














#### THAT WAS THEN THIS IS NOW


#### The Game















#### HOMECOMING PEP ASSEMBLY







These are probably the solemn thoughts of the ten guys who were escorts. They also carried armfuls of balloons and flowers.






#### **Puttin' on the Ditz**




























### **Tricking and Treating Thrills**





















### Remember When ...














## SADGuts and Glory H.S.




#### Records Come to an End







## New Coach, New Hopes









## Hard Work Hopes to Pay Off




## SWIMMERS HARD WORK SHOWS


