Ten years are only a beginning . . .


This academic year marks Proviso West's tenth birthday. The official dedication of the building was November 16, 1958.


"We realize," the dedication read, "this is merely stone, brick and mortar, but our purpose will remain to provide true education . . . which does not come from buildings alone . . . "



Ten years are only a beginning . .




















Growth and change reflected in West's first ten years






















DR. NORMAN S. GREEN Superintendent

Dr. Green leaves after three years

Coming to Proviso High Schools in 1966, Dr. Green had barely familiarized himself with the overall financial and educational aspects of his new position, when he was faced by unprecedented problems of student and racial unrest—problems, however, which have since become almost routine throughout the nation.

Feeling that an "open system" in which the administration still serves as head of the schools, yet readily gives students, faculty and citizens voice in school policy, is preferable to a "closed system" which relies on maximum enforcement of regulations, Dr. Green oriented his efforts toward developing such a system at Proviso. In assessing his work, Dr. Green feels that "Talk! Plan! Action!" as the program was called, has resulted in some communication gains, but that there is much more to be done.

Dr. Green will assume the leadership of a unit system in Mount Lebanon, Pennsylvania next year.

Three directors guide District 209's affairs

Responsible for the hiring and replacement of all certificated personnel, at both East and West, Mr. Daniels spent much of his time interviewing prospective teachers and specialists. The implementation of the new Office Occupations and Vocational Food Services programs at both schools absorbed a considerable part of his year as well.

With the assistance of Mrs. Gerda Dahl, he also maintained an effective public relations program including the release of information to the press and the publication of regular bulletins to faculty and parents.

Student unrest, so much a part of the national as well as the local scene, found West's Director of Special Programs, Mrs. Virginia Taylor, deeply involved. This year she filled frequent speaking engagements and was instrumental in introducing a human relations course which was developed at Western Michigan University which will be required for all new teachers in District 209.

The direction of the student teacher program, which this year involved eighty-five students, was also Mrs. Taylor's responsibility. A new course in consumer education was developed.

From budget to black-board, boilers and blue-grass, Mr. Stanley's work was many-faceted and demanding. Responsible for preparation of the school budget, he was also intimately concerned with the spending of funds acquired. As chief purchasing agent he was involved with school equipment of every type and with the care of that equipment. New buildings and the care of present buildings as well as their use after regular school hours were under his supervision, as was the employment of custodial and clerical personnel. In addition, he prepared necessary information for federally assisted projects.

Mr. DeWitt in third year at West begins new program

Initiation and development of "Talk, Plan, Action," a program which has as its goal a greater understanding and openness among students, students and faculty, faculty and administration, and administration and the community at large, was an important part of Mr. DeWitt's 1968-1969 plans for West.

A required human relations course for new faculty members, extensive student and faculty committee work, opinion surveys, and an all-faculty workshop in February were part of the implementation of the program which had its inception last year. In addition, however, innumerable less formal efforts to open or widen communication opportunities were made by interested individuals throughout the year.

In January Mr. DeWitt announced that he would take a year's leave of absence during 1969-70 to finish work on his doctorate at Ball State University in Muncie, Indiana, where his doctrinal studies will also be concerned with problems of communication between the educator and educated.

Four assistant principals guide varied school activities

One hundred and eighty-five days a year bells ring at Proviso West, and students move confidently from room to room. Schedules are arranged, books issued and collected. The structuring and maintaining of a framework of routine within which nearly 4,500 students and faculty members can live and work with a minimum of friction and frustration was the immediate concern of West's four assistant principals.

During West's ten years of existence, the "main office" and machines room have been Mr. Vallicelli's province with student scheduling, record keeping and the budget among his responsibilities just as it was this year. Next year, however, in 1969-70, he will assume a new role as interim principal during Mr. DeWitt's absence.

Sharing many of the problems of student discipline and control, Mr. Gusloff, Mr. Wede, and Mr. Milano also had individual responsibilities as well. Mr. Gusloff and Mr. Wede are involved with the multiplicity of student activities which are not strictly academic with Mr. Wede's special attion directed to problems of transportation. Mr. Milano, who, though new to his present position, is a long-time member of West's faculty, is concerned with buildings and grounds.



Probably no department reflects the changes which have occurred during West's ten years of existence more directly than that of business education. Those first years before C-building's completion, when the entire department was located on the third floor of D-building, computers were

far from being as commonplace as they are today and consequently one of West's most popular business courses had not even been considered. In fact, it was not until 1965 that the first two key-punch machines were installed in D—and the first students enrolled in key-punch instruction.

Reading center is enlarged new English courses initiated

Greatly expanded reading center facilities with an accompanying expansion of the reading program this year introduced three weeks of individualized reading improvement experiences for all Juniors and a tripling of capacity in the individual center for students who wish to work on their own time. Though equipment

for the new center was slow in arriving, by Christmas nearly everything had been installed in the large, cheerfully blue-carpeted room in C-Building. Next door thirty carels were set up for the group program. This year, West's new English curriculum introduced Sophomores to a choice of five electives during second semester.







Twenty-five vocational students at West were members of the first class in Illinois in which instruction was given in the use of a Compu-Dyne 3-Axis numerically controlled milling machine. The equipment was purchased this year and is used in evening school instruction also.

Numerical control (N/C) is an automated method used to operate general purpose machines by insertion of numerical data stored on a roll of tape. Students learned to prepare tapes as well as operate the highly sophisticated machine.






Compro given for credit is math first






Even Sophs take chemistry at West under acceleration plan





Special services make useful additions to study facilities

Though most students who leafed through magazines or studiously researched term papers at its tables were unaware of it, West's library was automated this year. Proof lies in more than 40,000 punched IBM cards stored neatly in long boxes in Mr. Teppama's office. These cards, one for each book on the shelves, makes it possible in a few minutes to print out even the most complicated bibliography, to prepare inventories, and to do many other things which formerly took days or weeks.

The audio-visual department also improved its efficiency by adding to its already extensive copying equipment and putting into use a sophisticated 16 MM film inspection and cleaning device which increases the life of the hundreds of films owned by the school.

The services for the nearly two dozen blind students who attend West were continued as were the services of a speech therapist and a school social worker.



However, much of the work of keeping acres of glass and tile shinning and the servicing of a forest of moveable, breakable equipment can only be done by hand.

In addition to the routine of daily upkeep, many extensive repairs and renovations of the buildings are worked into the schedule this year as was the meeting of dozens of daily emergencies. A winter with a minimum of snow made things a little simpler.






The club followed the popular

On the lighter side, Aquatic Staff members relaxed and enjoyed themselves at several swim parties given by the club during the year.







Spanish Club observes yule season with donkey pinata






The members were coached by their sponsors in the areas of radio speaking; readings of comedy, serious verse, and prose. These were regular events at each meet.




The group came to realize that although their customs differ, all people share common interests.


Folk and Aviation Clubs swing "Up, Up and Away"








Soph "A" squad finds rivalry rough; "B" squad has 5-1 tally


Varsity hardcourters fight hard but finish 8th in WSC

J.V.'s take 4th in conference






Park. The remainder of the season, however, found the Sophs less consistent in performance.



Varsity grapplers take 8th in state; capture 2nd in WSC



















Varsity has 3-9 season total Frosh-Soph have tough year










