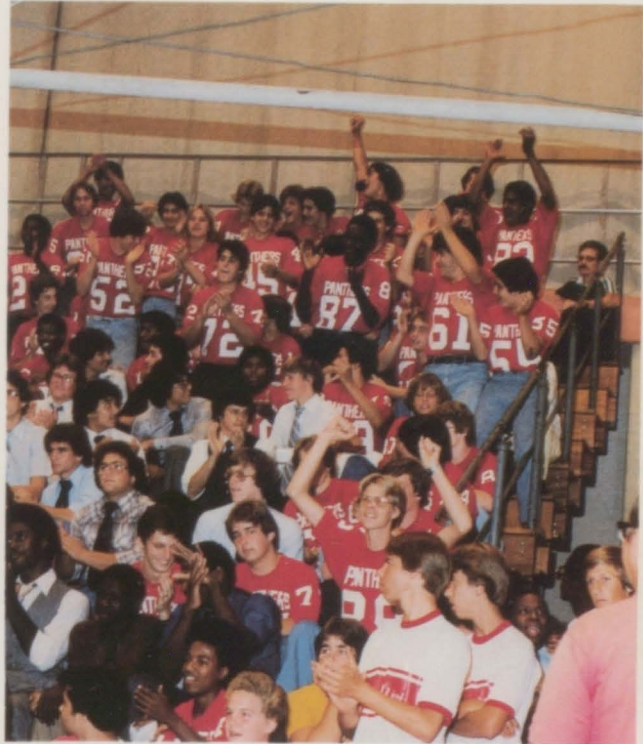

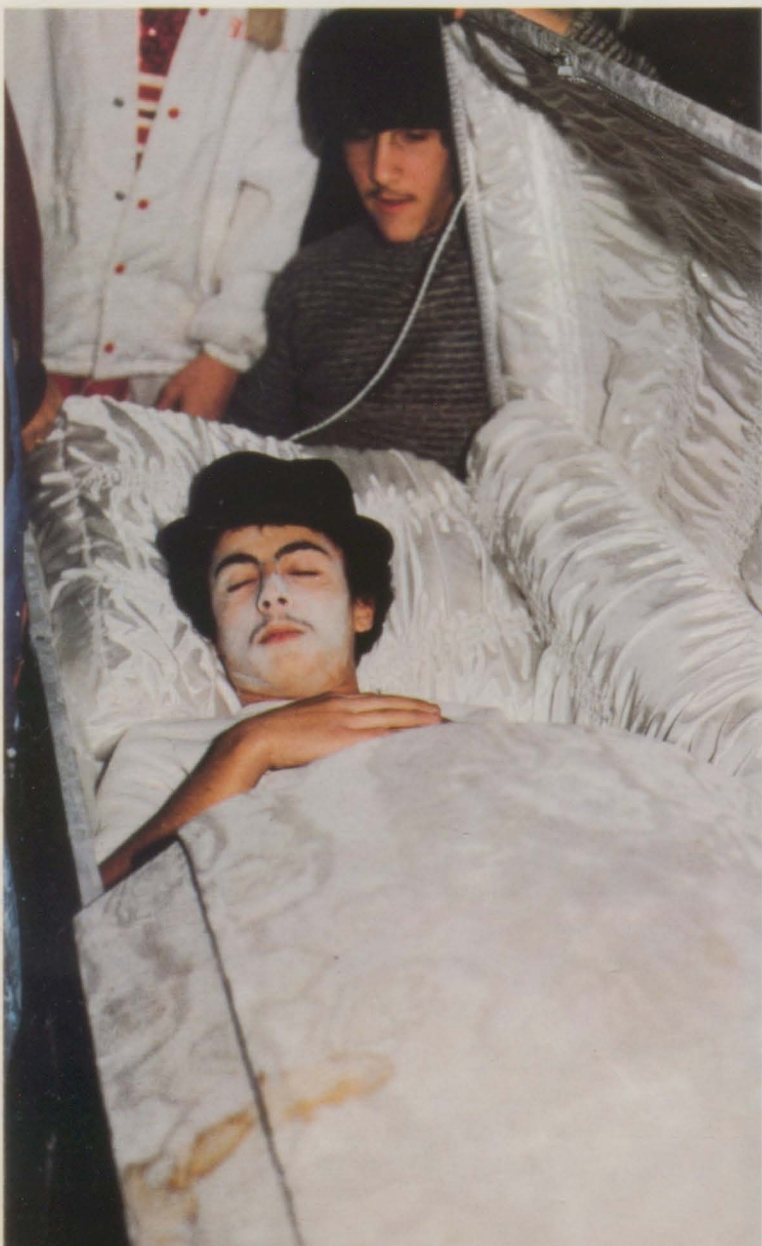

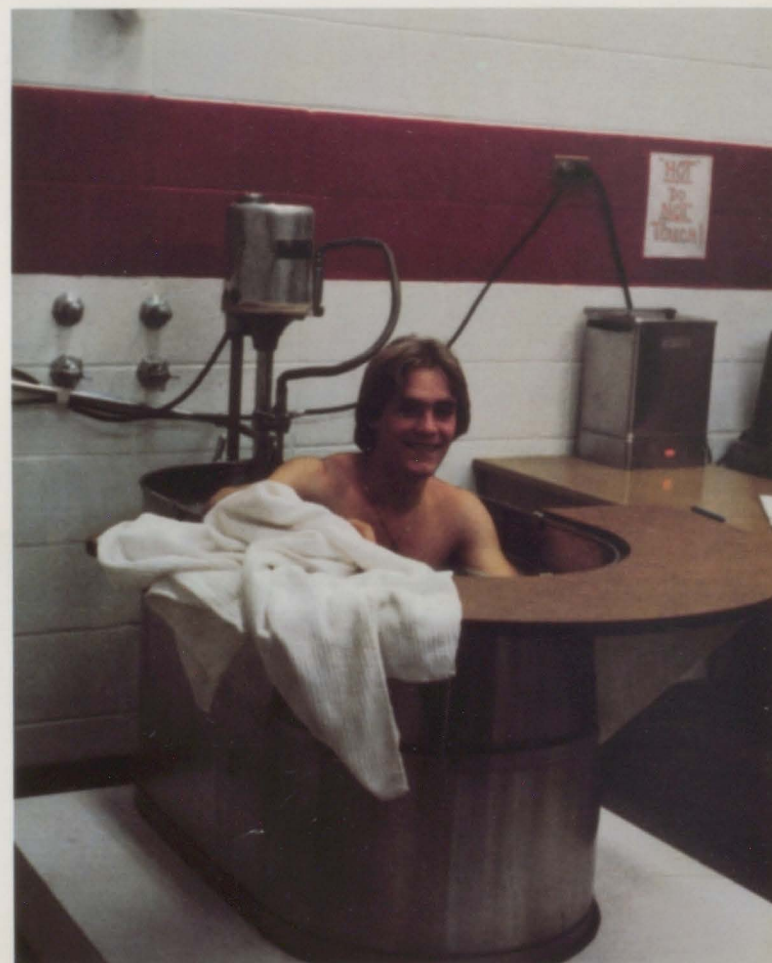


DETERMINATION

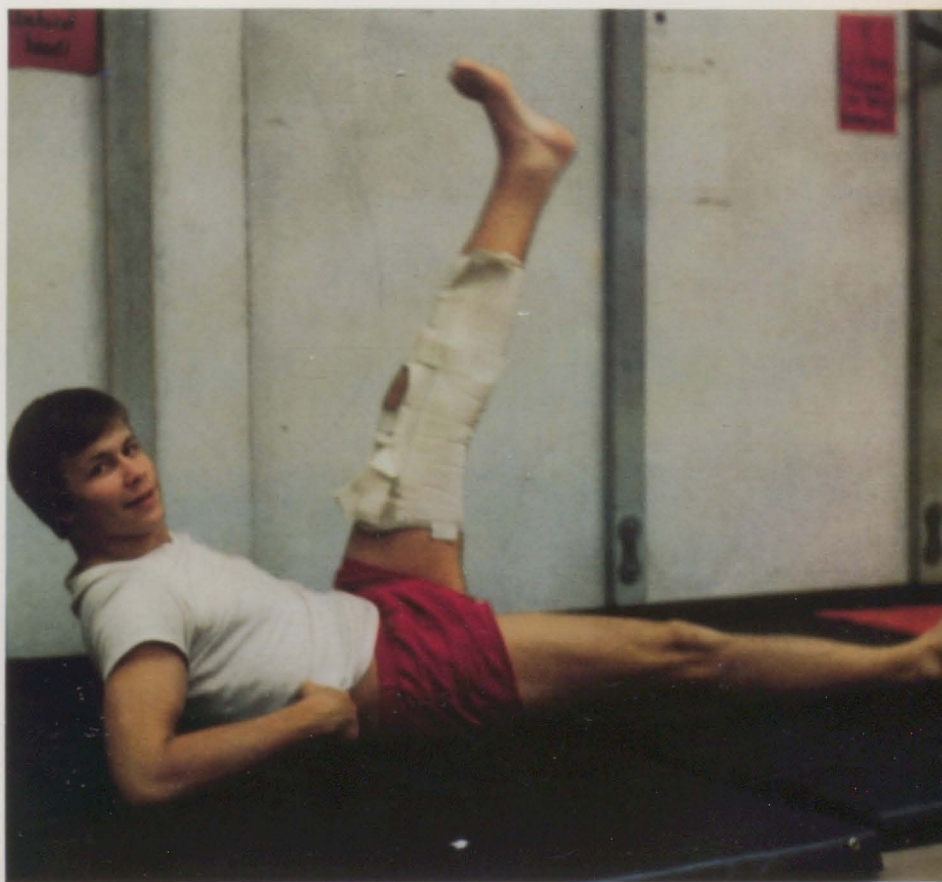




EXPRESSIONS

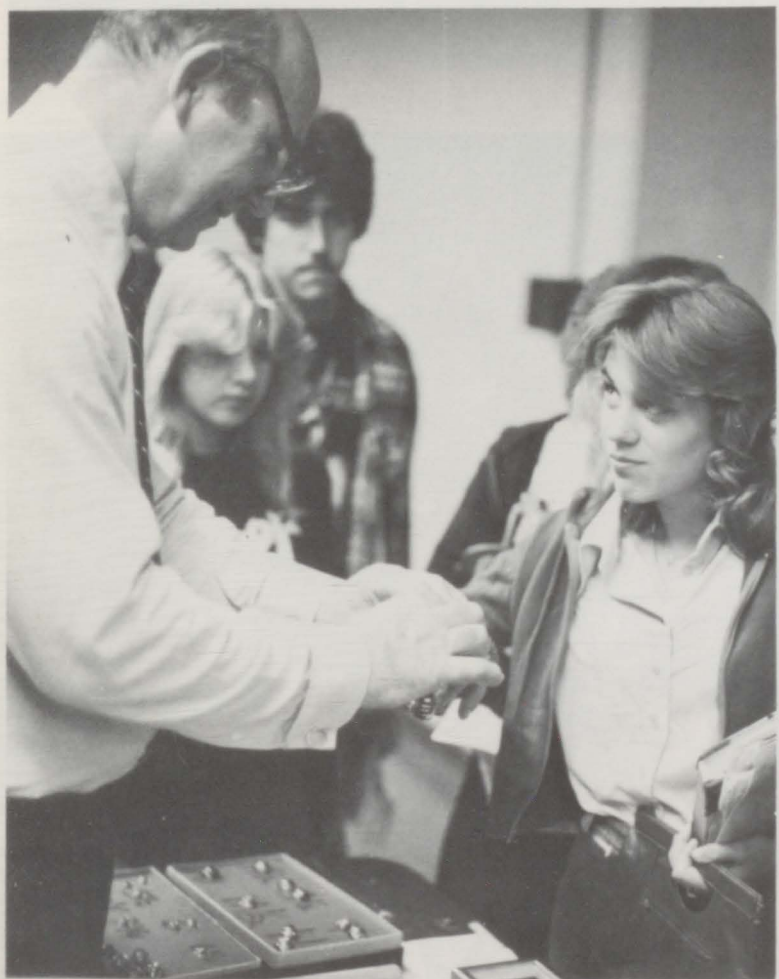
The Beginning Of A Decade

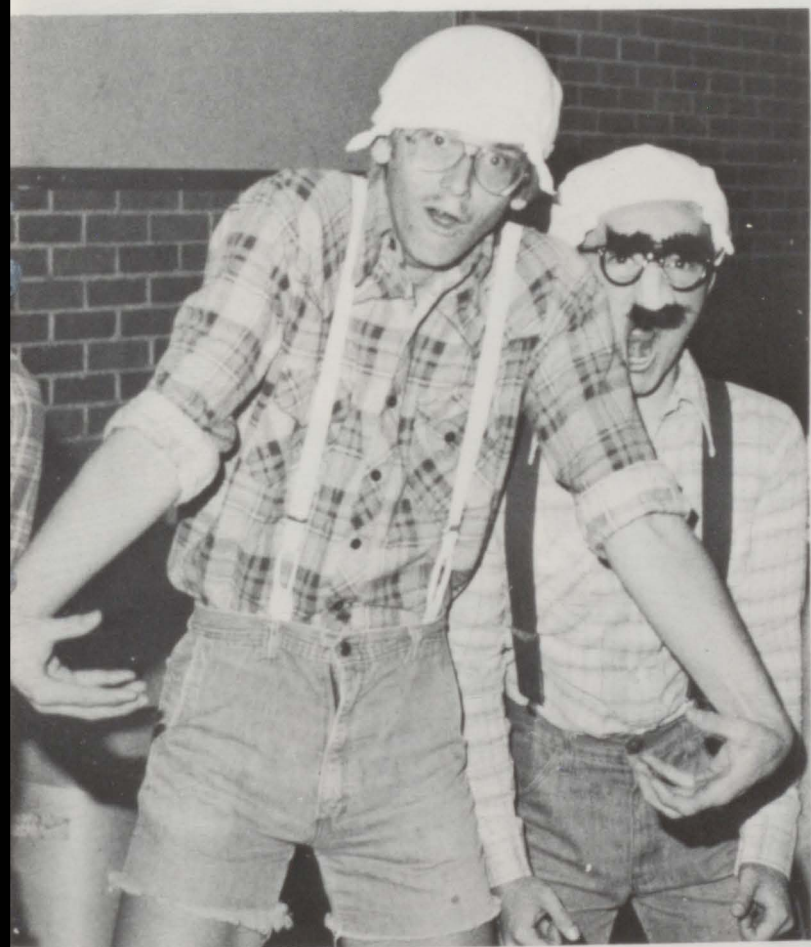

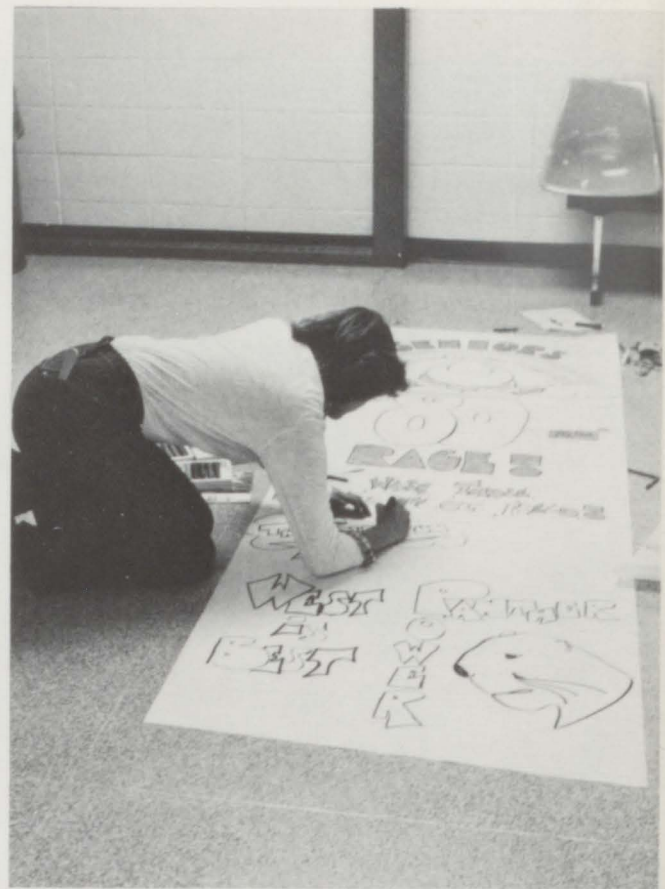

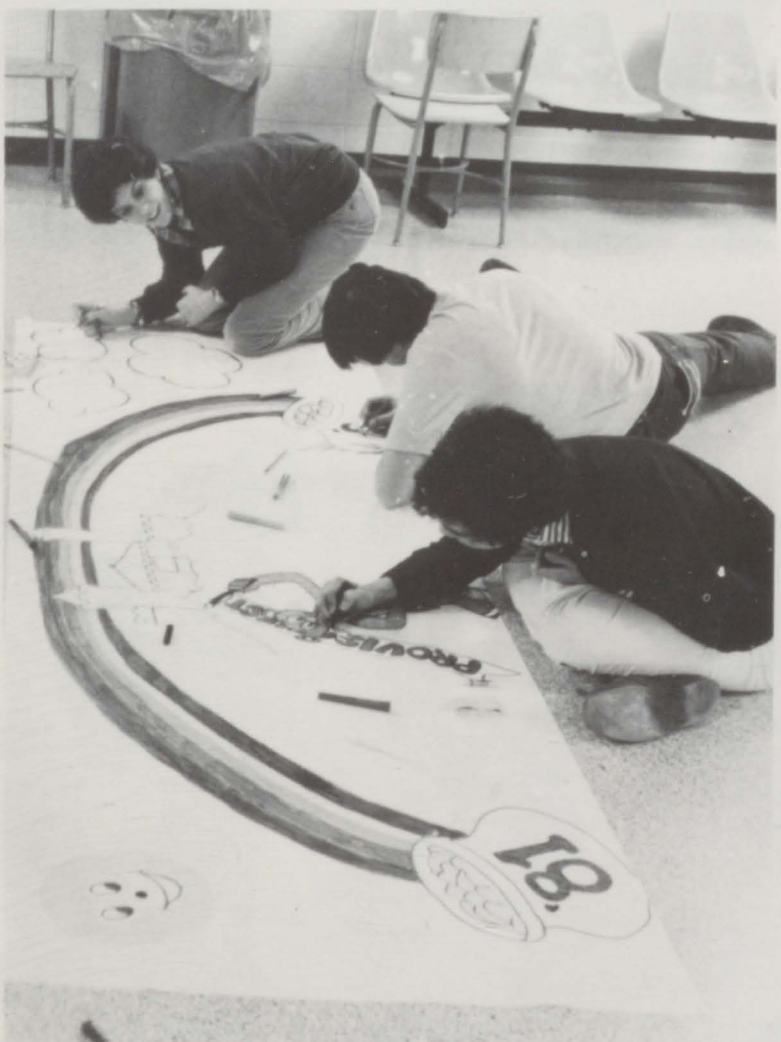

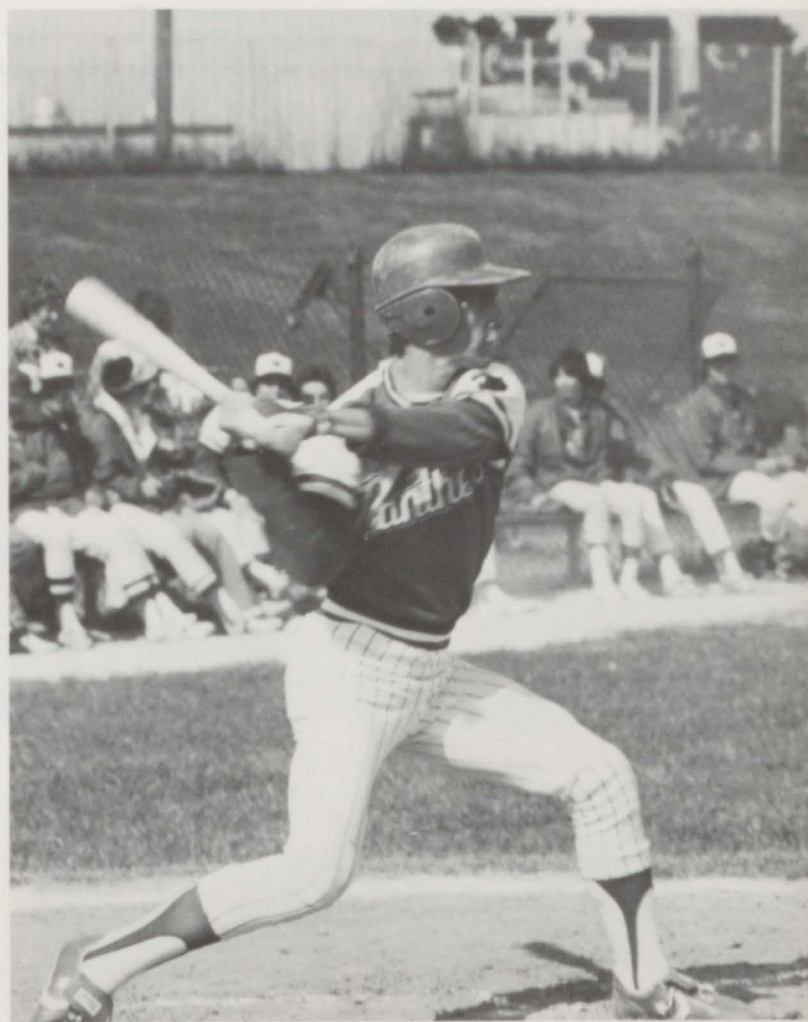

Sometime after Spring break; summer fever hits Proviso West. When this fever appears there is nothing to do except count the days until the last day of school.

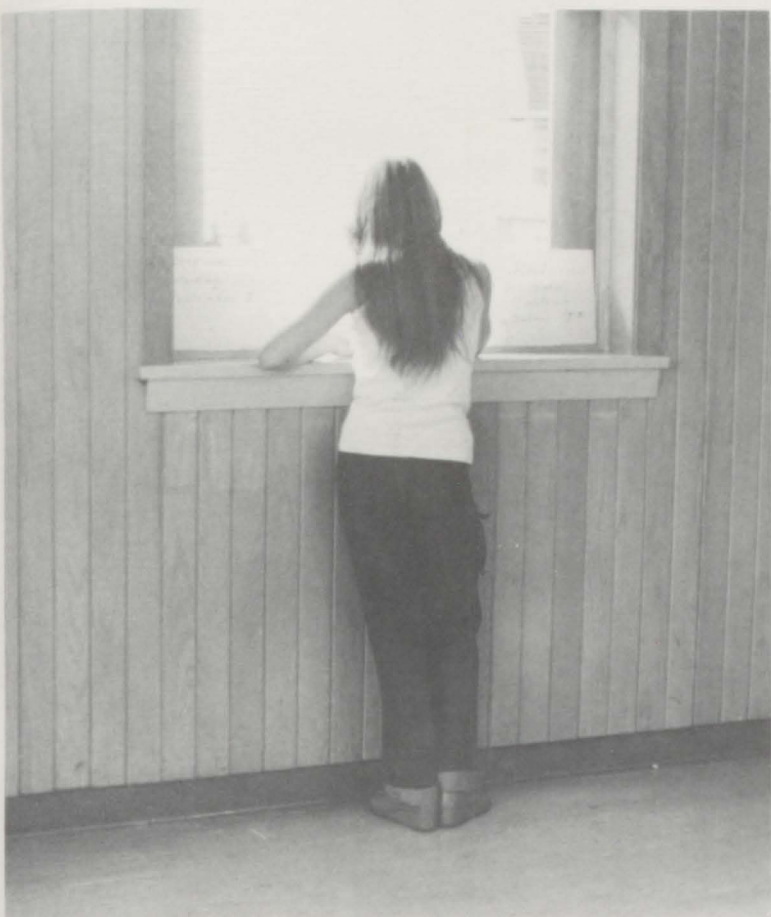

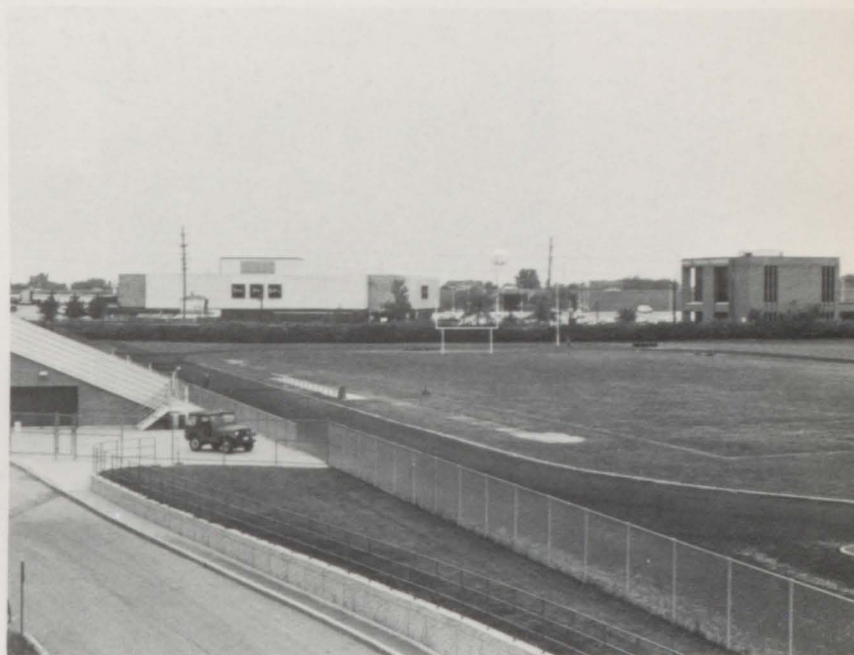

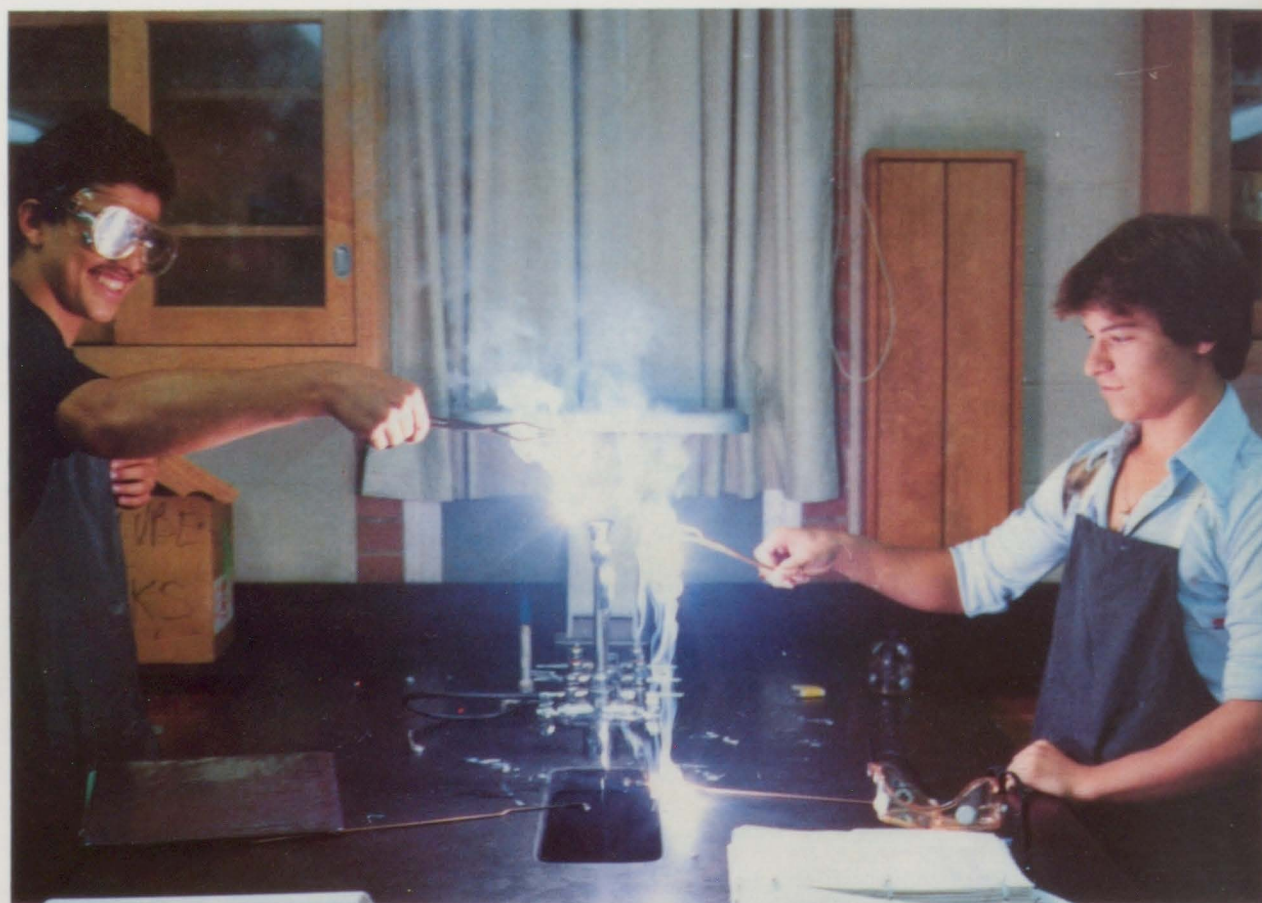


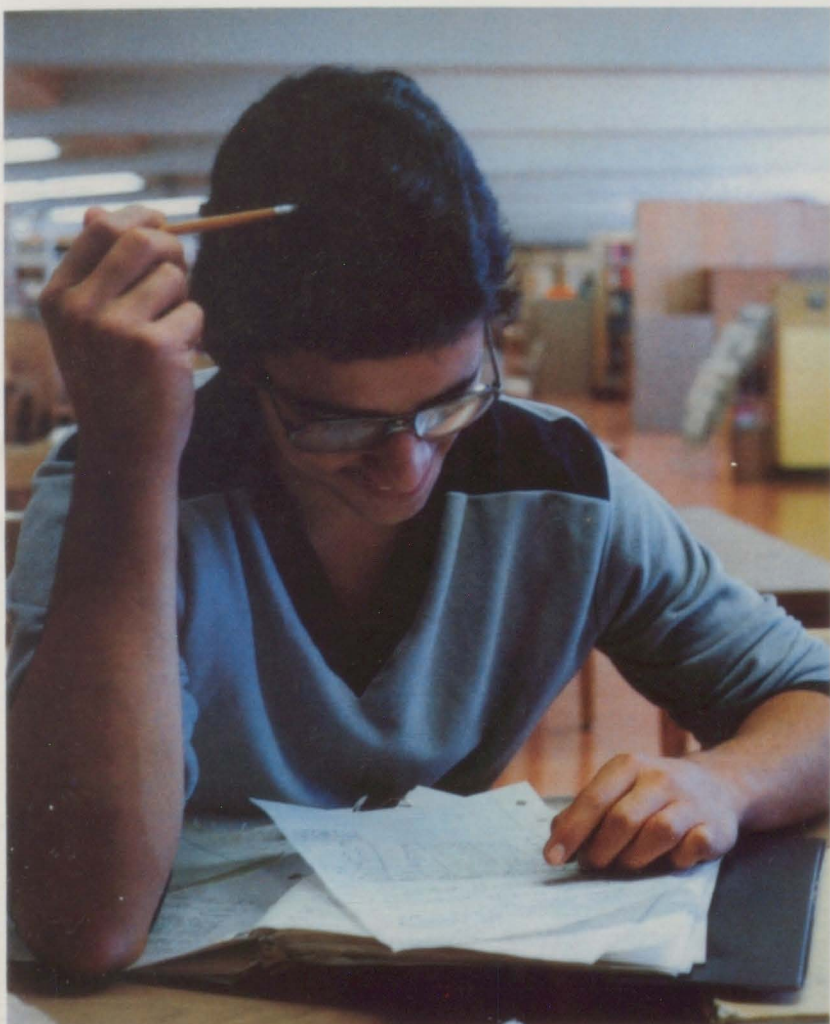

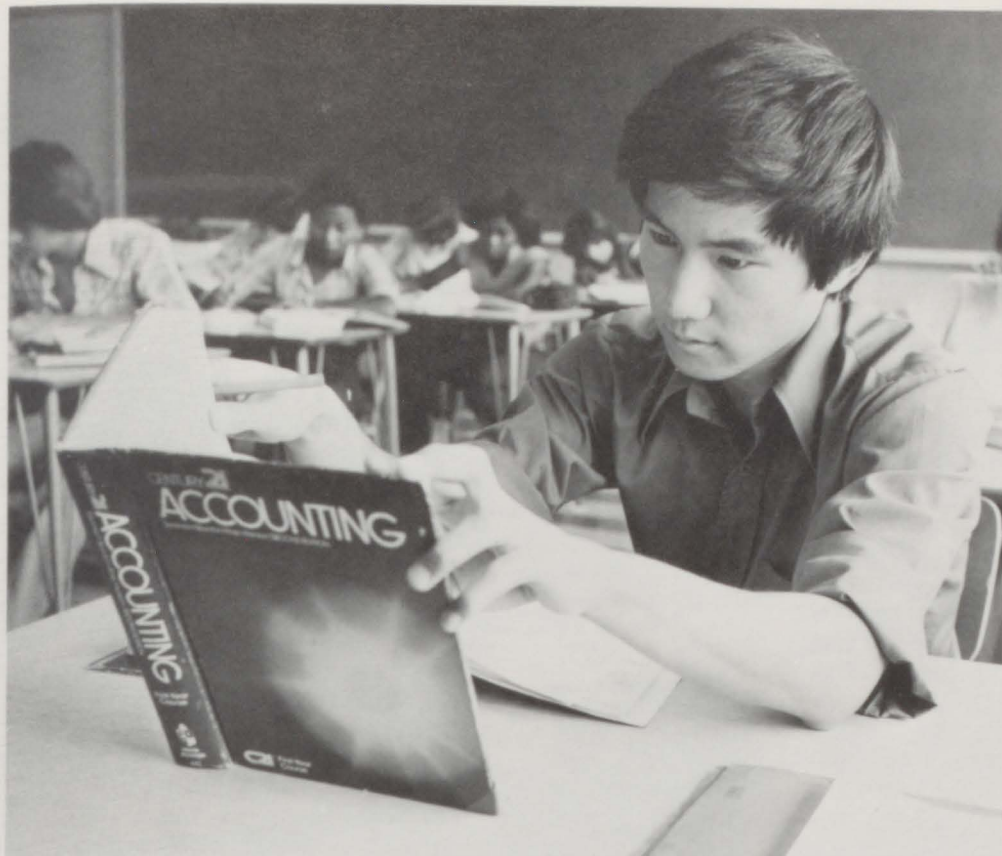


Above: Matt Wilbur creates a water color design in Art I. Below: Mr. Margita assists his students with line drawings.



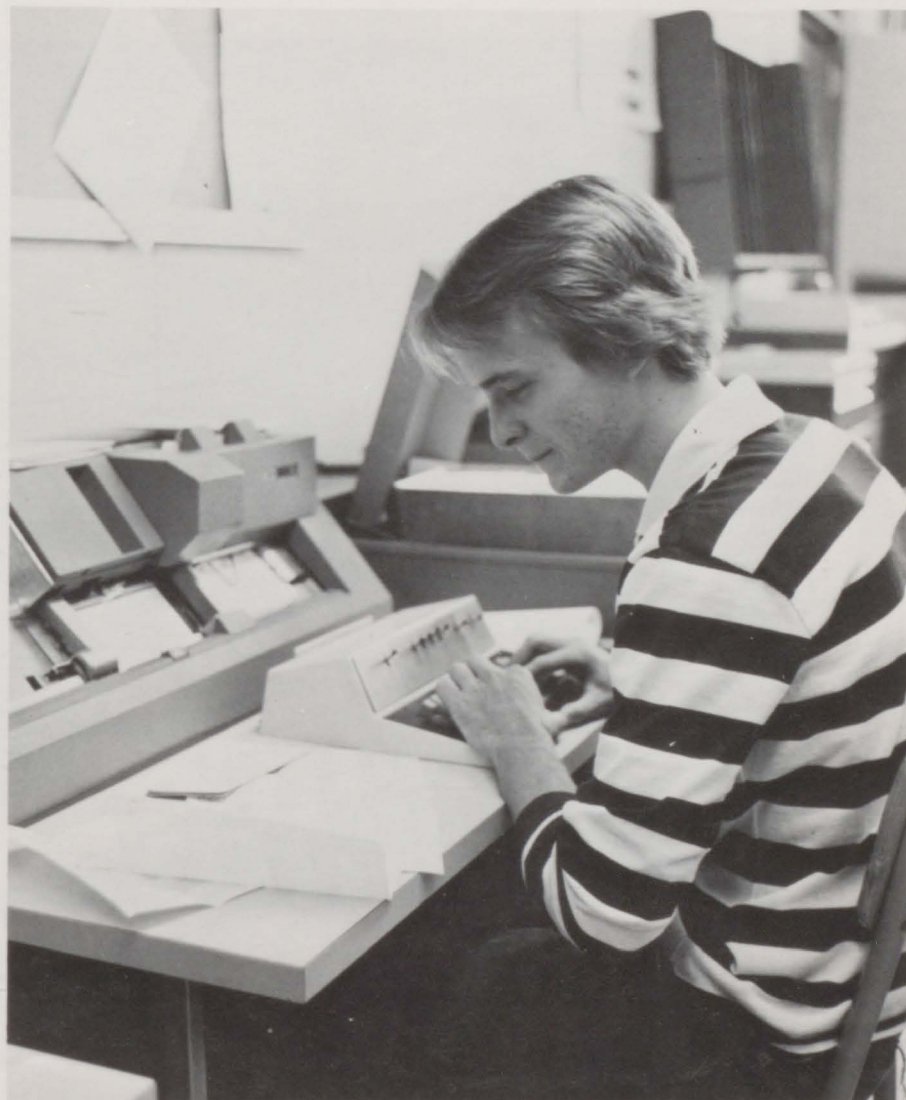
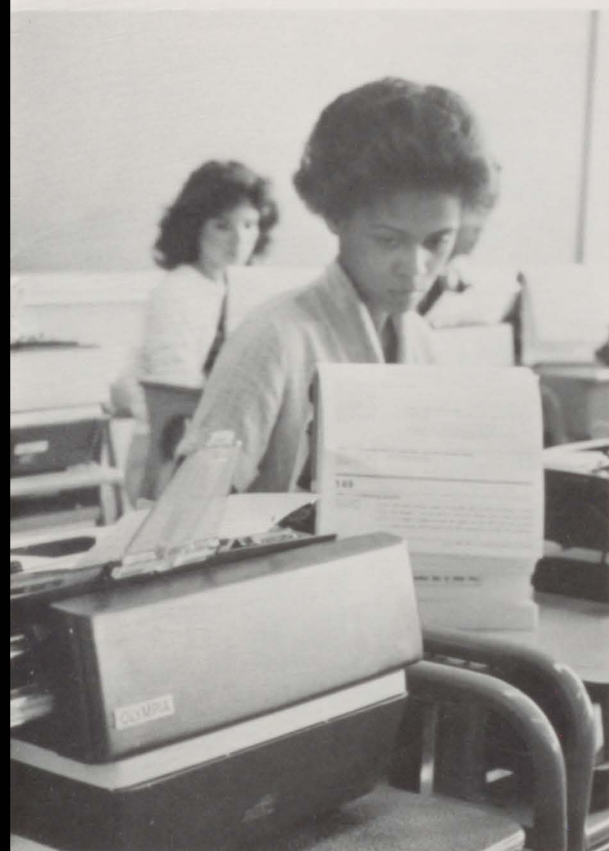
Right: These students begin to understand how to use the data processing equipment. *Below:* At first, Accounting may be confusing, but as the year goes on, students begin to catch on.

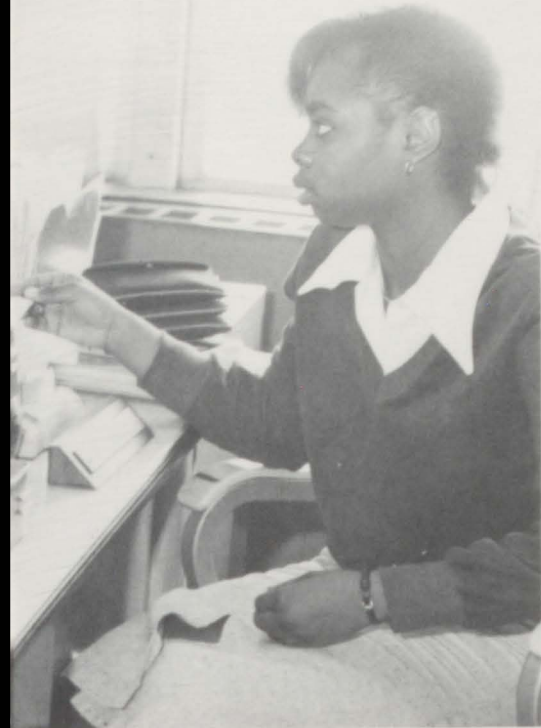
Counselors Help West Enter New Decade

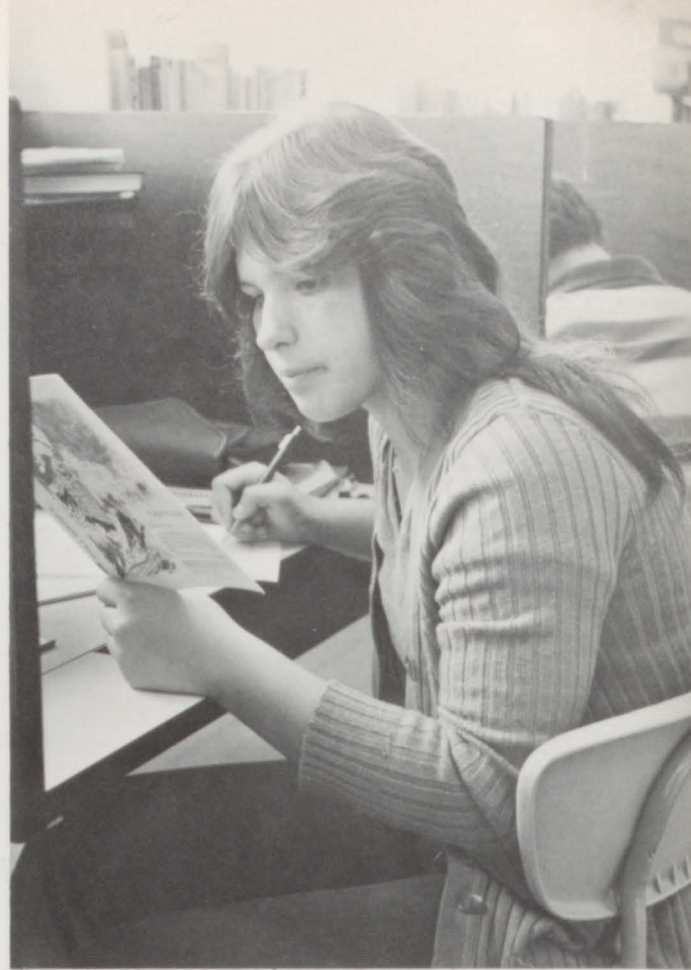

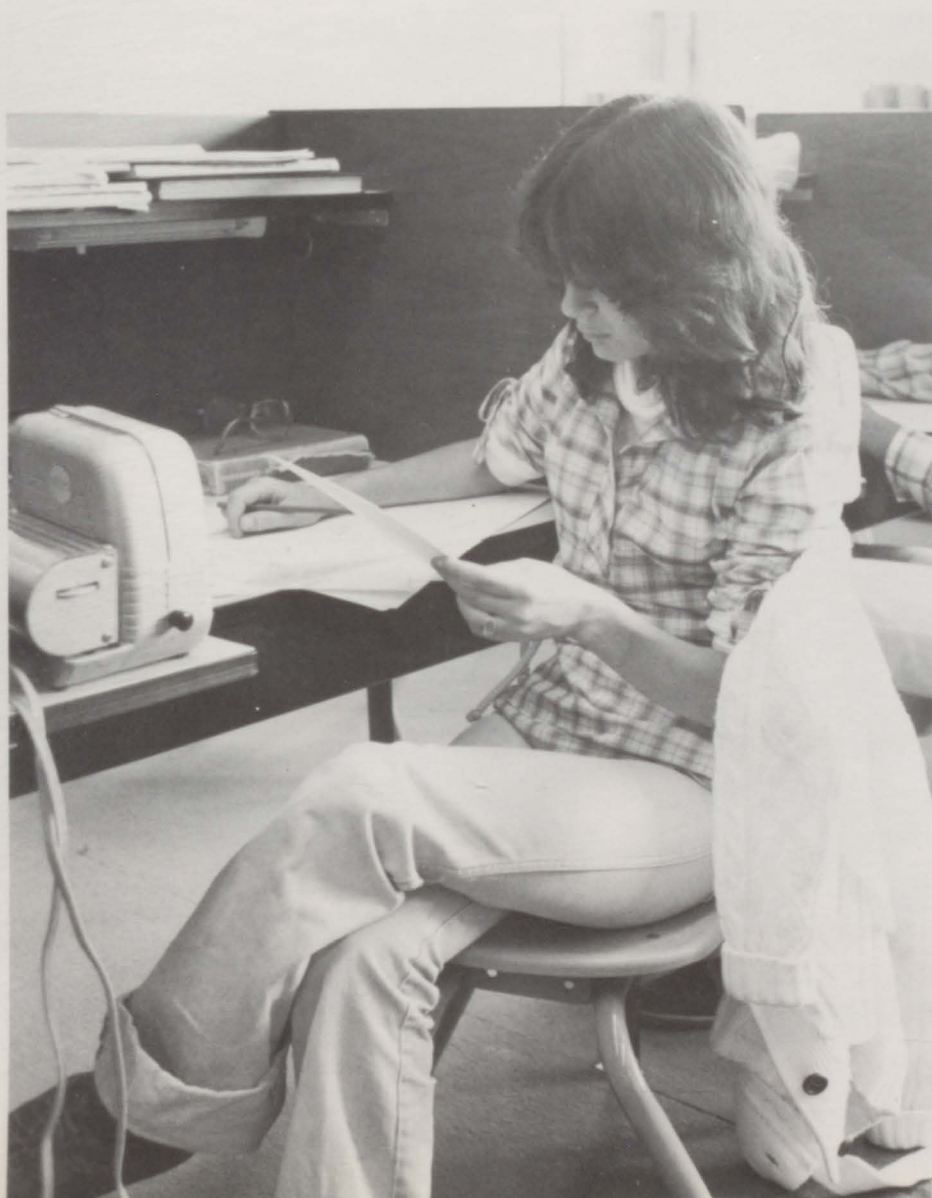


Tradition Returns To West's English Department

The past decade has seen much change in the English Department. The 70's witnessed tremendous growth and decline in student population. English involvement in interdisciplinary courses grew as the decade passed. Changing philosophy resulted in the use of more job-oriented materials in many English classrooms. Changing student population resulted in the growth of basic and special reading classes. The '79-'80 school term brought the revision of junior and senior basic classes.

As the past decade gives way to the 80's, West's English Department returns to a more traditional study reminiscent of the English taught in the 50's and early 60's. The coming decade will bring a greater emphasis on composition and speaking skills. Fewer electives will be offered as enrollment decreases and as more emphasis is put on standards of usage and on student achievement.

The new decade promises to bring more changes in methods of teaching and in materials used.



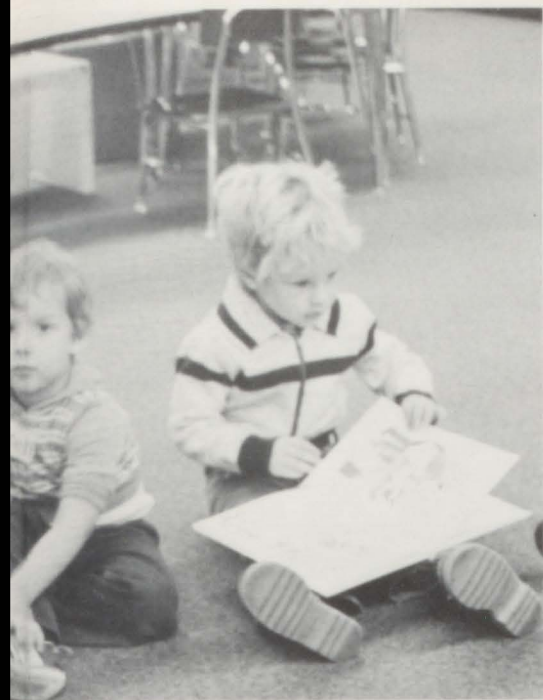

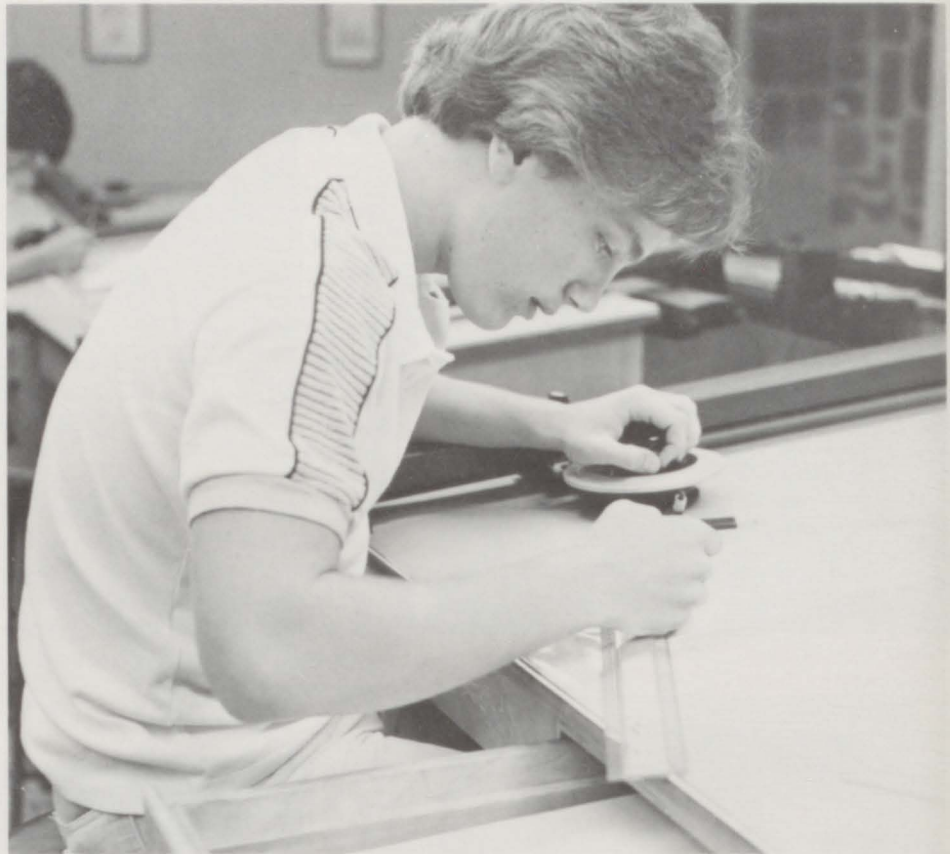

Industrial Ed. Readies Many For Vocations

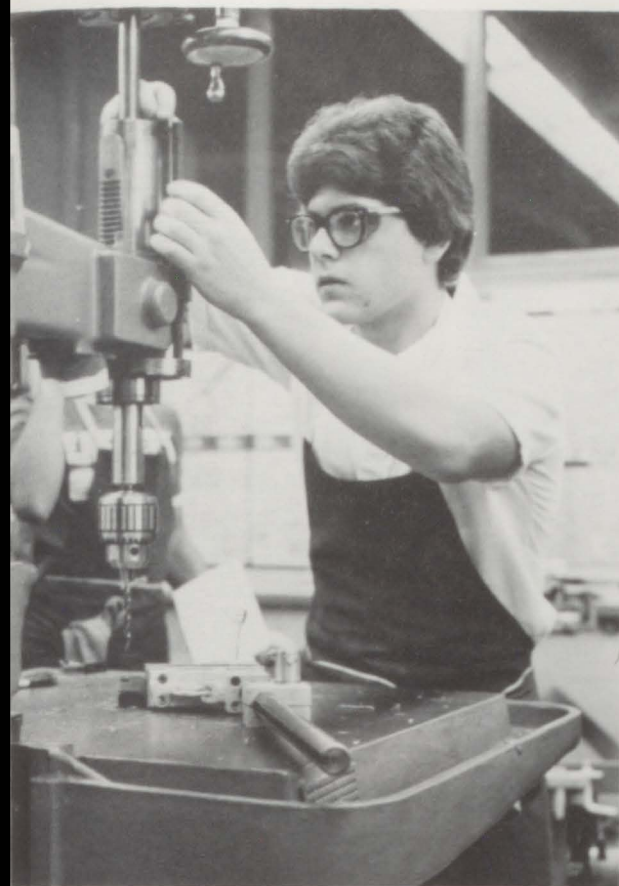

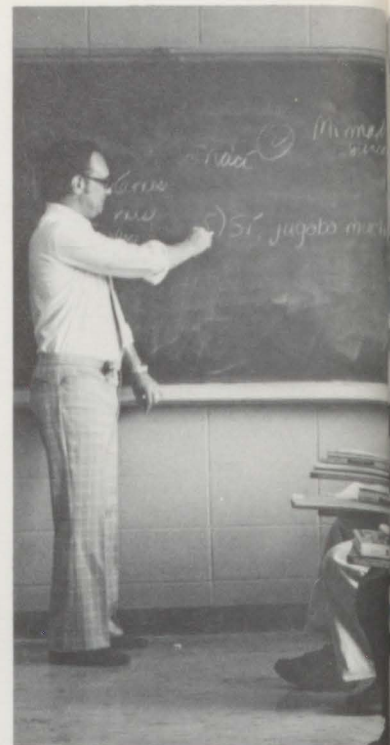

Language Dept. Changes With The Times

The past decade has seen the elimination of Latin from Proviso's language curriculum. This school year, the language department offered students the choice of Spanish, French, or German. Over the years this department has changed its teaching from strictly reading and translation to a more oral and cultural approach. Emphasis has been on speaking a language as well as knowing the culture of the people who speak the language.

Previously the study of a foreign language was absolutely necessary for admission into a college. While this is no longer completely true, some colleges still encourage the study of a foreign language for admission. Perhaps the greatest change in a foreign language study over the past decade is the vocational advantages in knowing a foreign language. The knowledge of another language plus specialization in another vocational field can enhance one's opportunities on the job market.

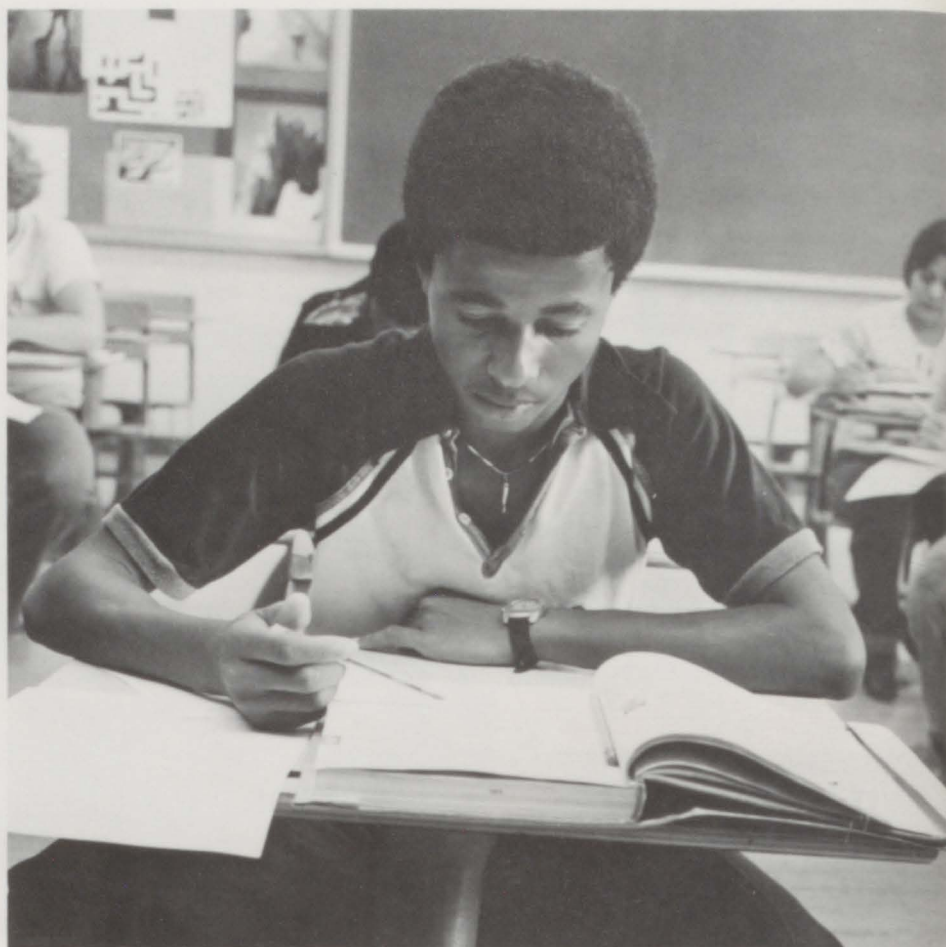

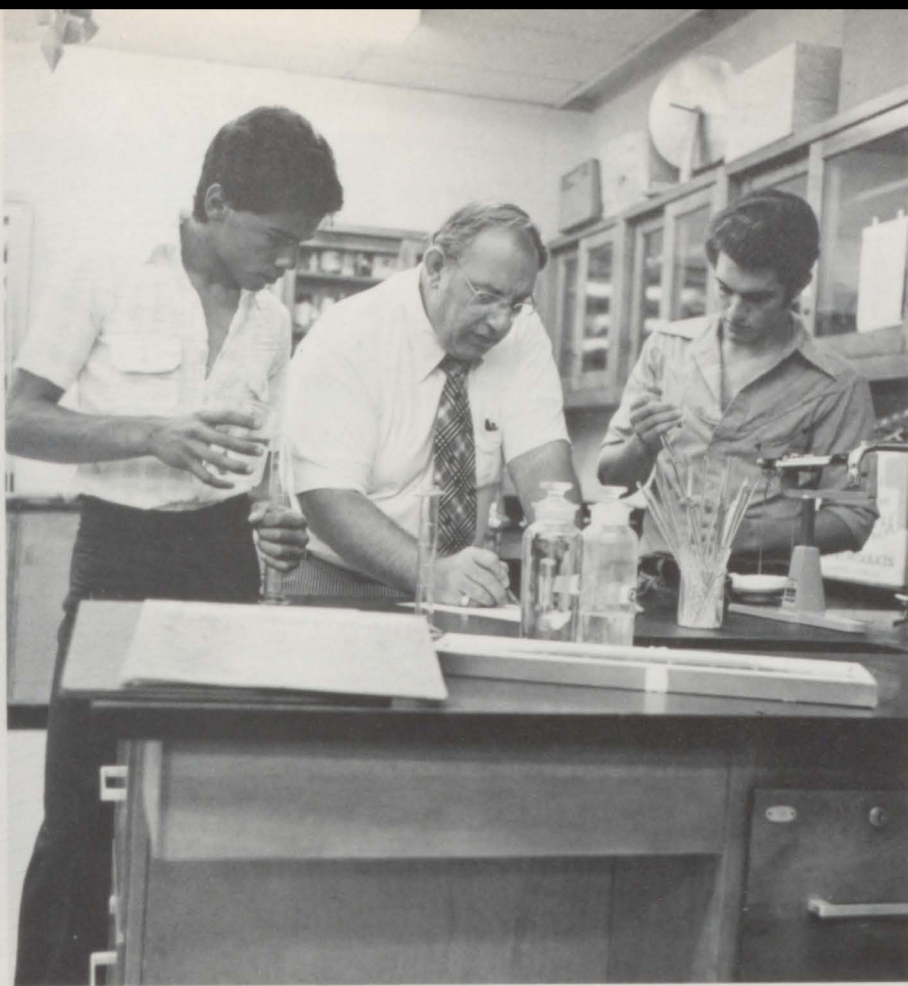

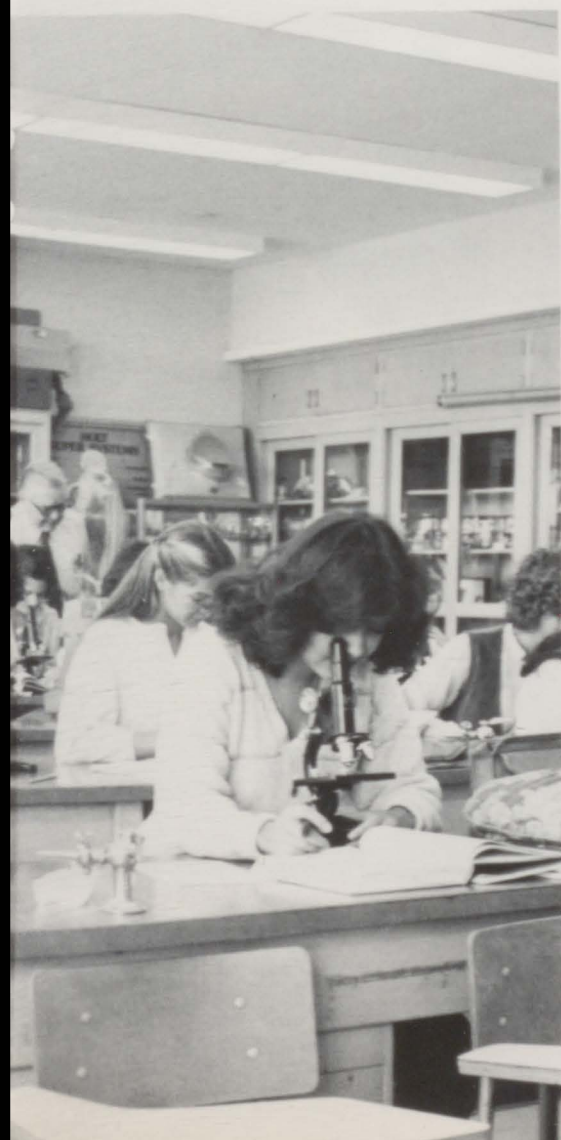


Science Places Its Emphasis On Participation

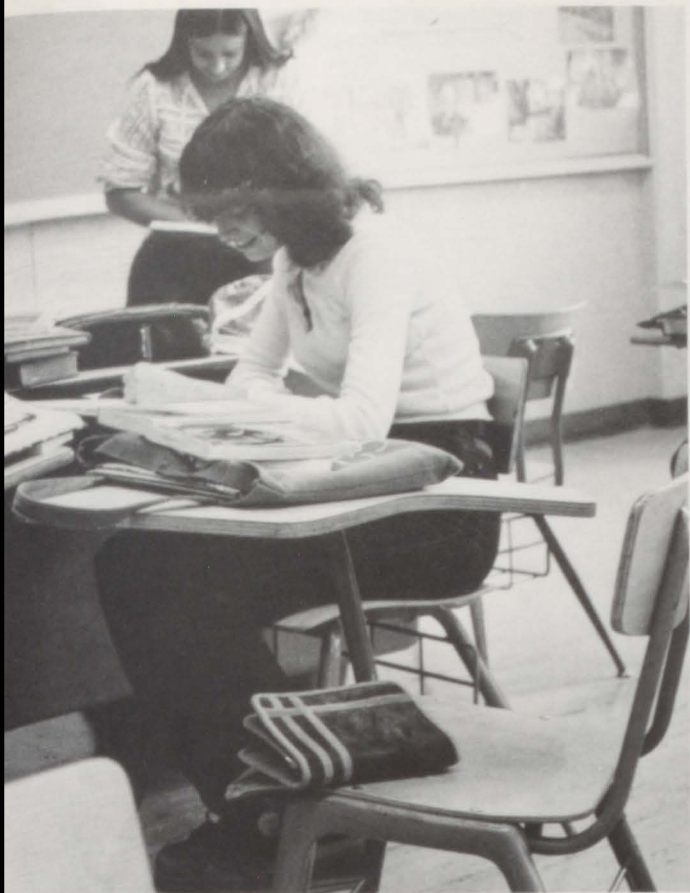


Social Studies Link Present, Past, & Future

As the new decade opens, students find themselves in an advanced and often confusing society. Studies in social studies during the coming ten year period should give West students insight into the society in which they live.

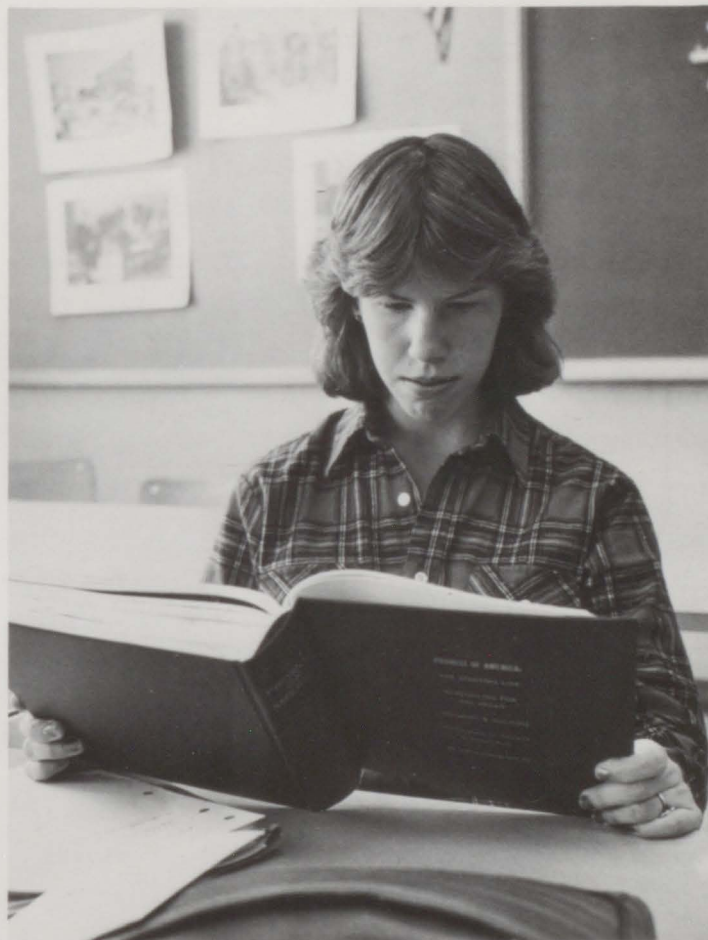

Hopefully, the coming decade, with its declining enrollment, will not hinder these special and very necessary services at West.

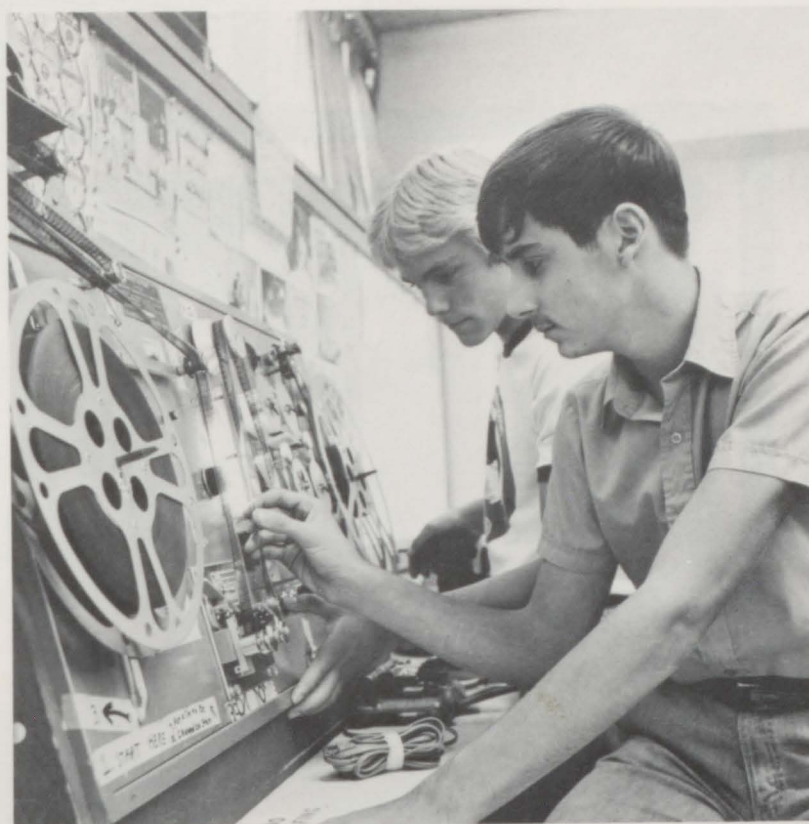

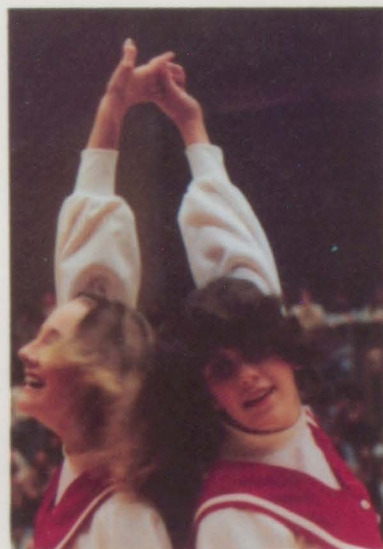

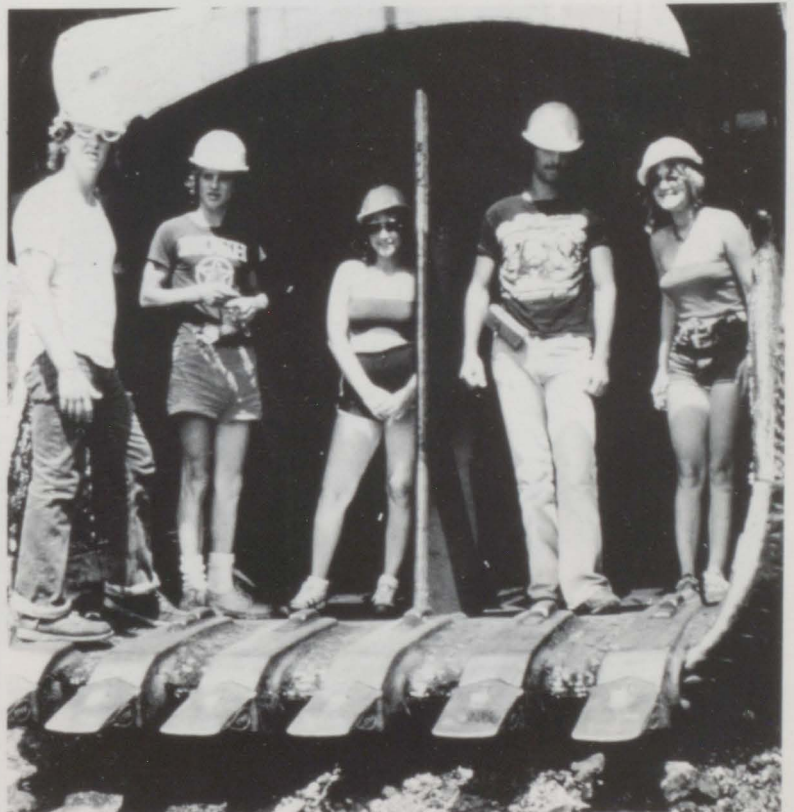

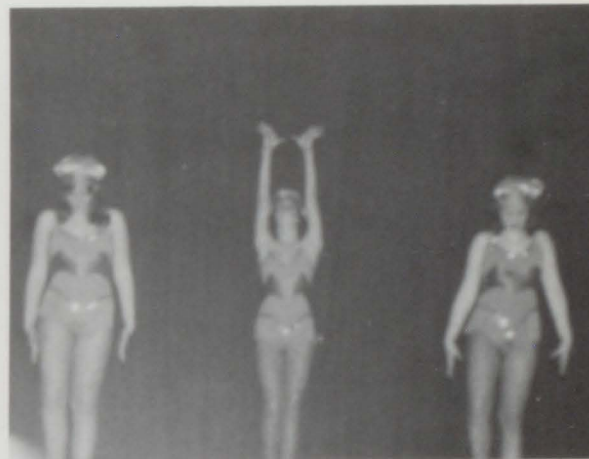

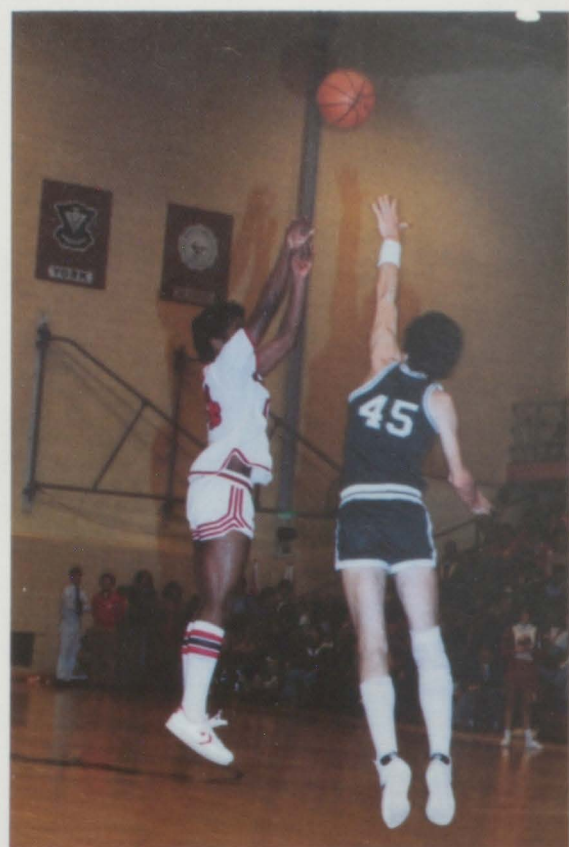
Cheerleaders Rock West

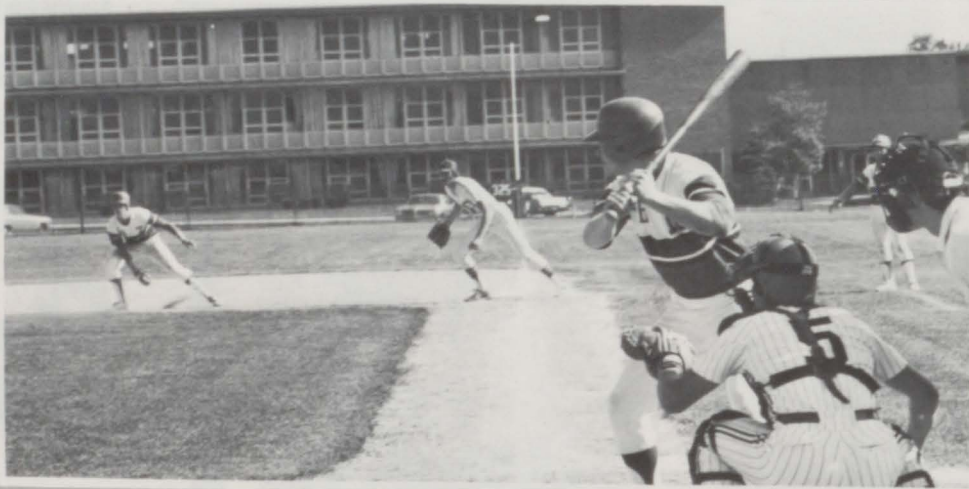
Panthers Take Championship

Frosh Coach "Skip" Lima thinks that the Panthers' outlook is "bright indeed."

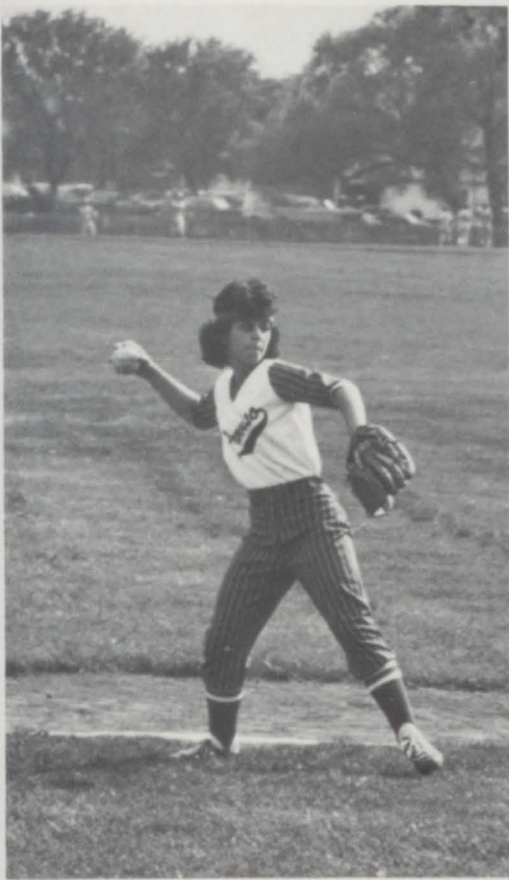

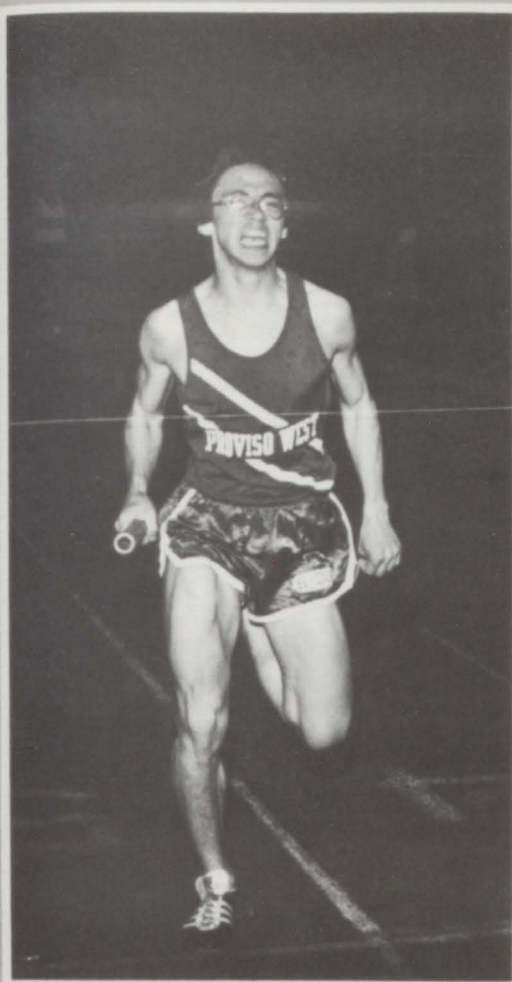

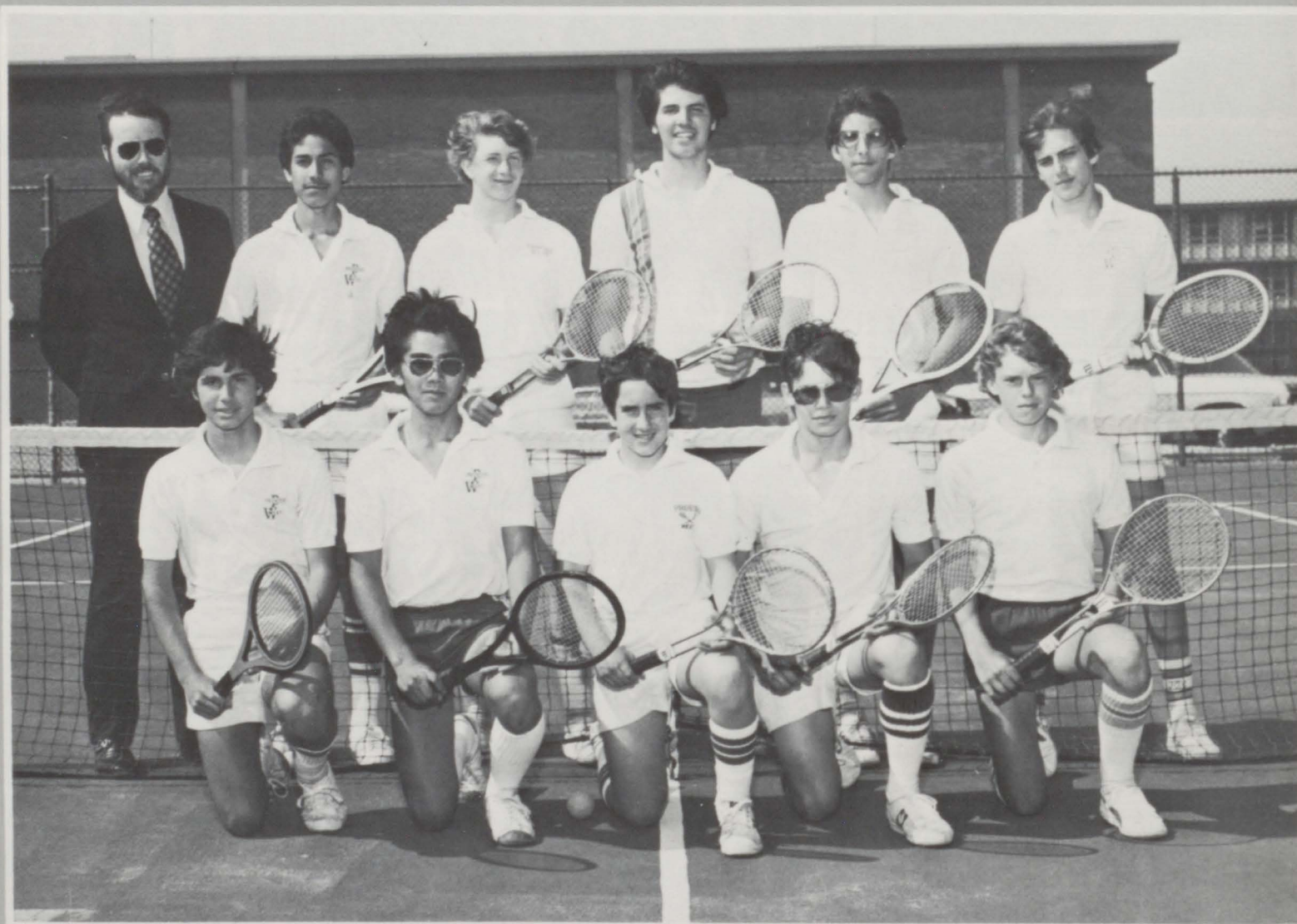
Young Panthers Show Prospect

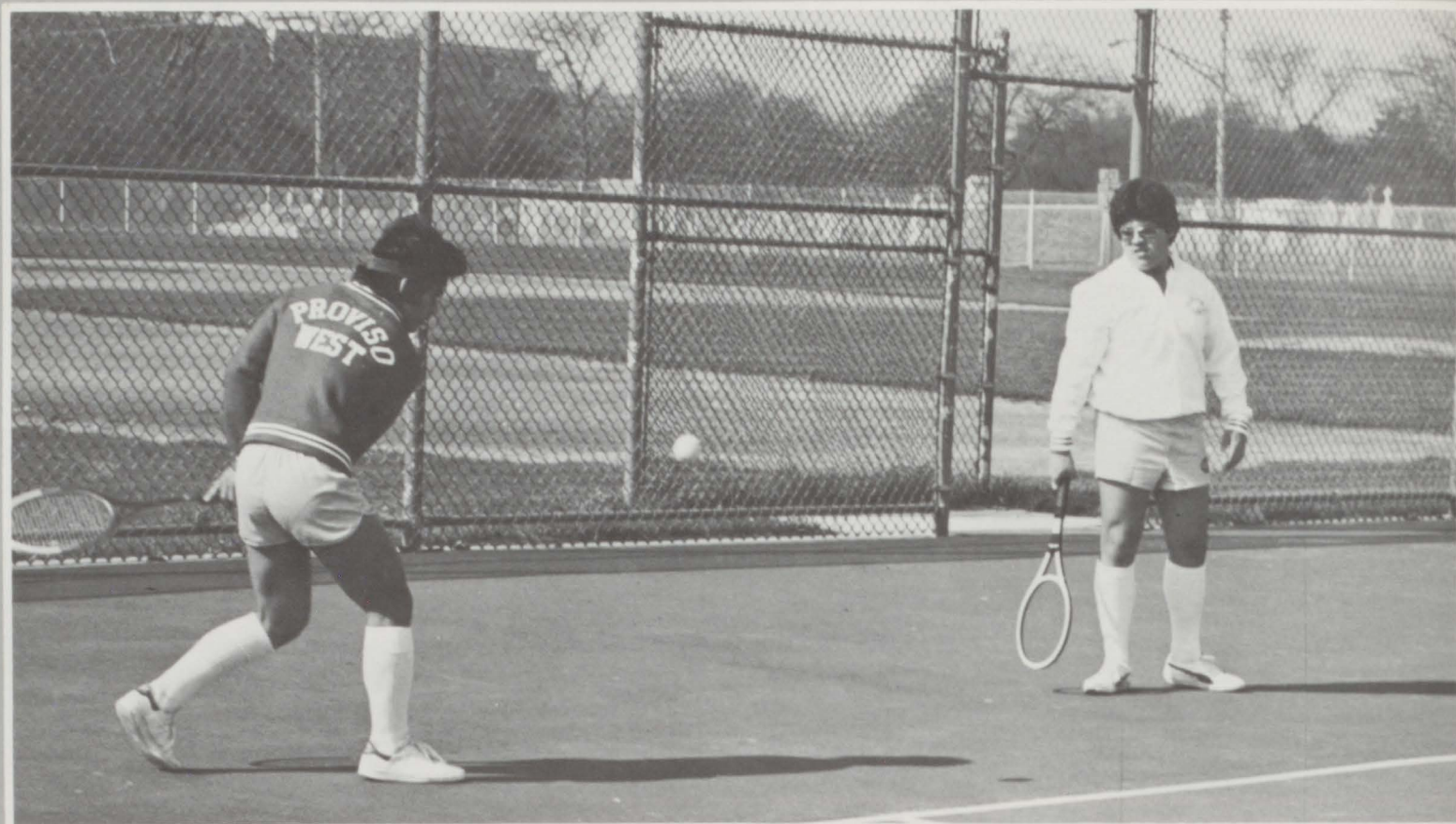

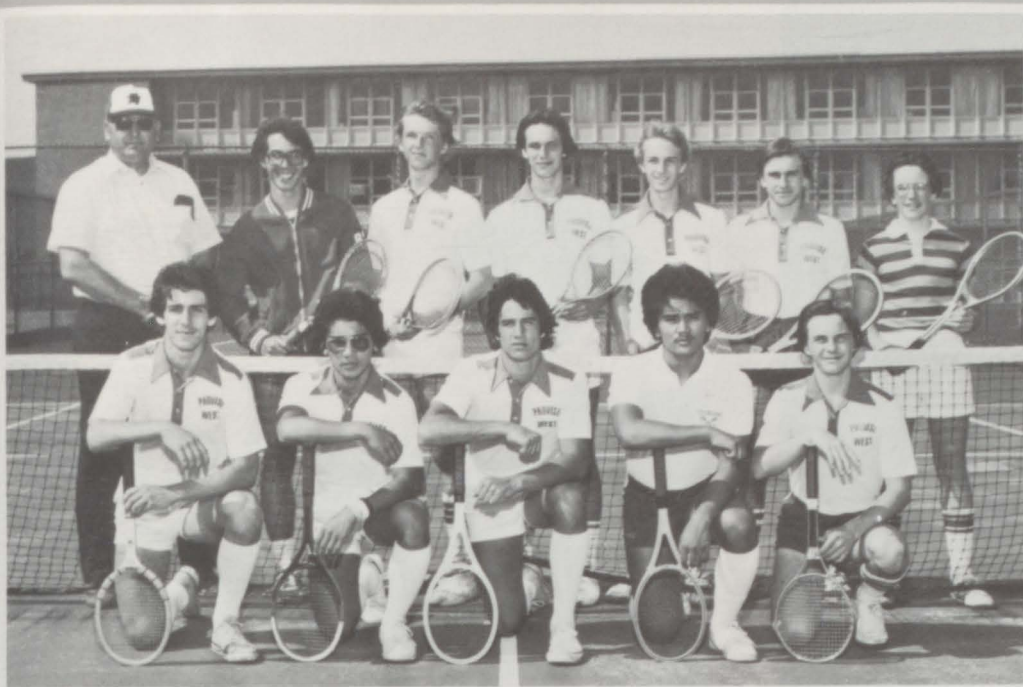
Inexperience Holds Key To Success

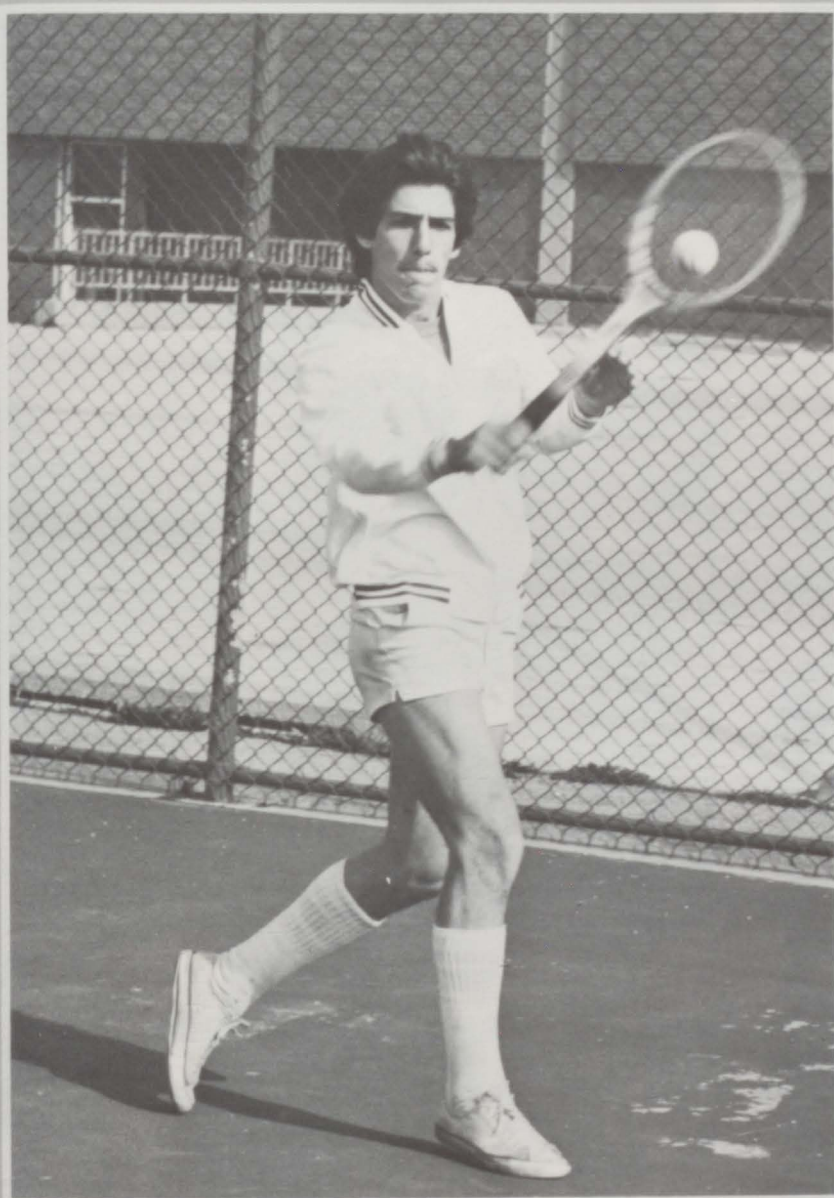

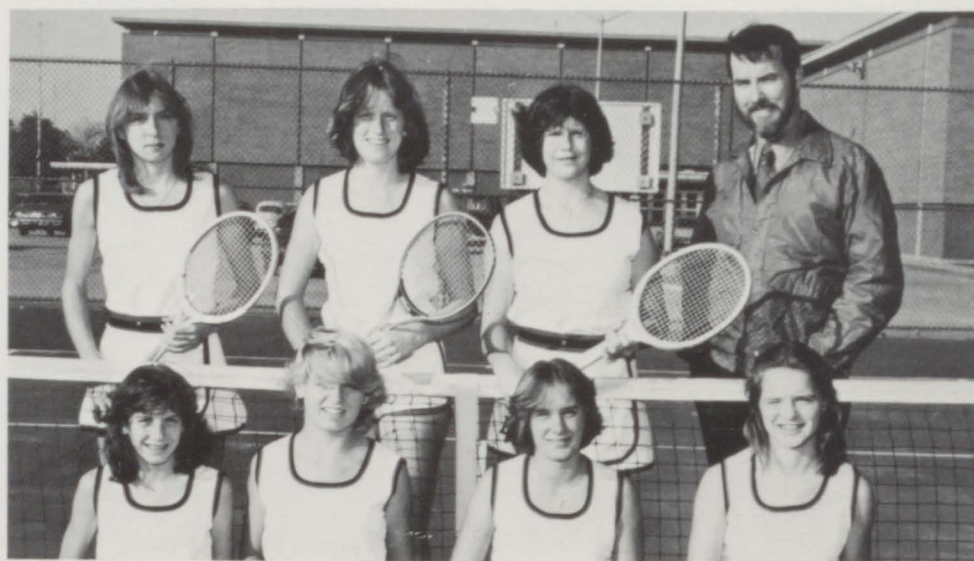

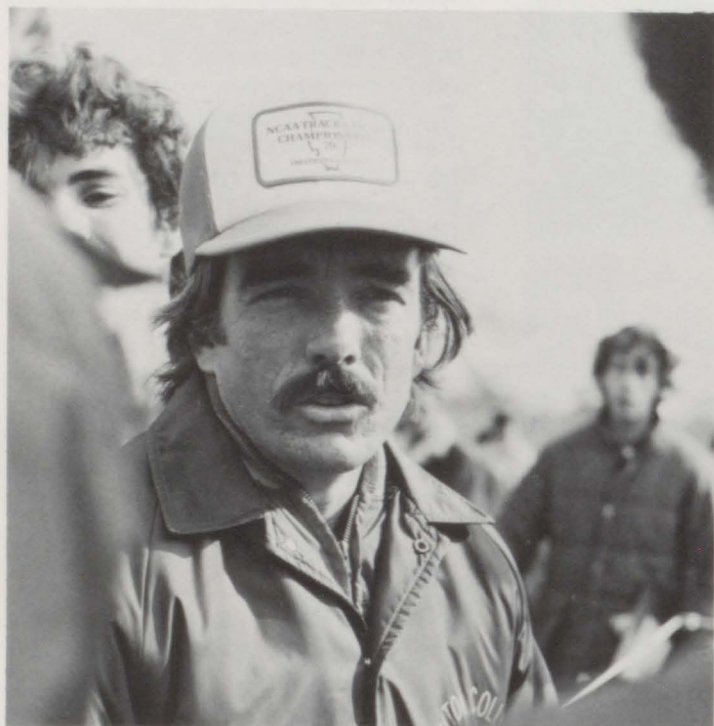
Panthers Qualify For State

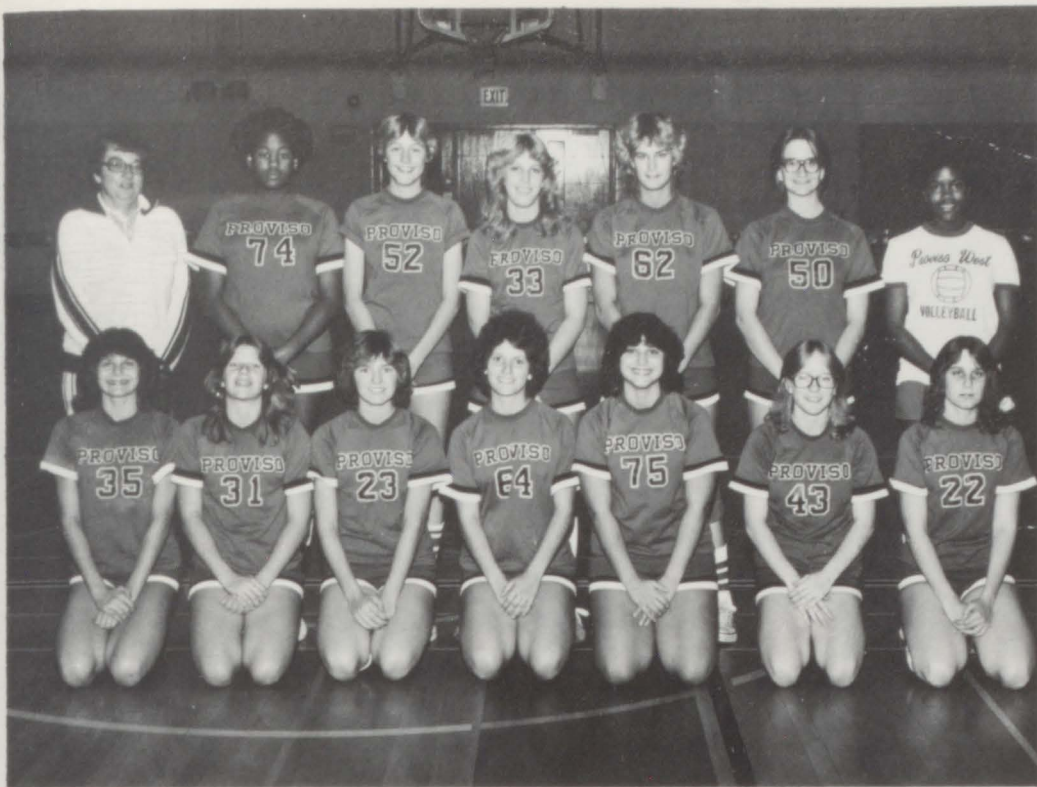

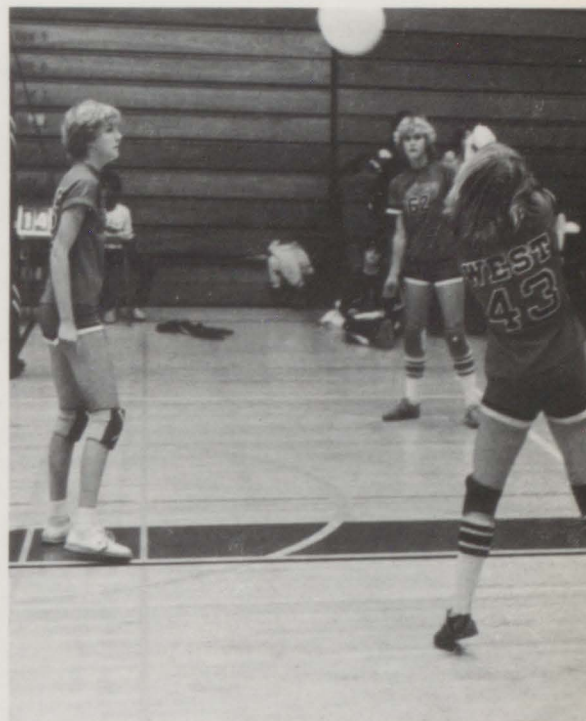

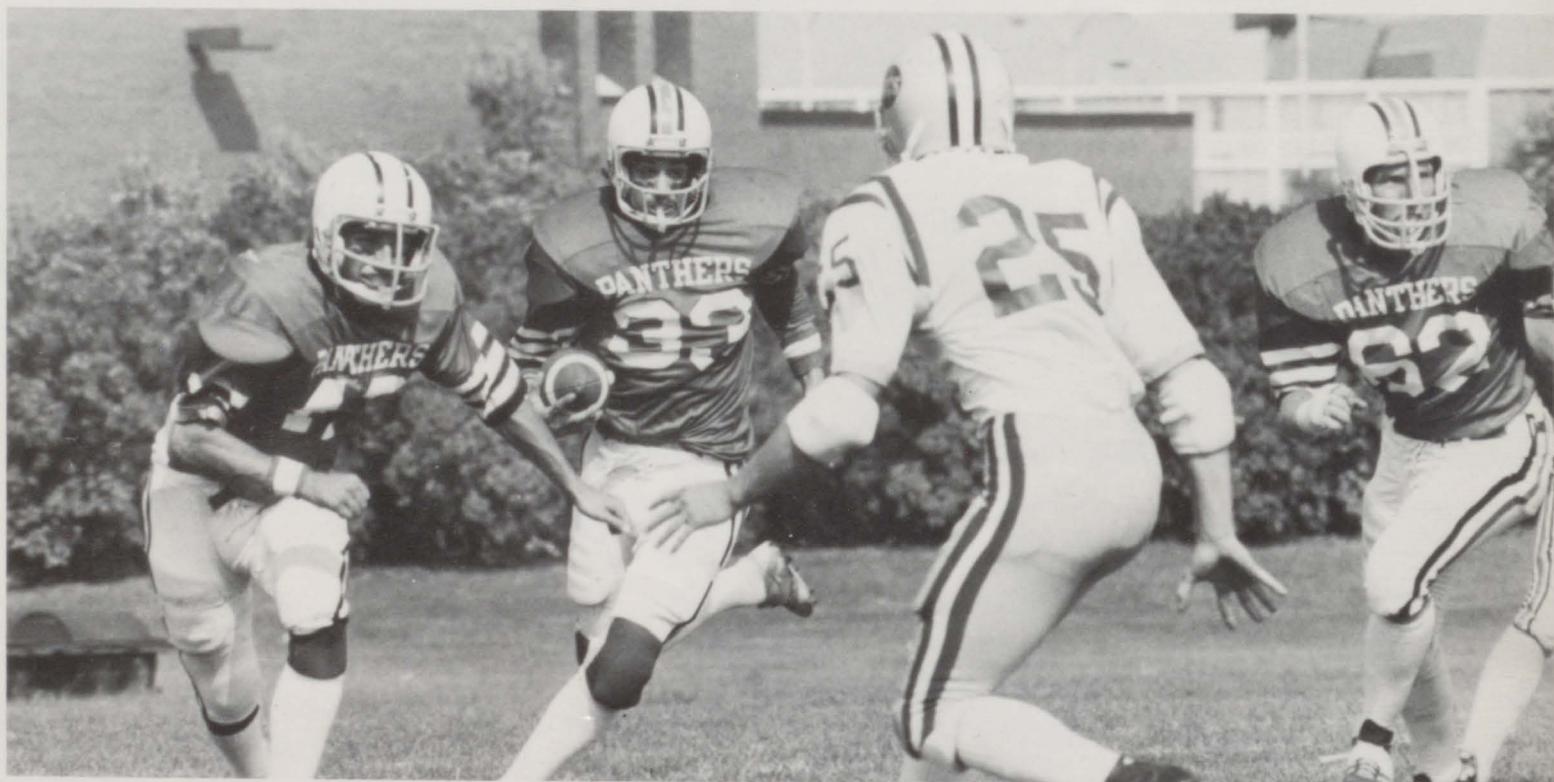

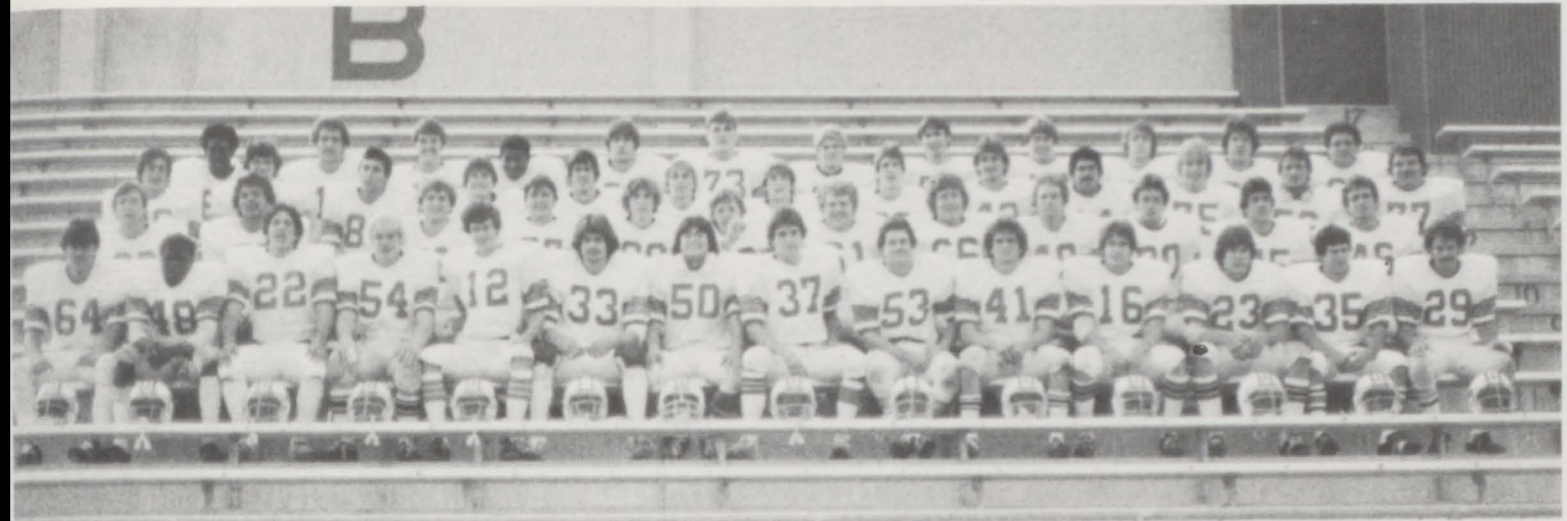

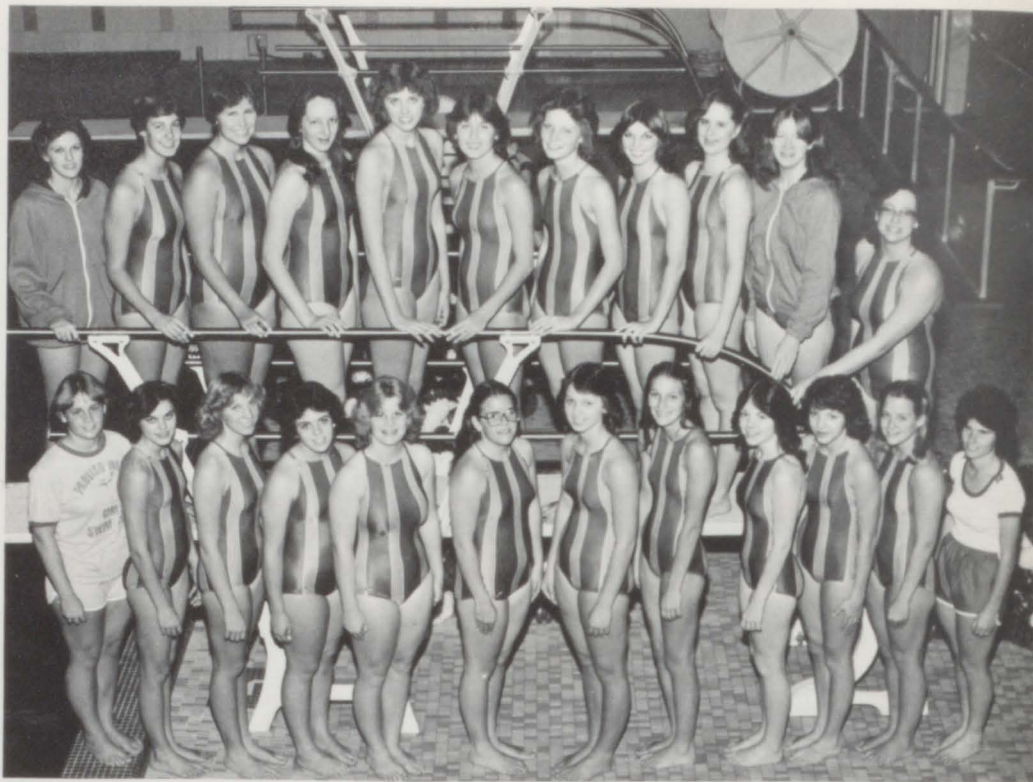
Frosh Have Troubles

Swim Team Improves

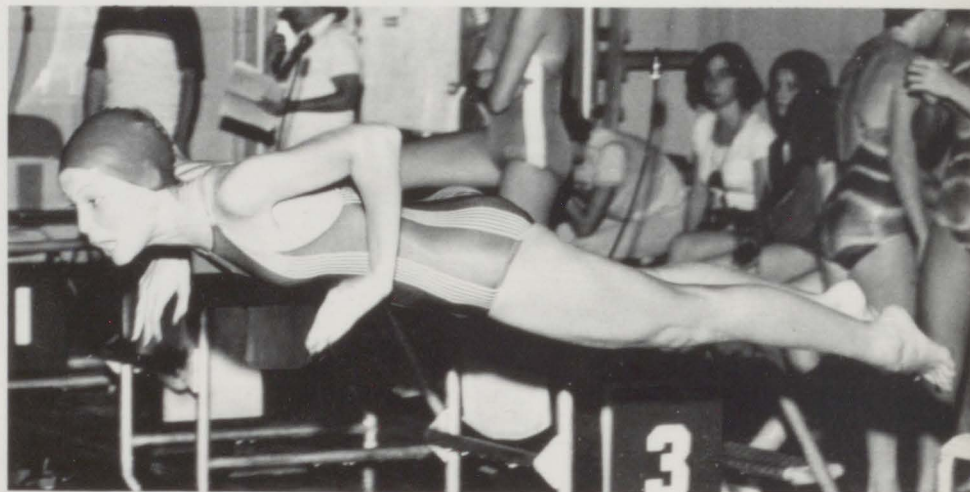

The team has improved greatly and shows a lot of promise in the next few seasons. Unlike teams of the past, this team had more medal and ribbon winners in Conference play and in the district final.



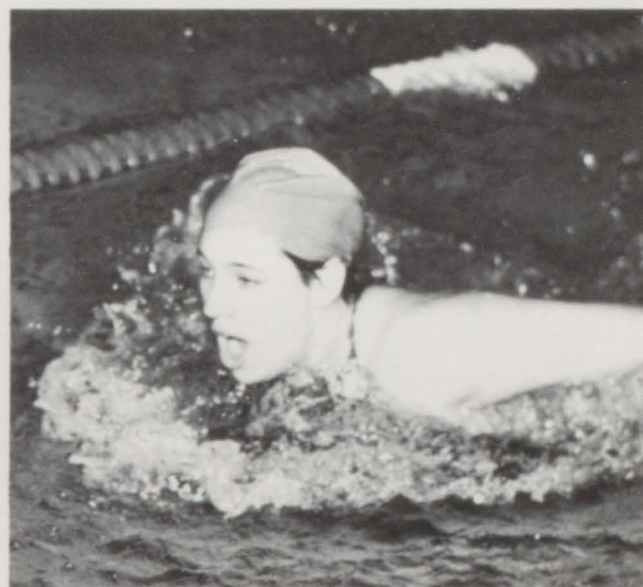

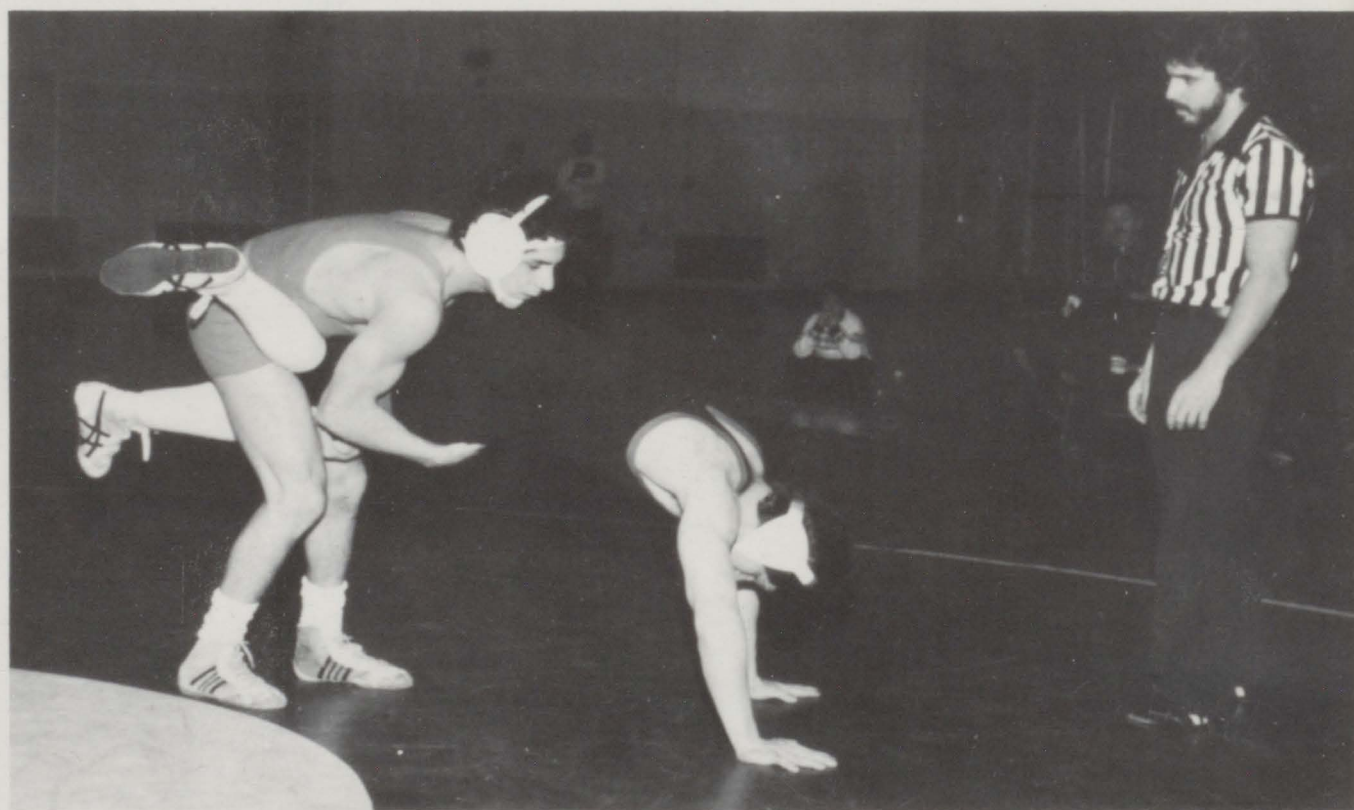

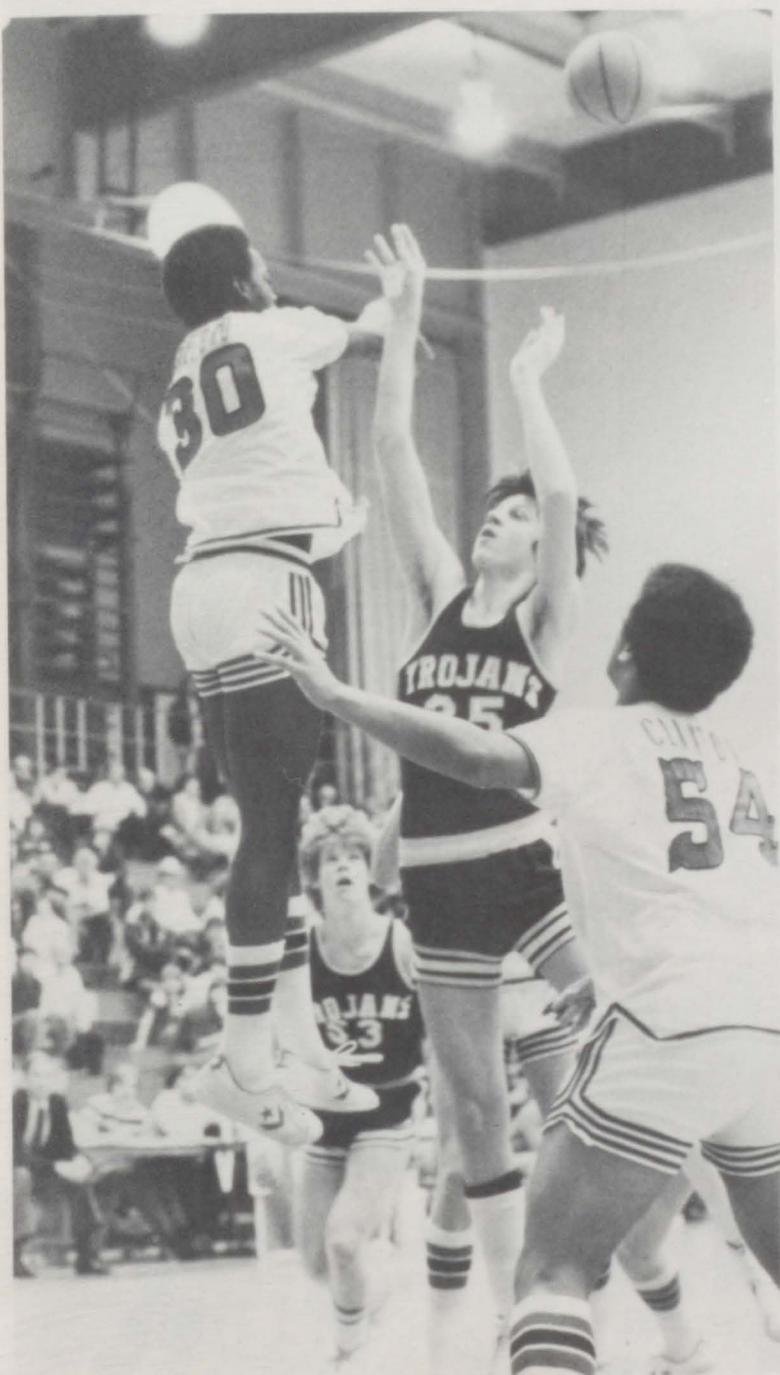

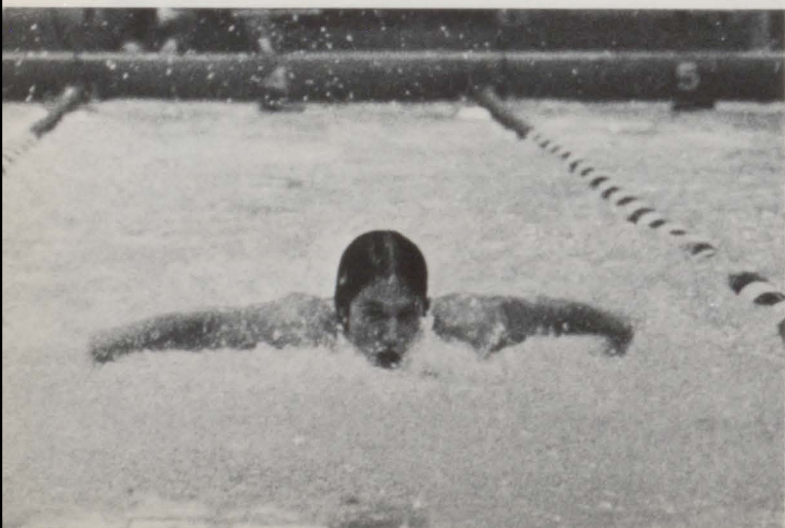

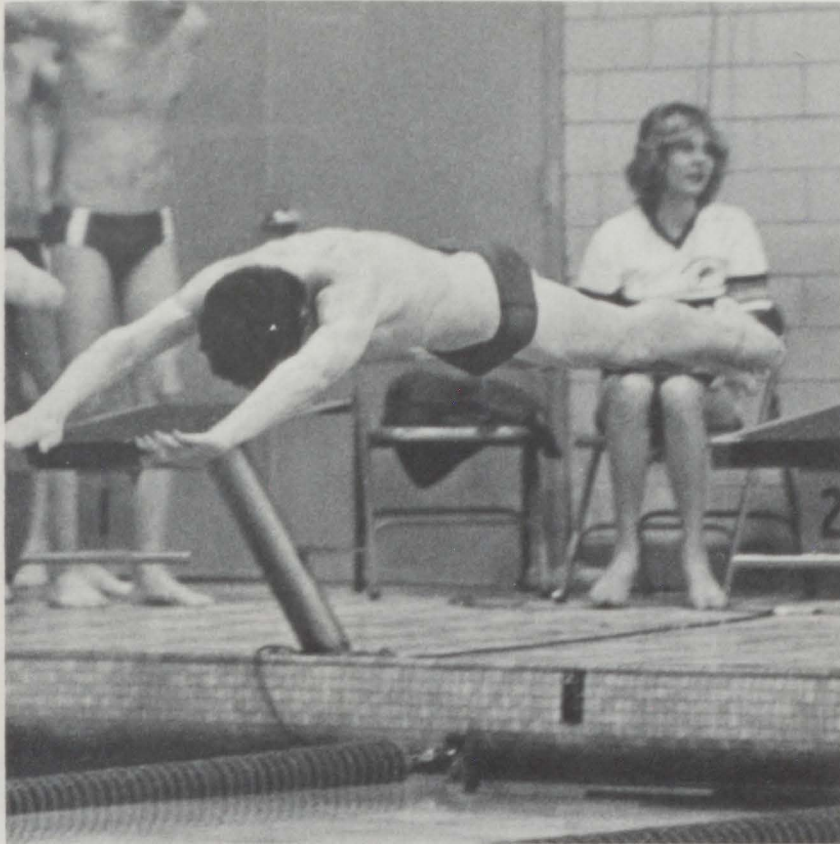

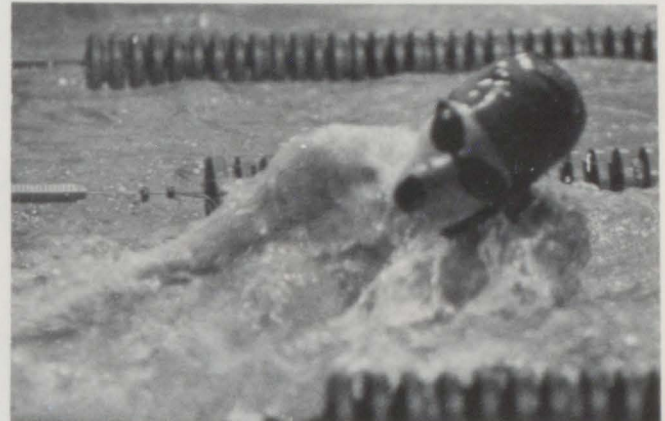

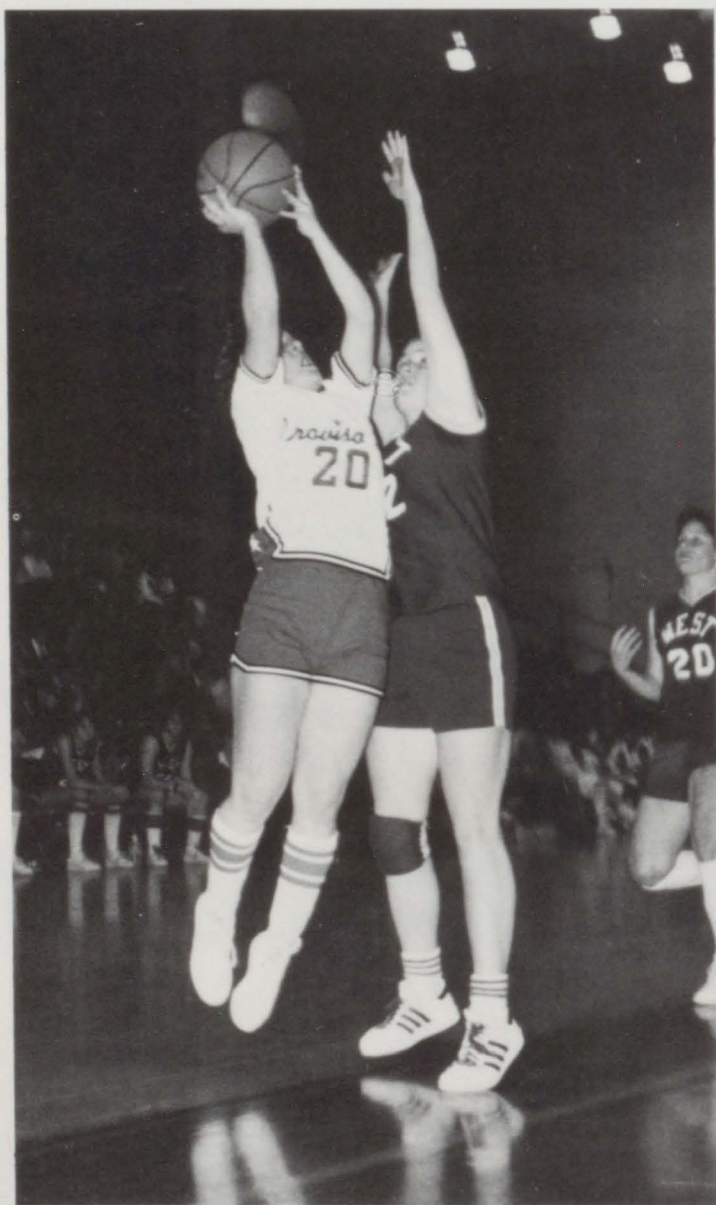
Girls Grab Regional Trophy

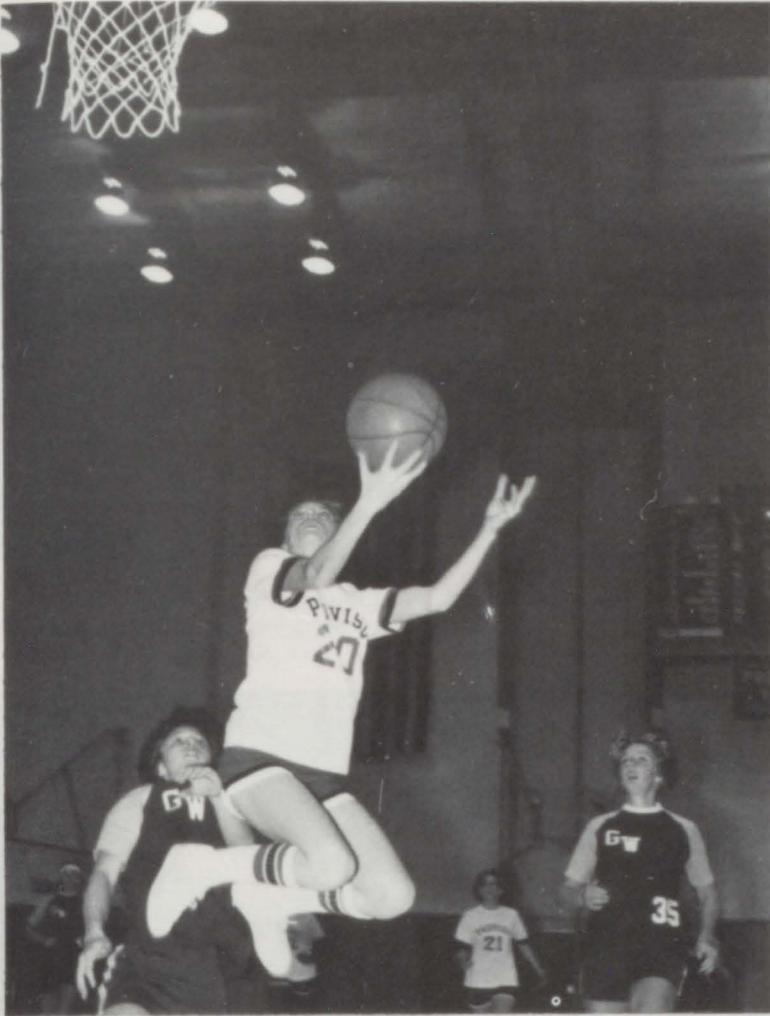

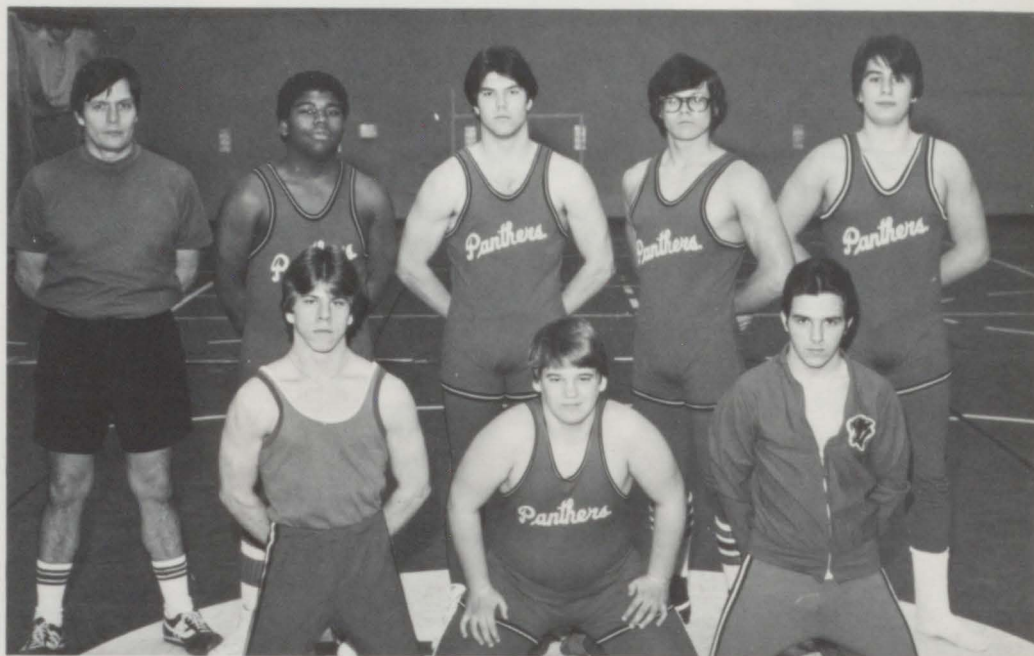

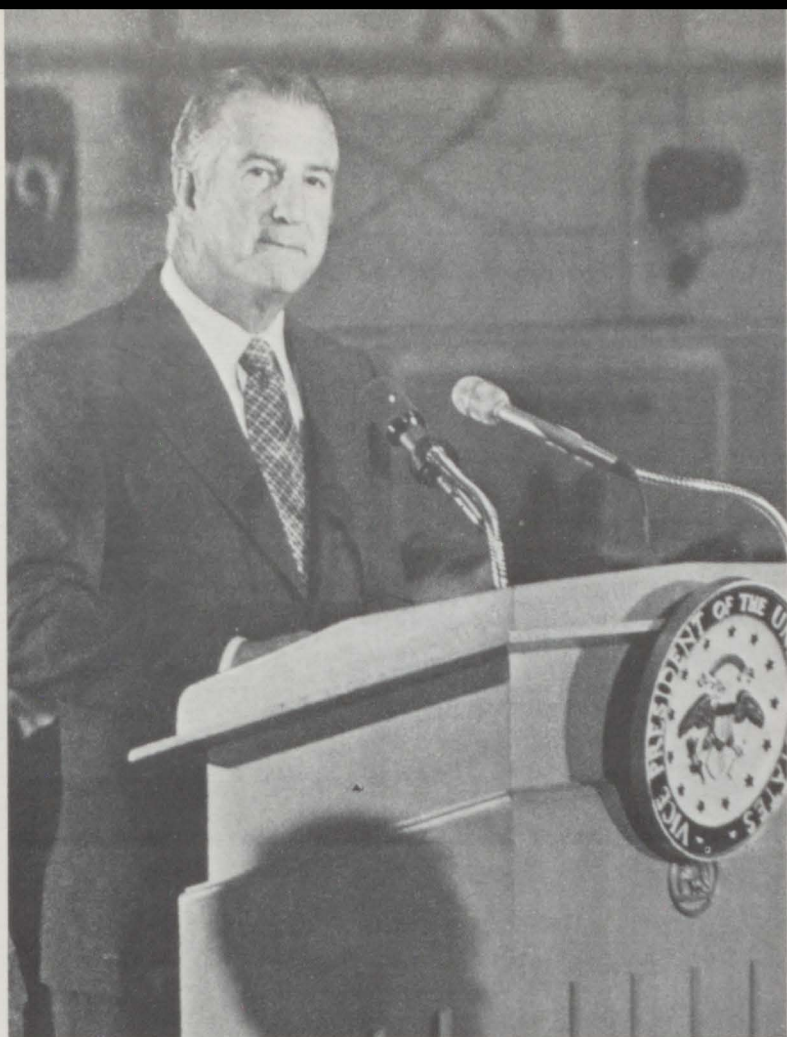

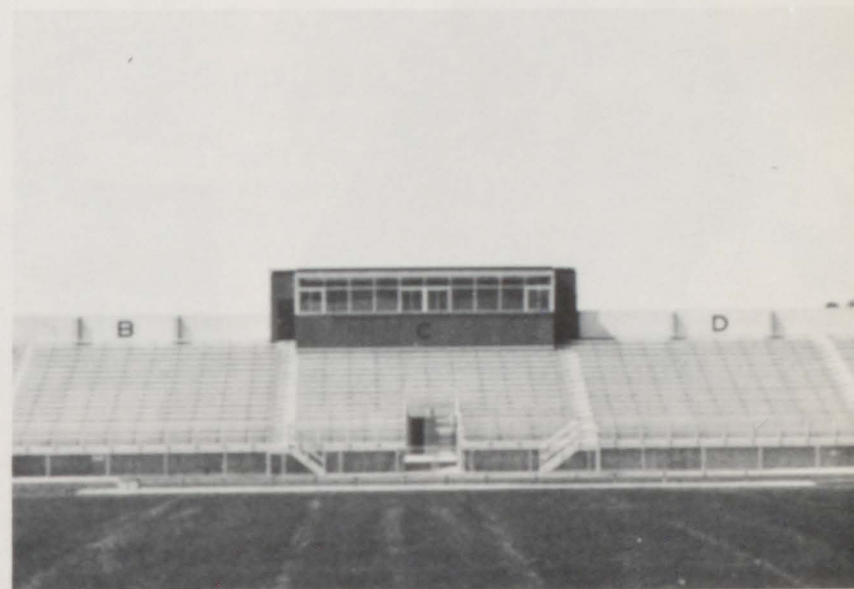
