
#### HALLOWEEN





#### A WINNING TRADITION




### History Repeats Itself













### Industrial Ed. Builds Skills


# Freshman Play Well









# Freshmen B Team Shines Through an Undefeated Season




# Varsity Soars For Another Year





### CHALLENGER MISSION ENDS IN TRAGEDY

Cape Canaveral to witness the first of the fifteen space shuttle expeditions which had been planned for 1986. The crew was on the shuttle and everybody nervously looked on. The countdown began and suddenly the rocket boosters came to life. The Challenger, with 5.8 million pounds of thrust, broke from the launching pad and headed toward the silent blue sky. The Challenger carried seven crew members, six of them professionals and a social studies teacher from Concord, New Hampshire. After thirty-five seconds, everything looked fine. Misssion control, located in Houston, radioed "Challenger, go at throttle up." The pilot, Micheal Smith radioed back, they were on their way. Just seconds later, less than a minute into the flight, Challenger blew up. Even the computers did not acknowledge the fact. The Challenger mission ended in tragedy less than ten miles and one minute into its journey.

Going for its tenth flight, the Challenger, had been delayed a couple of times because of difficulties with the shuttle itself or the weather conditions. Finally, everyone in the shuttle crew was ready and so was the space shuttle. A crowd gathered at







## Halley's Comet






