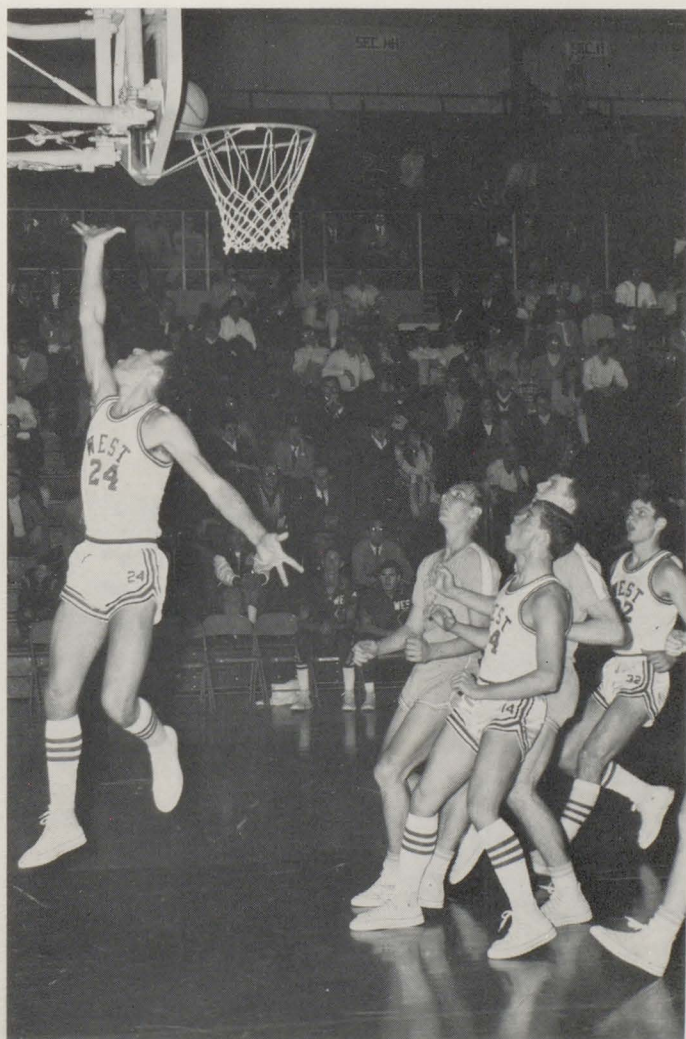

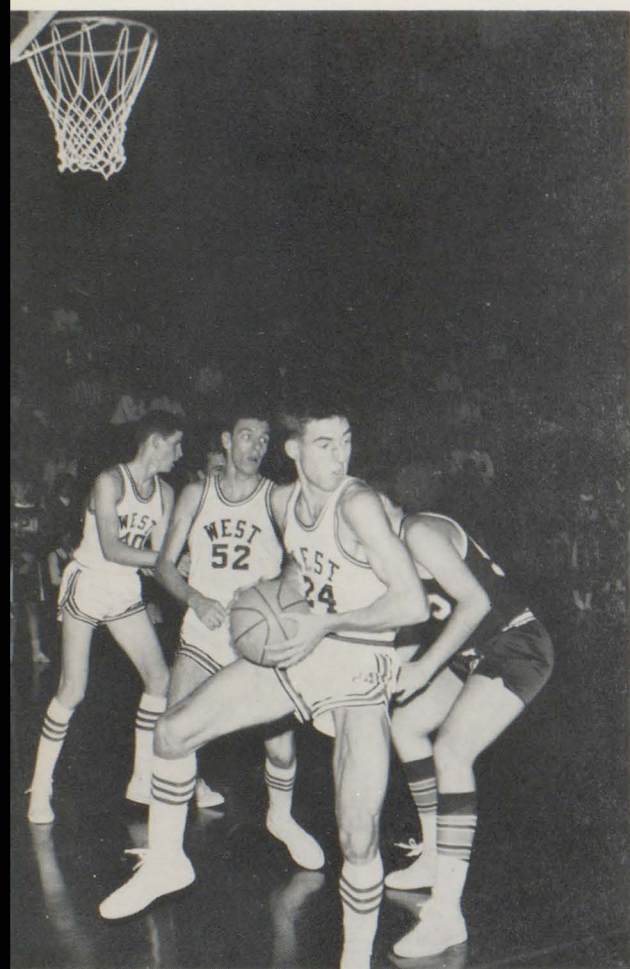

Regular summer workouts throughout the summer scheduled for the squads will firm up Coach Boyce's anticipation for an extremely promising season.



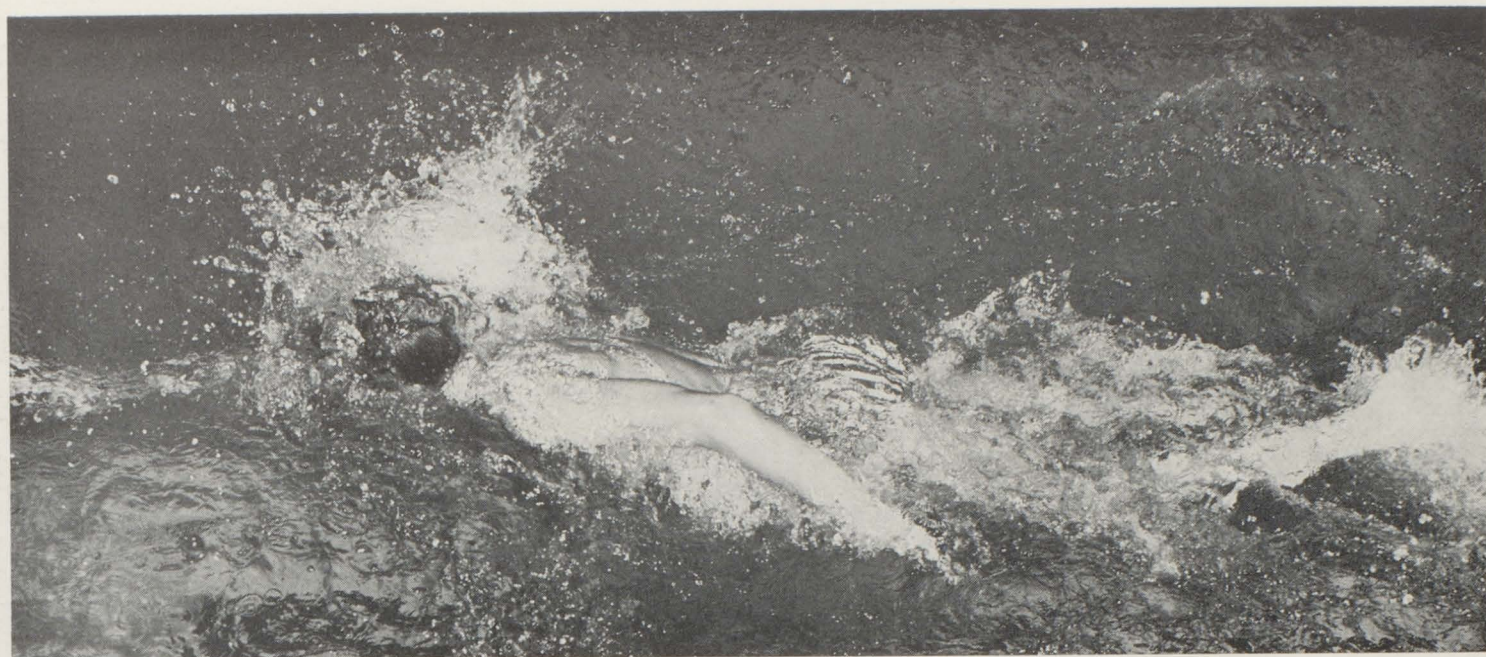

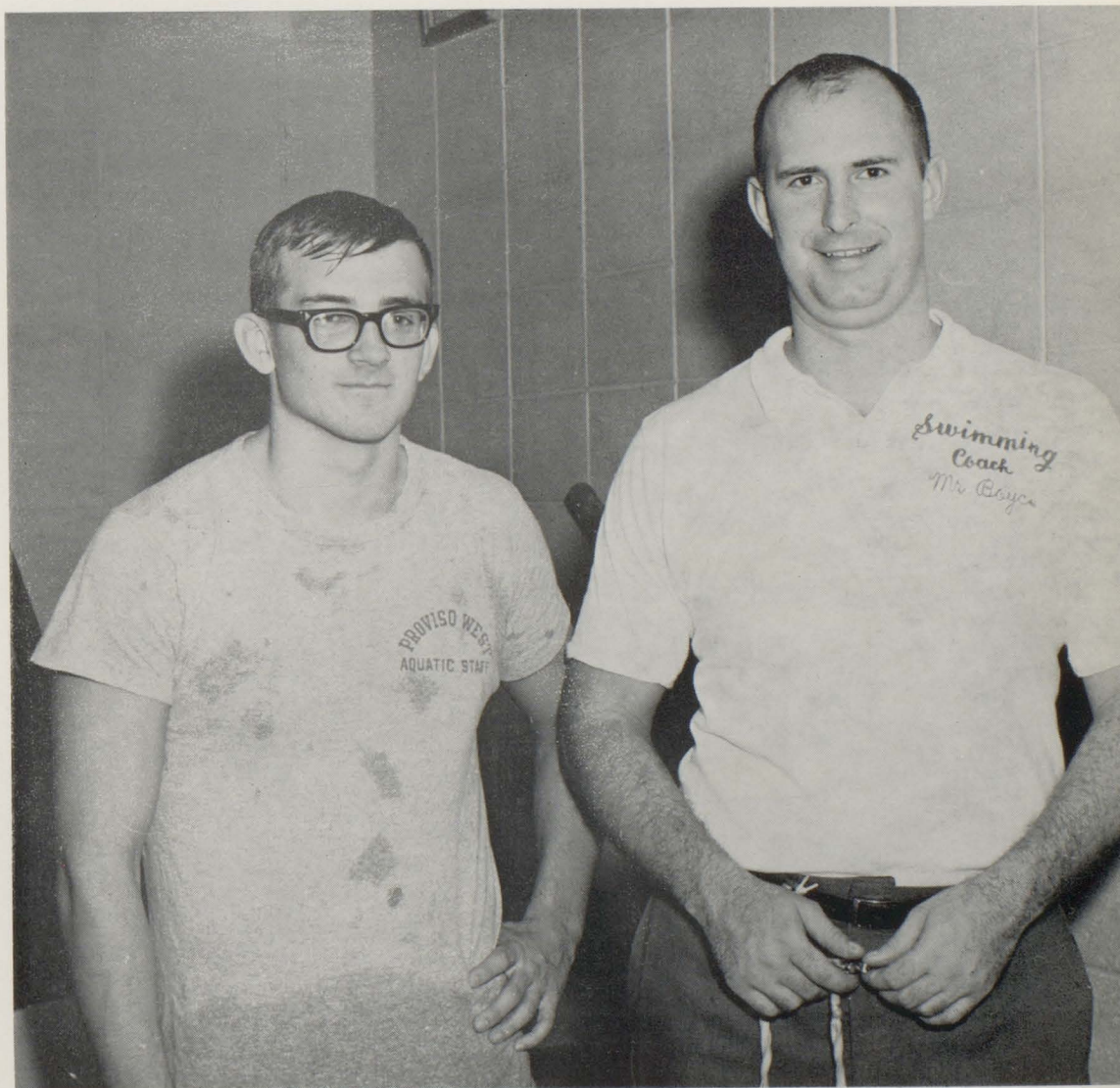

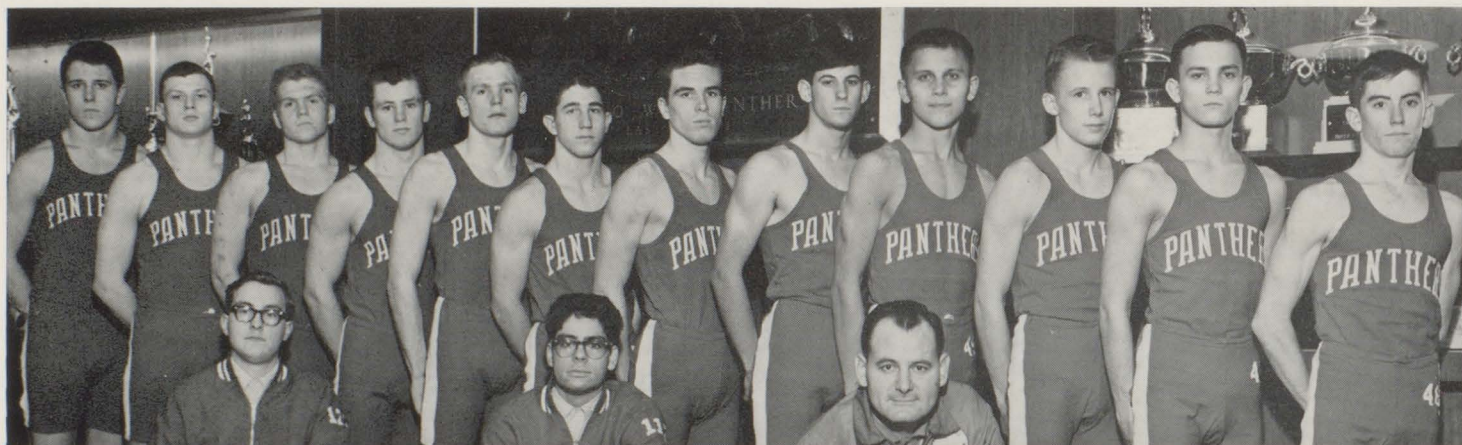

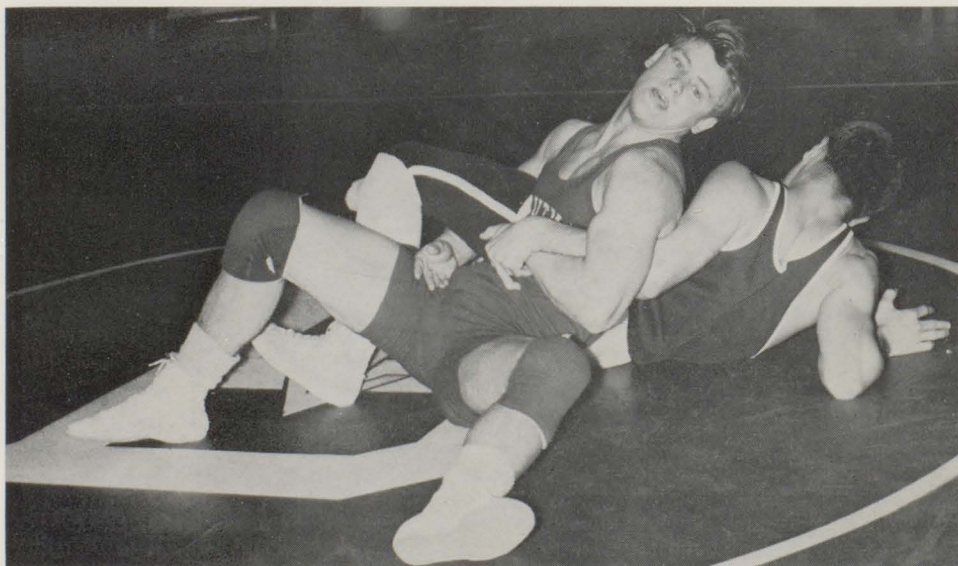
DISPLAYING championship style, Sophomore Duayne Nyckel works for a second round pin over his Downers Grove opponent.

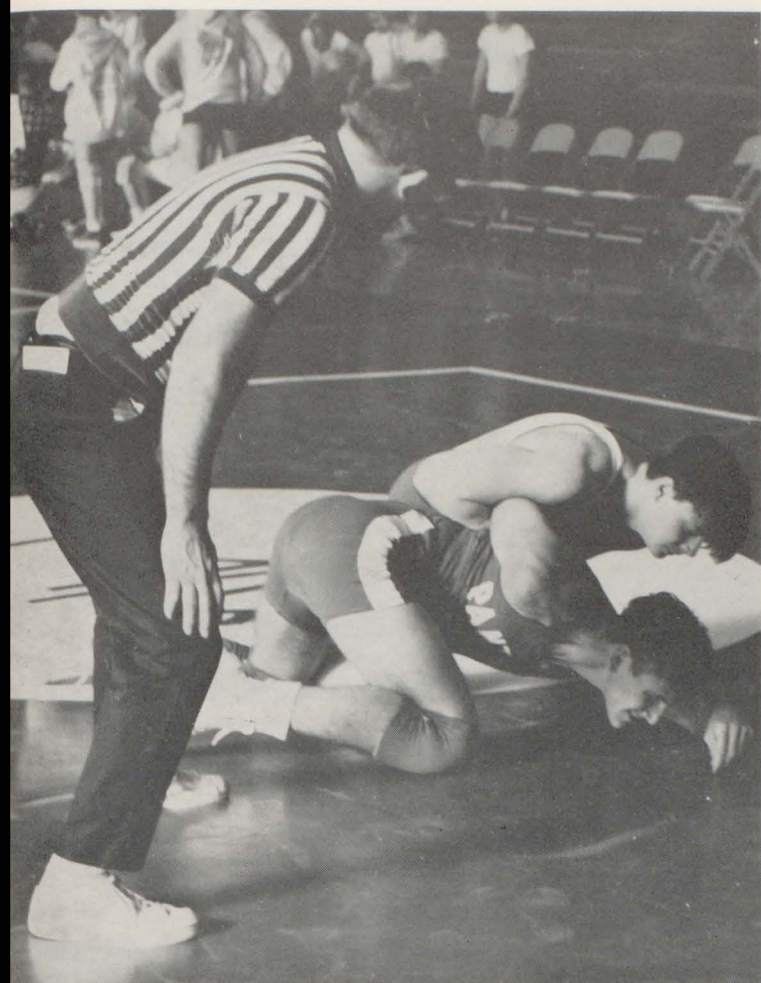

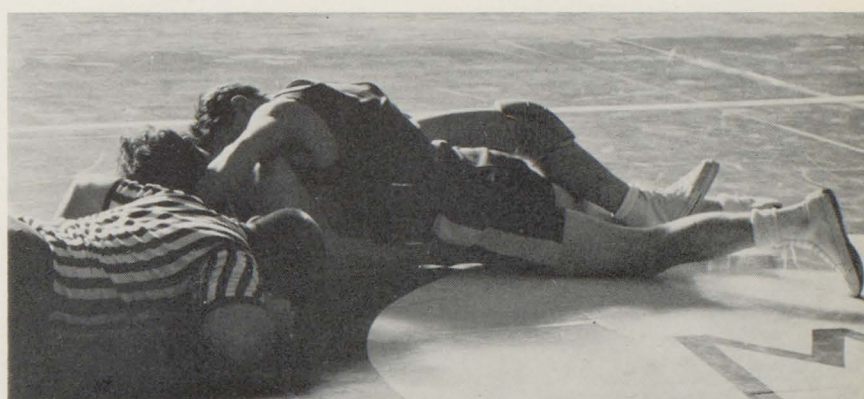
STRAINING for leverage, Senior Marty Lovse attempts to find a possible pinning combination as he maneuvers against his underdog opponent from Glenbard West.

Jay Vee Matmen Third in West Suburban Conference

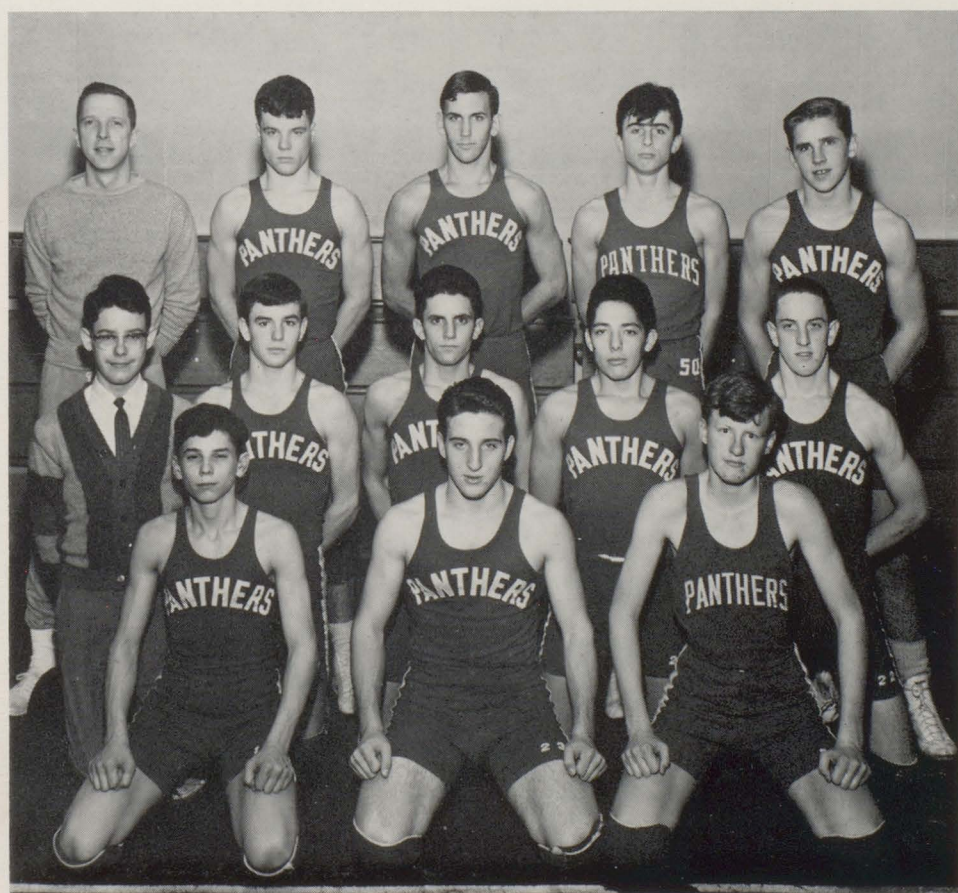

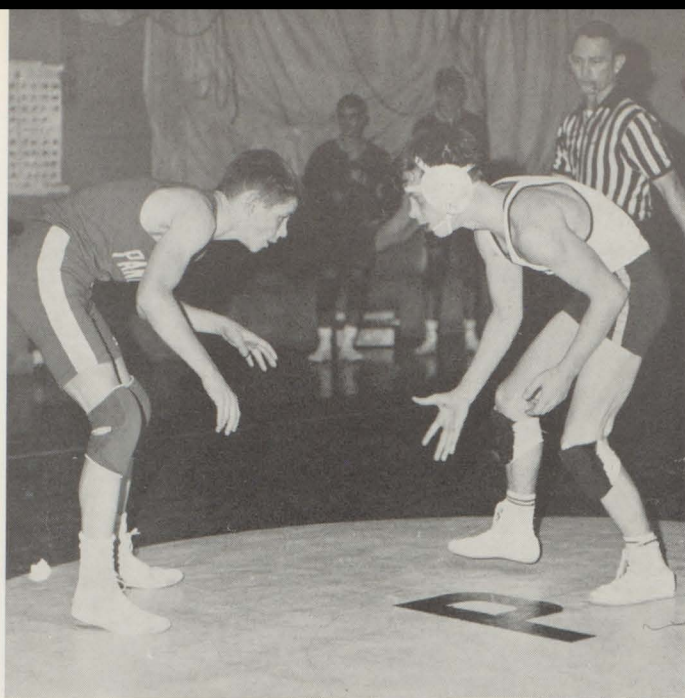

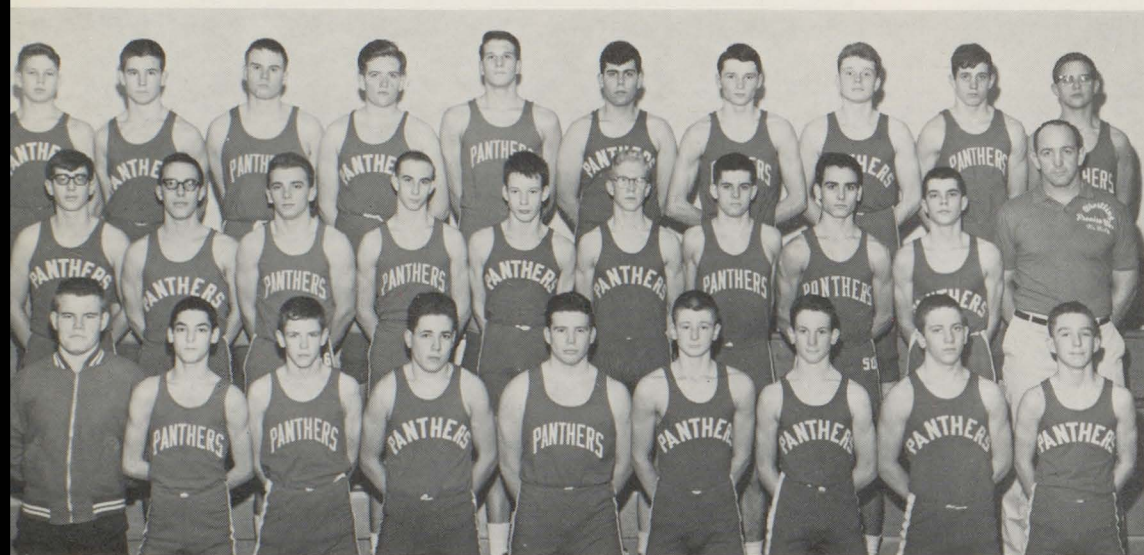
Winning Streak Boosts Soph To Early Conference Lead

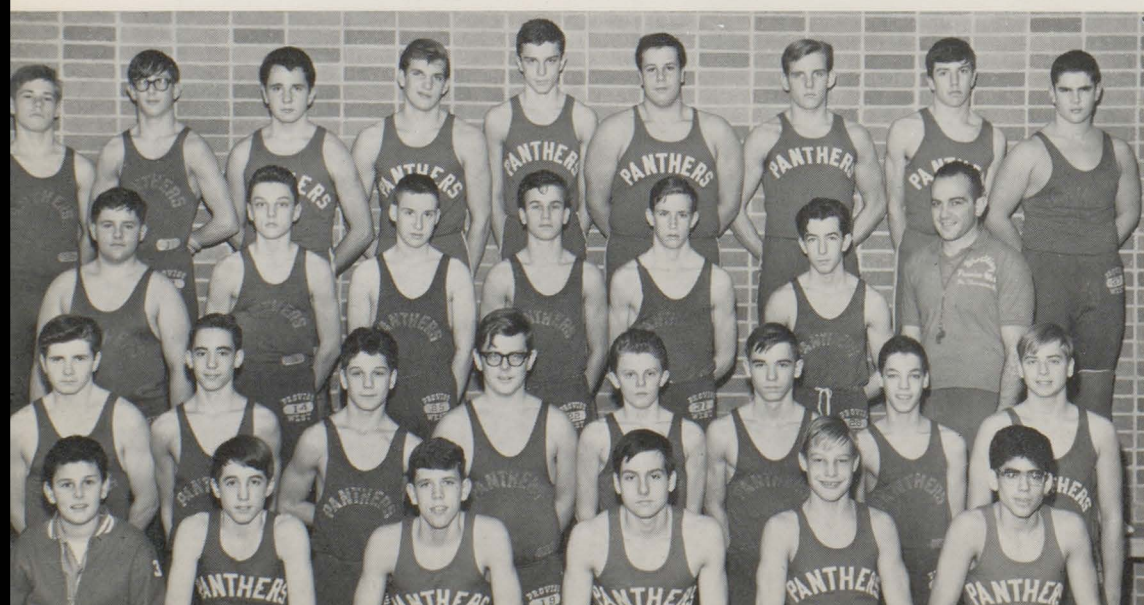

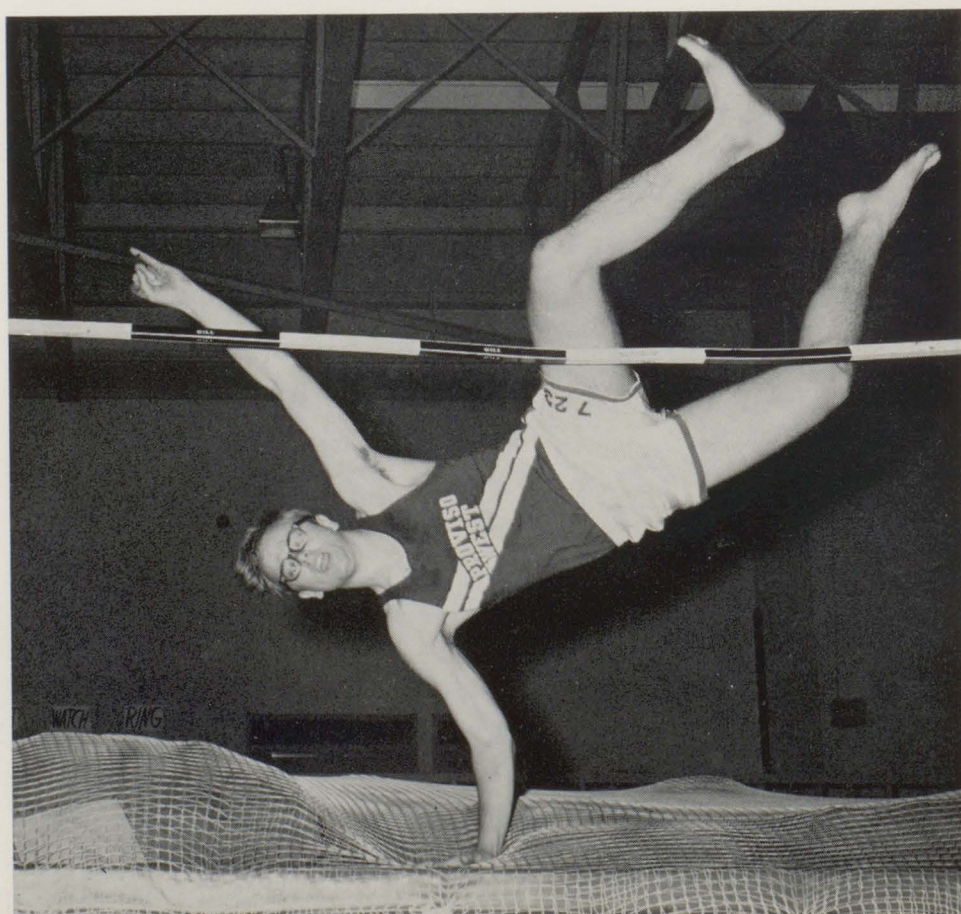

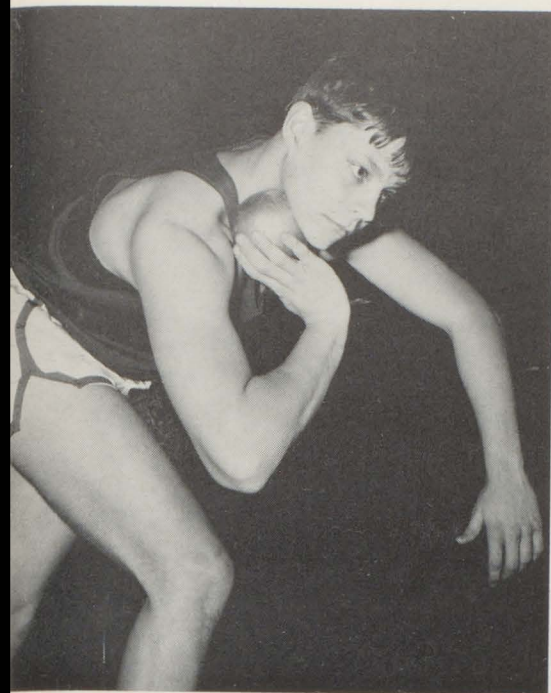

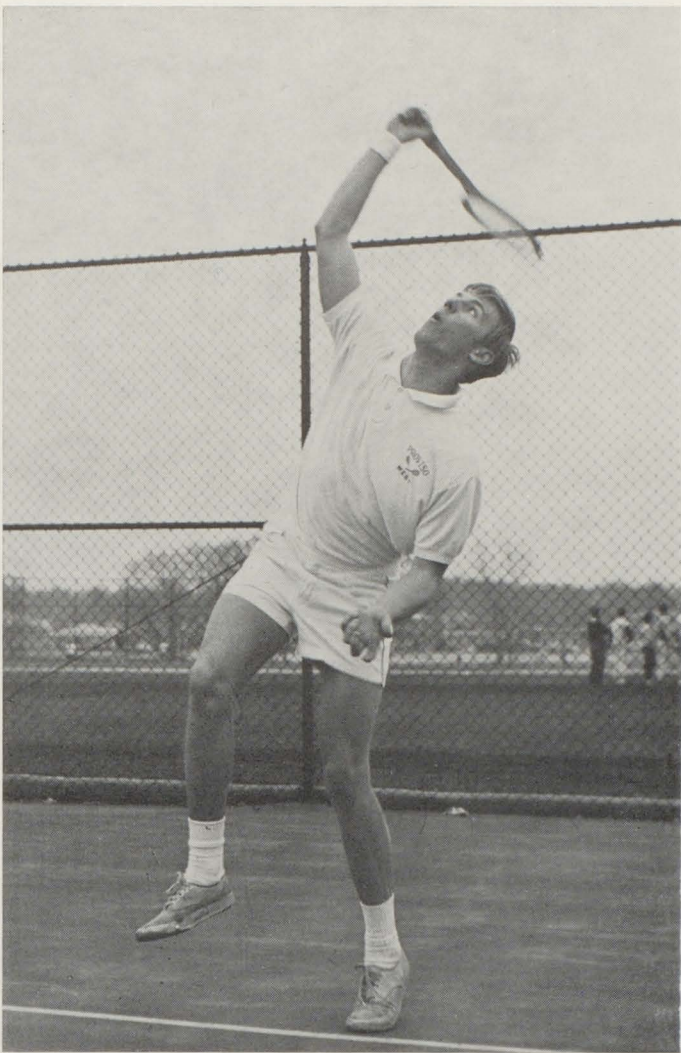

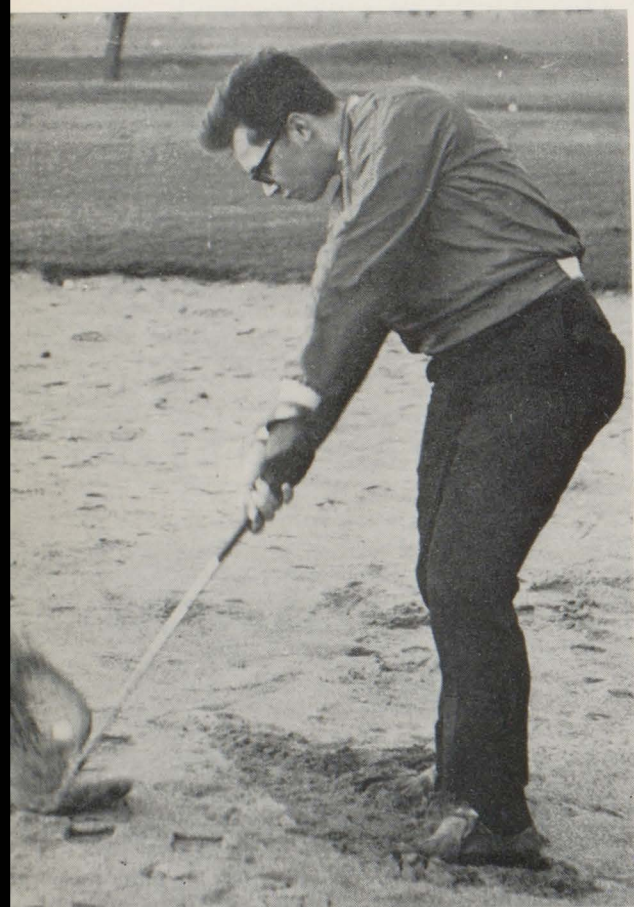

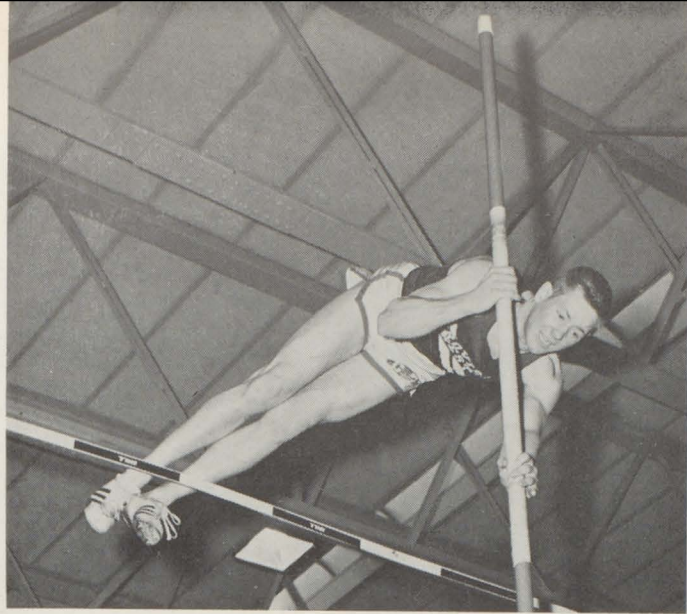

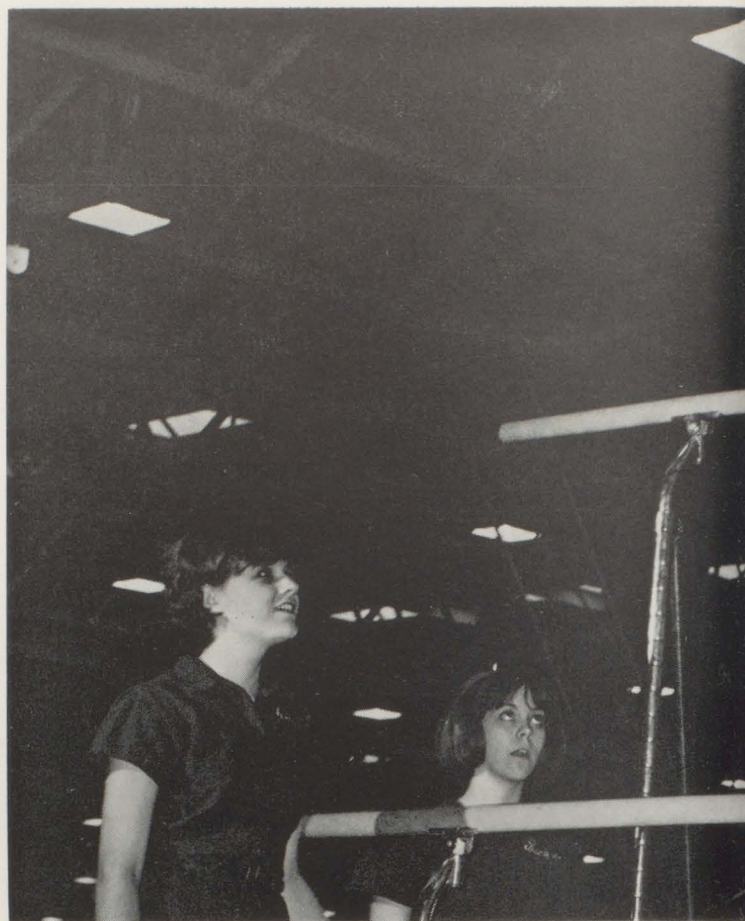
Leaders Assist Teachers In Physical Education Classes

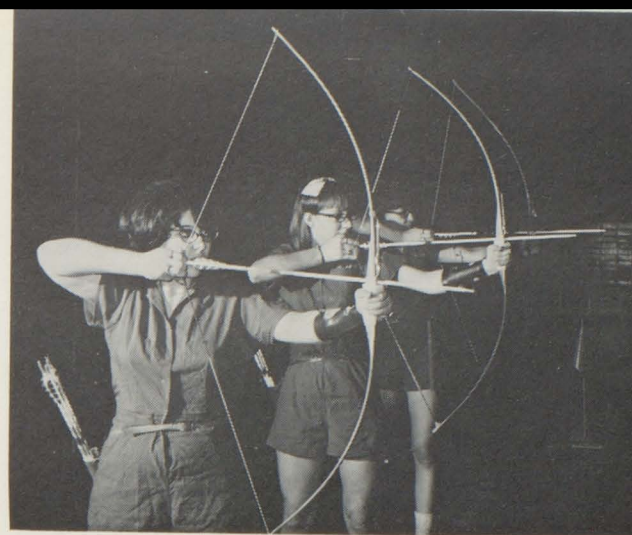

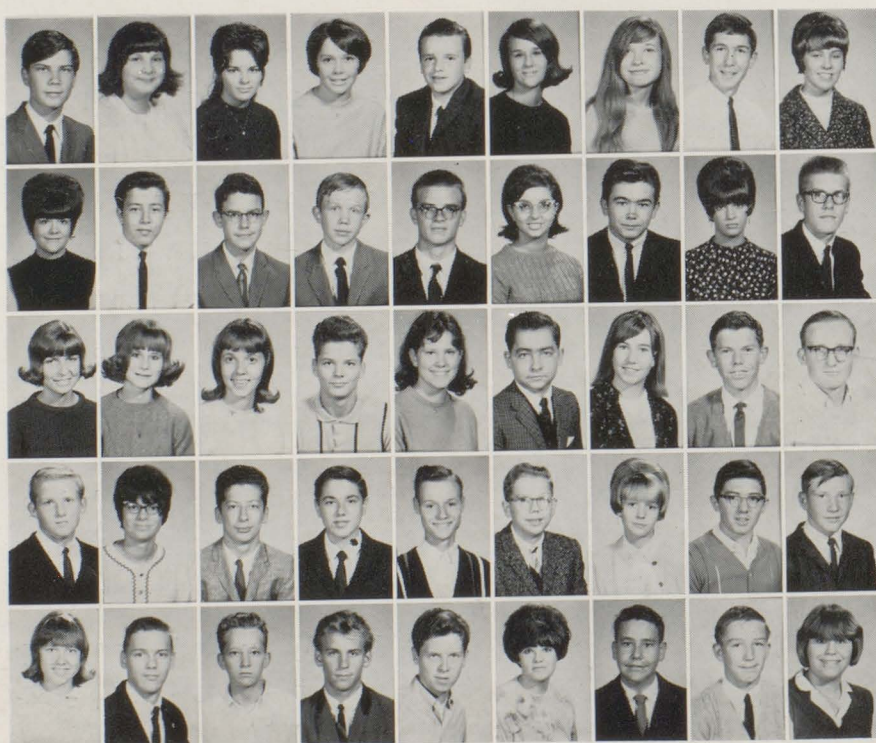

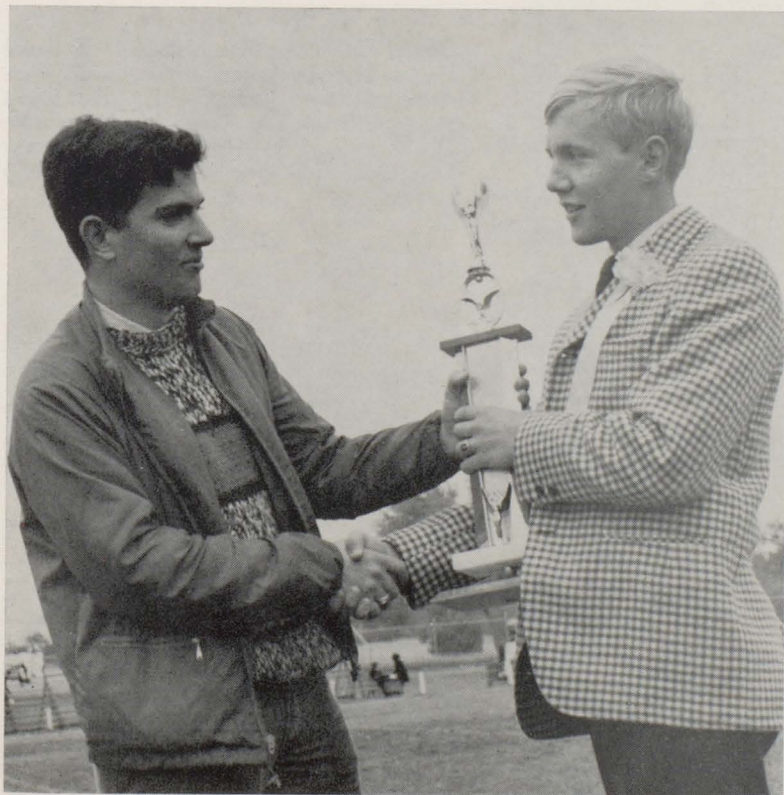
