
## Billie Bombed Bobby

# **'Putting on a Play**

#### is Fun...and Work!"

Putting on a play looks like fun . . .

It is fun, of course. Ask anyone who has worked on any of West's two big annual productions, or sweated out the contests.

But the fun is qualified by effort-a lot of effort. This year the fall play was Arsenic and Old Lace but the timetable is always pretty much the same. It averages about eight hours of work by more than fifty people for every single hour of onstage performance time before an audience.

This year it went like this:

JUNE 14 Arsenic and Old Lace chosen and approved for production in October.

JUNE 30 Planning begun on scene design. Lists of materials needed compiled.

JULY 1-10 Fabric and other materials priced in stores.

JULY 12 Requisitions written so approval can be got before school begins for purchase of scenery and costume materials.

**AUGUST 10 Send for scripts** 

SEPTEMBER 10-14 Tryouts and casting. (Without scripts which have failed to arrive)

SEPTEMBER 17-22 Recruiting and organizing of crews to build sets and make costumes.

SEPTEMBER 24 Rehearsals begin but scripts have still

not arrived. Most rehearsals start at 3:30 and frequently go on until 9:00 five days a week but usually Saturday too.

OCTOBER 1-6 Regular rehearsal. Scripts finally arrive. Tech crews work feverishly on the set which includes a live-in window seat.

OCTOBER 15-20 Scenery is on stage and light and sound effects are worked out while Mr. Grothe goes crazy.

OCTOBER 26-27 Dress rehearsals Cast advised to bring sleeping bags. It's an all-day, all-night business. The doors stick. The corpse needs more room in that window seat...

NOVEMBER 1 First matinee. The audience laughed! They liked us!

NOVEMBER 2-3 Night performances and Kloppman enlivens the first one by falling over a chair.

NOVEMBER 9-10-11 Night performances. Ursula Meyer sets all-new world record for time spent in a window seat.

NOVEMBER 11 Strike the set! Six weeks' work destroyed in thirty minutes!

NOVEMBER 15 Get ready to start all over again. This spring a musical--The Boyfriend.











Fall at West was settling into the routine of school and looking forward to the coming year.


The various clubs around school gathered to get organized and to plan activities.








# Two Dark Highlights-The Exorcist and DST



Mr. Jerry Cummings, returned from Australia after a two year leave of absence at the beginning of second semester.














# Class Night, Graduation Last Memories For '74







The blob is no longer a blob. It becomes a vase or a bowl whose curves and colors belong uniquely to the person whose hands shaped it. Or the same clay might curl and angle under probing fingers into a strange little animal or a portrait head. The same magic turns ordinary paper and cardboard or canvas into things of genuine beauty which would have remained locked in the brains of their creators without the stimulus of West's art classes.

More than students spend at least an hour every day at the easels and drawing boards of the three big rooms behind the cafeteria. When the best of their efforts are exhibited for competition each spring, the number of awards earned is evidence of the quality of their effort.













#### Counsellors Taught, Counselled this Year

#### Are Featured in English




Tapes of TV programs which appeared during the year were recorded and used to provide an added dimension to the study by Juniors of West Side Story and for sophomores, of Frankenstein.

#### More Economics, Less Home in Home Ec This Year

The girl who takes a home-ec course with the idea of learning to turn out a gourmet meal for her husband or sewing a budget school wardrobe for herself is in for a rude surprise. The home economics program at West is in the process of becoming almost entirely vocational in its approach.

Sure, it's still possible to learn to knit or do needlepoint in Needlecrafts and meal-planning for the family is not forgotten, but the main interest in most courses is increasingly job-oriented, Foodhandling is a field which employs thousands so training in diet, buying and pre-

paration of food gives valuable background for many different jobs.

The big, bright, green-carpeted rooms which make up the home economics part of the new addition on the first floor of D-building will eventually house an even more important part of the vocational program--a working nursery school which will be staffed in part by West students learning to deal with young children as day-certified day-care center supervisors or attendants. A one-way mirror will allow students in the classroom to watch the nursery children without being observed.

### West's Tech Students Know Their Skills Are Keys to Satisfying Jobs

The room is big, quiet and bright. At the high, slanting desks twenty students work with concentration and skill. There is little "teacher talk". The instructor moves up and down the room, pausing at a desk to answer a question or make a suggestion. When the bell marking the end of a traditional class hour rings, nobody grabs for his books. This class is three hours long! As a matter of fact, however, it is not particularly unusual. Vocational drafting is one of four advanced vocational classes which meet for three-hour

periods.


Vocational graphics and machine tool classes were taught at East to students from both schools while East students came to West for drafting. Both schools maintain auto shops for the vocational auto shop students. Sharing facilities makes it financially feasible to keep equipment up-to-date and consequently capable of providing students with the sort of experience which allows them to move from their classes directly into jobs using their skills.





## It's Not All Grammar In Language Classes






















### Mathematics, Not 'Jolly Numbers' Taught at West

From basic sets to circular functions; from DeMoivre's Theory to flow charts-West's mathematics department covers a lot of ground. "We try to teach mathematics, not jolly numbers," declared one faculty member.

Bearing out his contention is a quite sophisticated honors program which begins with a freshman honors course, continues through SDL geometry and algebratrigonometry, to climax in a full year of calculus. This year nearly forty students graduated as products of this rigorous discipline placing well in the AB and BC advanced placement examinations.

Data processing classes expanded to three during the second semester, familiarizing students with Fortran IV as their basic computer language and giving instruction in programming. However there were plenty of courses for students who were not altogether math freaks. General math, regular geometry and algebra were also available.

The guitar class, introduced last year for the first time, was even more popular this year and Madrigal repeated its Christmas dinner-concert that is becoming a holiday tradition.
























## SDL Biology Gives Scope for Experiment


Just what is involved in providing living things with air that is fit to breathe? Pollution and other ecological problems became more than newspaper items for the ninety-five Sophomores enrolled in SDL biology this year. Student-directed learning classes include students with more than passing interests in science and each student pursued his own project in addition to the work done by the class as a whole. So a live rat submerged in a large bottle, his air provided by the experimenter, produced specific information on the effects of varying degrees of pollution.

Other classes worked toward the development of an area to the east of the school into a prairie wild life and plant preserve.


### Austerity Leaves Mark on Special Services

As was perhaps to be expected, austerity was more evident in special services than in any other area at West this year. A single speech therapist who divided her time between East and West replaced the former two full-time therapists. Audiovisual supplies were painfully restricted. The Polaroid copier was useless for lack of film while other duplicating equipment lacked paper. Repairs on projectors were made only with difficulty and delay. The library's two ten-year-old microfilm readers became almost inoperable by the end of the year so that many thousands of

dollars worth of microfilm was inaccessible to students wishing to use it.

Health services remained crowded into one small room in A-building where two nurses managed as best they could to cope with the problems of more than 4,000 students. A single social worker gave token assistance to the same number.

A bright spot was the continued operation of the work-study programs which gave more than a thousand students opportunities to combine formal schoolwork with actual paying jobs.







Other outstanding players included Jim Carlo who led in hitting with .429 and shortstop Bob Caponi who led the team in runs scored and stolen bases and hit



According to Coach Green West's track team should improve over the next two years because there is a fine crop of underclassmen coming up.


The sophomore track team had a good indoor season finishing 2nd in the conference, but had a disappointing outdoor season, finishing 4th.



Leading the team in it's quest for par were seniors Don Galman and Rich Doyle who put out much pain and effort trying to find the primrose lane to victory.



## '74 Season Was Long, Hard, Disappointing





# Sophs Take 2nd in Metro, Finish 6-3-1






West's five-point win over Proviso East in the Christmas tourney was definitely a high point of the year and gave the Cats third place.

Leading the team in scoring were All-Conference selections Kurt Schoenhoff and Dave Sykora. Sykora also owned the single game scoring record with 40 points.



games by close margins." He concluded by remarking "We must avenge ourselves by placing well in the State playoffs."




#### Sophs Finish 4th in WSC





Several outstanding individuals backed by a faithful and hardworking team failed to come out of last place and finished with a disheartening 0-6 record for this year's Varsity wrestling season.










This year's sophomore wrestling team finished fourth in their conference with three more wins than they had last year as freshmen.


The three extra wins during the season showed that West improved steadily and next year hopes for a first place trophy in the conference.








Coach Fiorovanti indoctrinates his son in the fine points of wrestling during a Saturday meet.

According to Coach Boyce the '75 season should be a considerable improvement because a number of talented Sophs are moving up to fill the varsity ranks.




#### Flourishes in '74














Ken Pojman demonstrates fine form on rings.

"Most valuable" at West in the fall of '73 were Tom Kurland, Larry Turilli, and Mike Sogar.



## Kloppman, Murphy, Schoenhoff, Pezzullo Are Outstanding in Winter Sports



Kurt Schoenhoff, a steady and consistent player, was recognized as an All-Conference selection.





Books--more than forty thousand of them--tapes, records, magazines, pamphlets--West's three full-time librarians could never possibly cope with them alone when every day at least a thousand transactions concerning them take place. If all those pieces of resource material are to remain available for the students and faculty who stream past the desks in the North and South libraries every hour the library staff would need extra hands. They had them--West's Library Assistants. This year's able crew donated their free time daily to making the library a smoothly functioning part of the school. In addition to their checking, filing, and general assisting, however, they managed a Christmas party and banquet in the spring.

The reading center has many of the problems which face the library-thousands of separate pamphlets, books and

tapes and almost endless record-keeping to make the daily work of the students laboring to increase reading speed or comprehension meaningful. In addition much equipment must be regularly checked and individual students assisted in learning to operate it. Without the English Aids, reading teachers would have to use much more of their time in routine work and less in actual teaching.

"Indispensible to the operation of the science department," is how Mr. Slimmer, Science department chairman, described the Laboratory Assistants. But there's another side to their work. Only exceptionally talented science students were chosen as assistants and in the course of their duties they learned many skills not normally taught in any of the science courses.












The '74 yearbook faced the usual




The annual induction banquet was held in May this year to give awards to the outstanding senior and rookie clubber. They also attended a spring convention for I-I District Key Clubs.





## Dads Date Daughters At Girls' League Dance










## Board, PTSO Keep West Moving Ahead

#### West's Fire-Warning System

#### Gets Brand New Look

No longer will fire drills be as unpredictable as they have sometimes been in the past. West's entire fire warning system was updated and overhauled this year. To begin with, all fire alarms in the halls which were formerly easily manipulated by mischievous students, were enclosed in glass. Then all controls, formerly located in widely separated parts of the building, were placed in a single basement location where they can be handled quickly and without confusion by a single person.

A board monitoring all fire alarms in all buildings and all smoke detectors is an important part of the new control system. Included also is a master switch for all exhaust and ventilating fans so that they could be instantly shut off in the event of fire.

Nine new rooms and the new parking lot brought additional maintenance problems, but students and faculty stayed warm and comfortable as always.















#### West's Unique Mural


#### Designed by Oscar Howe

Hundreds of thousands of tiny ceramic tiles, specially glazed and fired form the great, curving mural on the west wall of the administration building. Year after year students glance up at the design scarcely aware that it pictures a panarama of life far removed from the roar of the expressway and thunder of jets.

Oscar Howe artist in residence at the University of South Dakota in 1958, was an American Indian artist and Assistant Professor of Fine Arts. Commissioned to produce a piece of architectural art to decorate the 'new high school' then being built, he felt that a piece of art continuously exposed to sun and rain, wind and snow, might very properly feature an Indian theme. So, drawing on the graphic nature forms from traditional Sioux Indian skin-painting techniques, he used a rhythmic, harmonious pattern in soft buff, deep brown and cream against a blue-gray background. He set each one of the tiny tiles himself and the flute player, the deer, the long-lost passenger pigeon, the Indian brave on his horse, the buffalo-all part of America's past--remind us of a world we never knew but represent, nevertheless, the fact that nature around us still forms the beginning of enjoyment of all the other good things of life.


Proviso West...It's Really a Beautiful Building!



In the 1950's it became obvious that Proviso East could not serve the hundreds of new students who lived in the rapidly growing suburbs to the West of Bellwood and Maywood. So in 1957 voters approved approximately seven million dollars in bonds to build a new high school on nine holes of the Hillside Golf Course. The well-known architectural firm, Perkins and Wills, designed a strikingly modern building--low, sweeping walls of rosy brick varied by panels of blue and orange metal and great expanses of glass. A beautifully landscaped mall divided the gymnasium from its opposite wing which housed shops, cafeteria and music and art areas. Class rooms were contained in two, two-

story wings now referred to as "B" and "D" buildings. Widely photographed and written up in magazines devoted to schools, Proviso West was one of the most modern and impressive school plants of the early 1960's. When C building was added a year or so after the school's opening, the quadrangle, which is one of its most interesting features, was produced. The addition of the field house in 1969 and the two nine-room additions to B and D buildings in 1972 and 1974 have allowed West's student body to expand comfortably from less than 2,000 to 4,500 and though the auditorium, included in the original blue prints, is still a dream there are plans for its construction in the near future.






