
Most students can be fit into six groups. Of course some fit into more than one, yet this in itself does not discount the existence of six groups.

First are the working students. They are the most independent. They earn their own bread and buy what they want.

Second are the students *par excellence*. Their ambition is to get the most out of school possible. They recognize the opportunity they have and take advantage of it.

Third are the athletes. Theirs is the pursuit of excellence too. Victory is their goal and the body is their conquest.

The fourth group find their satisfactions in school, near school or away from school. They can be with school or oblivious to school.



The fifth group is the smallest group. Its members know of man's predicament without God and see God's love as the meaning to life.

Though the sixth group is not dealt with directly in this special section, it is far from small. They perhaps make up the largest of all our groups. They are the students who lay no claim to being students at all. They have two specialities, goofing off and doing nothing. School to them is sometimes a prison and sometimes an opportunity. But always it is an inconvenience.

They pump gas, answer phones, and stock shelves. Usually they are paid less than a full-time worker would receive for the same job. But money is important to teenagers, not because they are in dire need of necessities but for all the things that might once have been considered luxuries-clothes, a car, the independence that comes with being part of the "real" world as distinct from the ambivilant world of school.





Some work. Some make chess or basketball or even church their consuming interest. But *every* student at West *is*, nominally at least, a student. Because the academic curriculum is the most serious business of the school. . .at least from where



most of the taxpayers in District 209 stand.

\$1,632 per year for every student at West. . .In four years that comes to an investment by the community of \$6,528 per student. A diploma, in other words, costs the community the equivalent of a Corvette. And in this transaction the boy or girl contributes, not cash, but himself, his time and effort. Sometimes the contribution is made grudgingly--taxes are not always paid with chortles of satisfaction either--but in the main there is satisfaction.



"There's always so much still to learn in gymnastics. There's discipline and grace. It's a beautiful sport!"





# Out of the Crowd A Single Face Emerges . . .

So there they are--West's students ---residents of Hillside and Northlake, Westchester and Berkely, Stone Park and Bellwood--fourthousand-six-hundred-and-some teenagers who spend from five to seven hours every day in the long halls, the bright classrooms, the noisy, spacious field house, the labs and shops and commons of the big buildings on the corner of Harrison and Wolf Road just off the expressway only fifteen minutes (if the traffic is flowing well) from the Loop.

About all they have in common, however, is their almost daily physical presence in the school. For what happens to each one is different even though they all pass through the same halls carrying, upon occasion, identical small white and pink passes or eat the same barburgers in the cafeteria during their half-hour lunches. School is a central fact in their lives but it is not all-important--may be, in fact, of only marginal importance. There is work. Even though the job may be menial and poorly paid, it becomes for some a stronger factor than school in the shaping of their lives.

And there is athletics--part of school, true--but in a different sense from the business of papers and books. Others find direction among the dozens of activities that are almost incidental to the professed purposes of the school--plays and publications, clubs and the casual contacts with hundreds of other kids of similar and very different backgrounds, and views.

Not every student finds even this much at West. A car, a cycle, a special girl or boy, tropical fish, a musical group--any one might be definitive in the education of a given student.

Yet for most West *will* have made a difference. For the teenager's world is not actually separate from the "real" world.

Abruptly teenagers find themselves adults.


What will their years at West mean then? Will most have received their \$6,528 worth? What will wrestling do for a future taxpayer? Will usherettes add to the life of a harried young mother? Will compro or world history or algebra really alter the life pattern of West graduates? Practically all of this year's 4,600 students will be parents of other students. How will their experience influence their view of education?

The boy who pumps gas now may be an executive for an atomic energy company. The girl who waits tables may serve on the state legislature.







## Well | Voted--But For What?


You stand there in the booth and wonder why you are standing. You would sit, but there is just not enough room. You glance at the candidates then you look again. What odd names.

I don't like these names at all. Who's ever heard of a Walker. You would think he would walk the length of the state with a name like that.






#### Spring Comes Every Year . . . '73 No Exception


# ''.... when I Stepped Out On Moon Soil ....''

The Prom . . . high point of the last days of school or just another plastic festivity?







## Board Supervises Nine Room Addition

Though their names and faces are unknown to most students at both East and West, the men who make up the Board of Education for District 209 are an important part of every student's school experience. Elected by the voters of the district and meeting long hours each month, these seven men attempt to solve the ongoing administrative and financial problems with the advice and assistance of school administrators from both schools.

In 1972-73 the Board supervised the construction of West's newest addition, a nine-room, three-story structure on the north side of D-Building. Utilizing one existing wall, the new construction involved a minimum cost to tax-payers.

In November the new building was only a gaping hole between C-Building and the north parking lot.

All-school testing for both schools was Mr. Vandevender's main interest while Mr.



#### **Even Early Birds Feel Creative Urge**

What is worth getting up in the bleak winter morning darkness for--educationally speaking? For some fifty West students who make up two Early Bird art classes, the bright, cluttered rooms of the art department have enough drawing power to run competition with their own warm beds. Altogether on any one day more than five hundred students work there with clay and glazes, tempera paints and oils, paper and canvas--all the fascinating paraphernalia of the artist. With five teachers to direct their efforts the classes turn out a mind boggling variety of pots, paintings and design assignments.

From September until Christmas the more aspiring students work at assembling portfolios of their best efforts for entry in the National Scholastic Art Contest whose winners are first exhibited at Weibolts in Oak Park and later sent on the New York for national competition. West has traditionally received more than its share of national awards.


#### Data Processing Course Expanded

Business courses have traditionally appealed to more girls than boys, but with the introduction of data processing at West the picture is changing. Of the more than two hundred students who took advantage of the greatly expanded data processing classes this year, at least half were male.

Sharing equipment with the business office, students learned to operate not only key punch machines but the 1130 computer, the accounting machine, reproducing punch, card varifying machines and the card sorter. The classes were situated in D-building directly across from the machines room, conveniently close to the computer, and equipped with two dozen key punch machines rented from IBM.


Only a very simple introduction to programming was included in the new course though a more extensive programming course is being planned for next year.

In addition to being available for individual counselling, each of West's thirteen-member guidance staff holds some fifteen half-hour guidance classes every week. This year, under a new department chairman, Mr. Francis Lyne, counsellors met regularly to identify the areas most in need of discussion and to clarify their approach to the problems once they were identified so that the brief sessions with students might be more worth while.

The team approach was further expanded to include the Deans and other members of the administration, who, upon occasion, visited counselling classes and talked directly with students regarding rule changes, drug problems and curriculum requirements.

Seniors, instead of attending regular weekly guidance classes, had a more flexible arrangement in which they were met in their study halls by their counsellors. Periodic sessions for Early Birds were arranged during 5-A in the Little Theater.

A popular assistant to all the counsellors was CIVIS, the new computer-connected information retreval system which was especially useful in determining college choices since information on hundreds of schools was almost instantly available to any student typing in his request on one of the sets in the counselling office.











#### Flexibility Is the Name of the Game in English

In the reading center students work on their own time to improve reading skills or, as part of their Junior year, spend several weeks of concentrated effort as members of a class. Students with specific, diagnosed reading problems have classes geared especially to their difficulties.

Non-college-bound Seniors may, in

Mass Media and Contemporary Humanities, come face to face with aspects of their immediate worlds not necessarily reflected in books--field trips, films, newspapers and TV take the place of concern with Shakespear's and Milton's England.

Cross-disciplinary groups such as American Studies and Academic Humanities combine the expertise of members of several departments--art, music, social studies, science--with English.

Student directed learning and teaching teams all contribute to West's continuing effort to provide a flexible and varied approach to the teaching of English.

## Child Development Course Introduced

Should little Dennis suck his thumb? What approach should his mother take when Johnny pushes his little brother off the couch? A new prevocational course introduced at the second semester provided answers to questions like these for Sophomores, Juniors or Seniors interested in becoming either managers or aids in day care centers.


The course, which was open to both boys and girls, has general value as well since it is designed to help students understand children better--knowledge which could be useful to any person involved with young children from older brothers and sisters, through baby-sitters and future mothers and fathers, interested in helping their children's maximum development.

## At West Drafting, Shop Pay Off

How much effect on the lives of students does their work in Industrial and Technological Education really have? A partial answer was received this year when, in reply to a questionnaire, last year's graduates were asked how important vocational instructors and courses were in determining their initial success in entering the job market. More than half replied that they had found their experience as vocational students very important. Approximately one out of three of those working also indicated that their employment was directly related to their high school courses of study.

Advanced Auto Technology and Advanced Technical Drafting and Electroncis prepare students to work in skilled jobs directly upon graduation while the introductory courses provide basic skills and an opportunity for students to gain a clear idea of their interest in the field.

# Language Students Eat in French, Spanish, German

What language does a *taco* speak? Or a *crepe?* Foreign language students absorb a taste for foreign foods along with the vocabulary which would enable them to order the dishes in a restaurant in Mexico or France or Germany. Spanish III students, in fact, even learned to write recipes in Spanish and experimented with cooking from a Proviso West Hispanic Cook Book prepared by the class. Later, to check on the success of their own efforts they had dinner at both a Mexican and a Cuban restaurant.

French and German students, though they did not attempt cooking themselves, did have dinner at the *Flying Frenchman* and *Zum Deutschen Eck.* 

West's numerous Spanish-speaking students have found that members of the Spanish classes can often help in unravelling their problems with English, giving English-speaking students an opportunity to serve as interpreters. In return students who have recently come to the United States from Cuba, Mexico or Spain are able to give vivid first-hand information on their former homes.

Vocabulary and grammar, are of course, the basic elements in all language programs but cultural and historical aspects of the countries are not ignored and current events are also part of every class.




#### SDL Gives College Preps Boost In Math


A brand new SDL calculus course was introduced for the first time this year and found more than thirty college preparatory students working toward possible advanced college placement. As many as twelve hours of advanced placement credit have been earned by students in past years. Students from this year's course could prepare for placement exams in either differential or integral calculus. Compro came on fresh and new this year also with a completely rewritten course of study. Students still worked with Fortran IV but were encouraged to design their own projects around the basic programming techniques. The SDL geometry course which was introduced last year was revised for greater effectiveness.

#### One Out Of Four At West Takes Music


Many "required" classes are suffered through by their members every day, but at least one out of every four students at West spends an hour a day involved happily in instrumental or vocal music.



Imagination and innovation--this year girls' PE sparkled with both. Four-and-ahalf week units in wide variety were available--several for the first time.

In a new program Juniors and Seniors were given the option of electing the units of their choice rather than being included in a uniform program. Skiconditioning was one such course, involving not only exercises for strengthening legs and back, but instruction in care and handling of equipment.

Fencing and flag football were also firsts. The latter gave girls the chance to enjoy the excitement of actually playing football and to add to their expertise as TV football fans as well.

Dance added an advanced class, Modern

Dance IV, and a modern jazz unit during which the girls danced through the evolution of popular dances including tap and the Charleston. Freshman dance students were introduced in their rhythms classes to square dancing.

The after school program of gymnastics continued with more girls involved than in previous years.







# Girls At West Aren't Science-Shy

Nine *girls* in physics? Correct! Onethird of West's innovative project physics class this year was female--a record and hopefully an indication that girls with a genuine interest in science will be less hesitant to follow it up than in the past.

Earth science this year found students involved in a variety of activities that translated the ideas in text books into "real life". One such venture made the practical problems of space travel more vivid. Each member of one class packed an egg according to his own idea of protecting it against breakage. Each student's "space capsule" was then dropped from the top of C-Building. Only those whose egg made the trip unscathed received satisfactory scores on the exercise.

Physiology, biology and chemistry classes which involve extensive lab work were particularly aware of the restricted budget which limited supplies.









# Who? What? When? But Most Important-Why?

Less than twenty minutes east on the Eisenhower one of the world's great cities rumbles and roars, sending up clouds of pollution that, if the wind is right, sting the eyes and throats of Early Birds stumbling into A-Building in the damp morning. For, though Westchester and Northlake are not Chicago, they are nevertheless very much a part of the larger urban pattern that ties city and suburbs together. In recognition of this idea the Social Studies Department introduced a new course, Urban Studies, this year. The course uses as its text, appropriately enough, the daily newspaper.

Innovative, fresh and realistic approaches to the problems of government and society at large are standard, however. Last year's introduction of several interdisciplinary programs was successful enough to warrent expansion this year. And simulations, role-playing, opportunity for student directed learning projects were all utilized.

## Special Services Simplify, Facilitate


Faculty members are people who take roll and make assignments--right? Well, sometimes. But there are other members of West's faculty who contribute in other, special ways which make school a much more satisfactory place to pursue a diploma.

The big, cheerful library rooms that take up almost all of the second floor of the main building hum all day with activity. Not strictly class rooms perhaps, nor study halls, they can still be more productive of education upon occasion than either.

Though no department has felt the pinch of West's current austerity more keenly, the Audio-Visual Department remains a vital part of the whole school program.

Less obvious than these two is the work of the Special Education Department whose members are concerned with working directly on problems regular curriculum assignments fail to touch. Work and school are no longer divided into two separate worlds. A number of work-study and vocationally oriented programs attempt to bridge the gap between.

Though blind students are not as numerous as in past years, West's teacher of the blind is available to assist blind students and a speech therapist may be called upon by any student needing her help, as can the school social worker.

#### There've Been Some Changes Since '61


As West's student body has increased in size, the faculty as expanded accordingly, more than doubling in fact, since 1961 when the first graduating class marched, 525 strong, in the June heat of the new gymnasium. There were, for example, 25 English teachers then compared to this year's 45 and eleven science teachers have been increased to 25. But among this year's faculty of 245 there are still some 38 men and women who were part of the 1961 teaching force of 118.

Courses have changed also. *Silas Marner* and *Julius Caesar* are no longer familiar names to most of West's Sophomore English students. Psychology and urban studies have appeared in social studies. Compro has assumed a priviliged spot in the mathematics curriculum. In language Latin has diasppeared, as has Russian, both taught in 1961. In all departments core, student directed learning, team teaching, and interdisciplinary studies give new flexibility and variety to learning experiences.

West has expanded physically as well to house its nearly 5,000 students compared to its '61 enrollment of barely 2000. First C-Building, then the field house, and finally the two mini-buildings on the south and north have been added.

But the 34 new teachers who joined West's faculty this year, the 38 veterans of '61 and the 183 others who have been, for varying periods part of West's faculty, all share a similar enthusiastic and genuine interest in teaching and students.

And they still make hearing tests, though the lack of adequate space makes this service increasingly difficult.




## There Was Something New-Guitar Classes








## Orchestra Has Very Busy Year

The Orchestra also performed in the Township concert, which combined both Proviso West and East Orchestra's, and the Fine Arts Festival held at the end of the year.








#### Usherettes Collect \$283 for UNICEF



#### Library Aids Prove Indispensable to West








#### Work-School Same For VICA Members



#### New Coach Yonkus Disappointed By Cat's Poor '72 Showing






#### Sophs' '73 Season Had Only One Win



Paul and Eric Edgecome, Larry Turrilli, Bill Klein, Jim Goray, John McHugh and Bruce Jayne did outstanding work.






# Varsity Grapplers Take Third In WSC

## Underclass Wrestlers Rate Fair Season









## Varsity Batsmen Take First Place


For the first time in the history of the West Suburban Conference, the Panther varsity won the conference title.

Coach Braucher described his players


as working throughout the season close to their potential. The teams conference record was 0-8 with an over-all record of 4-10.


# Varsity Golfers Have Dismal Year


