



West As I Remember It

As Told To Mike Reynolds and Sam Trezzo

"Take a chance. Don't be afraid you'll fail." With that, Mr. Tom Helms reminisced about the old days. To Tom Helms, the old days are our school's beginning. Mr. Helms was one of the first twenty students from Proviso East to decide on things like the new school's colors, mascot, and song. Those twenty people were, for all practical purposes, the first student council of Proviso West.

That group was composed of Freshman honor students and class officers who would soon be members of the West student body. They were chosen by the administration to help orientate the rest of the students to Proviso West in the fall of 1958. The student council as we know it did not appear until 1960.

Before leaving East, the student group had decided that our colors would be red and white. The panther was also decided upon. As Mr. Helms pointed out, the panther was a "mean" emblem chosen to represent the tough fighting image West's teams hoped to have. The only problem turned out to be the fight song. The group considered and eliminated many possibilities including the Notre Dame and University of Minnesota tunes. Finally, "Navy Blue and Gold" was selected. It was the theme song of the then popular TV show Men of Annapolis. Carol Bokorney wrote the words.

After the school song, mascot, and colors were decided, the hardest part came. That was to break the ties with Proviso East. Mr. Helms said that it was tough because: "Most of our parents had gone there." During the summer of '58 those twenty chosen students found themselves no longer East students. They were West students now and it was going to be up to them to help orientate the rest of the sophomores (who had been freshmen at East) and the new freshman class. What greeted the West pioneers just before the fall of '58 was horrifying to them. They saw huge concrete slabs that would soon be the halls of West.

"Everything smelled like paint and there was white dust everywhere." This is what faced Tom Helms and his classmates in the fall of '58. The classrooms seemed to be set up so no breezes could get in. By mid-afternoon, they smelled like "locker rooms that had just been painted." Mr. Helms also noted that "there was always someone working over your head." You see, when the building first opened, many parts were still incomplete, especially third floors of some sections. One of the biggest student complaints involved the lack of reality that West had. The walls were painted cement block instead of "real" walls like East had. Everything seemed to be made of steel, cement, and glass. West's first students did not appreciate the modern design of their school. They longed for the comfortable old halls of Proviso East.

Finally, though, routine took over and the sophomores and freshman students began to accept West as their own. Mr. Helms' sophomore class had the unique distinction of being the "upperclass" for three years, since they were to be the first graduating class at West. They now hold the distinction of being West's first alumni.

Shortly after West settled down to its routine, the administration made the stairways one-way. Chuckling, Mr. Helms recalled the problems that students had because of the up and down staircases. He explained that most of the guys had carefully worked out their routes to be able to walk their girls to class and then to get to their own classes without being tardy. Once the stairways became oneway, most routes were messed up since the up stairways were at one end of the hall while the downs were at the other. To the further horror of the student body. the administration used big, yellow cut-out feel pointing up or down the stairs to show the direction of the staircase. Most students felt that signs or simple arrows would have been better. Needless to say there were many unhappy students until the stairways once again became two-way.

During his reminiscing, Mr. Helms commented on things that have changed since the early days of West. Football, like all sports back then, had to start from scratch. Under Mr. Don Maechtle, West's Football team got started. In the fall of '58, the sophomore team (which was the only team) played "everybody and anybody" to get some experience and recognition as a team. Finally, in '59, a varsity team took shape. Even with a varsity team, though, West had fan troubles. Everybody went to East games because they had a stadium and because their older brothers and sisters were there. Mr. Helms pointed out that back in '58 kids really looked up to older brothers and sisters.

Girls' sports were non-existent then. The only thing girls could do was try out for cheering or join the Girls Athletic Association. The G.A.A. was a type of club that girls could join to play intramural sports.

Dress Codes were pretty strict. Girls never wore pants. They wore only skirts. When they entered the shool wearing a skirt of questionable length, they were asked to kneel. If their skirts did not then touch the floor, they were sent home with an unexcused absence. Boys, too, had strange rules to follow. Two of the rules that Mr. Helms especially remembered were that boys had to wear belts (even on pants that were designed to be worn without one) and that every shirt had to be tucked in. Mr. Helms quipped, "Do you know what a banlon shirt looks like tucked in?"

Another facet of school life that was vastly different then was activities. Every day before school, there would be dancing to records in the upper gym. A guy could meet his girl and dance for a half hour or so, then go to class. At lunch he could meet her again in the mall for more dancing and socializing. On nice days, the lunchtime dancing took place in the outdoor auditorium area.


Mr. Helms feels that types of students haven't really changed much. Names for types of crowds have changed, but kids still tend to break into social groups at school. In '58 there were the Hoods, the Social Climbers, and the Nothin's. The Hoods were greasers. Leather jackets, cycle boots, and greased hair all made up their Fonzie like appearance. Girls from the group wore a lot of make-up and severe hair styles. Social Climbers wore flat tops and cardigan sweaters. Their girls wore skirts and sweaters and sometimes full round skirts with cut out poddles sewed onto them. Hair and make-up styles were much less severe than the Hood group. The Social Climbers was the most active group in school. They organized most of the happenings. The last group was the Nothin's. They did nothing but attend class regularly. Their interest in school went only as far as passing and getting

In concluding his reminiscing, Mr. Helms said, "Because we were the first in everything, everything was historic." Because of those "historic" events, West developed a past, but most importantly. West developed its own traditions. Finally, the break from East became reality. West students began feeling pride in their school. As a result, Proviso West now stands on its own. In the following pages, Mural presents West as it is today, twenty years after those first students reluctantly left the safety of familiar Proviso East to help establish the new frontier of Proviso West.




Fall Brings New Faces






Graduation Arrives
























Art Enrollment Is Past Peak

In the early days of West, the Art department was about as small as it could be. There was only one art teacher who taught four classes of art. The total enrollment in those classes was about 90. That's quite a difference from today's enrollment of 450. With decreasing school enrollment, though, art enrollment is on the decline. The peak year was 1974 when 500 students participated in art department programs. Currently the Art department is made up of 5 teachers who instruct a total of 20 classes.

Business Ed. Meets Needs

To meet the needs of West's business students, the Business Education department has changed over the past 20 years. Business Exploration has replaced General Business. Data Processing and Consumer Education are new since West first opened for business. As the emphasis on vocational education increased, West's Business Department again changed to accomodate student needs. The result was Office Occupations, a work program which allows girls to gain actual office experience while earning high school credit. Local businesses cooperate with West's Business Department by hiring O.O. students.

In addition to keeping courses up to date, West's Business Department is fortunate to have excellent facilities and equipment. The wireless stenography machinery and data processing equipment, for example, help to keep West's Business Department on top.






Guidance Dept. Has Grown


Proviso West Counseling has seen many changes during the past twenty years. During the early years of West, freshmen and sophomores had physical education classes four days a week and a full period guidance class on the fifth day. Junior and senior guidance classes met once a week for only a half period. The '67-68 school year brought to an end senior guidance classes. During the following year, physical education classes were required five days each week, thus reducing counseling to half a period per week.


From 1958 until 1964, there were two counselors assigned to each class. There was a man for the boys and a woman for the girls. Until 1960, students would get a new counselor each year. In 1960, the superintendent asked the counselors to vote on the system they wanted. Most counselors felt they would be more effective if they remained with the same class throughout its four years. This system has been in effect every since.

The responsibilities of the counselors have changed over the past twenty years, but the primary concern of the counselors has always been the students of West.



West's English Adapts To Needs

Each of West's twenty years has brought change to the West English department. When West first opened, the English department offered only freshman and sophomore courses. Class designations were very different. Instead of basic, special comprehensive, or academic, a student would find himself taking repeater, minus, regular, plus, or plus-plus English! In 1959, junior courses were added to the curriculum. Juniors had a choice of American Lit., Dramatics, Functional English, News Writing, Public Speaking, and Secretarial English. In the fall of 1960, West had its first senior class, so the English department added Modified English, English IV Regular, and College Prep English, all senior classes.

Throughout West's 20 year history, the English department has continually updated materials and programs. Back in 1961, the department adopted the then new method of team teaching. As society began to place more emphasis on oral communications, the English department instituted a required freshman speech course. As the need arose or as current trends dictated, interdisciplinary programs, reading improvement programs, and TESL programs all came to West. Because of its progressive nature, West's English department became the site of the state funded Title IV program in 1976. Due to the program's success, it was continued this year.

Throughout West's history, the English department has expanded and adapted to meet the changing needs of its students.



Government Aids Home Ec.

Because Proviso West's Home Economics department prepares students to be more skillful and efficient employees in various jobs as well as efficient in the home, almost every one of the courses is now reimbursed by the State and/or Federal government.

Since 1958, several new courses have been introduced. The needlecrafts course aids students in expressing their creativity and in making profitable use of their leisure time. West was the first school in this area to institute this course. Another first for West was the institution of the Child Development and Child Care Careers courses. After West was in operation for a while, curriculum offerings were rearranged so that Family Living could be taught both semesters. Home Planning and Home Decoration are also offered yearly.

Specially equipped labs for the various courses help make West's Home Ec. department one of the best around.






Left: Student participation is important in learning a language. Above: Spanish class students lis-


Foreign Lang. Stresses Speech

Twenty years ago found the old grammar translation method used in all foreign language classes. Student involvement in languages outside the classroom was limited too. The Big thing for the language classes to do was to stage a gala Christmas presentation in which all classes participated.

Early in West's history, from the grammar-translation method rose the new audio-lingual technique whose whole thrust of learning was based on the conversational aspects of learning a language. The change in method prompted a change in textbooks and supplementary materials. Along with changes in existing language classes, a new language, Russian, was added to the curriculum.

During the early days of West, the most popular language club was the ROME club, or Latin Club. The activities were legendary with the Roman banquet being the highlight of the year.

With the coming and going of the Viet Nam War came also a general questioning of everything in America. The ALM approach to language fell prey to this type of questioning. Eventually a middle of the road approach to language was adopted by the department. Also, during this time period, enrollment in foreign language classes began to drop. Today's interest in learning a foreign language is considerably less than that of 20 years ago.







West's Math Sets Trends


West's Math Department has a twenty year history of being progressive. Back in 1958, we were one of the first schools to introduce the then "modern math". In 1965, West became one of the first Chicago area schools to offer computer programming. In 1976 West's Math Department received a grant from the National Science Foundation. The grant allowed West to establish a national model course in Algebra. West has occassionally been the scene of mathematics conferences and conventions.

Today, the Math Department boasts one of the best facilities in computer assisted math instruction. Course offerings as well as physical facilities have expanded since those early days of West.

Music Offerings Have Increased

Since 1958, the staff of the Music Department has grown. When West first opened its doors, we shared with Proviso East our one band director, one choral director and one orchestra instructor. Today, West has four full time music instructors plus an orchestra director.

Curriculum changes have been made since West first opened. Interested students can now take Music Theory or Humanities, as well as participate in Treble Choir, Chorus, Girls' Glee Club, Men' Choir, Mixed Choir, or Concert Choir. Band offerings have increased since 1958. Back then, West offered only Cadet Band and Concert Band. Today, music students have a choice of Cadet Band, Varsity Band, Concert Band, Symphonic Band or Stage Band.

Probably one of the biggest changes in the Music Department involves student enrollment. In 1958, total band enrollment was 60; today West's bands boast a combined membership of 250. Due to the increased enrollment, competition has become sharp. The spirit of competition probably contributes to the many awards the West music groups bring home each year.







West Students Work Out

Over the past twenty years, West's physical education classes have been keeping Proviso students in shape. For the most part, P.E. classes seem to stay about the same from year to year. Back in 1958, P.E. classes were required only four days a week. Today, students must take P.E. every school day. The students have a choice of regular classes, modified health classes, and special classes for athletes in training for a particular sport. Each student's choice depends on his individual needs.

Emphasis Is On Science Labs

When West opened, the Science Department offered a full year course in Botany and a full year course in Zoology. Both of these courses were dropped from the curriculum a few years later when a new course, Biology, was introduced. In 1958, all freshmen took General Science which was a lecture-demonstration course. Later, freshmen had the opportunity to take biology instead of General Science; and in recent years, Physical Science has been added to the options available to incoming freshmen.

In 1958, science had a course in Aviation and a course in Geology. The Aviation course was dropped a few years after West opened, and Geology was changed into the present two semester Earth Science. Since the early days of West, the Science Department has added Core studies, SDL Biology, Physiology, and Project Physics.


Back in 1958, science classes were taught in D building. During second semester of that first year, science moved into B building. Subsequent years brought the addition of more science labs in C building. Currently, the science department occupies 19 rooms.


The greatest over-all change in the science department's teaching philosophy is the elimination of the old lecture-demonstration type courses. Instead, emphasis is now placed heavily on student involvement through laboratory experience.







Social Studies Has Grown

The Social Studies department has grown with West. In 1958, there were only two teachers. Today there are twenty three. In the early days, social studies classes occupied only six rooms. Today they occupy sixteen.

Over the years, courses have changed. Contemporary History, Far Eastern History, Economic Geography, and Modern History have all dropped from sight. In their places are newer courses like Global Studies, Urban Affairs, American Studies Academic, Core Studies, and Development of Western Thought.

Of the twenty three social studies teachers, only one, Mr. Stilwell, has been teaching at West since the building first opened.







West Services Have Expanded

West's special services include the library, health services, and the audiovisual department. When West opened in 1958, A-V organized in the basement of E building. Later, A-V moved to A building and finally, a few years ago, relocated in D-2. In addition to changing location over the years, the A-V department has changed in other ways. Improvements have been made in the development of instructional television, the addition of a graphic arts center, IBM scheduling of films, computerized inventory, and the addition of an electronic repair center.

Both the nurses' office and the library have also been assisting the students of Proviso since the early days of West.

























Girls Bowling Rolls To Victory








Marinettes Get New Show Time





























Panthers Take Conference Win










Soph's Future Looks Bright


Young Panthers Look Hopeful

Despite the fact that the '76-'77 team was not spectacular, they showed a lot of promise. The '77-'78 team should be strong with all but two seniors returning.














Varsity Matmen Look to Future






Fourth Finish For Sophs






West Gymnasts Finish Sixth







Varsity Team Is Short but Tough






Debbie Kanak '78 Softball

As a member of the 1977 all-conference team, Debbie Kanak was a top outfielder on the team. Debbie led the team with stolen bases and carried a .400 batting average.




Burt Becker '77 Track


Jeff Subach '78 Soccer


Mary Beth Kennedy '80 Swimming


Under the direct leadership of these six men, West completed its 20th year and prepares for the next twenty.


















West Is Still Going Strong

Only The Faces Seem To Change





















West Spirit Is Passed On
