Few students of Proviso attempt To discover the colorful history Of this unique semi-abstract Work of art enlivening the west Facade of the quadrangle area. The creation represents work of Oscar Howe, artist in residence At the U. of South Dakota. An American Indian artist and Assistant fine arts professor, Mr. Howe speaks through his art.

The mural, being an exterior Architectural piece of art Continuously exposed to The elements of nature, a Nature motif seemed appropriate. This idea suggested the Sioux Indian theme, which is an Indian song of nature. Our American Heritage contains No more sincere love of nature Than that of the American Indian. In its position in the mall, Beneath the sky, surrounded By green and living things, The mural forms tell of The wondrous meshing of Sky, sea, man, and beast All under one God.

Rhythm serves as the artistic Balance of the mural. The Artist uses rhythmic, harmonious Patterns on plain background and Contrasting graphic nature forms. This modern Sioux Indian art Comes from the old Sioux Skin-painting technique, a simple Type of ceremonial art painting. What, then, is the feeling that Mr. Howe is attempting to Convey to viewers of his work? It is a strong belief that Naturalism comes before realism; Understanding and appreciation of Nature around us forms the Beginning of enjoyment of all The other fine arts in life.





#### Board redesigns administrative structure and faces challenge of changing world

The unrest which racked the nation during the past school year was reflected with particular force in District 209. Consequently, in addition to their routine problems and responsibilities, Dr. Green and the Board of Education were faced with a series of virtually insoluable problems brought on by racial tensions at Proviso East—tensions which were reflected to a degree at West as well.

Two new administrative positions were set up and filled by experienced members of the Proviso staff. Mrs. Lawrence Taylor moved from her counselor's office to that of Director of Curriculum and Mr. Richard Daniels, long-time Chairman of the English Department, assumed the duties of Director of Personnel and Public Relations. Mrs. Taylor's duties included the supervision and development of the program of studies offered to students in the Proviso schools. Mr.

Daniel's duties involved the hiring and supervision of teachers and the organization and dissemination of information concerning the schools and their activities to both the faculties and the public in general.

The duties of Business Manager for District 209, so long and ably carried out by Mrs. Hattie Haupt, were taken over during the year by Mr. Jack Stanley as Director of Business Affairs. Mr. Stanley's former responsibilities as Director of the Evening School were assigned to Mr. John Oklepek.

School construction necessitated by growing enrollments continued. New classroom and laboratory space at East was completed along with extensive fire protection renovations. At West a new circular classroom addition to be constructed at the corner of C and B buildings was planned and construction initiated.





# Problems of all sizes fill days of administrators

During the school year more than four thousand people live and work inside West's walls. The possibilities for friction, frustration, even chaos are almost unlimited. That the days move smoothly with only minor dislocations is mainly the result of the concerned effort of three men: Assistant principals Arthur Vallicelli and Richard Gusloff and Dean Richard Wede.

Mr. Wede this year assumed the title of dean for the first time but in his capacity as Associate Dean for the past two years his duties were very similar. Mr. Gusloff, while still closely concerned with problems of student control, took a more active role in developing and applying fresh techniques in dealing with student relationships and with extra-curricular activities, matters with which as dean he has been familiar in the past.

In charge of the multitudinous functions of "the main office," Mr. Vallicelli planned and directed all scheduling, the issuing of report cards and the maintenance of the records without which the school's work would be almost meaningless. The steadily increased use of West's 1440 computer in school business is also the result of Mr. Val's imaginative approach to problems which, though he has dealt with them since West's first year.



## All-School career day lets students investigate variety of occupations.

When a Freshman class enters Proviso West it is assigned to guidance directors who will be responsible for its members throughout their entire four years. This policy permits individual counsellors to become better acquainted with the more than four hundred students who are their direct responsibility.

Students have many opportunities to consult directly with their counselors. In addition Freshmen have an hour of group counselling each week, while all upper classes meet for a half-hour of group counselling.

Duties of the counselor include supervision of attendance plus an almost endless variety of assorted problems from the trivial through the routine to the tragic. In fact, the counselor is not the student's disciplinarian in the usually accepted sense of the term, he is the liaison between the school and the home in every other area of student concern.

An activity sponsored by the Guidance Department this year for the first time was an All-School Career Day. In previous years the opportunity to attend Career Day sessions was restricted to upperclassmen only. This year the entire school took part during the first two periods of the day.



## Needlecrafts proves that a Stitch in Time saves a nine week's grade

During the first semester, if anyone took a peek inside a few classrooms in D and C building, they would have found the girls busily hunched over a variety of subjects. What were the girls doing? Some were knitting sweaters or shells, some were finishing webbed tote bags, and others were stitching a pillow, a placemat, or a wall-hanging. The class was needlecrafts, and the girls were working on three main projects that are completed each semester. For each project, the student was allowed to choose something that equals her ability and rate of working. First semester concentrated on knitting, weav-

ing and stitchery. Second semester covered crochet, needlepoint, and a last extensive project that enables the student to use any technique she had learned during the year. The different types of projects completed this year were numerous. One girl knitted a smocked dress with short sleeves. At the end of the year, students learn a few more techniques, such as the duplication stitch used in knitting.

#### Electronics offers exciting possibilities in West's steadily expanding program

The rustle of turned pages and the scratch of chalk gives place in E-Building to the whir of lathes and the whine of metal-shaping tools. For it is here, in the shops whose long windows face Wolf Road, that the department of industrial and technical education is situated.

Instruction in the fundamentals of woodworking, metals, drafting and printing are available as well as advanced classes in machine and architectural drawing and in auto theory and graphic arts.

Of particular interest, however, is the expanding program in electronics. Only four years old, the program offers a technical background increasingly valuable. Though no graduate can claim the skills of a full-fledged TV repairman, any student who has taken both basic and advanced electronics has a solid background which makes the acquisition of specific skills relatively simple. From an understanding of house wiring, simple motors and generators, he goes on to build his own radio and acquire some knowledge of transistors and the functions of basic TV parts. More than seventyfive boys were enrolled this year in the three classes offered.

#### Computer programming to scientific poker, base numbers to Pythagorean theory, math department is functionally alert

Although only one credit is required for graduation, two out of every three Seniors leave West with mathematics majors. This year eighty-six percent of the Freshmen, forty-seven percent of the Sophomores, forty-two percent of the Juniors and thirty-four percent of the Seniors were enrolled in math classes. More than a hundred enterprising students were enrolled without credit in a computer programming class during study halls. Next year "Compro" will be offered as a half-credit, one-semester course. Originator of this new course at West, and its first instructor, is the department's new acting chairman, Mr. Jerry Cummins.

In addition, students who plan to go on to advanced mathematics in college are given the opportunity to elect calculus and trigonometry. This year twenty-four Seniors availed themselves of this chance to get some collegelevel work out of the way early.

Even the lively, attractive displays which appeared regularly in the case outside the mathematics department office testified to the versatility which characterizes the department as a whole, dealing as they did with such desperate subjects as the proof of the tricky Pythagorean theory and the odds against drawing to an inside straight.





#### Five-day physical education is first for all students this year.

Expanded facilities provided by West's new fieldhouse made it possible this year to offer physical education five days a week to all students for the first time in the history of the school. The truly impressive proportions of this effort can be better appreciated when it is recalled that this means providing for more than 3,700 students daily with staff and facilities from a single department.

In order to deal with such a large and heterogenious student body physical education offers both introductory and advanced instruction of many types. Basic instruction in swimming is available to all students capable of receiving it, while group games such as basketball, touch football, soccer and softball are also enjoyed. In addition instruction in the basic skills of gymnastics for both girls and boys as well as wrestling for boys and dance for girls is given. Advanced instruction for students with particular interests in any of these areas is available in inter-scholastic and after-school work. Skills which will have life-long recreational value such as golf, bowling, archery and tennis, are also part of the curriculum.

But physical activity is not the only type of effort demanded. Health and safety, driver education and home nursing and first aid are also offered to round out the program.



#### New approach enlivens Physics for would-be scientists.

Ever wonder how many ergs equal one joule? Only one out of every twenty Proviso West students could answer that question, since they are enrolled in physics. Although physics may seem only a blur of equations and agonizing lab reports to many students, it is actually a living, practical science through which one can better understand the physical world. Two approaches are used in teaching physics, the traditional method and the newer Physical Science Study Committee method. The physics department at Proviso is presently using a combination of both methods. The

traditional textbook is used because it covers a greates variety of topics. The PSSC textbook covers less topics more extensively, and is used mostly at supplementary material.

Chemistry students will now have the opportunity of learning more through experiments since the chemistry lab has new equipment. Senior Science students will also have a better teaching method, since Senior Science is now being taught by two teachers, instead of one. Mr. Rice teaches the section dealing with chemistry, and Mr. Haas teaches the section dealing with physics.

#### Three departments combine facilities in effort to ease students' lives.

West's library, audio visual department and special clinics provide students with a variety of aid apart from the regular offerings of the curriculum. The library adds fifty new books each week - an accumulation of over two hundred books a month. Not only are the students exposed to exciting and educational books, but they are also able to view many instructional movies. The Audio Visual Department shows nearly twenty-two hundred films yearly. These films range from historical documentaries to colorful foreign language travelogues. Mr. Jedlicka, head of the department, coordinates films with department schedules. The boys who run the projectors keep everything running smoothly and on schedule. The third service offered at West is the reading center. Over one hundred students are enrolled in this program. These students devote some time each day to go to the clinic and improve their comprehension as well as their speed. This reading service is only half of the special aid offered to students by the special clinics division. The other half includes a program for blind students. Both these services are headed by competent teachers - Mrs. Pealsee as director of the reading clinic, and Mrs. Buhrow as teacher of the blind.









#### Mu Alpha Theta offers math students new opportunities












#### Thespians give strong performance of challenging "Miracle Worker"














### Newly organized French Club sponsors All-School French Week




### Varsity complete season with 3-4-1 record, boast all-area squad member.





# Cats finish in finals of holiday tourney first time in West's history


Though the '68 Varsity squad's record of seven wins to fourteen losses was slightly less impressive than last year's 9-12 tally, out of 23 games played during the season only four were decided before the last minute of play. 
# J.V. Cagers display determination despite disappointing record of 4-10






### Varsity matman places fifth in State, team takes third at Rich East Tourney

High point of regular competition was the meet with conference champions Maine East in which the Cats tied them 22-22.






27-15 Panther victory over the La Grange Lions which decided the 4th place finish.

### Frosh matmen earn fourth place; Sophs finish last in conference







# Active girls in physical education enjoy daily relief from academic routine










