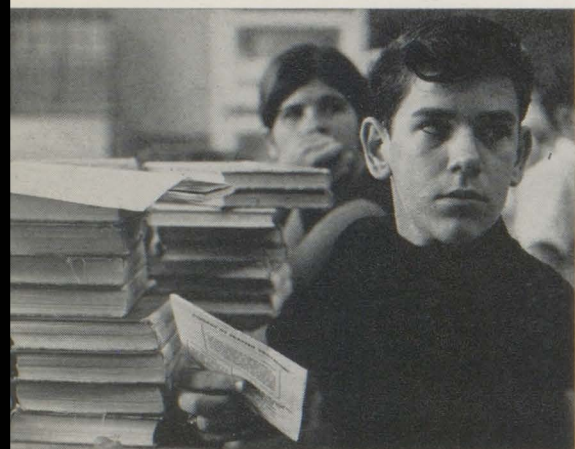








## First Day Finds 530 Early Birds, 3770 Late Ones Back on Their Perches at West

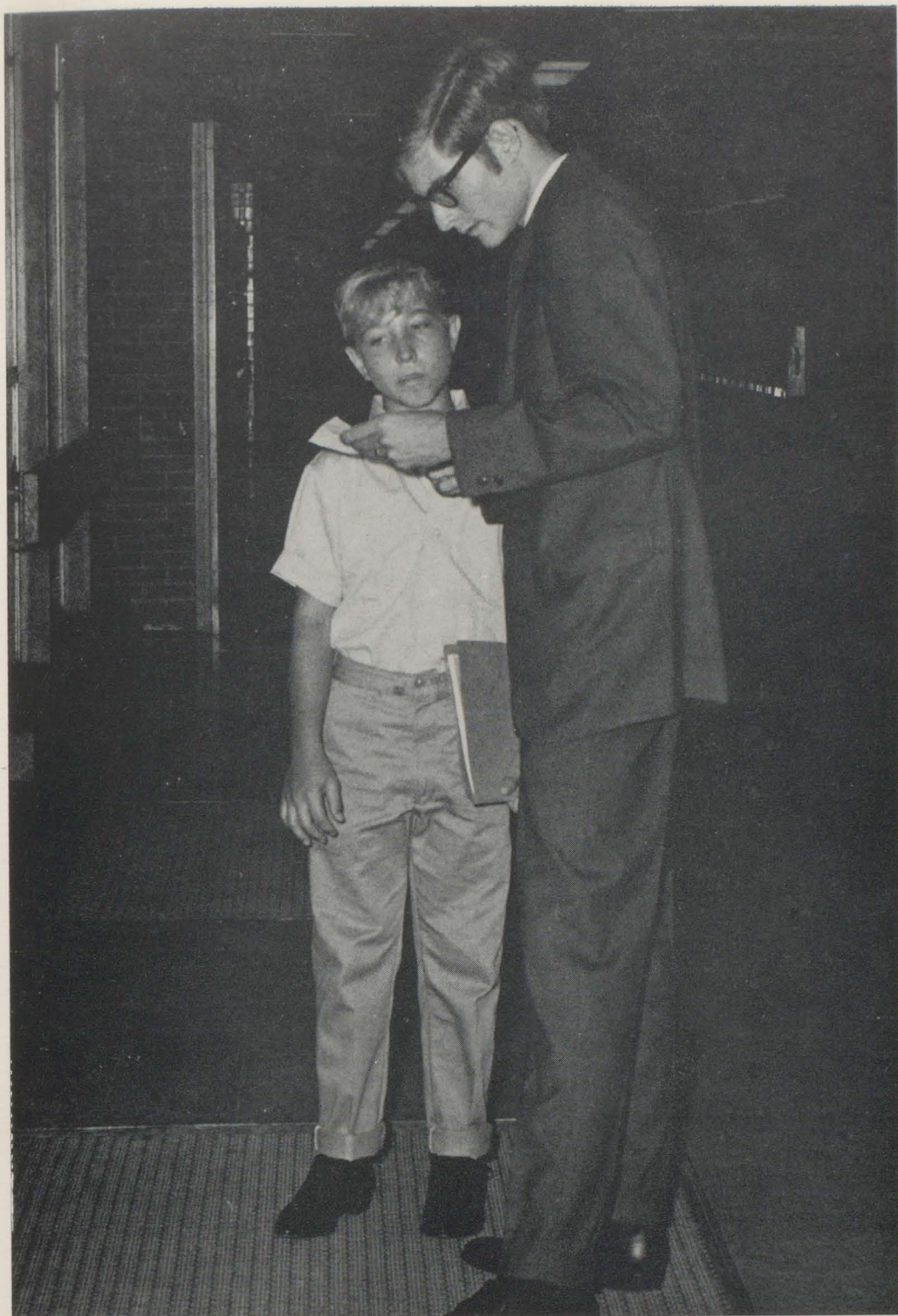

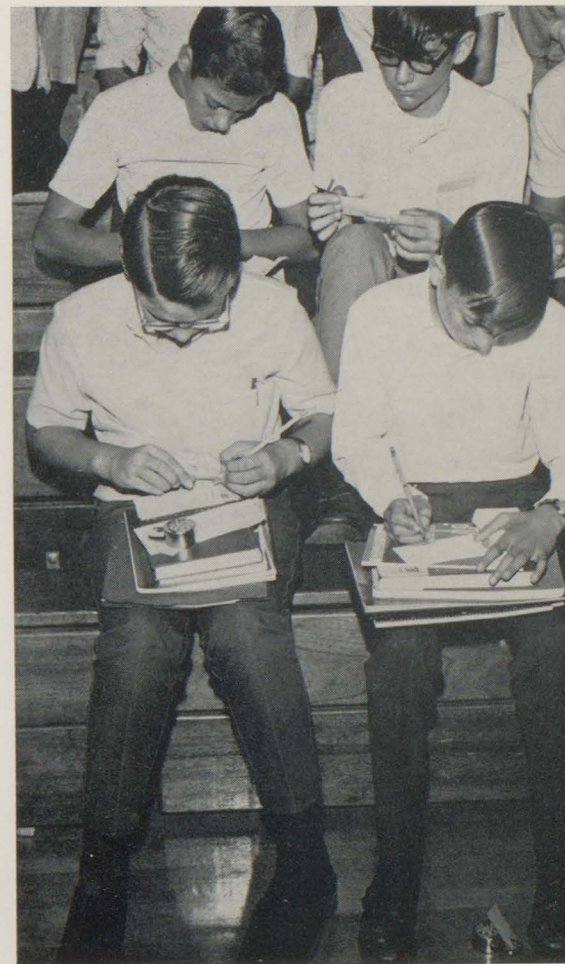

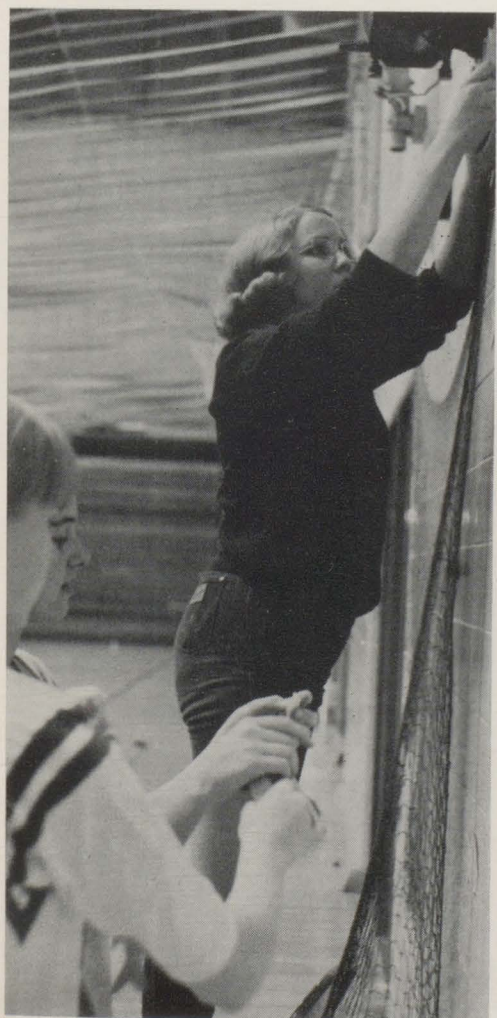

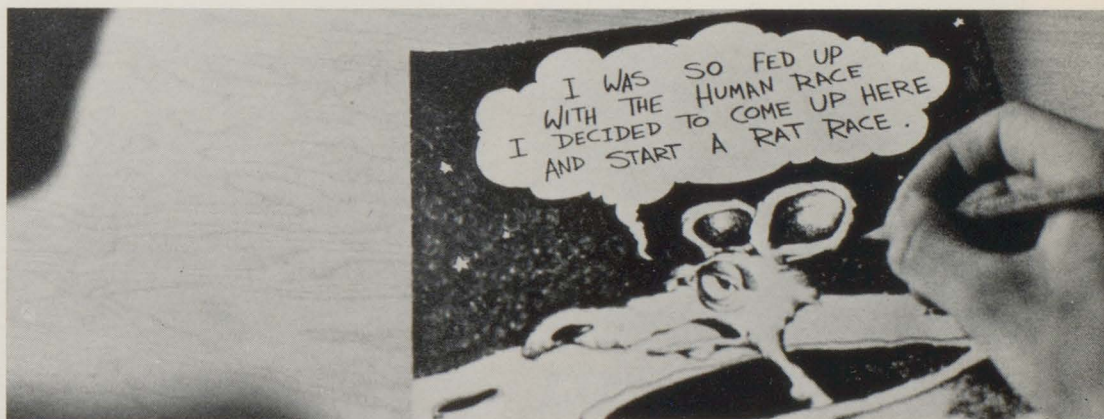

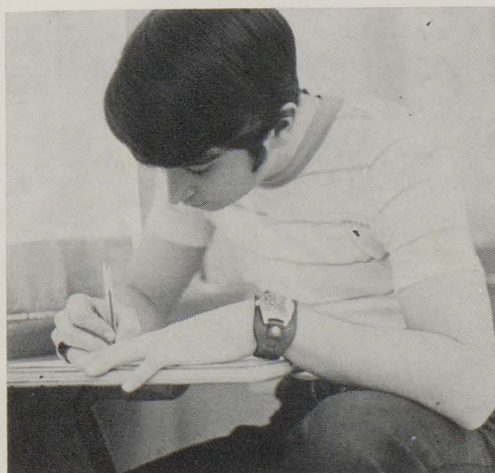

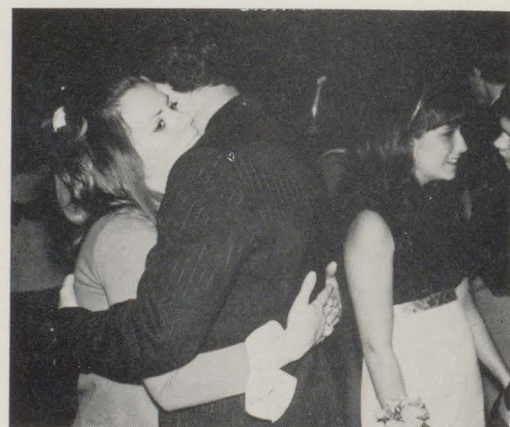

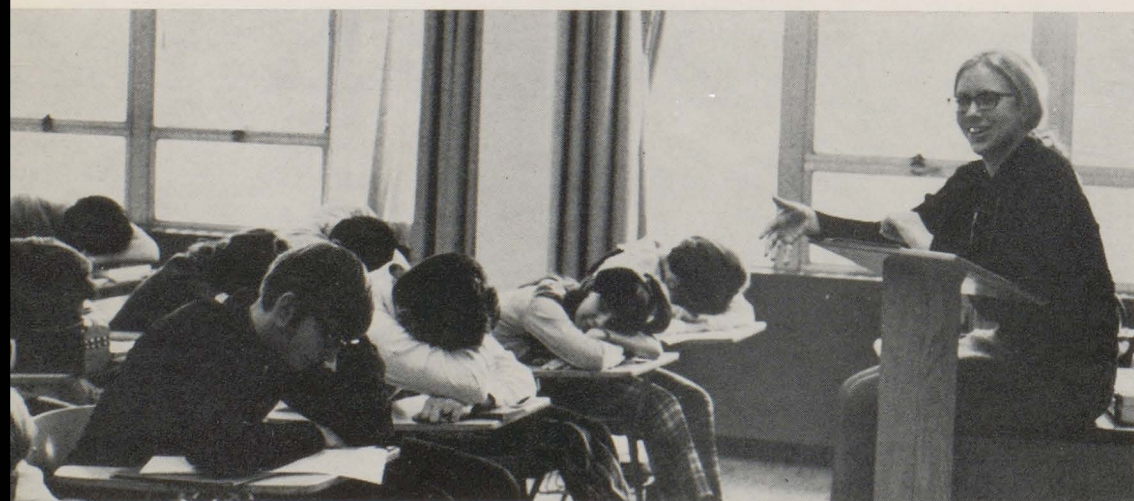

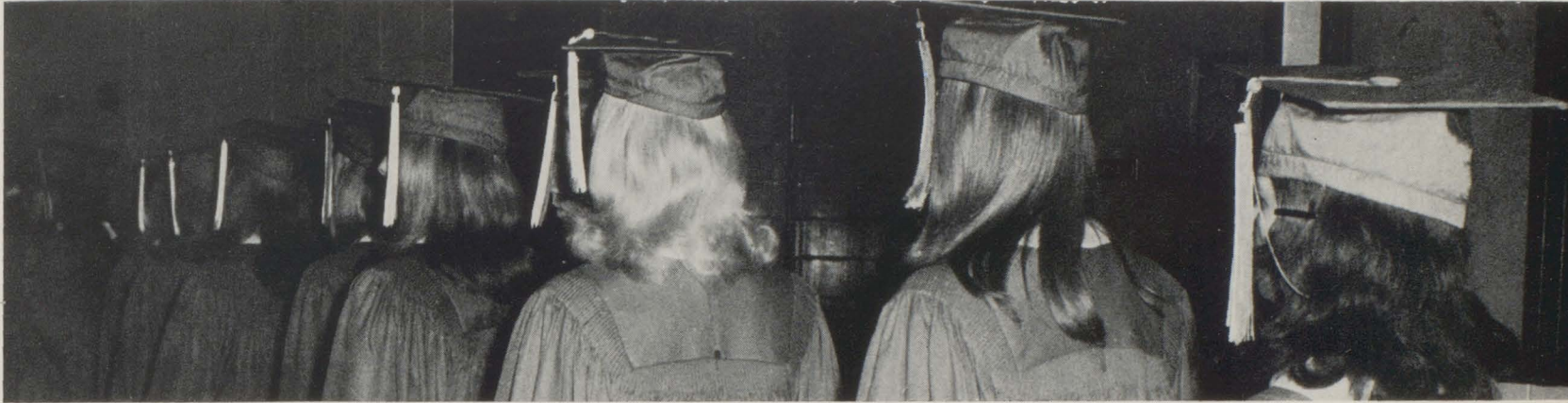






## June 10 Commencement Culminates An Innovative Year for the Class of '70

## After Seven Years, Dr. Charles Holt Returns as New District Superintendent

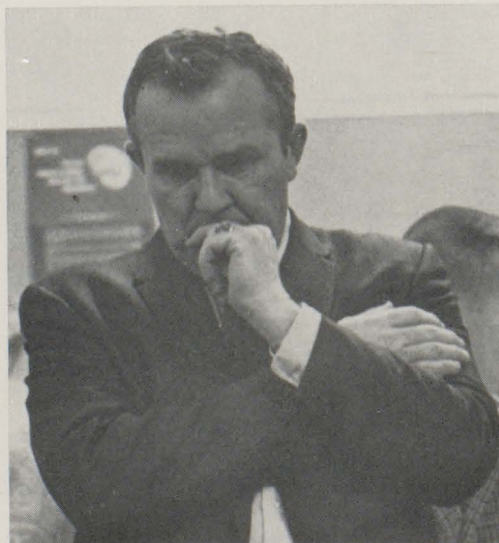

Indiana.

Though Dr. Holt's office is at Proviso East, he managed to spend considerable time at West as well. The referendum in November was conducted under his spirited leadership and he faced the multiple problems of two crowded schools throughout the year with humor and equanimity.

# Problems, Tensions, Made Board's Work Difficult, Demanding During 1969-70

Faced by rising costs in every area, the Board of Education for District 209 held a referendum in November to raise both the educational and building levies. Enthusiastic support by students, parents and faculty resulted in the passage of the educational proposal, but the building proposal was defeated.

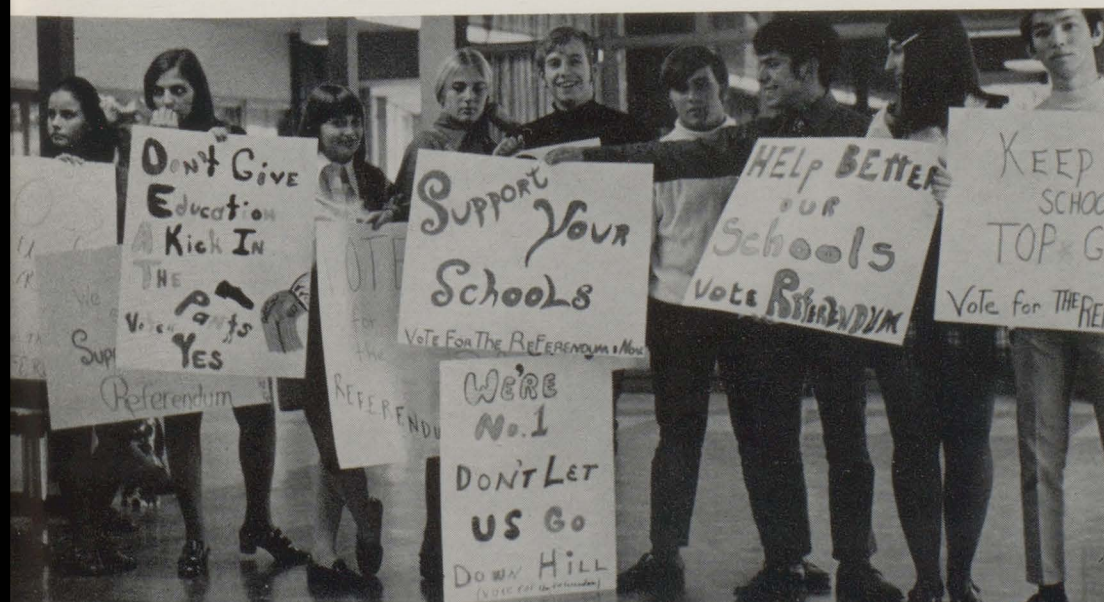
Added to the problems of finance,

tensions arising from the death of Fred Hampton, a former resident of District 209 and Black Panther leader, led to the closing of Proviso East during the weeks before Christmas. Throughout the year the faculties of both schools, as well as administration and board, were concerned with the evaluation by the North Central Association.

## Capable Staff Administers Varied Programs with Imagination and Zeal

Though most students at West scarcely know they exist, since most of their work is done from offices at East, the six people pictured here spend their days, and upon occasion, considerable portions of their nights planning and administering the programs and services which make West, as well as East, functioning entities.

One new administrative position was added to District 209's roster this year — that of Administrative Assistant — when Mr. Thomas Millikin, former Assistant Superintendent and head basketball coach at Proviso East, assumed some of the superintendent's administrative tasks and liaison duties between the community and the schools.

As in past years, Mr. Jack Stanley directed the district's business affairs, supervising the preparation of the budget and all other financial reports as well as the purchasing of equipment and supplies.

Mrs. Virginia Taylor was concerned with curriculum, the student-teacher program, and faculty in-service courses. While Mr. Richard Daniels was responsible for hiring of both certificated and clerical staff. Assisted by Mrs. Gerda Dahl, his office kept parents, the Board of Education, and the public in general, informed about school matters.

Mr. John Oklepek's duties included supervision of the adult education program, the evening school with nearly 2,000 students, and the summer school.

Under his new title, Mr. Claude Vandevender continued his former supervision of all-school testing, ACT, SAT, and National Merit Scholarship Qualifying tests. In addition, however, he introduced a program aimed at setting up a long-term follow-up study of Proviso students and providing a statistical basis for enrollment projections and growth factors to guide school progress.

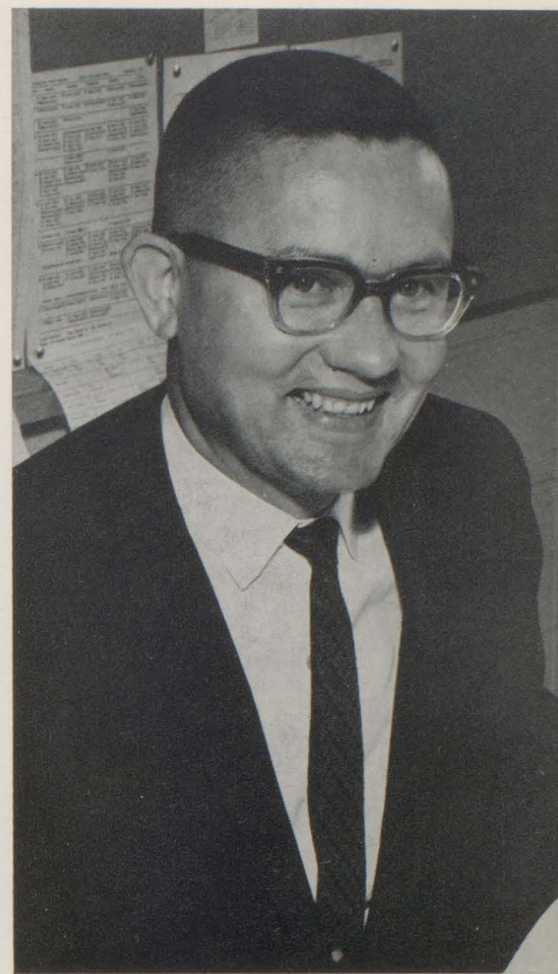




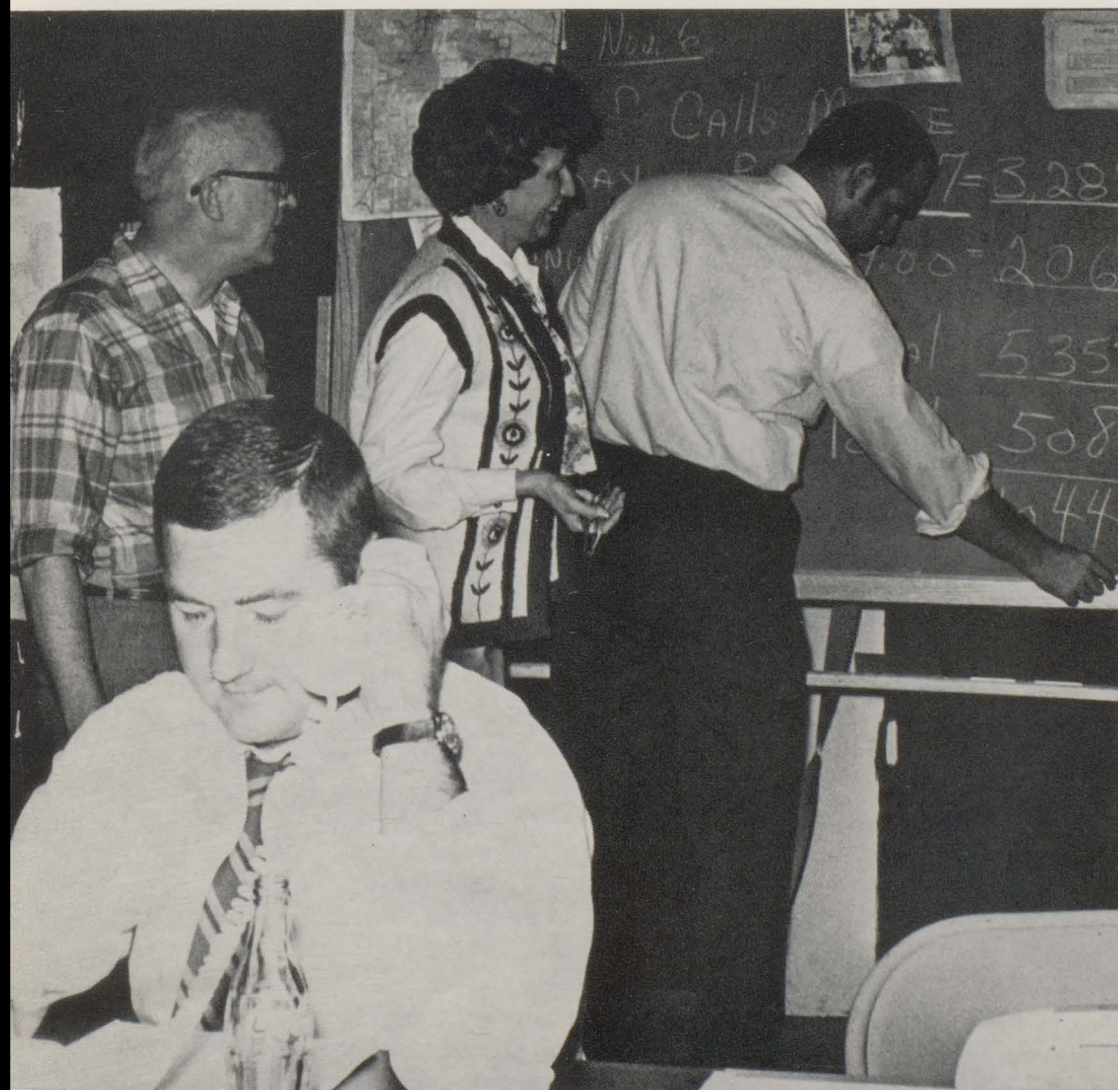

## West's New Principal Knows His School Inside and Out

This year Mr. Arthur Vallicelli was Proviso West's new principal — the third person to hold the position in the school's history. But every morning for the past twelve years, barring vacations, flu, meetings, and other legitimate exigencies, Mr. Vallicelli has stood, in one capacity or another, behind the desk in the main office. When West's first students pioneered their way from A to D buildings

in the opening weeks of September 1958, "Mr. Val" was West's administrative assistant in charge of scheduling and enrollment. He had been a science teacher and a counselor at Proviso East, so he was, even then, familiar with the problems and strengths of the Proviso high schools. In the intervening years he has done much to facilitate the clerical routines which make it possible for a steadily

growing school to continue to run smoothly, including the utilization of computers as they were added to improve the school's services.

His experienced and steadying hand was apparent throughout the year as he dealt with new problems and innovations including the "Early Bird" program which has proved a satisfactory if partial solution to over-crowding.

Serving his third year as dean, Mr. Richard Wede was assisted this year for the first time by Mr. Wayne Holous who has had many years of experience at West as a teacher of vocational and architectural drafting.

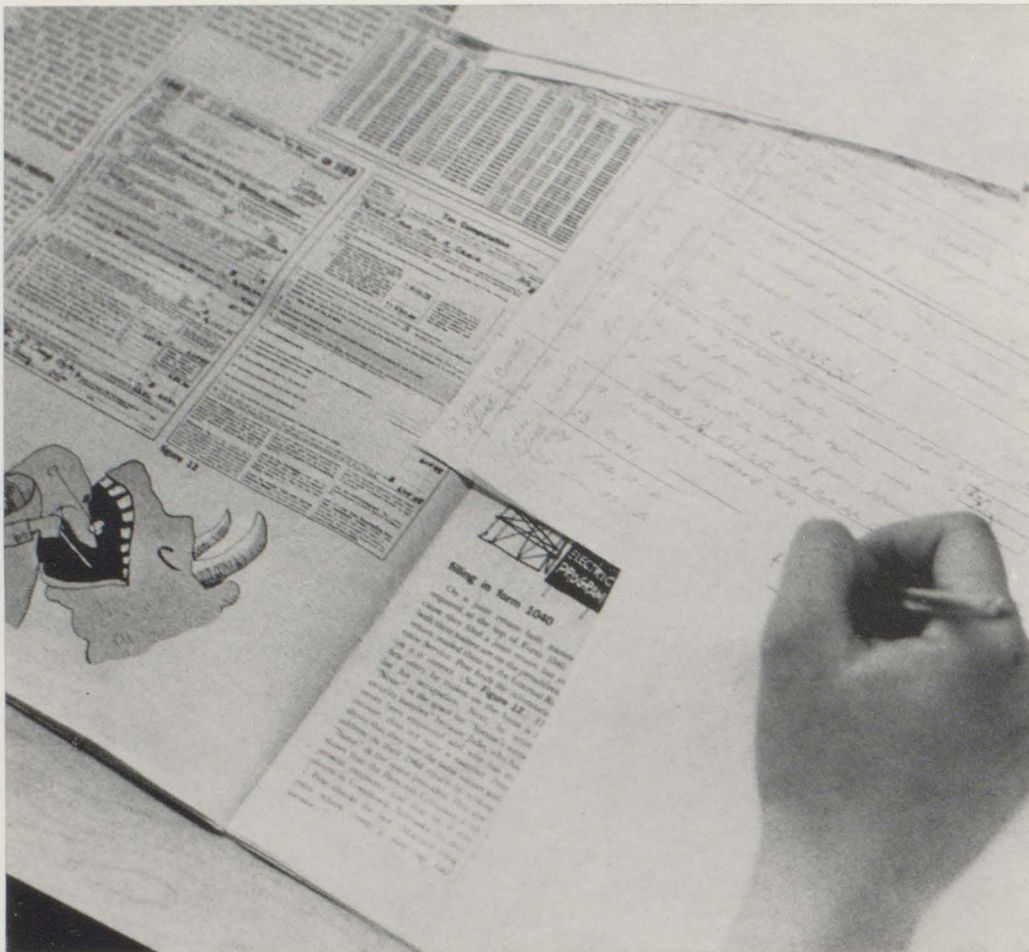

## New English Curriculum Reaches Juniors Modular Scheduling Is Tentatively Tried

The third year of West's new English curriculum was translated into the daily routine of assignments, papers and discussions in 1969-70 when juniors were introduced for the first time to a full year of American Literature. The traditional study of Hawthorne's *Scarlet Letter* and Twain's *Huckleberry Finn* were not omitted, but much of the course concerned more contemporary writing dealing with the urban environment and its accompanying problems. A unit on the development of language and dialects

was also a part of the new course.

Though modular scheduling has not yet been introduced at West as an overall pattern of class organization, members of several of Mr. Dale Crawford's classes had an opportunity to sample this less rigid method of time allotment. Students were permitted to choose the particular activity on each day which they wished to attend in order to best serve their needs in dealing with the subject area being covered.

in the future. Mechanical and architectural classes also have girl members.

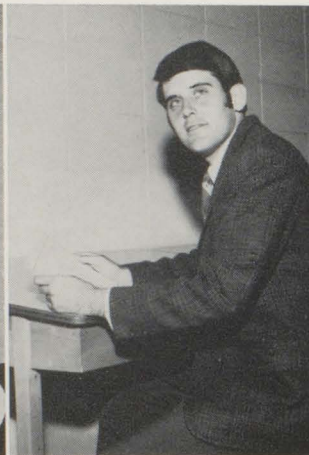
Introduced last year, the Numerical Control (N/C) course was expanded. N/C is an automated method of operating machines. Students learned to prepare the tapes which operate such machines.



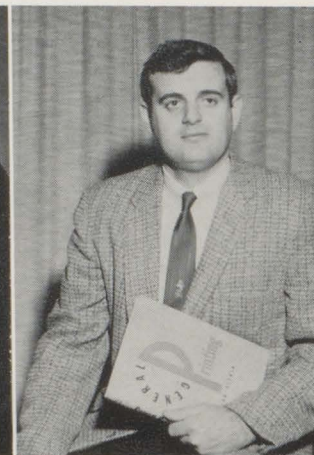

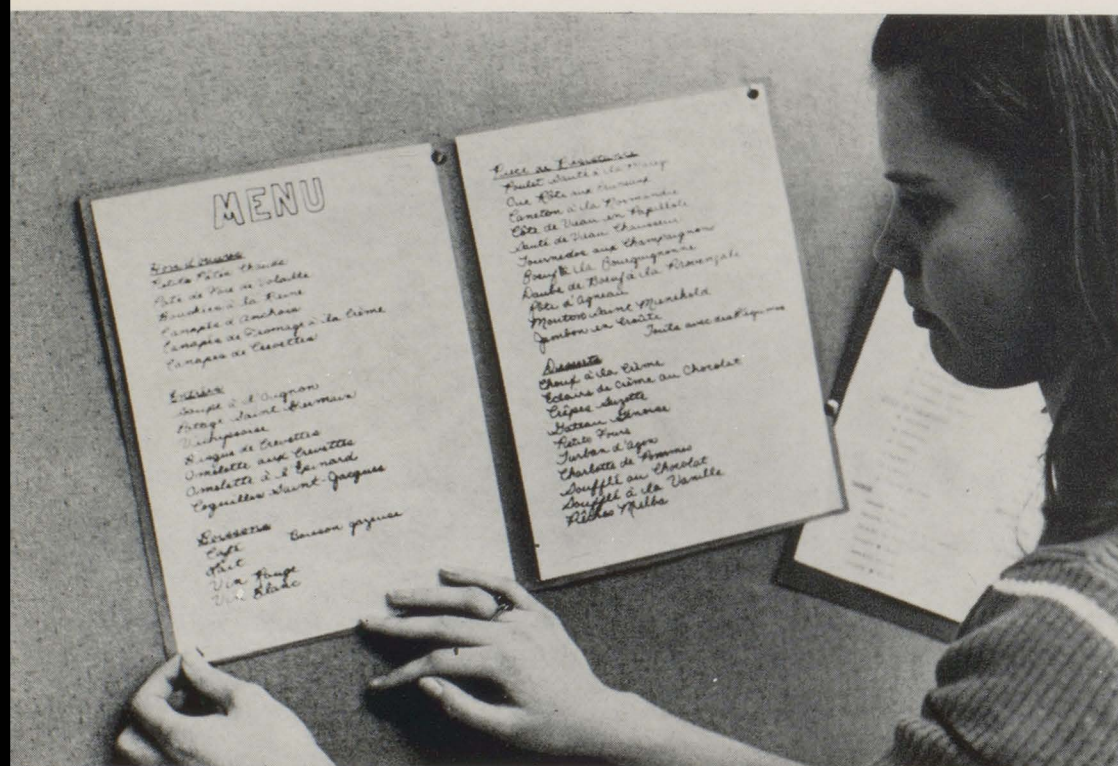
## Language Classes Strive to Give Fresh Viewpoints on Unfamiliar Life Styles

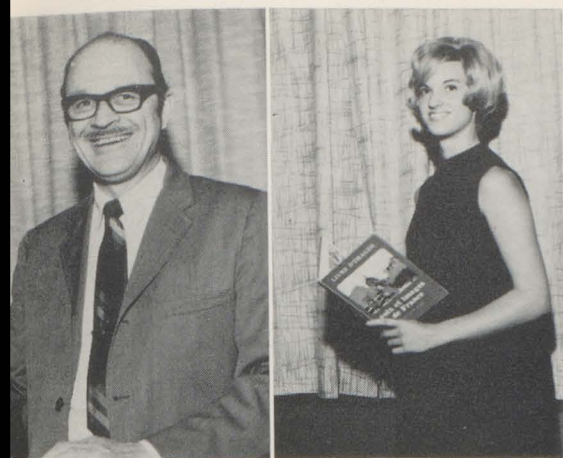

## Girls' Physical Education Offers New Unit Weight Room Facilities, Use Increase

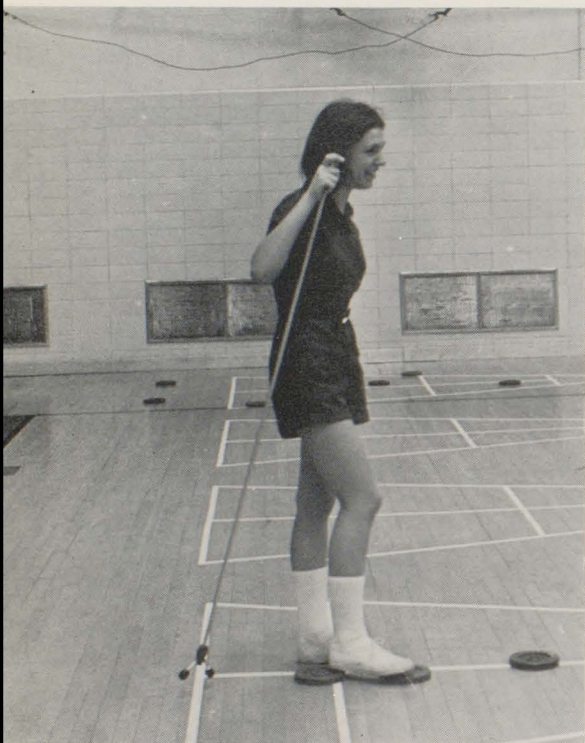

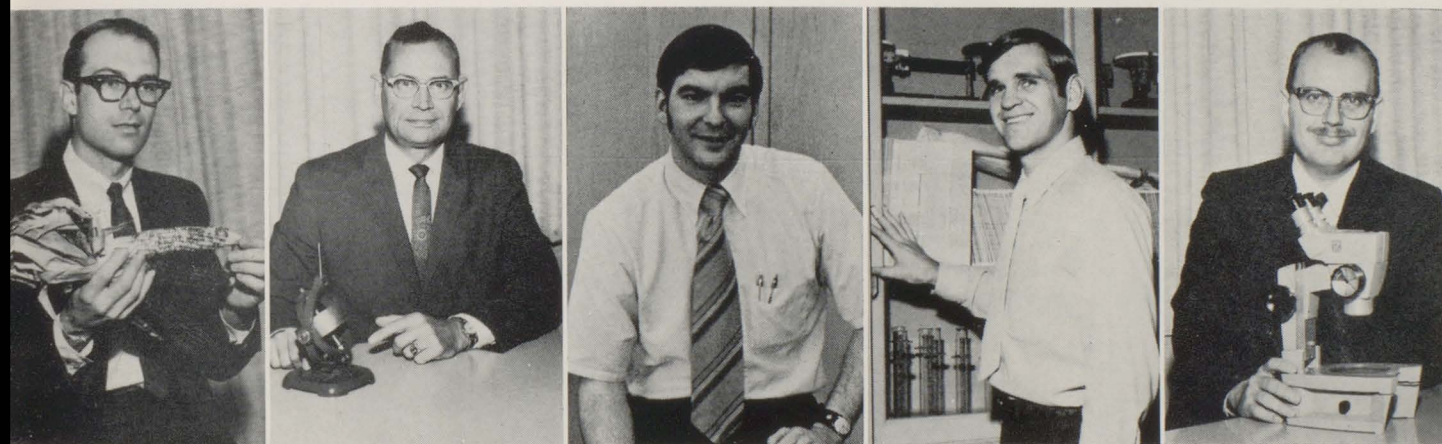
they added choice specimens of their own discovery to their individual fossil collections. A 250-million year-old fern fossil was one of the more exciting finds.

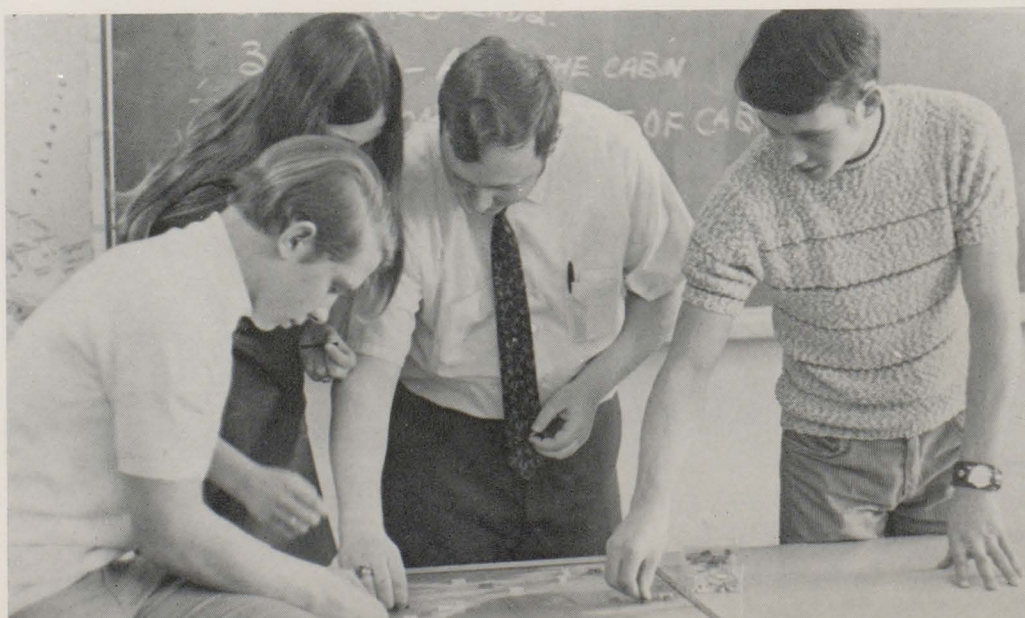

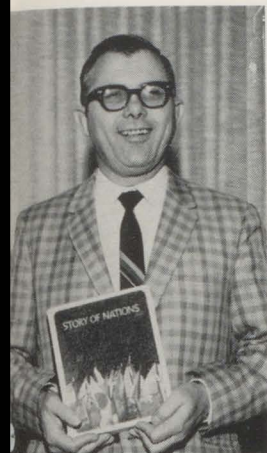


# Social Studies Introduces Afro-American Course for First Time Second Semester

proach to the social sciences which West is in the process of developing.

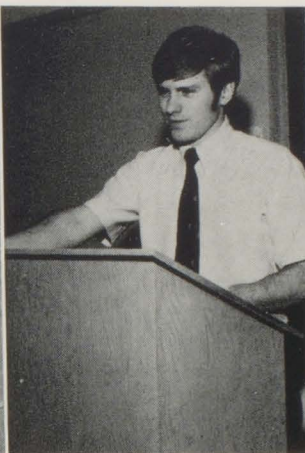
Another evidence of this approach was the use of simulation exercises in far-eastern and current history classes to make more vivid the social, military, and economic problems of unfamiliar countries.

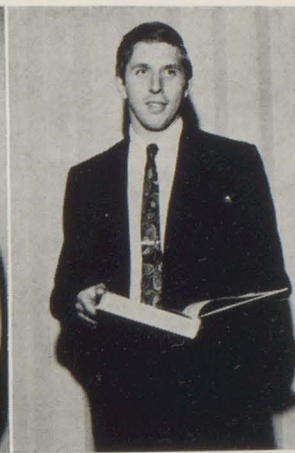

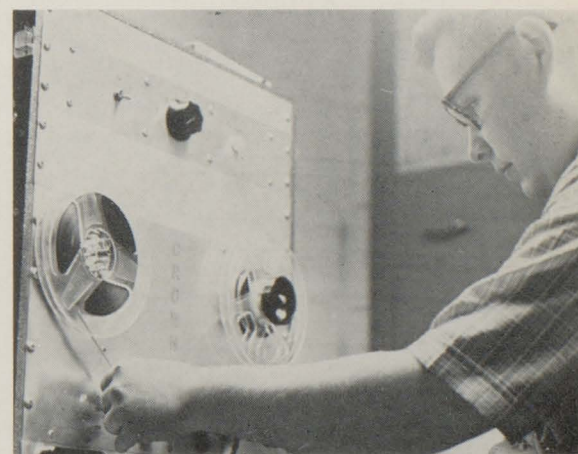

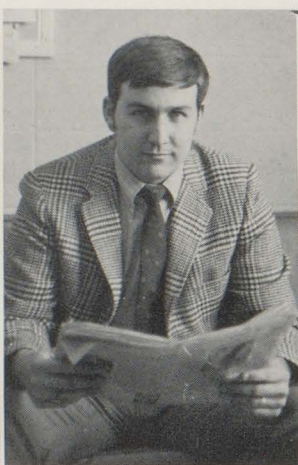
## Meeting the Challenge of West Head-on, a Dozen Teachers Join Faculty at Semester

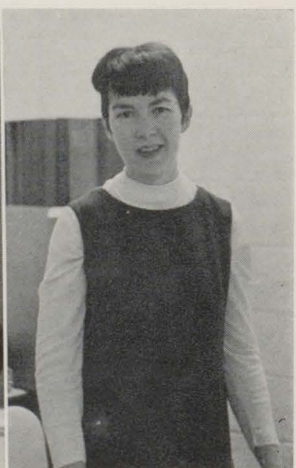

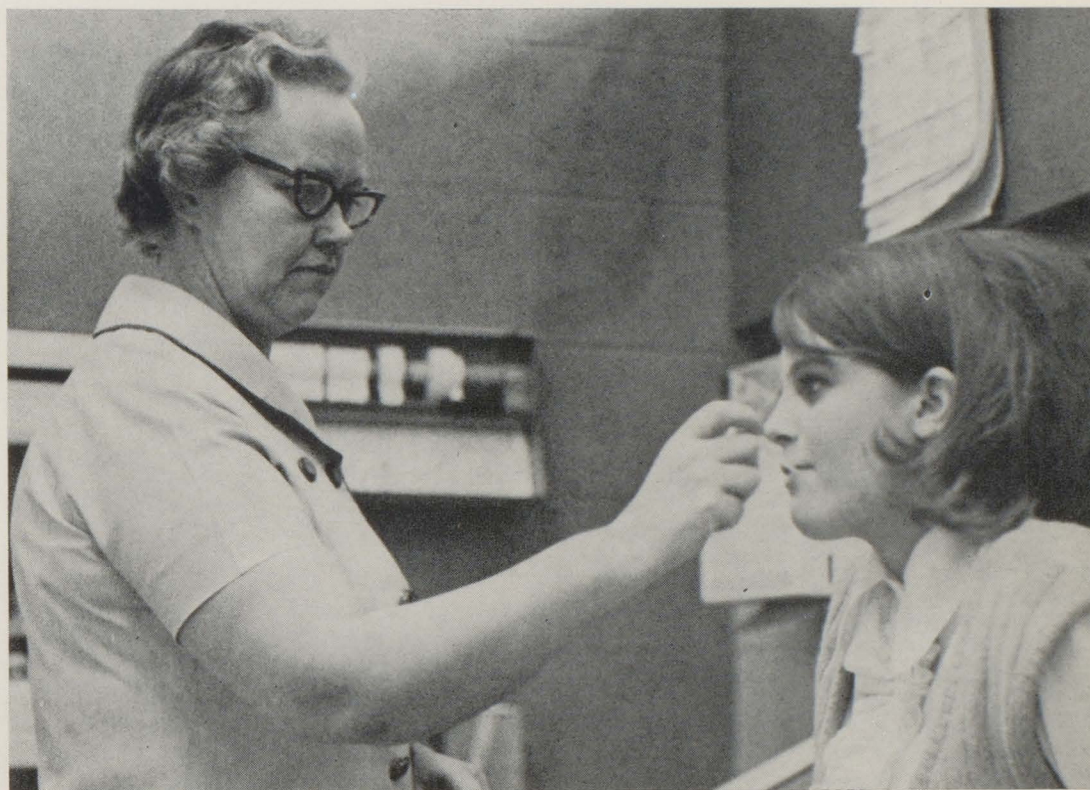
## West Nurses Encourage Careers in Health Through Special Conference Day

## IBM-PBX Dictation Increases Efficiency

Though West's secretarial and business staff was increased by one in 1969-70, additional enrollment added to, rather than lightened the workload of individual members.

Student report cards and permanent records, both scholastic and for attendance, twice-yearly scheduling of more than 4,000 students, class lists and book records—these were routine duties which had to be fitted into a steady stream of letter-writing, and the typing and reproduction of thousands of pieces of material needed by administration and faculty.

Greatly aiding the staff in the time-consuming business of dictation this year, however, was the newly installed IBM-PBX machine which enabled any department chairman or counsellor to pick up his telephone and dictate automatically to a tape material which could later be processed into a typed letter, stencil, etc., by a secretary.

An innovative and imaginative approach to the problems of maintenance on the part of its staff and directors has provided West with a fleet of jeeps and trucks constructed from surplus vehicles. Purchased from the government for very small sums, jeeps and trucks have been entirely renovated and redesigned by the maintenance staff to serve particular uses as well or better than vehicles costing

hundreds of thousands of dollars. Equipped with snow plows, these same jeeps and trucks do double duty in winter.

Many of the routine tasks of maintenance which many institutions are unable to do for themselves—such as the cleaning of draperies—are also done at great saving by the school staff using equipment imaginatively created from surplus or inexpensive materials.



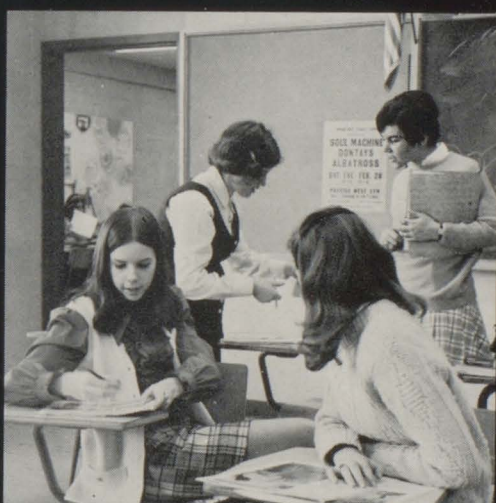
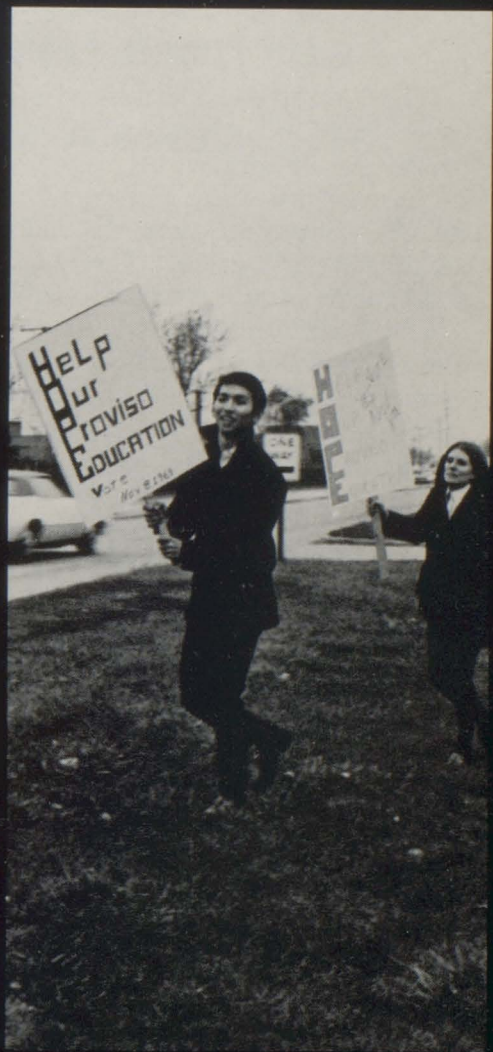

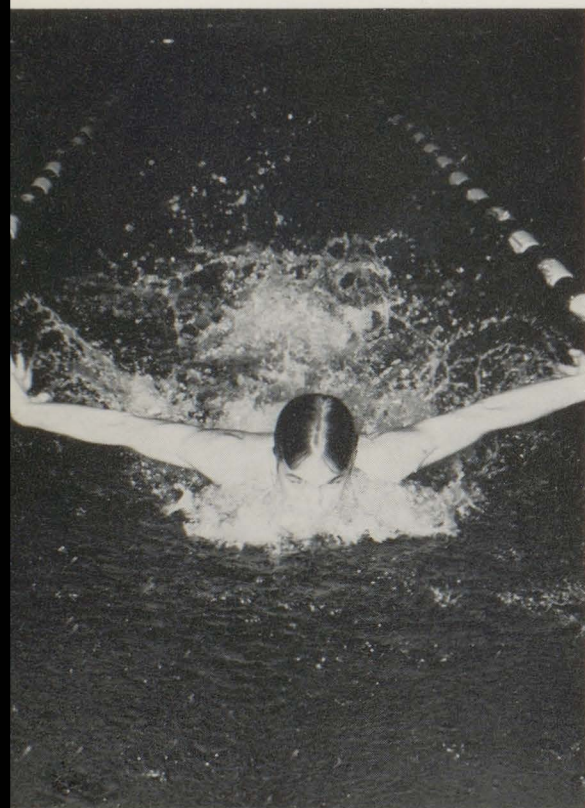
normal children who wanted to learn.

Proviso's Aquatic Staff also hosted the Panther Relays. These consist of various schools competing in swimming. The members sold concessions.

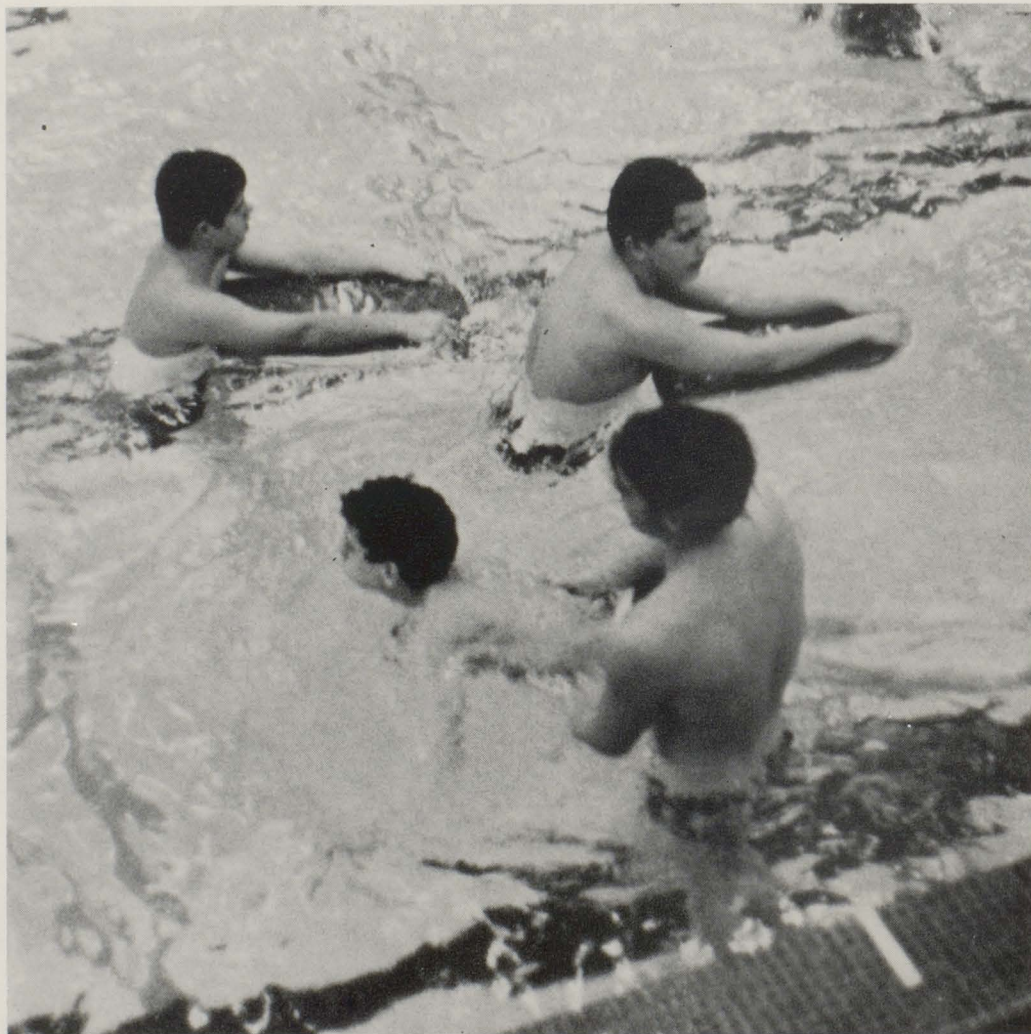

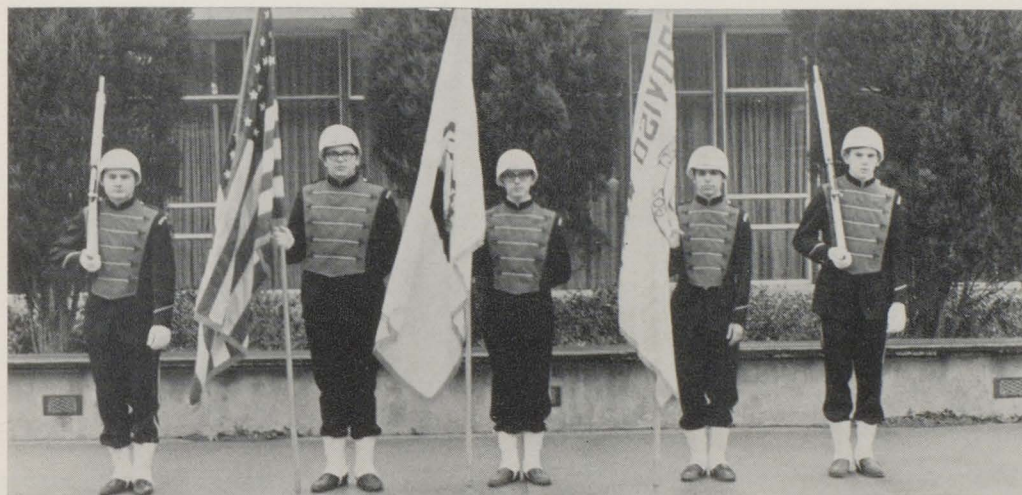
## West Band Has Rewarding Year

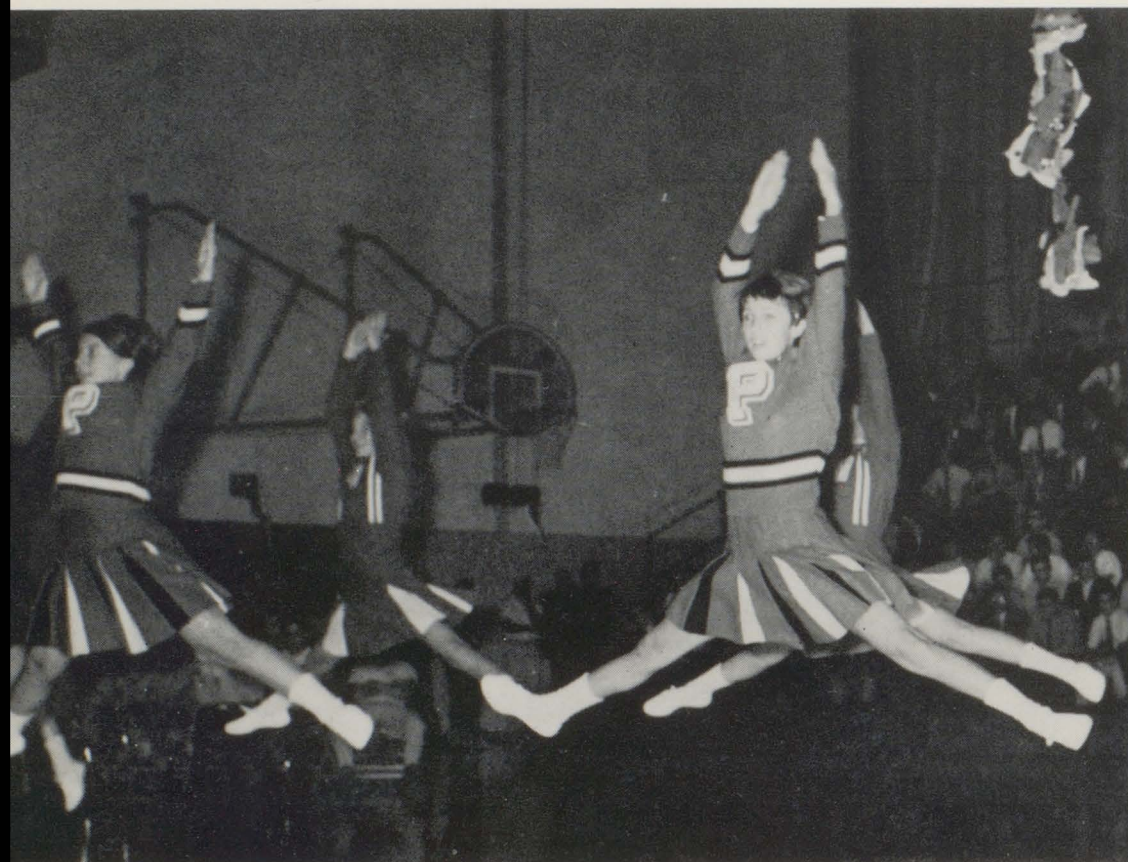
# Proviso West Cheerleaders Proudly Bring Back Awards From Camp in Michigan

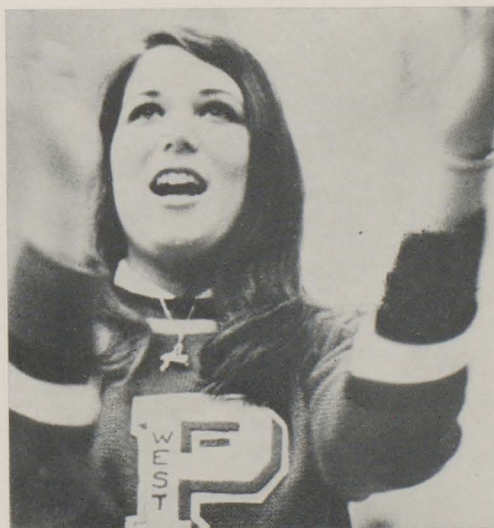

For the time and experience, one senior boy is selected each year for a scholarship. Last years winner is attending Bradley University and is majoring in television electronics.



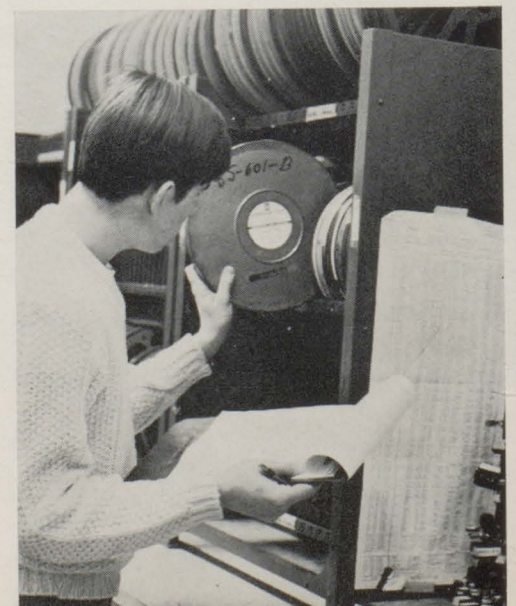

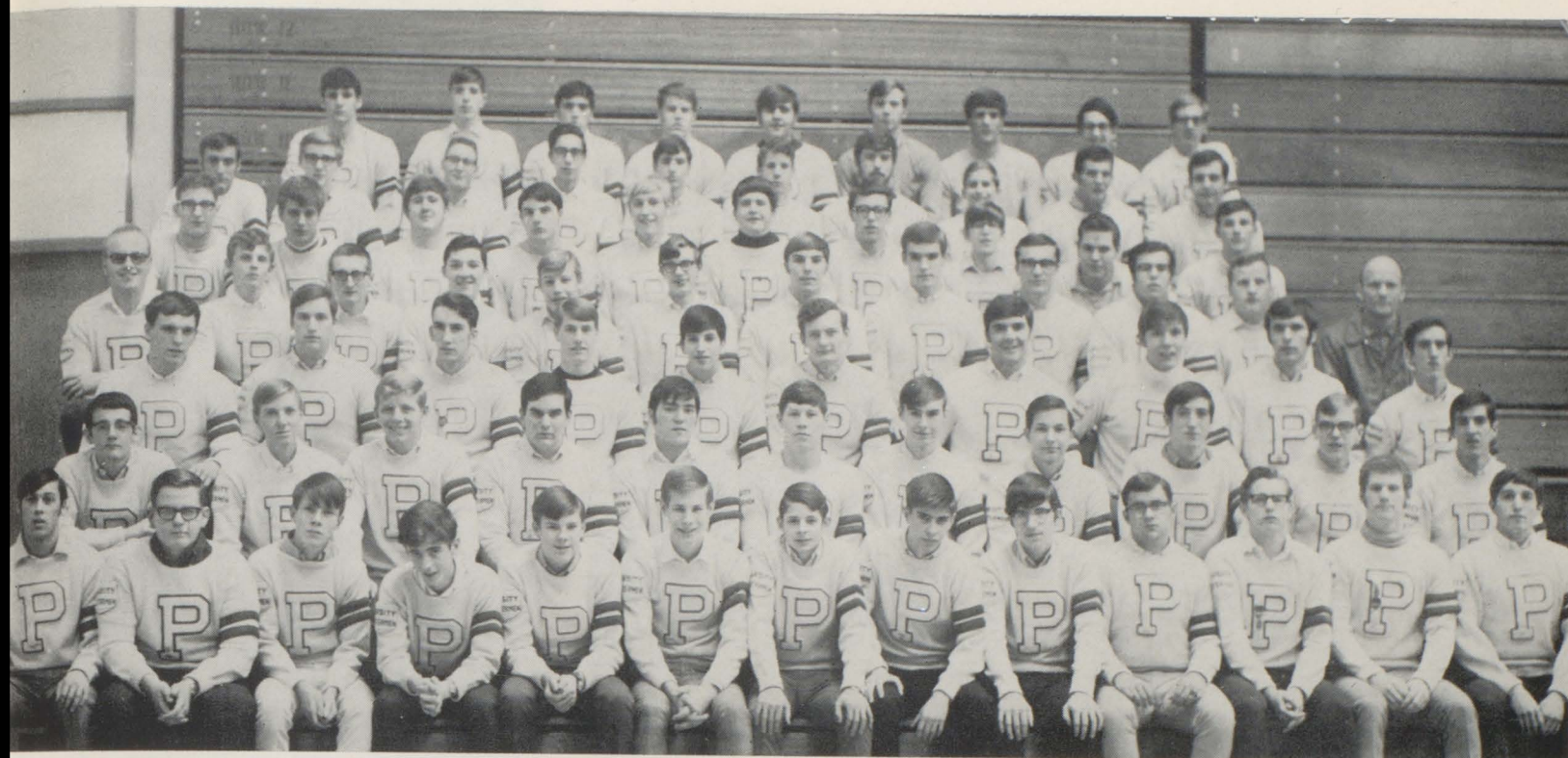

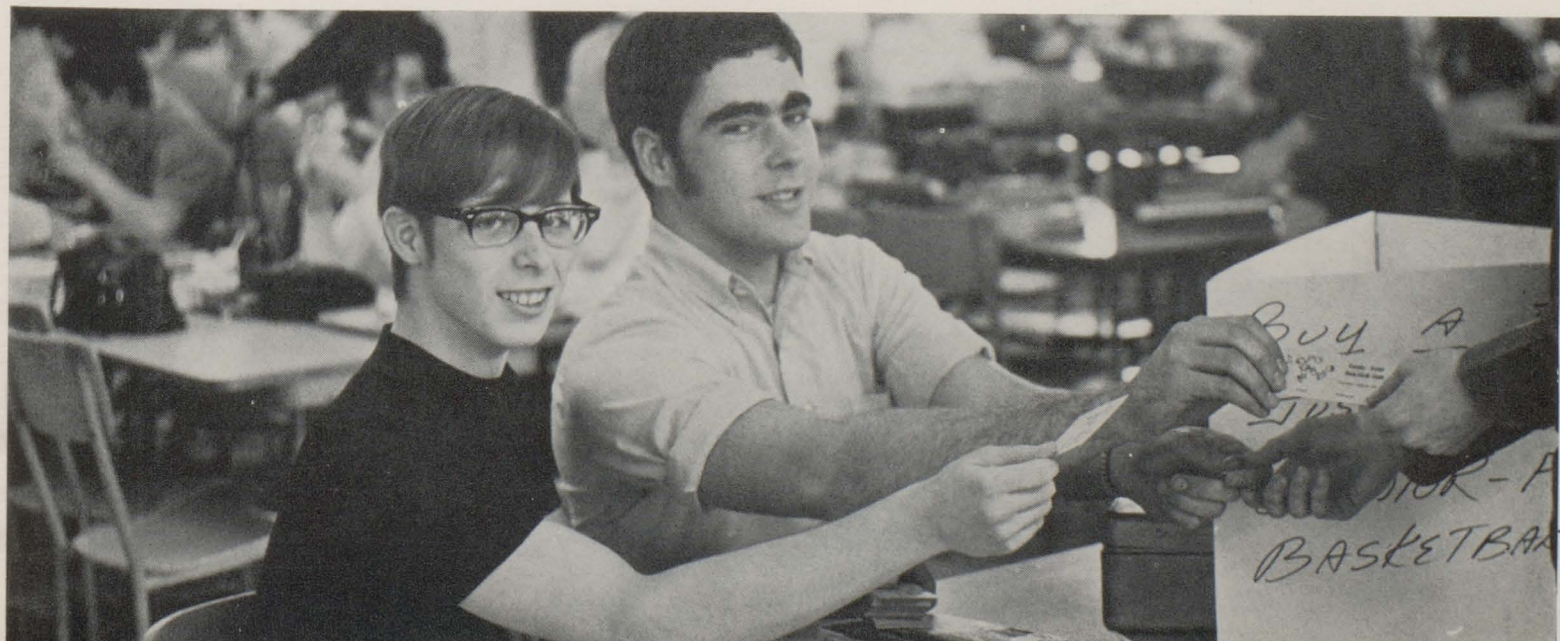

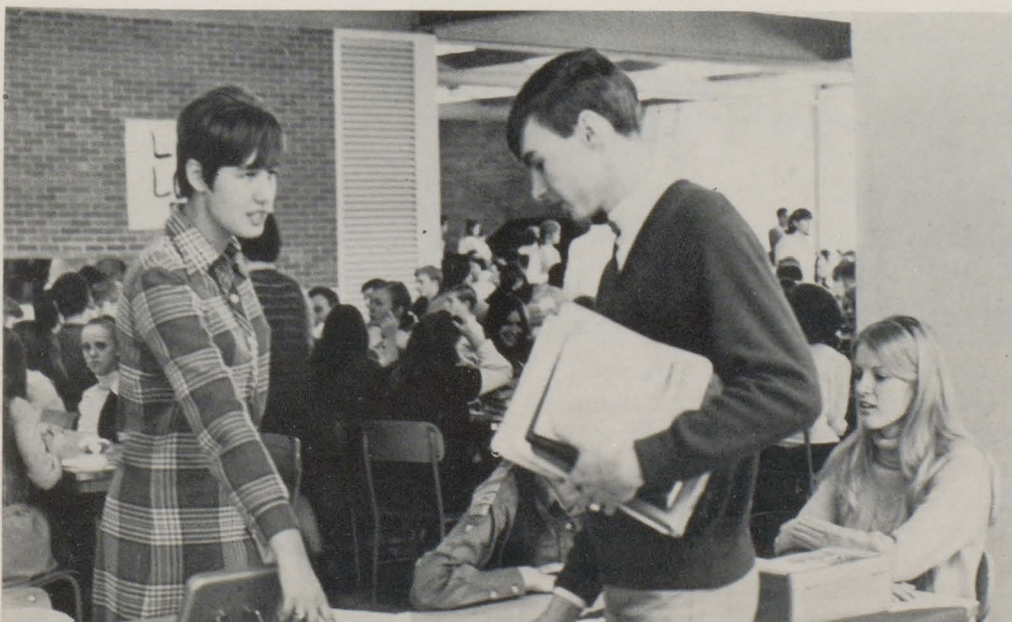
## FTA Features Foreign Students and Special Education Teachers at Teas

## Girls' League Goes Ape Over Favorite Cave Man at Sock Hop "Flintstone Fling"

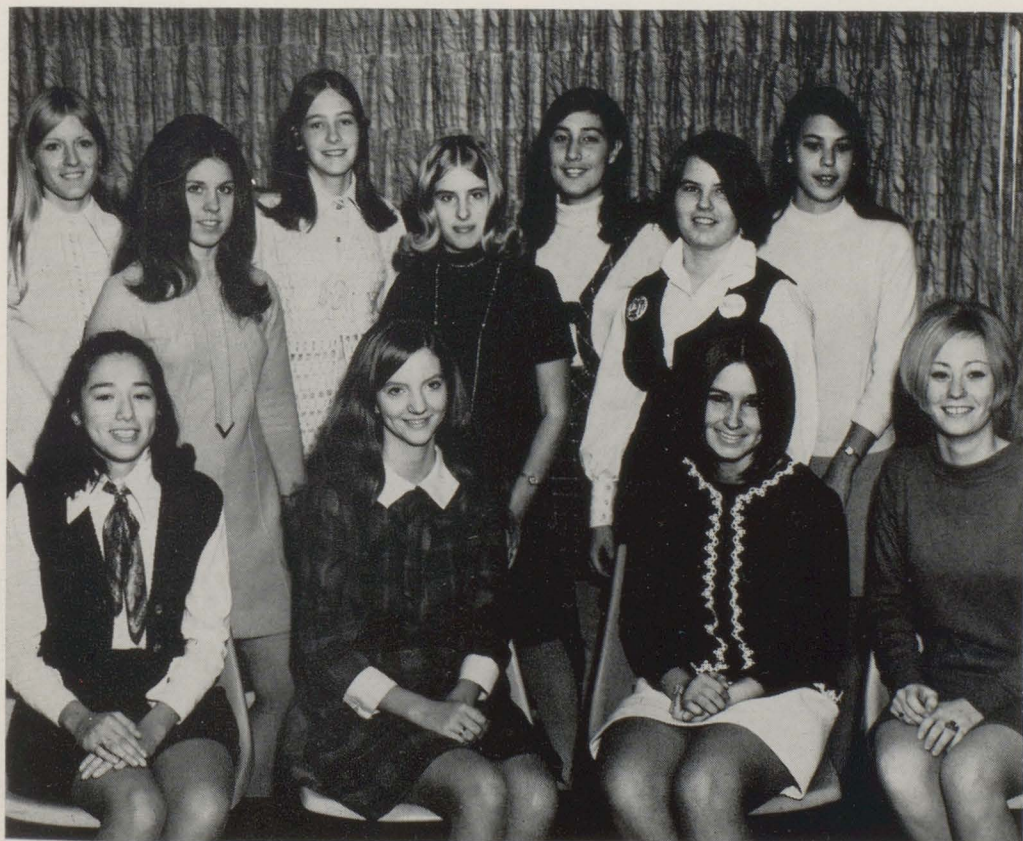
Larry Lujack was the special guest of the Girls' League service project dance, "Guada Gungle Gas." All proceeds went to a mission hospital in Guatamala.

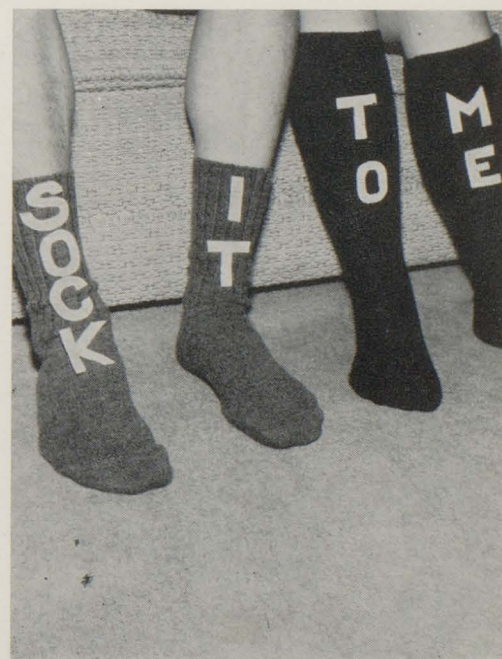

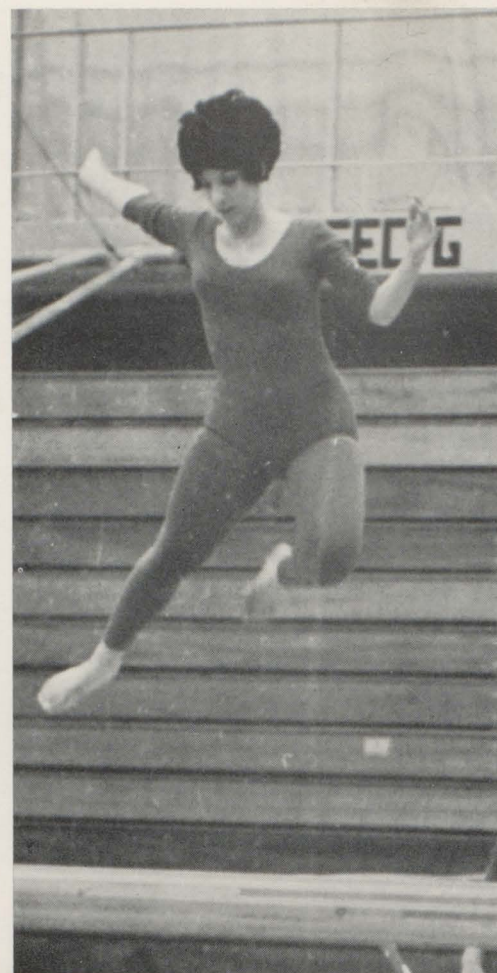

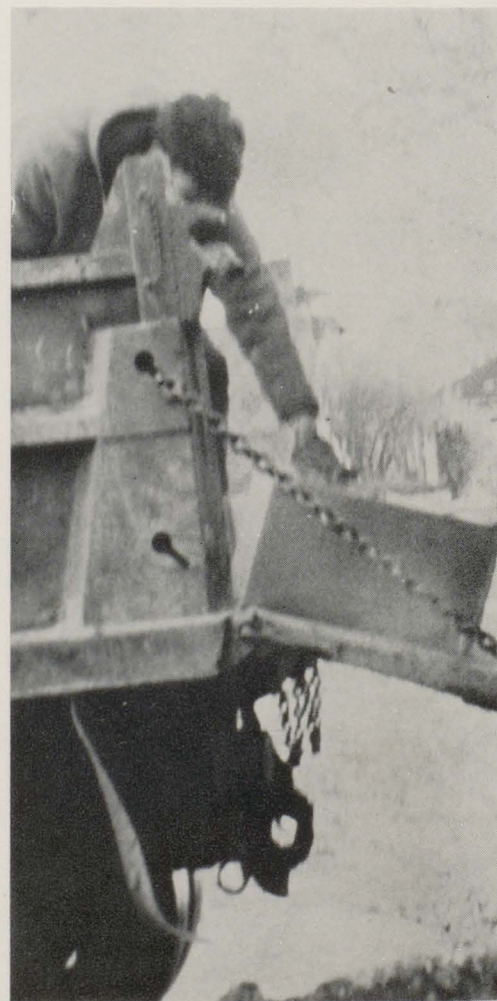

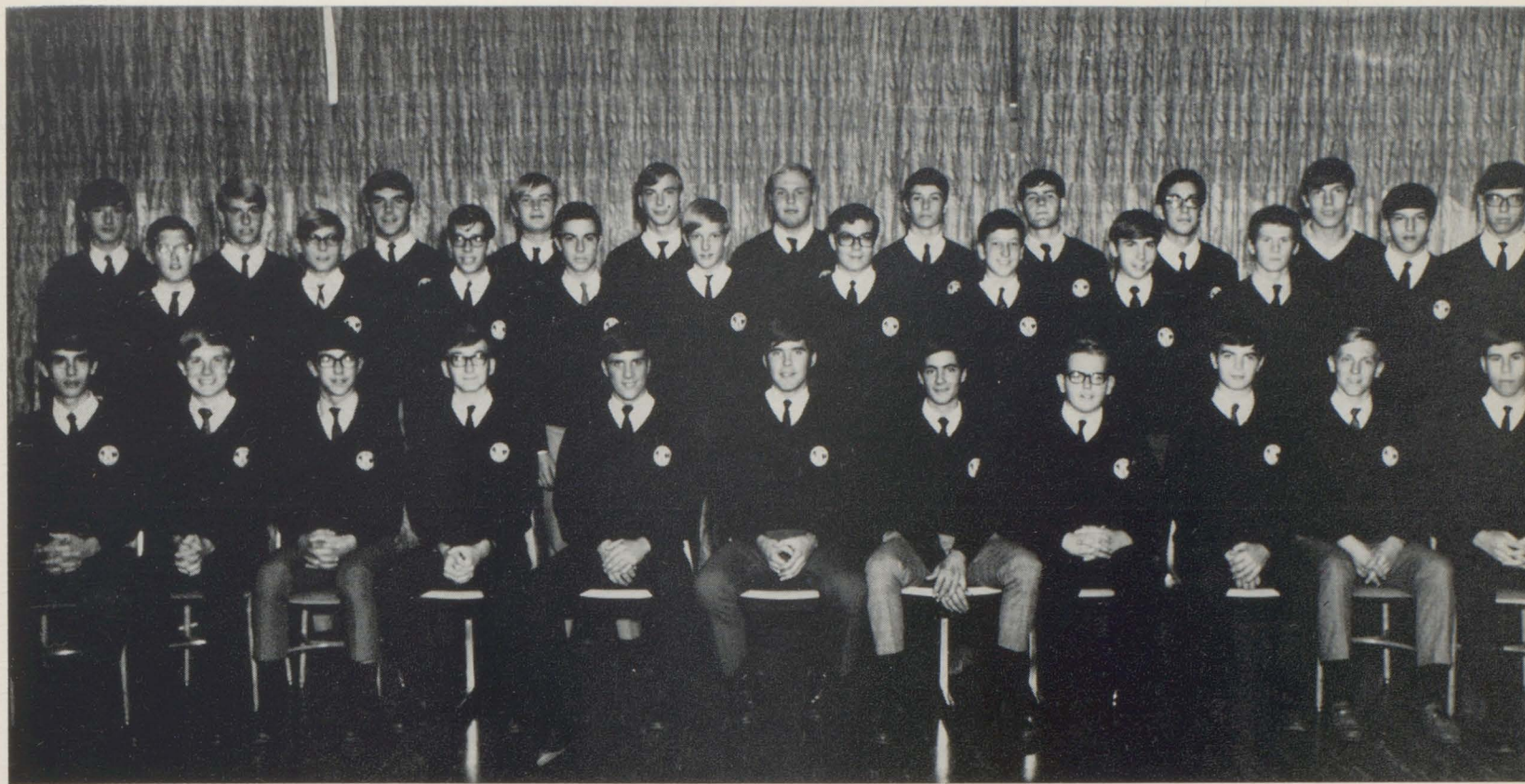

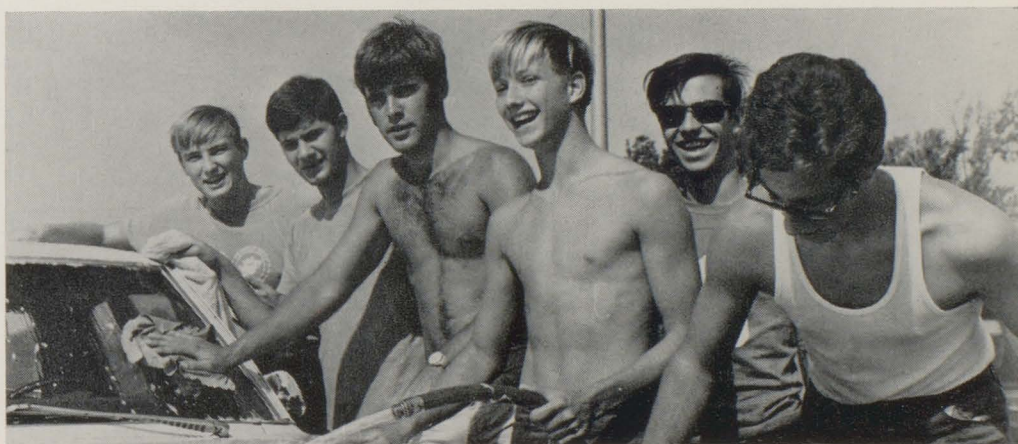

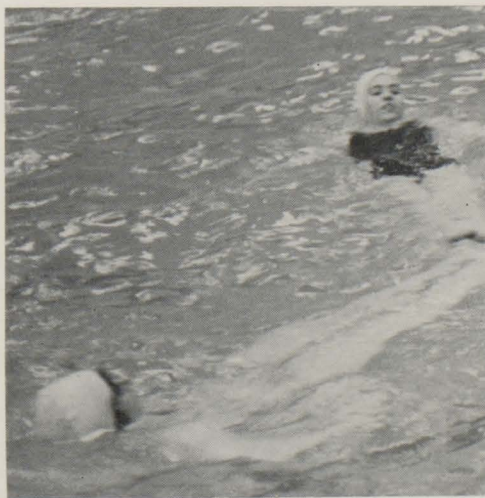
## Extra, Extra, "Water Weekly" Newspaper Theme Delights Fall Audience With Skills

Monitors, such as Paul Gasior, stationed in the Deans' office execute such errands as delivering "send-fors" to respective students.

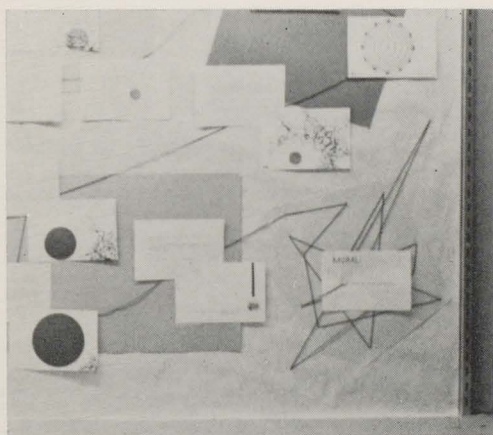

As the result of economic stresses the 1970 *Mural* staff was faced with the challenge of producing a book at minimum cost that would maintain the high level of past year's books.

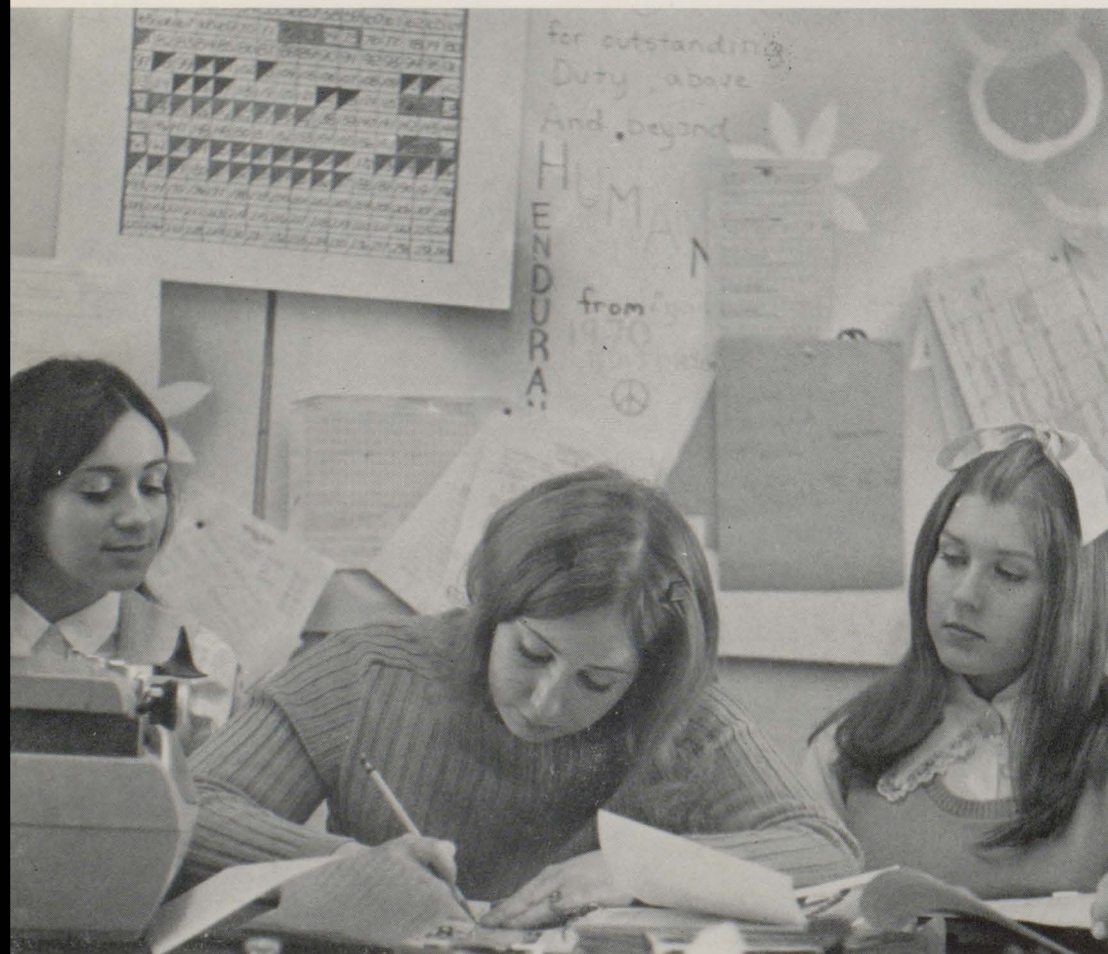
With a no-color dispensation the staff decided on a black and white design for the cover and division pages. This color

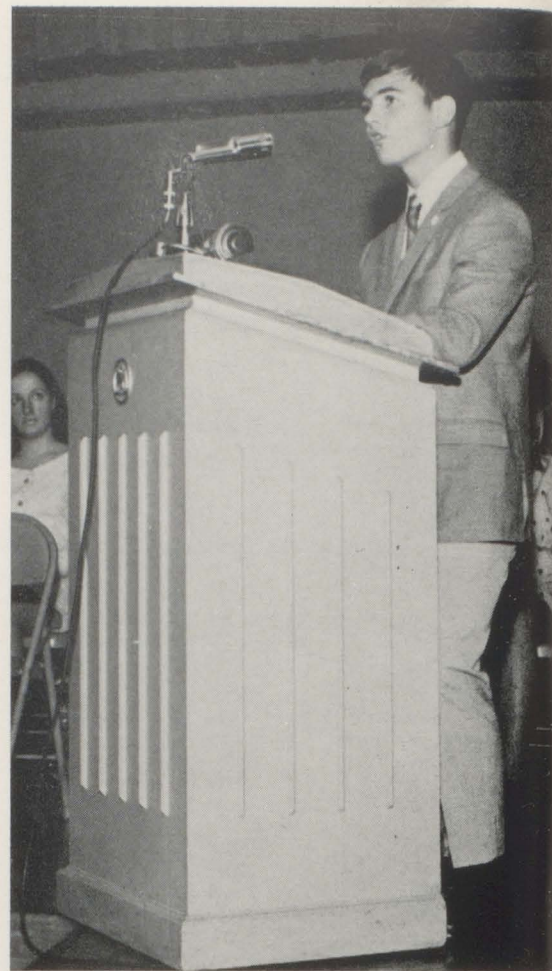


## NHS Gathers Funds Through Sale of Panther Decals

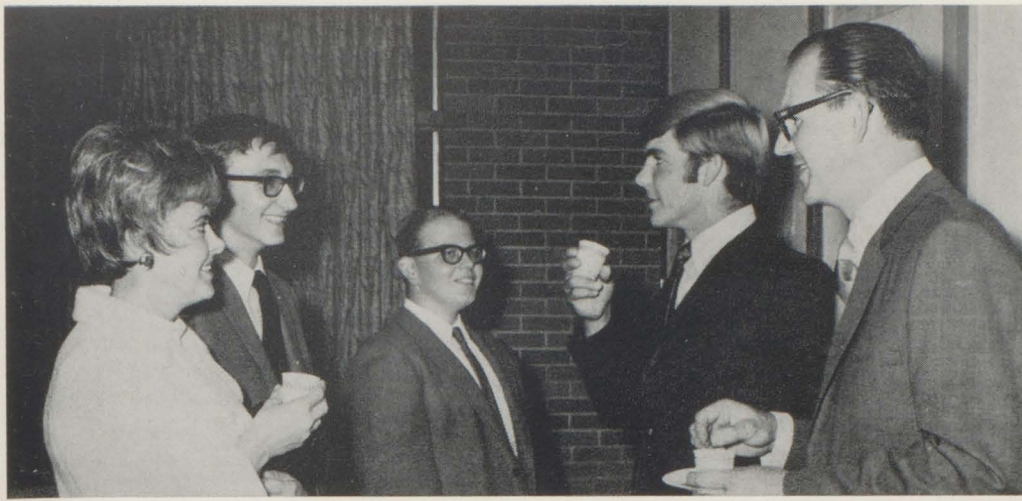

A new invention sparked student interest: suggestion boxes. These boxes were scattered around the halls in the form of mail boxes beckoning the students to anonymously make known their gripes.

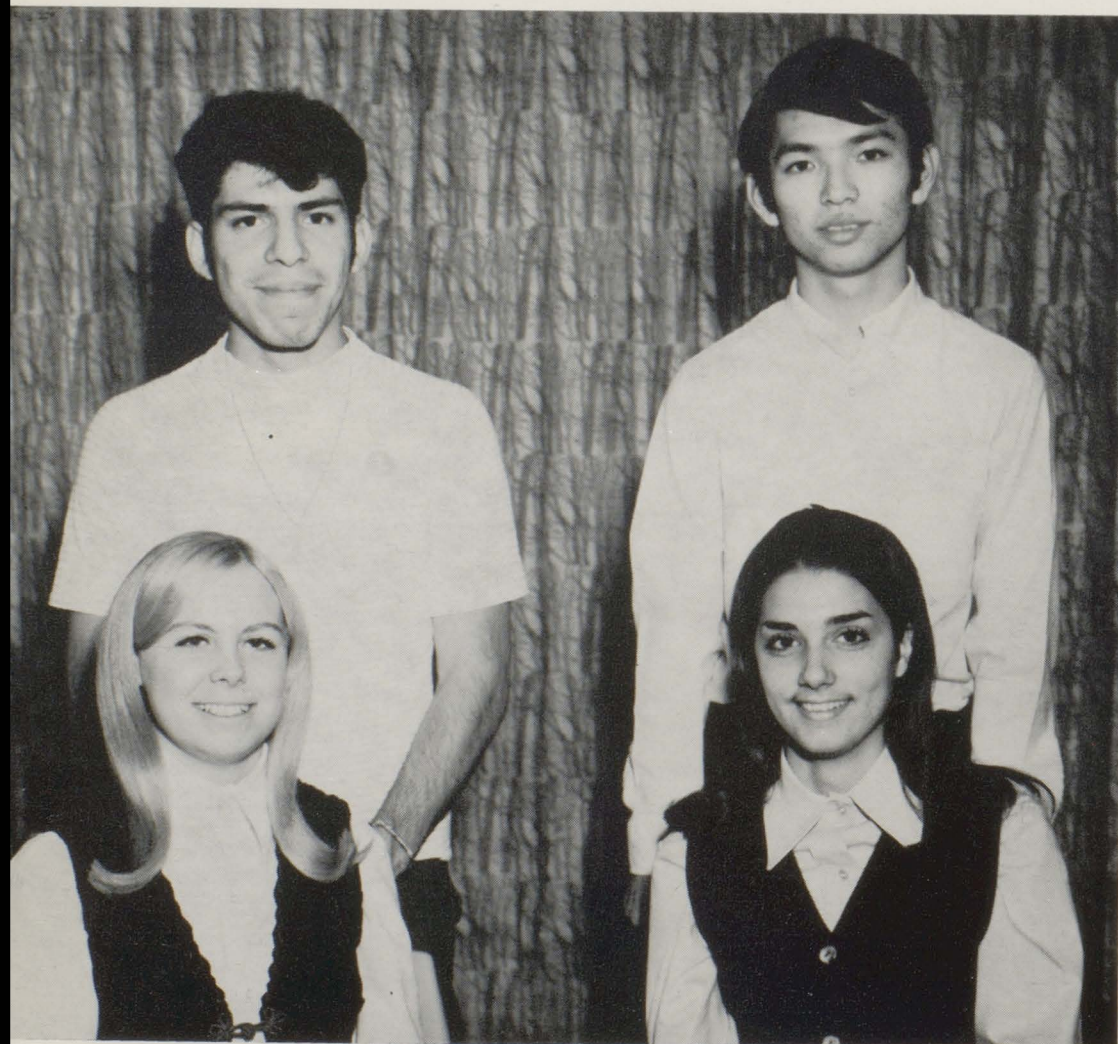
Among other activities, Student Council held two gym jams, the annual winter dance entitled "Glass Onion," and a spring convention in April.

The officers tried to promote enthusiasm in the club by awarding points on attendance at meets.

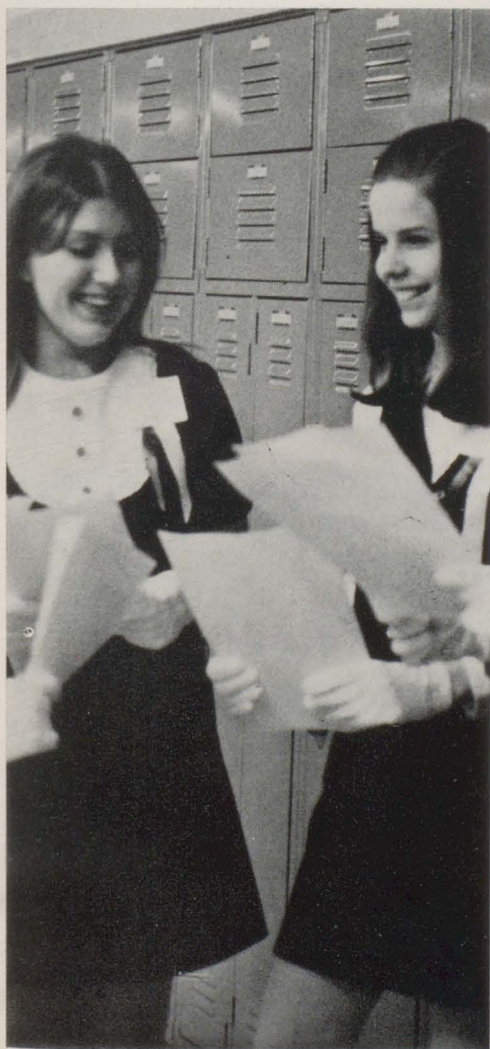

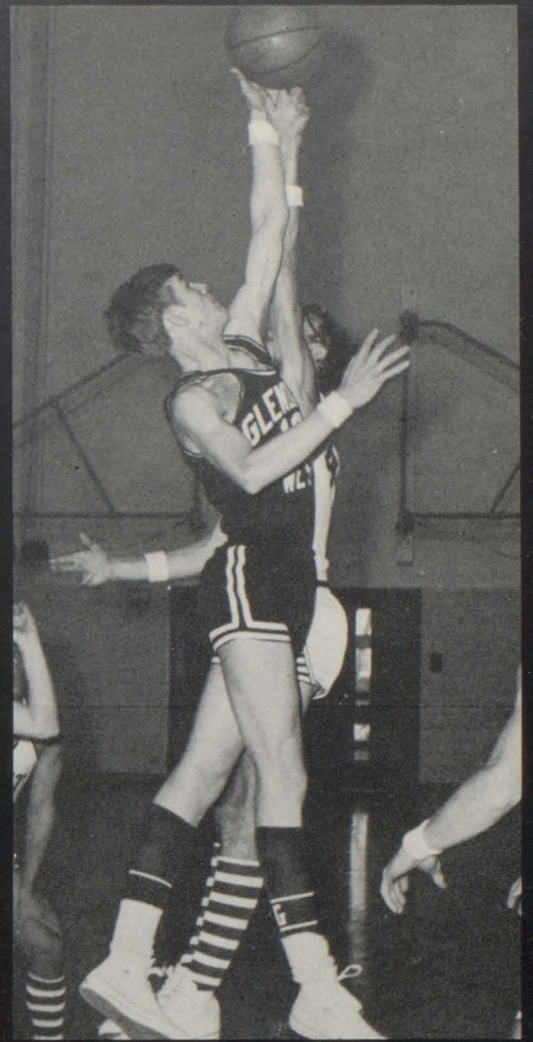
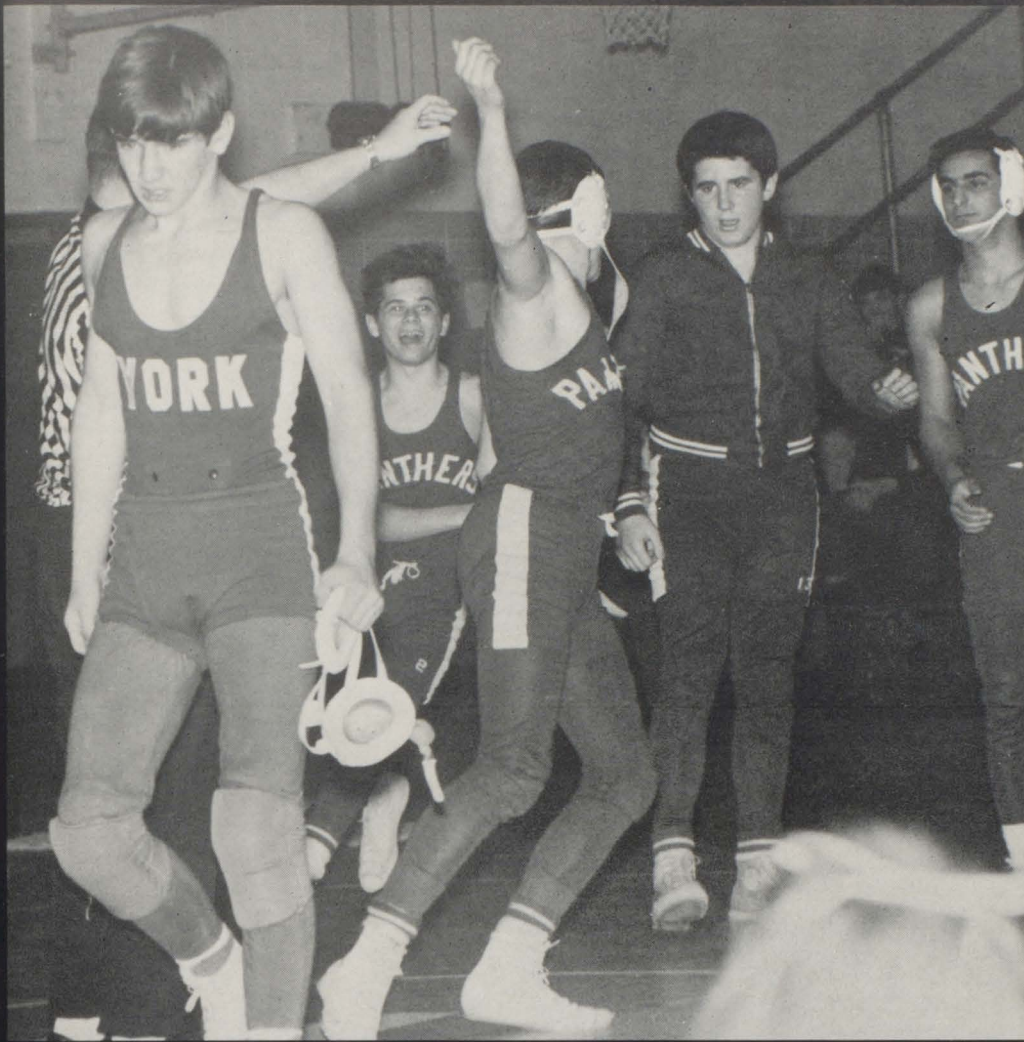

# Panthers Suffer Through Rough Season; Three Attain All-Conference Status

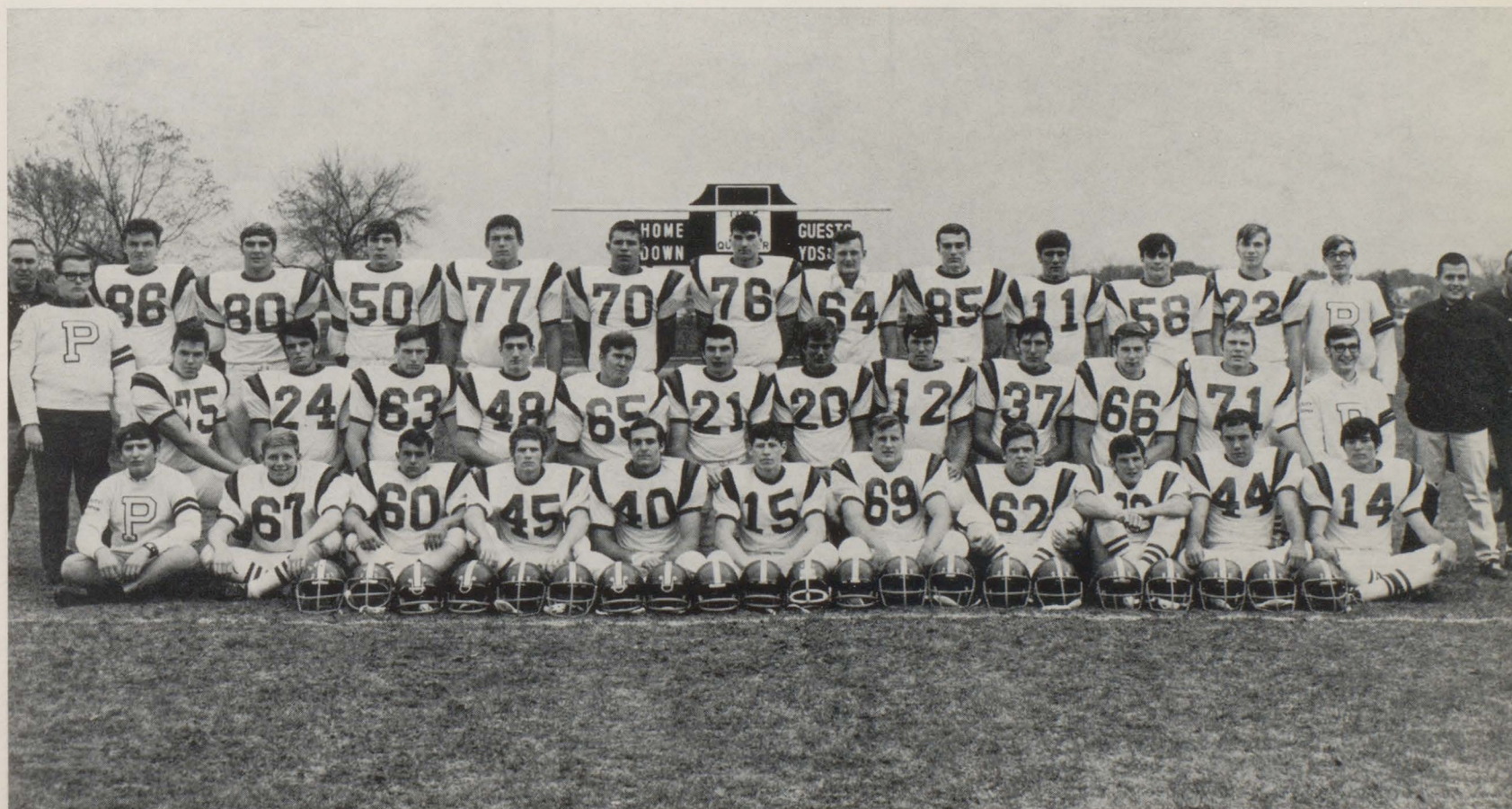

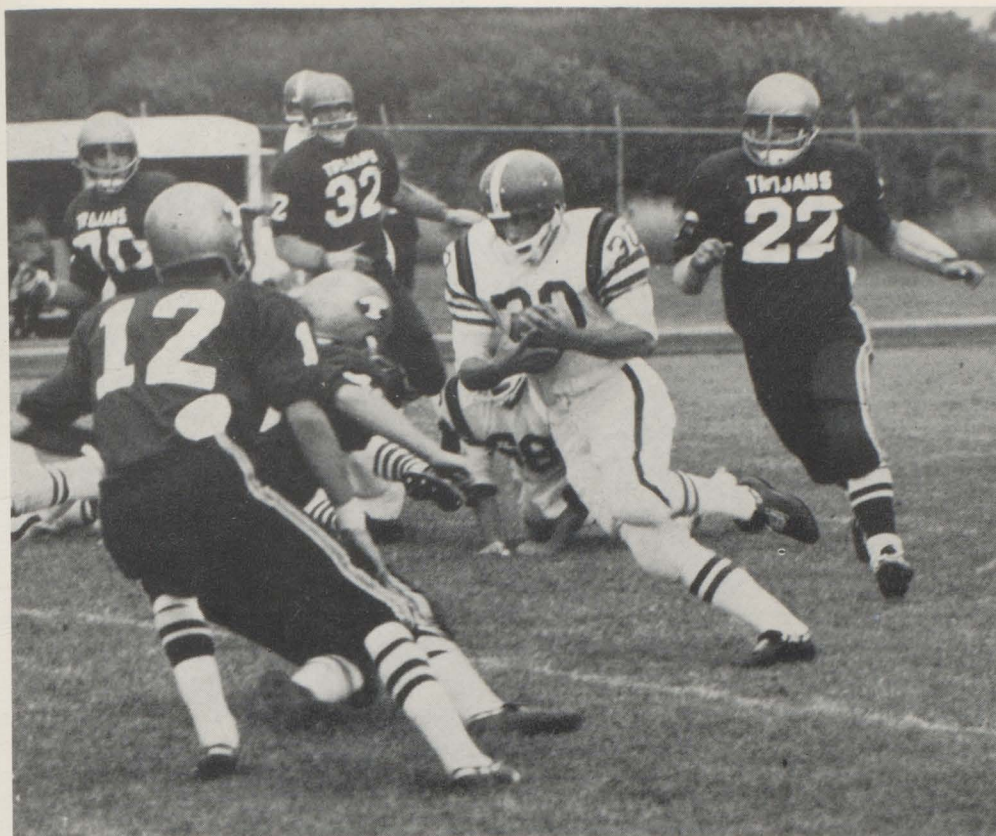

## Harriers Grab Respectable 5th Downstate, Dominate District for 7th Straight Year

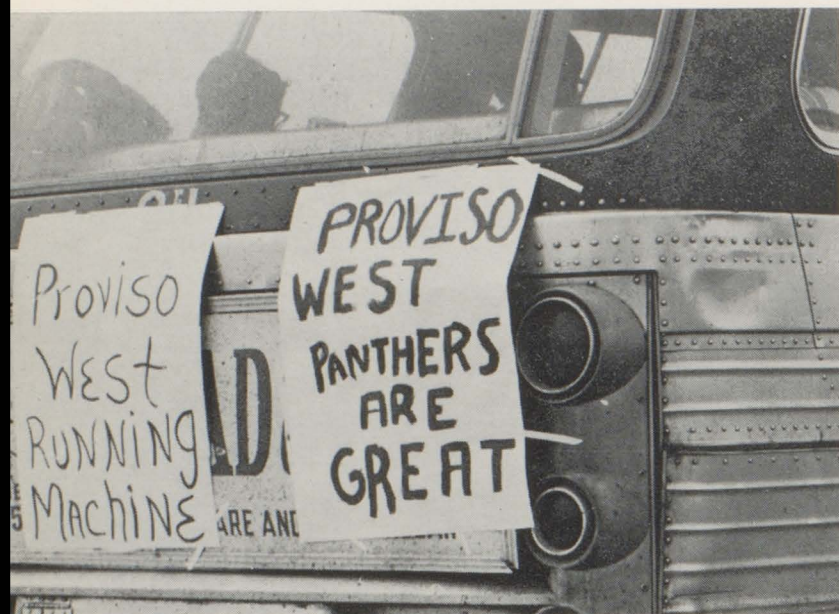

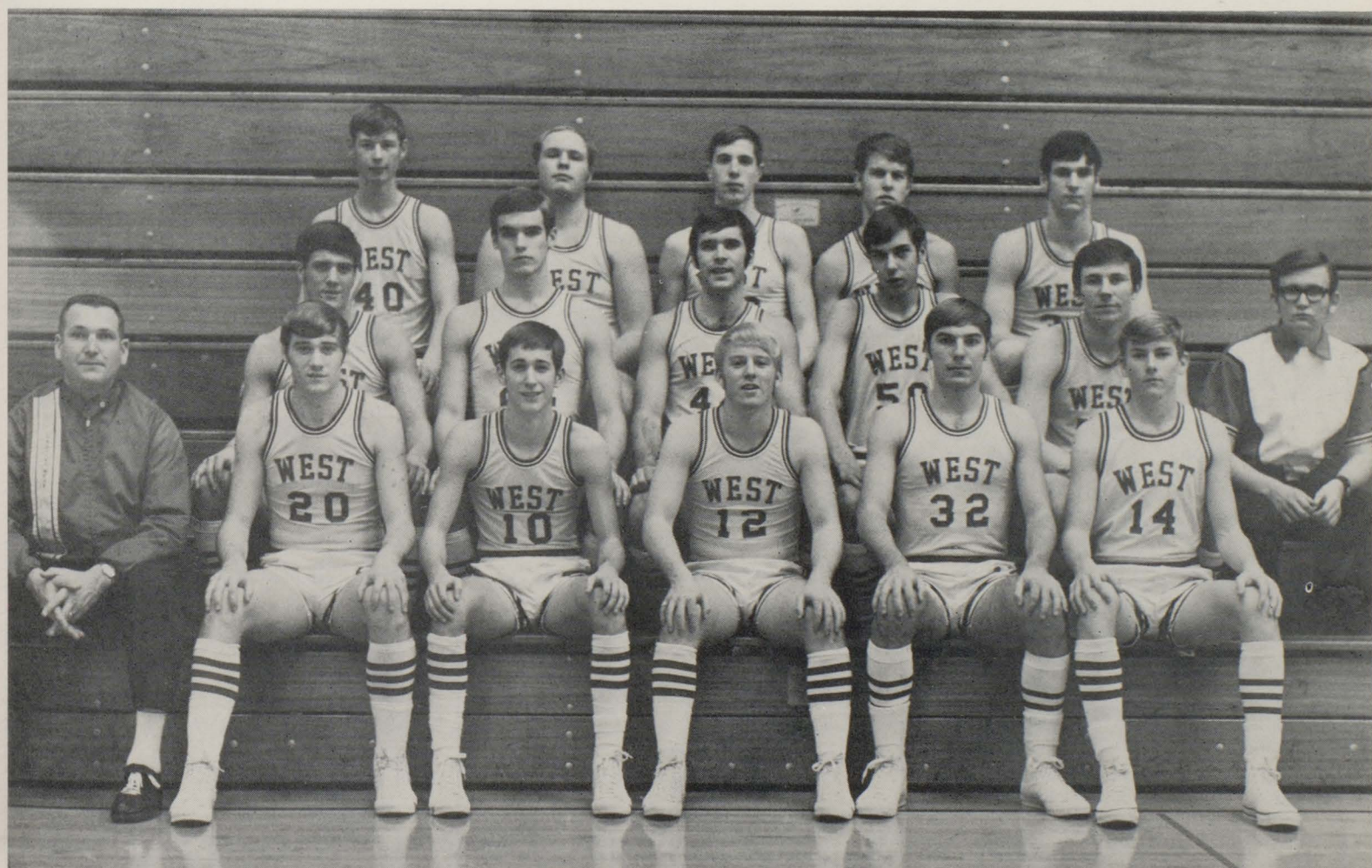

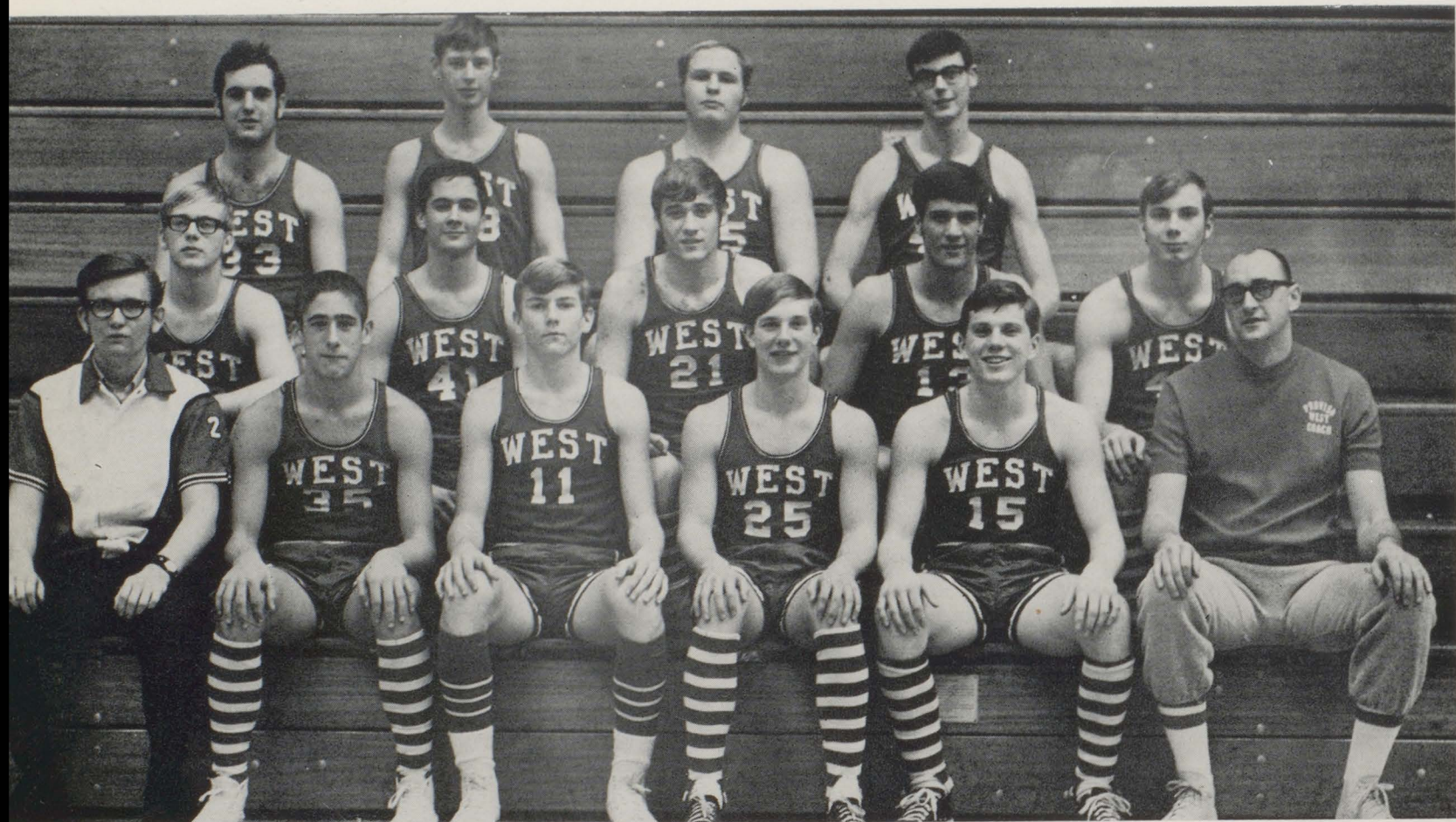

and showed much competitive spirit. When put together in the next couple of years, the ability of the Freshman ball team should provide Proviso West with their first conference basketball championship."

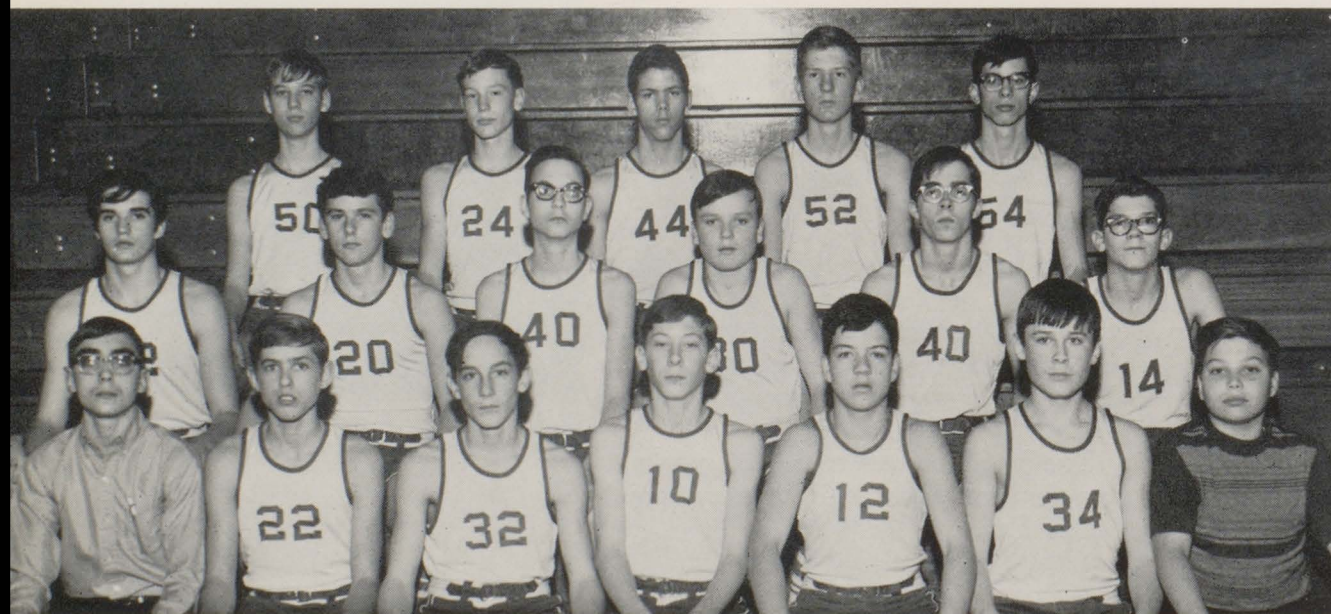

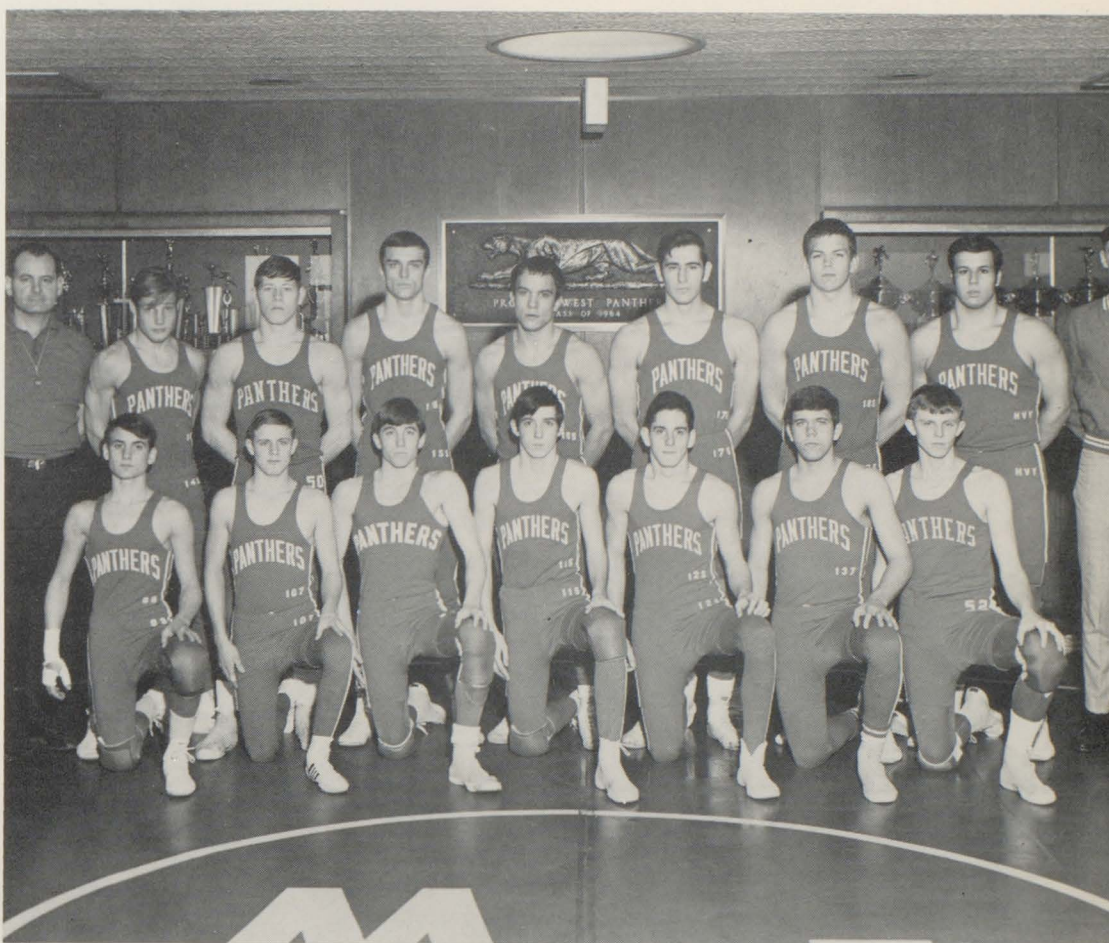

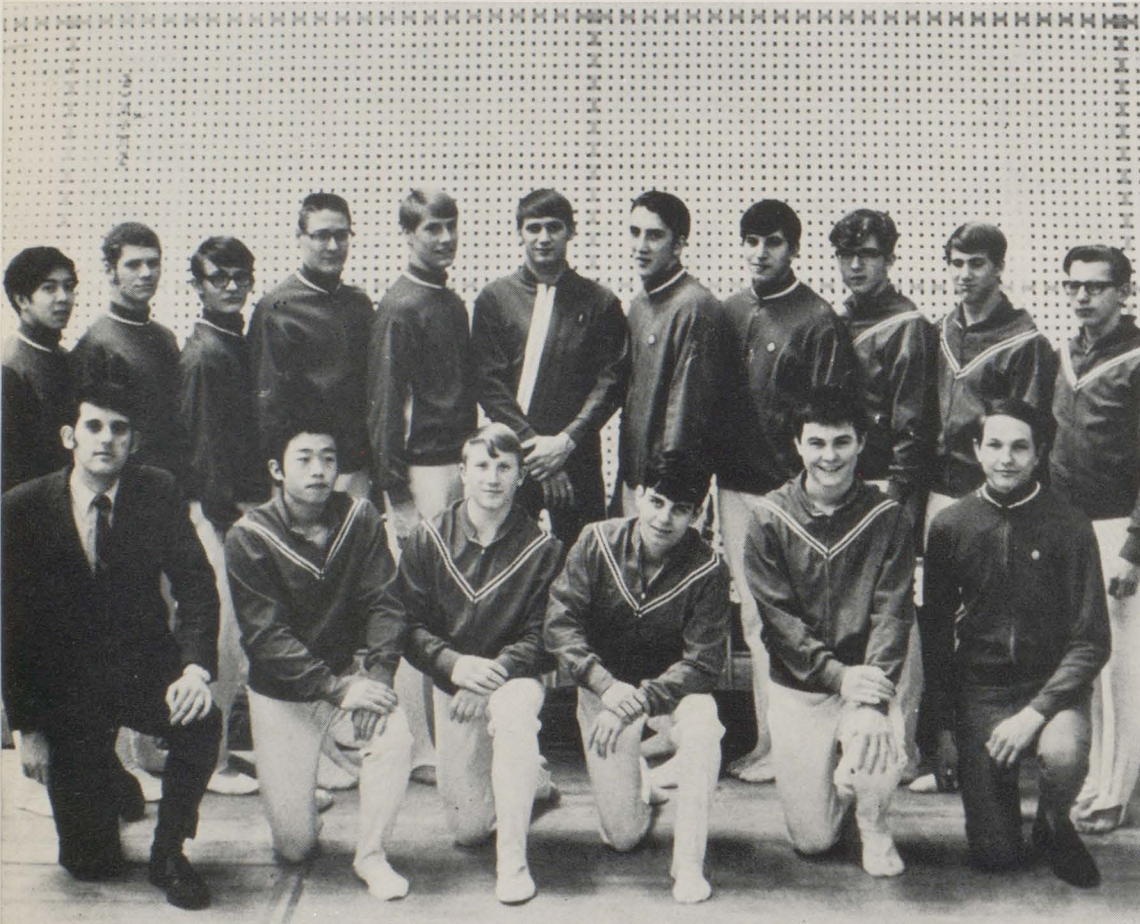

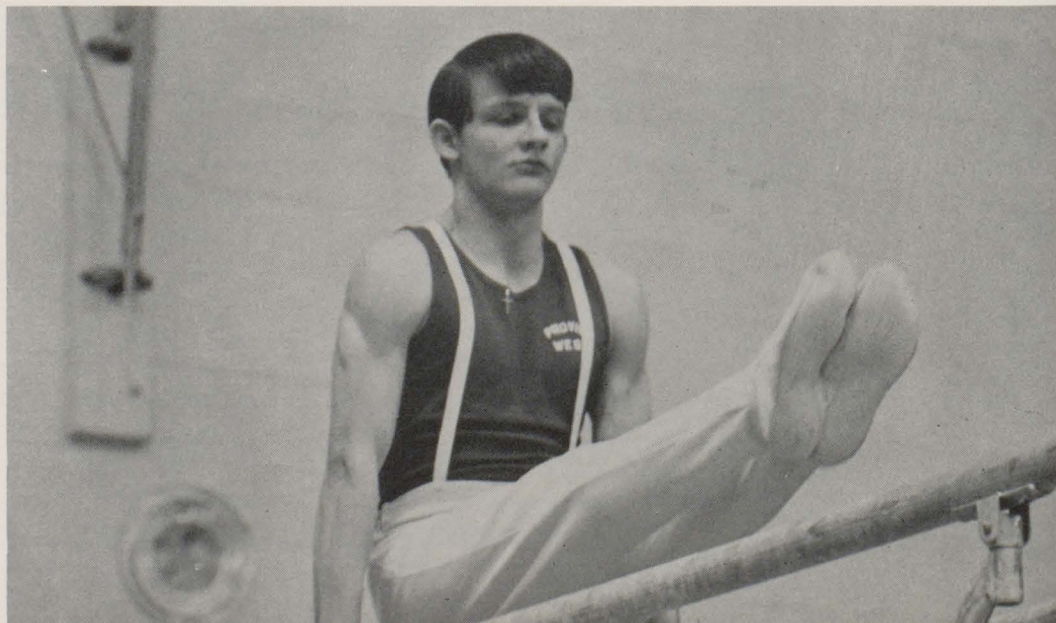


Showing sureness at the end of his routine, Jim Ogisaka hopes the judges share his certainty.

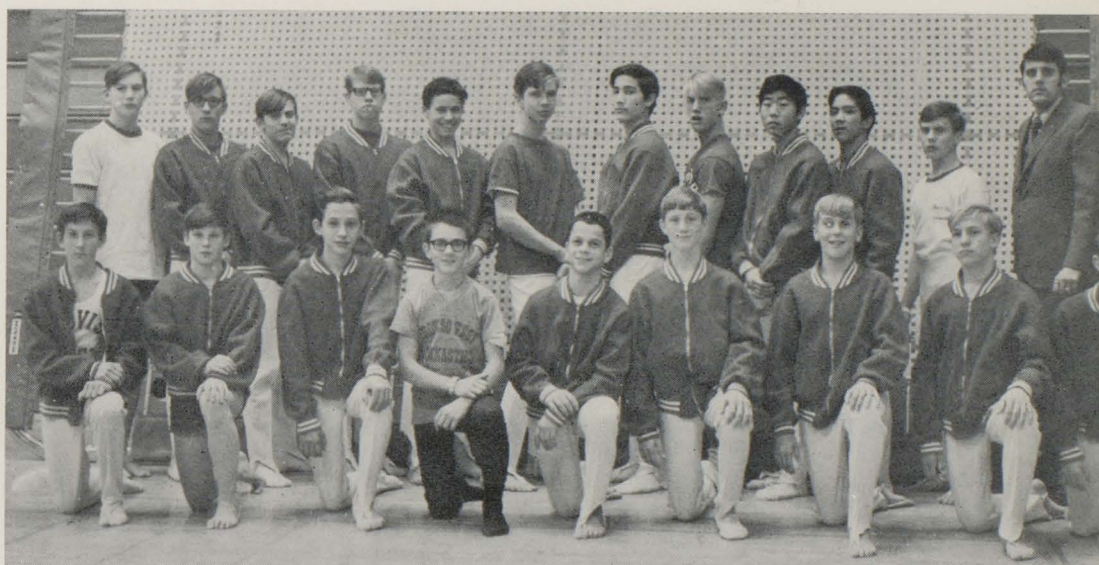

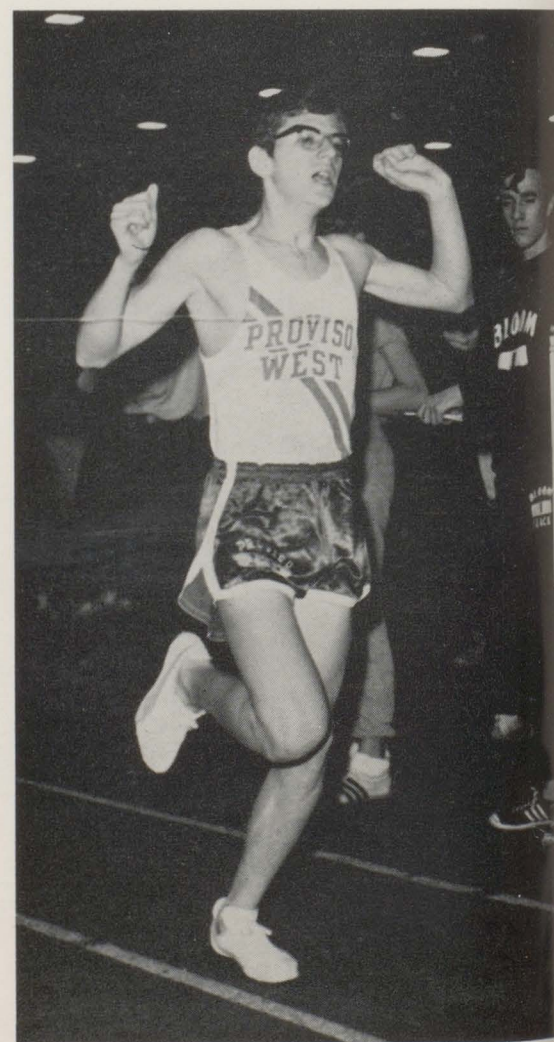
## Place Third at Oak Park; 4:30 Mile and 12 Foot Vault Highlight Soph Season

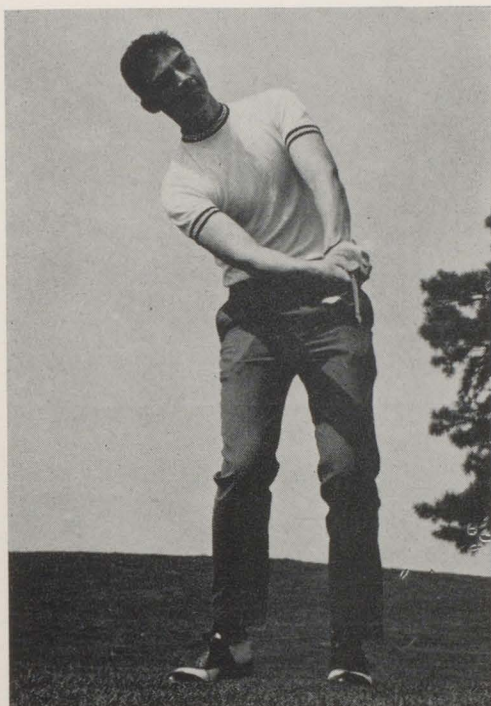

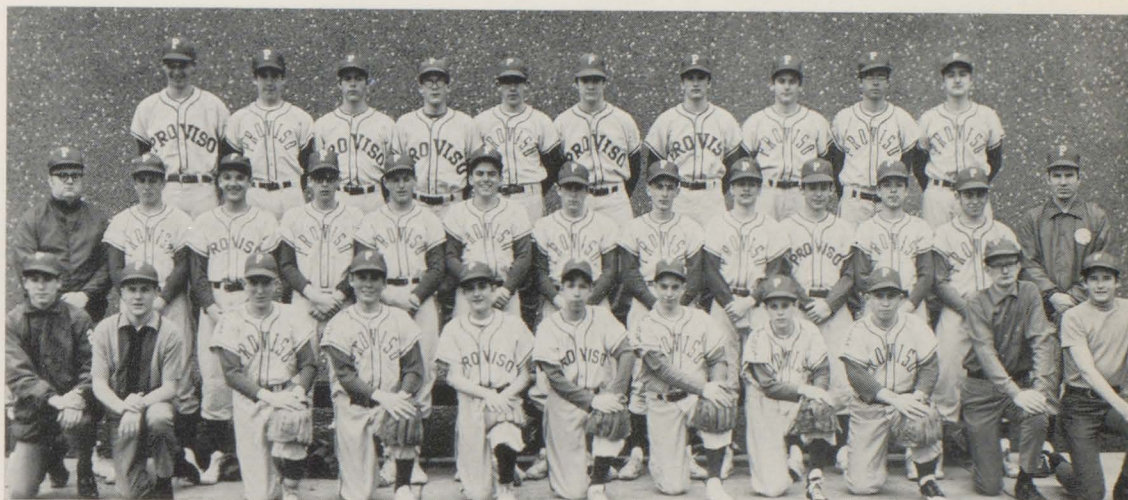

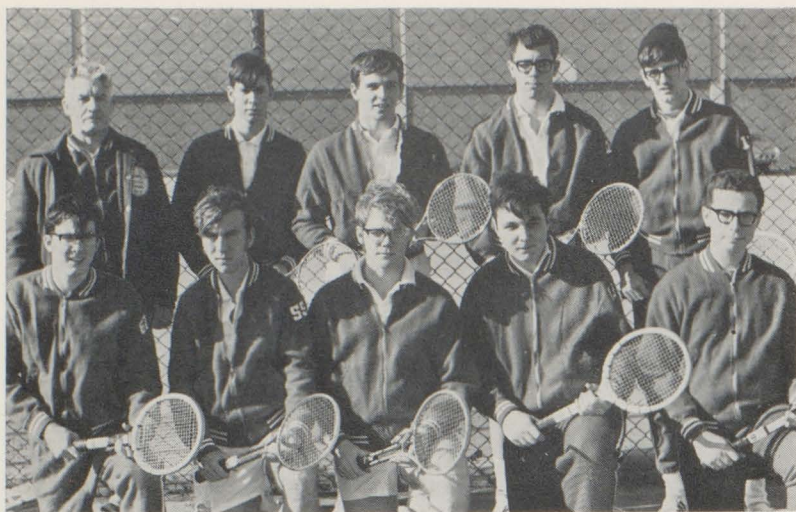
## Dismal Season Hurts West's Sophs; Frosh "A" Come Through With WSC Crown

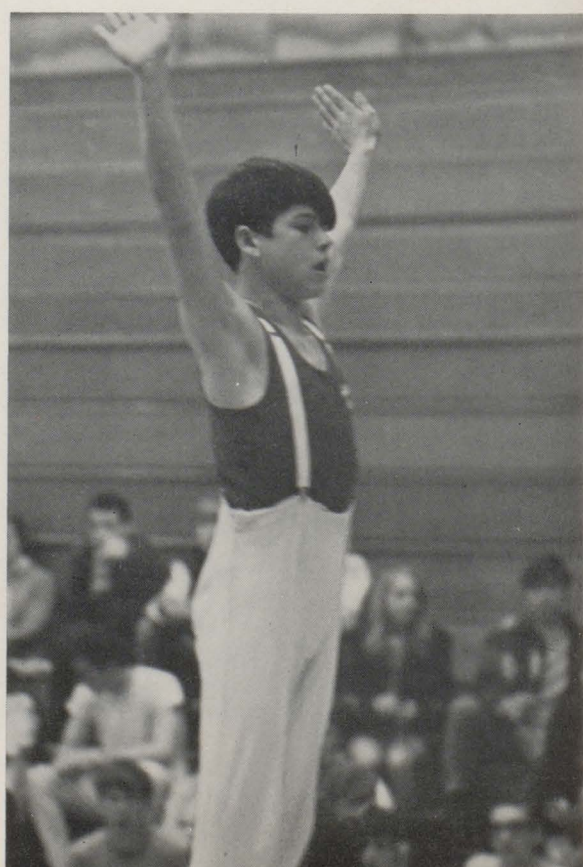
