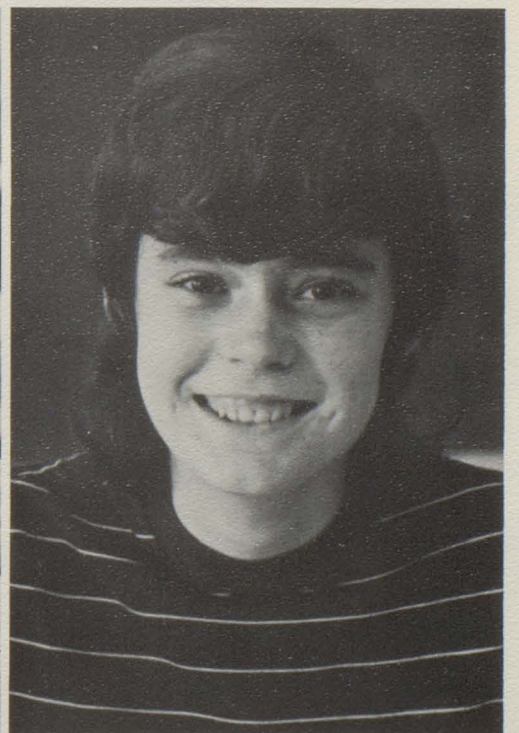
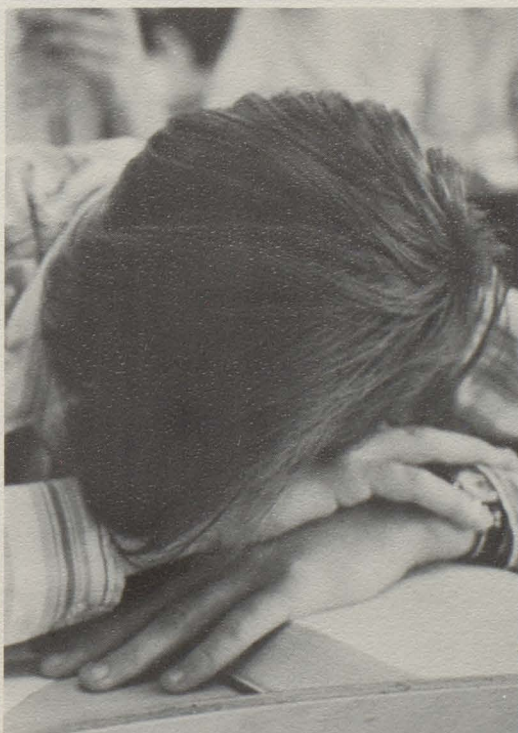
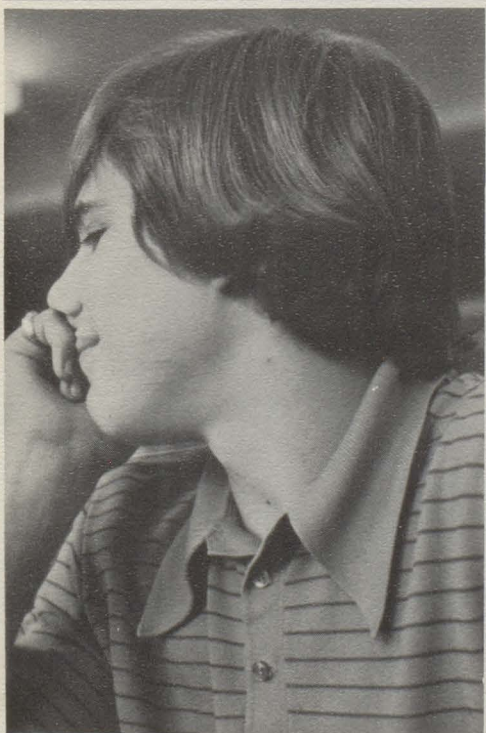
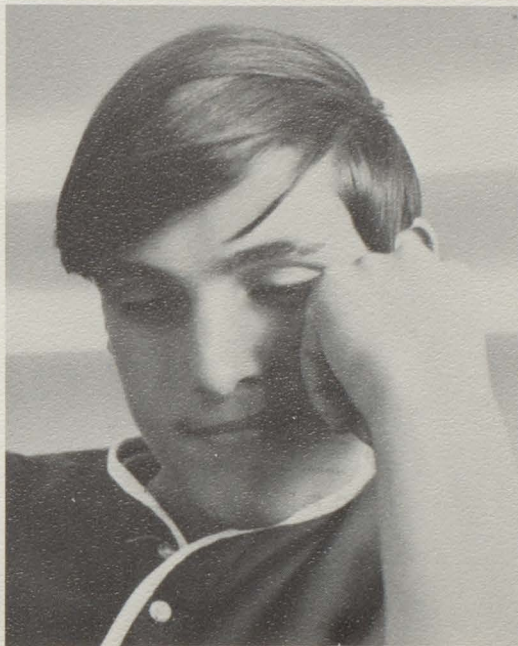
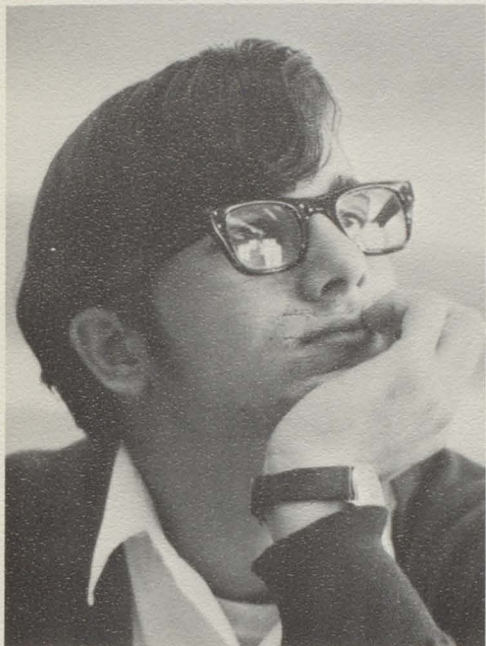
"School spirit is not only supporting teams, but participating, using your own effort toward something that counts." (Brian Whitlock) ...

"For some sports school spirit is great but all around it stinks. When only twelve people stay to see a football game until the end I'd say that school spirit doesn't even exist! ...

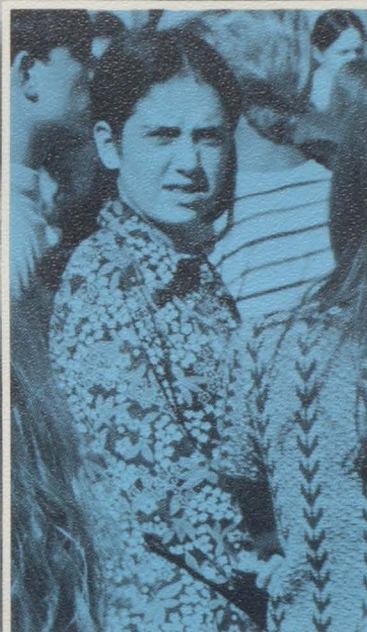
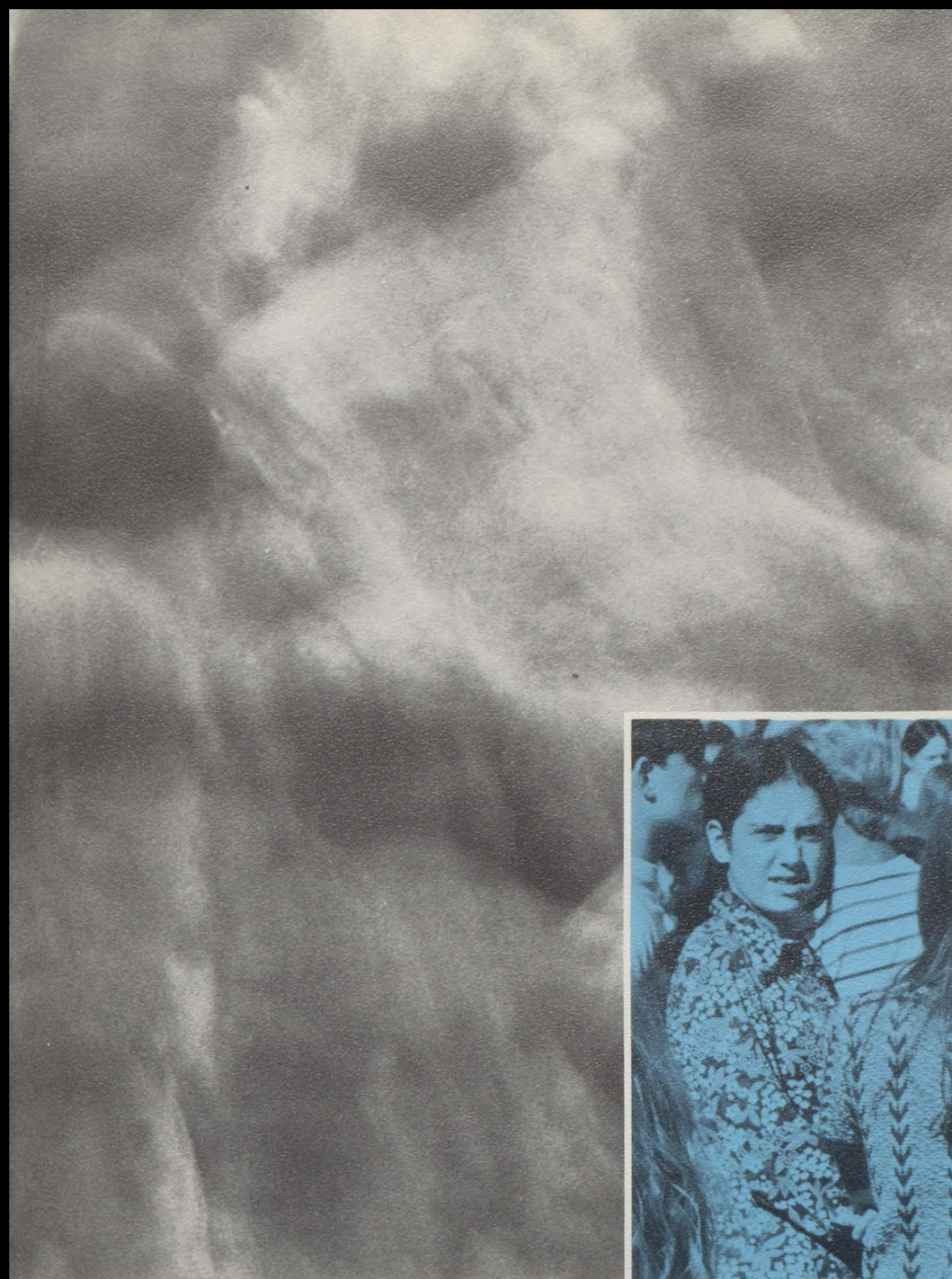






Traffic! Is It Rough Getting into This School!

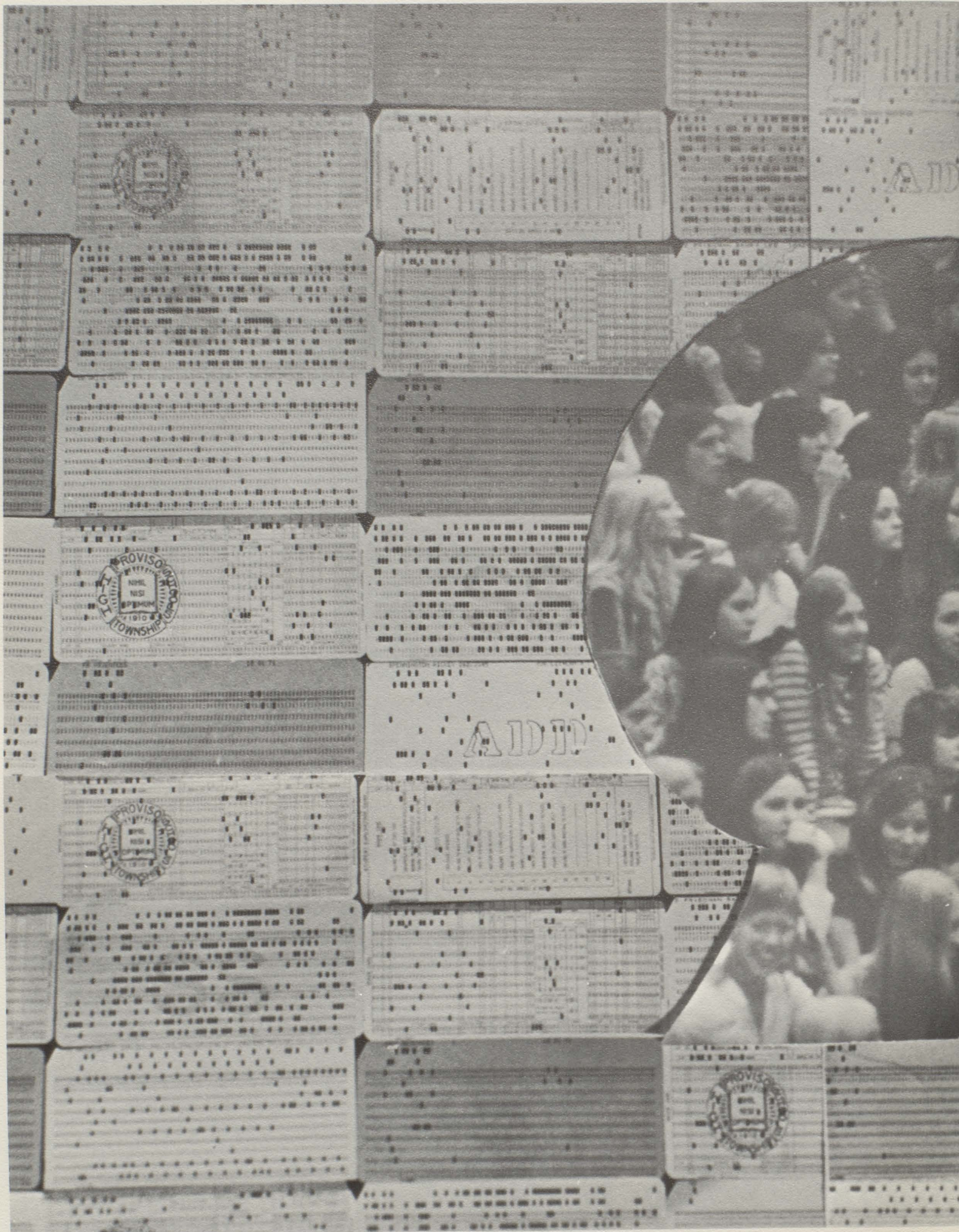
"I think the shool should invest in \$20 for paint and paint the parking lot lines because you can't have people parking horizontal in vertical spaces!" (A Senior).

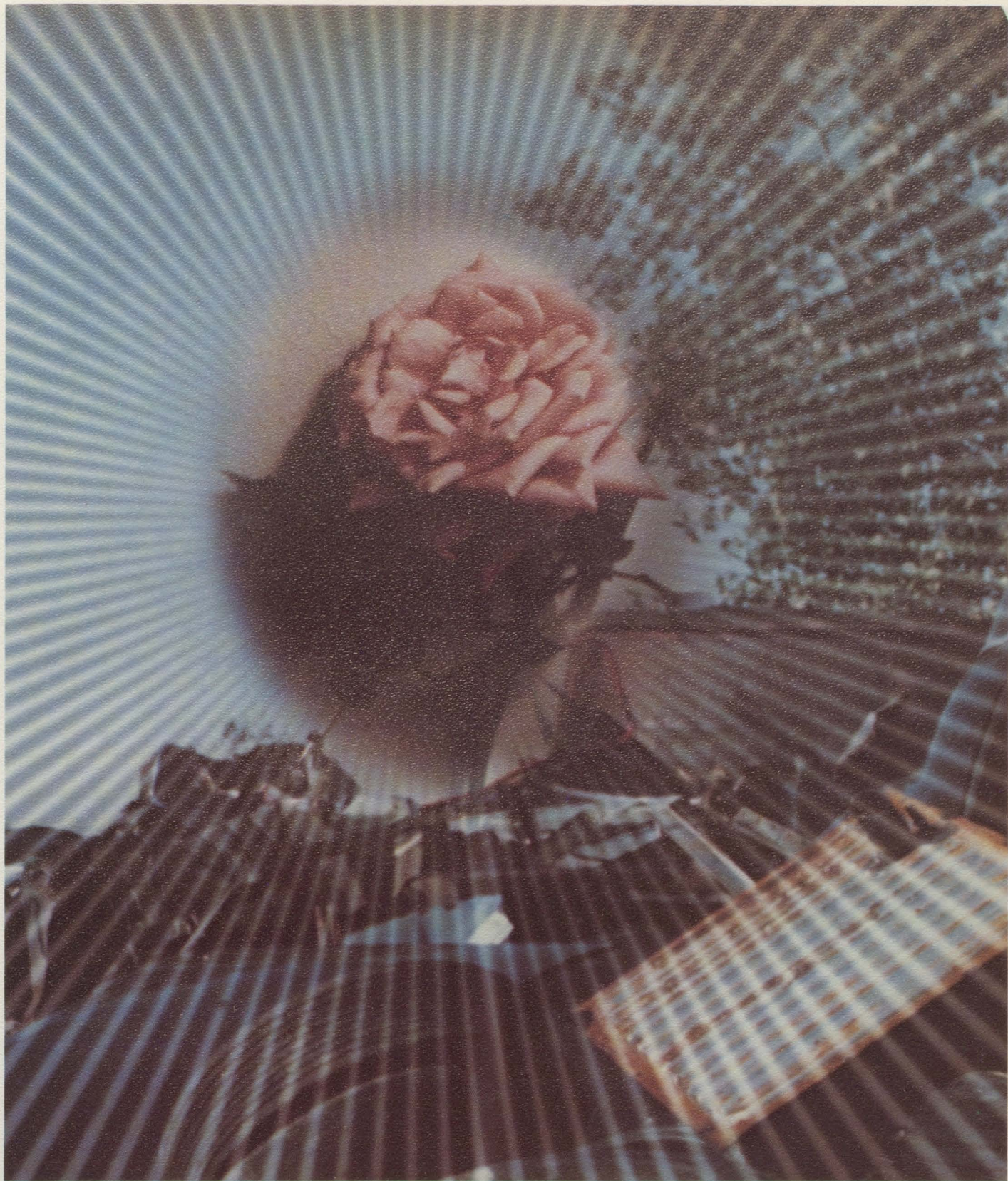
"I feel I have better things to concern my life with. Pollution is a major world problem but one I do not want to get involved in." (Rich Mrazek '72)

"I think pollution has been advertised too much. It is a problem that must be solved but the image created by the communications media is one of black skies, black rivers and seas and people in gas masks. No dice. Pollution is here and now killing. It's mercury in fish, fish in people people dead. It's CO₂, CO, H₂SO₄, HCL gases in air, air in people, people dead. There won't be time for skies to blacken and seas to cloud. The sky and sea will be killing the people who are their oppressors off before they have the chance to see them darken." (Frank Rubino '72)

"I sit and scream about factories polluting my land, but sometimes I catch myself throwing papers out of a car window. 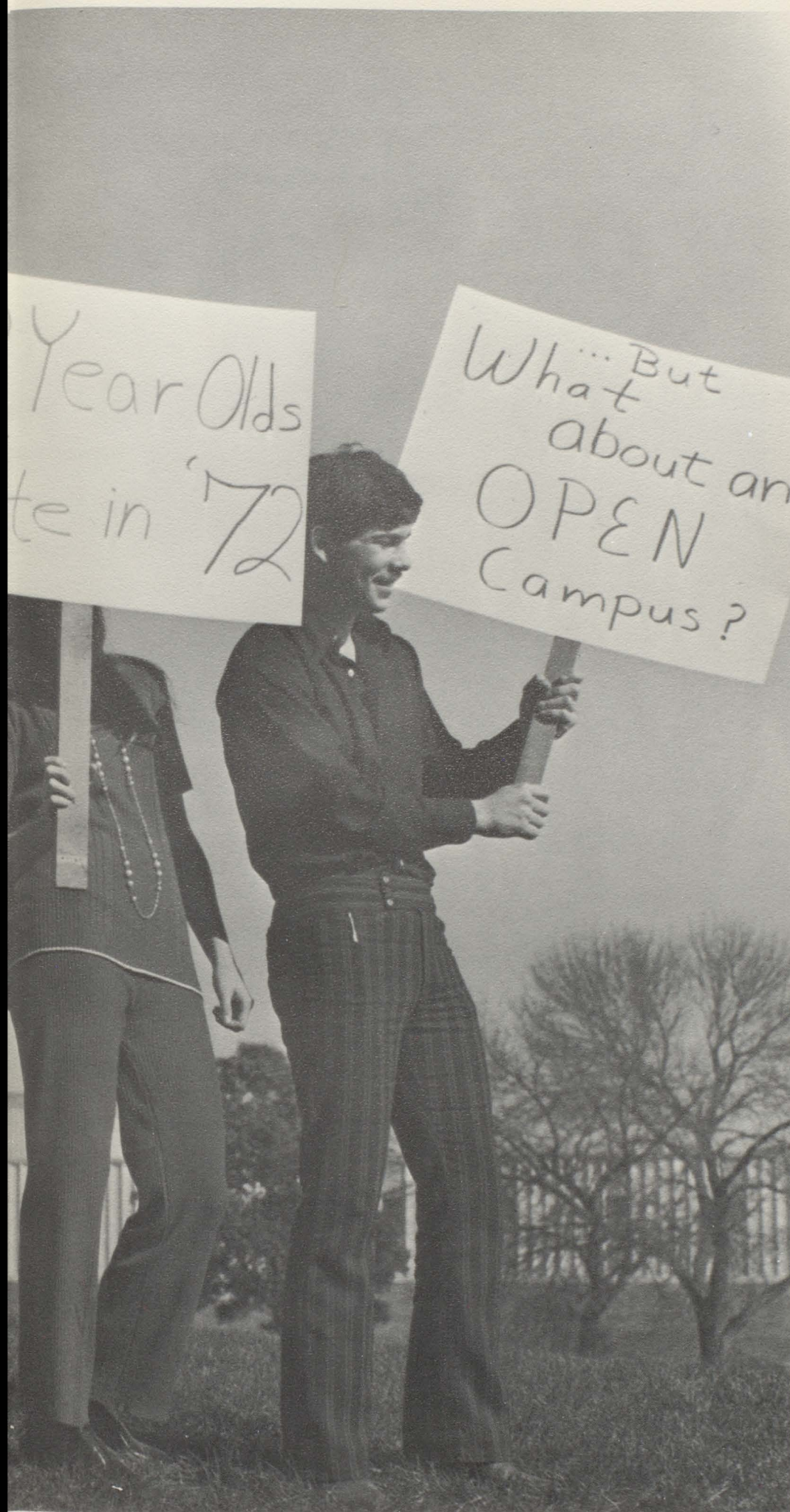

Ditching:

"I think the students should take the responsibility to attend classes without the dean making them." (Jim Hurt) . . . Library Privileges:

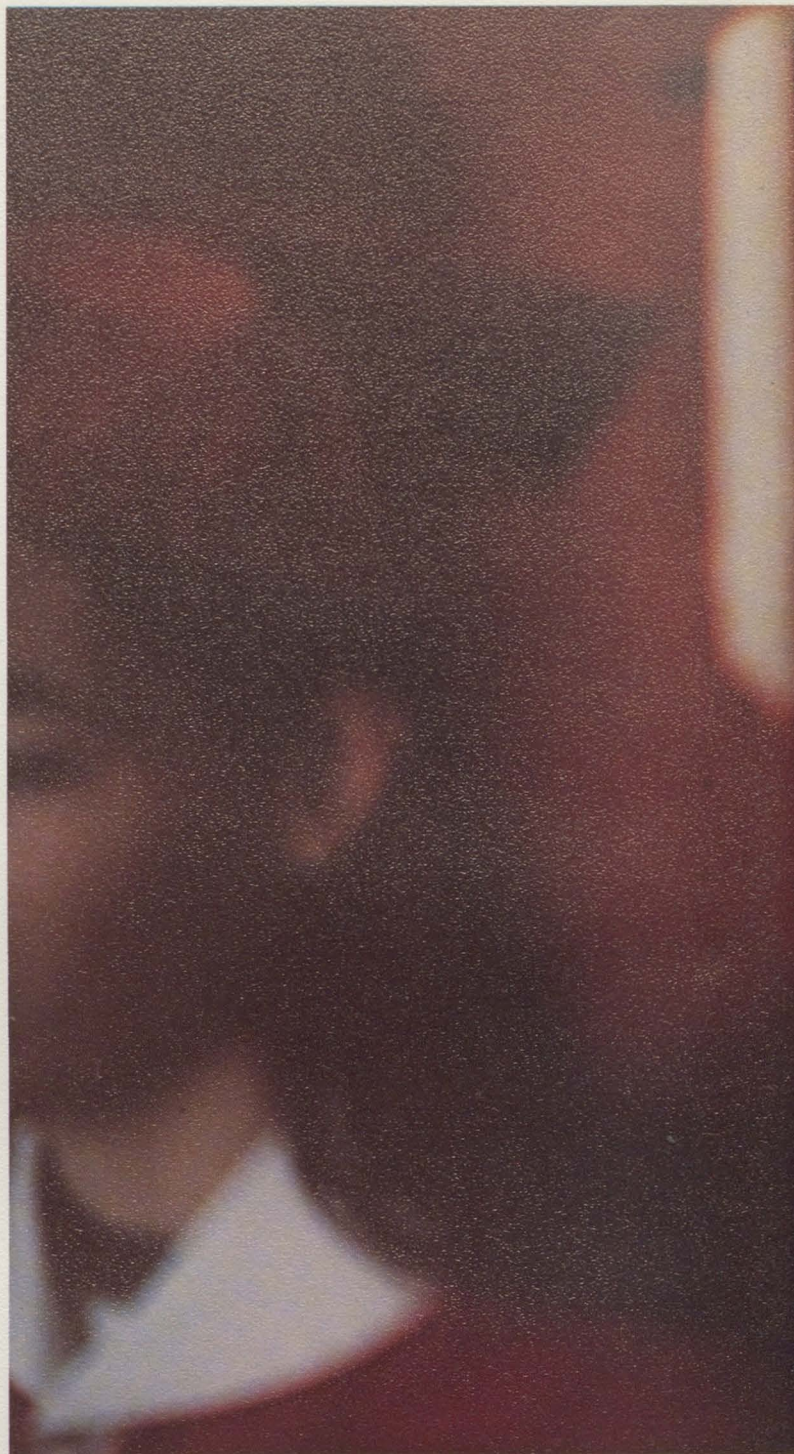

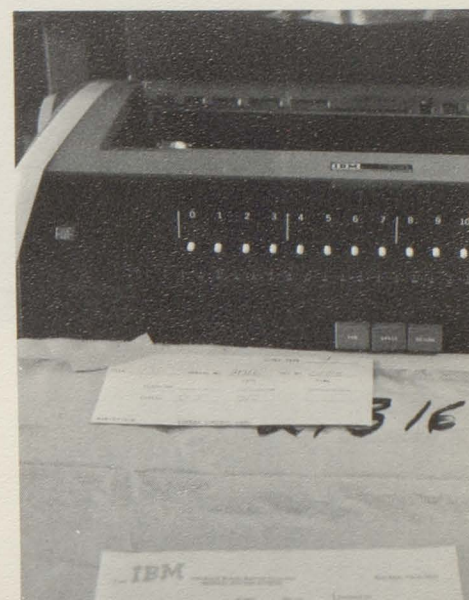
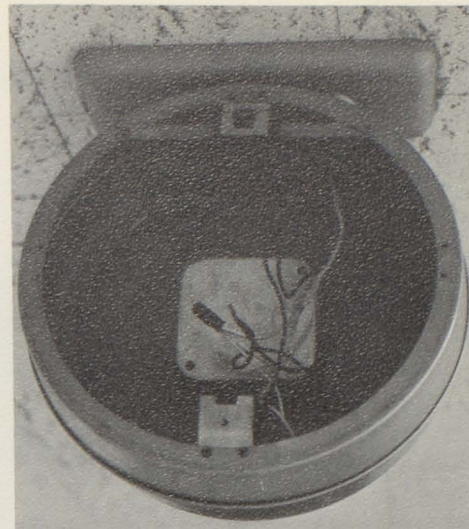
Soccer:

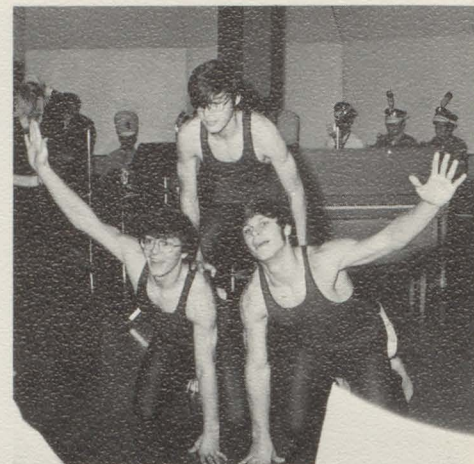
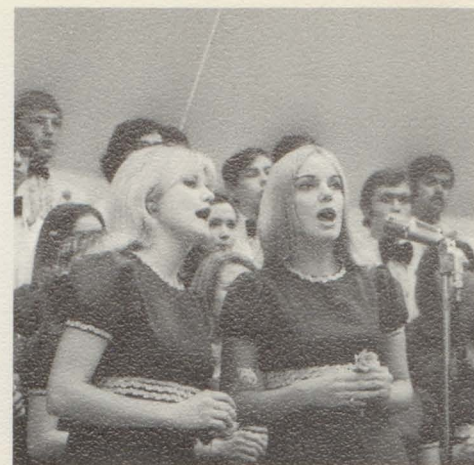

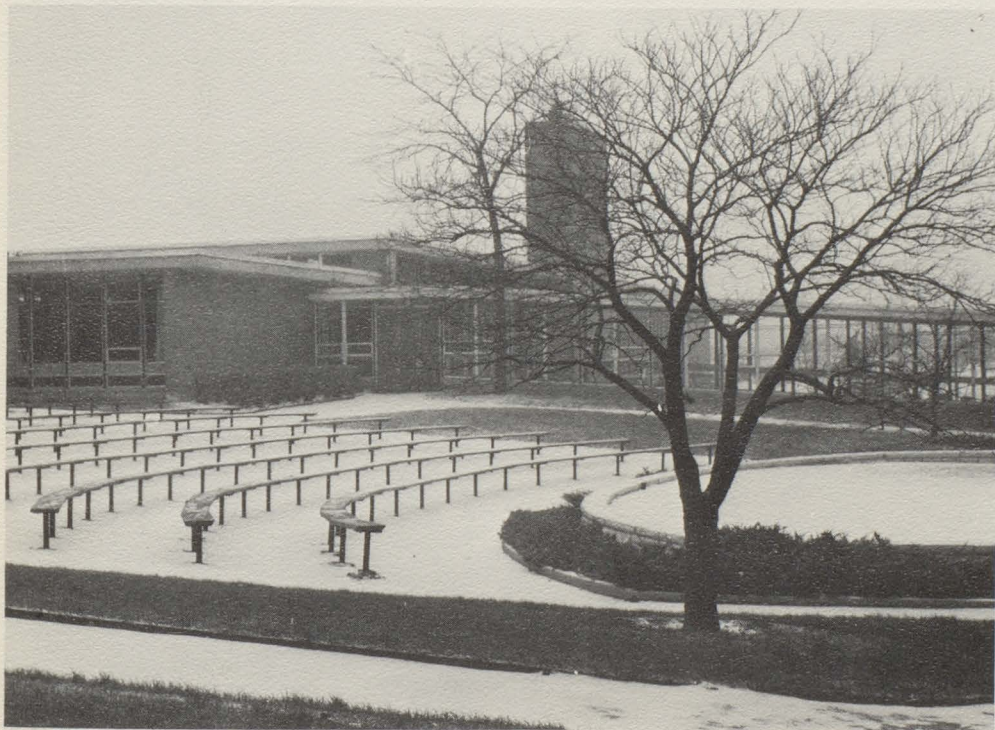
Christmas Vacation:

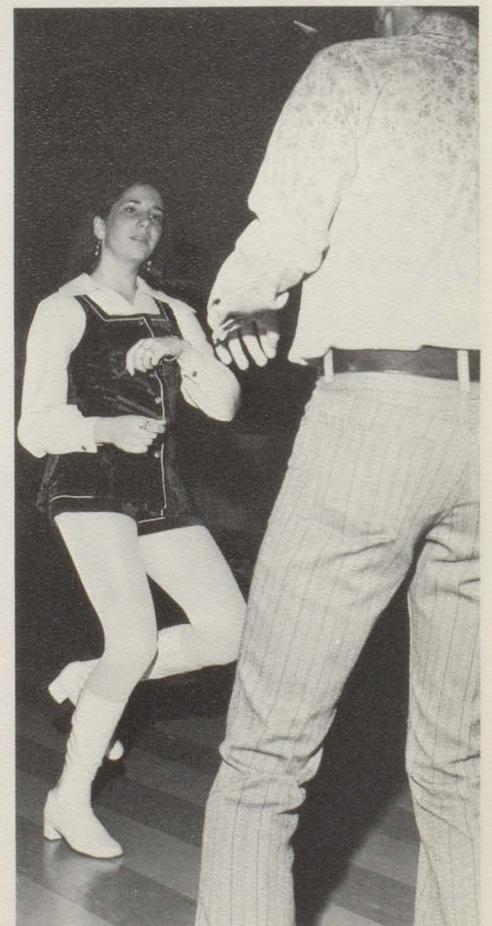
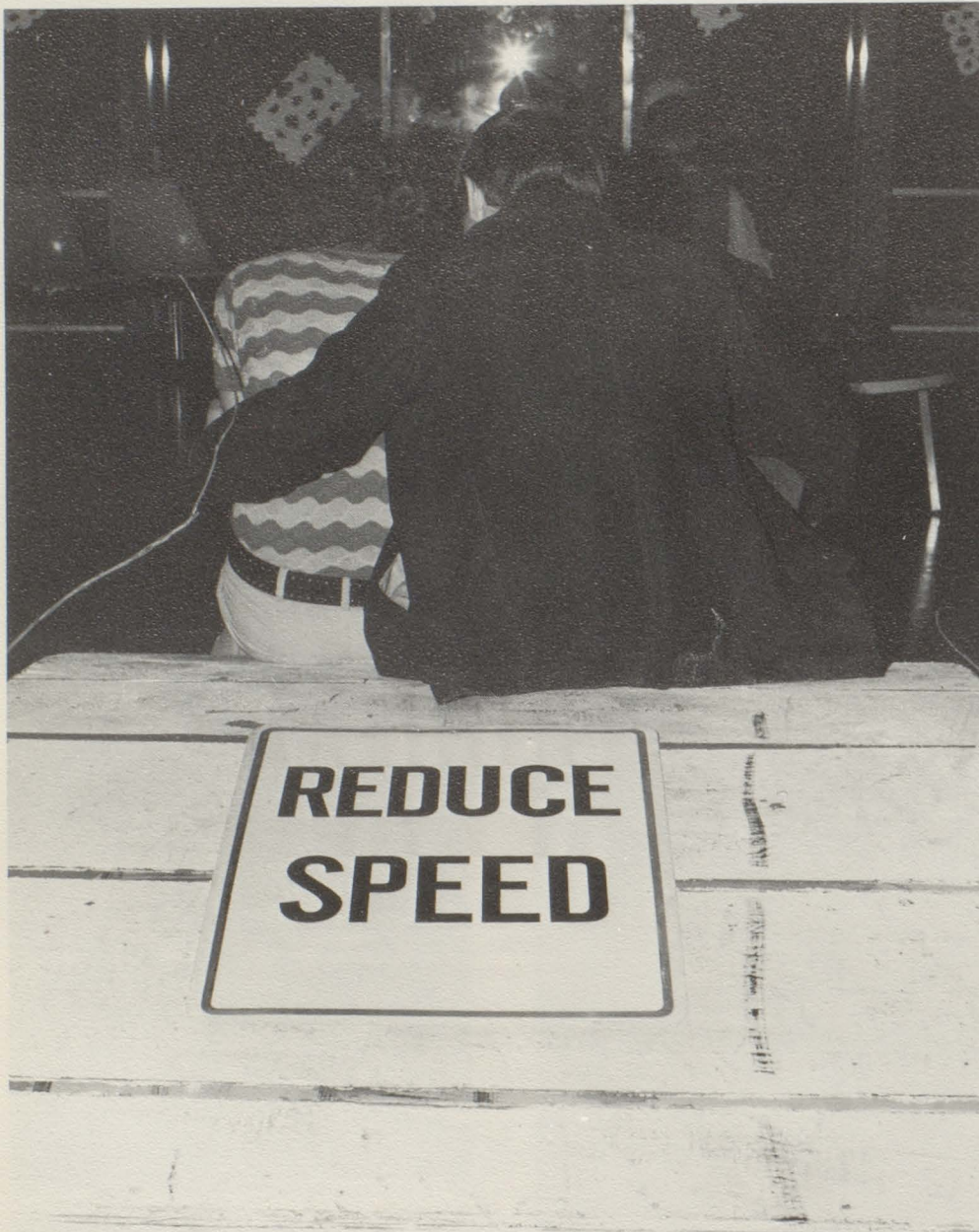
Brand New Hockey Team Earns First

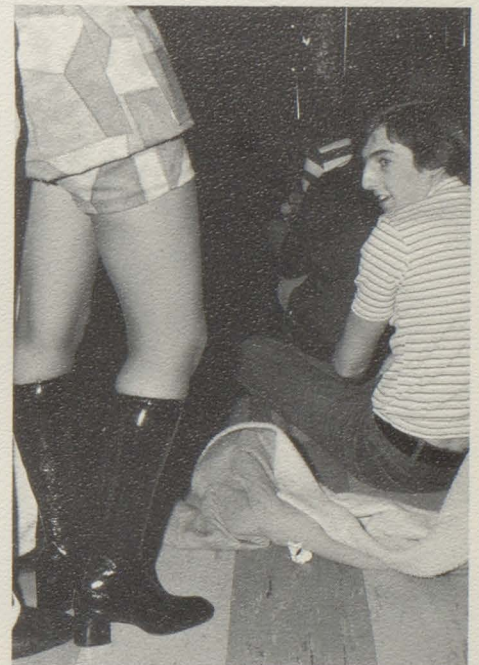
"Nobody Notices What You Have On"

Time: 8:30 P.M.

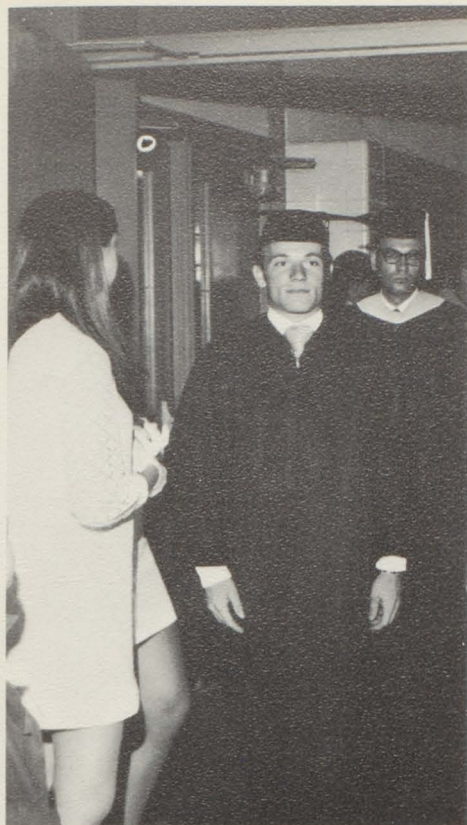
“I think the prom is the best dance of the four years. It's not so much the idea of the dance, but the idea of a last get together with the kids who have really meant a lot.”

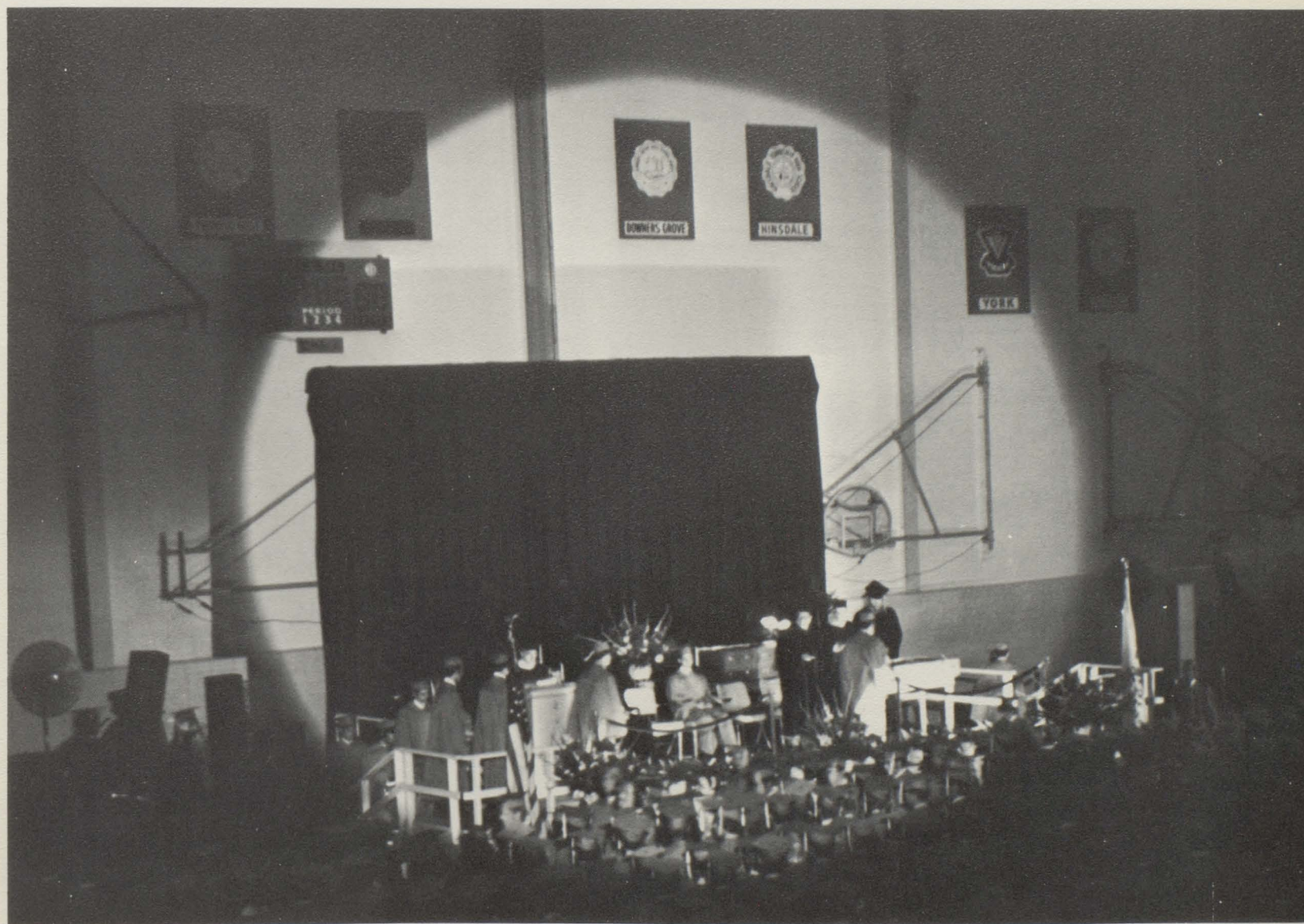
"Graduation is something I have been looking forward to since Fresh-

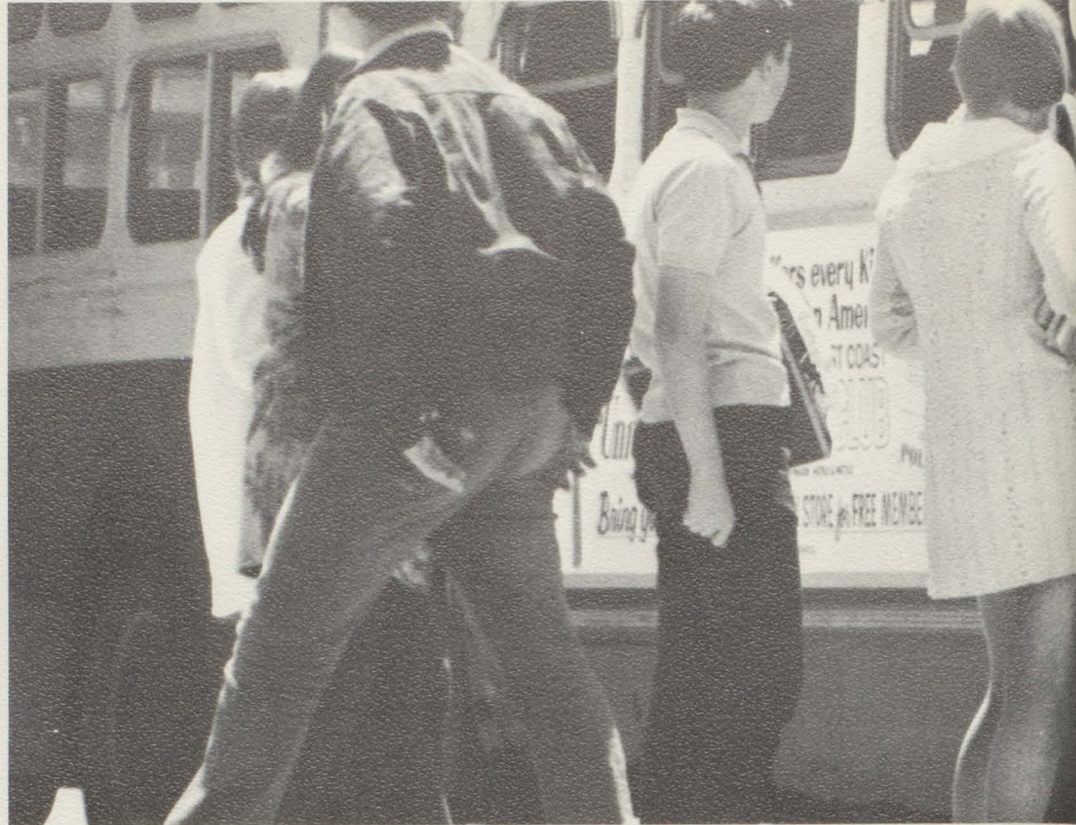
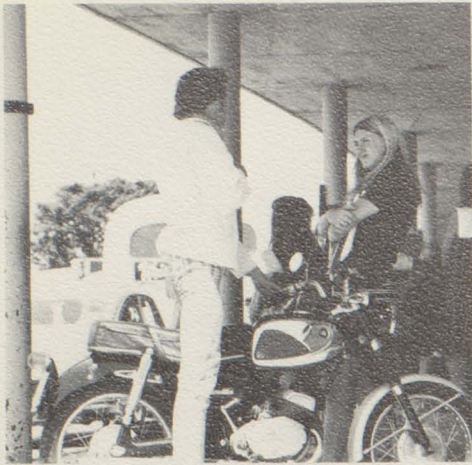
man year. It's not the marching part or the big celebration. It's just getting a diploma and being free. The whole world is different now."

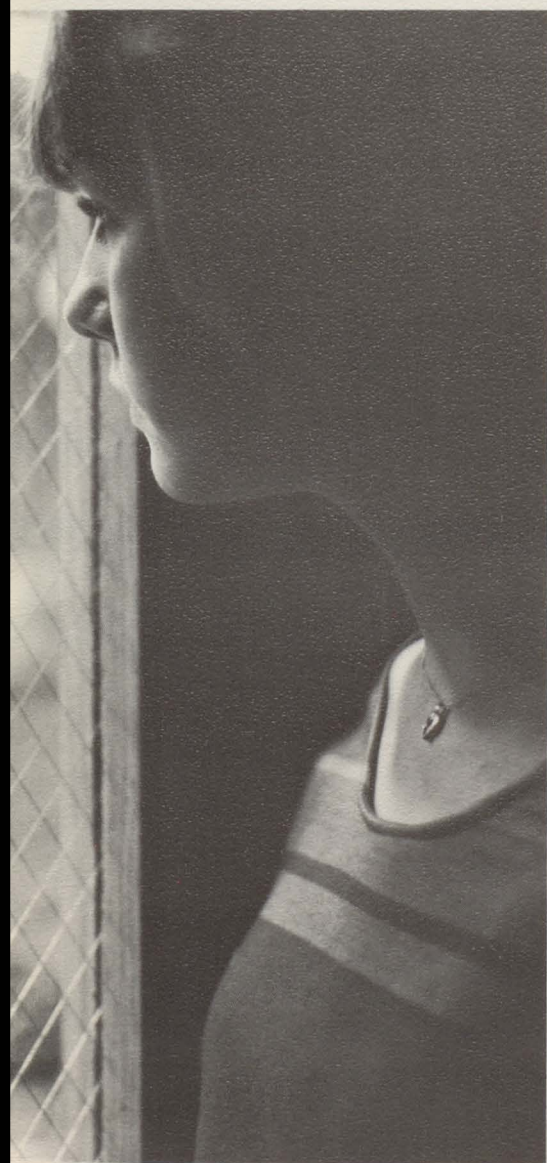


“To See A Proviso Athlete Make An All-State Team — ”

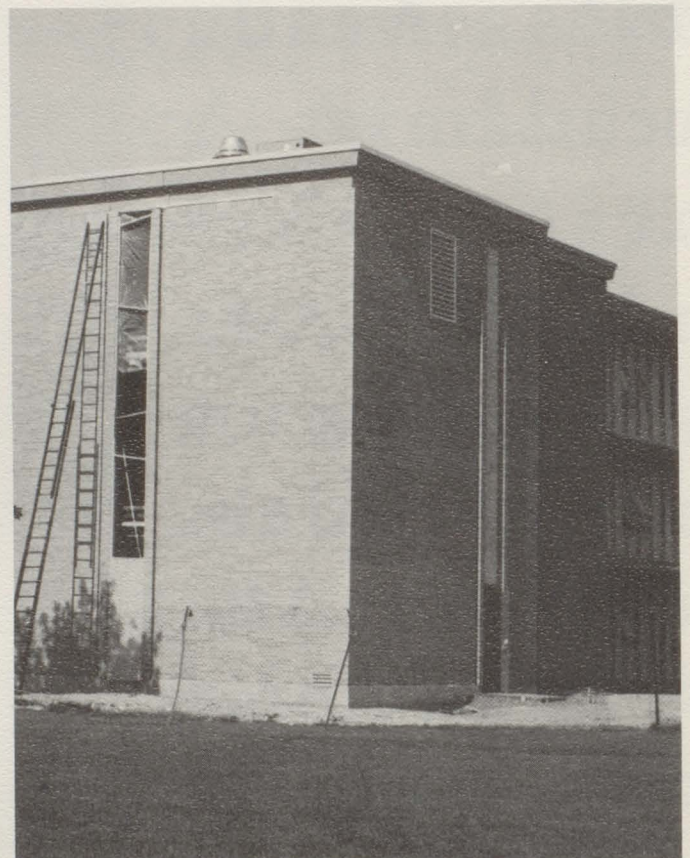

Holt Heads Dist. 209 For Third Year

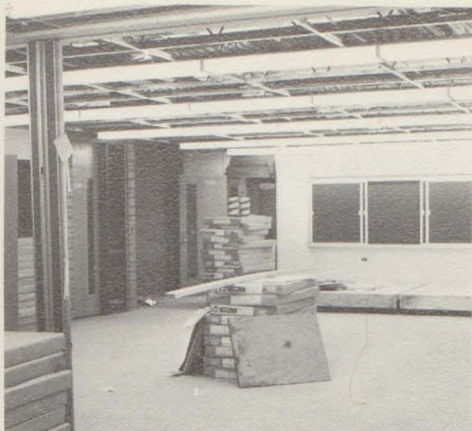
Though he spent part of each Tuesday and Thursday at West, most students probably failed to recognize the tall smiling figure of the superintendent as he walked the halls, or stood talking in the main office. Yet Dr. Charles Holt was the heart and soul of District 209 nevertheless.

In his third year as superintendent he supervised much-needed additions to the physical plants of both schools. The introduction of improved attendance procedures and the expansion of the Early Bird program were additional efforts to meet the challenge of increased enrollments.

District 209's Staff Important to West

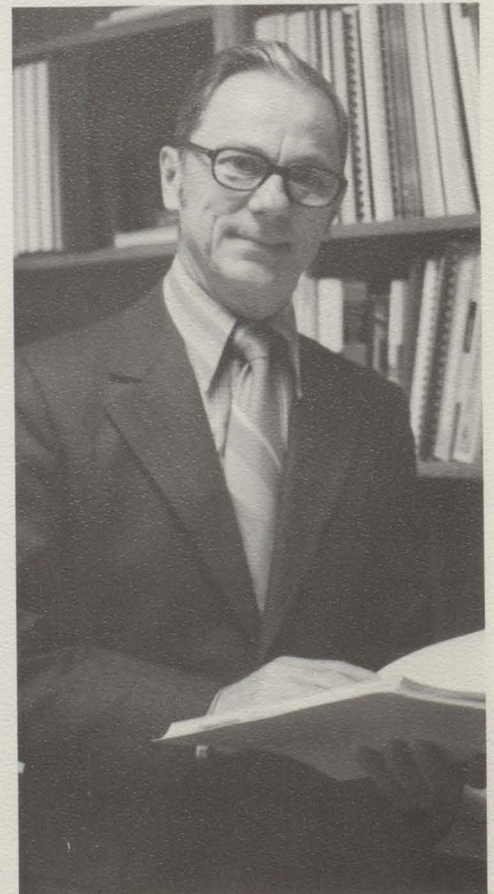

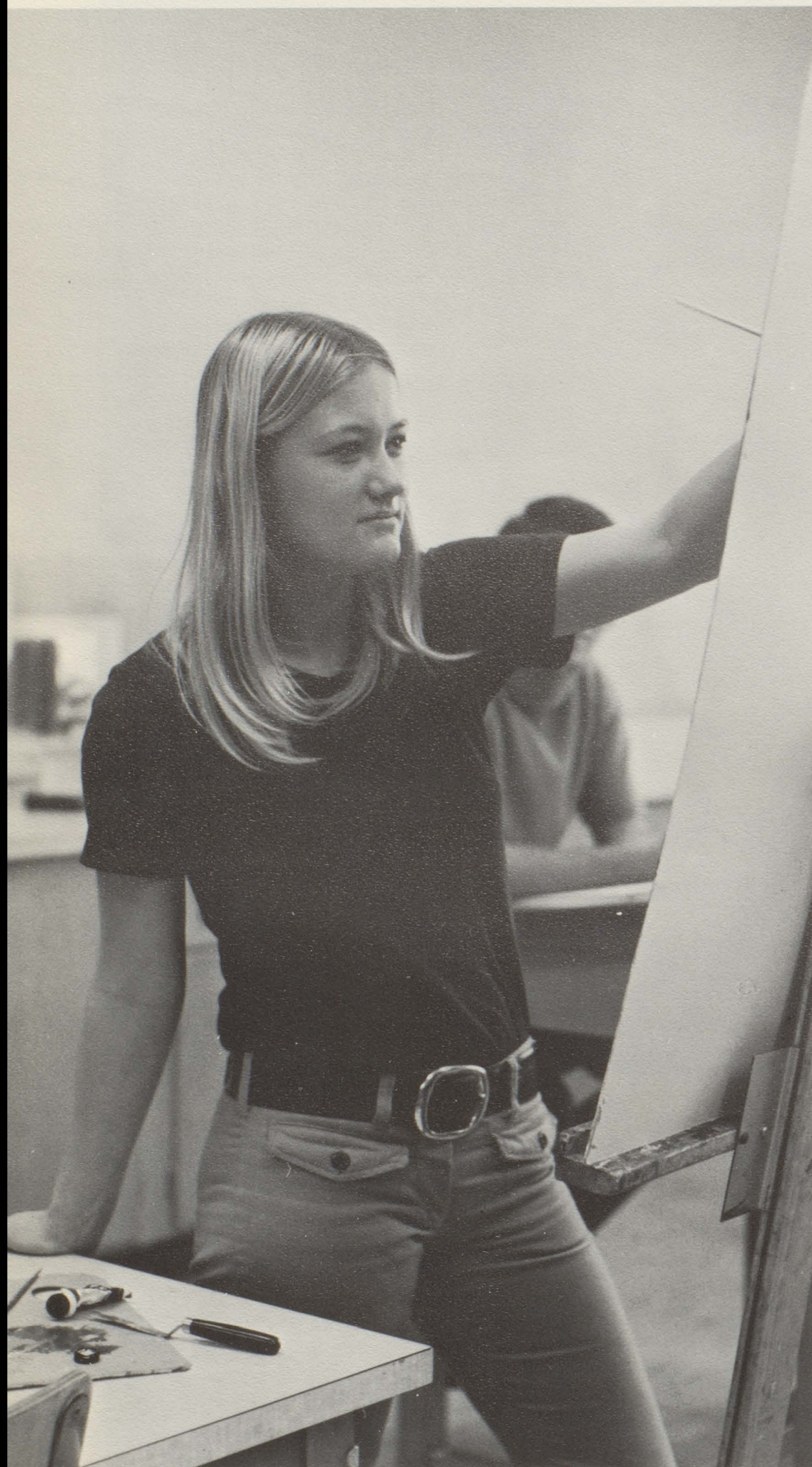

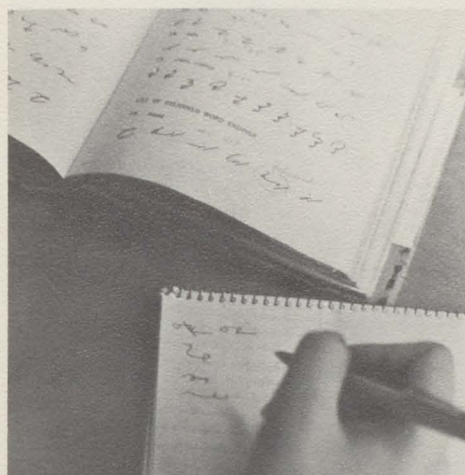

More Than 800 Students Learn to Type

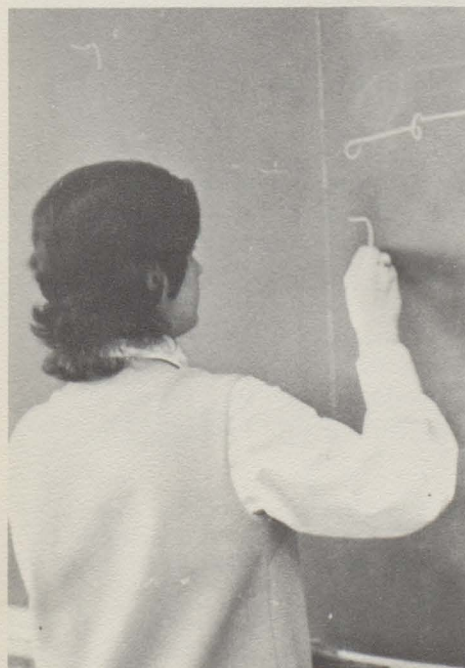


The hall of third floor D-Building echoes every hour of the day with the sharp, staccatto click of typewriter keys where more than eight hundred West students learned to type during the past year. Yet once a typewriter was regarded as a curiosity in an office and all typists were self-taught. So the computer, once viewed as an instrument so complex and mysterious that only a few initiates could deal with it, has moved, like the typewriter into a routine spot in an increasing number of offices and West's Accounting II course was updated this year to include experience in computer augmented accounting.

Once innovations also, work-study programs such as Co-operative Distributive Education and Office Occu-

pations are now regular parts of the business curriculum, providing opportunity this year for nearly fifty students to practice the skills taught in classes and earn at the same time. But work-study is only a small part of the over all program. One out of every three students at West is enrolled in one or more business courses including besides the traditional shorthand and typing, the increasingly popular key-punch and business law, office machines, consumer education, sales and retailing courses.

Like other departments, Business Education is in the process of re-writing its curriculum with the view of making its offerings more relevant and practical.

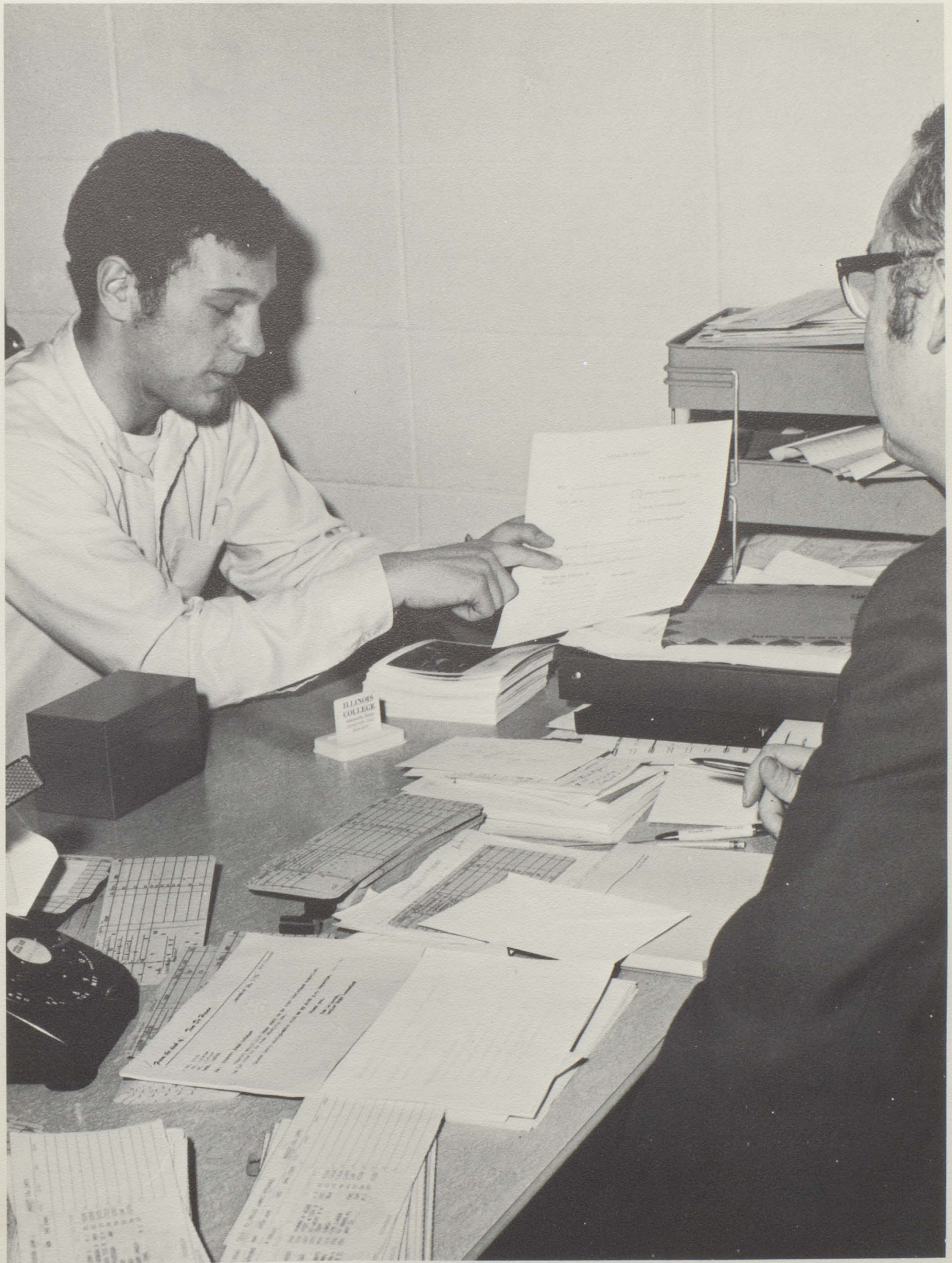
Counselors Try to “Personalize” West

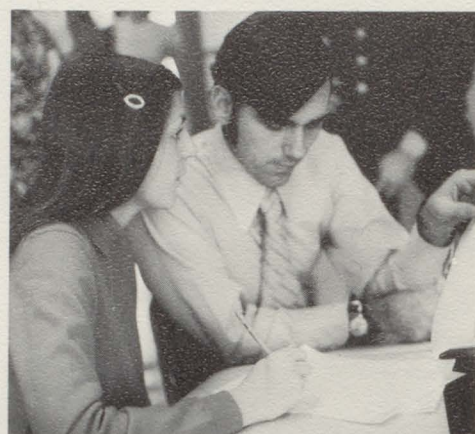
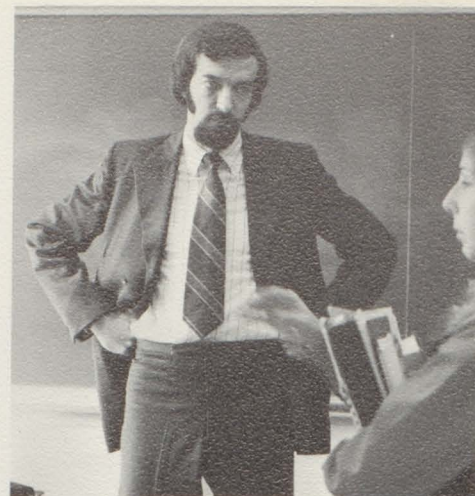

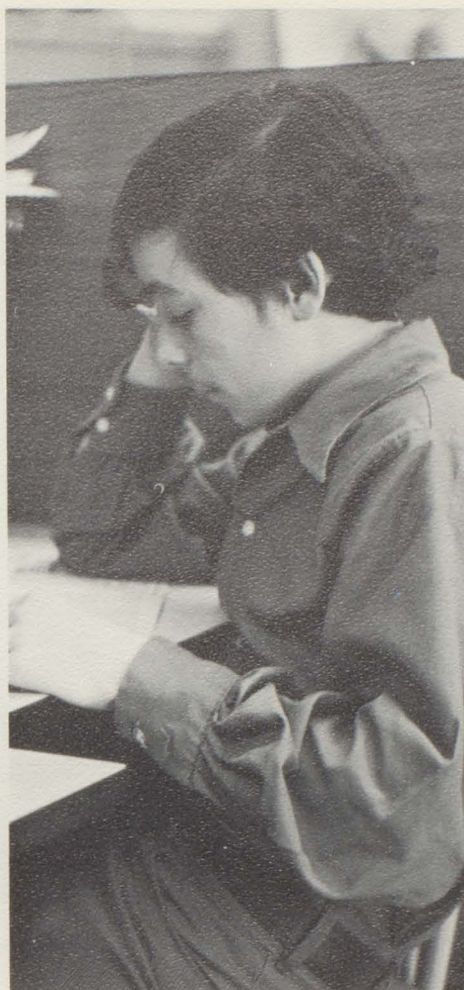
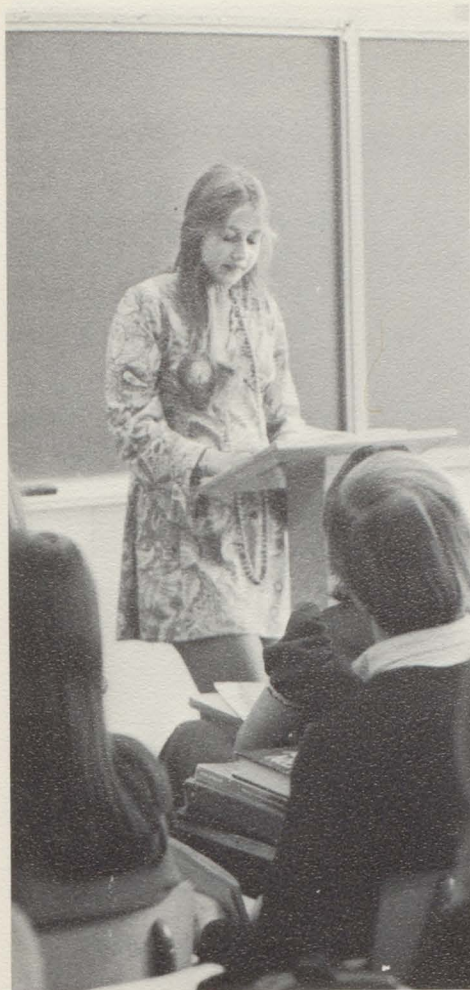
In addition each class had its own dean this year who met regularly with the class counseling team.

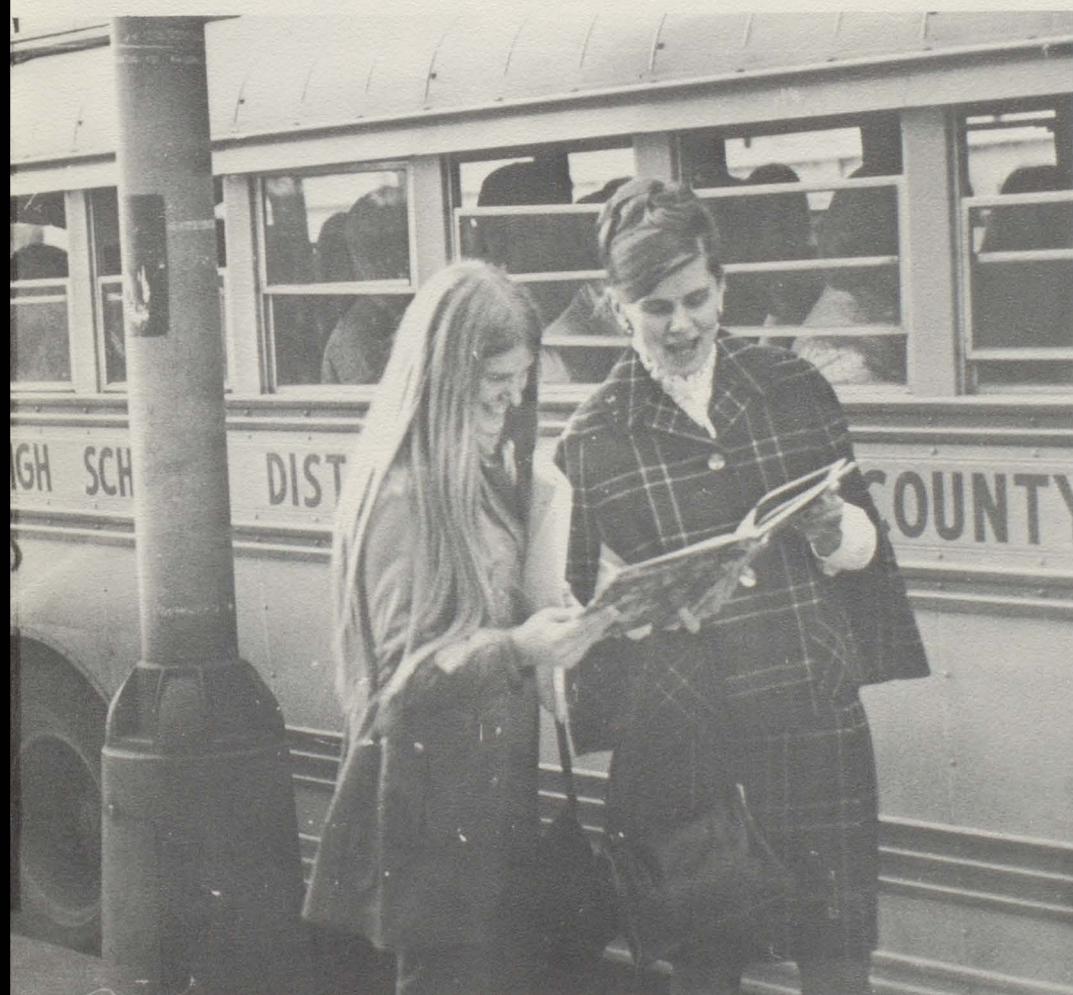
Horizons Widen for English Classes

When is an English class not an English class? This year it was when it turned out to be a social studies or a science class. Moving through the door opened several years ago by the first humanities classes which were taught by English, art and music teachers together, the English department this year joined forces with both social studies and science as well. Nearly a hundred students were enrolled in three new courses which included Core Studies, a combination of English with social studies and science, and American Studies and Development of Western Thought which drew on both English and social studies disciplines.

Contemporary humanities classes planned for non-college-bound students managed to shake themselves out of the strict books and papers format by exploring firsthand the Art Institute and the Museum of Contemporary Art. In addition they attended a performance of 1776 and had a fine day investigating the fine points of Chicago architecture. For many students who have spent their lives only a few miles away, it was the first visit to the Frank Lloyd Wright houses in nearby Oak Park.

Though the Reading Center is no longer news at West, this year it settled into a solid under-pinning for the entire English program since it was used not only by all Junior classes for the usual six-week course but was also made available to the members of all students in basic or special sequences for a five-week period during the year.

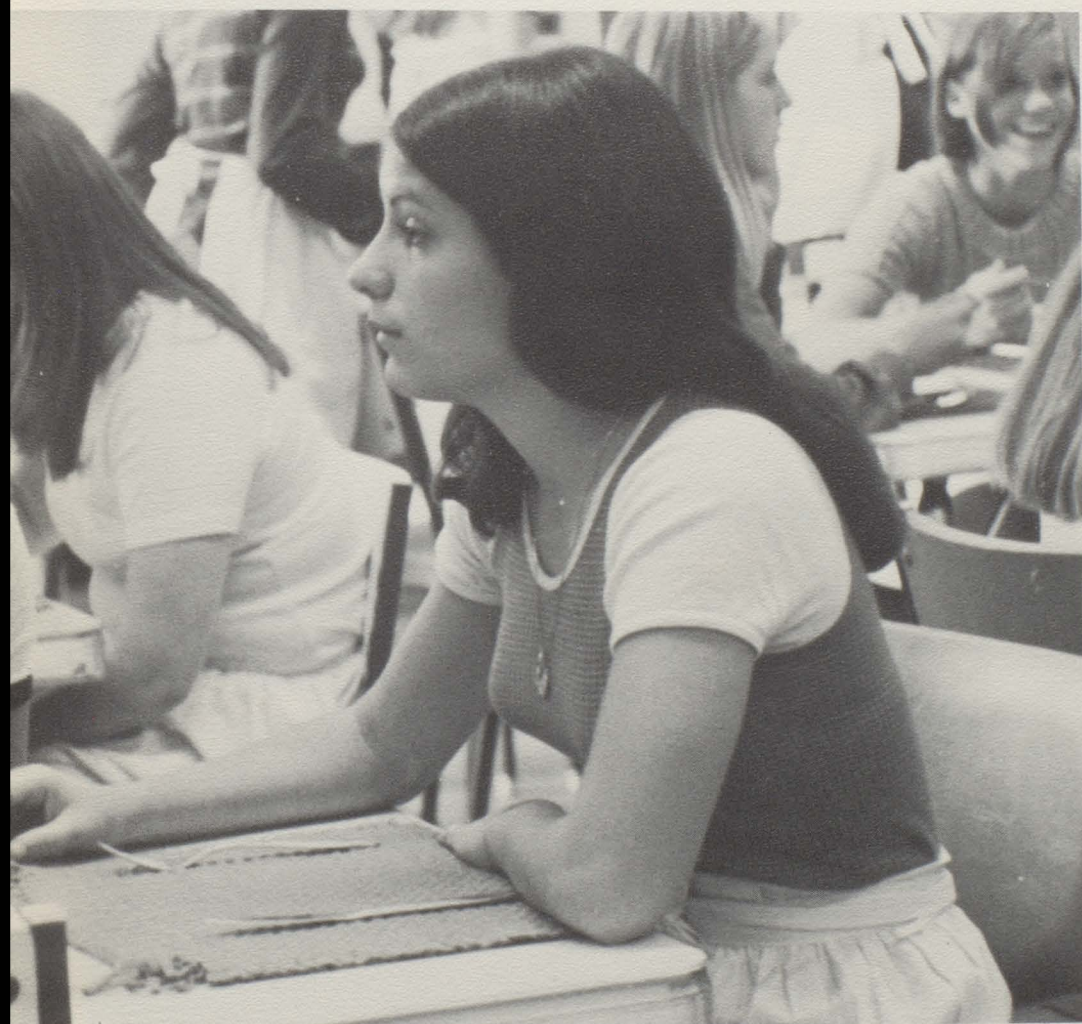

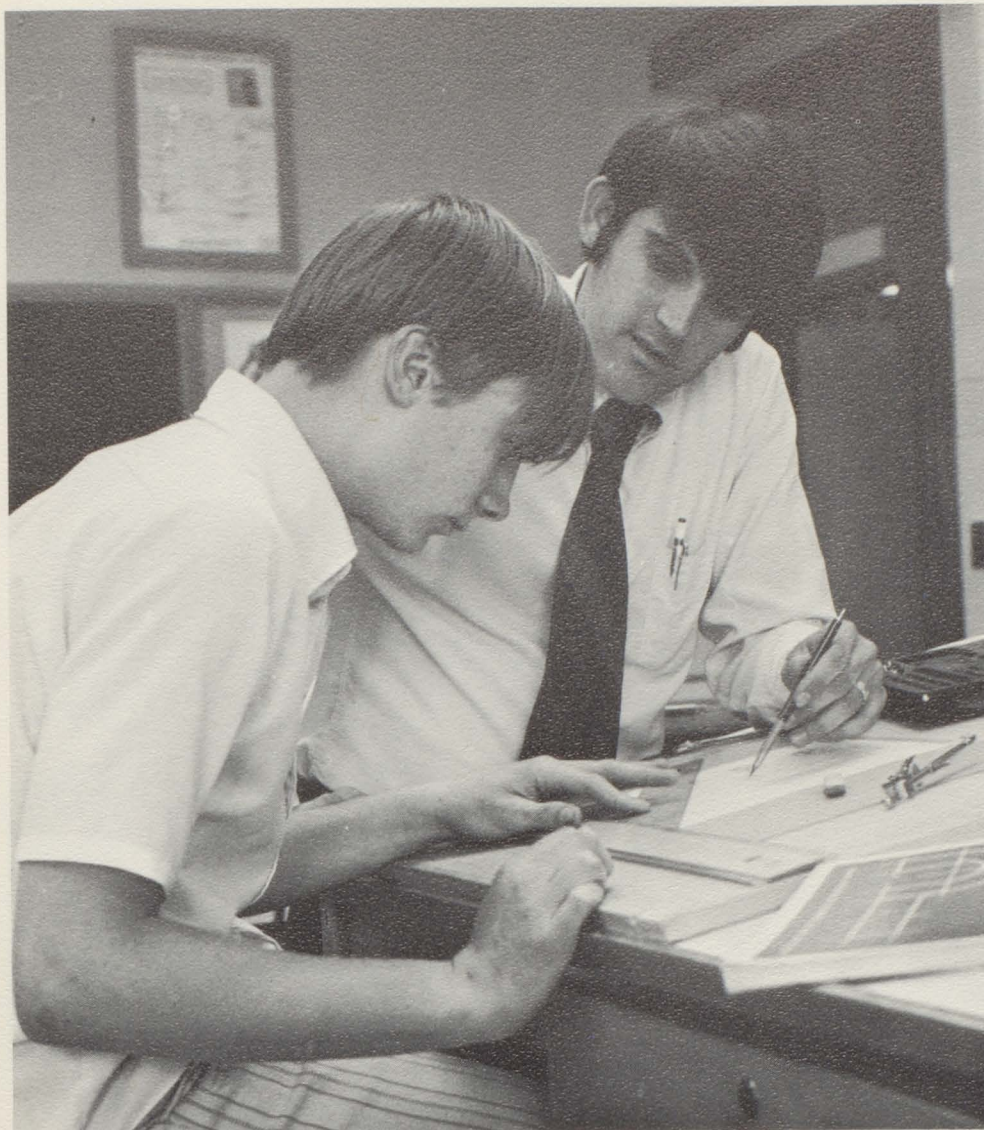
HERO's Home Ec's Newest Contribution

Sharply tailored slacks, sweaters that could have come from an expensive boutique, carefully planned meals — these are routine Home Economics Department concerns. But though the tight budgets which plagued all departments at West this year brought an end to the traditional Christmas tea, Home Ec managed to add a whole new program. Entitled HERO for Home Economics Related Occupations, it gave nearly twenty students a 2-credit work-study experience in stores, restaurants and as nurses' aides.

There's Lots of Action in *E*-Building

Motors whirr, presses thump and in the big, bright drafting rooms pens move across tightly stretched paper with exquisite precision. The Industrial Education department is a place where books are only a minor part of the daily activities. In fact this year course titles were altered to reflect a new emphasis on vocational instruction since Federal support for many courses has prompted a more realistic approach — a more genuine work type experience. And, though meat tenderizers and wall decorations were still turned out at the elementary level, sophisticated instruction in several different fields was available in advanced classes.

That the need for such instruction is appreciated is evidenced by the fact that auto mechanics and auto theory classes were able to choose their twenty or so members from among as many as 75 applicants. West's unique advanced drafting class which meets for three hours a day was also quickly filled, while enrollment in engineering graphics has quadrupled in the past four years.

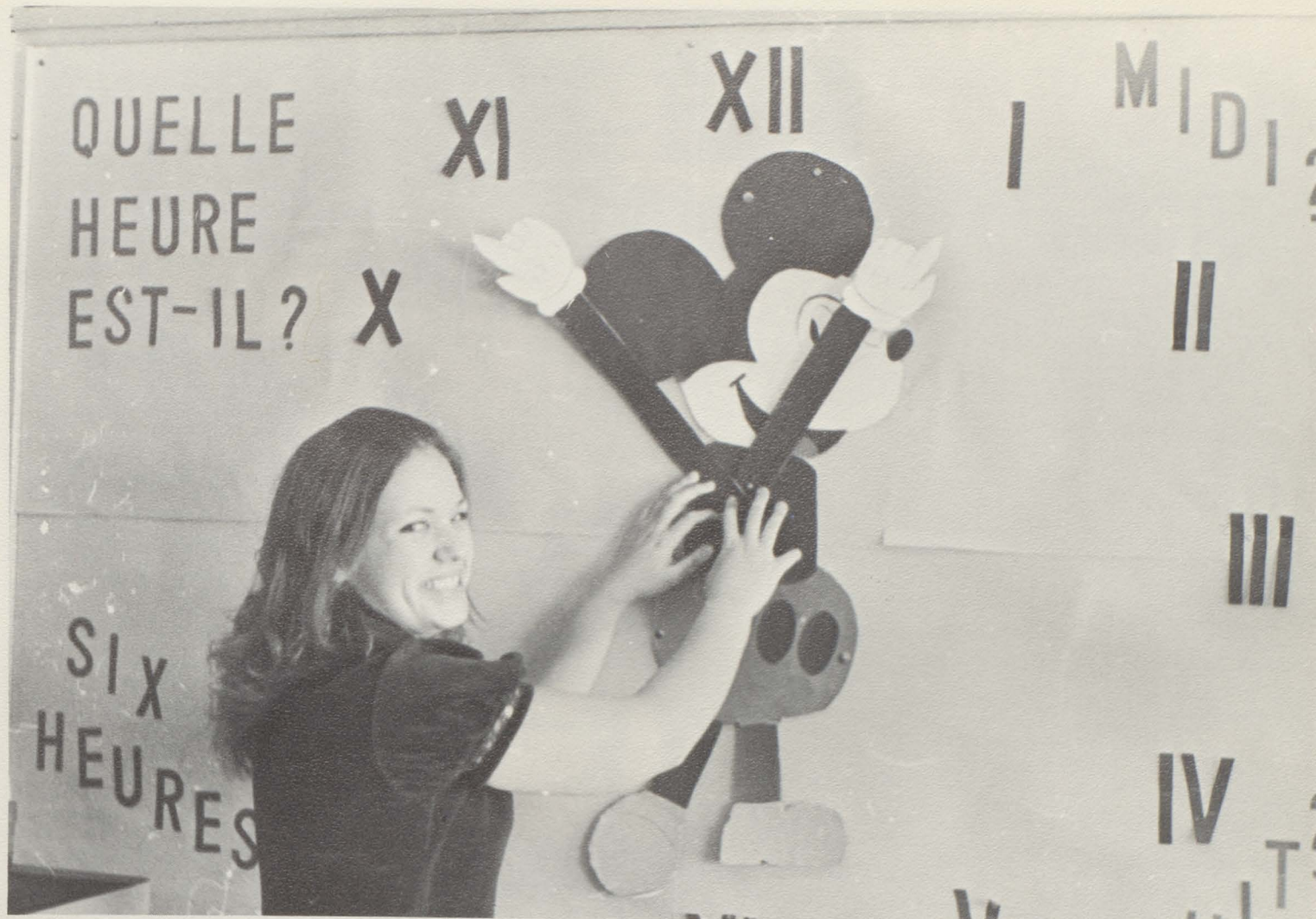
To the million-dollar shop facilities of West are added those at East so advanced work in metals and graphics can be done with the most modern machines, including computerized type-setting.

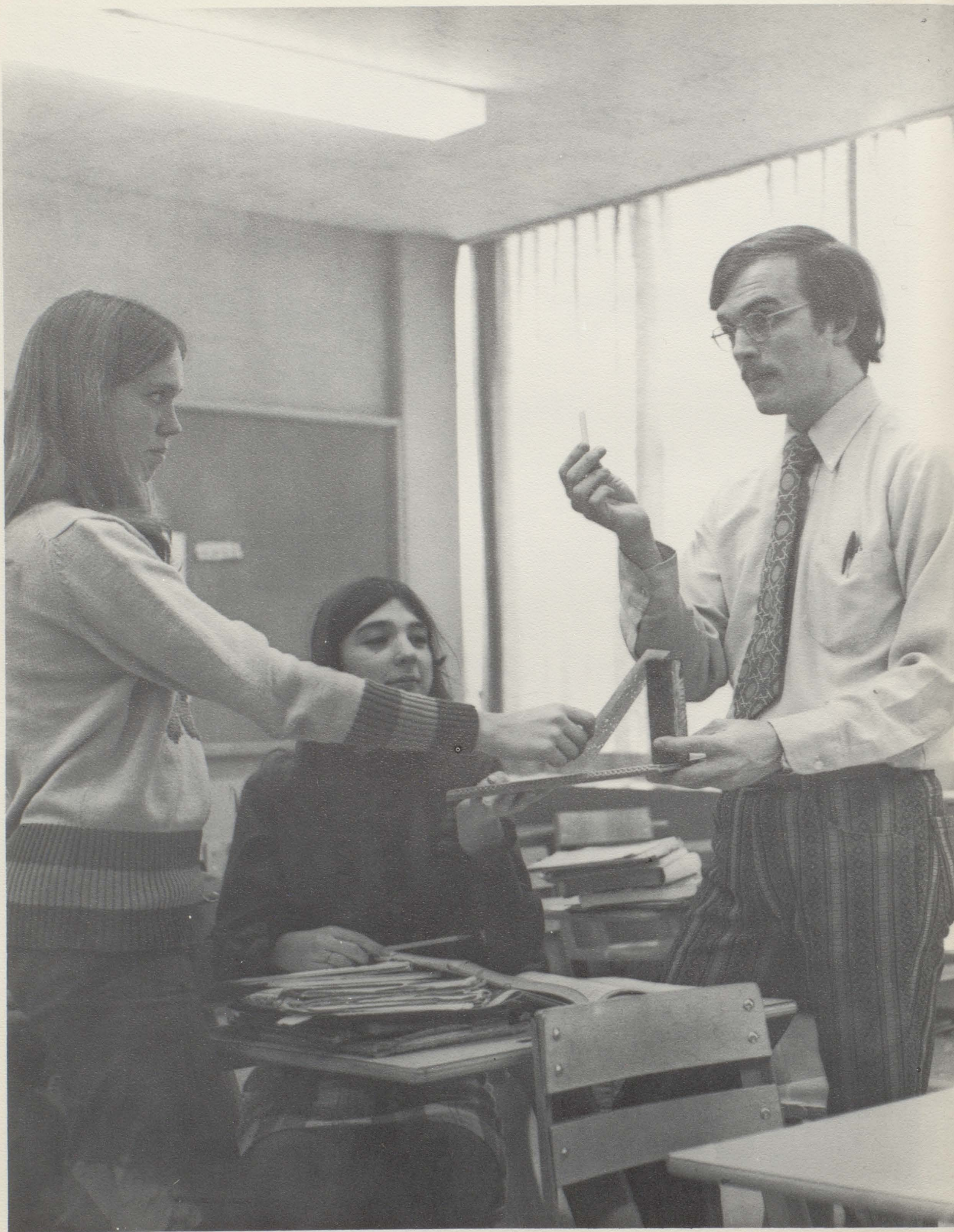
West Says Goodbye to Cicero and Caesar

Response, as would be expected, was mixed. Some students found the experience rewarding, others confusing.

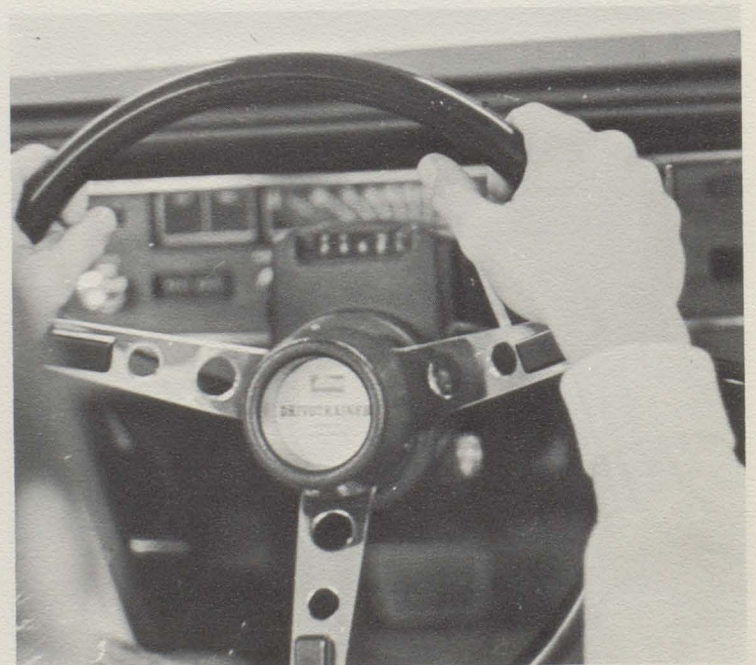
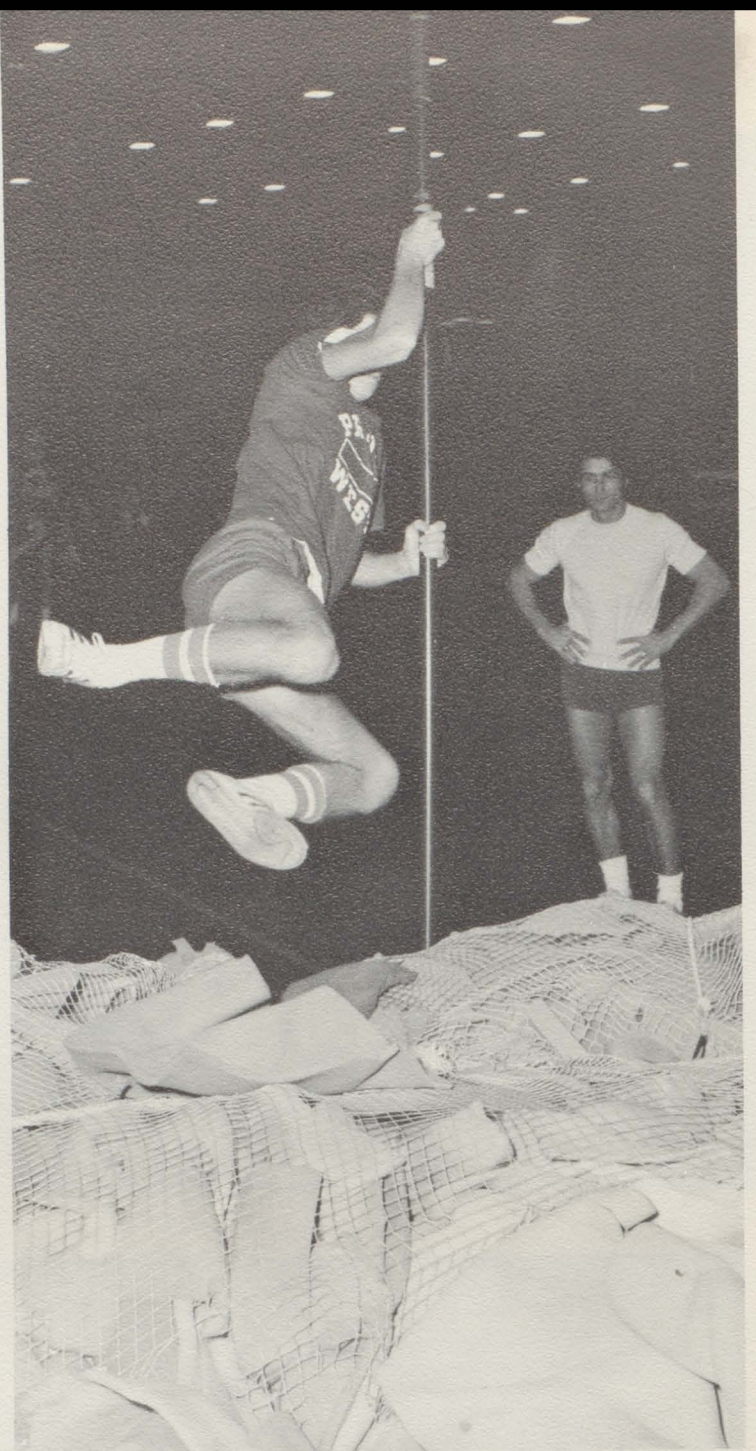
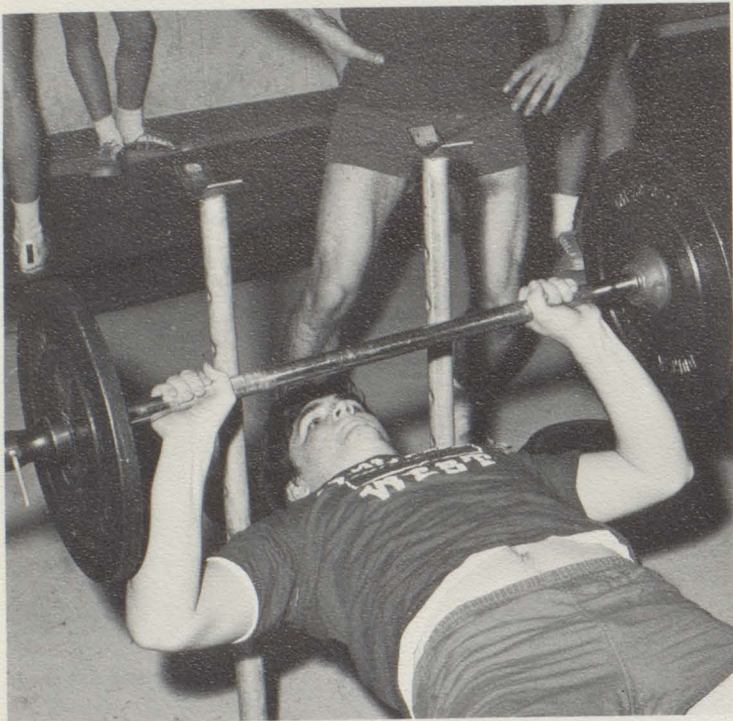

New Drivotrainers Open New Roads

In the mechanized, technological word of the '70's A-Building and the field house represent something that might be considered a bit old-fashioned. There are no motor-scooters on the track — it must be negotiated with nothing but muscle and lung power. No elevator is available to lift the fifty-pound weights or flip a limber hundred and fifty pounds of man over the high hurdles. The Physical Education Department still views the human body as a piece of equipment worth time and effort to put into shape and to maintain.

P.E. classes are varied and there are even special modified activities

for those not physically capable of the standard exertion. Activities range from postural conditioning and floor exercises through team sports, swimming and gymnastics to individual instruction in recreational sports such as golf, bowling, and tennis.

Also a part of the PE program are health and safety classes and the driver training program which last year provided under-the-wheel instruction for more than 700 students. The installation of fifteen new driving simulators made this instruction even more worth while.

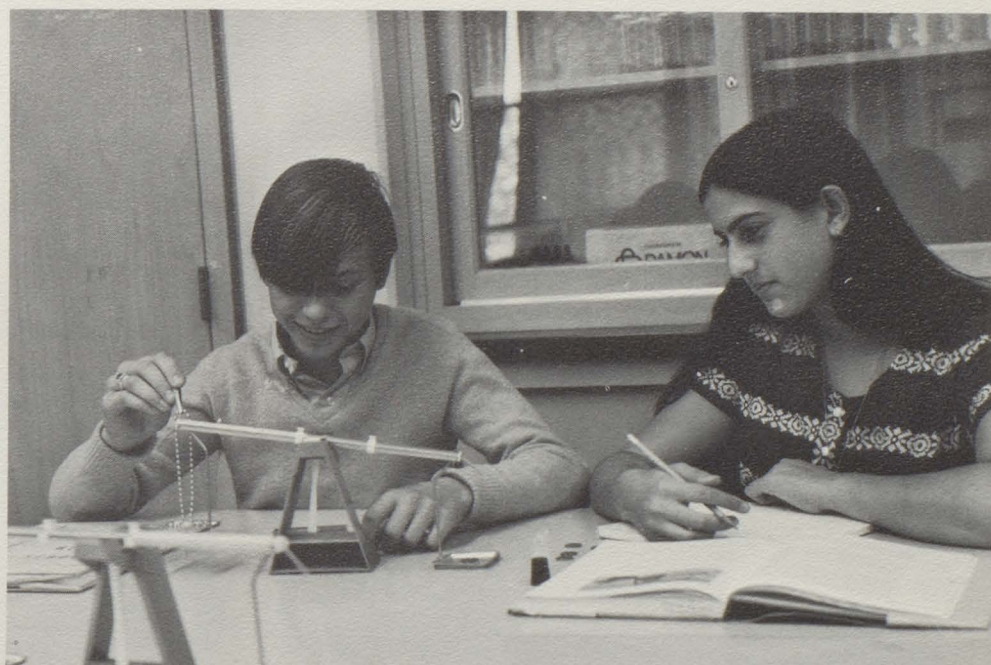
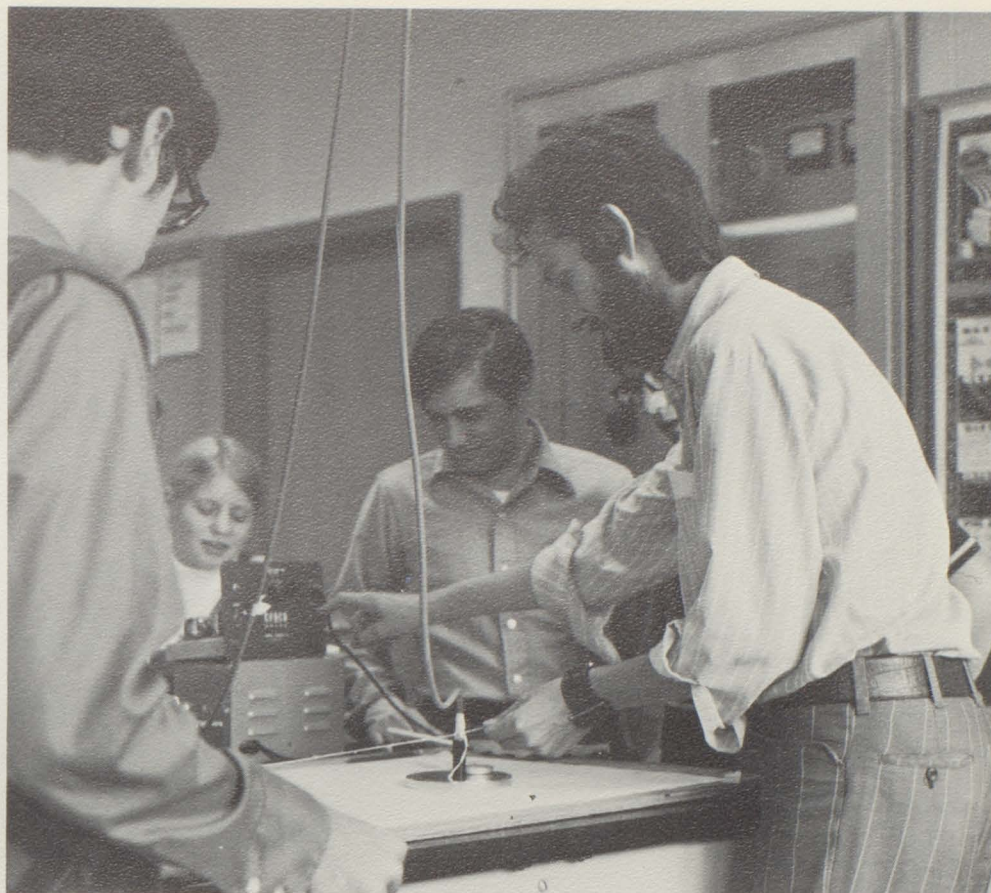
Project Physics Provides For Personalized Investigation

Following the student-directed learning trend which was much in evidence throughout West this year, some 110 juniors and seniors enrolled in Project Physics. Under Mr. Kenneth Williams' deceptively casual guidance they had the opportunity to explore independently the basic concepts of motion, light, electricity and

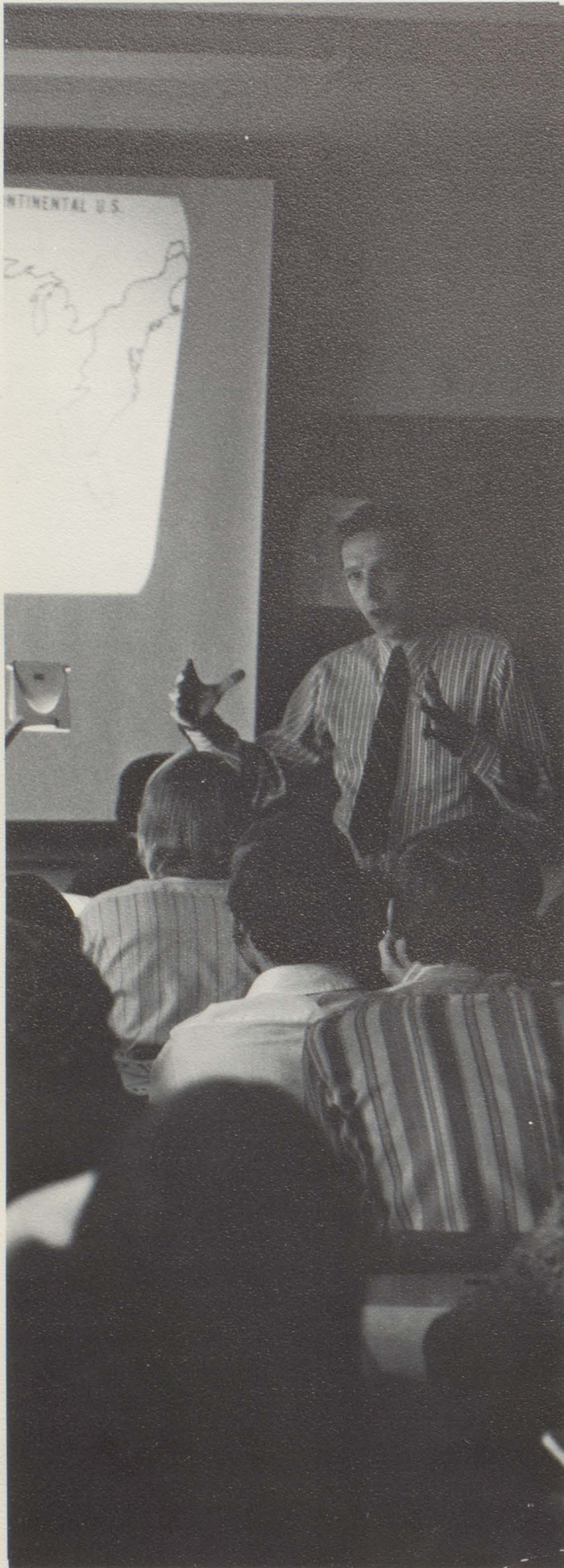
so on.

Breaking with the traditional tightly structured pattern of labs and lectures, project students were able to choose among several experiments in each area and were allowed to work in depth when interest prompted, or to do only minimal work in other situations.

"I don't know whether I'll know everything I should when I go into Senior Science next year," one Junior commented, "but equations mean a lot more than they did and I think I can figure things out better for myself."

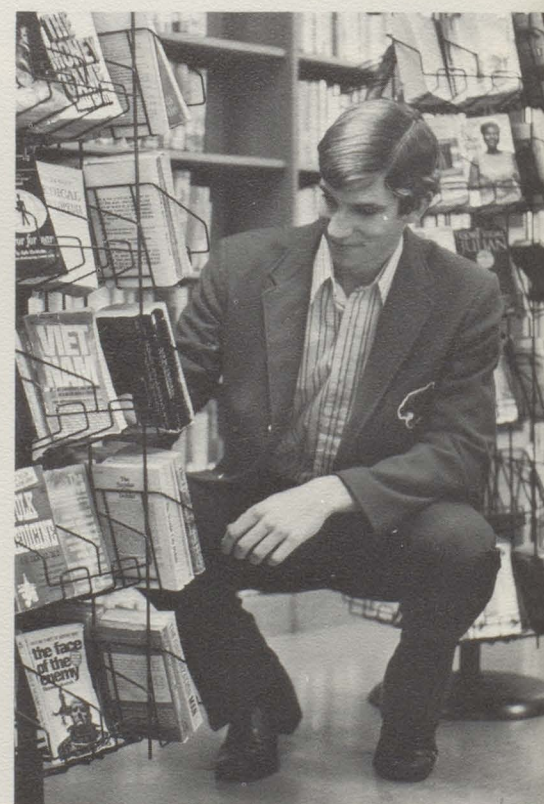
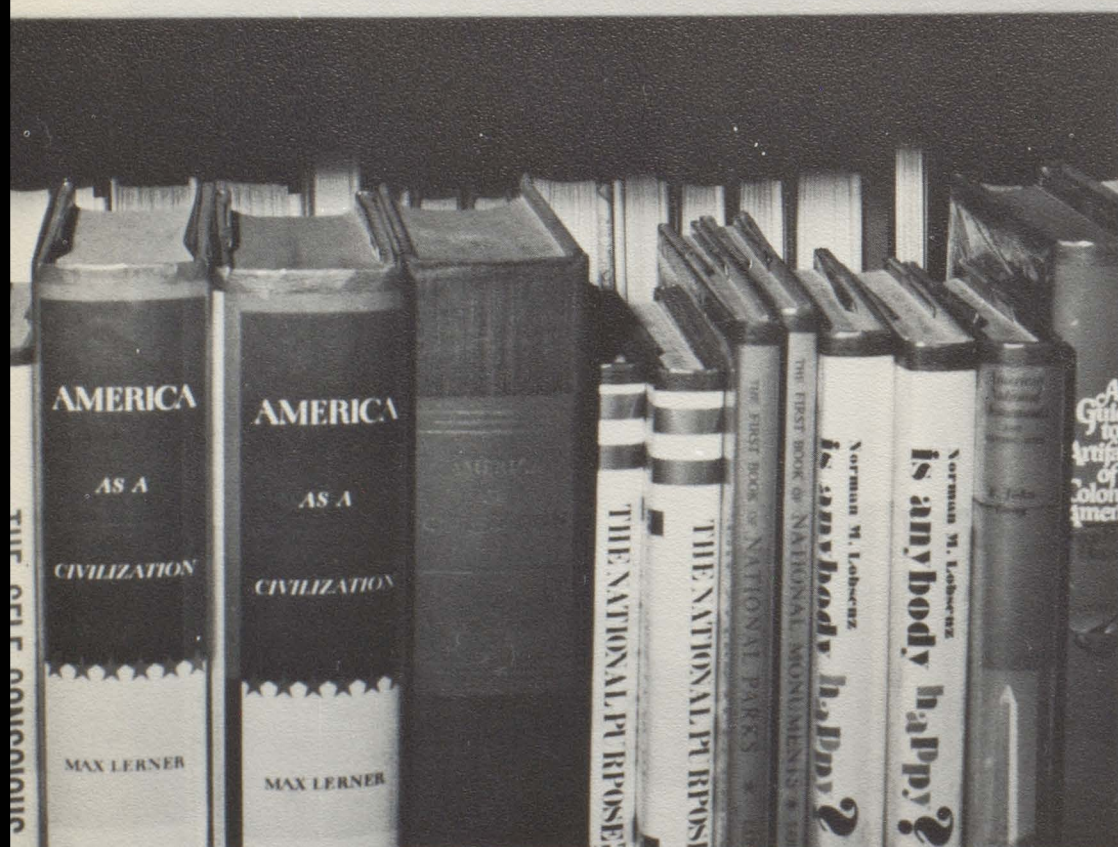
Special Services Make Things Easier

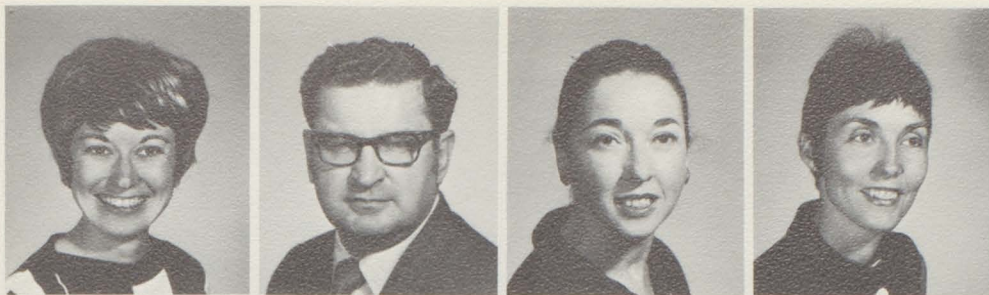
Use of the library increased to spectacular levels this year. Time was when the big, bright rooms were hushed and almost empty most periods. This year with the new no-pass, first come, first-served policy and the large number of student directed learning classes there was scarcely an empty seat during any period from first to seventh. The first four months showed four times as many books and magazines had been circulated compared to the same period last year.

Audio visual services outgrew their basement quarters and found new additional room in A-Building where the mass media and humanities courses kept their services humming.

The reading center was integrated into the total English program with most students given an opportunity to utilize its services during a part of the year.

With fewer blind students than in years past, Mrs. Buhrow managed the brailing of tests and other services unassisted this year. But a speech therapist and special social counselling assistants gave specialized aid in a variety of situations.

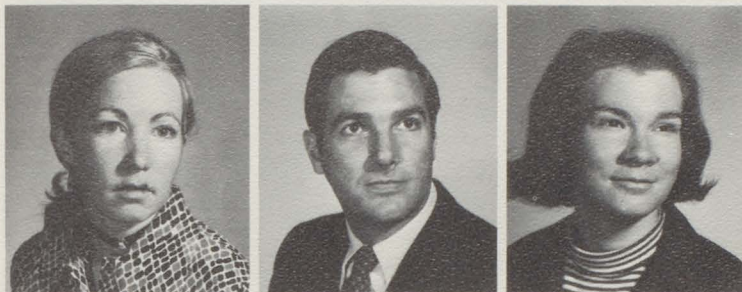

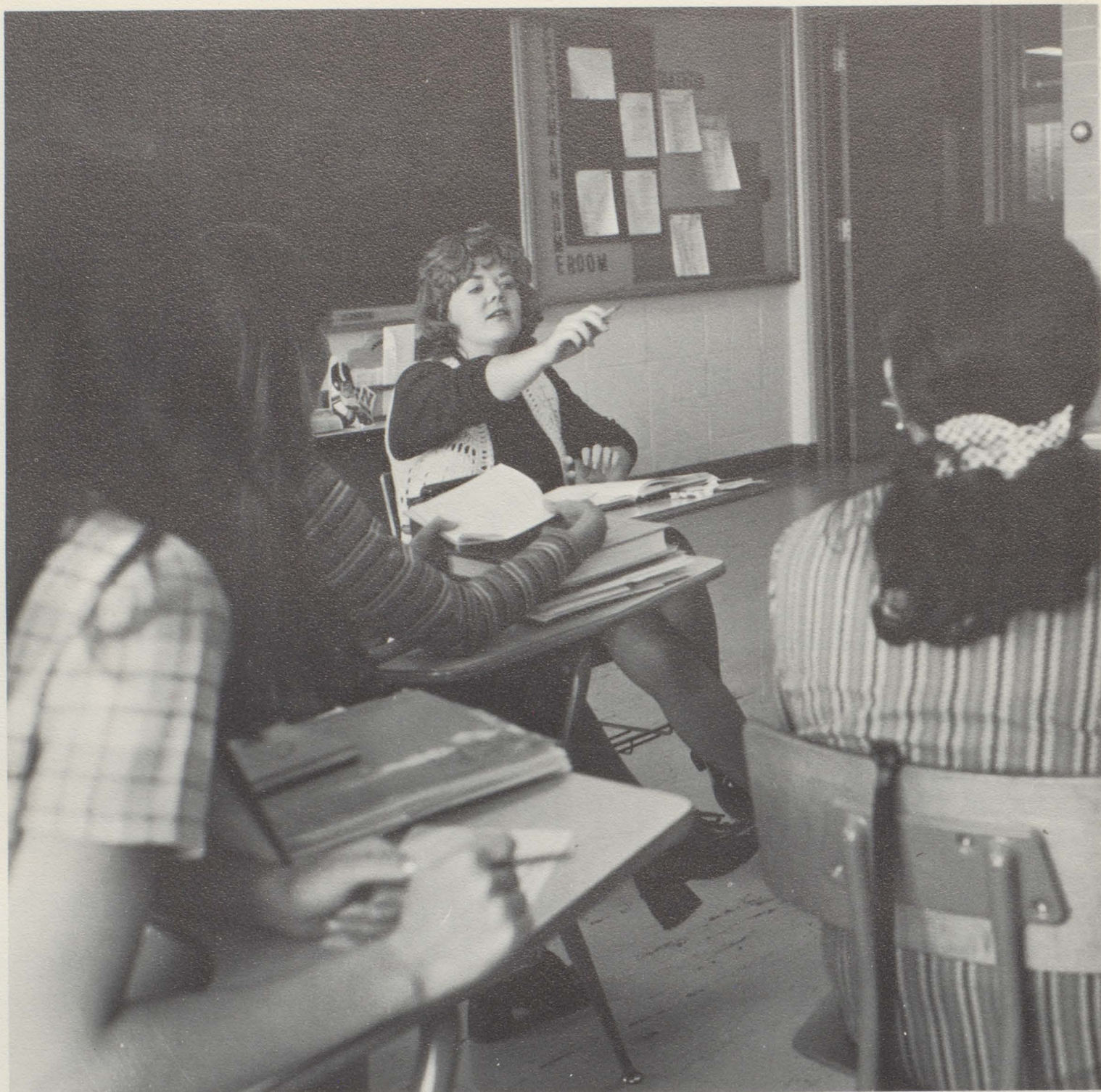

Nurses operate under battlefield conditions in Viet Nam but West's two nurses are also able to appreciate the problems of working in confined space under pressure. This year their quarters — not exactly commodious to begin with — were further shrunk to make room for other student facilities. Accordingly they took care of the health needs and emergency problems of more than 4,000 students in one class-room sized area.

Freshman vision and hearing tests, insurance claims, advice and assistance to counsellors in cases involving health problems of students were attended to in addition to the routines of sprained ankles and upset stomachs. Both of West's nurses have been part of West since its beginning twelve years ago and their ability to keep their feet in an increasingly difficult situation is the result of long practice.



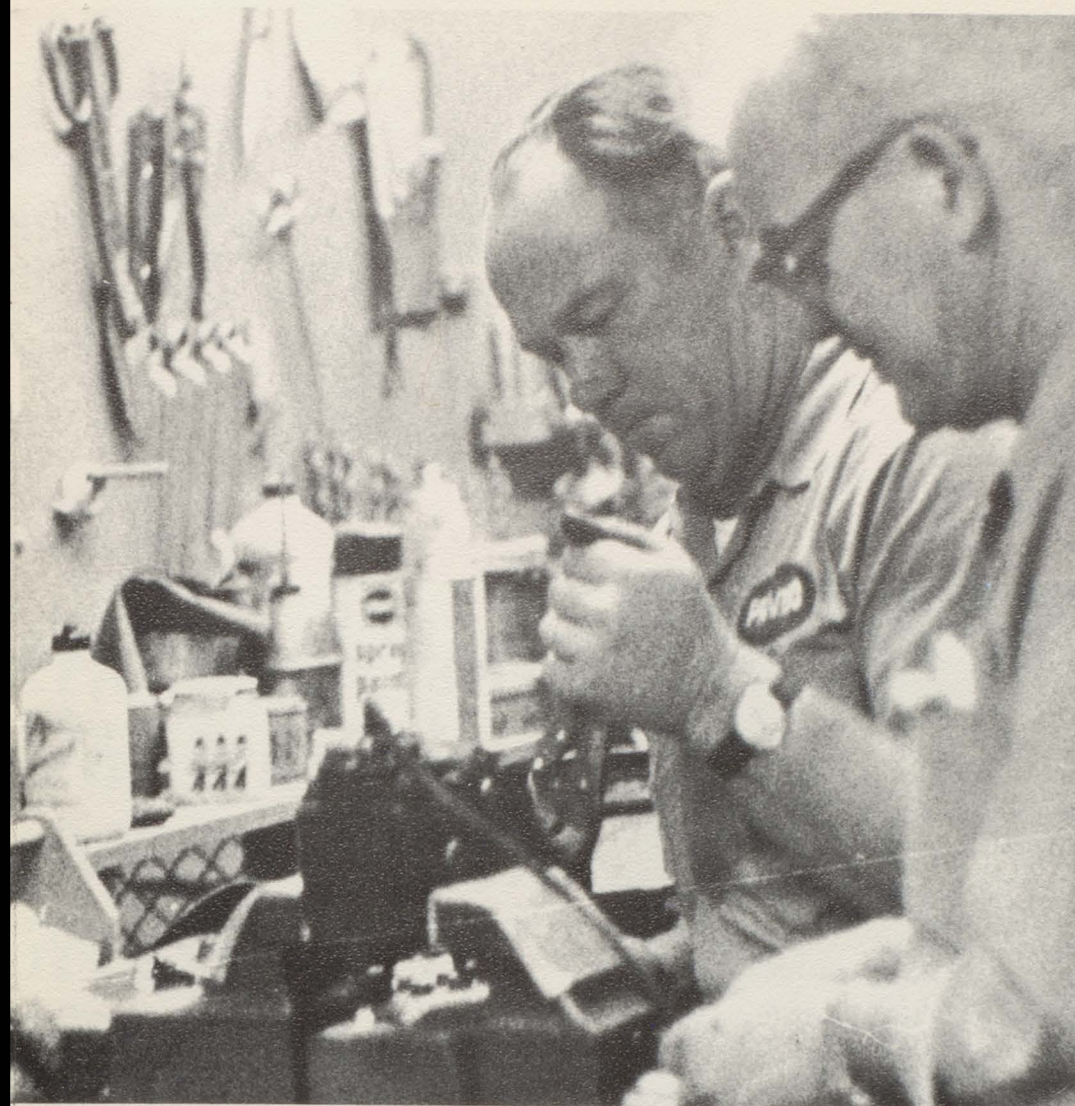

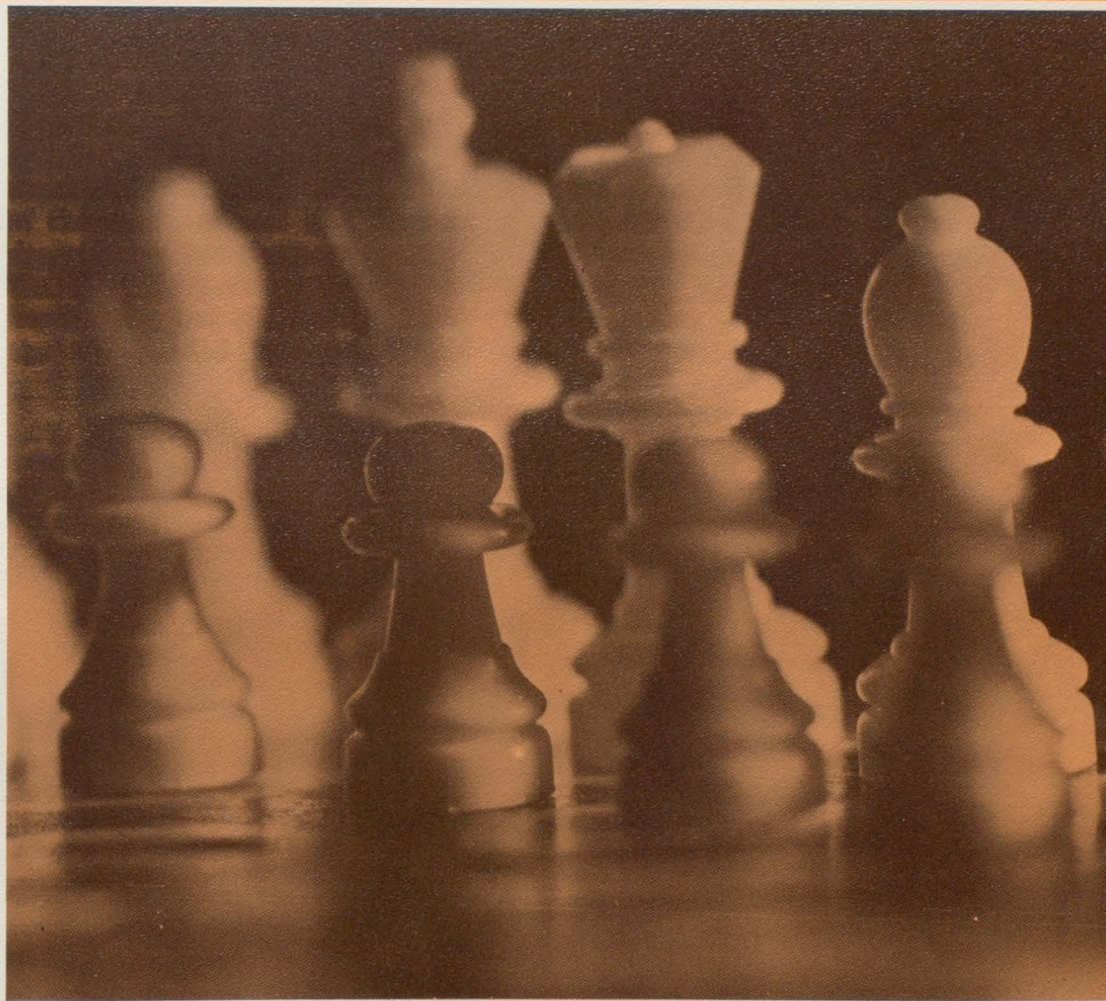

Jazz Band played co-host for the second annual Illinois Invitational High School Jazz Festival at Elm-

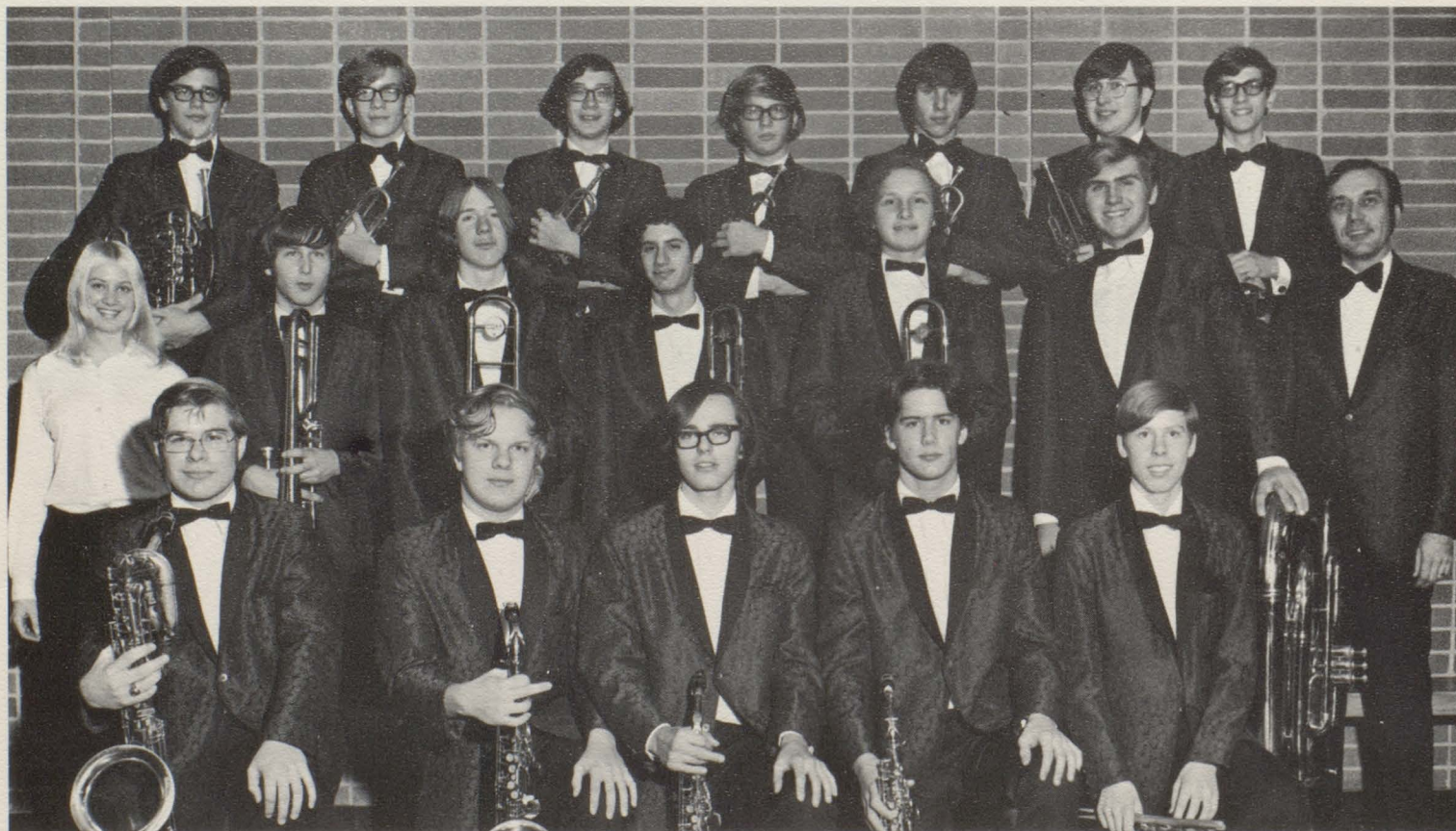

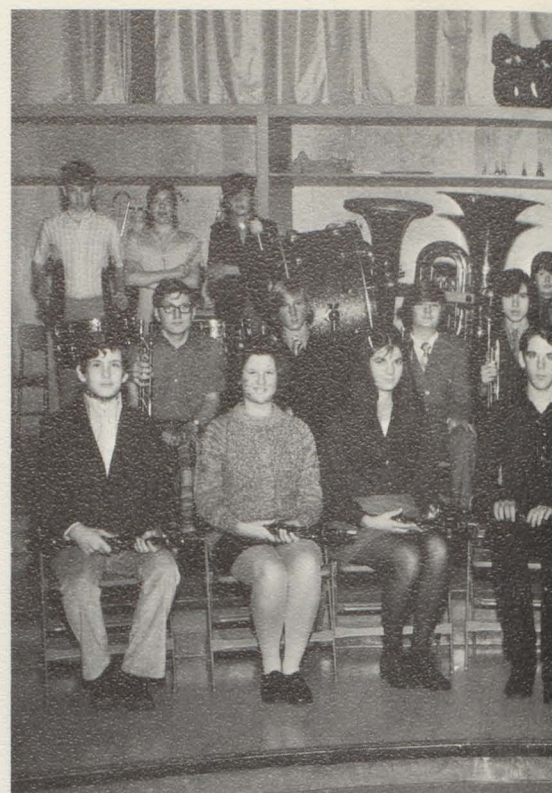

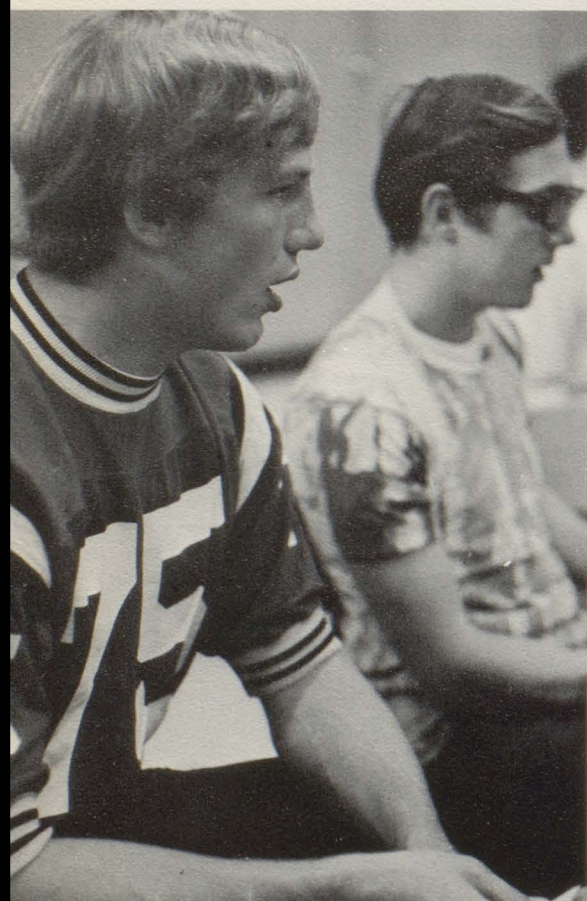

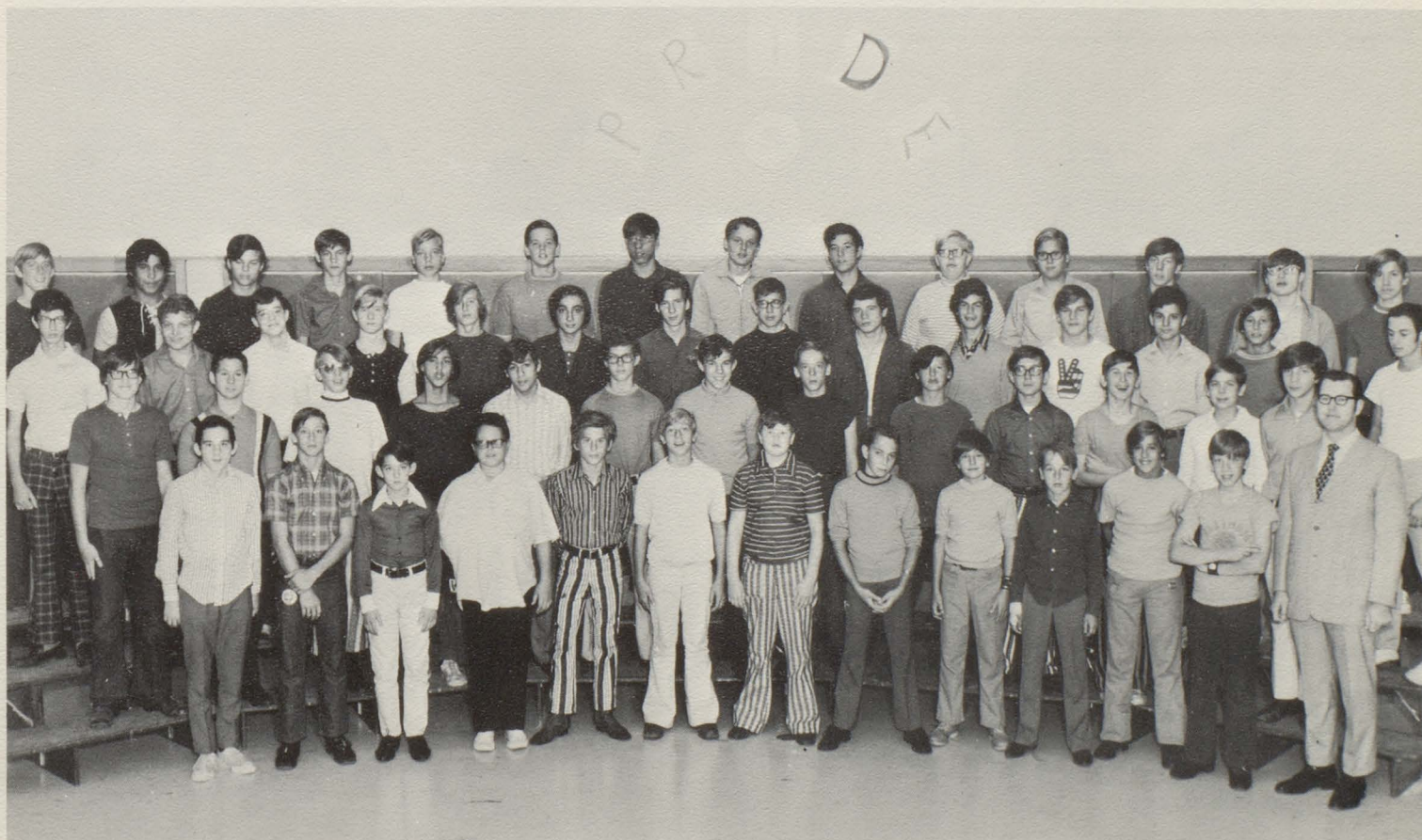

Student Council also sponsored trips to concerts of singers and name bands.



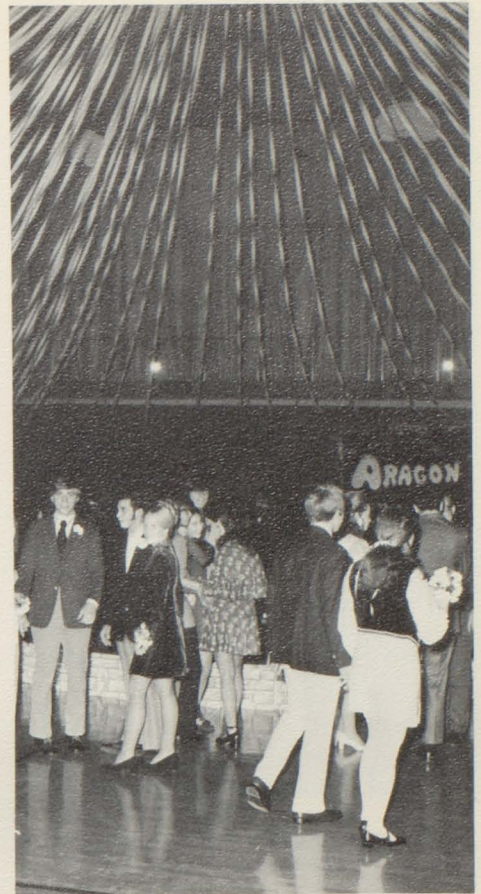

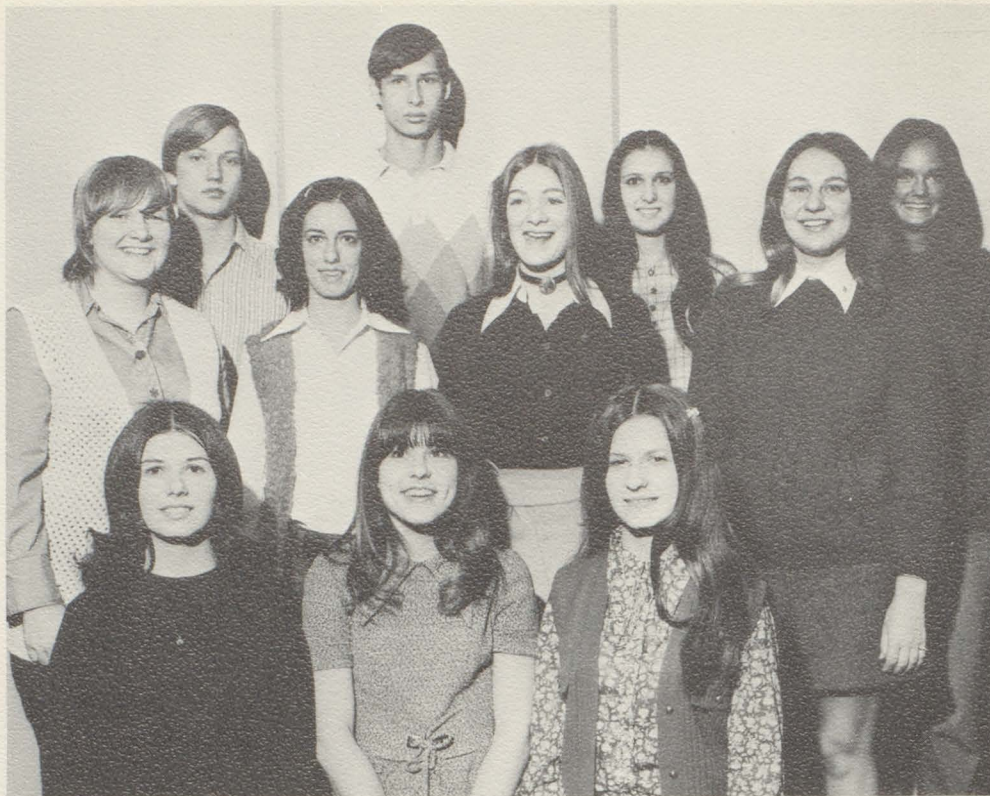

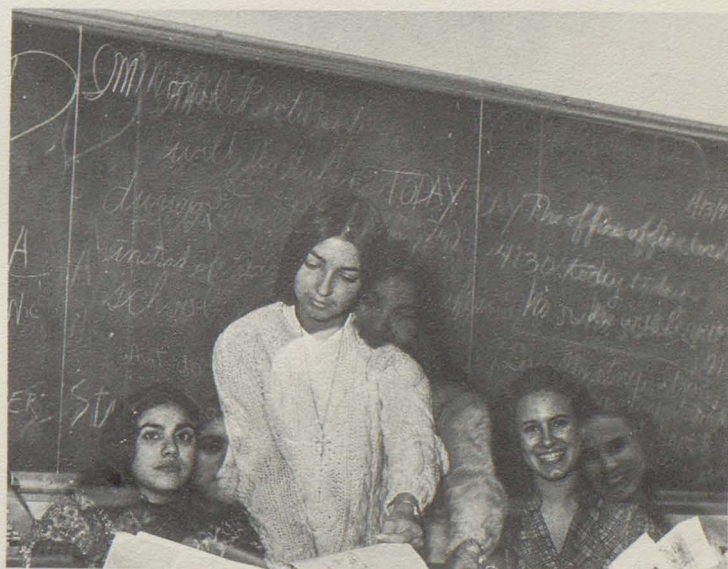

Concert Orchestra Tours Springfield

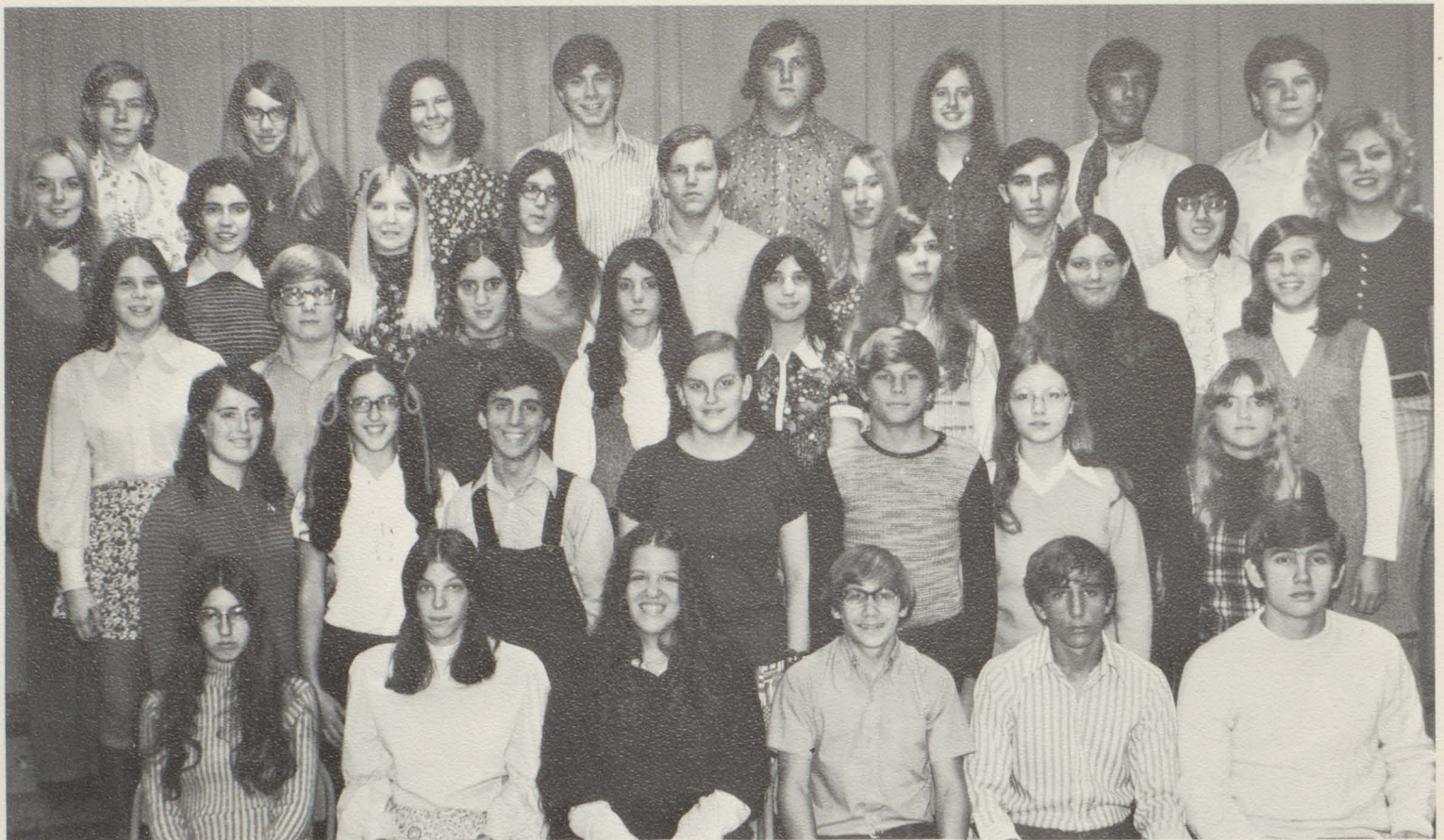

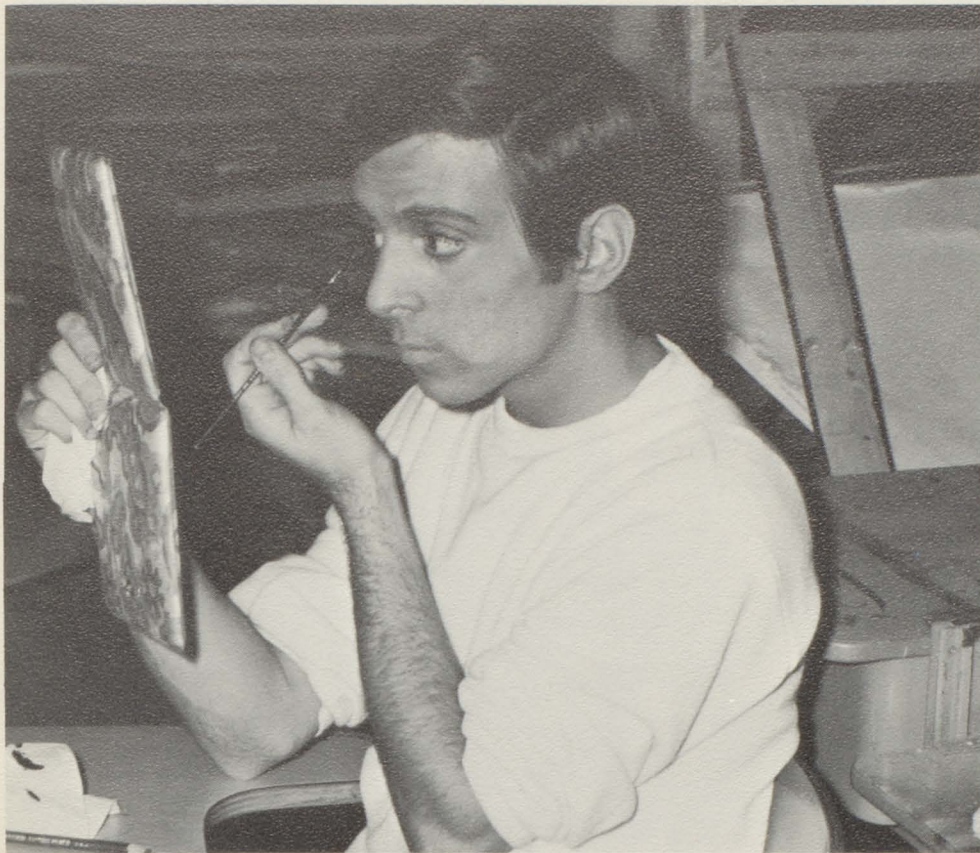
Tech, Thespians Unite in Plays

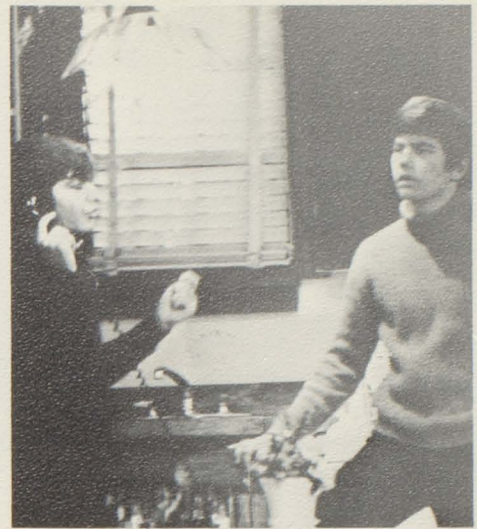

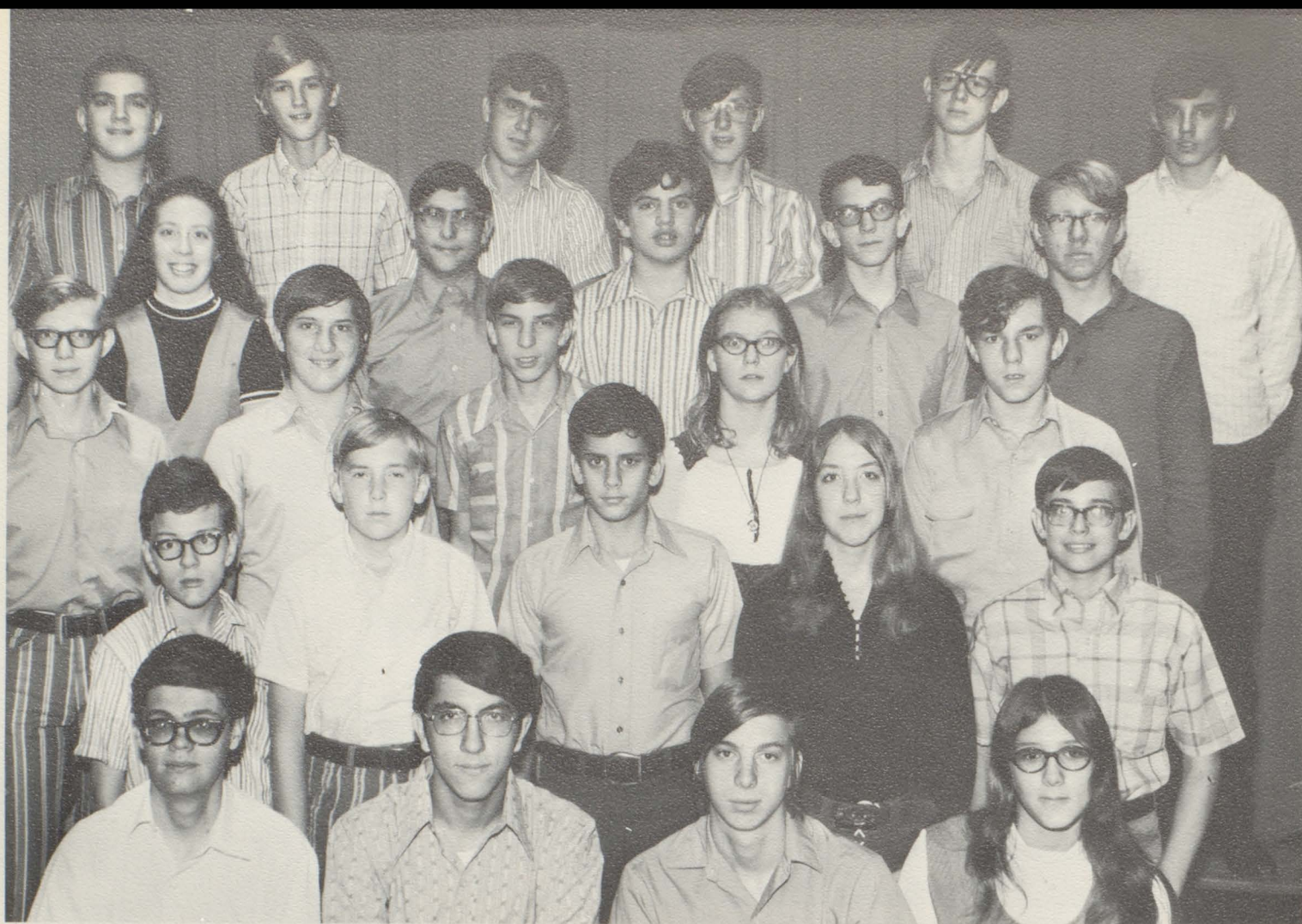

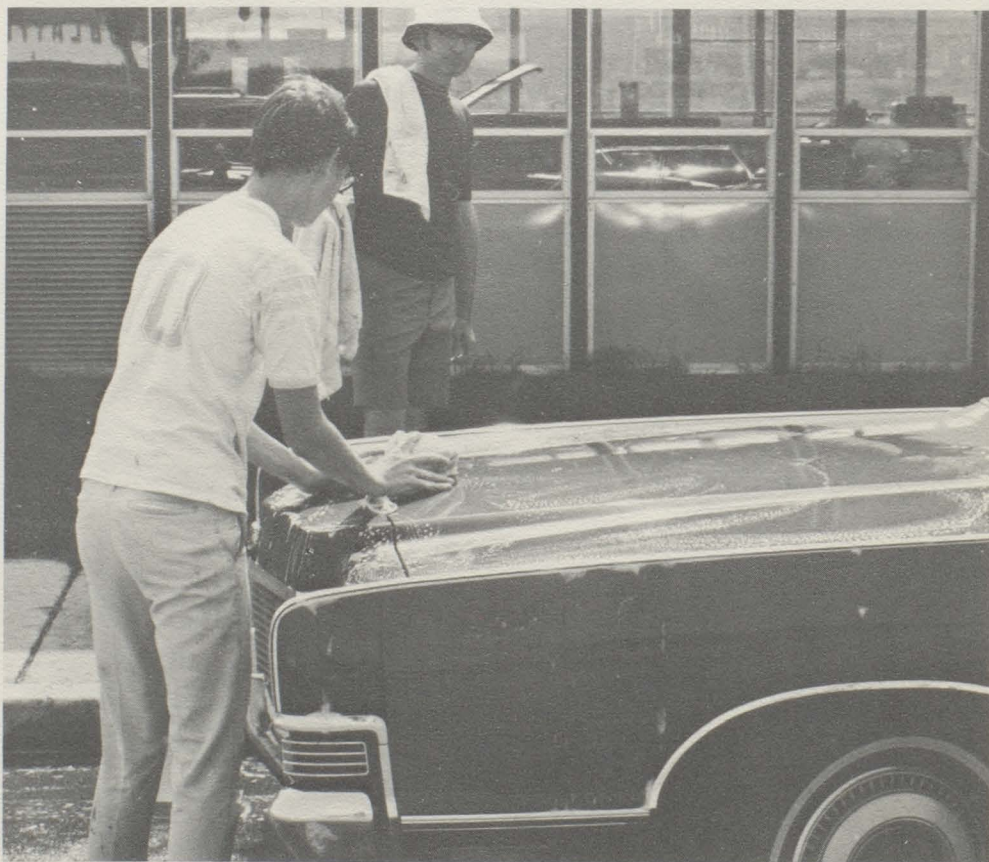

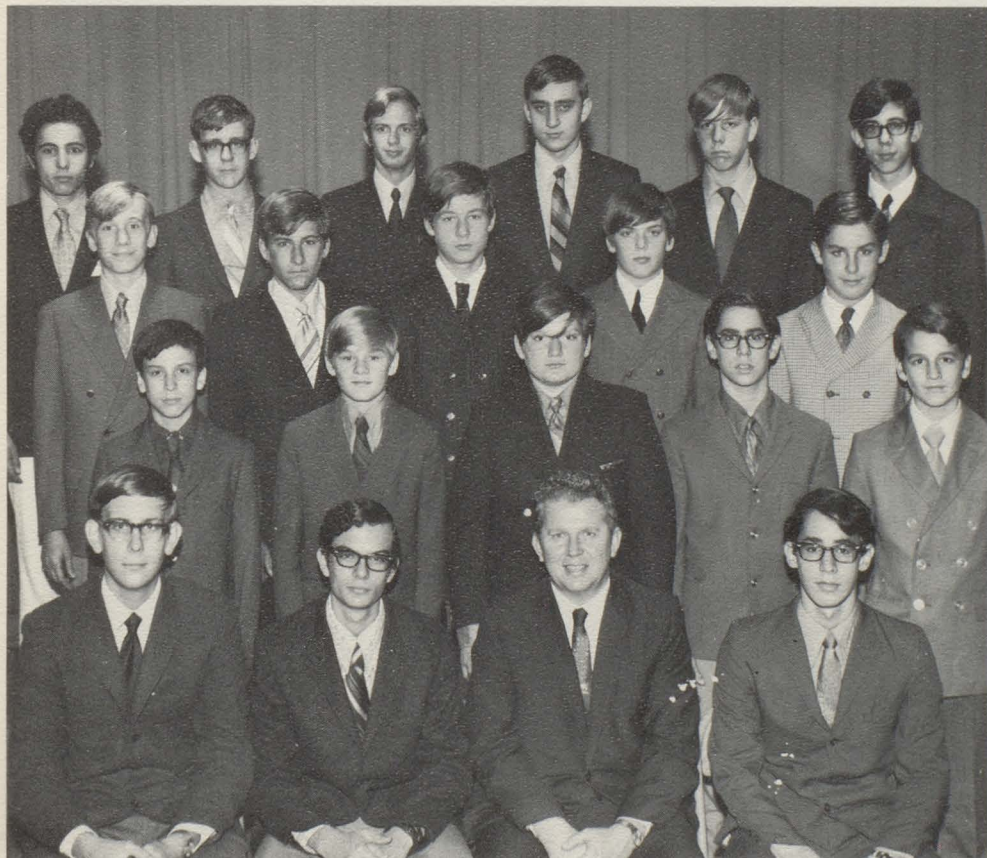

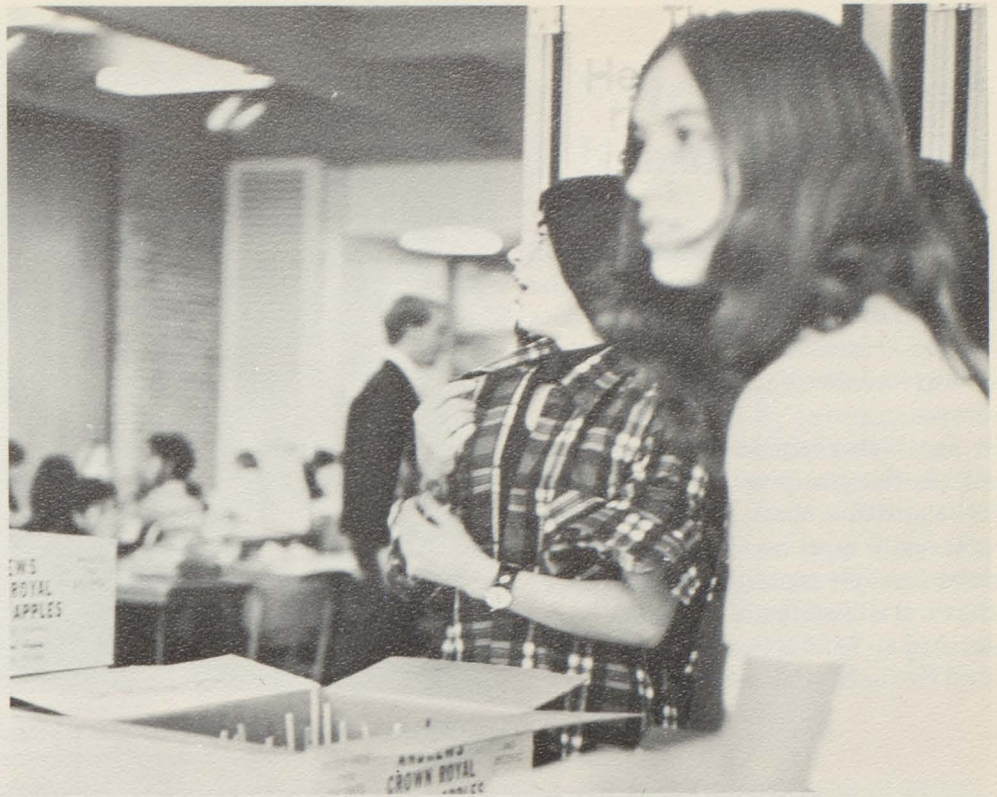

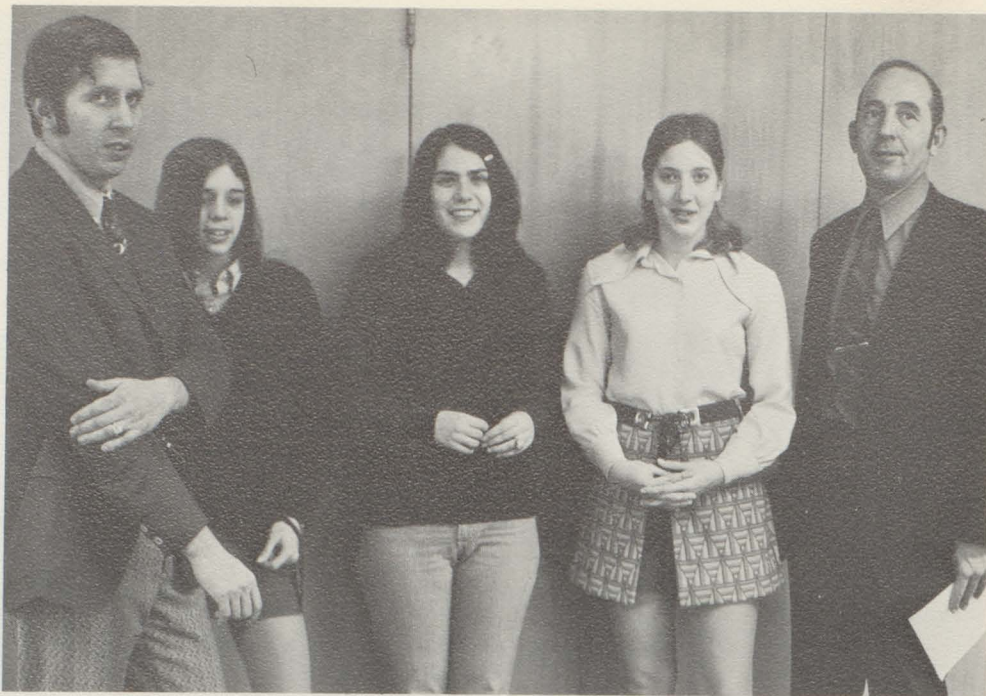

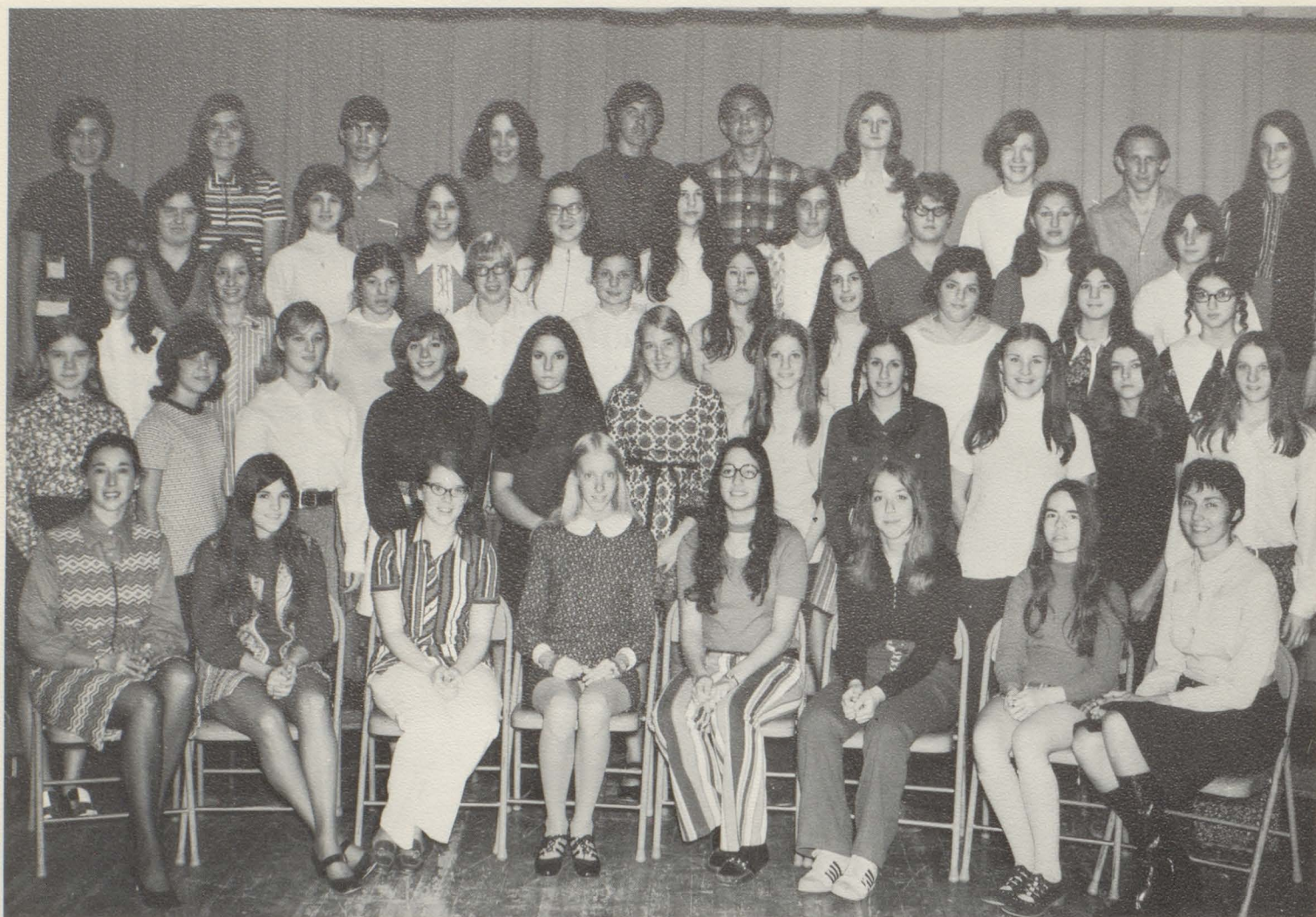

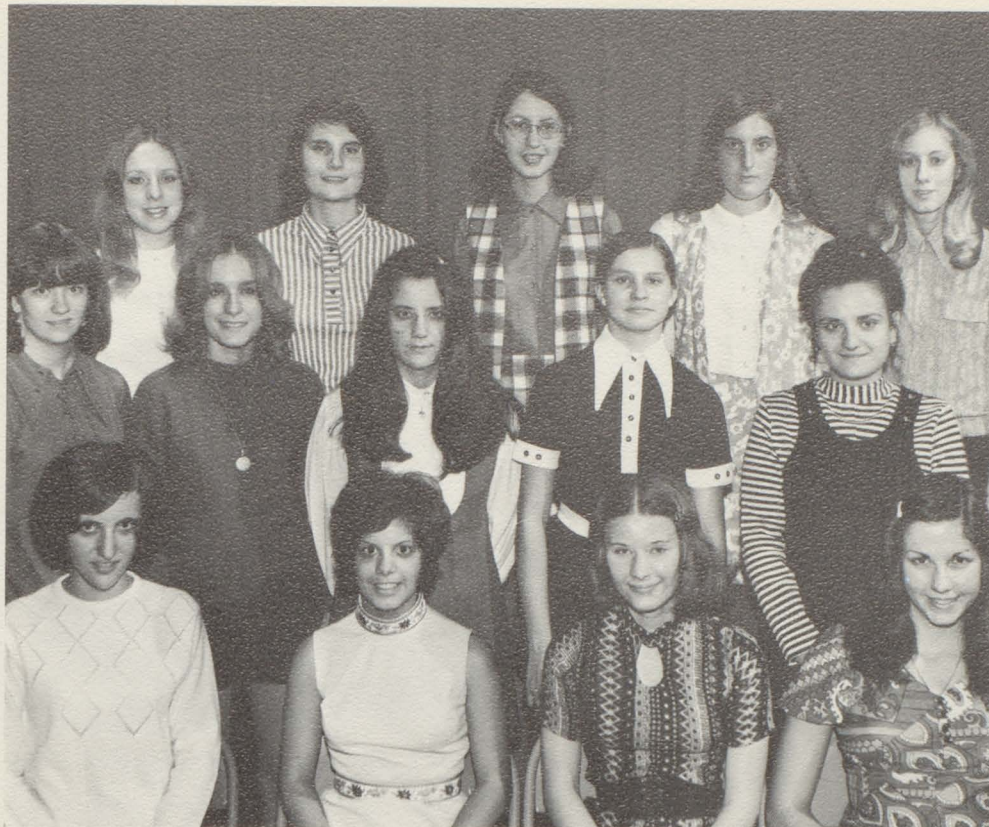

Panth'rettes Turn Into "Flappers"

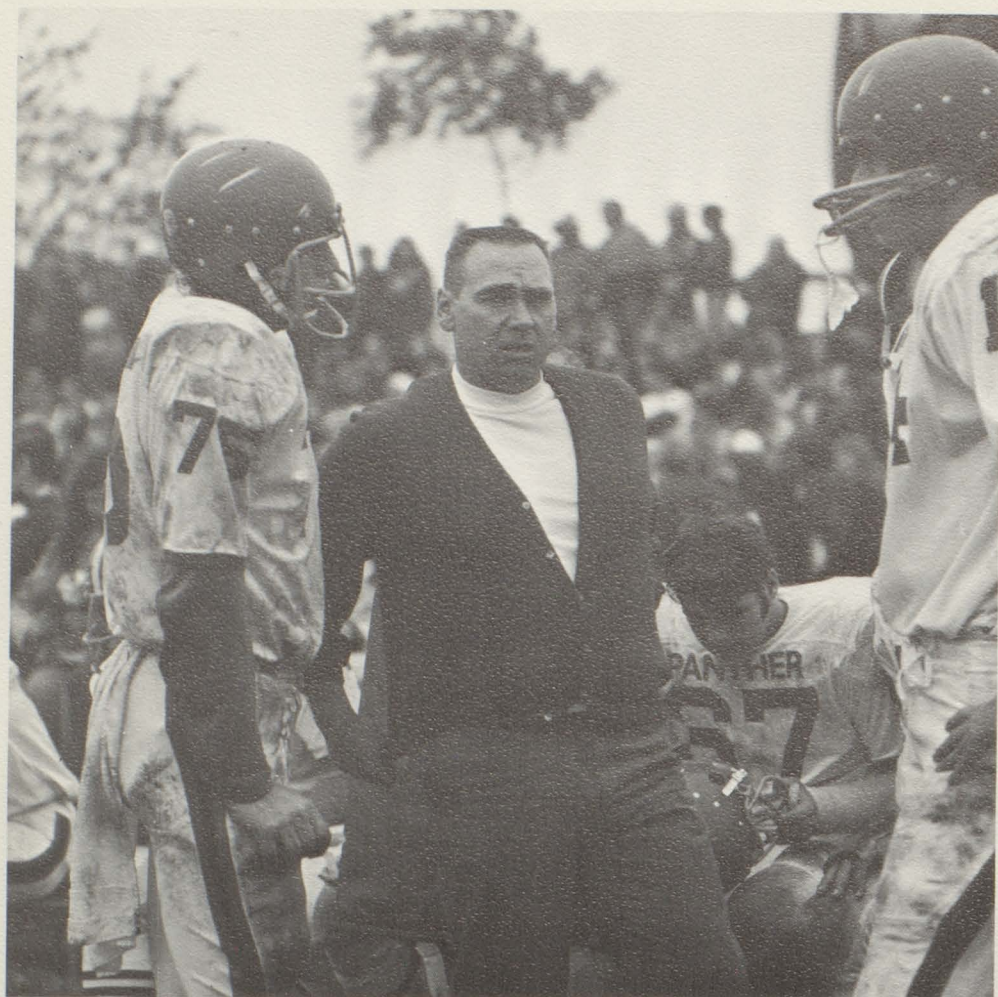

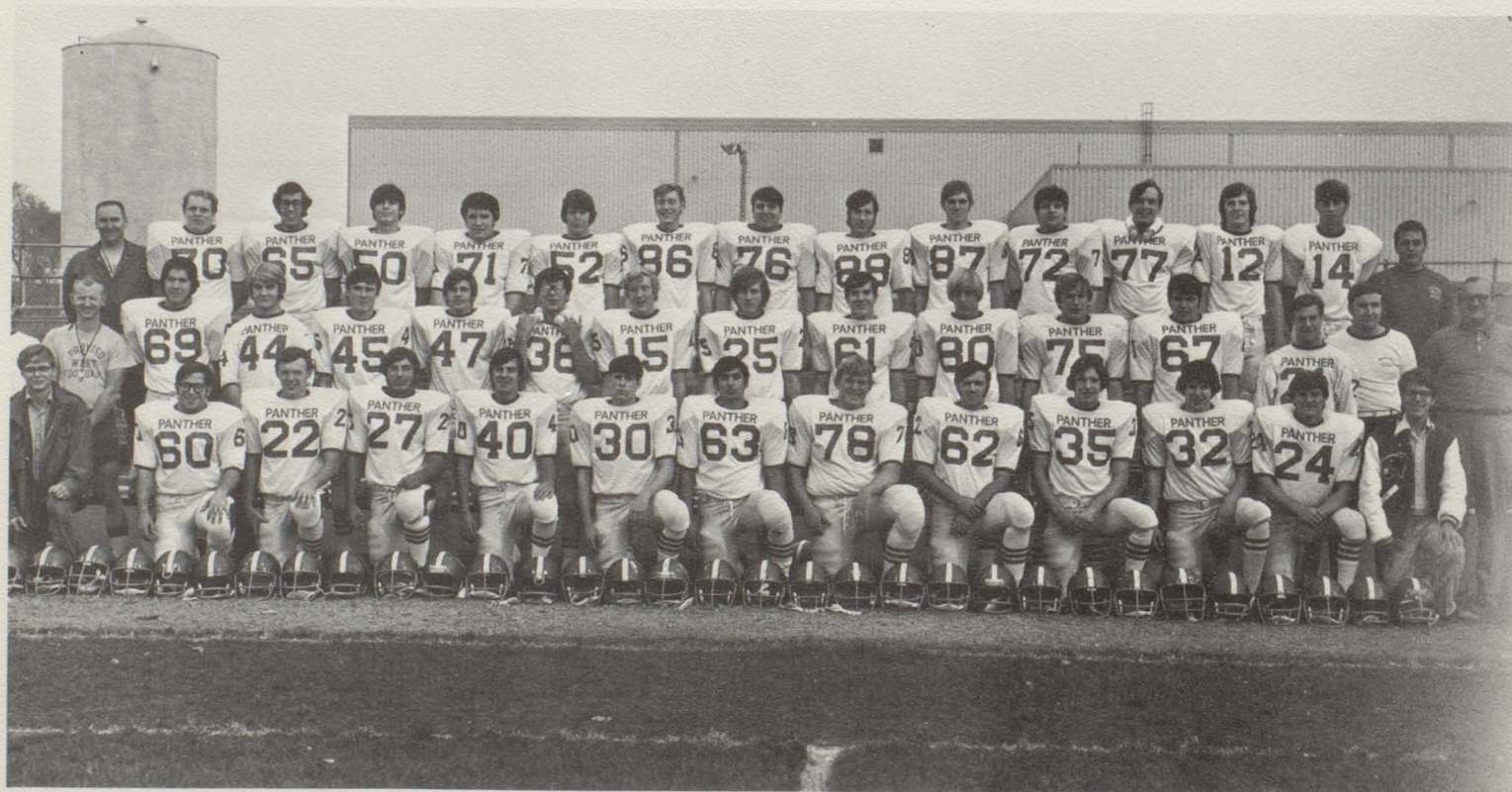


Varsity Team Starts Homecoming Game Winning Streak, 2nd Year Now!

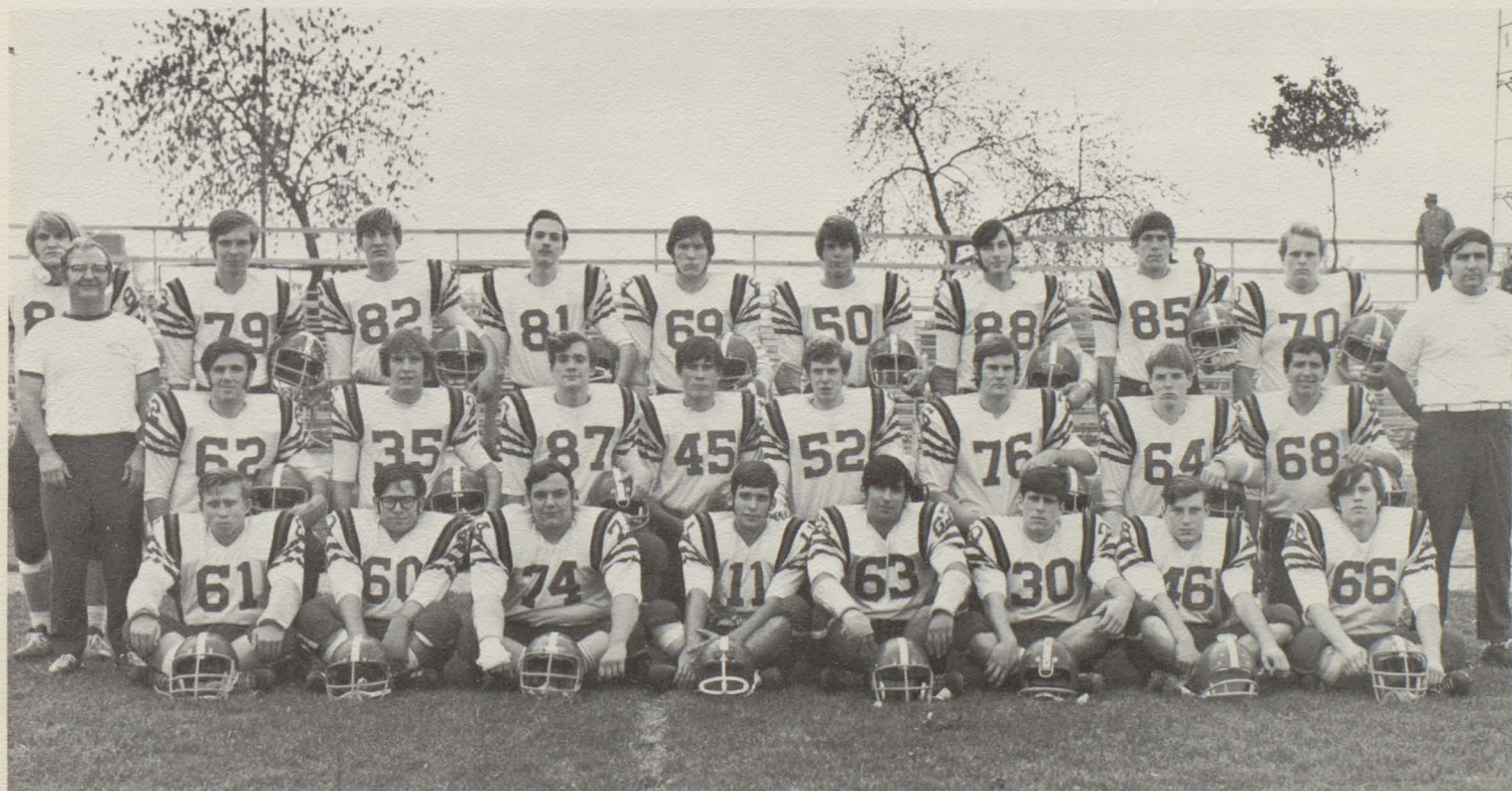

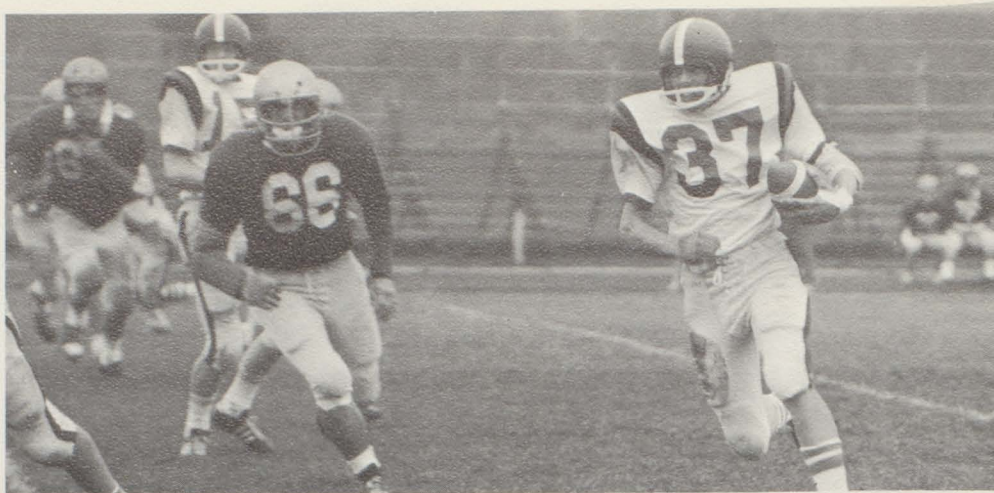


Sophs "Get It All Together At Downers N. Game

Sophs definitely suffered a "building year" in '71 with a 3-5 final tally. Winning their homecoming game against Downers North however, sweetened the season slightly.

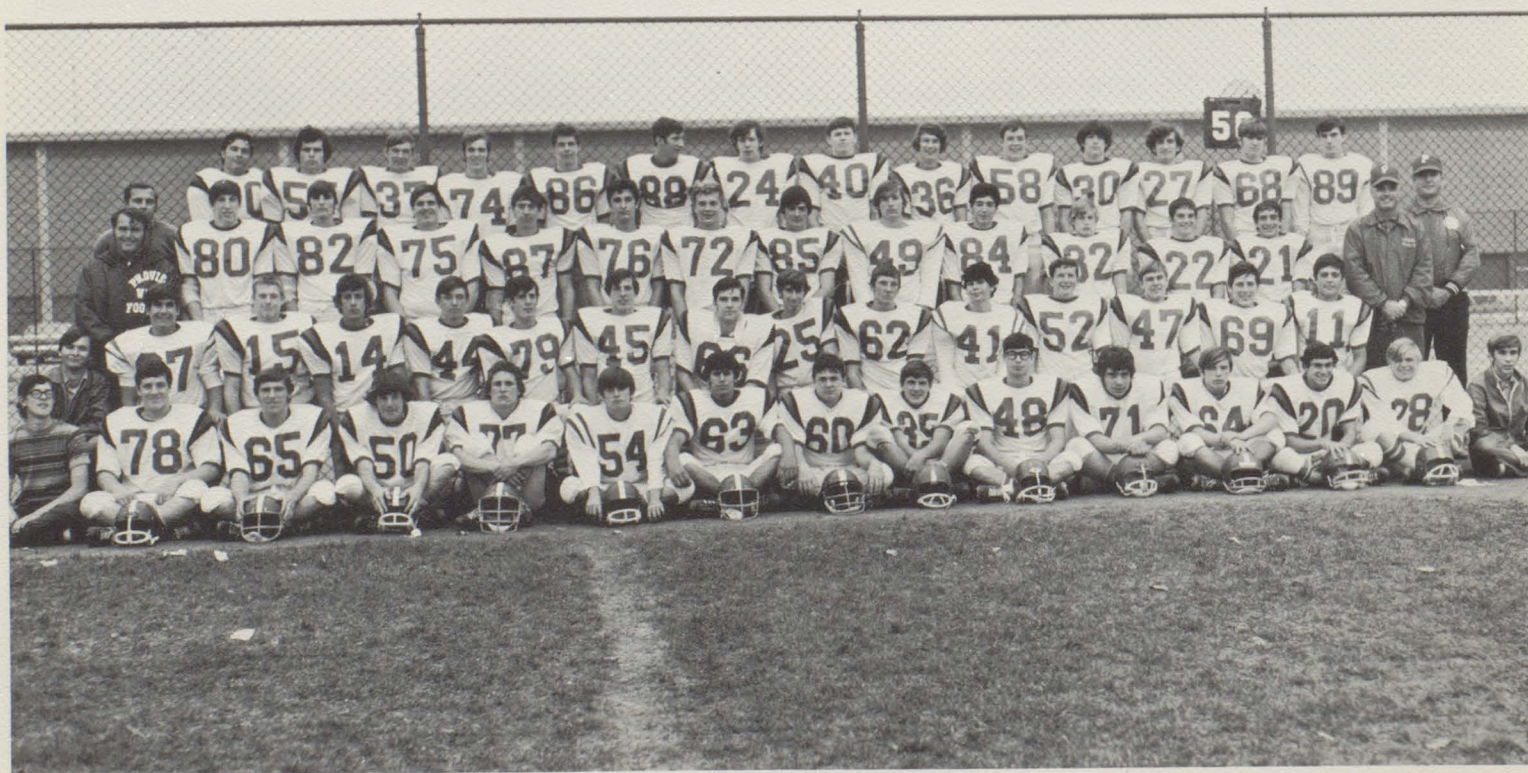
"I think this was the game we put it all together both offense and defense," Coach Gilbert commented. "But with the ability some of the boys showed," he continued, "we should have won more games."

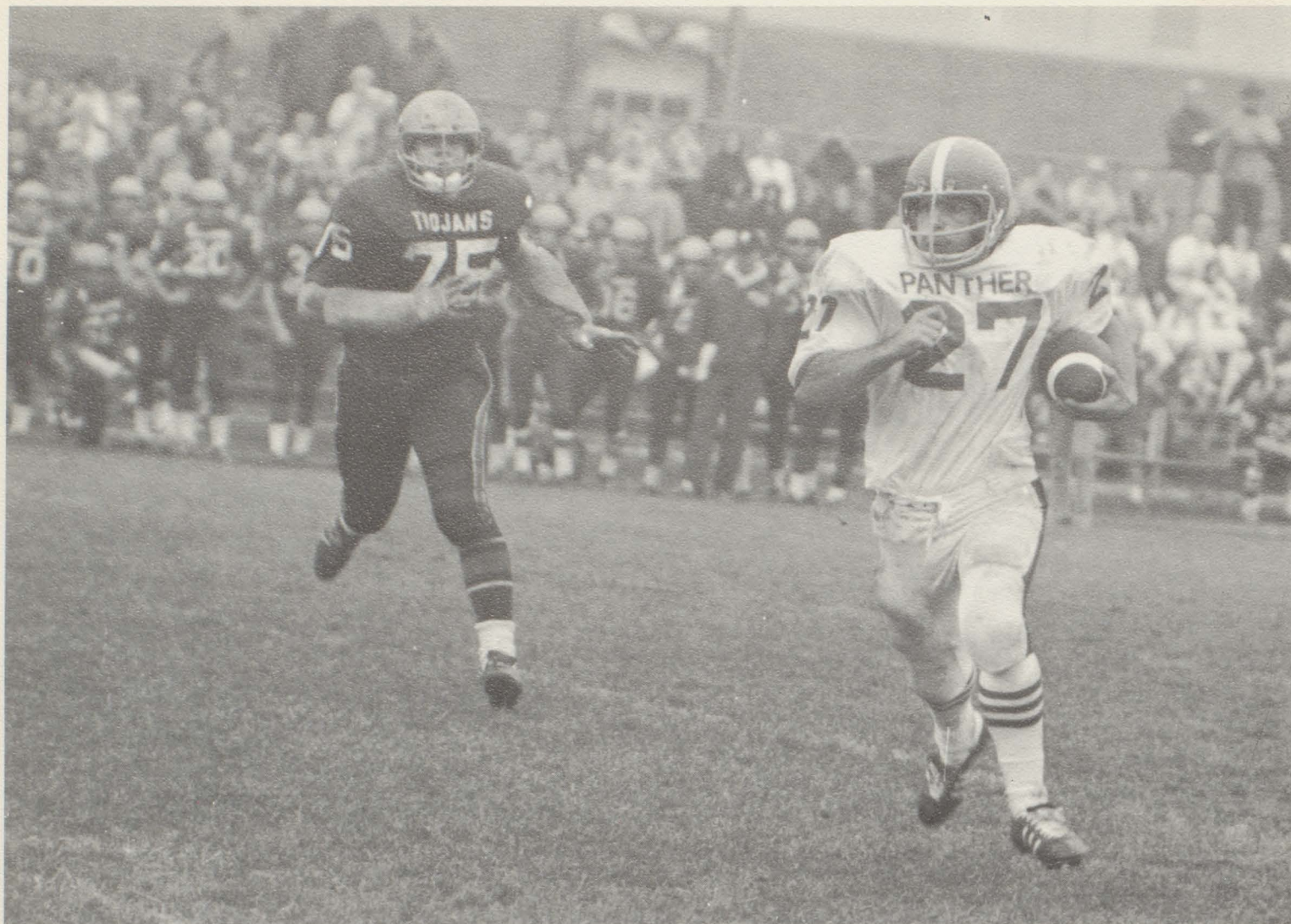

Harriers Rate Only Sixth in State

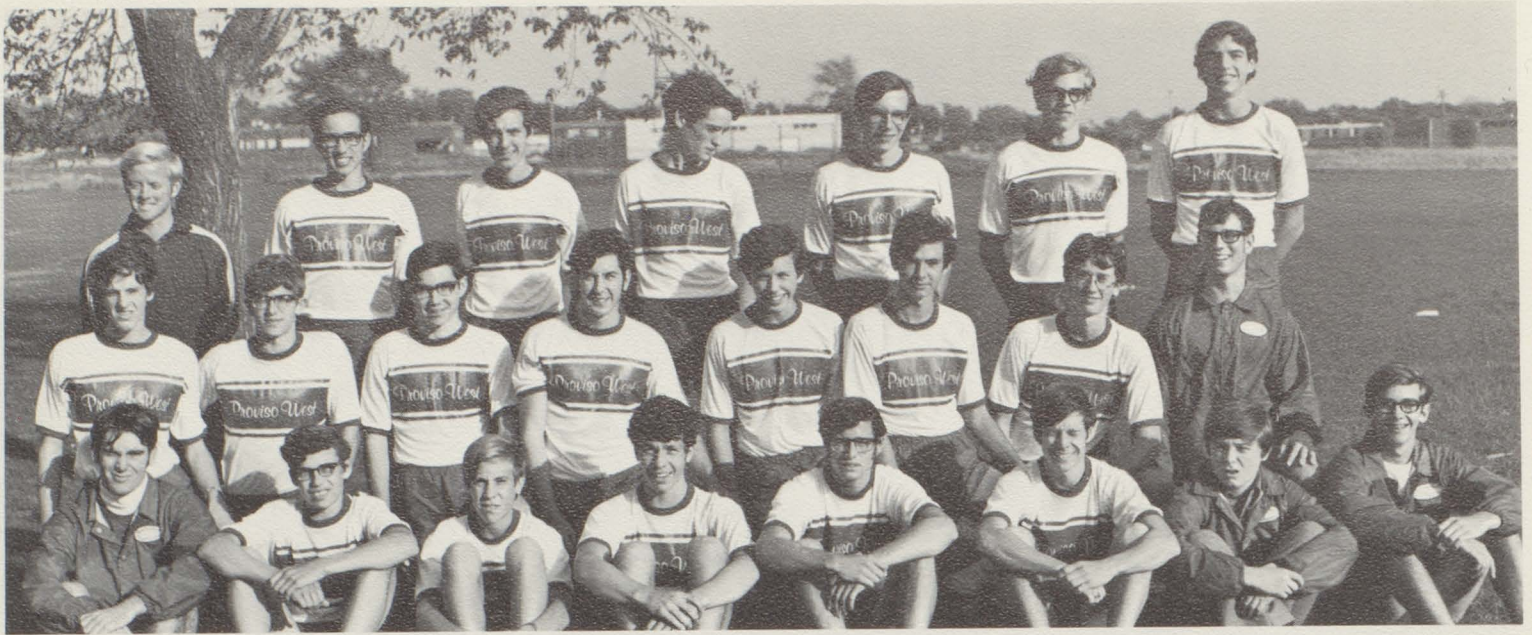

One of the highlights of the season was the victory over the highly regarded York team by a very close score of 27 to 28.

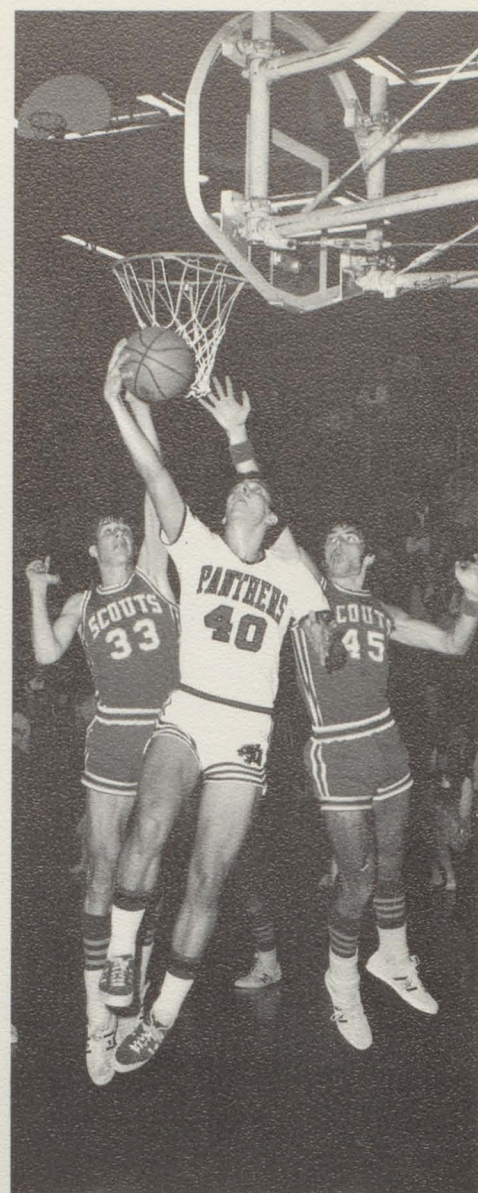
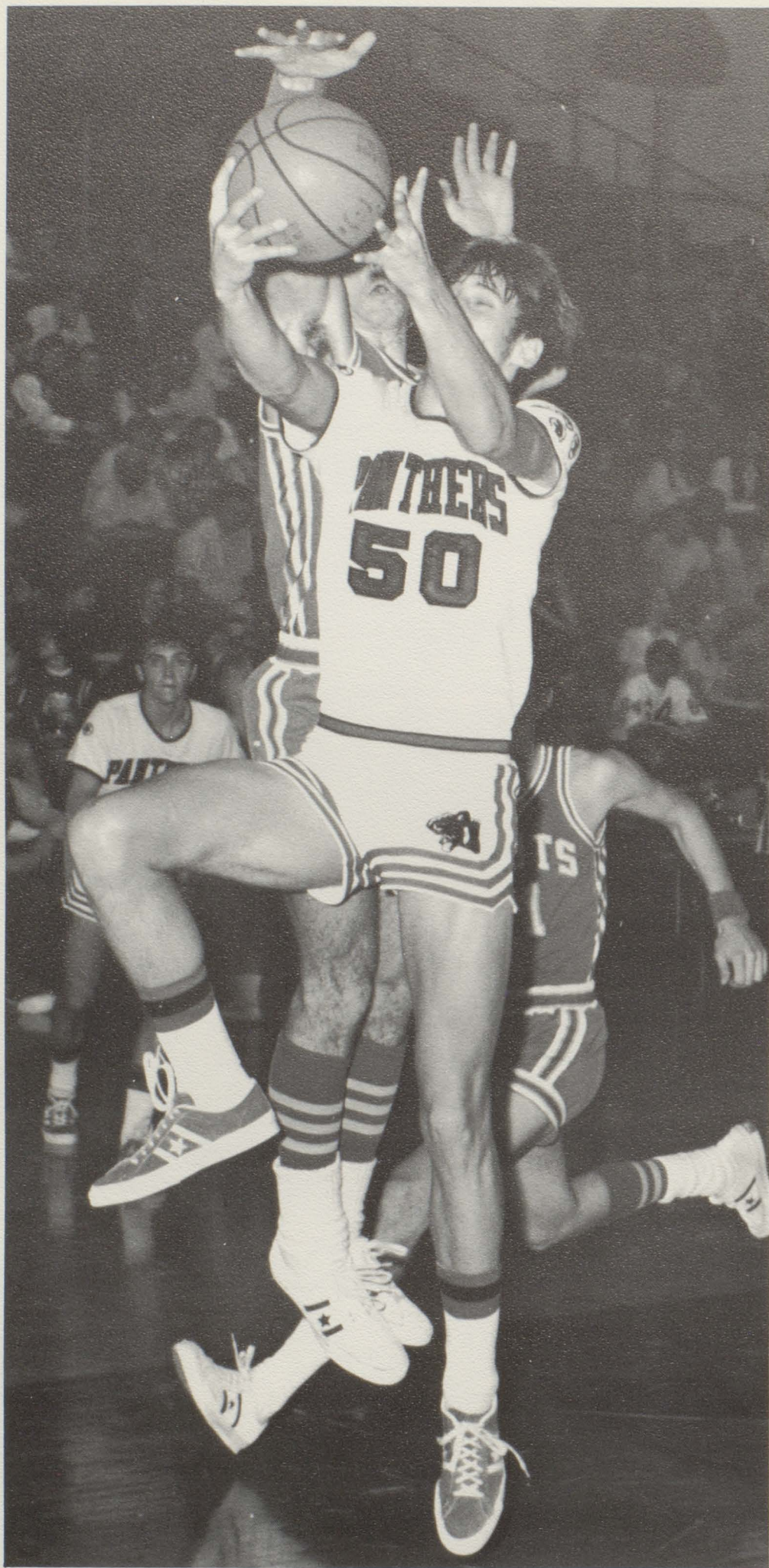

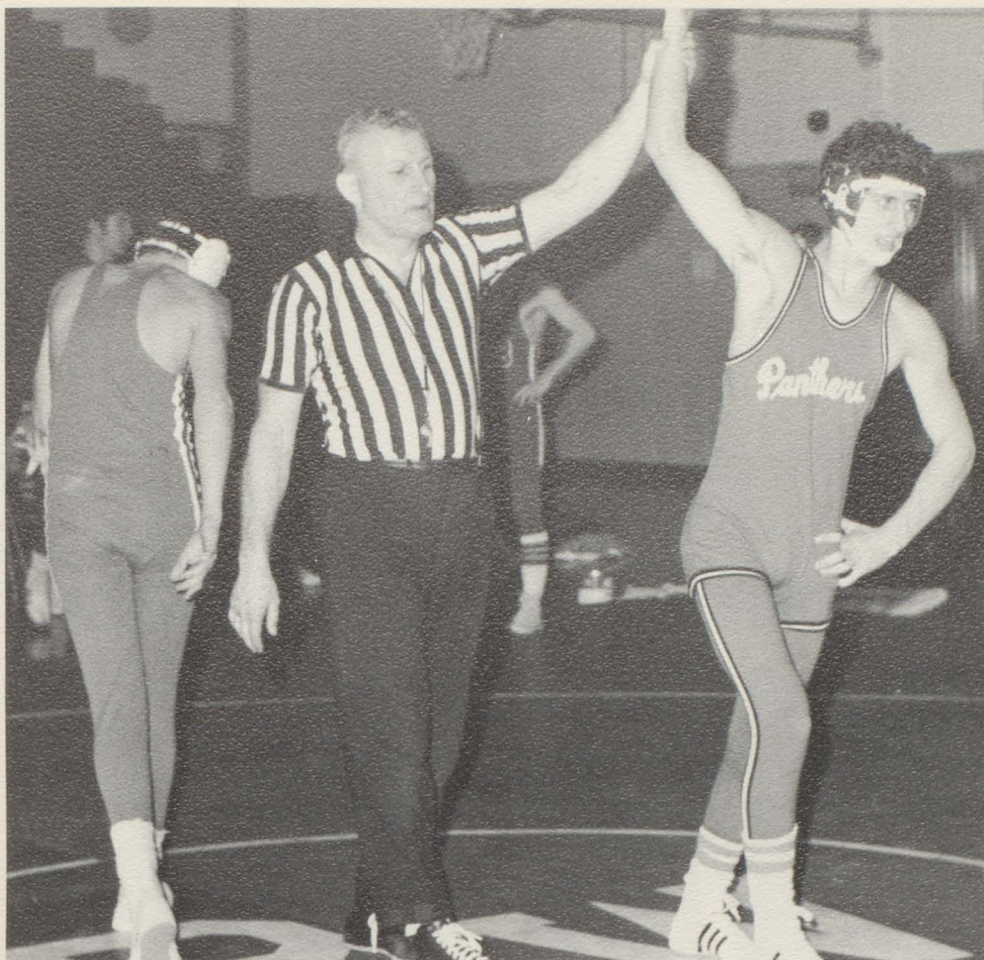
Frosh "A" Squad Sags "B" Has Good Season

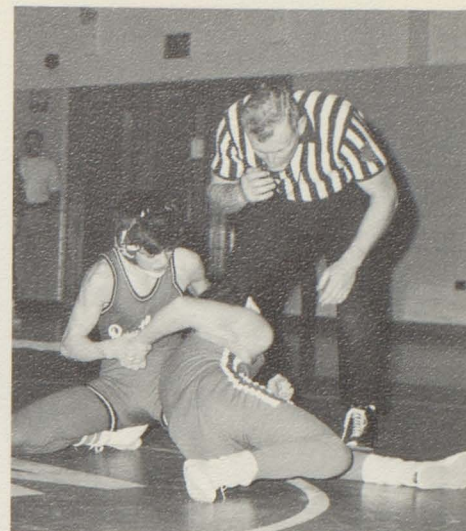
Frosh, Soph Matmen Cop 5th, 2nd and JV's Rate 7th

Stat Girls Help Teams, Spark Morale

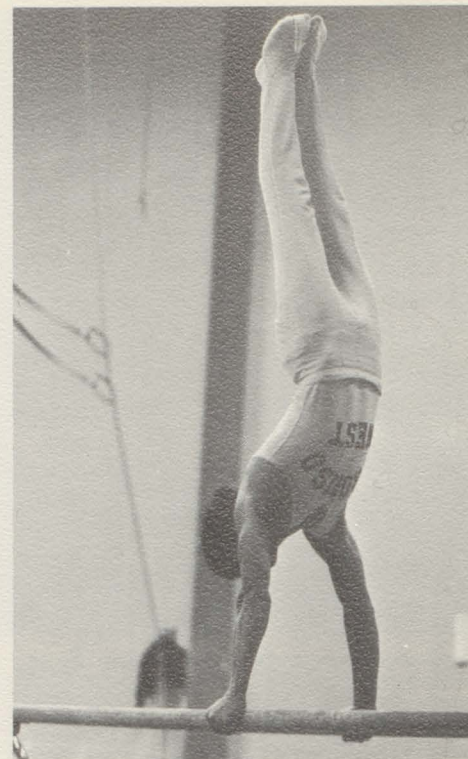

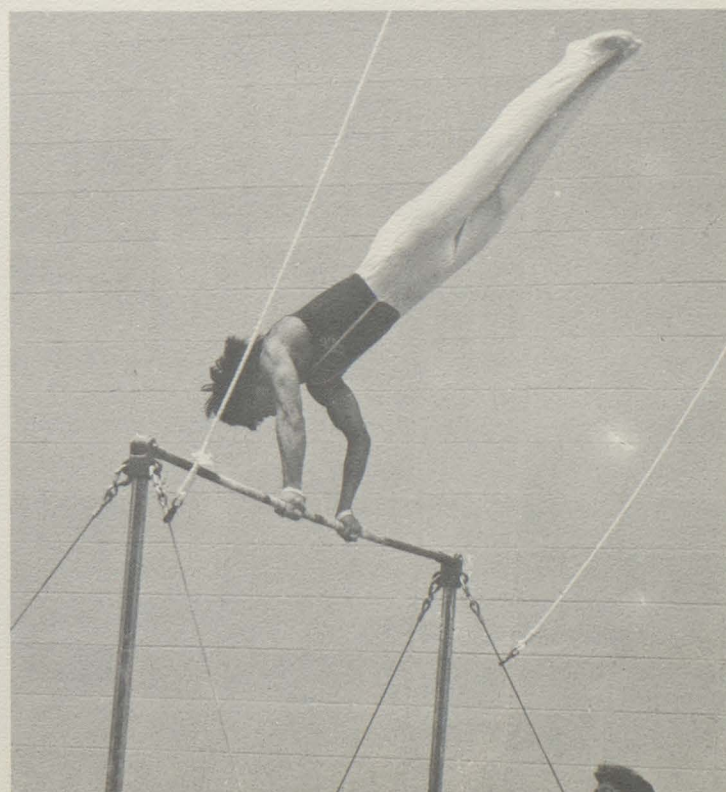

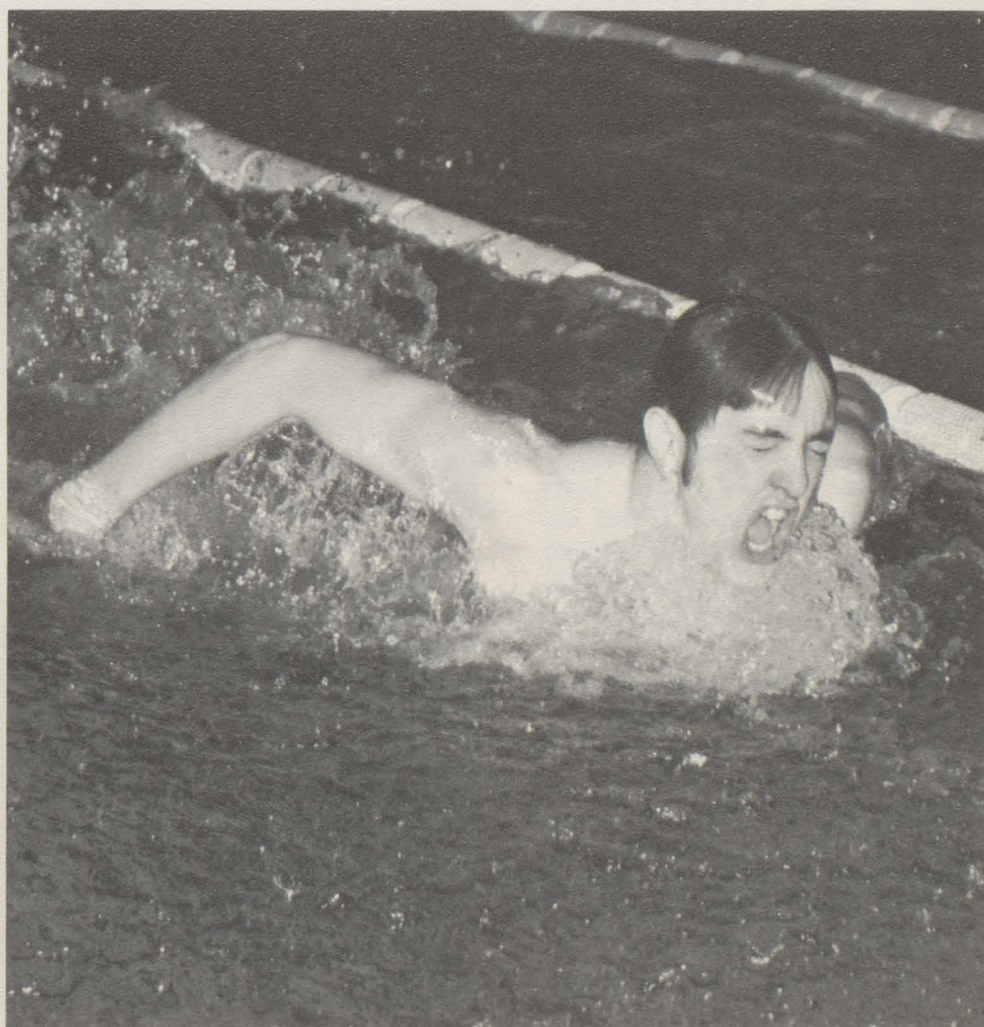

West's '71 indoor season found the track men earning a second place in the conference. The relay picture was not so bright as in past years, since the Cats had a 13th in the prestigious Oak Park Relays and only a fourth in the Proviso West Invitational. However they won the Morton East Relays for the fourth consecutive year and had a third place in the Naperville Relays.

The outdoor season brought a third place in both the conference and district. No points were scored at the State meet — the first year that a Proviso West track team did not score at State. Twelve men qualified for the state contest including: 880-relay men Paul Murray, Gary Matusek, Scott Miricky, Bill LaRocca; high-jumpers John Stanek and Jim Smith; weightman Tom Kearney; pole vaulter Tom Krebes; distance runners Jim Hurt, Al Letterer and Bob Kannenberg. All State contestants with the exception of Kannenberg also made the West Suburban All-Star squad.

Third places in the conference were won by both the Soph and Freshman squads. Sophs won fourteen and lost four dual and triangular meets while the Freshmen won sixteen and lost only two of their indoor-outdoor meets.

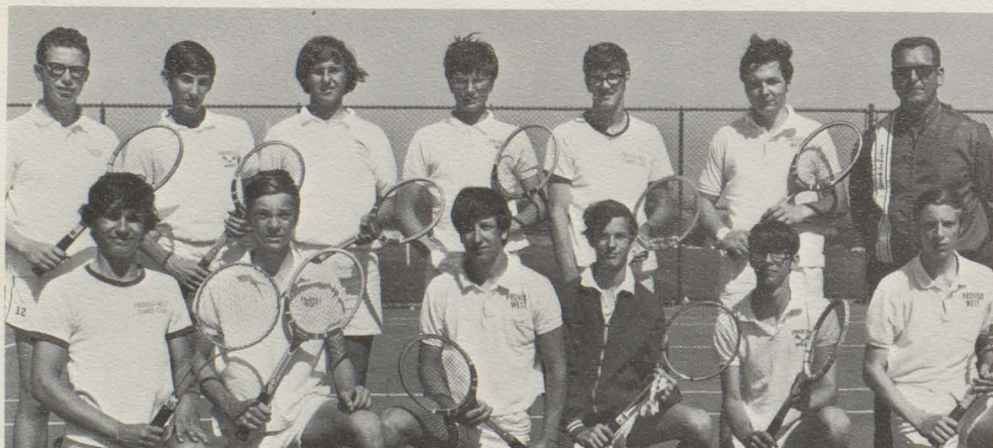

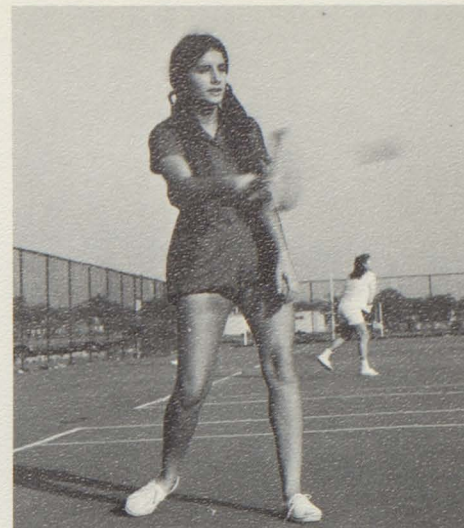

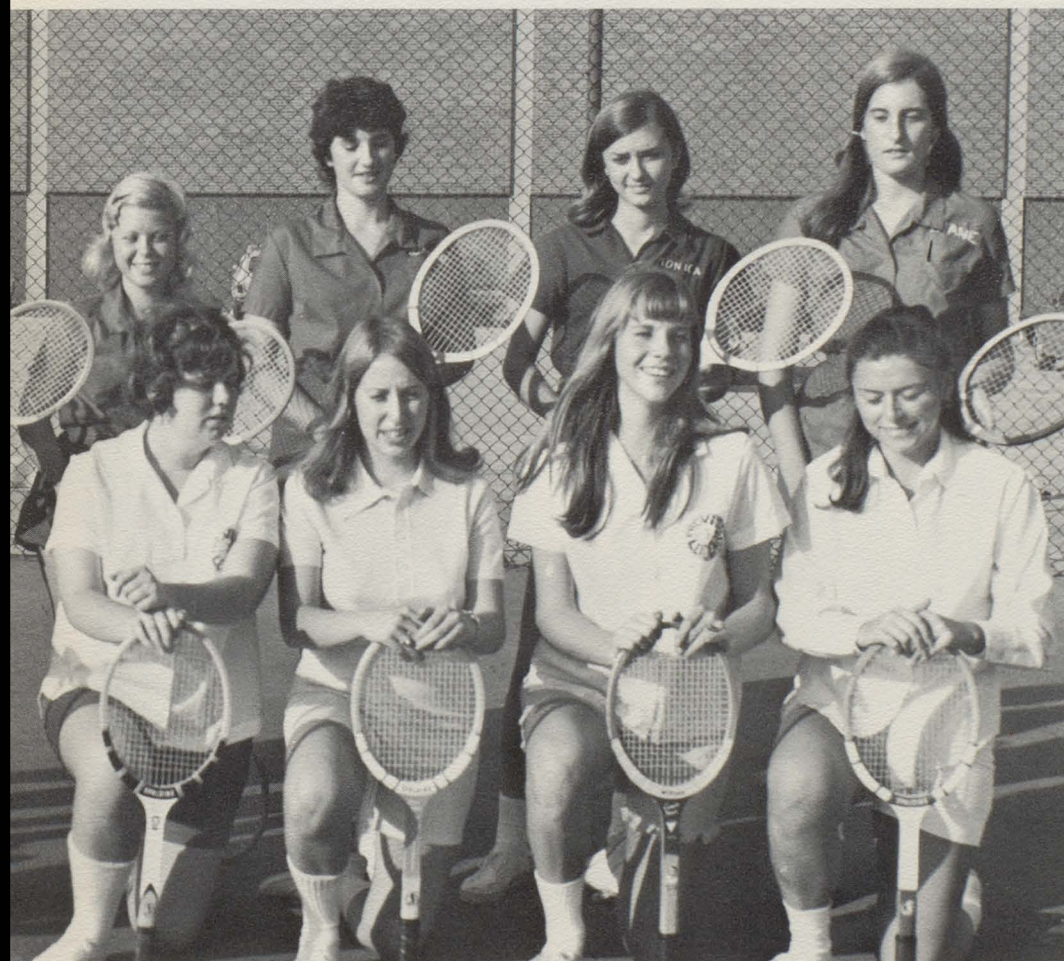

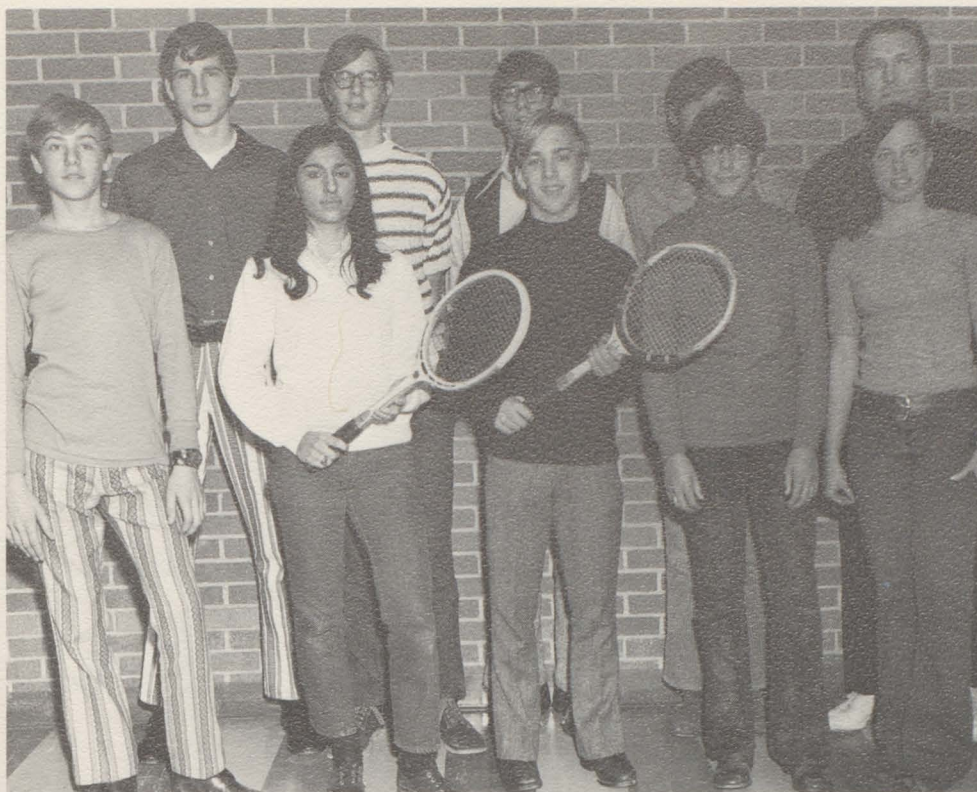
