Cliffs Notes .. Helpful or Harmful

This note below is taken from the inside cover of an actual book of **Cliffs Notes**. Labeled: Note to the reader.

THESE NOTES ARE NOT A SUBSTITUTE FOR THE TEXT ITSELF OR FOR THE CLASSROOM DISCUSSION OF THE TEXT, AND STUDENTS WHO ATTEMPT TO USE THEM IN THIS WAY ARE DENYING THEMSELVES THE VERY EDUCATION THAT THEY ARE PRESUMABLY GIVING THEIR MOST VITAL YEARS TO ACHIEVE.

How many students have seen that note before? More than half of the enrolled Proviso students have probably read that on the inside cover of Cliffs Notes. Cliffs Notes are small black and yellow pamphlets which contain vital information to help understand a book more clearly. Some students read them after having read the book to better understand it or to pick up information they missed while reading. Other students read Cliffs Notes instead of the assigned book just because they do not want to read it or they just don't have the time. Cliffs Notes run approximately \$3.75 depending on the type of reading materials you buy it for. Most students say they spend up to \$40 or more a year depending how many books are read during the numerous amount of days in a semester of an academic class. Do parents know their children use Cliffs Notes? Do they care? Articles have been in the paper during the year, because schools are adopting the issue of having Cliffs Notes available in their libraries. This puts a deep cut in the money spent by a student who wastes gas to drive to Crown Books or B-Daltons to buy Cliffs Notes. Then what do you do with them after you're done? Well, having them at the access of the school library allows the student to check them out rather than buy them. But that still doesn't solve the problem of students just reading Cliffs and not the books. Most students know that reading Cliffs does not help when the test asks who said a specific quotation from the book. Some people have different views on Cliffs Notes than others. The students' views differ from those of the teachers. Let's see how students and teachers feel about Cliffs Notes.

Students Against Driving Drunk

Between September 2nd and the 9th, a very special memorial of the Vietnam War visited the Hillside Commons. This monument is the replica of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall. Hundreds of people came to visit this emotional monument and pay their respect once again to the thousands of Americans who died and now have their names inscribed on the wall. Some names are labeled with symbols that indicate death or missing in action. Many tears were shed as family and friends looked upon the names that meant so much to them and will never be forgotten. Caring people left paper flags near their loved ones or other memories such as letters, pictures, candles or articles. Students from Proviso took field trips to see the memorial first hand. Some students received donations to give to the veterans in return for POW/MIA bracelets with a certain soldier's name on it, the date they were reported missing, and the branch they were in. Once the bracelet goes on the wrist, it will not be taken off until the soldier is found and safely home. The sad thing was that the people they knew had come from Proviso since sixtyeight names listed on the wall were from Proviso & Leyden townships.
