






Homecoming Day '81

Ragtime Rendezvous












Halloween Spirit






Right: Mr. Vaccaro oversees the drawing attampts of his art students. *Below:* Two drawing students concentrate on the paper in front of them.






Business Education Paves The Way To Future Jobs





Counselors Guide And Assist West's Students










Students Look To The Future With Industrial Ed.










Language Study Opens Foreign Doors




Music Adds A Light, Harmonic Touch To School







Physical Ed. Classes Keep West Bodies In Shape




















Science Satisfies The Minds Of The Curious



Special Services Offer Additional Help





















Softball Takes WSC Title






Varsity Season Dedicated To Sutherland





















Varsity Boasts Two State Champs








Varsity Loses Grip On First








Above: Burch Wallen looks up at the sky in hopes of carching the ball. Below Left: Tony Sproles makes a

tackle during the game Below: Darren Dial runs for a rouchdown.














Jim Schneider, who placed 14th in state competition, was voted MVP. Other outstanding players included Doug Evak, Gary Yuenger, and Dan Erickson.







Seniors Al Casagranda and Robert Pottle both advanced to the sectional championships. Also, Casagranda was voted outstanding senior athlete by his teammates.










Swimmers Have Record Season








Above: Roger LaFaver's face says it all as he finishes his race. Below: Ed Yanez is clearly ahead of his opponent in this lap. Right: Senior





Frosh B Team Is Conference Champ

For the first time in West's history, a freshman "B" team placed first in the West Suburban Conference. According to Coach Sawosko, this was the first championship on the frosh B level. Outstanding players of this team were Reggie Shannon, high scorer with 225 points; John Burda, number 2 scorer with the most rebounds, best freethrows, and 180 points; Eric Collin, the most improved player, with 120 points; Mike Ingram, with 100 points; and Jim Scott, with 100 points.

According to Coach Sawosko, the season, which ended in a 10-1 conference record, was very successful and the team improved throughout the season. He stated that the ream played hard with a pressing man vs. man defense.

With a 13-5 overall record, the Frosh "A" team ended its season with a third place conference finish and a Co-Championship of the Willowbrook Freshman Tournament. 




Above: Surrounded by Glenbard players, Hiram Guyron lays one up for the point. Right: Coach Zimmerman suggests a strategy during a time out.


Above: Varsity wrestler Wayne Bohenek gets ready to take down his opponent.



According to Coach Power, "In what was supposed to be a rebuilding year with only one returning starter, the girls proved to be the surprise ream of the conference."













Individuals Set Records




















