







Home Ec. Gives Useful Skills









Languages Exercise Memory

















Test Tubes Can Be Memorable






Key Club's Influence Grows












Gymnasts Battle Inexperience






Above: A basic routine V-seat on the parallel bars must have good form to score high for this Panther. *Left:* Dan Runkel gets prepared for his landing off the vault.





J-V Dominates Second Place
























Gymnasts Look Toward Future





'80-'81 Term Gives West New Principal




