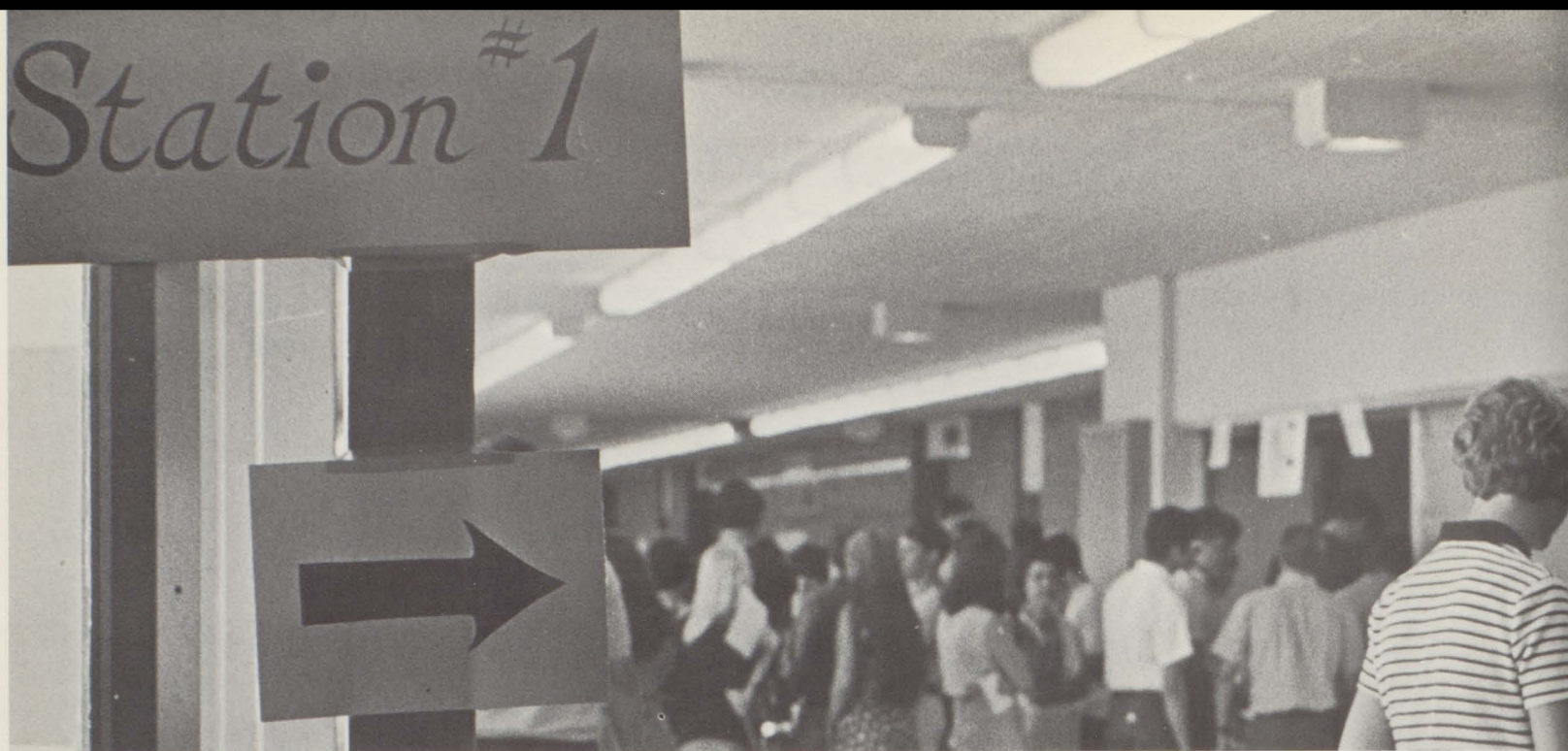
The tall boy at the front table

It was a different game.

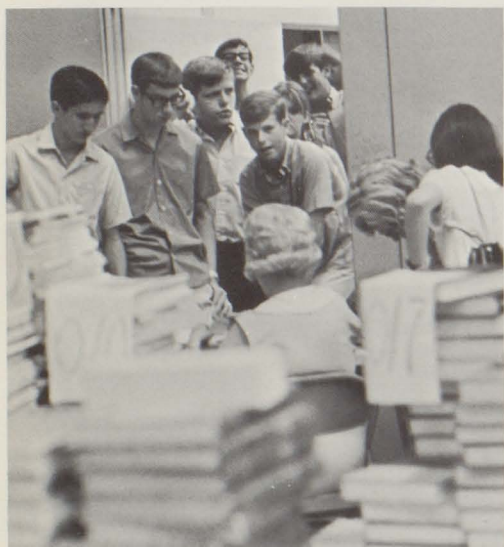

I was acting stupid, but I think that I did a good job . . .

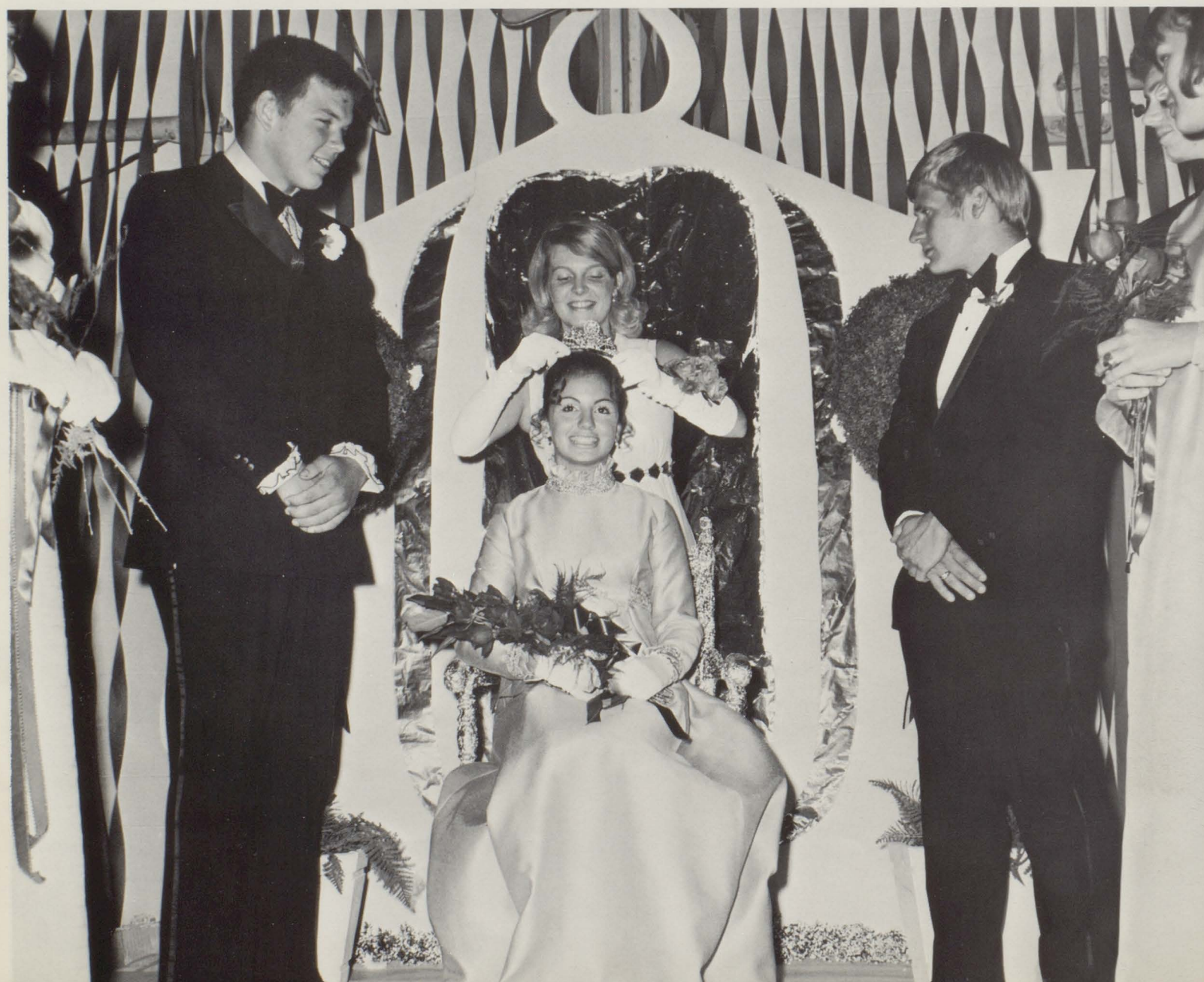
Everybody looked terrific! So many different styles!!

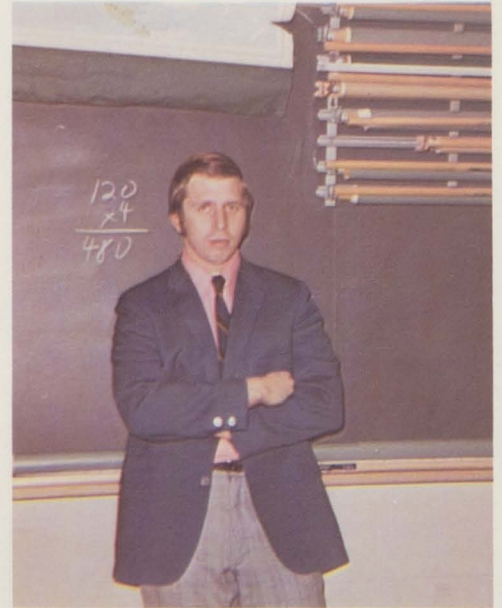


NCA Evaluations Help Alleviate That Forlorn Fall Feeling

But already kids and teachers are talking about Christmas vacation . . .

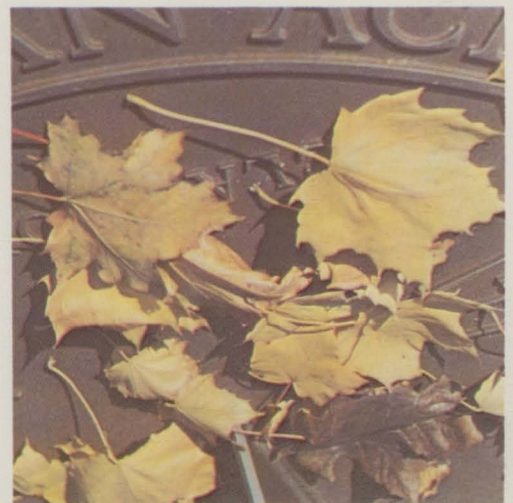

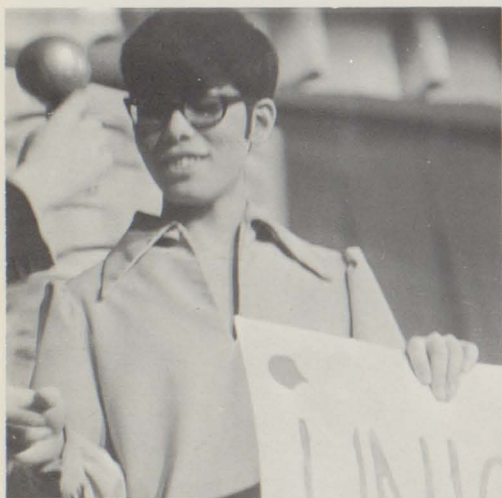

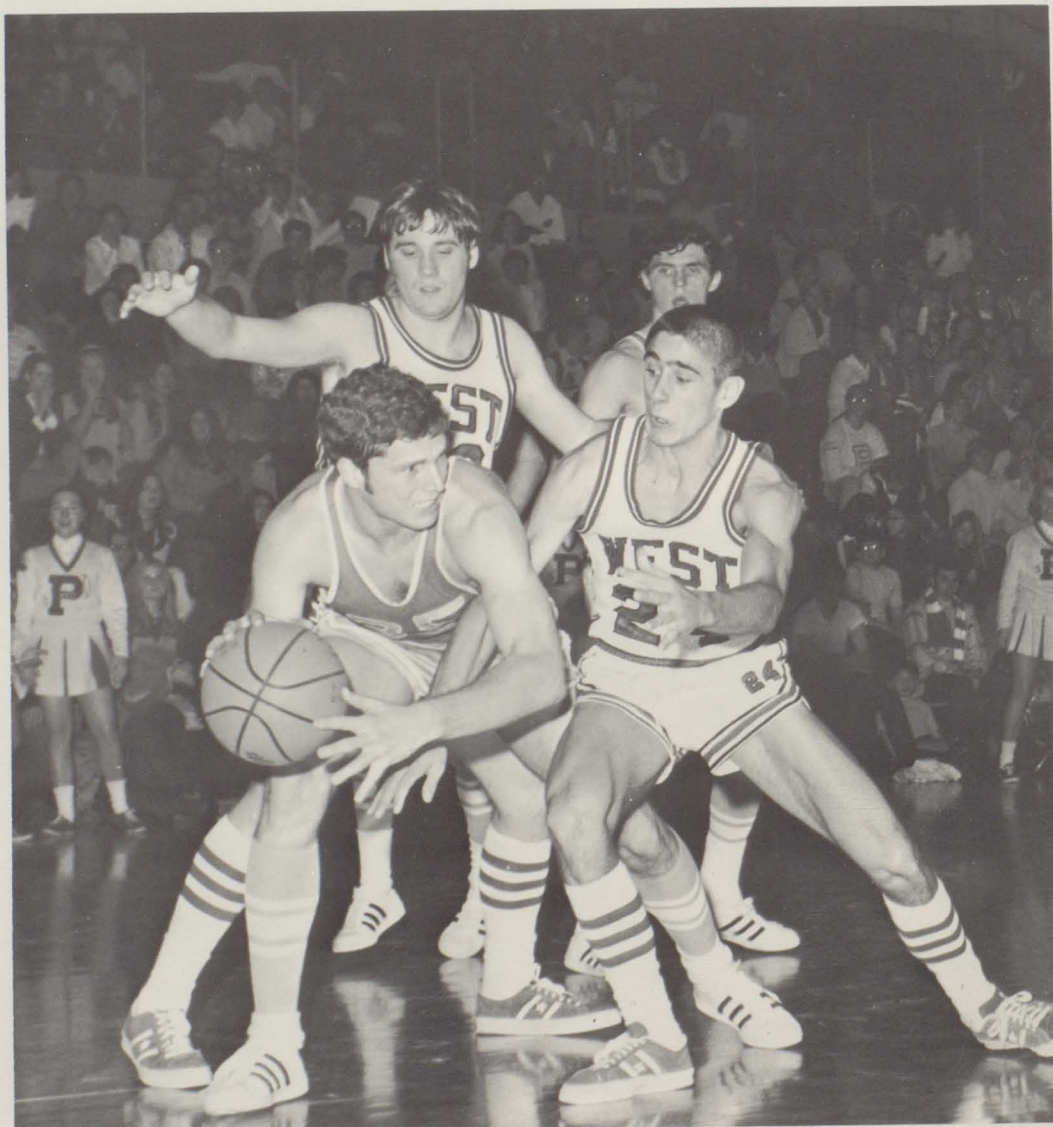

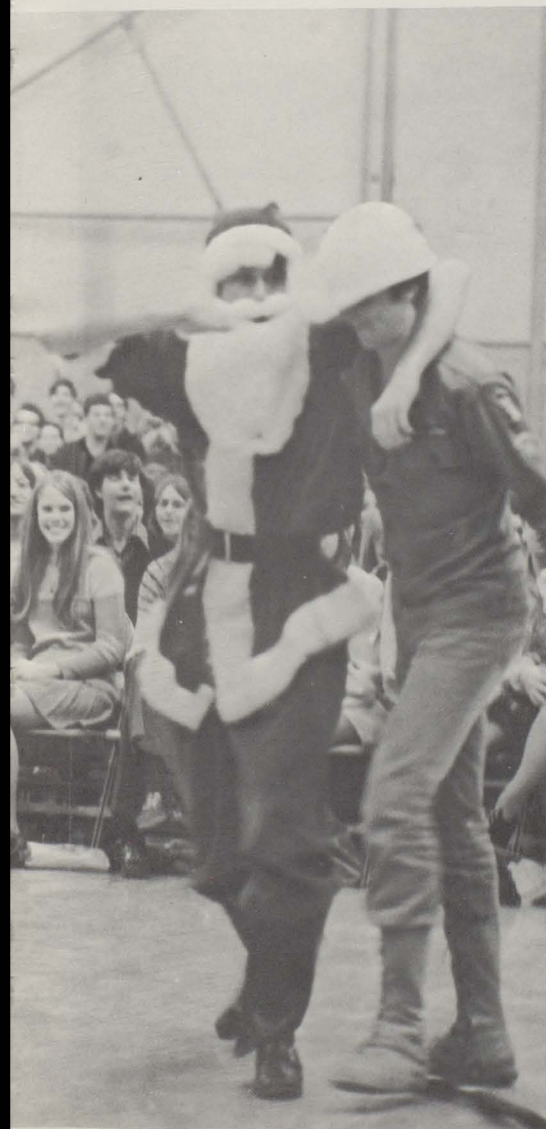

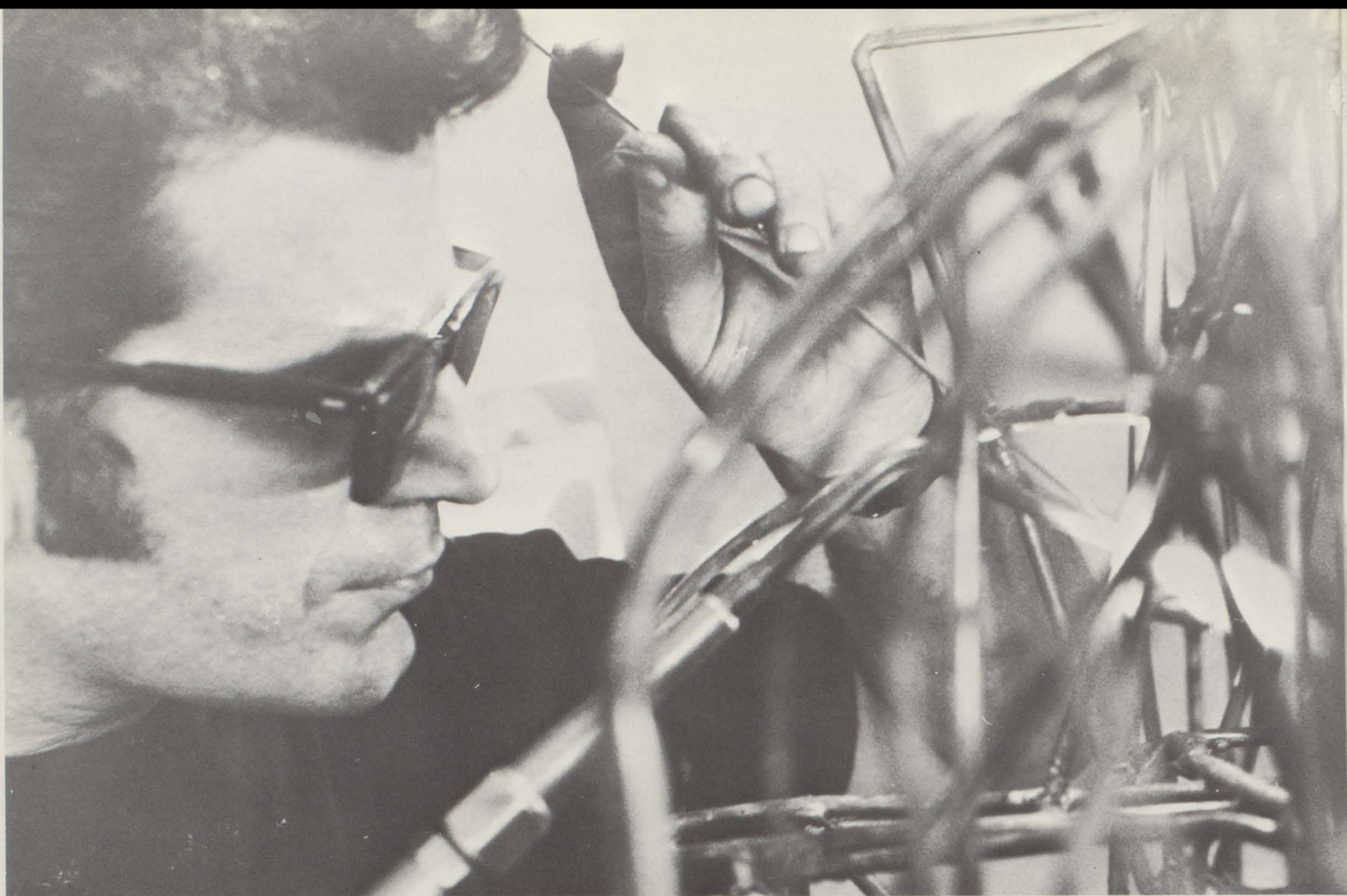
Variety Show and Christmas Assembly Help Brighten Dark December Days

Make things disappear!

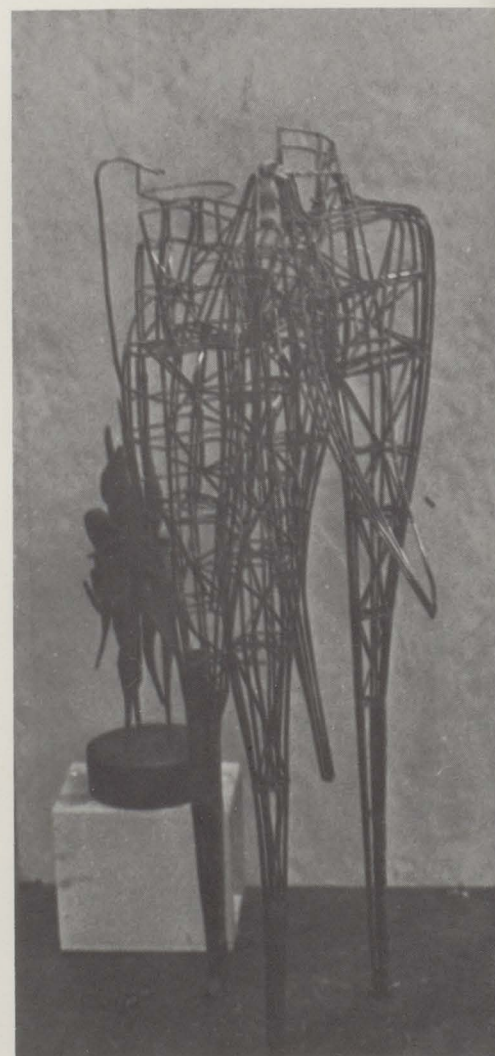
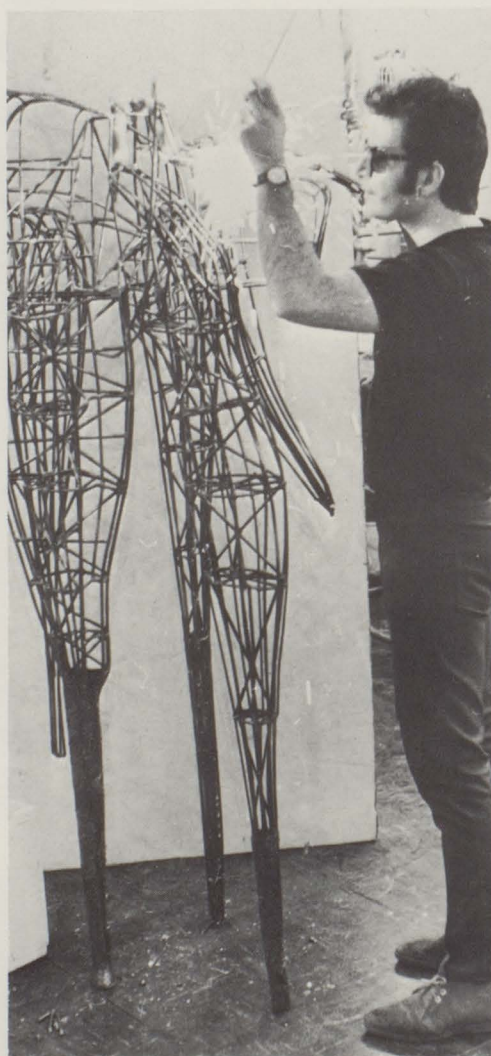
Oh! Then there's the Christmas

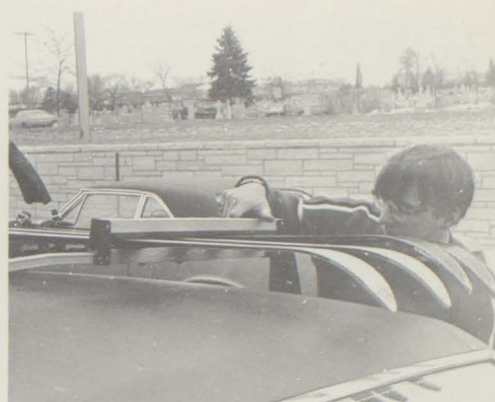
Second Semester Classes Rank Number Two Behind Extra-Curricular Activities

I have to get going now. I'm going to get my Easter outfit after school. I wonder if I can talk my mother into buying me hot pants . . .

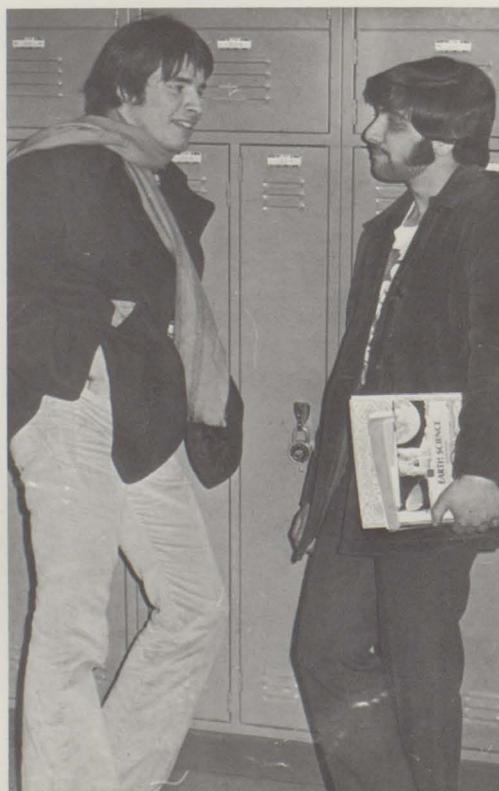

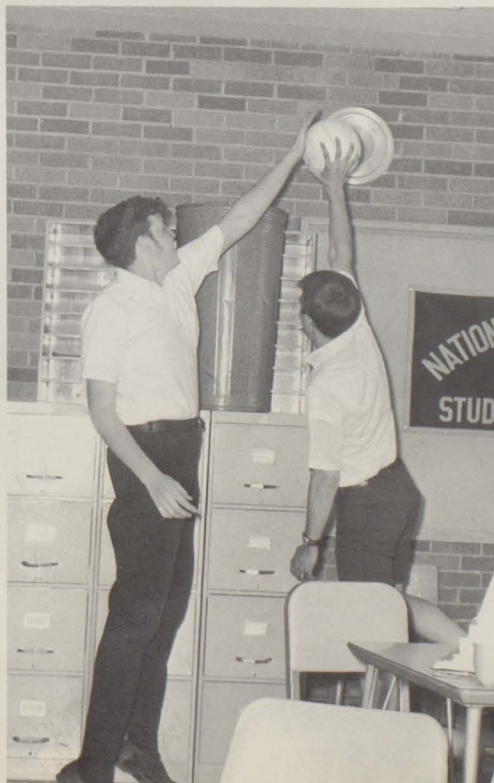

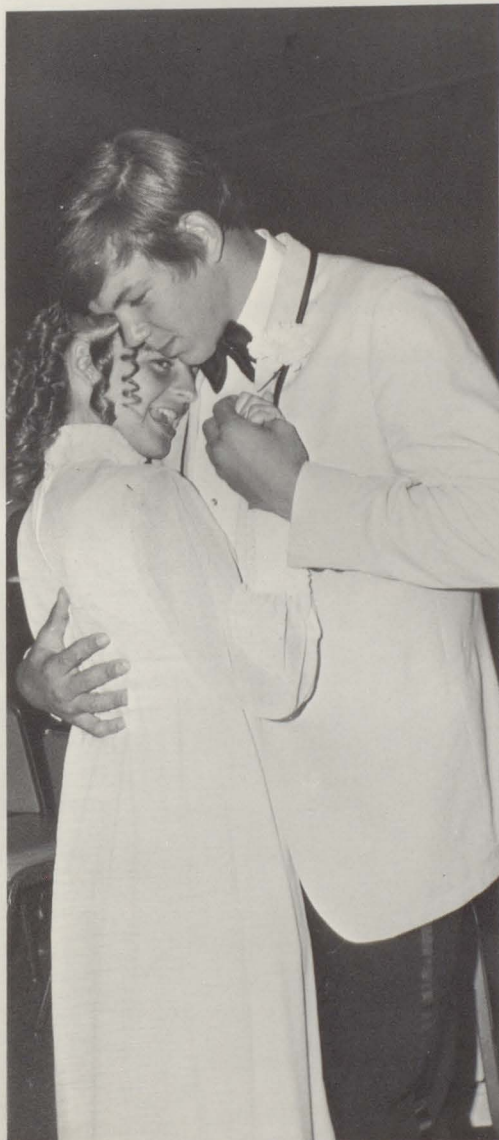
Seniors Learn Final Lesson at Prom '71 — They've Only Just Begun

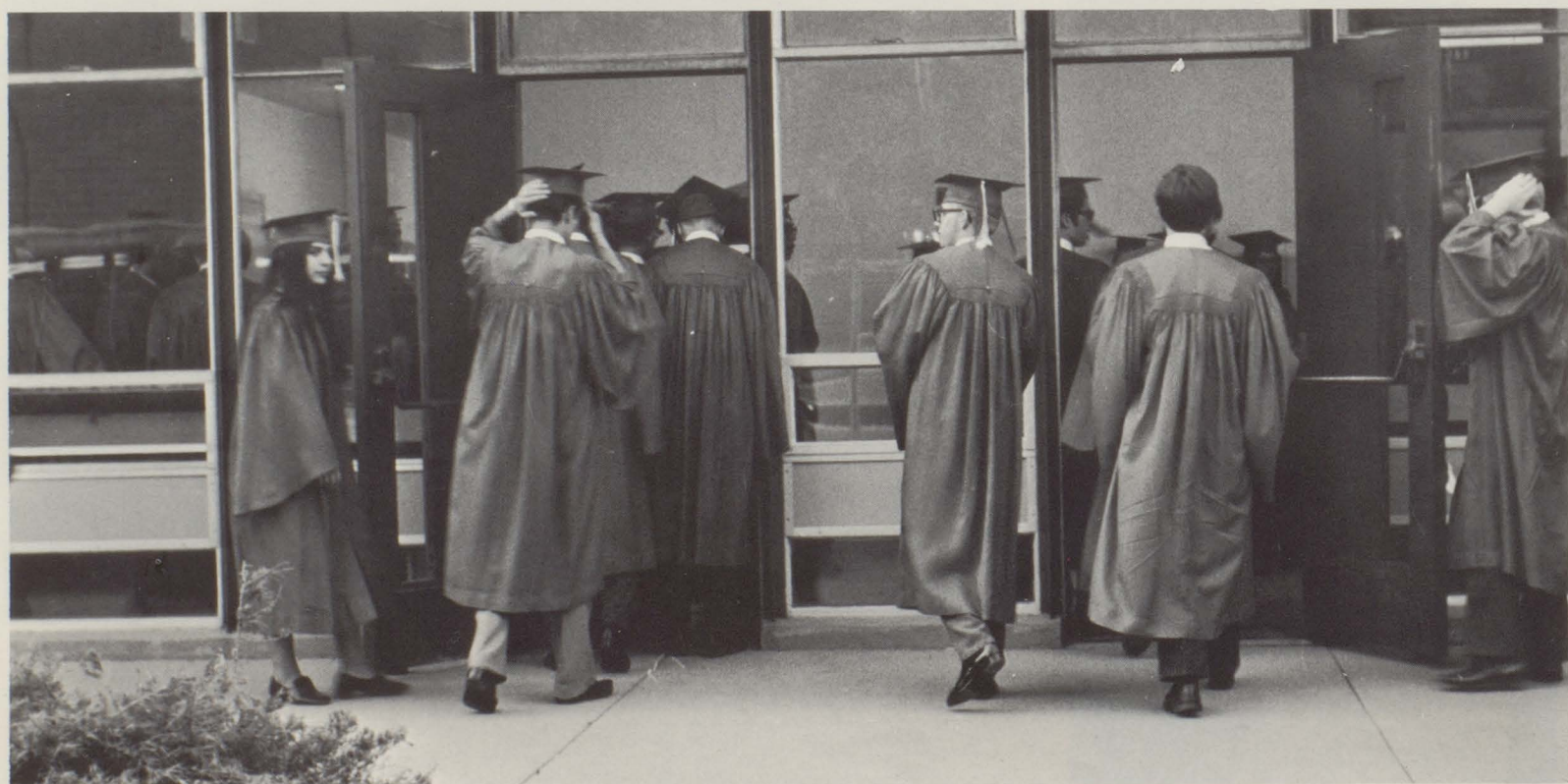

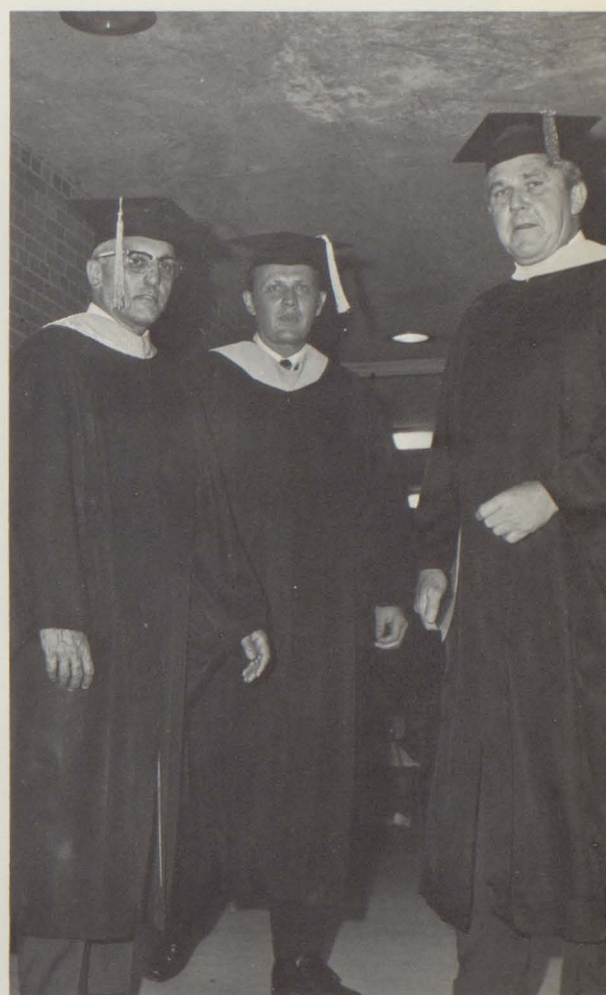

Visiting North Central Evaluation Committee Favorably Impressed by West

West's Board of Education, faced with the multitude of problems which the administration of two very large high schools involves, had the opportunity this year to have their policies and over-all effort reviewed by an objective group — the North Central Evaluation Committee. The resulting evaluation, received in November, was highly favorable. The committee mentioned in particular the mutual respect

among the various elements of the school and its good scholastic record.

Among the comments and recommendations were ideas which the board had itself been aware of. The committee suggested that the school is too large and mentioned the advisability of a third high school for the district. It also noted the need for an auditorium and more class rooms, laboratories and expanded music facilities.

Overseeing Both East and West, District 209 Administrators Have Their Hands Full

Though their offices are mainly at East, the problems which face the administrative staff for District 209 originate in both schools, since both are under their jurisdiction.

New to the staff this year was Mr. Richard Wede, who for three years previously served as West's Dean of Students. As Administrative Assistant to the Superintendent he acted as a liason between the community and schools.

The budgeting and spending of many hundreds of thousands of dollars was the responsibility of Mr. Jack Stanley Business Manager. He was also in charge of the maintenance of equipment already purchased, and the preparation of all financial reports.

Curriculum, the student-teacher program and faculty in-service courses were Mrs. Virginia Taylor's field of interest. Mr. Richard Daniels recruited and hired both certificated and clerical

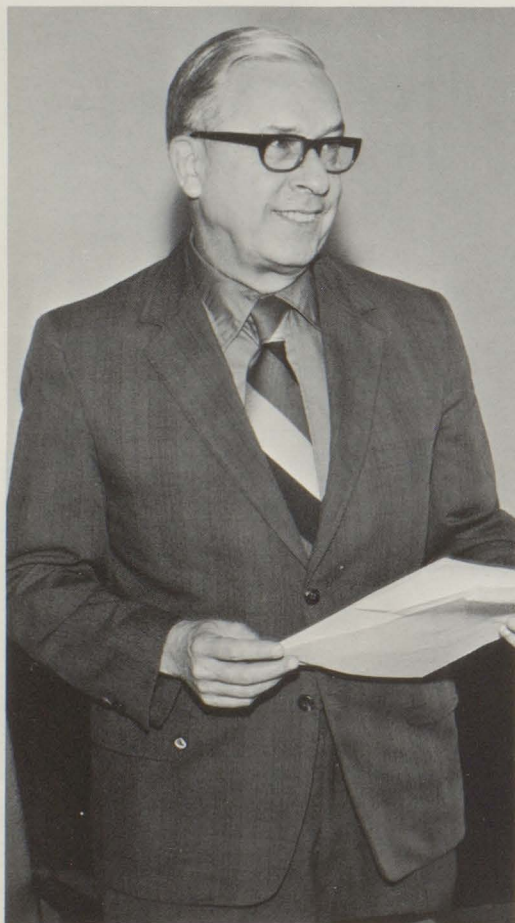
staff for both schools. With the assistance of Mrs. Gertrude Dahl his office also issued news releases and in other ways kept the Proviso schools before the public.

Director of Continuing Education this year for the first time, Mr. Hubert Pitt has been a part of Proviso schools in many capacities, most recently as principal of Proviso East. His new duties include the synchronization of junior college, adult education and evening school programs with the regular school and summer school.

District 209's increased use of computers this year required a full-time Director of Management Information, Mr. Howard Schumacher while Mr. Claude Vandevender continued in his capacity as Director of Research and Testing.

Administrators Face Complex Schedules

The four men who head West's administrative staff have duties so varied that few students or faculty members are ever completely aware of their scope. Instead the school takes the smooth functioning of its many activities for granted, concerned only if a snag occurs.

Mr. Richard Gusloff's duties as head of the Counseling Department are only a fraction of his responsibilities. In addition he supervises student organizations, the conduct of all school functions, issues the daily bulletin and serves as liaison between the PTA and the school. Student teachers and their problems are his concern also as are all para-professional employees and Early Bird teachers.

Mr. Robert Milano's chief area of operations is "the Main Office" where student scheduling and records, the office and school budget and equipment and supplies are among his responsibilities. Last year and the first part of this year he was particularly busy since the North Central Evaluation came under his direct supervision.

Mr. Donald Maechtle and Mr. Thomas Parker are both new faces in the Deans' office in D-112, though familiar to students in their former capacities in the Physical Education and Music Departments. In addition to student control, Mr. Maechtle is also responsible for school security and safety and the graduation exercises. Mr. Parker assists in discipline but also makes arrangements for field trips and public transportation and supervises fire and disaster drills.

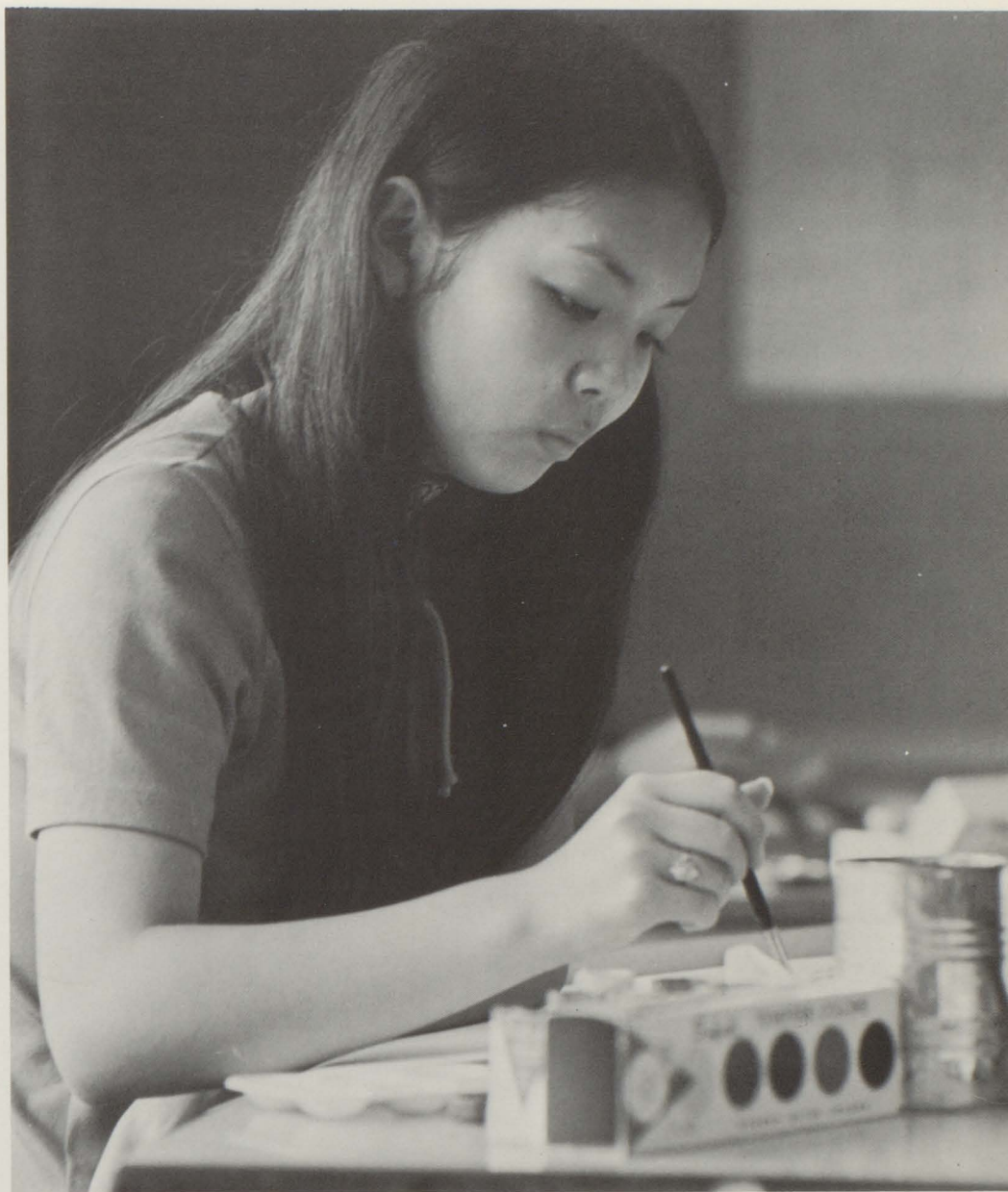
Art Teaches Students to Use Their Heads

Imagine a mass of cold, sticky plaster engulfing your face with only two straws for breathing as your contact with the outside world. Senior Ray Kowalski did not have to imagine what it would feel like — he felt it! Ray literally used his head in making his crafts project. For fifteen claustrophobic minutes he left his face in the plaster to make a mold. Later he used the mold to cast an exact replica of his features. However Ray was not satisfied with merely having a model of his own face. He ripped the clay apart and put the pieces back together in an abstract manner.

Crafts is only one phase of West's art program however. In commercial art, Gary Matusek hurled paint at a spinning posterboard. Not only was the poster colorful, but so was Gary.

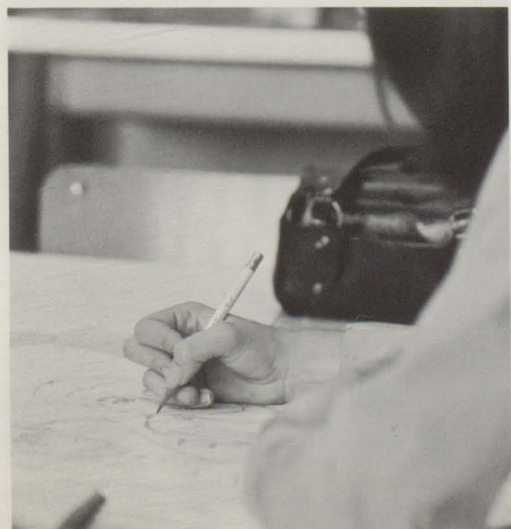
Painting students expressed themselves on a 5' by 3' masonite board. They spontaneously applied paint to create a part of themselves.

General art classes experimented with pop art and collage. They, like the rest of the students enrolled in West's Art program, are involved in an effort to keep abreast of new art techniques.

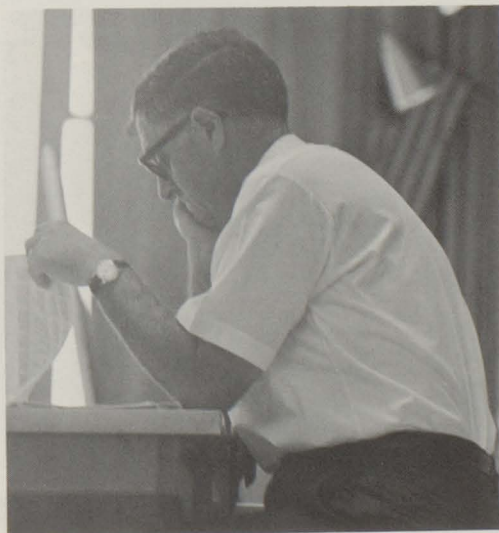


Understanding depth and vibrations of color is not a problem for Art I student Gayle Tanaka.

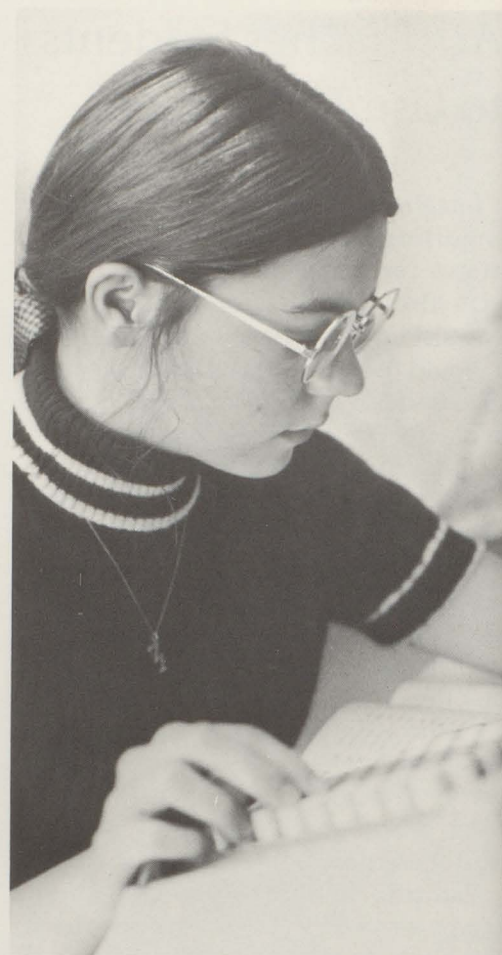
Business Education Pays off for Students In Money in the Pocket as Well as Skills

Typing classes as always were crowded. The consumer education course introduced last year was well-attended. Shorthand and office practice are still staples of West's business curriculum, but the line between school and the working world is becoming steadily less clearly drawn for many students. Once enrolled in the Distributive Education program a student may work at a selling job part of each day and spend the rest in class. Preparation for that job in the future thus becomes actual training for work in progress.

New to West this year is another work-study program which allows its

members who are taking secretarial training to work part time also filing, typing, even taking live dictation or working with transcription machines in area offices. Both groups of students earn the going wage for part-time workers.

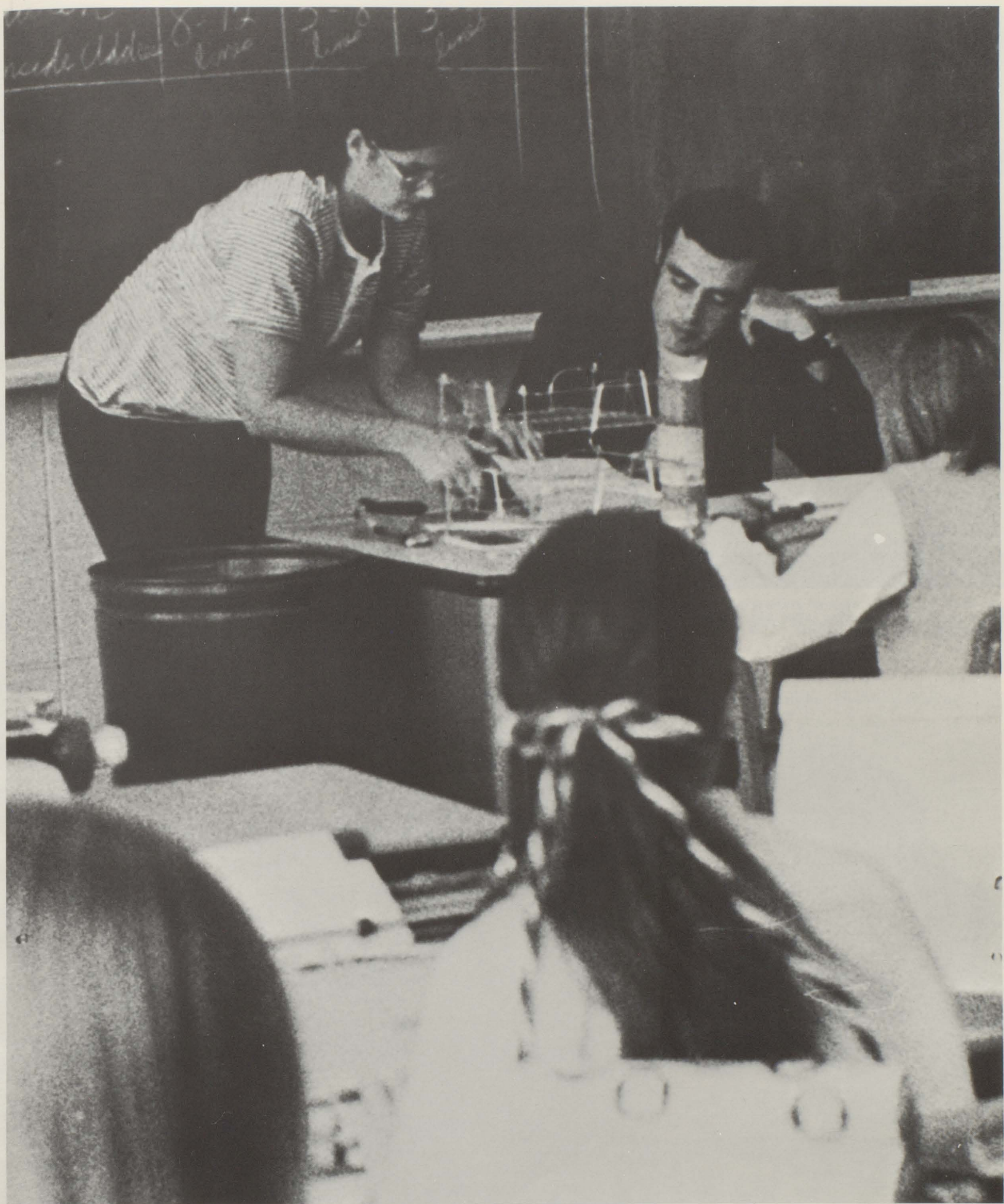

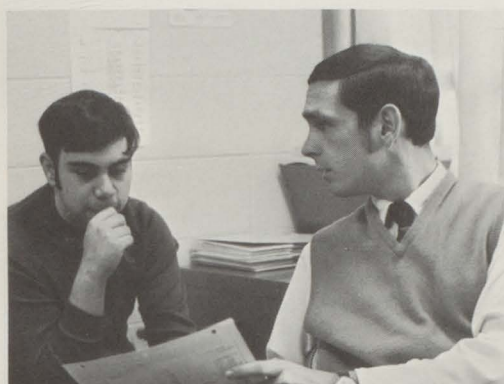

Formal Hours of Counselling Decline in '71 But Counselors Still Provide a Human Touch

Freshmen, sophomores, and juniors had a half-hour, while seniors had an optional half-hour of counselling this year. Freshmen were previously given an hour, since they were new at West and supposedly needed the most help. All necessary assistance was crammed into the short time allotted. Seniors were expected to ask for help when they needed it to decide on post-graduation plans.

In addition to helping students with general problems like schedules, transfers, and broken zippers, counselors guided them toward a curriculum which was best suited to the individual student. Most girls also found that their counselors provided a good shoulder

to cry on. Boys seldom had this special relationship with their counselors however. In addition to being a freshman girl's counselor, Miss Hamilton was the special counselor in charge of scholarships and awards. She worked together with the senior counselors to inform the students of possible monetary and honorary awards. Mr. Gusloff supervised the entire counselling system, while Mr. Webb, Vocational Counselor, supervised jobs for the Diversified Occupation program.

Though the work of the counselors is not as clear cut and obvious as that of the classroom teachers, it nevertheless is what gives West a touch of humanity.

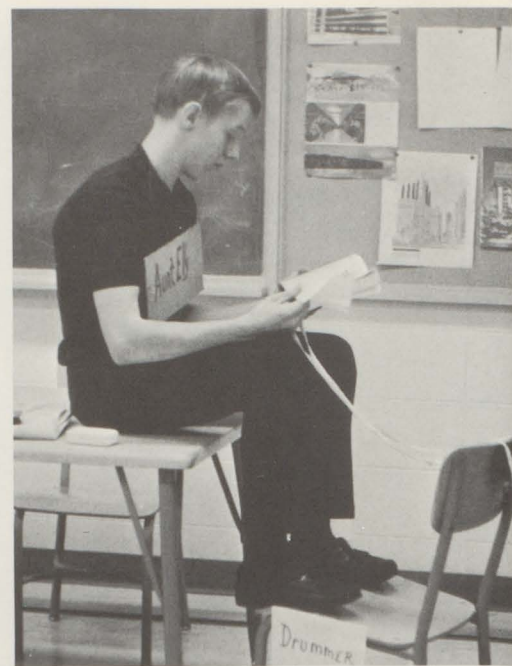

In its second year, the Junior American literature and language course was provided with brand new texts which maintained the current nature of the materials making the course almost as up-to-date as a newspaper.

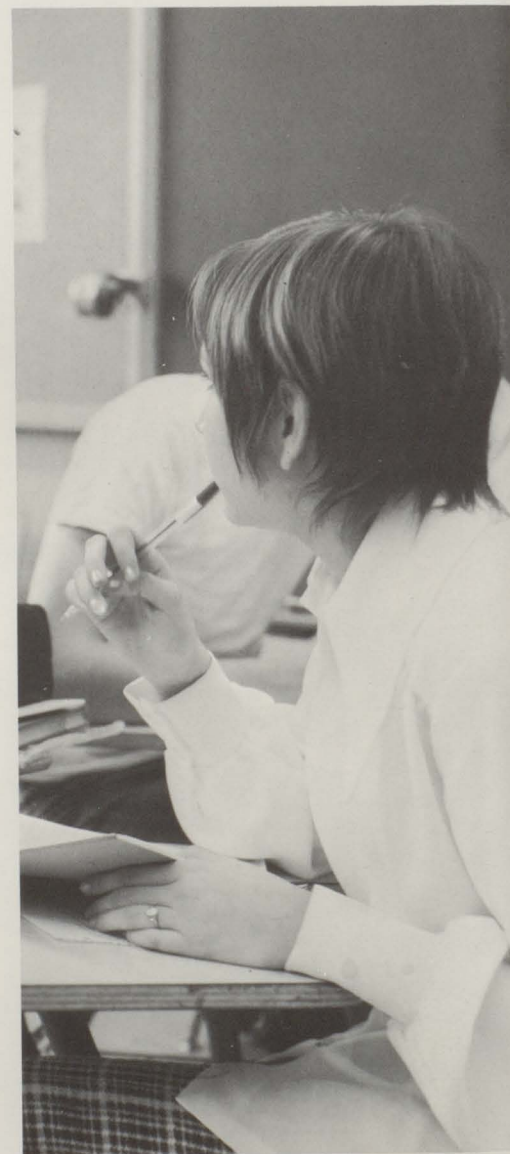

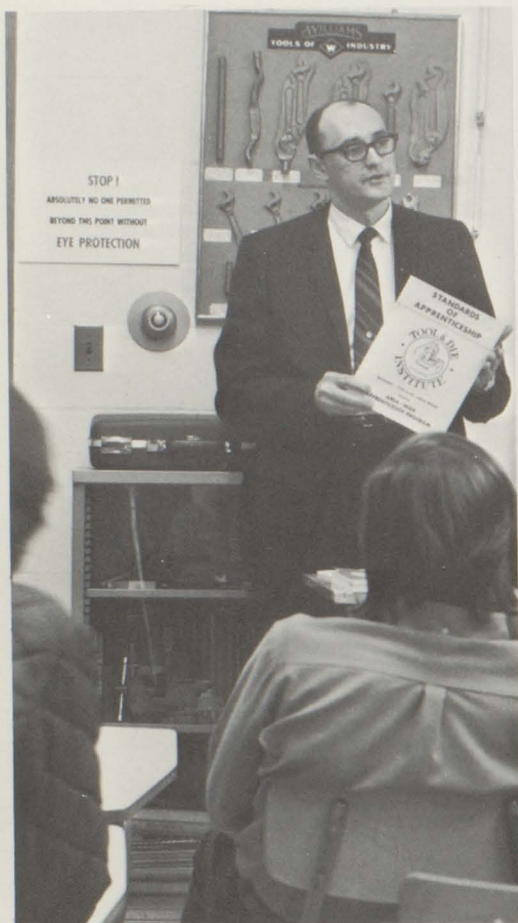

Drafting Classes Draw Prospective Engineers

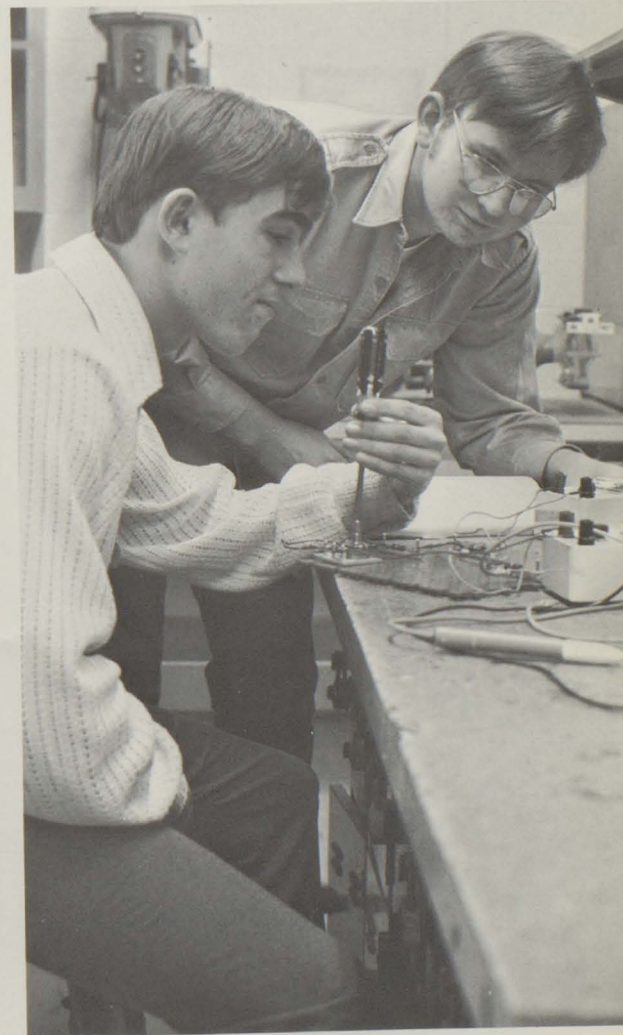
Two years of intensive, practical training, three hours five days a week, give vocational drafting students a working knowledge of both machine drawing and architectural design — a year in each discipline. Architectural design includes not only the design of residential buildings but the development of scale models including landscaping. Machine drawing involves the techniques needed in tool and product design. Students use ink instead of pencil on plastic film.

Europe Is Right There In D-Building

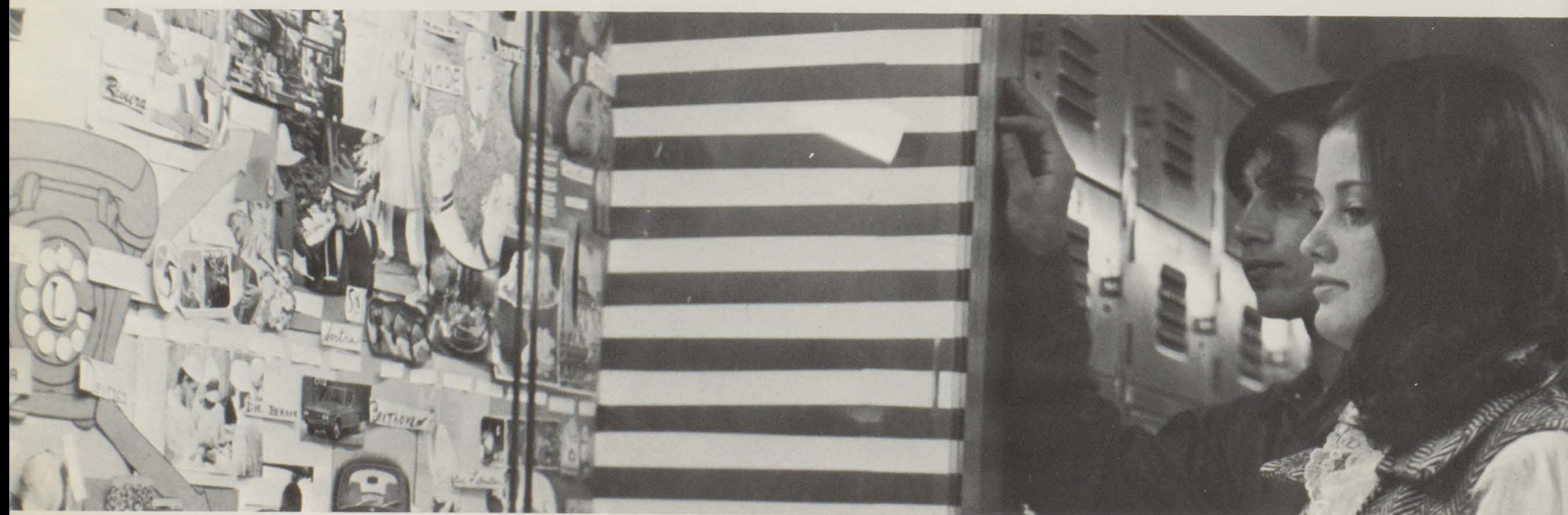

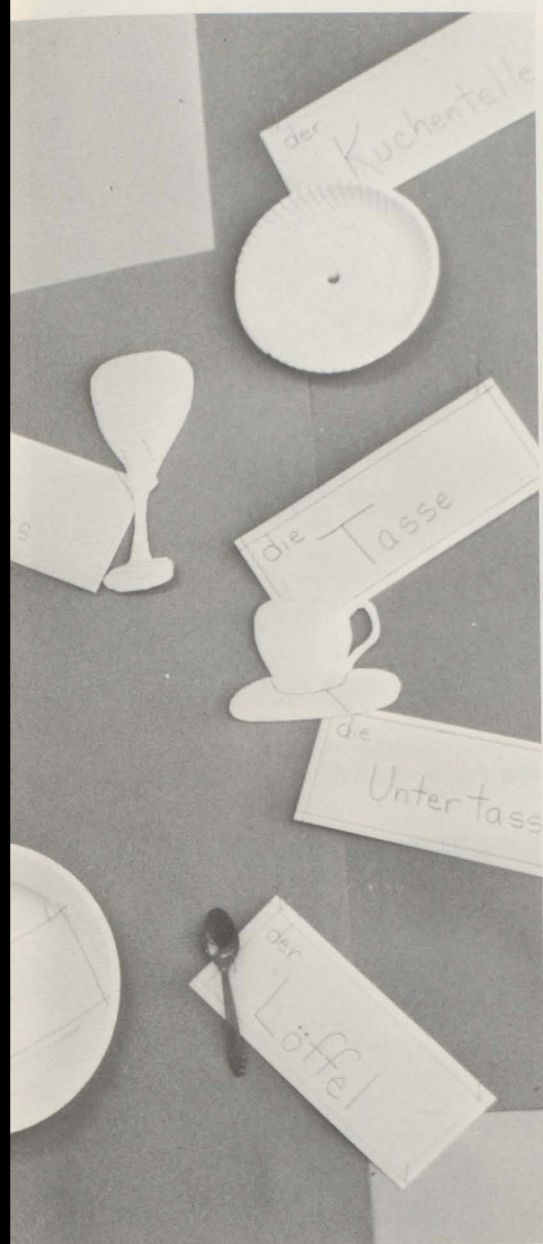
Language teachers are either natives of the country whose language they teach, or have studied abroad and classrooms are alive with colorful maps, flags, ceramics, pinatas and posters.

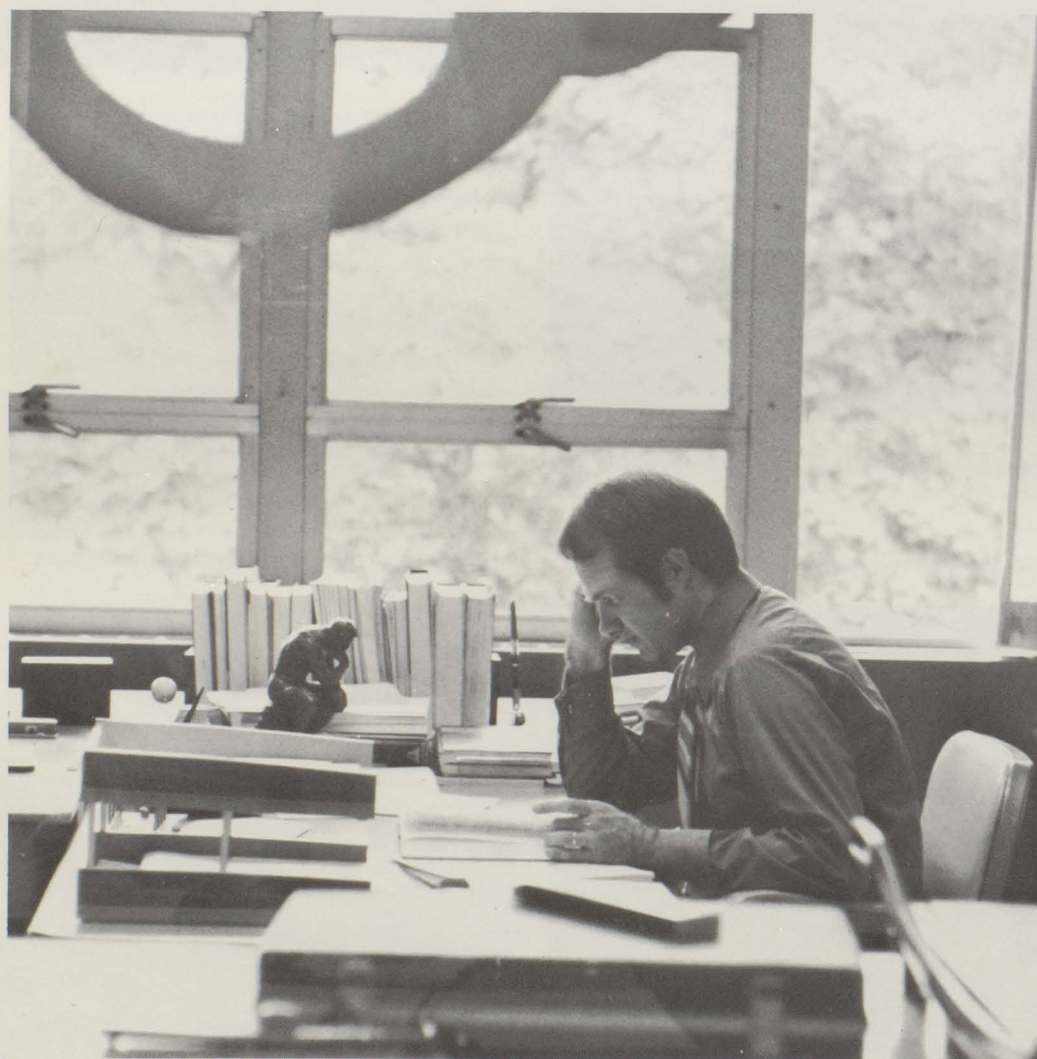
Another innovation was the addition of a semester of analytic geometry to

the Calculus class. This was an experimental class to test the course for a permanent place in the department curriculum.

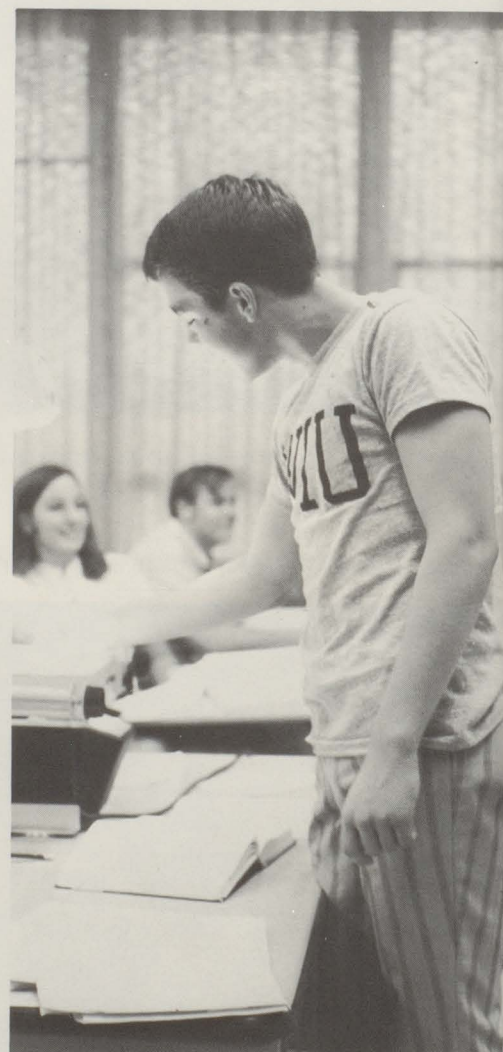

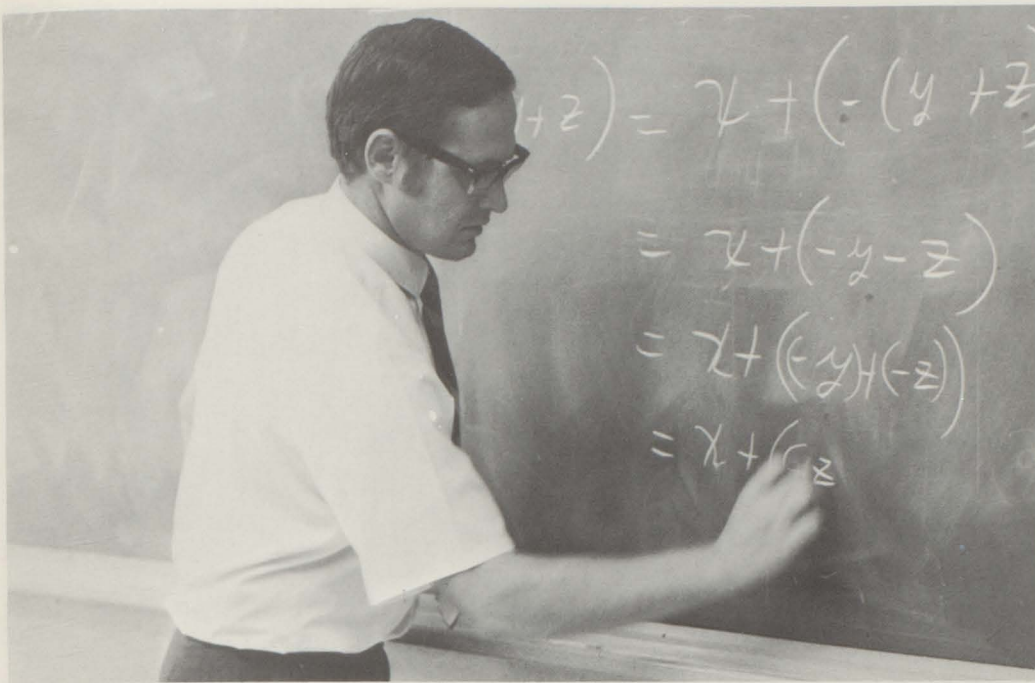

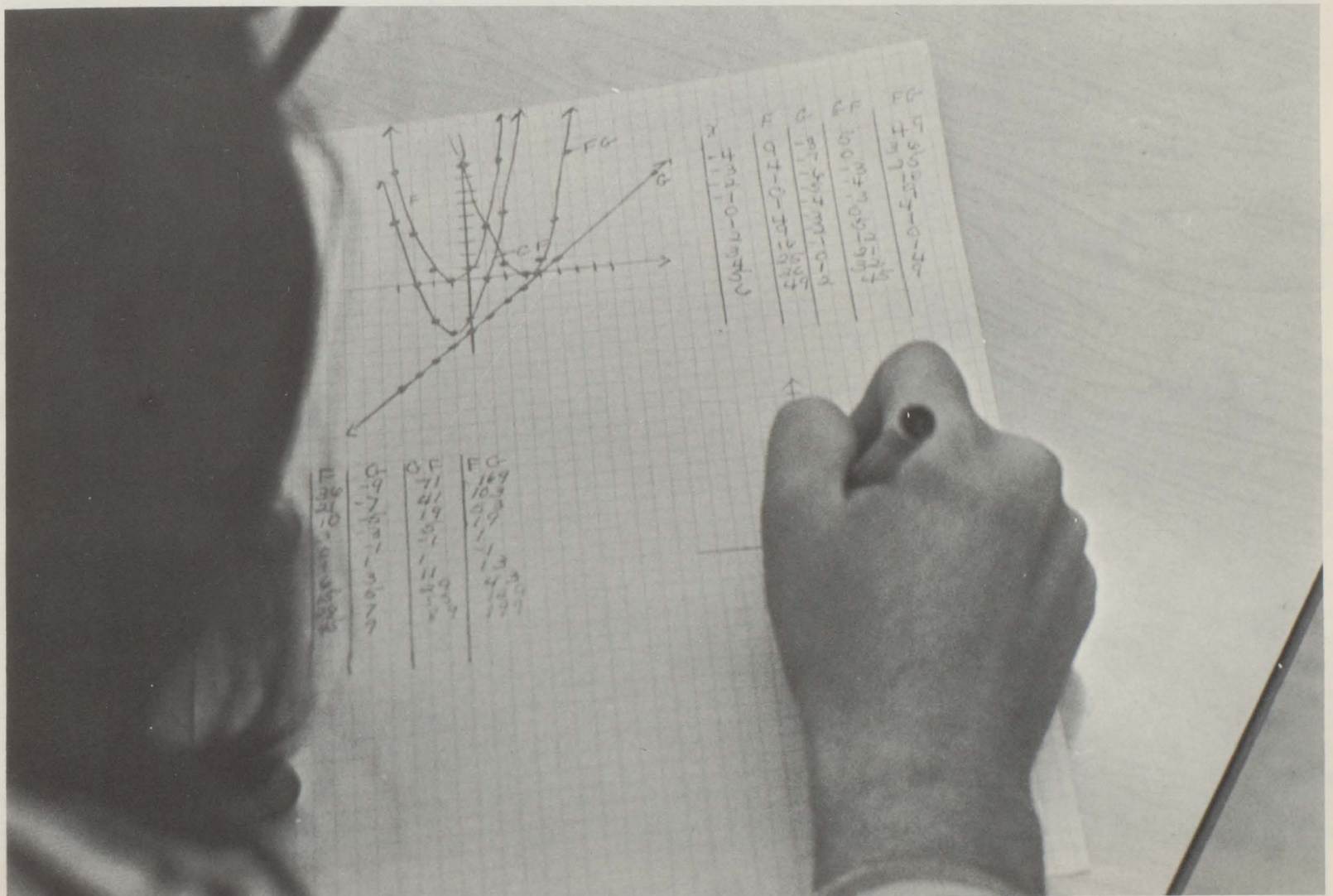

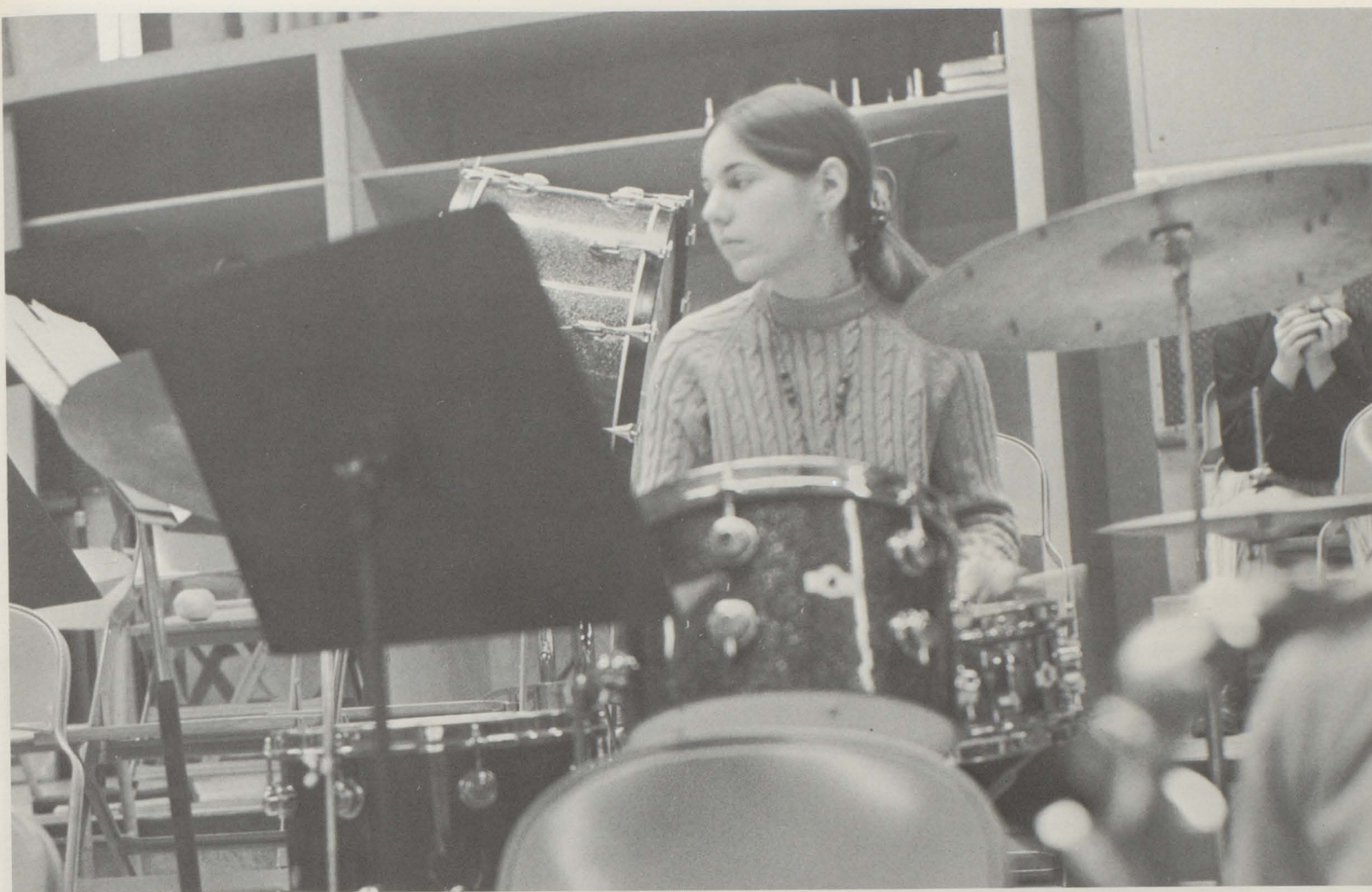

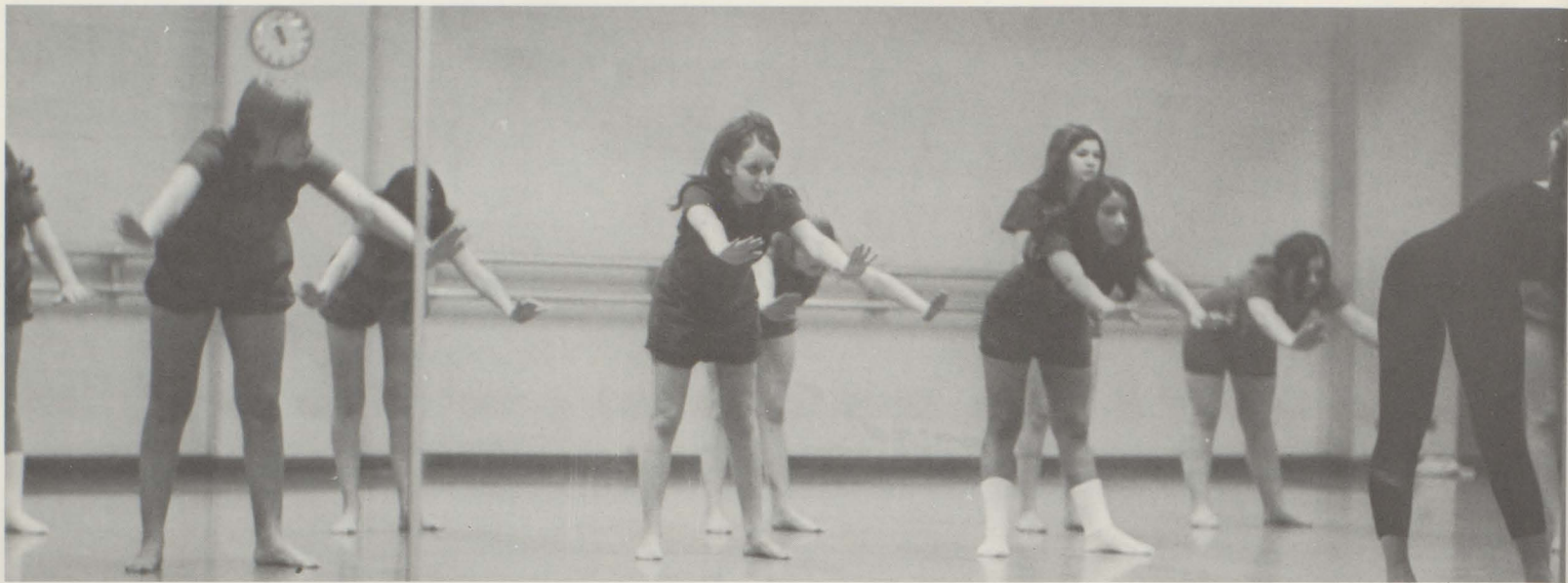

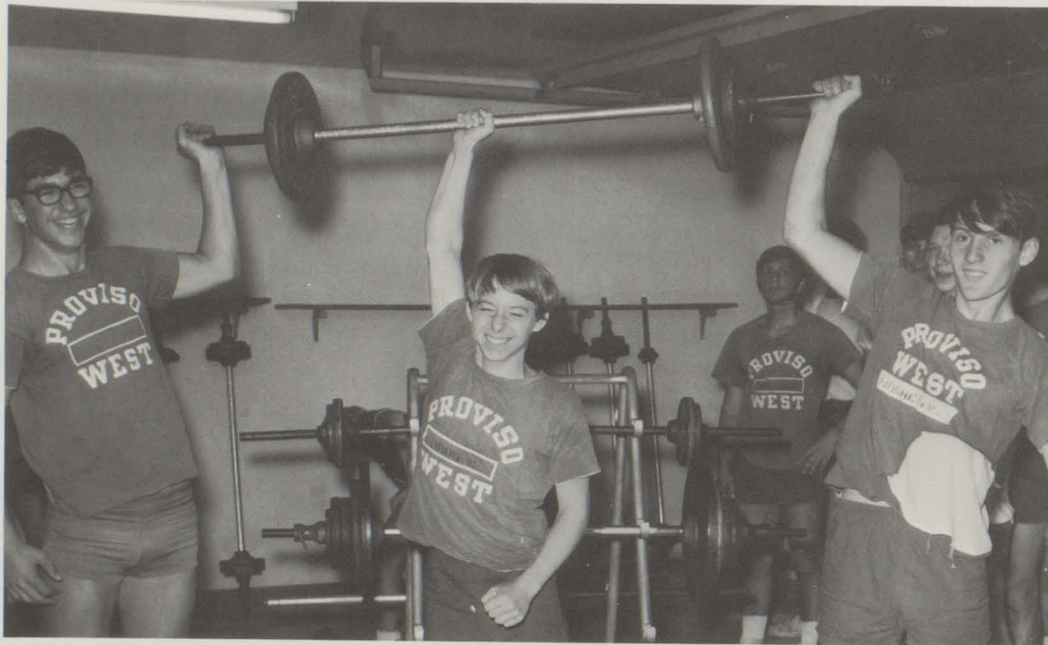
Violinist Penny Burns pauses to study her next concerto before returning to the grind of practice.

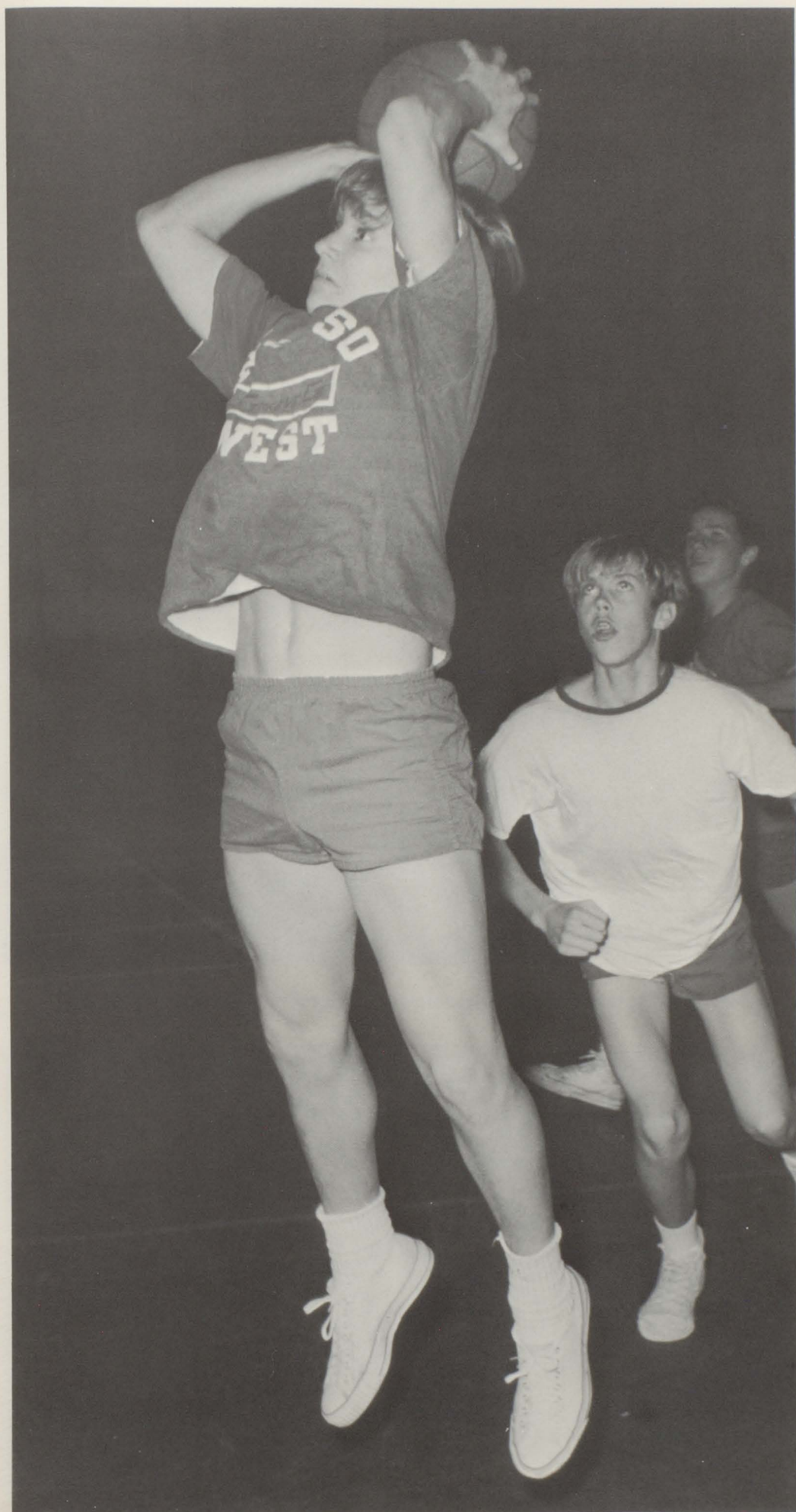

Physical Education Develops Coordination

Dancing, weight-lifting, shooting fouls, working out on the rings or side horse, polishing diving form, enjoying a game of badminton — every day, five days a week every one of West's more than four thousand students spends one class period in the gyms, field house, pool or playing fields. West's physical education department offers a remarkable smorgasbord of activities.

Following a tightly scheduled program which permits both boys and girls to use the many facilities equally, students are introduced to a variety of activities, then are given the opportunity to develop particular skills which may interest them. The fundamentals of bowling, golf, the dance, touch football, swimming, and tennis provide life-long satisfaction. Muscle coordination is built up, along with poise, grace, and accuracy.

Ironically, the students at West are often seen limping from pulled muscles, shivering from dripping wet hair, and protecting their bandaged wounds. Nurses are an active part of West's physical fitness program.

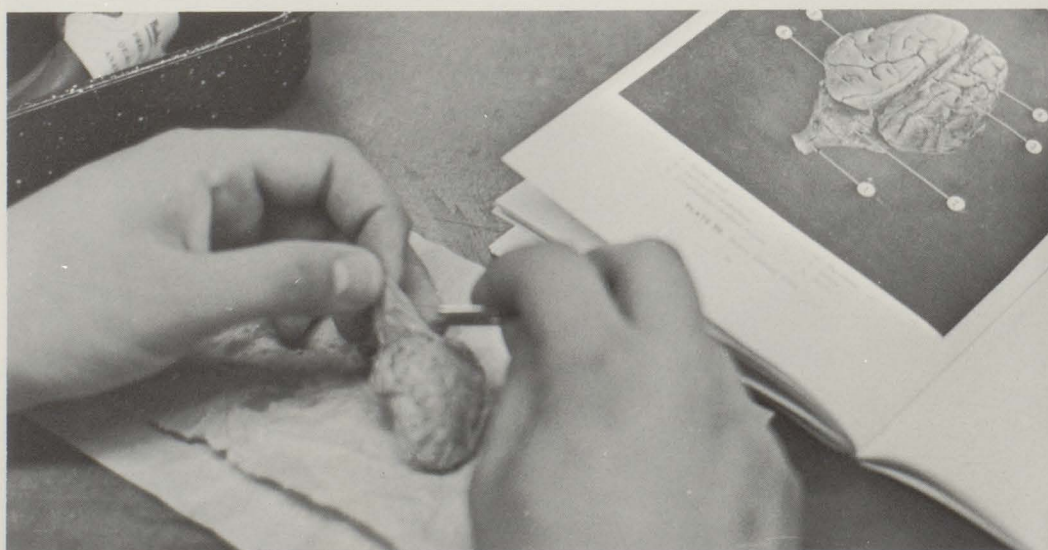
IPS Program Turns on Freshman Scientists

This year, besides general science and biology, freshmen were given the opportunity to take one of fourteen sections of IPS, better known as Introductory Physical Science. Eighty-per cent of this new course is laboratory work, giving the students experience in observation, basic lab skills, and experimental data analysis. The students develop an ability to judge what is and what is not important in the carrying out of an experiment. It serves as an introductory course to future biology, chemistry, and physics courses. The goal is that the student gains a unified picture of matter and a firm ground in some of the most basic ideas of science.

As a higher course, earth science is offered to those with a previous introductory course. This involves the study of the solid, liquid and gaseous parts of the earth; the reaches of space; and is composed of interrelated fields, such as geology and oceanography.



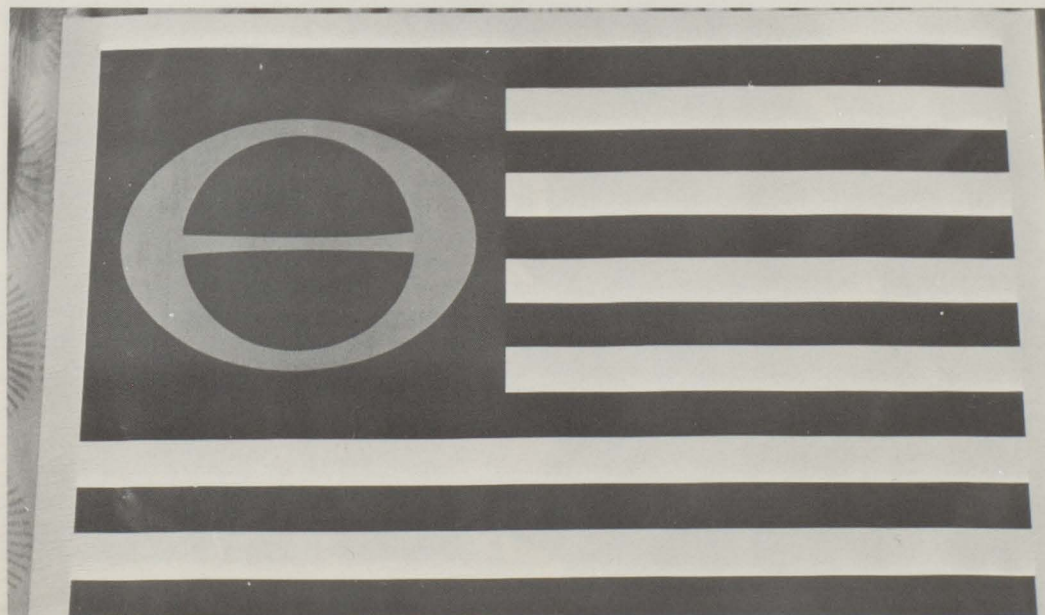

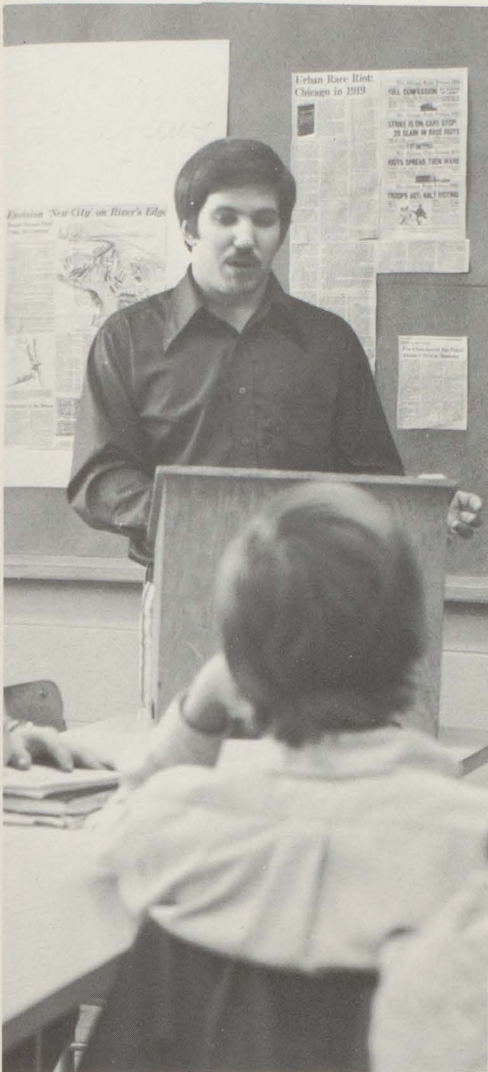
"Involvement" Is Key in Social Studies

Simulation activities in Far East history also found students acting out historical situations rather than merely reading about them.



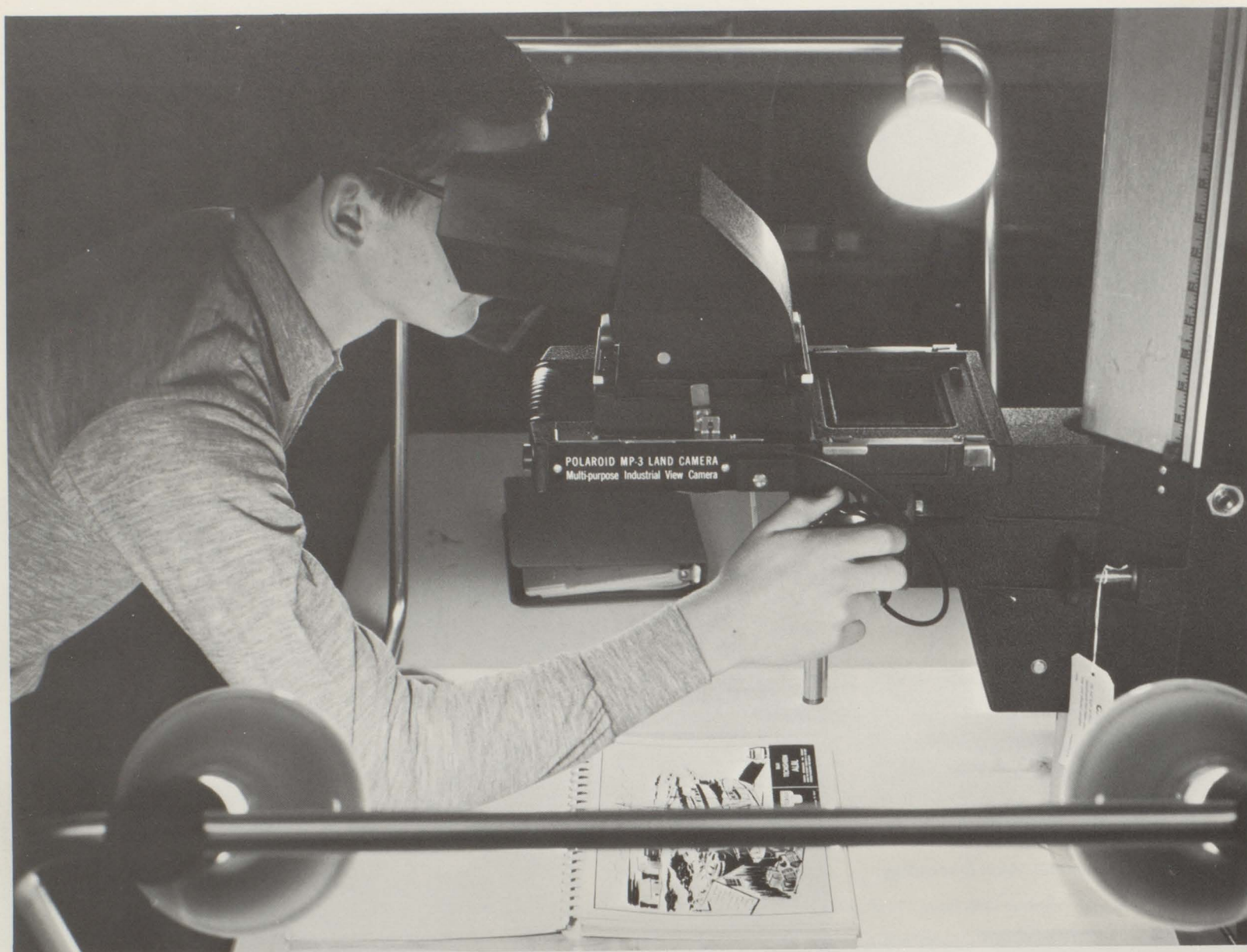

Rows of films filed in neat slots as well as equipment for their repair and maintenance; slide projectors, opaque projectors, tape recorders and film projectors by the dozen — West's Audio-Visual Department in the basement of D-building buzzes with activity from first to seventh periods. Quite apart from the distribution and servicing of equipment and films, however, is the copy department where instant reproduction of almost any type is possible. The new Polaroid Land Industrial View Camera makes photographic reproduction now also instantly available.

Student Directed Learning, introduced this year at West, brought a new

addition to the library — a special book case containing books for this group alone. The space squeeze, felt by most libraries, is being met at West by the expansion of microfilm purchases. The microfilm readers, as a result, were moved to the research alcove for more convenient use.

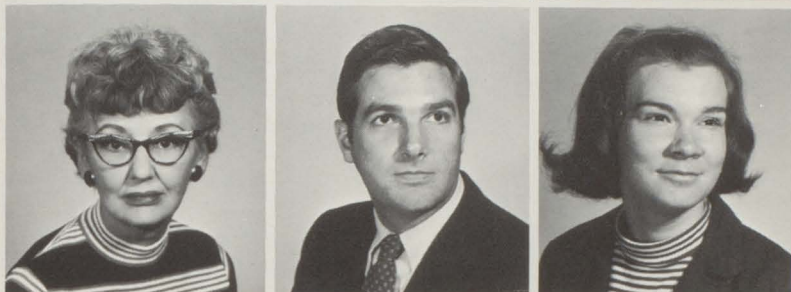

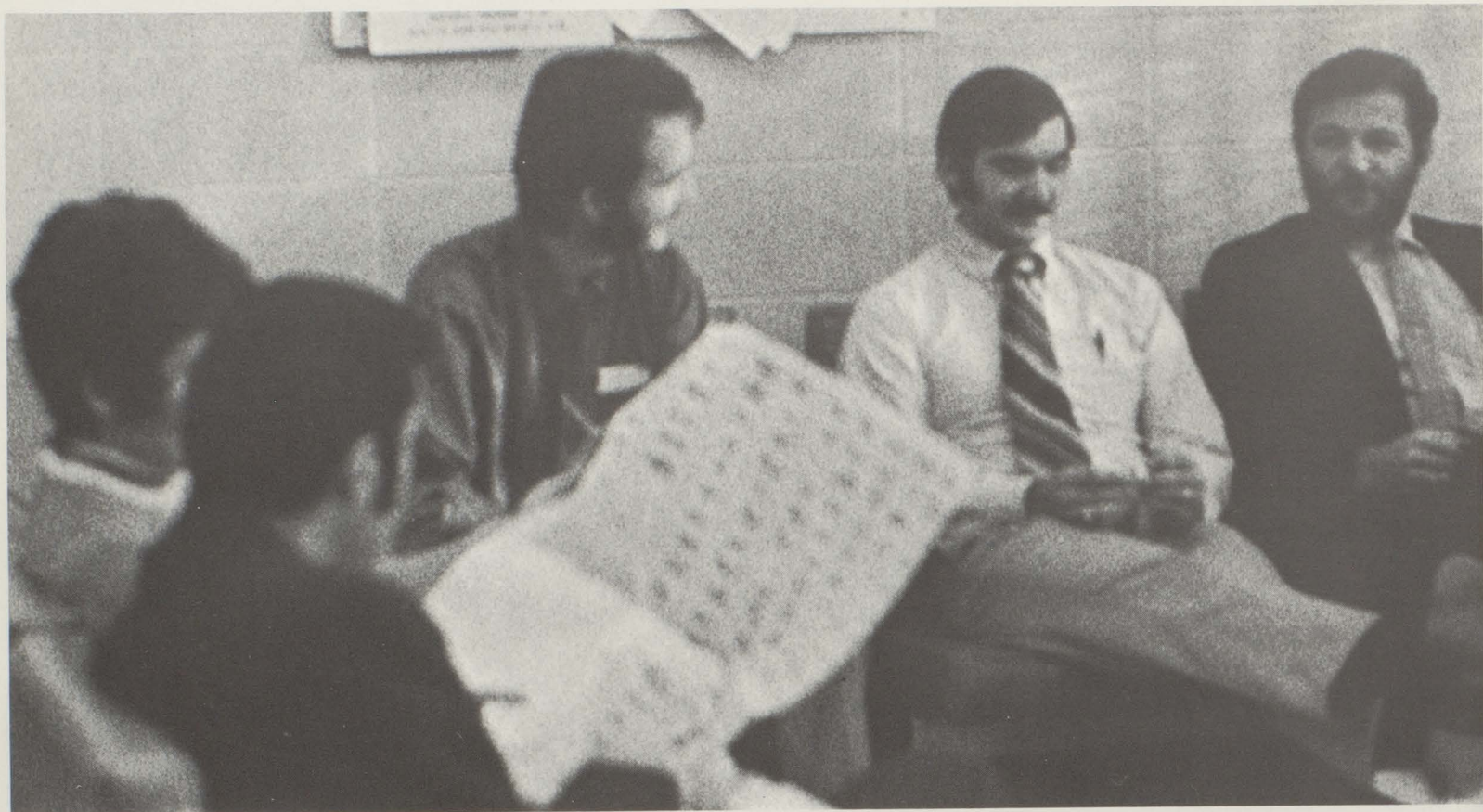

While based at P.W., teachers: taught, naturally; policed study halls and corridors; chaperoned Fun Nights and dances; sponsored clubs, advised

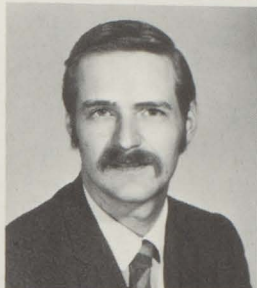

Health Service Adopts "Take a Number" Plan

West's enrollment creeps steadily upward; new class rooms are devised; additional faculty members employed, but health facilities remain static. The same two nurses do their best to serve more than four thousand students who once had only three thousand as their responsibility.

Consequently in an effort to serve as many students as efficiently as possible the Health Service this year adopted the "Please take a number" system used in many other situations and limited their clientele to strictly emergency cases.

The Health Service is also responsible for the final check on all insurance forms, ear-testing of incoming Freshmen and work as advisors and resource persons for reading and speech clinics.

Office Staff Adapt to New Challenges

Early registration brought a variety of new problems for West's office staff even before the first day of school. Very soon afterward the rigorous routines which must be maintained if attendance, grades, schedules and requisitions are processed smoothly was again interrupted by the flood of extra work resulting from the NCA evaluation — work which culminated in a pile of more than five hundred neatly typed pages which were stenciled and collated for the final copies of the official report. Through it all the staff managed to maintain business as usual.

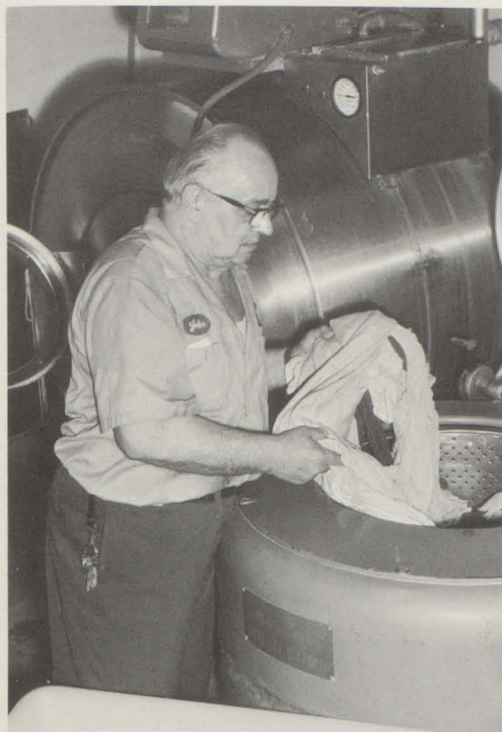

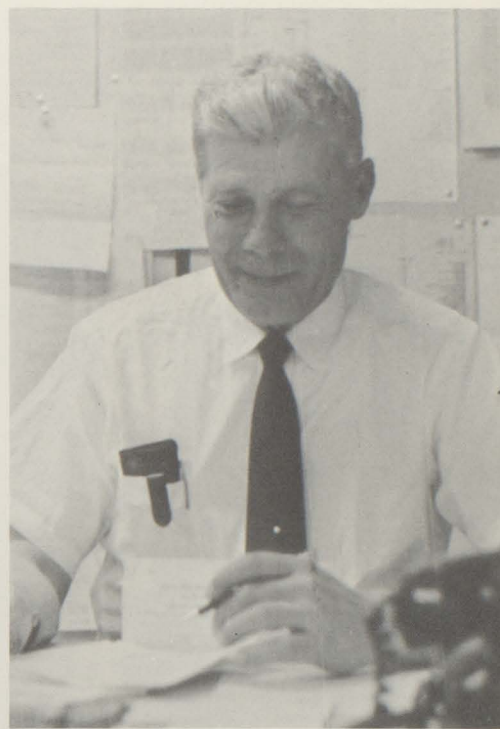

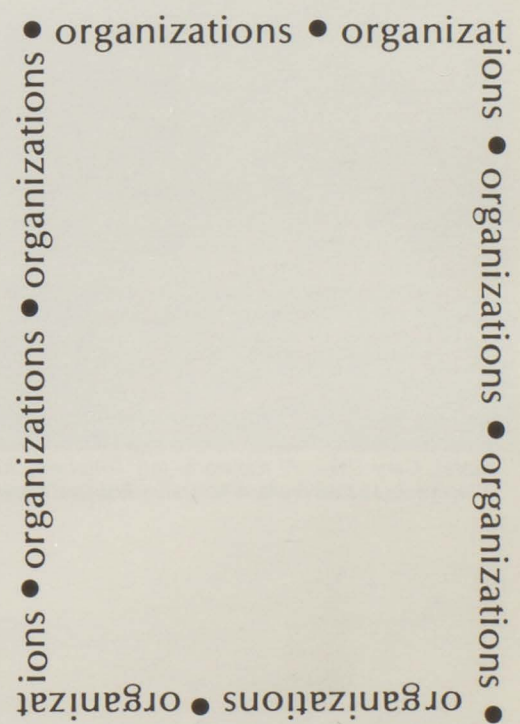
Maintenance Keeps It Clean at Proviso West

Bataan Day Trophy, Record Album, Frequent Concerts, Kept Bands in Public Eye

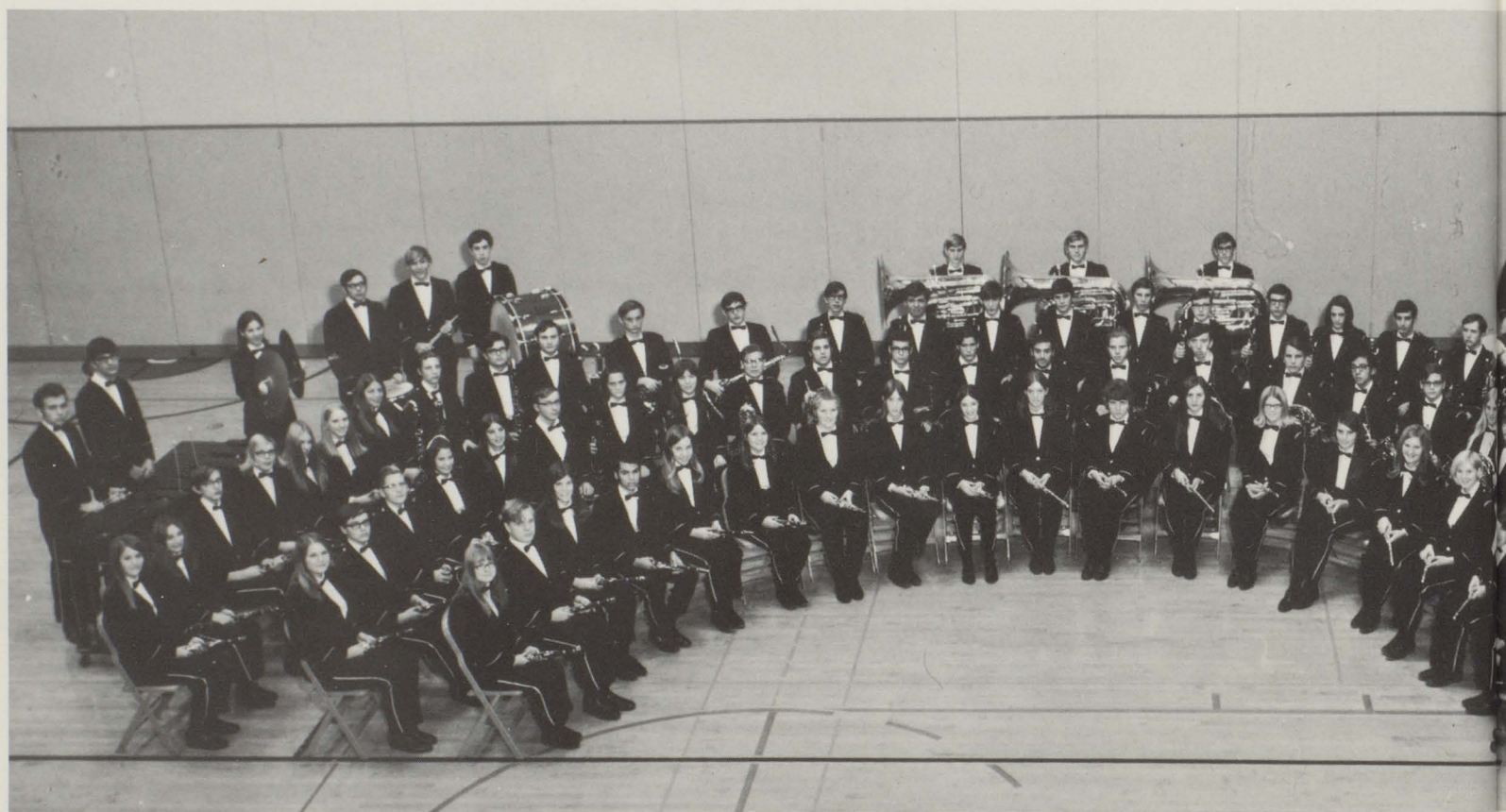

Student Council sponsored the Variety Show which gave matinee performances on December 9, 10 and 11, and evening performances on the 11th and 12th.



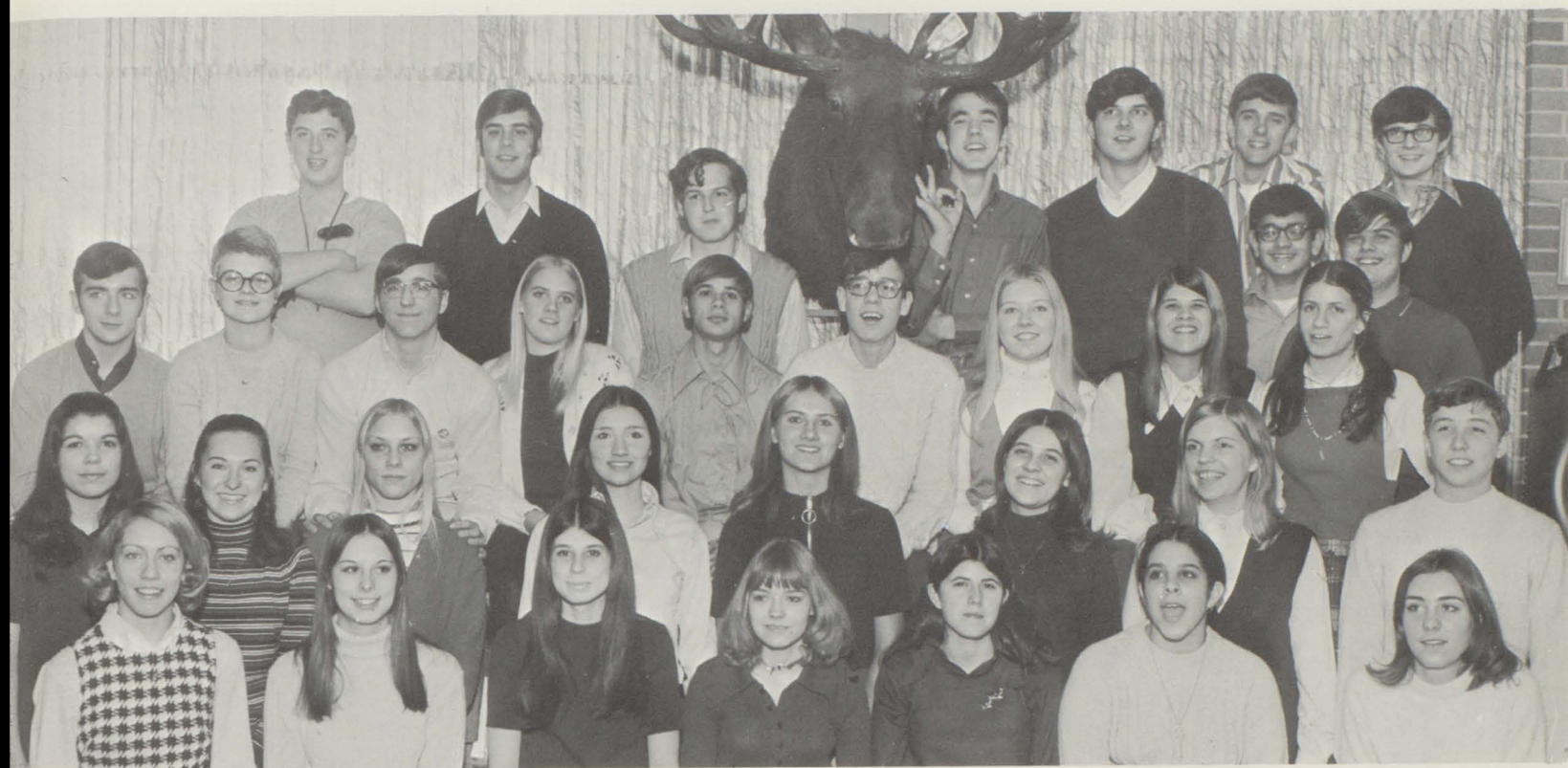

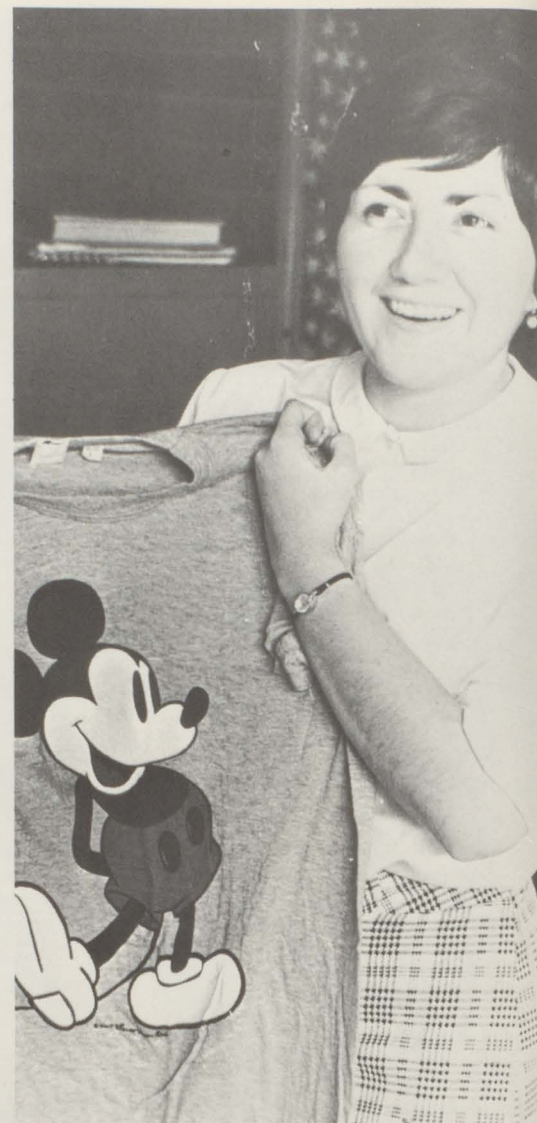

Profile Wins Yet Another "All-American"

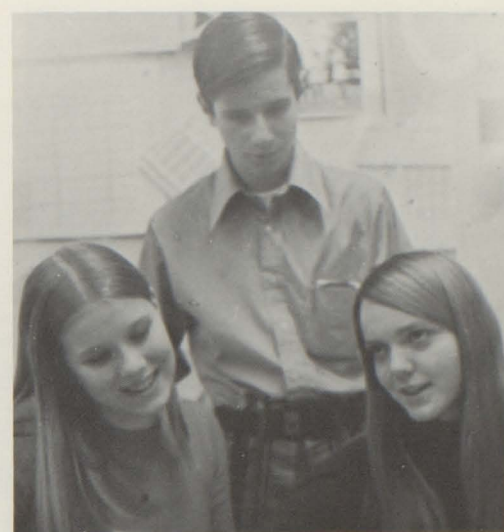

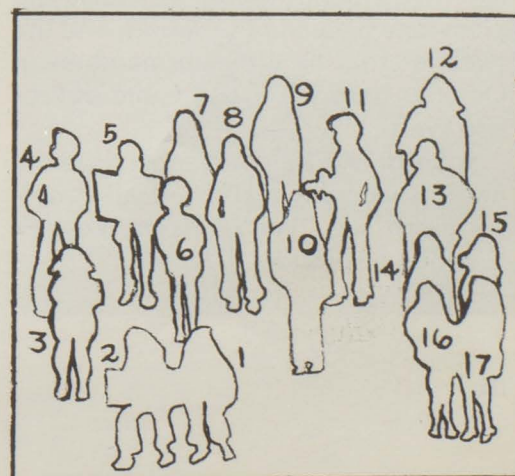

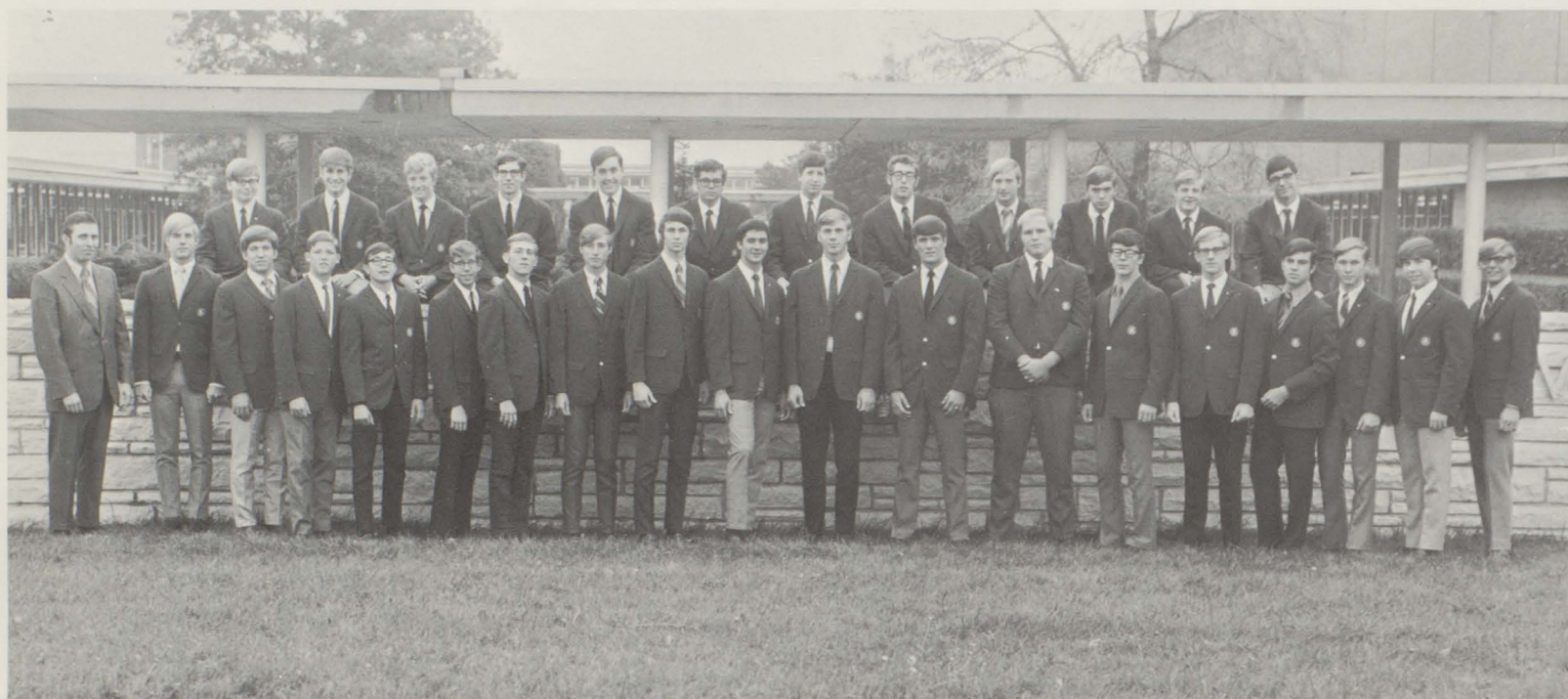
Mural Staff Does Its Thing in 1971

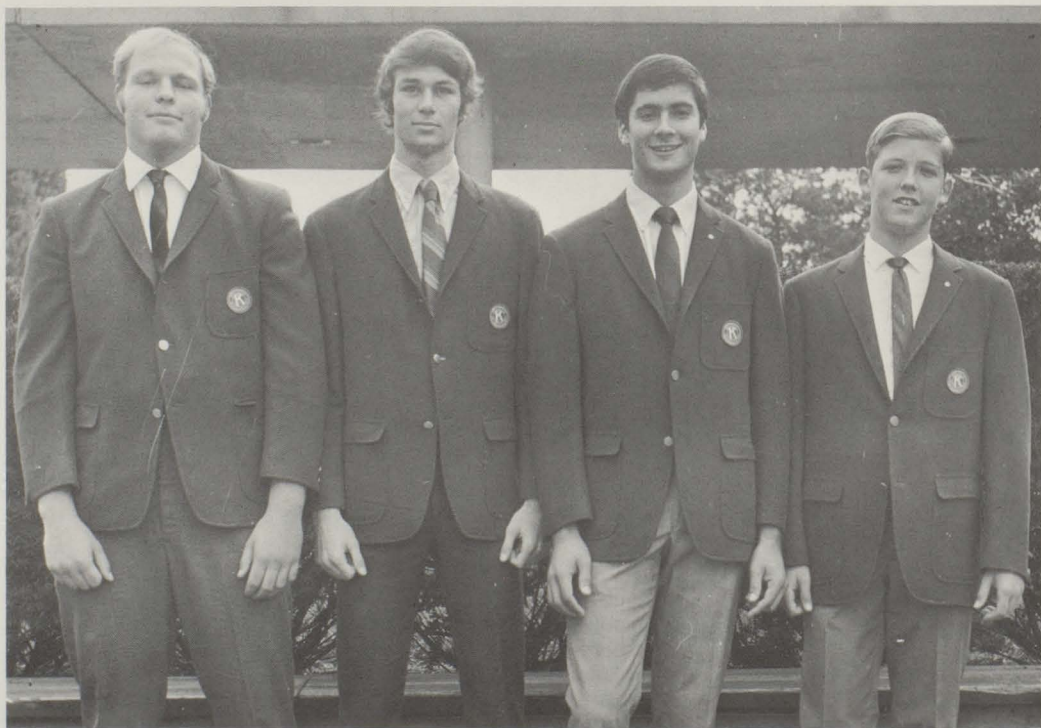

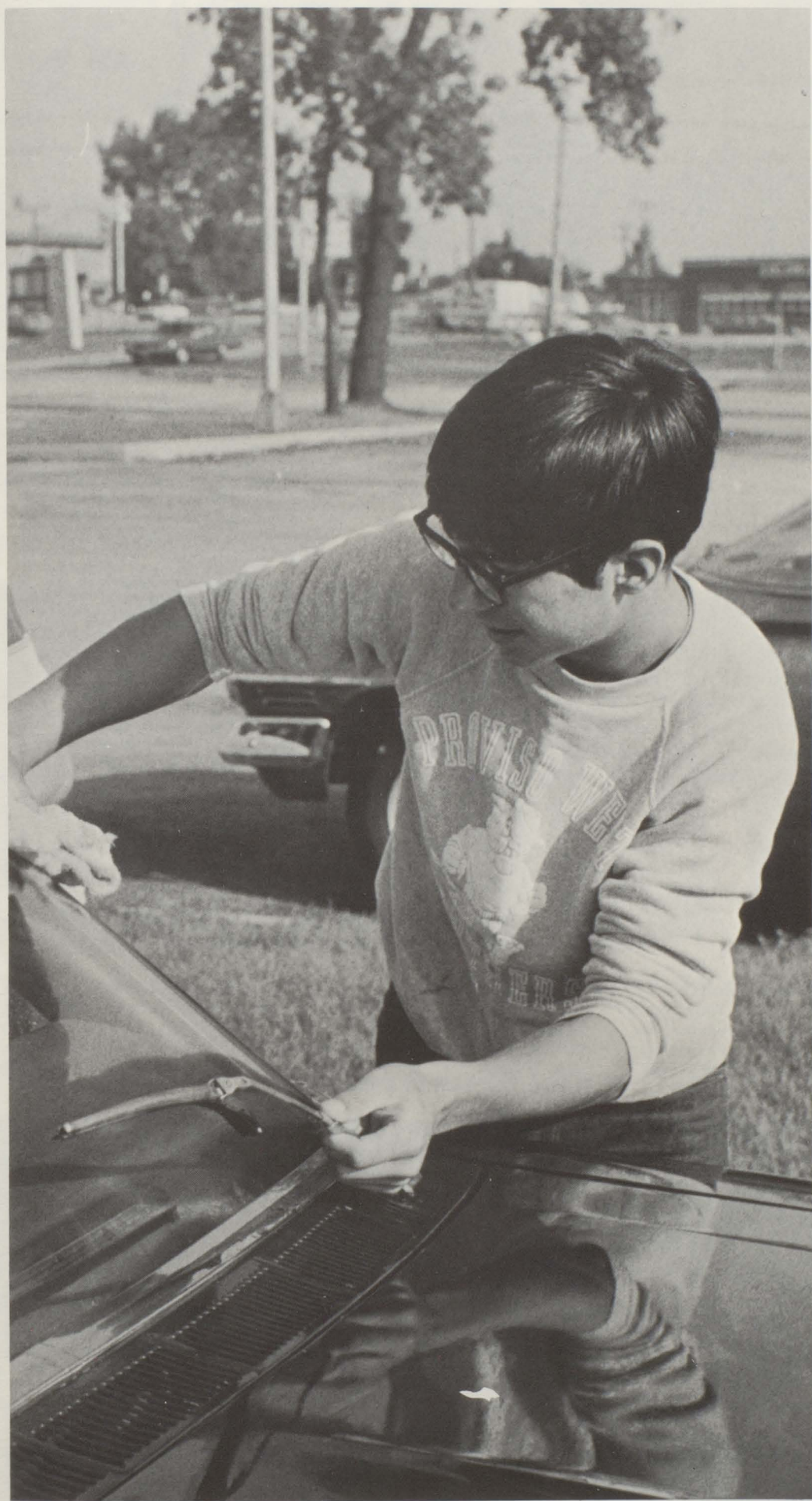
Inflation Hits Key Club— Derbies Up to 75¢

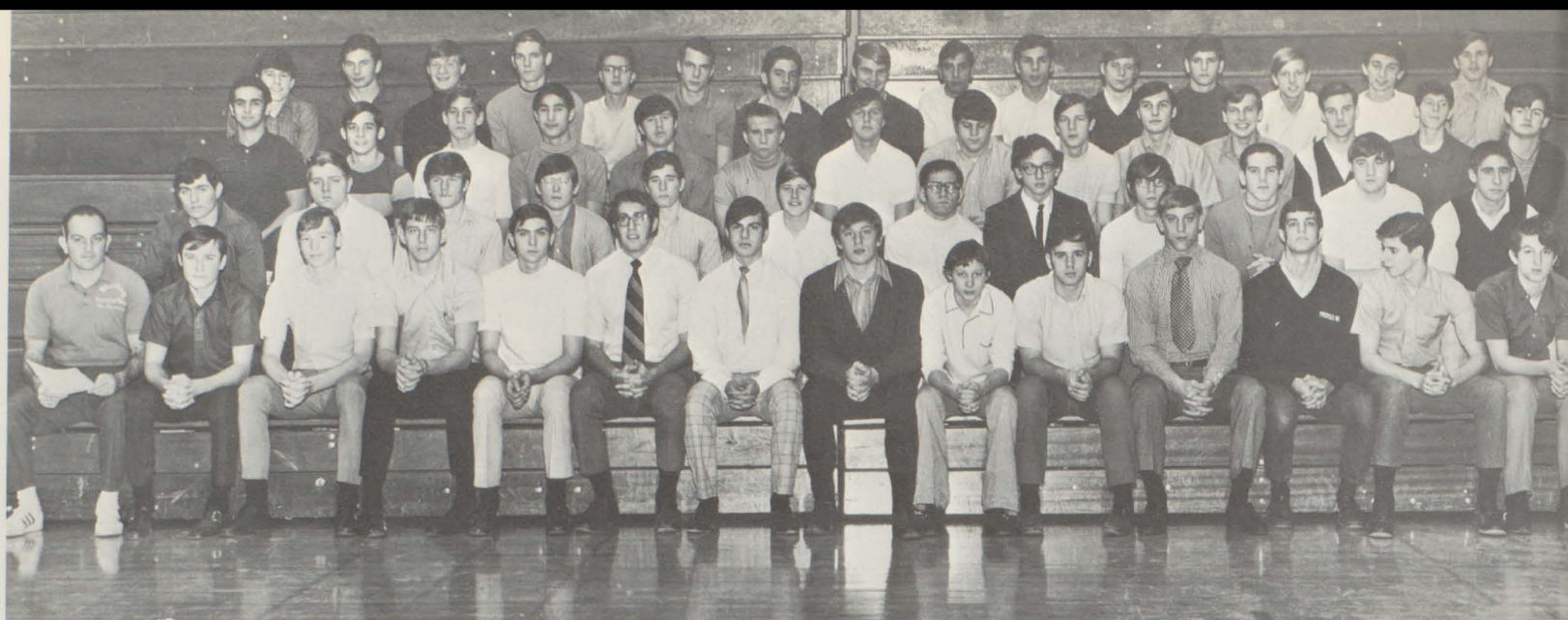

Aquatic Staff Teaches Handicapped to Swim

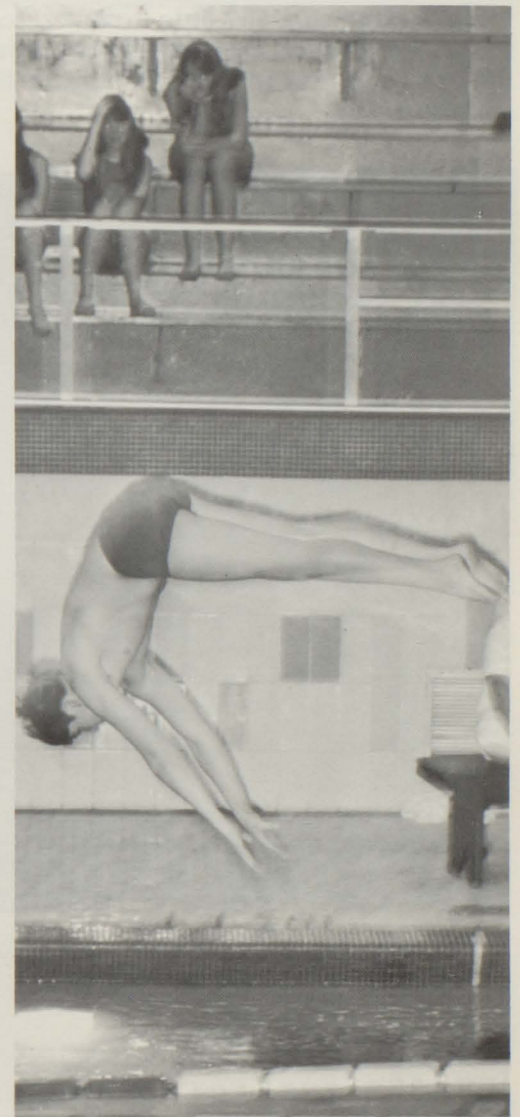

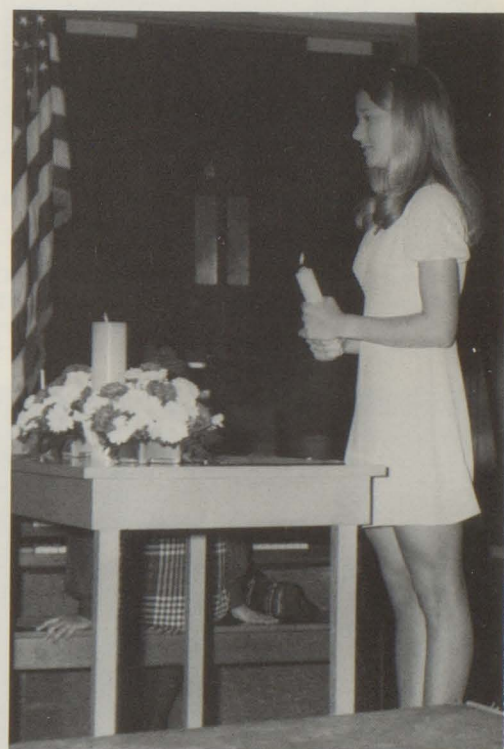

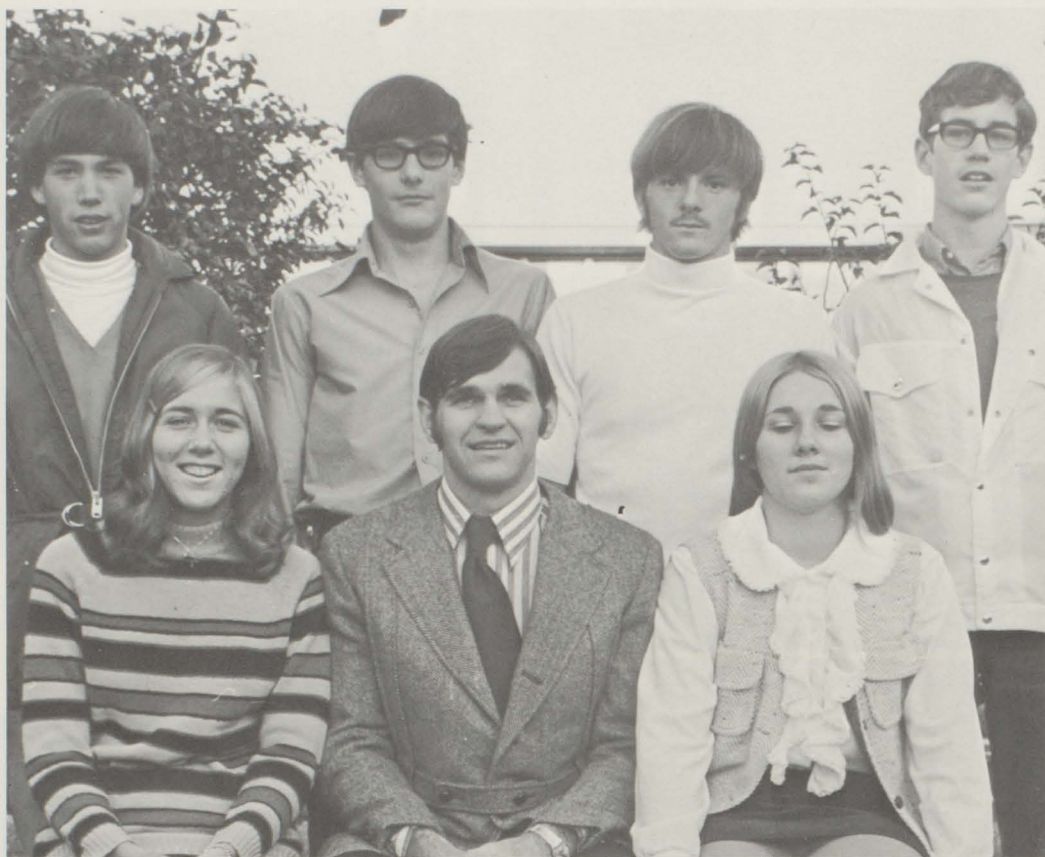
Ski Club Slalom, Snow Plough at Alpine

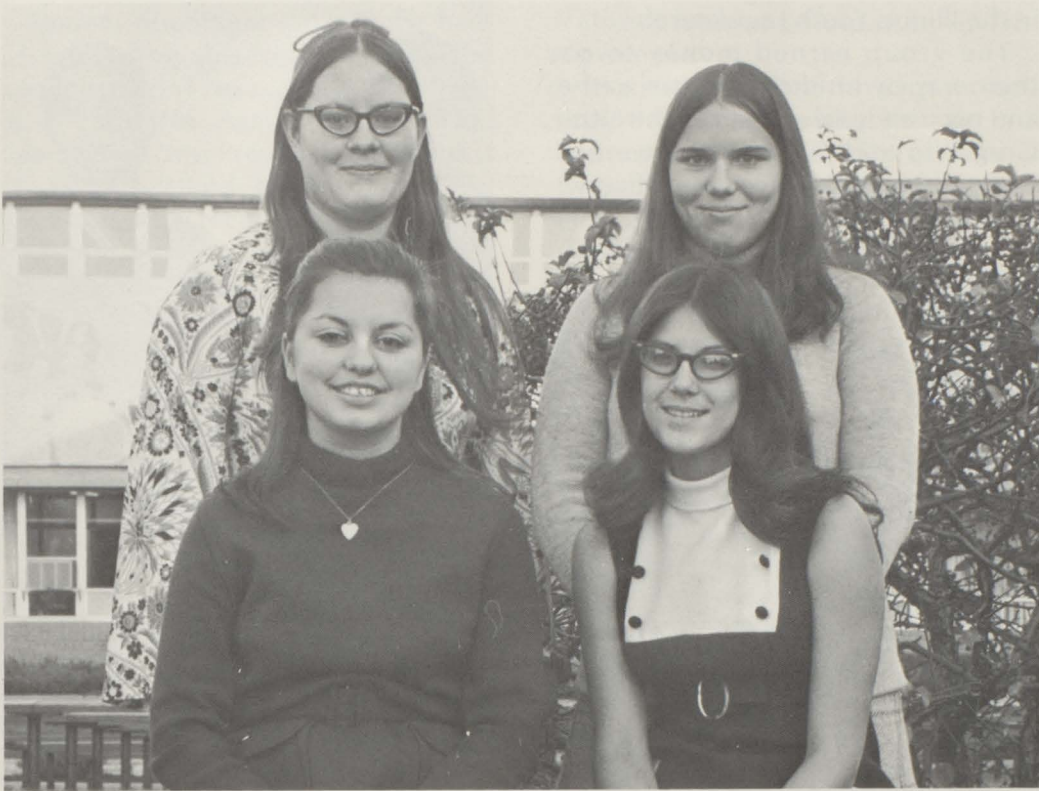

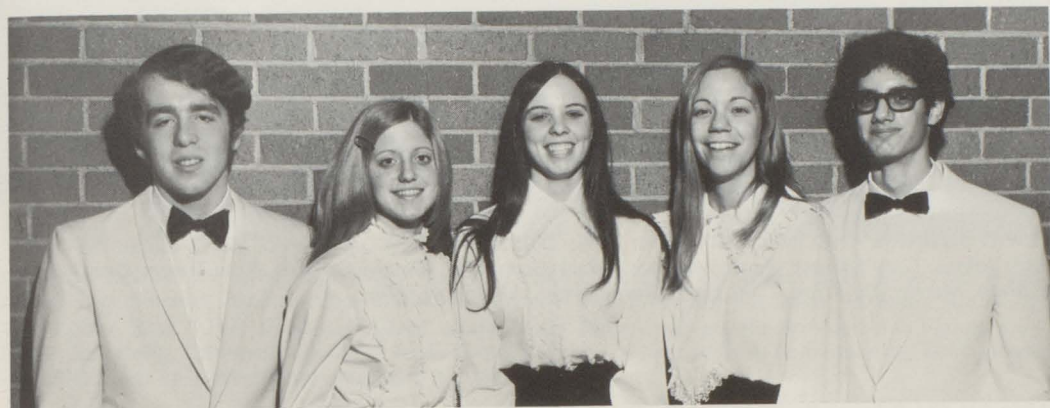


Now It's "Orchestra Power" Say Musicians

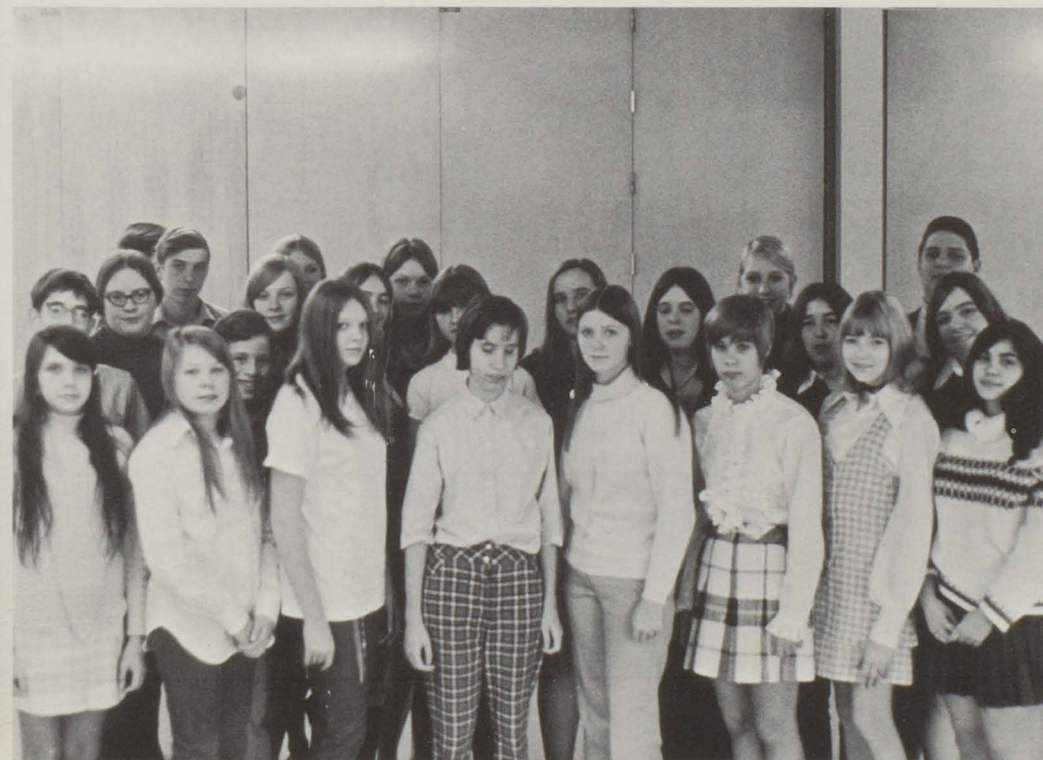

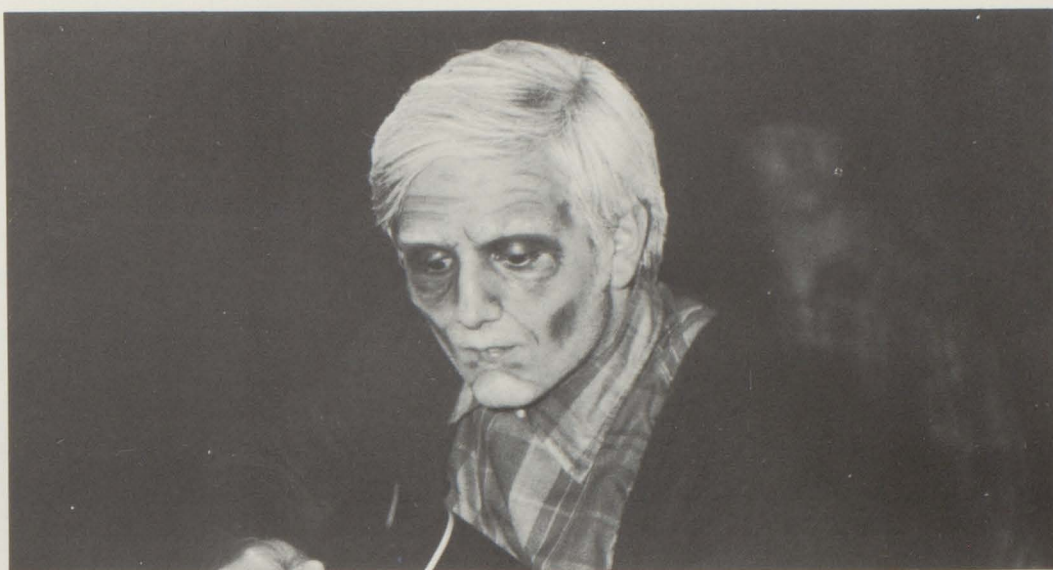

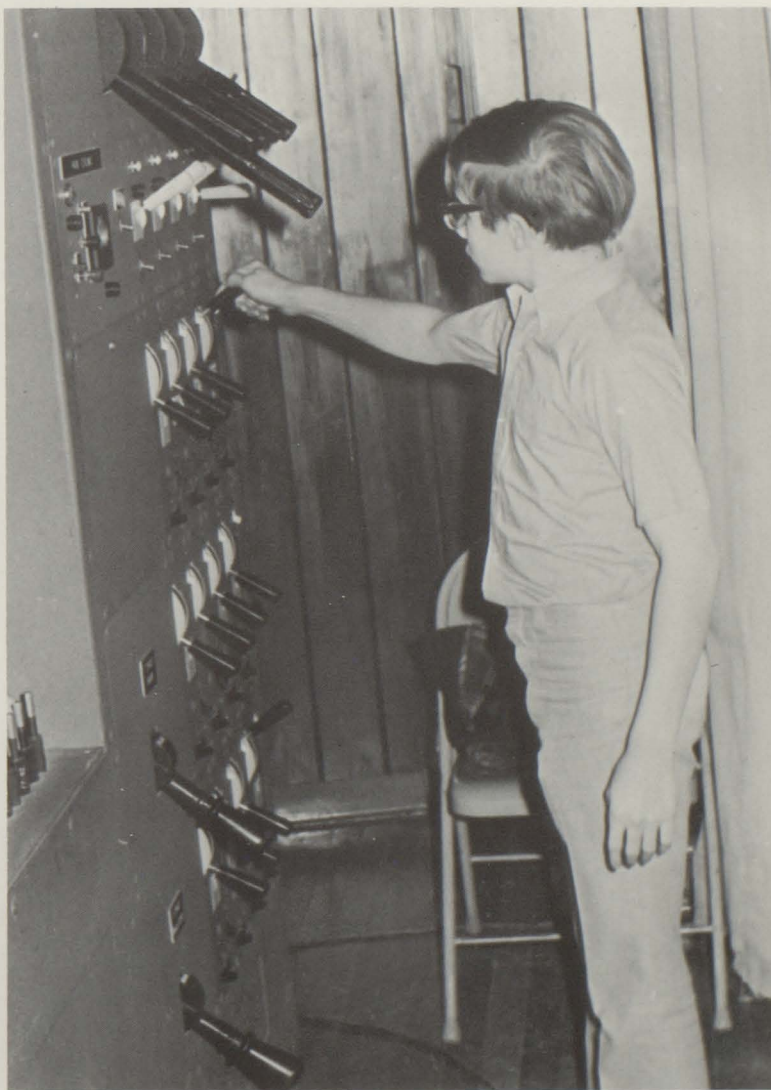

Cine Club gave a final farewell party to the seniors. One senior was lucky to receive a Scholarship award.



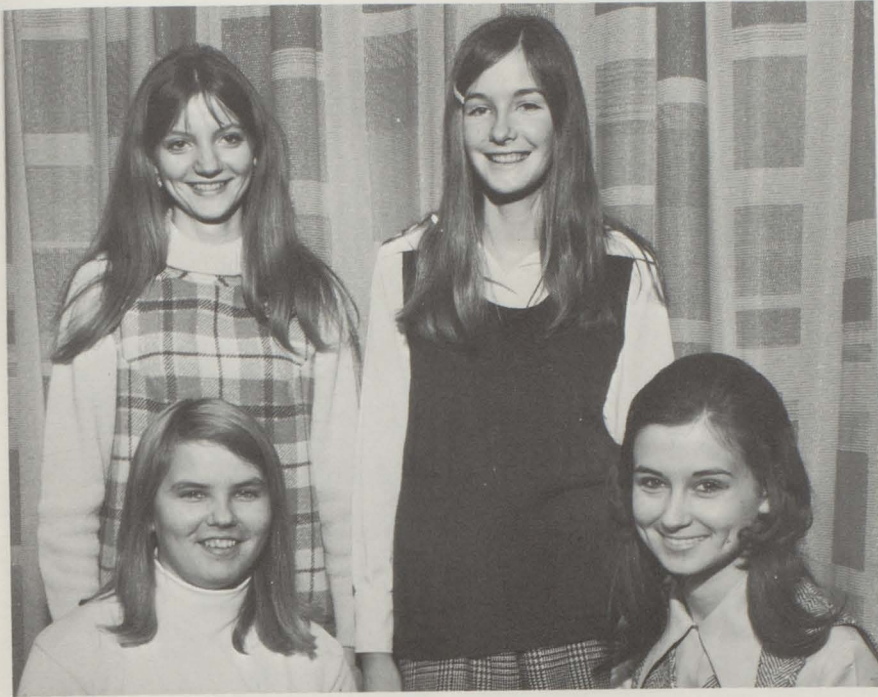

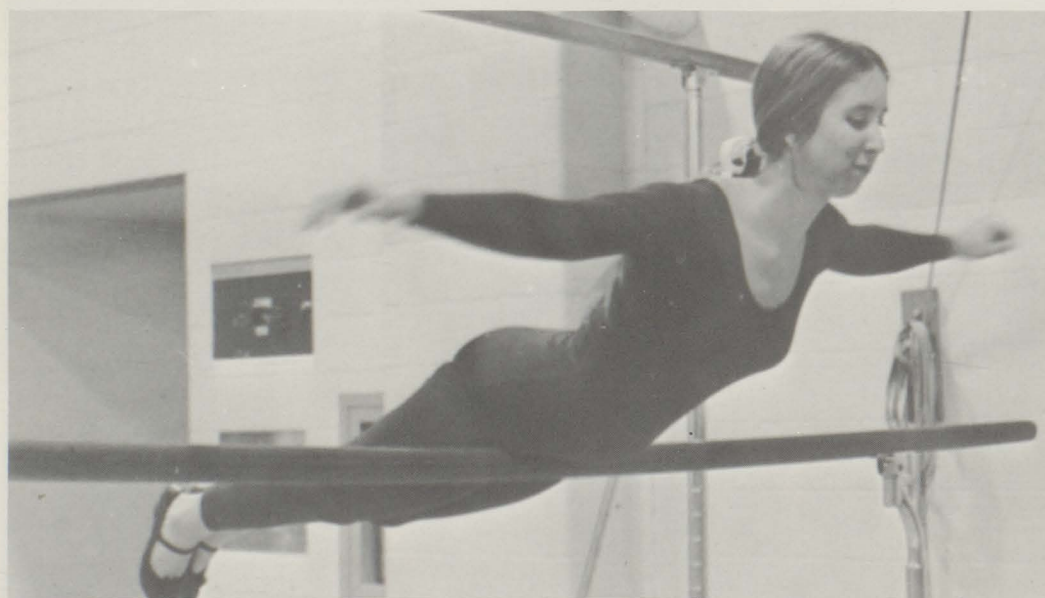

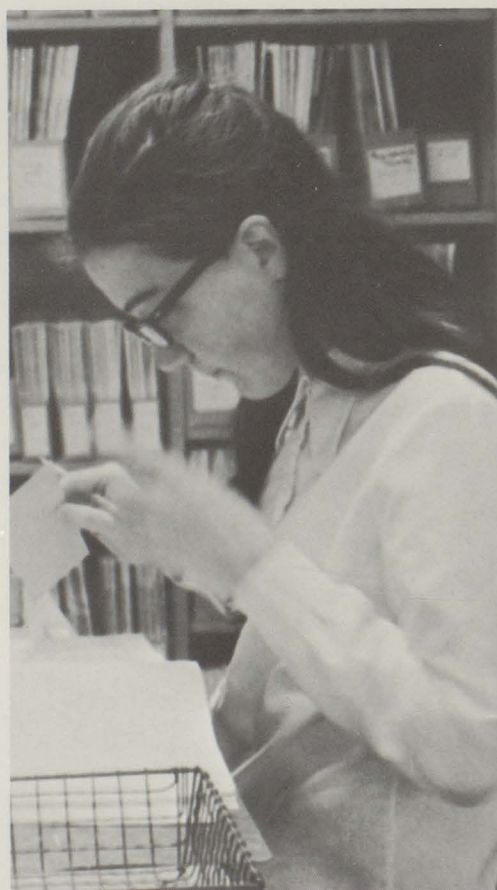

many trips they made. One special project of the year was a candy sale. A mortician, a bee keeper, and a F.B.I. agent were just a few of the guest speakers that Science Club had.

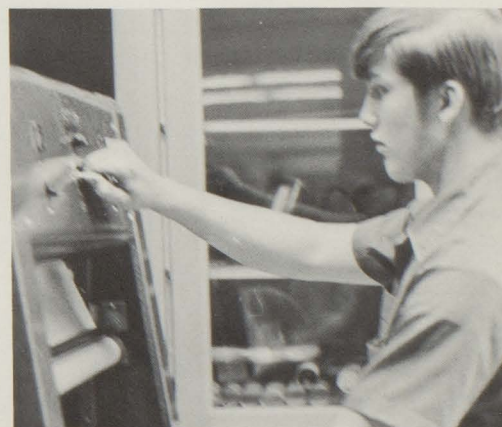

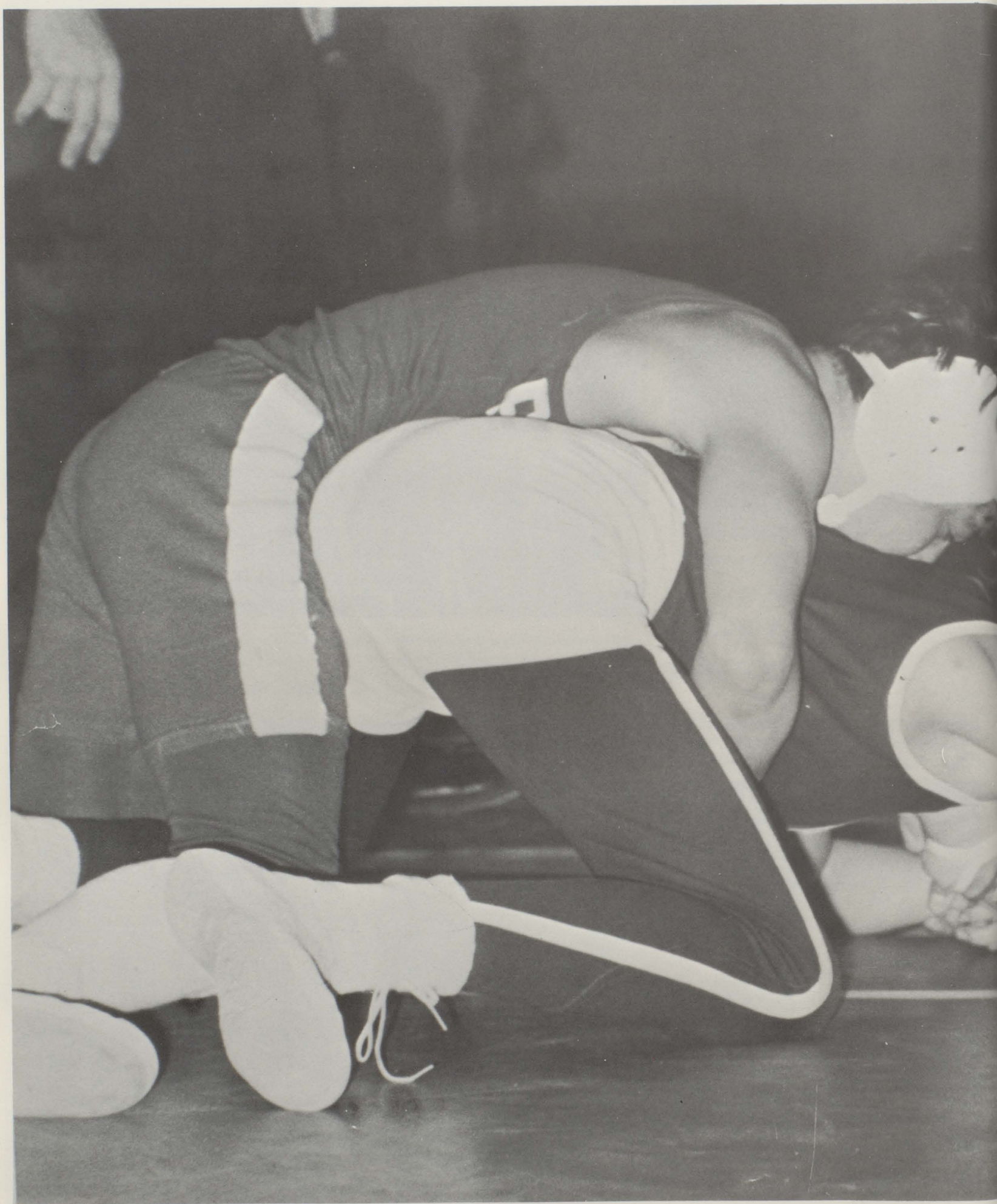

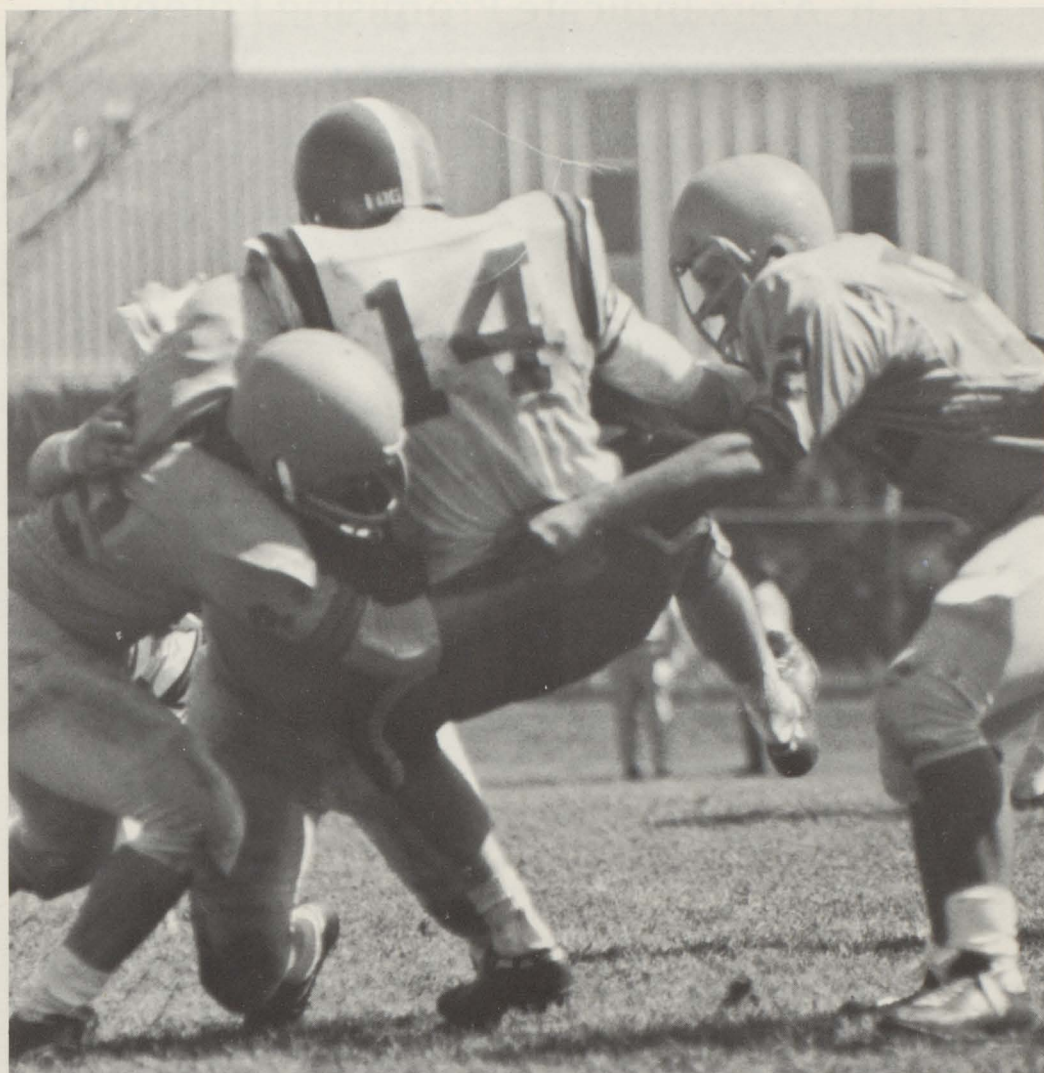
Jay Vees' Season Ends With 3-3 Tally

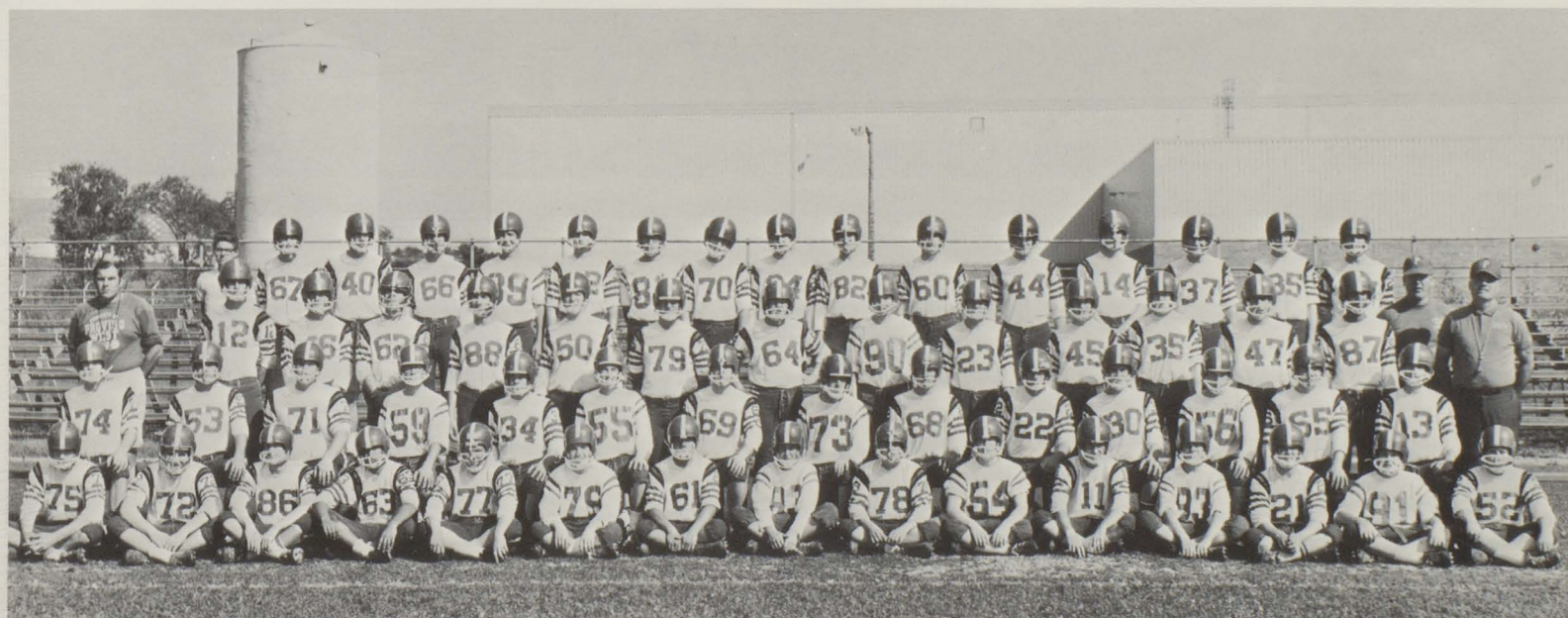

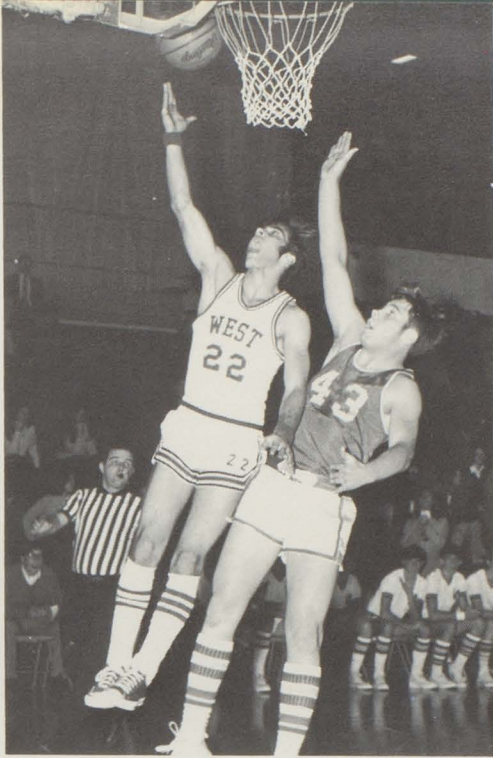
High point was the final game against Glenbard West in which the Cats were able to top Glenbard 52-47 in a close, tight, well-played contest.

Sophs Are WSC Champs Win 15 Straight

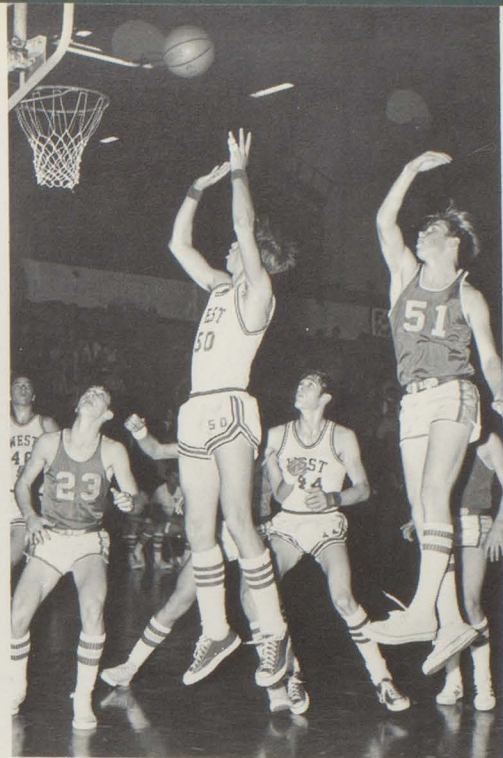

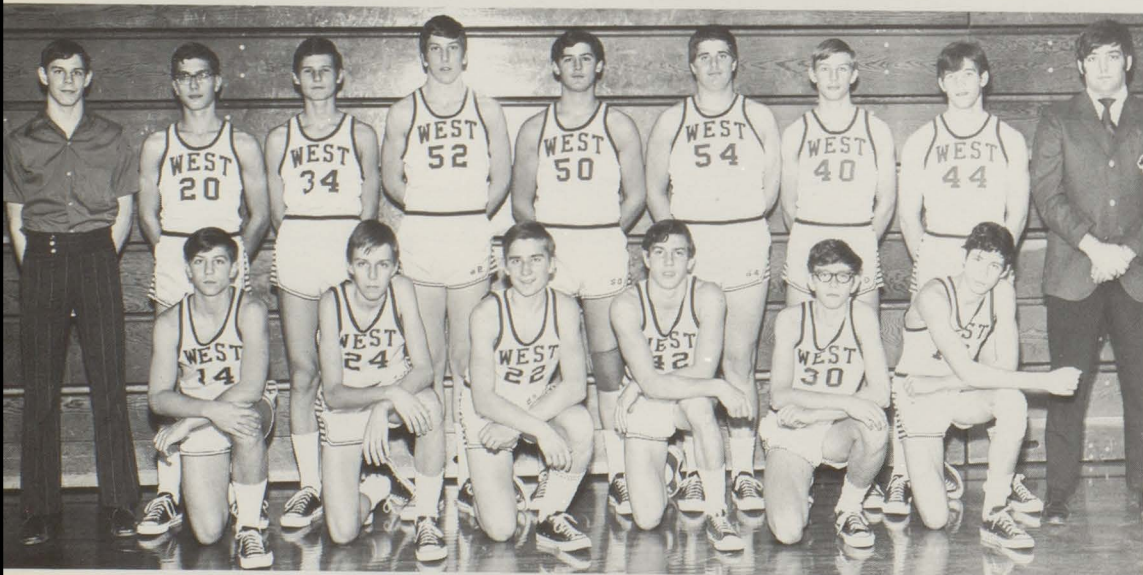

Varsity Grapplers Have Banner Year, Place Second in Conference

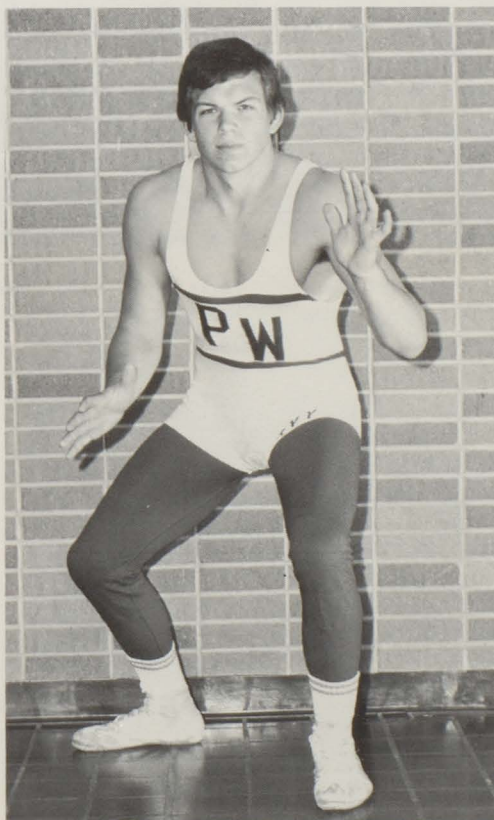
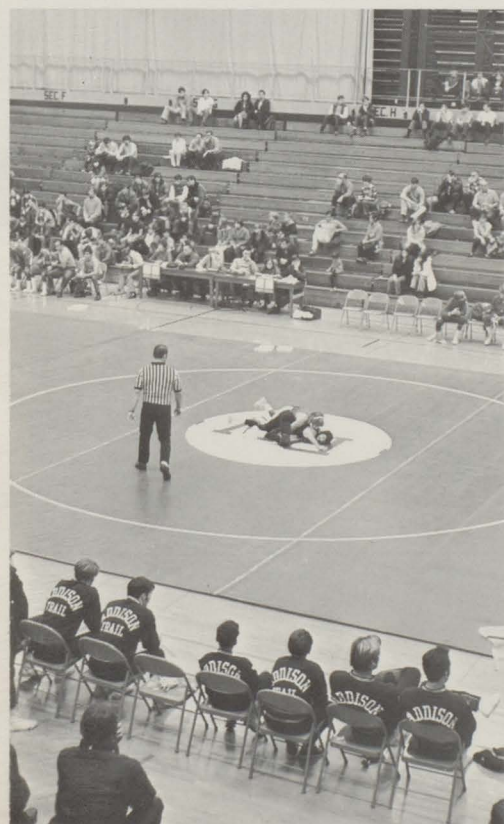

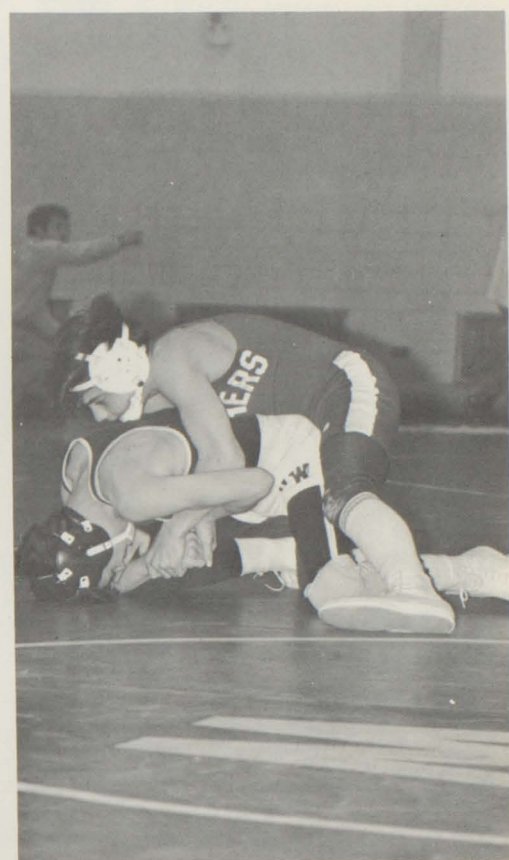

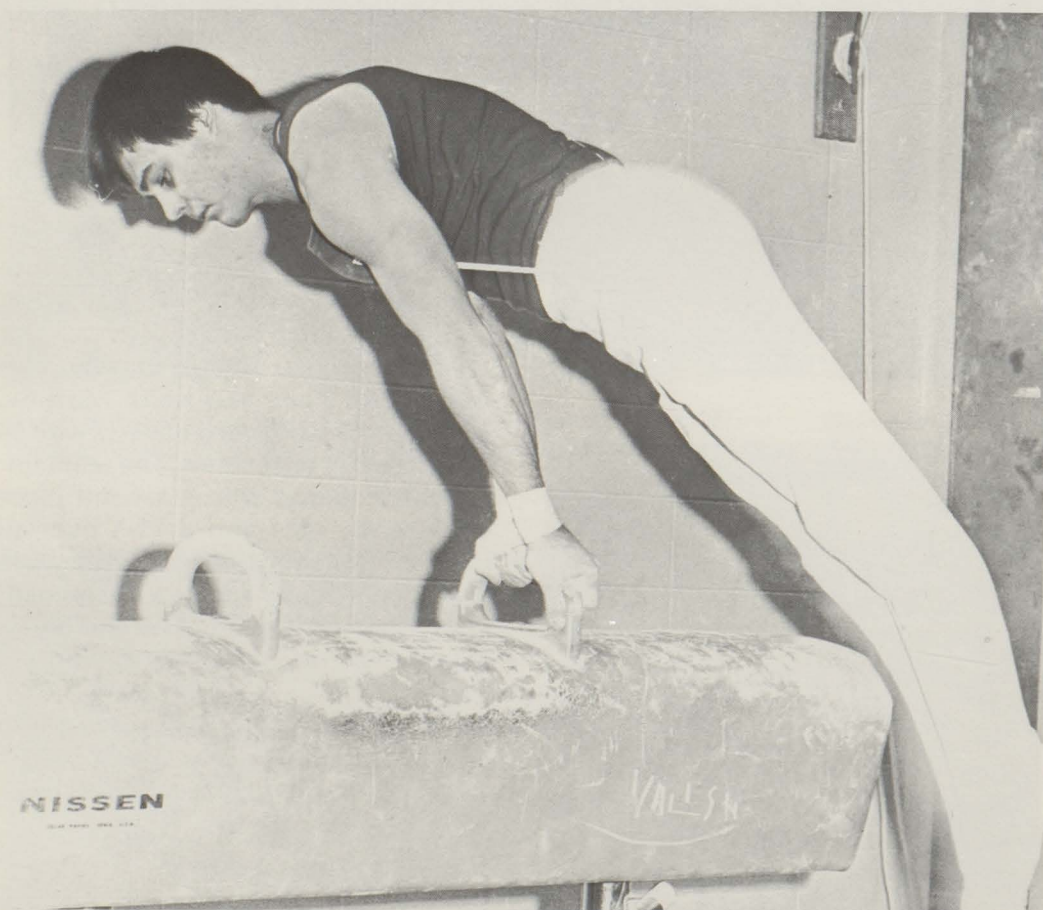

Romanelli Brings West 1st State Swim Title

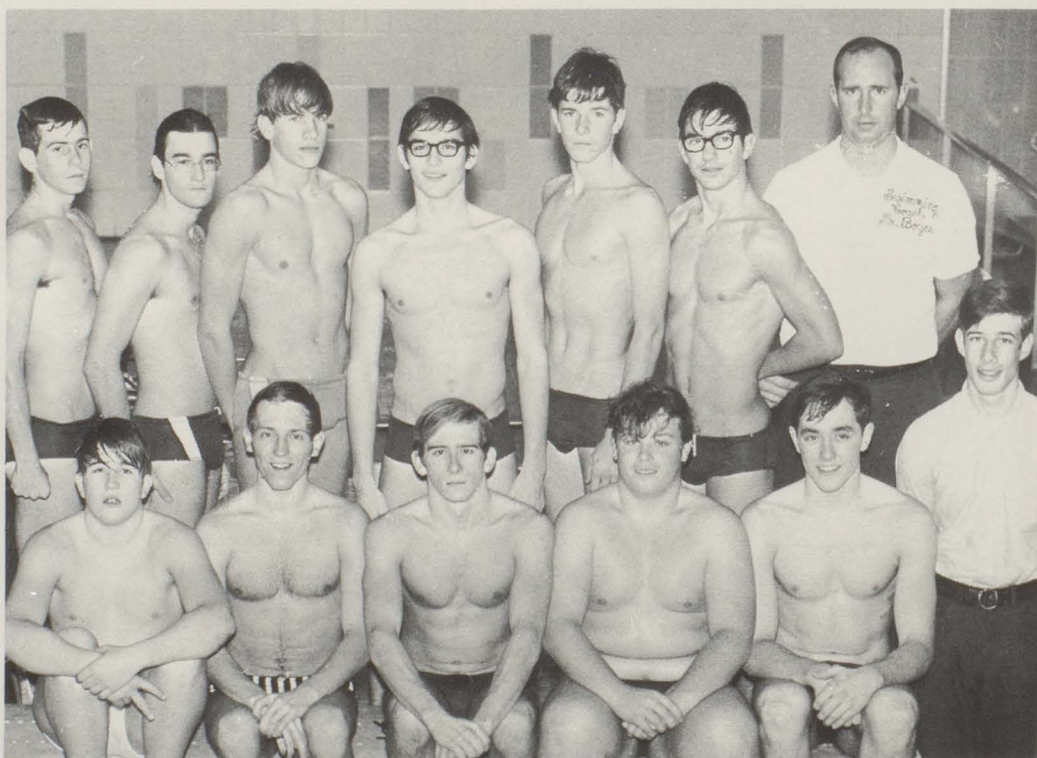

Varsity Has 3rd Place 1970 WSC Final Rating

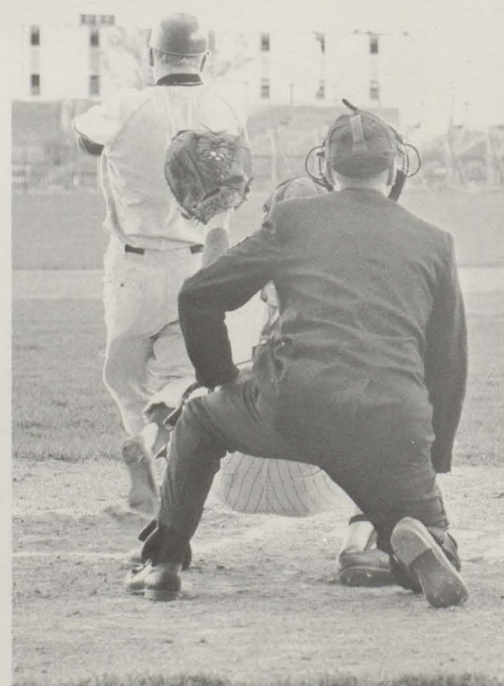

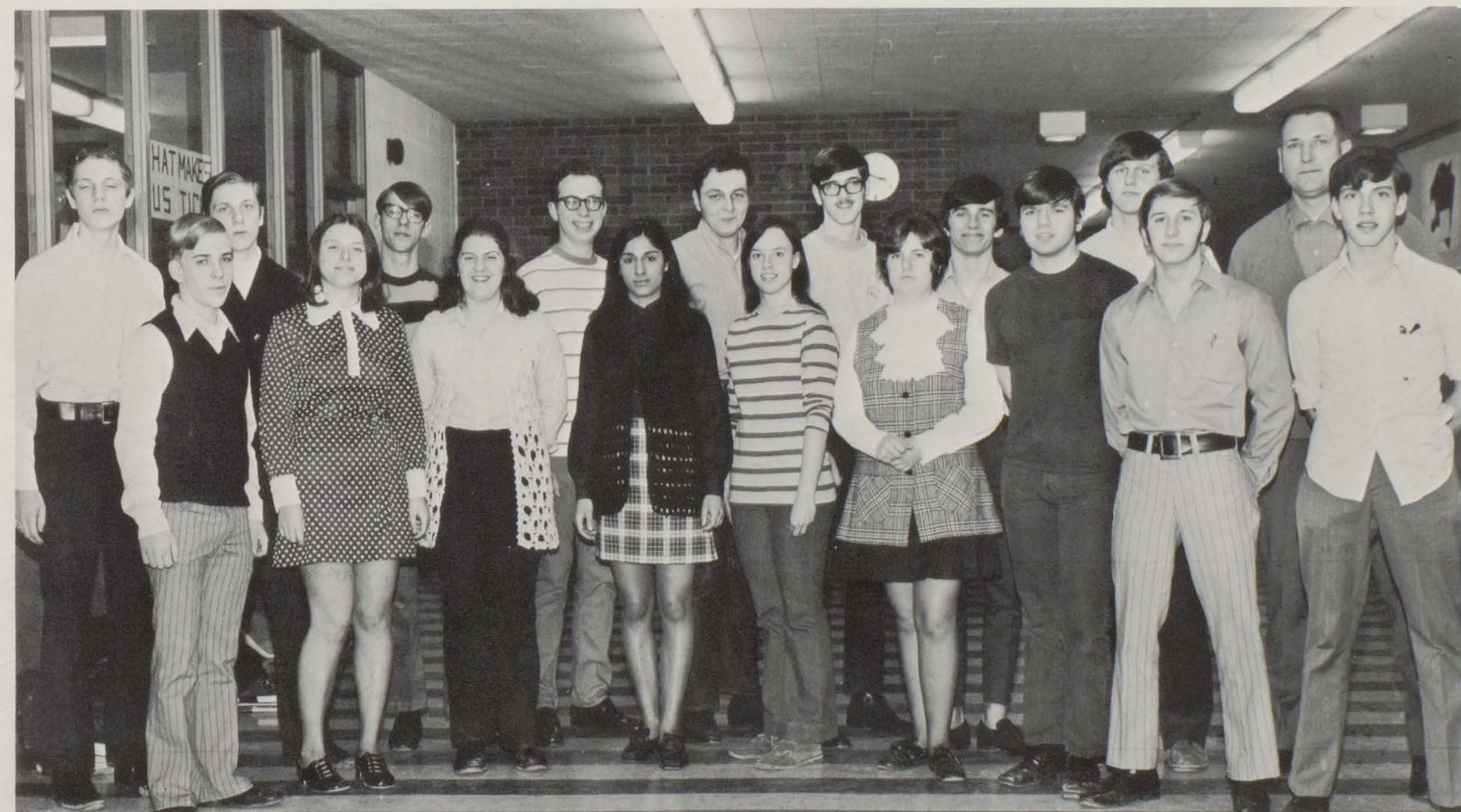

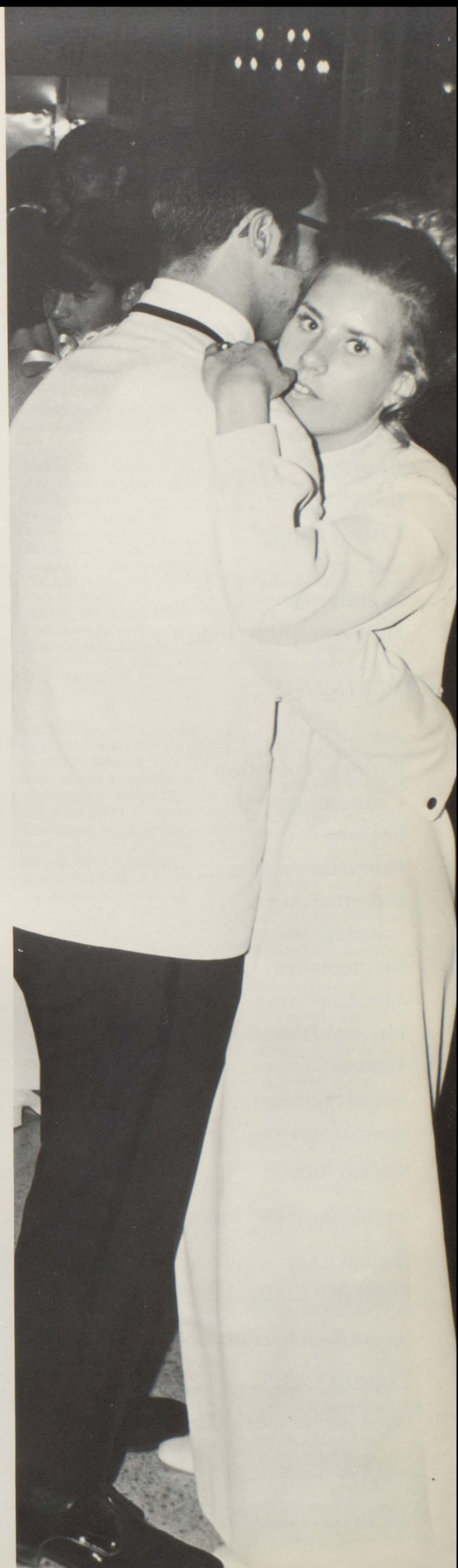
In the simmering-hot gym rows of scarlet gowns flanked by two solid walls of proud, perspiring faces — June 9, 1971, Graduation Day!
