










### Living, Learning, And Loving Languages,


### Figures, Findings, Formulas, And Functions














Since 1967, many Proviso West students have participated on the winning chess team under the fine leadership of Mr. Larry Stillwell. The students have won more than 500 individual trophies or cash awards for their accomplishments. Every year the team has lost no more than two meets since 1967. The 1982 season ended with 55 consecutive West Suburban Conference dual meet victories. Since the first IHSA State Championship in 1975, Proviso West has defeated more opponents and won more trophies than any school in the state. They set a record by winning consecutive state championships in 1980, 1981, and 1982. The team has placed in the state meet for five consecutive years and is truly one of Proviso's finest teams.










































#### Frosh Girls Hoop It Up

#### Nothing But The Best In The Making Of A High School

Twenty people gathered to make decisions that would affect the new Proviso West High School in Hillside, Il. This group, composed of Freshman honor students from what is now known as Proviso East, were chosen by the administration to help orient students to the new school in the fall of 1958. These twenty students decided on the school colors, red and white; the school mascot, the panther; and the tune for the school song, "Navy Blue and Gold."


Many complications arose such as fresh paint, dust clouds, and mingling workers. In addition, the third floor had yet to be completed. Also, to further complicate matters, the administration made the stairways *one way* which added more confusion.

Various school policies were established. The dress code seemed to provide the most challenge for the student body. Boys had to wear belts and had to have their shirt tails tucked in at all times. Girls were permitted to wear only skirts and appropriate tops. If girls entered the building wearing skirts of a "questionable" length, they were asked to kneel on the floor in the dean's office. If their skirts did not touch the floor, they were sent home with an unexcused absence. As far as extra-curricular activities such as sports, Proviso was rather limited in the early days. We had a football team, but the selection of players was very open. Girls sports did not exist at the time. Girls could belong to an organization known as the Girls' Athletic Association, but actual involvement was almost non-existent.





# A Continuing Success Story In Education



As time marched on, so did Proviso West. Proviso has made many notable strides and gained its reputation for excellence in academic circles. The sixties brought about the completion of the field house as well as work on the gym. The seventies saw new additions added to C Building, computerized scheduling, student I.D. cards, the football stadium, as well as other notable achievements. In the first few years of the eighties, many changes have altered Proviso's image as compared to its beginnings.

In the energy conscious eighties, building improvements are constantly being made. The strict dress code of the fifties has long been abandoned. Levi's, rock concert T-shirts, Izod shirts, cardigan sweaters, knickers, warm-up suits, and even shorts dot Proviso's hallways. The extracurricular scene changed in the eighties. Proviso offers football, basketball, baseball, soccer, gymnastics, softball, volleyball, volleyball, wrestling, tennis, track, badmitton, and cross country as well as numerous other activities. Throughout its twenty-five years, Proviso West has always lived up to its motto of, "Nothing But the Best!"




